MISSIONARY HERALD.—The price of the Herald is One Dollar, payable in advance, to those who receive it by mail, or at the Missionary House. To those who receive it through agents or carriers, WITHOUT EXPENSE TO THEMSELVES, the price will be, if IN ADVANCE, One Dollar and Twenty-five Cents. To AGENTS who become responsible for the copies of the Herald distributed by them, and pay for the same in advance, the price will be as follows:—For any number of copies over 50 and under 100, 95 cents. Over 100, 90 cents.

JOURNAL OF MISSIONS.—The Journal of Missions is a monthly publication, designed especially for adult readers, and made up of the best available materials. For a single subscription the price is 25 cents a year; but 8 copies sent to one address, will be furnished for \$1; 16 copies for \$2; and so on for any number of copies. All payments to be in advance.

YOUTH'S DAYSPRING.—This is a neatly covered pamphlet of 16 pages, ornamented with cuts, and designed for Sabbath schools, and for children and youth generally. Ten copies sent to one address, will be furnished for \$1; sixteen copies, postage paid, will be sent to one address for \$2; and larger numbers at the same rate. For a single copy, 25 cents; payment, in all cases, in advance.

Ten Dollars a year contributed by any Sabbath School or Juvenile Missionary Society, to the Children's Education Fund, will entitle the same to 10 copies of the Youth's Dayspring; \$25 to 20 copies; \$50 to 40 do.; \$75 to 60 do.; \$100 to 80 do.; \$150 to 120 do.; \$200 to 160 do.
