#### **Collection Information**

<u>Abstract</u>: This collection is comprised of newspaper volumes, illustrated magazines, lantern slides, and 2 pamphlets donated by Dr. Cynthia H. Enloe. The materials were collected by the donor's father Dr. Cortez F. Enloe, Jr. in 1930s Germany.

The 4 newspaper volumes (February 1936- June 1936) belong to 4 publishers in Frankfurt, Munich, and Heidelberg: Volksgemeinschaft Heidelberger Beobachter, General Anzeiger der Stadt Frankfurt, Das Illustrierte Blatt, and Munchner Illustrierte Presse. The 10 magazine volumes (June 1936-May 1937) belong to 3 publishers in Munich and Berlin: Munchner Illustrierte Presse, Das Illustrierte Blatt, and Illustrierter Beobachter. These periodicals reveal the increasing influence of Nazi leadership on German media, as seen through the propagandizing of the Berlin Olympics and the 550<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Heidelberg University. The 9 lantern slides document the US Trial of Nazi Physicians in 1945; the images range from prisoner experimentation, the trial itself, and executions of the condemned. The collection also contains 3 booklets on the National Socialist Party, the anniversary of Heidelberg University, Communism in Germany, and Dr. Enloe's corresponding notes.

#### **Historical/Biographical Notes**

Dr. Cortez F. Enloe was born June 1, 1910 in Jefferson City, MO. He studied Chemistry at the University of Missouri in Columbia, later traveling to Germany in pursuit of his medical degree. He took classes at the Universities of Heidelberg and Munich before obtaining a Doctorate in Medicine from the University of Berlin in 1937. To supplement his tuition, Dr. Enloe worked as a freelance journalist for *The Kansas City Star*, documenting the National Socialist Party's rise through coverage of Nazi political rallies. He married California-born Harriet Goodridge while in Germany, together raising daughters Margaret and Cynthia. Upon graduation, Dr. Enloe served as a flight surgeon for the US Army Air Corps in World War II, ultimately receiving thirteen military decorations. His positions included Assistant Surgeon of the First Fighter Command, Medical Inspector of the First Air Force, and Medical Advisor to Admiral Louis Mountbatten. He was also named Director of the Medical Services Branch for the U.S. Strategic Bombing Survey (Europe).

Dr. Enloe spent much of his Army career in Burma, serving on 39 missions before returning to Germany as an interrogator of Nazi medical scientists—some of whom were his former professors. His experience in Burma served as the inspiration for "Doc," a character in the comic strip "Terry and the Pirates" by Milton Caniff. Dr. Enloe became a prominent figure in the studies of Nutrition and Aviation medicine following his military service, organizing clinical research and lecturing both nationally and abroad. He founded the revered research journal *Nutrition Today* in 1966, for which he served as both editor and contributor. Dr. Enloe was inducted into a number of prestigious organizations during his career; he held membership with the Royal Academy of Medicine (London), the New York Academy of Medicine, and the American College of Preventative Medicine.

Dr. Enloe was also honored with the US Navy Antarctic Medal and a Fellowship to the Royal Geographic Society of London. He lent his expertise to both the New York State Medicine Society as Chairman of the Space Medicine Section and the US Air Force as consultant to the Surgeon General. In 1978, Dr. Enloe's research garnered him an invitation to the International Congress on Circumpolar Health on behalf of the USSR Academy of Medical Science's Siberian Branch. He spent his final years in Annapolis, where he passed away in 1995. The impact of his leadership in both the military and medical field was felt internationally. This collection is indicative of Dr. Enloe's resourcefulness and lifelong dedication to education.

The vibrantly illustrated newspapers, magazines, and booklets highlight the increasingly propagandic nature of periodicals in prewar Germany. Printed in typical 1930s German typescript, they form a unique snapshot of the Weimar Republic's culture and politics. These materials grant valuable insight to Nazism in everyday life. The lantern slides represent the postwar portion of the collection, documenting the violent crimes of the U.S. Trial of Nazi Physicians and their fatal aftermath.

#### **Scope and Content**

This collection is comprised of 4 newpapers, 8 magazines, 9 lantern slides, and 6 booklets belonging to Dr. Cortez F. Enloe of Annapolis, MD. The newspapers, magazines, and booklets were compiled in Berlin, Heidelberg, Munich, and Frankfurt from 1932-1937. The lantern slides depict the U.S. Trial of Nazi physicians and the events leading up to it.
