Seur Brother,

yours of the 16th inst. was duly received. As yet I have not heard anything from Mr. Williamson.

The amount you left in his hands for me, \$436,16, is correct, serve the interest. There will be due on the first of February for interest at 7 per cent.

It's job , according to the calculations of Mr. books our Mathematical Professor.

Some time since I wrote

to oije Winter requesting him to see that my tax was paid. I have not heard from him, Will you therefore have the kindness to attend to this matter for me before it is too late. I should be sorry to have those lots sold for tax.

He are all very well but Distrie. Her health remains poor. We all congratulate you on the prospect of so desirable a son-in-law. May Mena I the Dominie live long and happily together. I often wonder how Helena is since the birth of her son. I hope her health may not suffer. Please remember us to the different members of your family. I would gladly write but have not the time just at present. Wishing you a joyful welcome at home, with improved health, and spiritual joys, I am
