The "Traveling & Begging Guide" of Rev. Albertus C. Van Raalte when he went on fund-raising trips to New York and New Jersey to raise money for the academy building, later known as Van Vleck Hall. He is given clear directions as to where he must travel and whom he should visit. The writer of instructions in the guide is not identified. However, judging from a 1 September 1856 letter of John Van Vleck to Van Raalte, the handwriting of Van Vleck is similar to the handwriting in this document. A letter of introduction to prospective donors by Dr. Thomas De Witt is appended to the traveling guide.



About two years
ago, Rev Dr Van Raalte
succeeded in collecting
mainly at the East, nearly
enough money to furnish
the Holland Academy
with a building sufficient
for present purposes, and
some needful furniture
for the rooms. A foundation
was thus laid for permanent
progress, but it was only
an humble beginning, and we
now again bring the wants of
the Institution to the notice of its
friends.

First, it is of essential importance that the lot on which the academy stands, should be enlarged. The building is located on an area of five acres, donated for the purpose by Dr Van Raalte. A more eligible site could not have been found in the place, but such was the natural rise of the ground that in order to secure its advantages, it was necessary to get the rear wall nearer the street than would otherwise have been done, leaving between

them, a space of but a few feet. Any one on the premises sees the reason and the necessity at a glance, and they were perceived at once by Rev. Mr. DuBois, the present Secretary of the Board of Domestic Missions, when he visited the spot last spring. The property can now be secured at a moderate sum, and the street can be closed, which if delay intervenes, it will be difficult & expensive if not altogether impossible to do. The present is the only time to make sure of shutting the street.

There is needed money
likewise for some chemical
and philosophical apparatus.
At present the Academy has
not even so much as a
globe, to aid in instruction.

It is very desirable
also that a dwelling be
erected for the use of Rev.
Mr. Van De Wall, one of
the Instructors. His present
quarters are altogether
insufficient, whether as
regards health, comfort
or convenience, and there
is no better house in the
village, ^{to be hired} even if his salary
would admit of his paying the rent.

There remains yet one
more urgent want. It was
found necessary for every
reason to relieve the Principal
of the insupportable burden of
attending to the boarding of
the students. At present, this
is provided at the house of
a widow, a little distant
from the Academy (the only
place that would answer even
for temporary use) but the
arrangement cannot be per-
manent, for economy and
the supervision of the students
demand here more than
elsewhere, a refectory on the
premises under the entire con-
trol of the Academy.

In view of the above-mentioned wants, the lowest sum that could be named to meet them would be between three and four thousand dollars.

All the churches here are taxed in various ways to the very last extremity, and struggle nobly to take up applicants for aid in studying at the Academy. They give largely out of great poverty.

If the friends of our Church, and those who are anxious to increase the number of her efficient

ministers, do not aid us promptly and liberally, they will see the usefulness of the Academy materially crippled and its opening prospects darkened, if not extinguished.

We therefore earnestly solicit their aid, and trust that our call, which we believe to be the call of the Lord and of His Church will not be unheeded.
