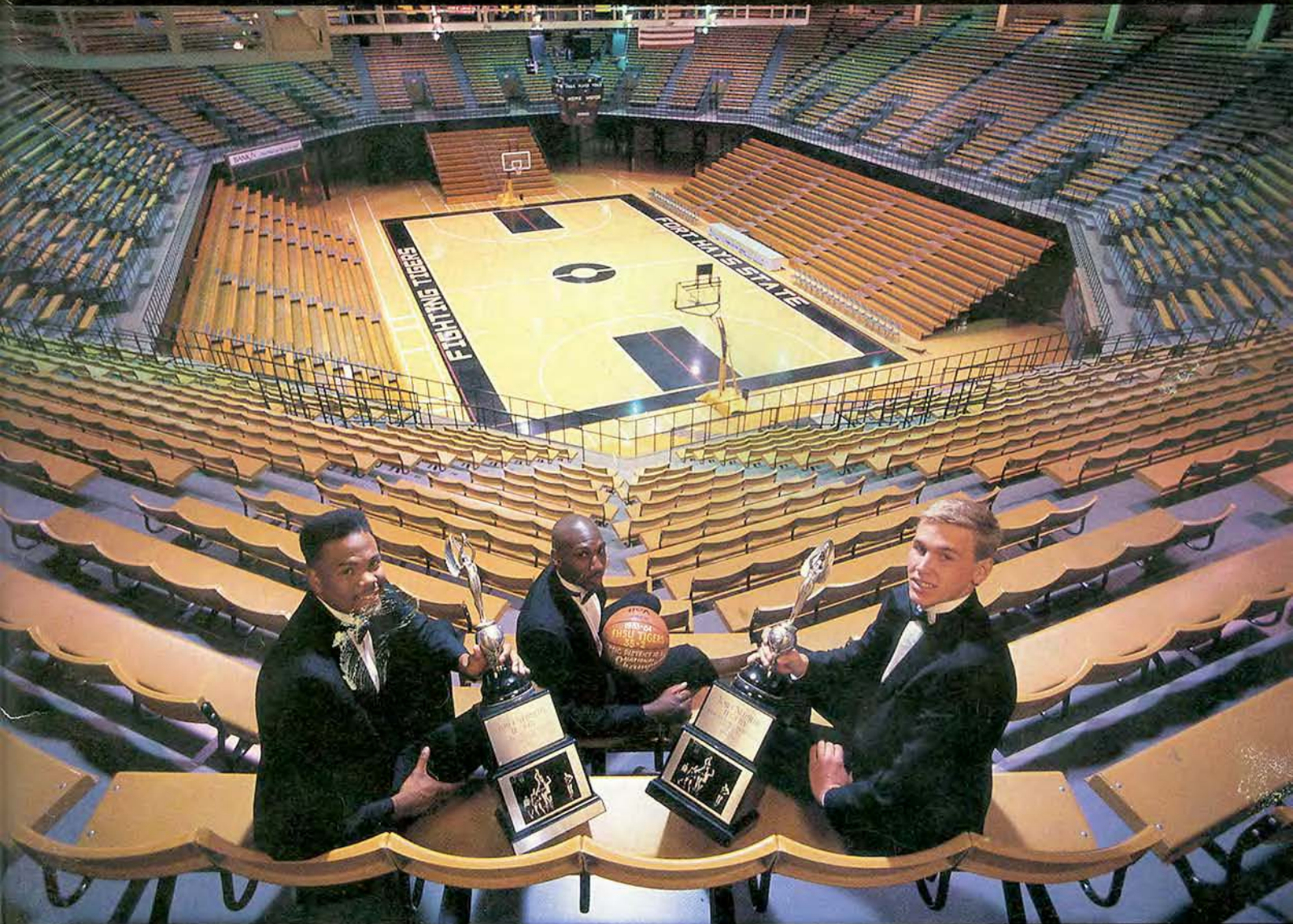

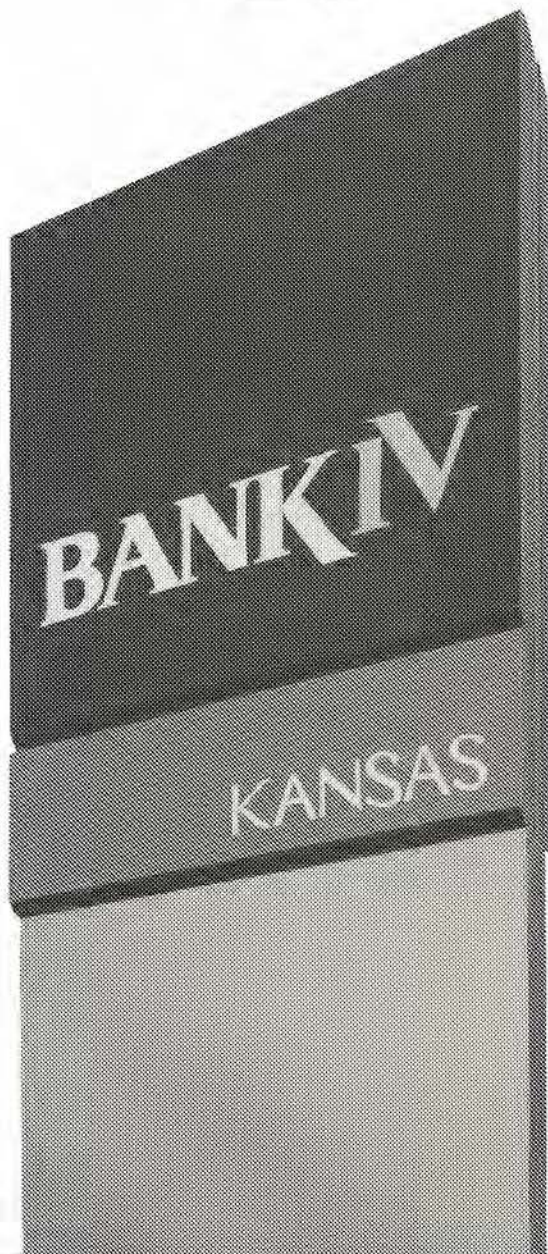

Dr. Edward Hammond - President



Dr. Edward H. Hammond, 46, is the eighth President of Fort Hays State University. A man of boundless enthusiasm and energy, whose style is upbeat and progressive. President Hammond was born in McAllen, Texas, but reared in the Kansas City, Kansas, area.

Prior to his current post, President Hammond gained education experiences and shared his expertise at the University of Louisville, Seton Hall University, Southern Illinois University, Purdue University and the University of Missouri-Columbia.

President Hammond has been extremely active since assuming the leadership of the University in the summer of 1987. He laid the ground work for the Western Kansas Educational Compact, a cooperative educational initiative between FHSU and the community colleges in Western Kansas; is watching his dream to totally computerize the campus quickly become reality; created a Western Kansas Coalition, an organization comprised of business

and community leaders from 57 Western Kansas counties; helped to establish scholarship programs for potential minority school teachers at Garden City and Liberal; has played a major role in the furthering economic development in Hays and Western Kansas; and recently introduced a voice main system that will vault the foreign language efforts of FHSU into an elite class.

President Hammond has published widely and is in demand nationally as an education consultant because of his expertise in risk management, sexual harassment, and alcohol education issues.

The Hammond family includes Viv (Hammeke), formerly of Ellinwood, daughters Kelly and Julie, and son Lance.

Tom Spicer - Director of Athletics



When Tom Spicer was named to the director of athletics post at Fort Hays State University on July 27, 1989, he said it was something he had dreamed about for quite some time. Spicer is starting his second year as director of athletics and has emphasized a return to athletic and academic excellence.

A native of Beaver, OK, Spicer attended secondary schools

in Hays. He is a graduate of Hays High School and earned a bachelor of science degree from Fort Hays State in 1972. He played varsity football for the Tigers in his collegiate days. Spicer also received his master of science degree from FHSU in 1977. He is completing a specialist in education degree with work at both Southeastern Oklahoma State University and Wichita State University.

Spicer made the move from director of athletics and dean of student affairs at Butler County Community College in El Dorado back to FHSU. "I look at this as a good, professional move," Spicer said at the announcement of his appointment at FHSU. "I will have an excellent opportunity to share my knowledge and experiences and will gain some new experiences at a quality, four year institution. Everyone in the midwest knows that Fort Hays

State University is a great school."

The 39-year-old Spicer also has experience as director of athletics, physical education instructor, head football and track coach for the Durant, OK, School District. Previous to his work in Oklahoma, he taught and coached at Salina South High School, at Bishop Miege High School in Shawnee Mission and at Schlagle High School in Kansas City, KS.

Spicer is married to the former Kathy McGovern of Colorado Springs, CO. She received a bachelor of arts degree in sociology from Fort Hays State in 1972. The Spicers have four children: Mathew (15), Amber (12), Kristen (10), and Allison (8).

Bill Morse - Head Basketball Coach

Bill Morse is a winner. His coaching numbers tell the entire story. In 13 years as a head basketball coach he has compiled a 333-94 record and a winning percentage of .780. Since coming to Fort Hays State in 1982, Morse has the Tigers winning at a .804 clip while compiling an impressive 217-53 record. His record in post-season play at Fort Hays State is even more remarkable. In 39 games he has guided the Tigers to 29 wins and two NAIA National Championships.

Morse has built a basketball power that is both respected and feared across the country. From a spectator's point of view, his brand of hard-nosed defense and fast-breaking offense has put the fun back into the game. There is nothing that quite compares to the atmosphere of excitement and electricity his teams bring to a jam-packed Gross Memorial Coliseum on the FHSU campus.

The coaching efforts of Morse have not gone unnoticed. He was honored in 1987-88 as the

Co-Coach of the Year in NAIA District 10 for winning the district title. In his first season as Tiger head coach, Morse was selected as the CSIC and District 10 Coach of the Year in 1982-83. Morse also garnered KABC (Kansas Association of Basketball Coaches) and NAIA Area 4 recognition that



same year. He was named the CSIC's best coach for the 1983-84 season. In 1985 when the Tigers brought home a second national title, Morse won the following coach of the year honors- NAIA National, NAIA Area 3, Co-District 10, CSIC, and KABC.

The native of Winona, Minnesota, played basketball at Winona State University. He earned both his Bachelor of Arts and Master's in Education at Winona State.

Morse coached at the high school level from 1964-71. He also held coaching positions at Dominican College (NY) and Alpena CC (MI).

Morse came to Fort Hays State by way of Hillsdale College in Hillsdale, Michigan. He posted a 116-41 mark as the head coach at Hillsdale. The Chargers made one NAIA National Championship appearance with a fourth place finish in 1981. Morse's teams won over eighty percent of their games at Hillsdale in 1978-79 with a 24-6 record and 1980-81 with a 28-7 season total.

Morse ranks as the second winningest coach in FHSU basketball history. Only Cade Suran with 264 wins over the course of 19 seasons has more victories. In his 11 year tenure as a collegiate coach, Morse has had three seasons with over 30 wins, 11 seasons of 20 or more victories and the most losses any of his teams have suffered was 13.

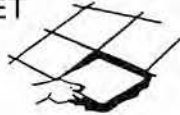

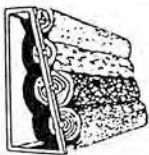

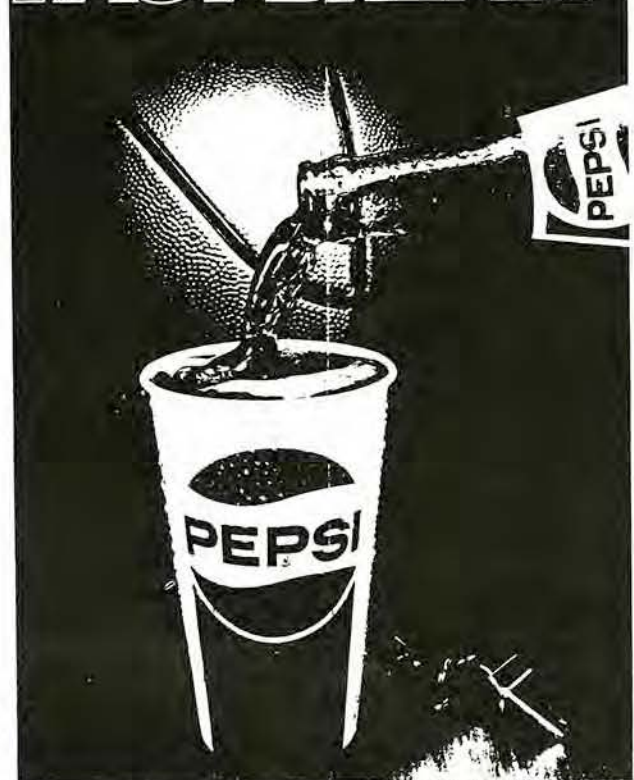

Chad Wintz begins his initial season on the Fort Hays State basketball staff. Wintz has extensive college basketball coaching experience, a total of seven years as a player and coach, with most of that coming within the state of Kansas. He has additional responsibilities at FHSU as the head golf coach.

Wintz is a native of Colby and has held basketball coaching stints at the University of Kansas, Wichita State University and Colby Community College. He has learned from a pair of the state's most respected coaches in recent years, Larry Brown at Kansas and Eddie Fogler at Wichita State.

He played junior college basketball and golf at Butler County Community College in El Dorado. Wintz went on to finish his undergraduate education at the University of Kansas where he completed a Bachelor of General Studies in 1987. He was a member of the KU basketball squad from 1984-87.

Wintz earned a Master's degree in Sports Administration from Wichita State University in May of 1990. He spent the 1989-90 season as an assistant coach at Colby Community College in his hometown.

The camp circuit has been a regular part of Wintz's summers with Dean Smith's North Carolina Basketball School, Larry Brown's University of Kansas Basketball School, the Northwest Kansas Area Basketball Camp and Kansas All-Star Basketball Camp on his list of stops.

Wintz has responsibilities within the basketball office in the areas of recruiting, academics and office organization.

Wintz, 25, is single.

Graduate assistant coach Kevin Newsome is in his second season at Fort Hays State. Newsome came to the Tiger program after a stint at Mesabi Community College in Minnesota. He earned his bachelor's degree at Sonoma State in

California. Newsome is completing work on his master's degree at FHSU. He is a native of Philadelphia, PA.

42 FRANK BEATTY 6-4 195 Junior Guard/Forward Pasadena, California

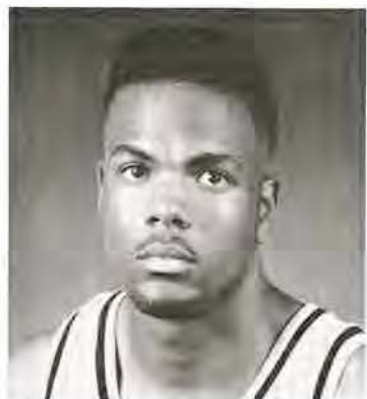

FORT HAYS STATE UNIVERSITY

Founded in 1902 on the Plains of Western Kansas, Fort Hays State University is the second youngest of the six state universities of higher education.

From an exciting beginning, when 34 students were greeted by two faculty members and a 19-course curriculum, our University has grown to a student body of 5,200, a faculty of nearly 300, a support staff of 250 and a curriculum comprised of 1,500 courses.

Fort Hays State University is one of seven state-assisted universities governed by a Board of Regents appointed by the Governor of the State of Kansas.

The main campus of FHSU sits on 200 of the 4,160 acres owned by the state of Kansas and deeded to the University. Winding Big Creek, with its shady, grassy banks, traverses the campus and

provides not only a tranquil, conducive learning atmosphere, but also a natural laboratory for students in the biological sciences. Our campus has often been called the prettiest in Kansas.

Fort Hays State University is located in Hays, the largest city in northwest Kansas. A progressive city of 17,500 people, Hays is an old cow town on the Union Pacific railroad. The old and the new blend beautifully to form a city that is small enough you can feel comfortable in, yet is large enough to provide culture and shopping facilities second to none.

The University is comprised of four colleges: Arts and Sciences, Business, Education, and Health and Life Sciences, and a Graduate School.

FHSU is academically superior to many comparable universities and is

richly endowed by heritage and tradition. A recent survey of our students showed that while there are a multitude of reasons why students come to our University, their overwhelming response was "because of the University's reputation for academic excellence."

Fort Hays State University supports one of the most extensive intercollegiate sports programs of any comparable size college or university in America. More than 350 athletes annually compete in seven men's and five women's sports. Fort Hays State University recently joined the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference, but will not compete for the football championship in the conference in 1990. The RMAC is comprised of schools from the states of Kansas, Colorado, Nebraska and New Mexico.

Tiger Basketball Update

THE TIGERS:

The 1990-91 Tigers are off and running to a 3-0 start early in the season, but will get their biggest test of the year when Washburn University travels to Hays on Dec. 3.

The Ichabods knocked off the Black & Gold all three times the two schools met last season including a convincing 70-56 win in the NAIA District 10 playoffs. Sophomore Lance Sparks led Washburn in the playoff contest with 23 points. The Ichabods will miss center Jeff Markray who was a key in all of the meetings with FHSU a year ago. WU will rely on NCAA Division I transfers Todd Alexander (University of Kansas) and Todd Stanfield (Kansas State University) at the guard spots although Sparks and Lonnie Hiebert manned those spots in 1989-90.

Washburn enters the FHSU game with an uncharacteristic 1-3 record after an 0-2 trip to Alabama and Louisiana for Thanks-

giving. The Ichabods only win this season was over Bethel College.

The Tigers are coming off a pair of wins in the Thanksgiving Country Kitchen Classic at Hays. FHSU defeated Abilene Christian 95-78 on the first night of the tournament. Senior forward/center Rod Tatum and junior guard Mark Willey each contributed 22 points against the Wildcats.

On Saturday Nov. 24, the Tigers took on a talented Mississippi College squad that was coming off of a 21-7 season, but had lost all returning starters from that squad. The Choctaws whipped Emporia State on the opening night of the classic by a 71-66 count.

Fort Hays State opened a 19-9 lead after the two teams battled for the lead in the early minutes of the game. The Tigers never let Mississippi College back into the game and salted away a 15 point win.

FHSU was led by a different pair of

Tigers than on opening night. Junior college transfers Frank Beatty and Damian Evans hit for 20 points apiece.

The all-tournament squad was dominated by Tigers & Hornets with Tatum earning MVP honors after compiling 30 points and 19 rebounds in two games.

Also on the squad for Fort Hays State were Willey and senior forward/center Troy Zierke. Willey tallied 31 points in the tournament. Zierke, who has proven to be a force on the boards for the Tigers with a 10.3 average after three games, pulled down 17 rebounds against Abilene Christian and eight more against the Choctaws. Zierke also logged 21 points.

The Tigers will travel to a tourney at Abilene Christian in Abilene, TX on Dec. 7-8, but will return to play Spirit Express on Dec. 14 to round out the pre-Christmas schedule. FHSU will make a return trip to Topeka to compete in the WIBW Tournament hosted by Washburn.

John Klein - Head Coach

John Klein has carried the women's basketball program at Fort Hays State to new heights. Now entering his fifth season as the head coach of the women's program at FHSU, Klein has accomplished two milestones that put the program among the best in its class. The 1989-90 Lady Tigers posted a school record 22 wins which was only the second 20-win season at FHSU. And as a result of the fine campaign a year ago, the Black & Gold was ranked for the first time in the history of the program. FHSU earned the #17 spot in the preseason NAIA Coaches Top 20 Poll this year.

Klein has compiled a 69-47 record in four seasons at FHSU, and overall stands at 135-91 in eight seasons at the collegiate level. The 1989-90 season was his most successful stint as a college coach. The Lady Tigers posted the 22 wins and earned a CSIC Championship in the final year of the league.

Starting his collegiate coaching career at Lakeland College in Sheboygan, Wisconsin, Klein ran up a four-year record of 66-44 for .600 winning percentage before joining the Lady Tiger program.

The 32-year-old native of Schofield, WI, has also seen some international experience, serving as the head coach on a USA Scandivavian Tour in 1983. In 1987-88, Klein and the FHSU women participated in the Great Goombay Shootout in Naussau, The Bahamas.

Klein earned his bachelor's degree from the University of Wisconsin-LaCrosse in 1980 and a Master of Science (Administration of Physical Education & Athletic Programs) from the University of Illinois-Chicago in 1981.

Klein is married to the former Nettie Robertson.

Tom Burkhart- Assistant Coach

Tom Burkhart enters his fourth year as the assistant in the Lady Tiger program. After serving as an undergraduate student assistant for two seasons, Burkhart has received his bachelor's degree and is now working toward a master's degree. A physical education major, he also attended Dodge City Community College and Kansas State University before coming to Fort Hays State.

Klein indicates that he is pleased and fortunate to have Burkhart as an assistant. "I know his title is graduate assistant, but he does everything any other assistant coach would do," Klein said. "He is responsible for not only on the court coaching, but also organizational aspects as well."

Burkhart, a Kinsley native, married the former Suzie Maska in August of 1989.

Lady Tiger Basketball Update

THE LADY TIGERS:

The Fort Hays State women's basketball squad lost its season opener on the road to Denver University, 78-76, on Nov. 16, but since has rebounded to win two games in the Thanksgiving Country Kitchen Classic at Gross Memorial Coliseum on the FHSU campus.

The Lady Tigers knocked off the University of Southern Colorado, 61-51, behind the 25 point, 13 rebound performance of senior center Annette Wiles. Wiles became the all-time leading scorer in the contest against the Indians and now stands atop the scoring list with 1,586 points in her three-plus seasons at Fort Hays State. She eclipsed the mark of 1,552 set by Roberta Augustine from 1979-83. Sophomore forward DeAnn Wiles also logged double figure scoring against Southern Colorado with 10 points.

The Lady Tigers also blitzed St. Mary of the Plains College in the second night of the classic by a 69-43 score. St. Mary's is the defending District 10 champion but is playing without Lori Flax and Treva Batman who have graduated. FHSU had a balanced attack and everyone saw plenty of playing time against St. Mary of the Plains. Annette Wiles led the way again with 13 points. Wiles was named the most valuable player of the Thanksgiving Country Kitchen Classic.

Fort Hays State has a busy slate of games prior to final exams and will have played Washburn University at Topeka on Nov. 27 and Hastings College at Hays on Nov. 29 prior to the Central State University contest on Dec. 1. FHSU will play five straight home contests starting with the Hastings game prior to the holiday break. After Central State, the Lady Tigers have a return match with Denver University on Dec. 8, play Regis College

on Dec. 16, and host Missouri Western State College on Dec. 17. Following the first semester blitz the Black & Gold will have two weeks off to prepare for Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference competition which gets underway on Jan. 3 at Mesa State College in Grand Junction, CO.

After three games, Annette Wiles leads the team in scoring with a 20.0 average and she also is the leading rebounder with a 10.3 per game average. Also scoring in double digits are sophomore guard Petrece Faulkner at 10.3 and junior forward Deb Smith with 10.0. Smith ranks second in rebounding with an 8.3 average.

The Lady Tigers have won 21 consecutive games at GMC heading into the Hastings game and will have ample opportunity to extend that streak with the number of games to be played on the home floor this month.

Gross Memorial Coliseum

Gross Memorial Coliseum is the home of the Fort Hays State "Fighting Tigers". The 7,000-seat arena was finished in August of 1973 at a cost of seven million dollars. The Tigers made the move across campus from Sheridan Coliseum which seated 2,000. Paul "Busch" Gross is the namesake of the Coliseum. Gross coached basketball at FHSU from 1930 to 1946 and totaled 150 wins and 88 losses in 14 seasons. GMC received a new 1/8 inch layer of Proturf in October of 1988 to replenish the cracked and discolored surface after 15 years.

The Coliseum has most recently been the site of four District 10 Championship wins for Bill Morse's teams. In the Morse era, the Tigers have compiled a seven-year record of 128-12 for a winning percentage of .914 at Gross Memorial Coliseum. Fort Hays State led the nation (non-NCAA institutions) in home attendance during the 1984-85, 1986-87 and 1987-88 seasons.

In the first game ever played at Gross Memorial Coliseum on November 30, 1973, FHSU defeated East Central State (OK) University, 74-68. Chuck Brehm coached the first team to play at GMC and his squad won 11 of 14 home contests that year. Also in that historical first game, Greg Standish scored a game high 20 points and pulled down nine rebounds.

M.C. Cunningham Hall is part of the total Health, Physical Education and Recreation/Athletic complex at Fort Hays State. Cunningham Hall houses HPER offices, classrooms, a swimming pool, four full-sized gymnasiums, eight handball/racquetball courts, a weight room, two dance studios, a wrestling room and the Ed McNeil Gymnastics Room.

Gross Memorial Coliseum is a multi-purpose facility that hosts concerts (seating for 10,000), the KSHSAA State 1A Basketball Tournament, the KSHSAA State 1A-2A-3A Wrestling Championships and indoor meets including the Alex Francis Invitational. The Coliseum houses the FHSU athletic offices, a large athletic training room, locker rooms, concession stands, a press box and the newest addition is the Fields Weight Room which features full nautilus equipment, free weights, mirrors and a full-time supervisor.

Fort Hays State University takes pride in its basketball facility and sees it as one of the most modern and comprehensive complexes in the country.

Drugs and the Athlete... a losing combination.



Athletes command a unique position in American society and in societies throughout the world. Many view the athlete as a hero who strives for perfection. The public expects excellence, and to achieve these high standards and thereby maintain public favor, the athlete must maintain peak alertness, responsiveness, efficiency and coordination.

A small segment of the athlete population has resorted to the use of drugs (e.g., anabolic steroids, amphetamines and various "street drugs") purported to improve physical performance. The decision to use drugs to improve physical performance, for the most part, has not been based on sound information and could have dire physical consequences for involved individuals. Further, such usage violates NCAA ethical principles.

The ethics of sport need to be emphasized, particularly in that taking drugs to improve performance constitutes cheating. There is need to reemphasize the fact that the important thing in sport is to compete honorably; to win at all costs is a contradiction to the meaning of sport.

The athlete should not carry all the blame for the situation. Coaches, trainers and the medical profession need to share some of this burden, as does the public, for expecting and frequently demanding a winning effort every time.

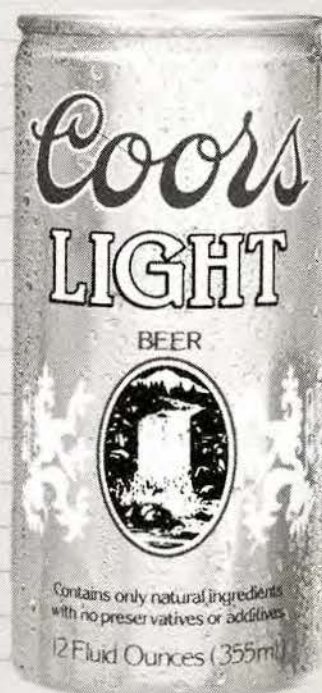
Society has placed a number of demands upon the athlete. If one believes that athletes and the general public will make sound judgments most of the time when provided with the necessary information, educating athletes and others about drug effects, appropriate drug use and the skills needed to cope with such problems could have substantial benefits to the individual and to society.
