TOWN OF WILMOT WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Wilmot in the (L.S.) County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Wilmot on Tuesday, the 10th of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon (the polls closing at 6:00 PM) to act upon the following subjects:

- To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To see if the Town is in favor of the adoption of an amendment, as proposed by the Wilmot Planning Board, for the Town of Wilmot's Planning and Zoning Ordinance as follows:

Amend Article VIII Section II of the Ordinance to provide for criteria for a special exception and for a variance.

You are hereby further notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Wilmot the 10th day of March, next at seven of the clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same. Recommended by the Selectmen.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes and to negotiate the extension or renewal of the notes securing such loans when it is necessary. Recommended by the Selectmen.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell any material or equipment deemed to be surplus to the Town needs; the sale of highway material or equipment to be made with the approval of the Road Agent. Recommended by the Selectmen.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply for any Federal or State grants that may be available. Recommended by the Selectmen.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to accept any grants that may be allocated to the town and expend same, per RSA 31:95b. Recommended

by the Selectmen.

- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$41,225.00 (Forty one thousand two hundred and twenty five dollars and no cents) for the purchase of a new truck equipped with a standard steel body, with \$25,000.00 (Twenty five thousand dollars and no cents) from Capital Reserve Equipment Trust Fund to be applied to the purchase. The balance in the amount of \$16,225.00 (Sixteen thousand two hundred and twenty five dollars and no cents) shall be raised by taxation. Recommended by the Selectmen.
- 9. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 (One thousand dollars and no cents) for use by the Forest Fire Warden. Recommended by the Selectmen.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$22,000.00 (Twenty two thousand dollars and no cents) for reconstruction of the bridge over Cascade Brook, on Kearsarge Valley Road with the sum of \$22,000.00 (Twenty two thousand dollars and no cents) to be taken from the Capital Reserve Bridge Trust Fund. Recommended by the Selectmen.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 (Two thousand dollars and no cents) for the purchase of the Florence Langley property on the corner of Route 4A and North Wilmot Road, Map #15 Lot #61, said to contain .4 acre. Recommended by the Selectmen.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to convey the above parcel of land to the Wilmot Historical society for the sum of \$1.00. (One dollar and no cents) Recommended by the Selectmen.
- 13. Shall we adopt optional adjusted elderly exemptions from property tax? The optional exemptions, based on assessed value, for qualified taxpayers shall be as follows: for a person 65 years of age up to 75 years, \$25,000; for a person 75 years of age up to 80 years, \$25,000; for a person 80 years of age or older, \$50,000. To qualify, the person must have been a New Hampshire resident for at least 5 years; own the real estate individually or jointly, or if the real estate is owned by his spouse, they must have been married for at least 5 years. In addition, the taxpayer must have a net income of less than \$10,000 or, if married, a combined net income of less than \$12,000; and own net assets not in excess of \$30,000 excluding the value of the person's residence. Per petition of George M. Howe and others. Requires a ballot vote. Recommended by

the Selectmen.

14. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Treasurer, with the approval of the Selectmen, to appoint a Deputy Treasurer. Said deputy shall be sworn, shall have the powers of the Treasurer, and may be removed at the pleasure of the Treasurer. Recommended by the Selectmen.

REPORT OF THE SELECTMEN

The Board of Selectmen are pleased to report to you that in 1991 numerous issues have been addressed on behalf of the citizens of Wilmot. Needless to say, with the slowdown of the economy both nationally and locally, town employees and your Board of Selectmen have been working diligently to see that the taxpayers get the best return on their tax dollars in terms of budgeted costs and town services.

As you know the Town's recycling program got under way in April and your participation in making this program a success has been most gratifying. We will always be grateful to our Recycling Committee whose research and efforts have contributed to the success of the program. Because of your excellent participation, less solid waste is going into the compactor and consequently, Waste Management is hauling a reduced number of loads. Our contract with Waste Management calls for an adjustment of their charges when fewer loads are hauled and we have asked them to grant this adjustment.

In reporting to you concerning cable television for Wilmot we feel somewhat like the little boy who called "Wolf". The latest information we have is that the project is still in the design stage and that because of the possibility of using a different type of technology, some additional time has been required. Nevertheless, the power company is presently doing make ready work and construction is anticipated the second quarter of this year. If all goes as planned, service to the town might also be a reality shortly thereafter. The primary cause for delay of this service was the protest appeal to the FCC by another cable company.

We have had discussions with the Andover Board of Selectmen regarding the possibility of Wilmot's construction debris being accepted at their transfer station. However, at this time we have not been able to agree upon a satisfactory cost allocation and no

immediate resolution is foreseen.

Periodically, Selectmen from the seven towns in the Kearsarge Regional School District meet to discuss problems of mutual concern. These meetings have been valuable both from an informational and an operational

standpoint.

It has been said that small towns in New Hampshire could not survive without the many volunteers who give of their time and talents. We gratefully acknowledge the efforts of all of you who serve on the various committees, Boards, departments and organizations. Without your efforts and the support of our citizens, we could not accomplish the goals and objectives of the Town of Wilmot.

Finally, it is with deep regret that we report the

passing of two of Wilmot's leading citizens; Ernest M. Patten and Maurice Rayno. Ernest Patten served the Town as a selectman for fourteen years and he also served as Road Agent for a number of years. Maurice Rayno served as Town policeman and was active in the Fire Department, having served as its secretary for many years. Their contributions to the Town will never be forgotten.

We conclude by saying it has been a distinct privilege to serve the Town of Wilmot as your Selectmen. We look forward to continuing to work for you during 1992 and wish all of you the very best.

EXPLANATION OF NEW ACCOUNT CATEGORIES FOR 1992

The 1992 Budget Cycle uses a new chart of accounts with several new categories for reporting to the Department of Revenue Administration on their forms. This involved converting to the new categories for the reporting of the 1991 budget figures and appropriations. Under General Government the categories of "Town Officer Salaries" and "Town Officer's Expenses" were deleted. The account titles, "Executive Office" and "Financial Administration" are new. "Executive Office" is for the reporting of expenses for the Selectmen, their staff and Moderator etc. "Financial Administration" is expenditures related to the financial function of the town such as Tax Collector, Treasurer, Auditor and Trustees of Trust Funds salaries and expenses. Clerk expenses are included under Election Registration. Health Officer and Overseer of Public Welfare Salaries and Expenses are included under the account titles "Health" and "Welfare" respectively. Most other account categories remain the same. The old accounts for the highway dept., "Town Maintenance" and "General Highway Dept. Expenses", are combined into one new account titled "Highways & Streets".

The "Detailed Statement of Payments" report shows what items were put under these new categories for the conversion to the new Budget Form. The following chart shows the 1991 appropriations and expenditures before converting to the new Budget Form.

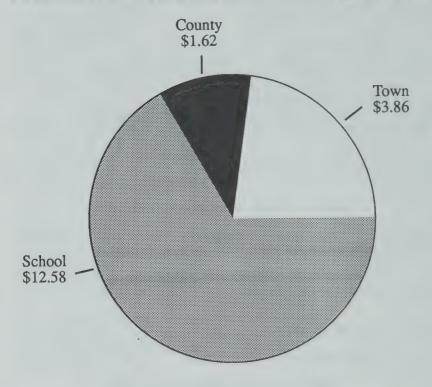

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, March 12, 1991, to act upon the following subjects:

The meeting began with the singing of America the Beautiful led by Mrs. Jacqueline Rayno, and the Pledge of Allegiance led by Mr. Keith Fleury.

Mr. Robert K. Minard Jr., the Moderator, read a letter of thanks to the road agent and his crew for the maintenance of the roads of Wilmot.

ARTICLE 2: Mr. Earle Chandler made the motion that "the Town vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$367,405.00 to defray Town charges for the ensuing year with any income from other sources except property taxes to be applied against this appropriation. Motion was seconded by Mr. Robert Tawney. Discussion followed. Motion passed unanimously.

ARTICLE 3: Mr. Nelson Chitterling made the motion to adopt Article 3 as written "To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in

anticipation of taxes and to negotiate the extension or renewal of the notes securing such loans when it is necessary." Motion was seconded by Mr. Earle Chandler. Discussion followed. Motion passed unanimously.

ARTICLE 4: Mr. Robert Tawney made the motion to adopt Article 4 as written "To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell any material or equipment deemed to be surplus to the Town needs; the sale of highway material or equipment to be made with the approval of the Road Agent." Motion was seconded by Mr. Richard Biron. Discussion followed. Motion passed unanimously.

ARTICLE 5: Mr. Earle Chandler made the motion to adopt Article 5 as written "To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,702.00 (Two thousand seven hundred and two dollars and no cents) for the Lake Sunapee Health Care and affiliates." Motion was seconded by Mr. Robert Tawney. Discussion followed. Motion passed unanimously.

ARTICLE 6: Mr. Nelson Chitterling made the motion to adopt Article 6 as written "To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,200.00 (One thousand two hundred dollars and no cents) for the New London Hospital." Motion was seconded by Mr. Robert Tawney. Discussion followed. Motion passed unanimously.

ARTICLE 7: Mr. Earle Chandler made the motion to adopt Article 7 as written "To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$30,000.00 (Thirty thousand dollars and no cents) for the Wilmot Volunteer Fire Company, Inc." Motion was seconded by Mr. Nelson Chitterling. Discussion followed. Motion passed unanimously.

ARTICLE 8: Mr. Fred Griffin made the motion to adopt Article 8 as written "To see if the Town will vote to be a member of the regional planning commission, organized and named the Upper Valley-Lake Sunapee Council and to appropriate the sum of \$776.00, (Seven hundred seventy-six dollars and no cents) as the Town's share of the annual operating expense of the regional planning commission to be used in conjunction with other state and federal funds available for planning purposes." Motion was seconded by Mr. Richard Biron. Discussion followed. Motion passed unanimously.

ARTICLE 9: Mr. Robert Tawney made the motion to adopt Article 9 as written "To see if the Town will vote to

raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,128.00 (Two thousand one hundred and twenty-eight dollars and no cents) for the continuation of services to the low-income residents of Wilmot through the Kearsarge Valley Area Center of the Community Action Program, Belknap-Merrimack Counties, Inc." Motion was seconded by Mr. Earle Chandler. Discussion followed. Motion passed, one opposition.

ARTICLE 10: Mrs. Anita Sanborn made the motion to adopt Article 10 as written "To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000.00 (Four thousand dollars and no cents) to help in the operation of the Wilmot Learning Place, a non-profit organization which is incorporated and licensed in accordance with RSA 292 and RSA 17:E-3. This appropriation is to be used for Wilmot students only." Motion was seconded by Mrs. Jacqueline Rayno. Discussion followed.

Mrs. Mary Jane Schoeler made the motion to amend Article 10 to have the appropriation included in the next year's budget instead of a separate warrant article. Amendment was seconded by Mrs. Myrtle Newcomb. Discussion followed. Amendment passed, three opposition. Original article was passed unanimously.

ARTICLE 11: Mr. Nelson Chitterling made the motion to adopt Article 11 as written "To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,800.00 (One thousand eight hundred dollars and no cents) for the New London Ambulance Service." Motion was seconded by Mr. Robert Tawney. Discussion followed. Motion passed unanimously.

ARTICLE 12: Mr. Keith Fleury made the motion to adopt Article 12 as written "Shall we adopt the provisions of RSA 72:28, V and VI for an optional veterans' exemption and an expanded qualifying war service for veterans seeking the exemption? The optional veterans' exemption is \$100.00 rather than \$50.00." Motion was seconded by Mrs. Jacqueline Rayno. Paper ballot was taken, Yes 85, No 9. Motion passed.

ARTICLE 13: Mr. Keith Fleury made the motion to adopt Article 13 as written "Shall we adopt the provisions of RSA 72:35, IV for an optional property tax exemption on residential property for a service-connected, total disability? The optional disability exemption is \$1,400.00 rather than \$700.00." Motion was seconded by Mr. Robert Tawney. Paper ballot was taken, Yes 88, No 9. Motion passed.

ARTICLE 14: Mr. Robert Tawney made the motion to adopt Article 14 as written "To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply for any federal or state grants that may be available." Motion was seconded by John Wall. Discussion followed. Motion passed unanimously.

ARTICLE 15: Mr. Earle Chandler made the motion to adopt Article 15 as written "To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to accept any grants that may be allocated to the Town and expend same, per RSA 31:95b." Motion was seconded by Mr. Robert Tawney. Discussion followed. Motion passed unanimously.

ARTICLE 16: Mr. George Howe made the motion to adopt Article 16 as written "To see if the Town will vote to erect a memorial to Wilmot veterans of the Korean, Vietnam, and 1991 Desert Storm wars, to be paid for by the Wilmot Historical Society and contributions from the public, and select one of the following proposals: a.) incise names on the rear of existing World War II monuments; b.) incise names on a new monument to be mounted with the others in Wilmot Flat; c.) incise a memorial to all Wilmot veterans on a monument to be mounted near the Town Hall." Motion was seconded by David Hopper. Lengthy discussion followed. The Article was split into two parts:

1. "To see if the Town will vote to erect a memorial to Wilmot veterans of the Korean, Vietnam, and 1991 Desert Storm wars, to be paid for by the Wilmot Historical Society and contributions from the public." Passed

unanimously.

"a.) incise names on the rear of existing World War II monuments;

b.) incise names on a new monument to be mounted with the others in Wilmot Flat;

c.) incise a memorial to all Wilmot veterans on a monument to be mounted near the Town Hall."

Lengthy discussion followed.

a.) received 30 votes, b.) received 19 votes and c.)
received 28 votes.

Mr. Philip Currier made the motion for reconsideration of the last part of the Article since the votes were so close. Ms. Maureen Clorite seconded the motion. Lengthy discussion followed.

Mrs. Alice Chandler moved to table the second part of Article 16 until next year's town meeting. Motion was

seconded by Mrs. Julie Morse. Lengthy discussion followed. The vote was in favor of the motion 43, opposition 43. The motion was accepted.

It was requested that a new vote be taken to establish the consensus of the group between choice a and b. The results were a.) 43, b.) 43.

ARTICLE 17: Mr. Earle Chandler made the motion to adopt Article 17 as written "To see if the Town will vote to accept so-called Shadow Lane as a Class V road." Motion was seconded by Mrs. Jacqueline Rayno. Discussion followed. The motion was defeated unanimously.

ARTICLE 18: Mr. Kenneth Clarke made the motion to adopt Article 18 as written "To see if the Town will vote to accept the new layout of Patterson Road which has been deeded to the Town by Kenneth R. Clarke by Warranty Deed dated 12/28/90." Motion was seconded by Mr. Robert Tawney. Discussion followed. Motion passed, 2 opposition.

ARTICLE 19: Mr. Earle Chandler made the motion to adopt Article 19 as written "To see if the Town will vote to discontinue Patterson Road from Route 4A to junction of Clarke Road." Motion was seconded by Mr. Nelson Chitterling. Discussion followed. Mr. John Morse moved to amend Article 19 to read as follows: "To see if the Town will vote to discontinue Patterson Road from Route 4A to junction of new layout of Patterson Road." Motion was seconded. Amendment passed unanimously. Original Article passed as amended unanimously.

ARTICLE 20: Mr. Earle Chandler made the motion to adopt Article 20 as written "To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell the so-called Donald Letty lot, Map 4, Lot 18-15, said to contain 8.9 acres. Sale to be made by auction or sealed bids, whichever appears to be best for the Town. This land was acquired by the Town by Tax Collector Deed on May 31, 1990, recorded in Merrimack County Registry of Deeds, Book 1840, Page 31, dated 6/14/90." Mr. Robert Tawney seconded the motion. Discussion followed. Motion passed unanimously.

ARTICLE 21: Mr. Robert Tawney made the motion to adopt Article 21 as written "To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$20,000.00 (Twenty thousand dollars and no cents) to rebuild the bridge over Cascade Brook on Kearsarge Valley Road." Motion

seconded by Mr. Earle Chandler. Discussion followed. Motion passed unanimously.

ARTICLE 22: Mr. Nelson Chitterling made the motion to adopt Article 22 as written "To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$12,000.00 (Twelve thousand dollars and no cents) to upgrade Campground Road." Motion was seconded by Mr. Robert Tawney. Motion passed, 6 opposition.

Mr. John Morse made the motion to reconsider Article 18 to amend it to read as follows:

"To see if the Town will vote to accept the new layout of Patterson Road, which has been deeded to the Town by Kenneth R. Clarke by Warranty Deed dated 12/28/90, and to reclassify the improved Patterson Road to a Class V status." Motion was seconded. Discussion followed. Motion passed, 6 opposition. Adoption of amended Article 18 was passed unanimously.

ARTICLE 23: Mr. Douglas Smith made the motion to adopt Article 23 as written with the correction of Article #24 changed to the correct number of 17 "To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to prepare the necessary rules for recycling at the transfer station in accordance with the affirmative vote of Article 17 at the 1990 Town Meeting for the Town of Wilmot." Motion was seconded by Mr. Fred Griffin. Discussion followed. Motion passed unanimously.

ARTICLE 24: Mr. Robert Tawney made the motion to adopt Article 24 as written with the correction of the word AND changed to OR "Shall we adopt the provisions of RSA 466:30-a which made it unlawful for any dog to run at large, except when accompanied by the owner or custodian, OR when used for hunting, herding, supervised competition and exhibition or training for such?" Paper ballot was taken, Yes 65, No 26. Motion passed.

ARTICLE 25: Mr Fred Griffin made the motion to adopt Article 25 as written "To see if the Town will vote to transfer the power of the Planning Board to regulate gravel pit permits and operations to the Board of Selectmen as per RSA 155:E:1 III." Seconded by Mr. Earle Chandler. Discussion followed. Motion passed unanimously.

ARTICLE 26: Mr. Earle Chandler made the motion to adopt Article 26 as written "To see if the Town will vote to appoint the Road Agent in accordance with RSA 231:62." Motion was seconded by Mr. Robert Tawney.

Discussion followed. Motion passed, 11 opposition.

Discussion followed concerning cable and recycling. Mr. Paul Barton received a round of applause for his excellent work as Police Chief of Wilmot.

The motion was made to adjourn. Motion was seconded and the meeting was adjourned.

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PINE HILL CEMETERY ASSOCIATION

This Association is responsible for the care and preservation of two cemeteries: Pine Hill Cemetery and Church Cemetery both located in Wilmot Flat. The Association conducts elections for its Officers and Directors at our Annual Meeting held in May of each year. Our membership is drawn from owners or part owners of lots in either Cemetery.

The current Board of Directors and Officers had a most successful year, both in improvements to the Pine

Hill Cemetery and in its Fundraising for 1991.

The Board had decided late in 1990 to have the standing timber removed from an undeveloped portion of Pine Hill Cemetery in order to provide new lots for future sale.

Our largest project for 1991 was to remove the stumps on our recently cleared extension. After the stumps were removed the site had to be graded and seeded. We were most fortunate to be able to have Kenneth Clarke work on this part of the project for us. With his equipment and expertise, in no time at all, we had grass growing.

Many supporters sold raffle tickets for the "Fence Rail" Quilt, raising a total of \$1,680.00. The quilt was raffled off September 7, 1991 and the winning ticket belonged to Mrs. Alice (Bixby) Ford of Cape Neddick,

Maine.

Donations were collected for a Yard Sale, and this

brought in \$ 361.85 for our General Fund.

The mailing of our Spring Newsletter raised a total of \$ 1,530.00. All the nice comments were certainly an incentive to our Board Members. The responses included gifts to our 1991 Expansion Fund, our General Fund, New Memorial Trust Funds and additions to the current Trust Funds. The new Trust Fund receipts were added to the Trust Fund principal for future income. These are reflected on our 1991 Trust Fund Reports shown in the Town Report.

Helping us with our newsletter mailing in addition to our Board, was one of our strongest supporters, Lida (Howard) Gross of Wilmot. With her long list of friends and family connections to Pine Hill and Church Place Cemetery, she has been able to help us raise many dollars for our cemeteries. One large donation was made in honor of this lovely lady and her family. We

appreciate her efforts very much.

Memorial Donations, adding to and creating new Trusts has helped us to continue to improve and care for the two cemeteries. In the last two years our investment earnings have dropped along with the investment interest rates.

With interest rates down, we are going to have some more fundraising projects. One of those projects, that we hope you can help us with, is a cookbook that will include "Recipes from the past."

The 1992 Fundraising will include another quilt called Log cabin, made and donated by a member. Watch

for the sale of our Raffle Tickets this Spring.

Our "Cemetery Genie" program is progressing well. We have had several inquiries regarding family research. There was some surprise that our records are now computerized as to location of lots, family records of those buried in the cemeteries, and family relationships that show the descendents of some of Wilmot's early families. We were happy to provide what information was available. This program brought to us by Michael Royce of Royce Family Software of Webster, has also gained some great publicity. We know of two other towns who are now using the program to catalog their cemeteries. Those responses were most gratifying to us.

We also had inquires from other towns concerning ways they might begin to spruce up their own cemeteries. It seems that because of the location of these two cemeteries, photographers stop and capture the lovely settings. We were asked about our organization and how we achieved such lovely results the past few years.

We are grateful for your past support and will welcome any future financial help you might wish to give. If you have any questions, the following Officers and Directors can help.

LAKE SUNAPEE REGION VISITING NURSE ASSOCIATION 1991 Report of Services Provided in Wilmot

Lake Sunapee Region Visiting Nurse Association and its affiliates, Lake Sunapee Home Care and Hospice and Lake Sunapee Community Health Services, provide health care services for people in Wilmot, regardless of their ability to pay within the fiscal constraints of the agency. These services include the following: pediatric and adult home care by nurses, physical, occupational, and speech therapists, medical social workers, home health aides, homemaker, and respite workers; hospice services, including volunteers to assist people in their homes, bereavement support to families of patients who died, and volunteer training programs; well-child clinics for children from birth to six years of age; a parent-child program; nursing consultation and assistance to area day care centers and schools; and blood pressure and influenza clinics.

REPORT OF THE WILMOT PUBLIC LIBRARY

Slowly, but steadily, the physical appearance of the library is coming together as we first envisioned it several years ago. We are most grateful for donations of furniture and equipment which have made the library more comfortable and more efficient in operation: the "readers' roost" in the elementary area, the handsome circulation desk, chairs and plants, to name a few. We were given a computer which is now on-line to the State Library giving us access to almost any book anyone might request. We have also been given a new copier, smaller and more efficient than the old one. A notebook in the library lists all donations and donors.

With a view to restoring the outside of the old school house, we have had the concrete ramp removed, the original granite steps put back in place, and soon will have a new front door with three panes of glass at each side. This will replicate the front entrance as it looked in 1890.

Events during the year included an Open House on a blustery day in April, a summer reading/discussion series, a quilt exhibit, and an evening of poetry reading with Donald Hall and Jane Kenyon. We also had a month long exhibit of photographs by Arline French. For the children there was a summer story hour each Wednesday evening and an outdoor production by the Little Red Wagon, a travelling group from UNH. The Friends of the Library cooperated with us or sponsored some of these events and we are most grateful.

The State Library Advisory Council held their monthly meeting in Wilmot in September. Everyone was very impressed by the look and layout of our library.

It was a reassuring pat-on-the-back.

Kathi Donovan, Librarian, has completed the Public Library Techniques Course. Her dedication to the library and her innovative ideas are what keeps it

running smoothly.

Use of the library has substantially increased this past year. We now have 24 volunteers who man the circulation desk and help with the business of running the library. Without them we would be lost - our heartfelt thanks to all. We plan to have the library open on each of the four election days. We hope that those of you who are not already regular patrons will take the time to stop in and see the progress we have made and what we have to offer in books, magazines, video and audio tapes.

1991 REPORT OF TOWN FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND STATE FOREST RANGER

1991 was a very dry and busy year for the New Hampshire Forest Fire Service as well as local fire departments due to our increase in the number of fires. Our three major causes of fires in 1991 were non-permit, children and smoking materials. 450 wildland fires in New Hampshire burned approximately 150 acres for an average fire size of one-third acre. Wilmot had three wildland fires in 1991 of undetermined cause.

Primarily, the local fire department is responsible for extinguishing these fires. Keeping the average fire size this small is a tribute to early detection by citizens, our fire tower lookout system and the quick response of our trained local

fire departments.

In every municipality, there is a Forest Fire Warden and several Deputy Wardens that are responsible for directing suppression action on wildland fires, working with other fire department members under the direction of the NH Forest Fire Service to make sure that all fire department members are properly trained and equipped for suppressing wildland fires. Forest Fire Wardens and Deputy Wardens receive specialized training each year, presented by the NH Forest Fire Service, to keep their skill level and knowledge of forest fire laws up to date.

The local Warden and selected Deputy Wardens are also responsible for issuing burning permits for any open burning that is to be done in their community. In New Hampshire, any open burning, except when the ground is completely covered with snow, requires a written fire permit prior to lighting the fire. Before doing any open burning, it is recommended that you contact your local fire warden to see if a permit is required to save your community the cost of sending fire equipment on a false alarm. Any person violating the permit law (RSA 224:27) shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

Please help your local Warden and fire department by requesting a fire permit before kindling a fire, be understanding if they tell you it is not a safe day to burn and keep New Hampshire green! Thank you for being fire safe.

1991 REPORT OF THE WILMOT PLANNING BOARD

The Planning Board continued to experience a reduced rate of applications for subdivision and site plan review in 1991, as it did in 1990. The overheated economic atmosphere of the mid to late 1980's has cooled dramatically - a fact that is evident everywhere we look.

During the past year the Board approved three new lots as a result of three different subdivision applications. Coincidentally, the Board also approved an owner's request to revoke his formerly approved three lot subdivision. The net result for 1991 is the creation of one new lot in Wilmot! The Board also conducted a conceptual hearing that did not result in

any further action by the applicant.

In November 1991, the Board approved a site plan review for a new bed and breakfast in the village at Wilmot Flat. In this case the applicant was required, pursuant to our zoning ordinance, to first secure the Zoning Board of Adjustment's approval for a special exception. It was during that process that it became apparent that, when our present zoning requirements were adopted in 1990, they did not contain any clear written criteria for the Zoning Board of Adjustment to employ in deciding whether or not to approve a request for a special exception or variance. This is a serious omission for two reasons. First of all, it fails to provide applicants for special exceptions or variances with any notice of the benchmarks they will have to reach in order to secure an approval. Secondly, but equally important, it fails to provide the Zoning Board of Adjustment with the tools it needs to make its judgements on such applications.

Both the Zoning Board of Adjustment and the Planning Board moved quickly to address this situation by jointly developing and writing the necessary criteria down for inclusion in the Zoning Ordinance. A joint hearing of the two Boards was conducted on January 6, 1991 and the criteria, which are the same as the Zoning Board of Adjustment would traditionally use anyway in deciding these cases, were approved as an amendment to the Zoning Ordinance. You will be asked to vote on this amendment when you vote for our Town Officers by paper ballot at the daytime portion of this

year's town meeting.

Both the Planning Board and the Zoning Board of Adjustment have unanimously approved this amendment and each Board urges you to vote for its adoption. The advent of zoning in Wilmot will make the work of the Zoning Board of Adjustment more sensitive and important than ever and we must provide it with the tools it needs to treat its applicants fairly and constructively. We, as a Town, also need to be assured

that, if the Zoning Board of Adjustment needs to deny an application for special exception or variance, it has the basis to do so without undue exposure to liability from a party whose application has been turned down. The amendment you will be voting on will provide these protections.

On behalf of the Planning Board, I'd like to extend our sincere gratitude to our secretary, Carol Drake. She has mastered her job and performs it professionally and with good humor - an unbeatable

combination!

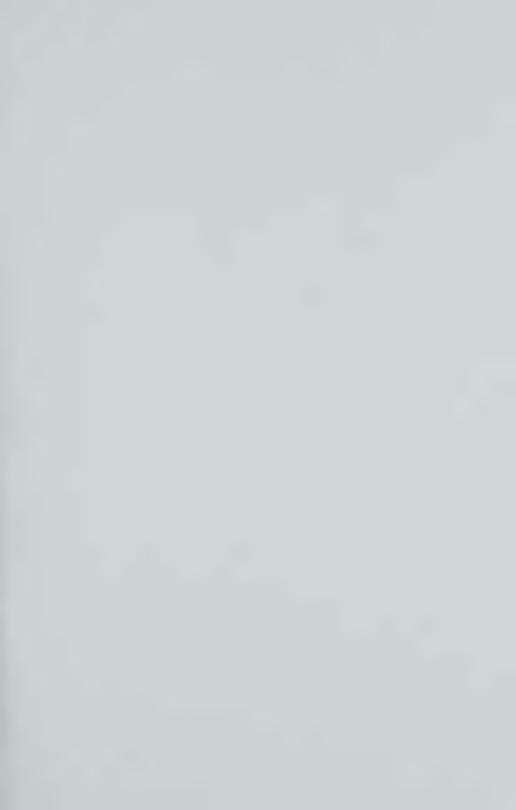

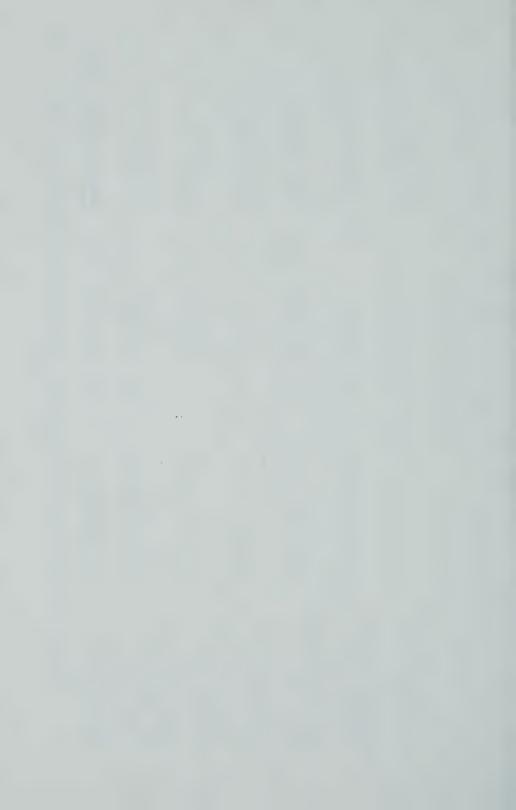
