## **Editors' Introduction and Acknowledgements**

Some readers of this volume were expecting the title to contain the word "proceedings." Others, seeing "Volume 6" in the title, will wonder, "Where are the first five volumes?" Let us explain. All of the research papers published in this volume were first presented at the Coalition for Education in the Outdoors (CEO) Sixth Biennial Research Symposium. Articles from the first five CEO symposia were published as "proceedings." While the word "proceedings" rightly signaled that the papers were associated with a gathering of scholars (something we wanted to convey) the word "proceedings" conveyed to many that the articles were accepted for publication without review (something we did not want to convey). Articles appearing in this volume and earlier CEO "proceedings" have always passed two levels of blind review—one a screening of abstracts to be accepted for the symposium, the other a screening of articles submitted for the resulting publication. The CEO Research Committee wanted the name of our publication to reflect better the rigor and efforts of the authors and reviewers. *Research in Outdoor Education, Volume* 6, is the name the Committee chose.<sup>1</sup>

A juried publication takes support and help from many different people. We are fortunate to have a strong Research Committee to guide the process and provide input on the conference as well as the publication. Our sincere thanks goes to the panel of reviewers who gave their time and expertise to provide valuable feedback to the authors. We also appreciate the thoughtfulness with which authors carefully considered the reviewers' suggestions and strengthened manuscripts, which resulted in much needed documentation to issues within the field of outdoor education. We believe the strength of the manuscripts found in this publication is evidence of the value and rigor of the peer-review process. We are also happy to publish many of the abstracts of the papers presented at the conference. While the abstracts were not refereed, their contribution to the field cannot be ignored. We hope that you also enjoy the special tribute to Rey Carlson written by Joel Meier. How fitting that our symposium was held at the same time as the remembrance of the 100<sup>th</sup> birthday of this well-loved icon of outdoor education!
