Attached is a signed copy of the extension center agreement between Fort Hays State University and Wichita State University. If this meets your approval, please sign and return. If there are other provisions you want included, we will need to address them.

Colonel Spencer, my boss at Region Headquarters, asked me to explore two additional areas with you pertaining to the agreement. If required, we can generate an amendment to the agreement to cover them. The first is that I initially be designated as the Professor of Military Science at FHSU, and the officer on station there be designated as an Assistant Professor of Military Science. As the program develops and possibly even before FHSU gains a full ROTC detachment, my "title" would be transferred to the man or woman at Fort Hays.

The second point pertains to the waiver of tuition and fees for courses in Military Science. The rationale behind this centers around the reduced costs of offering ROTC courses relative to other courses, due to our instructors being paid by the U.S. Government rather than by the State of Kansas. Obviously, according to the agreement between WSU and FHSU, there are some costs borne by you in the form of support such as facilities and administrative assistance. Perhaps we can find some mutually satisfactory common ground. Wichita State does charge full tuition and fees for Military Science.

Thank you for your time and assistance. I talk frequently with Ruth; she is doing a fantastic job in supporting the "start-up" of your ROTC program.
