G. de Moon by he rug voedering bot eene voorlopige oprage van en half jaar.

Vole outslaan my L. E. van de verantwording over alle witstaande posten, alsook over de ingeschrevene geldis in de kanalisatie door Dalmoholt ten bedrage van vijfduisend guldens. Dal Vredenlust onder Eemnes, der 15 September 1841.

We, the undersigned, A.C. Van Raalte and D. Blikman Kikkert, appropriate from Mr. C.G. De Moen, all his rights, obligations, enjoyments and burdens [lusten en lasten] which pertain to the tile [brick possibly] and additional ceramic factories in Ommen and district of Ommen, which belonged to the honored gentleman, of the firm of De Moen and Co. Therefore these [above gentlemen] discharge Mr. C.G. De Moen hereby of his obligation and responsibility, with the proviso to relinquish to us today all the pleasures and burdens flowing from these, promising him clearly to repay him the capital presently amounting to f.1,2446,41 in above transactions. The honored gentleman is also allowed to keep this sum in the business against 5 percent; both of the undersigned hold themselves responsible for the above capital, obligating Mr. C.G. De Moen, however, to refrain temporarily from claiming this for half a year.

We also dismiss the worthy gentleman from the responsibility of all outstanding entries, as well as the subscribed money in the canalization through *Dalmsholt* [*Dalmsholle*, area south of Lemele] amounting to five-thousand guilders.
