The Department of Fisheries Malaysia has taken the initiative to establish 2 information centers for the Fisheries Refugia project in Malaysia. The purpose of these Information Centers are to create public awareness and disseminate information about the Fisheries Refugia to the public. The two sites were at i) Tanjung Leman Ferry Jetty at Johor and ii) Miri Fisheries District Office.

FISHERIES REFUGIA INFORMATION CENTER, TANJUNG LEMAN

The Department of Fisheries Malaysia has set up a RIC at Tanjung Leman Ferry Jetty, Johor to facilitate the dissemination of Information about the Fisheries Refugia Project in Malaysia. The setup and maintenance of RIC were funded using national fund and GEF fund. Likewise, a collaboration with the Johor Corporation (under state government) was secured for the rental-free use of the building space. RIC was officiated by the Director General of Department of Fisheries Malaysia on the 20th of November 2017. 


Figure 5. Some information about lobster life cycle on display at the Refugia Information Center in Tanjung Leman
