#### TOWN WARRANT

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Litchfield, in the County of Hillsborough, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

[L. s.]

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall, in said Litchfield, on Tuesday, the eighth day of March next, at one of the clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
- 3. To vote for delegates to the National Conventions, to nominate candidates for President and Vice President of the United States.
- 4. To see what action the Town will take in regard to continuing State Aid Construction.
- 5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise or Appropriate for maintenance of State Aid Highways and Bridges.
- 6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise or appropriate for the Public Library.

- 7. To see what action the Town will take in regard to celebration of Memorial Day and make appropriation for the same.
- 8. To see what action the Town will take in regard to White Pine Blister Control.
- 9. (1) To see if the Town will vote to authorize its Selectmen through counsel to endeavor to secure proper Court authority for the Town of Litchfield and the Trustees of the Charles Bancroft Bequest, so-called:
  - First. To cancel three notes dated 1925, 1926, 1927, totaling \$4,000.00, together with their accumulated interest, for moneys advanced by said Trustees to said Town of Litchfield and expended for road construction on the highway now known as the Charles Bancroft Highway;
  - Second. To use and expend the remaining portion of said Charles Bancroft Bequest, together with any additions thereto and income accruing therefrom, for the purpose of completing, improving, reconstructing, repairing and maintaining the Charles Bancroft Highway, and for the purpose of constructing, completing, improving, reconstructing, repairing and maintaining, any bridges, culverts, guard rails and other incidental structures that are or may become advisable in connection with the public use of said Charles Bancroft Highway,—or take any other action relating thereto.
  - (2) If the Court shall duly authorize said use and expenditure of said moneys, to see if the Town will vote to appropriate the moneys of said Bequest, together with any or all additions thereto and income accruing therefrom for any of the purposes or uses stated in the previous article, or take any other action relating thereto.

10. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

#### REPORT OF TRUSTEES OF LITCHFIELD PUBLIC LIBRARY

The Trustees of the Litchfield Public Library submit the 39th Annual Report:

At the Annual Meeting held in April 1931 Mrs. Corabel B. Griffin was re-elected president and treasurer, Mr. J. Albert Reid, vice-president and Mrs. Alverta B. Barlow, secretary. Miss Florence C. Center was elected librarian and Claude J. Hopwood, janitor.

During the year the four regular meetings of the trustees were held at which time the routine business was transacted.

On April 1, 1932 the card system will go into effect. This will make it much easier to find wanted books and will, we hope, increase the number of books taken from the library.

We regret the removal from town of our janitor, Claude J. Hopwood, but we feel that we have been fortunate in securing the services of Ralph J. Lynch to carry on Mr. Hopwood's work.
