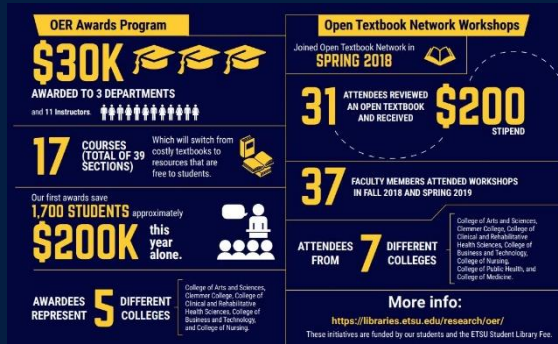
Snapshot of ETSU

- Open Textbook Network (OTN) Workshop
- OER Awards Program

Current Program (2020 -)

- "Saving Bucs" Workshop
- Open and Affordable Course Materials Awards Program

Pilot Program

OTN Workshops

- Continuously adapted from OTN template
- 79 faculty attendees from 6 colleges
- 58 submitted reviews/received stipends

OER Awards

- Focused on OER: Adopt, Adapt, Create
- Offered stipends and support to awardees
- \$56,400 awarded to individuals/departments
- OERs implemented in 31 courses/61 sections
- Saved approx. \$280,000 for 1,900 students

*Both funded by the Student Library Fee

Current Program

"Saving Bucs" Workshops

- Supports Open and Affordable
- Includes more local cases and data
- No review stipend

Open/Affordable Awards

- Supports Open and Affordable
- Streamlined, less jargon
- Budget reduction
- Funded by Student Library Fee and CTE/Provost Office

Students Love Open

Students mentioned four specific positives about open/affordable materials in their comments:

- **Cost:** The materials were free.
- **Use or Access:** The materials were available online and had features that enhanced their experience such as searching and highlighting.
- **Content:** The materials were detailed, digestible, and relevant.
- **Pedagogy:** The materials improved the classroom learning experience.

Surveys say

Surveys were distributed to faculty who received the OER Award. Over the Fall 2019 and Spring 2020 semester, we received survey responses from 23 faculty.

- 95.4% of faculty reported that the open/affordable materials they selected were either the same as or better than the quality of the texts in their other courses.
- 95.7% are likely to use open/affordable materials for other courses they teach in the future.
- 54.5% would have implemented OERs in their courses without the incentive of the Awards Program.
- 100.0% of faculty supported continuation of the OER Awards.

Common faculty challenges

- Time consuming to compile and customize materials
- 65.0% reported spending more time preparing for their course(s) than in previous semesters
- Lack of open/affordable materials (including supplementary materials such as assessments)
- Department-level decisions may change the materials for individual instructors

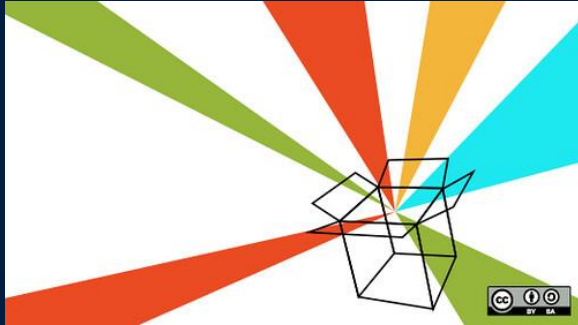

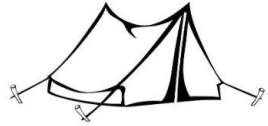

- Purchase e-textbooks with unlimited licenses

- Works in tandem with current Open/Affordable Program
- Funded by ETSU Instructional Design Grant and Student Library Fee

SGA Resolution on Access Codes

- SGA Resolution: Encourage use of course management system and discourage use of other digital learning systems
- Working group of faculty, staff, students, administrators
- Environmental scan of the issue in the resolution
- Report reinforced need to support Open and Affordable

Experiences

State Grant on OER and Diversity

- Tennessee Board of Regents (TBR) grant on OER and Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion
- Works in tandem with current OA Program
