- 1. Parent-child interactions are important throughout the life cycle, especially at the beginning and the end of the life cycle. The analysis of parent-child interactions is also important for understanding intergenerational inequalities (This thesis).
- 2. Public childcare plays an important role in the long-term development of children (Chapter 2).
- 3. The use of daycare services can have an adverse effect on children from affluent families (Chapter 2).
- 4. Parental housing wealth can serve as a signal in the marriage market in China, and parental housing wealth influences children's marriage outcomes more than non-housing wealth (Chapter 3).
- 5. In China, where males outnumber females, parental housing wealth is more important for males than for females, and higher parental housing wealth will improve males' marriage prospects (Chapter 3).
- 6. The loss of a child has a negative impact on parental wellbeing in later life (Chapter 4).
- 7. In societies where son preference is prevalent, the loss of a son has a greater impact on parents than the loss of a daughter (Chapter 4).
