Editor and Reviewer comments:

Reviewer #1: Methods:

In revised draft the methodology is properly explained

Results:

Interpretation:

Interpretation is much clear and meaningful

Other comments:

I would suggest, place the questionnaire in appendix instead of methodology part. Use decimal in results instead of comma

Reviewer #2: 1. Islamic banking is an ethical banking. There are many ethical values embedded in it. There are extensive literature discussing ethical values such as tauhid (Oneness of God), amanah (trust), adil (justice), balanced, cooperation, loyalty, honesty, etc. Therefore, selections of the ethical values and items to represent the values must be done based on extensive readings, both based on theoretical and empirical studies. Improper method might result in biased and invalid conclusions.

2. The study has chosen only four ethical values of Islamic banking without strong justification. The values are subsequently represented by only 12 items for 2 groups of community, namely Islamic banking employees and customers. Some of the items are quite general; they are not strongly related to Islamic banking practices and not supported by extensive previous studies (particularly empirical studies). These methods are not sufficient and might lead to invalid conclusions.

3. The samples are respondents living in a particular city in Indonesia, namely Makassar city which is known with its religious people. Hence, it is more appropriate to classify the study as a case study (of a pious city). Additionally, generalization of the current results is less appropriate.

4. It is possible that the respondents' perceptions are influenced by their knowledge, education background and other characteristics which are not explored in this study. The findings must be linked with the characteristics of respondents, which in this case are not well elaborated.

5. This study is 'too big'. I suggest the authors to focus the study into (i) theoretical discussions to derive the main ethical values of Islamic banking, or (ii) empirical studies which focus either on employees or consumers of Islamic banking. The study could then analyze their observance to the selected ethical values according to their specific characteristics.
