


Using the Zotero Connector

It changes to reflect what is on the browser page











The Zotero Connector in EbscoHost's Academic Search Complete Database






Navigating the Zotero App

- Group Libraries = great for team work and collaborative projects (see Zotero Documentation, Zotero.org)








Look for RefMan or RIS file option




























Importing Citations from PubMed to Zotero
