**Site:** Southwest Community Health Center

**Project Title:** Implementation of a Self-Management Program for Hispanic Patients with Chronic Non-Cancer Pain

**Methods:** Educate patients about non-pharmacological interventions for the management of chronic non-cancer pain. The Defense and Veterans Pain Rating Scale (DVPRS) was used to assess pain and quality of life. Post-Event Satisfaction Survey developed by the DNP student project developer to gather qualitative data.

**Significance:** The implementation of non-pharmacological modalities for the management of chronic non-cancer pain can increase the quality of life.


