Important information on BAföG:

- Under this act, students can receive a BAföG loan of up to 941 euro a month.
- Repayment is not due until five years after the standard period of study has elapsed – and even then, only half of the original loan without interest and a maximum of 10.010 Euro!
- BAföG recipients are also exempt from Rundfunkbeitrag (English: broadcast license fees).

Applying for BAföG

You can apply for BAföG online or you can download all the forms to apply for BAföG as PDFs; the forms are also available in paper form at Studentenwerk Dresden. BAföG is approved for a period of one year. Please file your BAföG initial application or repeat application in due time, i.e. two months before your studies begin or the approval period expires.

Counseling and Social Affairs

With our counseling and support programs, we wish to help you start, continue and end your degree course even when your life circumstances become difficult or you experience problems in your studies. We offer assistance in orientation and decision making as well as competent psychosocial and legal counseling.

Social Counseling

Competent counselors help you find answers to questions relating to earning a livelihood while studying, pregnancy and child care or studying with a disability or chronic illness as well as other complex situations. International students are also invited to receive counseling on such topics. Counseling takes place in the form of one-on-one talks.

Psychosocial Counseling Center (PSB)

The PSB offers psychosocial counseling to students with psychological difficulties such as exam nerves, difficulties with working or finishing one's studies, social anxiety, conflict with one's partner, friends or family, a lack of self-esteem and/or depressive states. During our open office hours or an arranged first meeting, we can explore through a confidential one-on-one interview what type of assistance will work best for you (counseling, coaching, therapy, etc.). Our PSB program includes approx. 10 meetings during the semester. The PSB also offers seminars and workshops on various topics.
