



HEADLINES: OREGON

- August 19: The Oregon Legislature has approved a \$35 million program to provide financial relief to those who have experienced economic hardships due to COVID-19. Oregonians are now able to apply for a one-time payment of \$500 if eligible. There are more than 150 locations statewide where eligible individuals will be able to receive relief checks via participating credit unions and banks.
- August 18: The OHA opened grant applications to not-for-profit organizations statewide, Oregon's nine federally recognized Tribes and the Urban Indian Health Program. The grants come from legislatively directed \$45 million in federal CARES Act COVID-19 relief funds. The aim of these grants is to address the disproportionate impact the pandemic has had on Oregon's tribal communities and communities of color by assisting people with health and economic disruptions, food insecurity and housing, and safety and violence prevention.





Vaccine Update: There are seven companies worldwide with vaccines in phase three testing (effectiveness tests in large study populations): The U.S's Moderna (Institutes of Health), Germany's BioNTech (Pfizer and Fosun Pharma), China's CanSino Biologics (Academy of Military Medical Sciences), Britain and Sweden's AstraZeneca (University of Oxford), China's Wuhan Institute of Biological Products (Sinopharm), China's Sinopharm (Beijing Institute of Biological Products), and China's Sinovac Biotech.

Good News Internationally: The prime minister of Australia has signed a letter of intent with drug maker AstraZeneca to manufacture a coronavirus vaccine in Australia. If the vaccine trials prove successful, the vaccine will be made free to 25 million Australians. The effectiveness of the vaccine will be tested in larger groups of human trials over the coming months.
