Coronavirus Update 3-23-22

Dear members of the Sacred Heart University community,

We want to remind all students, faculty and staff that you need to **remain at home if you have any COVID symptoms**. Please do not assume that it is allergies or a cold. As we begin to lift the COVID restrictions we have had in place, there are still things we need to do to keep the community safe. An important one is to stay home and wear a mask around others if you have symptoms. You should do this until you have a negative PCR test result. As a reminder if you test positive from a test that was not administered by SHU, students need to upload the result to their student health portal, and employees should notify their supervisor. CampusClear is still available to help you evaluate your symptoms. Let's remain diligent to protect ourselves and those around us.

Booster Clinic

There will be a booster clinic on campus this coming Saturday, March 26, from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. in the Edgerton Center atrium. The clinic will be open to SHU community members and their family and friends. The clinic will be offered by Griffin Health, and there will be 100 doses available that include Pfizer, Moderna and Johnson & Johnson. No appointment is necessary. Those eligible for a booster may walk in between 10 a.m. and 1:30 p.m.
