John Knops prominent retired Stearns county farmer, was born January 18, 1886, at Montford, Holland, the son of Peter and Helena (Bongaarst) Knops.

Peter and Helena (Bongaast) Knops were born in Holland, the former of whom was born May 10, 1829, at Montford and the latter was born May 1, 1833 at Lumburg.

On September 15, 1881, Peter Knops his wife and six children, Catherine, John, Anton, Mary, Martin and Elizabeth migrated to America.

During their last years in Holland floods destroyed their crops and for that reason the family decided to make their home in America.

The trip across the Atlantic was made on the English Red Star Line. After landing at New York, the family at once came west to St. Anthony, Stearns County, Minnesota, where they made their home with Joseph Craemer family for a short time.

The Craemer's had migrated to America from Holland several years before and were old acquaintances of the Knops family.

During the first winter the family shared a home with Mrs. Mary Winter, who resided near St. Anthony. In the spring Peter Knops purchased an eighty acre tract of wild land near the village of St. Anthony. A log house and barn were the first buildings. In later years, after having put the land into a tillable state, new and modern buildings were erected.

At the time of his death, which occurred December 15, 1899. Peter Knops had transformed the wilderness into a modern dairy farm.

His wife died June 19, 1904. Both are buried in the Catholic Cemetery at St. Anthony.

The daughter Catherine is Mrs. Hubert Boeckers of St. Frances, Minnesota. Anton married Anna Weber and they reside at Melrose, Minnesota. Mary is Mrs. Adam Loehlein of Milwaukee, Wisconsin. Martin married Elizabeth Boeckers and they reside on a farm near Northholm, Minnesota. Elizabeth is Mrs. Mike Gresser of Freeport, Minnesota.

After the death of his father, John Knops took over the home farm, and also added another 80 acres.

In 1938, when he retired to the village of Albany, he had built his farm into one of the outstanding dairy farms of this community.

On June 14, 1896, he married Anna Gresser.

Anna Gresser was born August 22, 1871 at New Munich, Minnesota, the daughter of Christian and Margaret (Lendner) Gresser. She attended the district school at New Munich and was at home until the time of her marriage.

John and Anna (Gresser) Knops are the parents of twelve children -

Peter born - - - - - married Elizabeth Prsybilla of Pierz, Minnesota. They reside at Pierz, where he is employed as a carpenter.

Marie, is Mrs. Ewald Hubrig of Redding, California.

Rudolph married Esther Hormann of Albany and they reside at Waite Park, Minnesota.

Beata is Mrs. George Salchert of Minneapolis.

Alphonse is employed at Lincoln, California.
