A MESSAGE FROM THE CREATORS

Nearly two years ago, Michael Rubinoff approached us about creating a site-specific piece for Sheridan's 2015 graduating Music Theatre Performance class. When, several months later we toured Brantwood for the first time, we instantly knew we had found the perfect home. The building was bursting with theatrical possibilities, and when we learned that the school had first opened its doors in 1920, our imaginations began to churn. High school is an incredibly exciting and emotionally charged time. We were curious to explore the inevitable loss of innocence that defines adolescence, and the ways in which teenagers unknowingly re-enact the same social dynamics, experimentations, transgressions and mistakes from one generation to the next, through their own historical lens. With this task in mind, we set out to craft eleven different onehour storylines, one for each decade in the life our imaginary Brantwood High (including a vision of the school redeveloped as a condo in 2020 - The Chalkboard Lofts).

As we began inventing characters and storylines, our intrepid ensemble were always at the forefront of our minds. We were excited to have each actor play multiple characters, separated by era, but not by spirit, and to transition from one to the next in full view of the audience. We set out to create moments of convergence where characters, stories and histories would smash together. We were also very excited to explore the role that music and dance would play in fleshing out the characters, stories, and styles of each decade. When we began "song-spotting" and presented our list of musical requests to our brilliant team of composer-lyricists, we never in our wildest dreams could have imagined the level of artistry and inventiveness that Britta, Anika, Bram and Chris would create in composing this immense score. As a result of their monumental work, music has become the heartbeat of Brantwood.

Our goal is to take "audience voyeurism" to a whole new level by giving people free reign to follow whomever they choose and explore any space at any time. We both are obsessed with creating immersive audience experiences, implicating the audience in the action, and pushing the boundaries of intimacy between performer and audience. We have worked closely with our incredible team of designers to create a detailed and interactive space, and ensure that every nook and cranny of the building is active at all times, through action, scenic design, soundscape, and lighting... not to mention costuming a hundred different characters that span a century's worth of fashion!

We are so grateful to Sheridan for having the vision and artistic integrity to support this massive, unprecedented undertaking, and not shy away from the size and scope of the project. Our army of creators, designers, assistant directors, crew and stage management have worked tirelessly around the clock to bring Brantwood to life. As we throw open Brantwood's doors to you our "audience of alumini", we are excited to continue to learn all we can about the show and the vast many ways in which people will experience it. Our ultimate dream and vision for Brantwood is that it will have a long-term future life, so that we may continue to build on all that we learn from this premiere production, and so that audience members may continue to dive deeper and deeper into its story. After all, who among us wouldn't want the chance to go back to High School and do some things a little differently?

Creating Brantwood has been the thrill of our theatrical lives! Thank you for spending an evening inhabiting our world. There's lots more to experience – we hope you'll come back!

THE EXPERIENCE

BRANTWOOD is Canada's largest experiment in immersive, site-specific musical theatre. Each audience experience lasts three hours, with over fifteen hours of scripted material unfolding simultaneously all over the school. Embedded inside BRANTWOOD lie forty original songs and dance numbers which chart the evolution of contemporary music over the last century. Our ensemble features forty-two actors, inhabiting one hundred different characters. BRANTWOOD's simultaneity of action allows the audience to follow whomever they choose through the densely interwoven narrative, and experience all new characters and storylines each time they return.

After this initial run in Oakville, we will be looking for a future home for Brantwood in Toronto. In addition to being a theatrical event of unprecedented size and scope, it is our hope to establish a venue that can also be an exciting and unique social hub – further enhancing the vibrancy of Toronto's nightlife.



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CREATIVE TEAM

Mitchell Cushman - Creator, Writer and Director Mitchell Cushman is a director, producer, educator, and Co-Artistic Director of Outside the March, one of Canada's leading site-specific theatre companies. With OtM, Mitchell has staged such award-winning immersive theatrical experiences as Vitals, Terminus, Passion Play and Mr. Marmalade. As a director, Mitchell's work has been seen on stages as large as the Royal Alexander Theatre, in spaces as intimate as a kindergarten classroom, and in locales as remote as Whitehorse and Munich. Other favourite directing credits include: New Jerusalem (Harold Green); The Last of Romeo and Juliet, Possible Worlds (Talk is Free); The Crippleof Inishmaan (Studio Theatre). Also an active theatre producer, Mitchell recently created and curated the East End Performance CRAWL, a site-specific solo festival for Crow's Theatre. He has received numerous distinctions for his theatre work, including two Dora Awards for Outstanding Independent Production (Vitals, Mr. Marmalade), the Siminovitch protégé award, the Ken McDougal Award, and the Toronto Theatre Critics' awards for Best Production and Best Director (Terminus). Mitchell is a graduate of the University of Alberta's MFA Directing program. Next year, he will direct Possible Worlds as part of the 2015 Stratford Festival season.

Julie Tepperman – Creator, Writer and Director Julie Tepperman is an actor, playwright and educator, as well as co-artistic director (with Aaron Willis) of Convergence Theatre, twice listed by NOW Magazine as the "Best Site-Specific Theatre Company in Toronto". Past immersive Convergence productions: AutoShow (one of NOW Magazine's Top Ten Productions of 2006); The Gladstone Variations (4 Dora nominations; #2 in NOW Magazine's Top Ten Toronto Productions of the Decade); YICHUD (Seclusion) (published by Playwrights Canada Press; Capital Critics' Circle nomination for Outstanding Production); the Canadian premiere of Sarah Ruhl's Passion Play (with Outside the March and Sheep No Wool). Selected playwriting: YICHUD (Seclusion) (Convergence/Passe Muraille/Magnetic

North), I Grow Old (as part of The Gladstone Variations); ROSY (as part of AutoShow); a re-imagining of the August Strindberg play The Father (Winnipeg Jewish Theatre). Julie was Playwright-In-Residence at Theatre Passe Muraille in 2010/11 with the support of the Canada Council. Selected acting: Mary 2 in Passion Play (Dora award for Outstanding Performance by an Ensemble); The Audience Guide in Mr. Marmalade (Outside The March; Dora award for Outstanding Indie Production); Liza in Out The Window (The Theatre Centre); Rachel in YICHUD (Seclusion) (BroadwayWorld Toronto Best Actor nomination); two seasons at The Stratford Festival (All's Well That Ends Well, Agamemnon, Electra, The Flies, The Swanne - Part Two). Julie is a graduate of George Brown Theatre School and Stratford's Birmingham Conservatory for Classical Theatre Training. In-development: Julie is stoked to be developing a rock opera for teens with composer (and Brantwood's sound designer) Christopher Thornborrow, as part of Tapestry Opera.

Bram Gielen – Composer and Lyricist and Additional Orchestrations

Bram Gielen is a composer, lyricist, arranger, and multi-instrumentalist living in Toronto. On the heels of a childhood and adolescence studying classical piano and playing in a ton of weird bands, Bram went on to study the double bass at the University of Toronto's faculty of music, graduating in 2008. The composer of the musical theatre pieces *Biggish Kids* and *Public Speaking*, Bram also frequently composes and arranges music for various theatre, film, and recorded music projects. As an instrumentalist, he can be heard live and on recordings with such artists as *DIANA*, Weaves, and T H O M A S, to name only a few.

Anika Johnson – Composer and Lyricist Anika Johnson is a writer and performer based in Toronto. She has performed internationally in over 15 countries and had her original work programmed in festivals in Canada and abroad. Performing credits include 7 years with CORPUS DanceProjects and seasons with the

Stratford Festival and Drayton Entertainment. With writing partner Barb Johnston, Johnson has created five original musicals, including Blood Ties (SummerWorks/Edinburgh Fringe/featured on BBC America's 'Orphan Black'), Summerland (with songwriter Suzy Wilde; commissioned by Wexford School for Performing Arts), and Elly's Emotions (Toronto Fringe Kids 2014 - NOW Toronto selection 'Outstanding Production','Outstanding New Play'). Upcoming: new commissions by YPT and the Randolph Academy, and the professional premier of Summerland at the 2015 Toronto Fringe. Anika also performs regularly across Canada as a proud founding member of Wannabe: The Spice Girls Tribute Band. She is thrilled to be collaborating for the first time with her incredible sister Britta!

Britta Johnson - Composer and Lyricist Britta Johnson is an emerging composer, lyricist, music director and performer thrilled to be working with Sheridan for the first time. Her first full-length musical, went into an extended run at her high school before being invited to perform on the Avon stage of the Stratford Shakespeare Festival. Since then, she has she spent two seasons writing and directing for the Blyth Festival's young company, a summer as a music assistant at the Stratford Festival, three years as a playwright-in-residence with the Paprika Festival and has had her work showcased at the Shaw Festival's Lyric Canada conference. She made her professional stage debut in January of 2015 premiering the lead role in the Globe Theatre's production of "Living in the Spaces" in Regina. She has been the recipient of two Tyrone Gutherie Awards for her work with the arts and community and is a recent graduate of the University of Toronto Faculty of Music with a degree in composition. This Spring, she will be music directing Mr Burns: A Post-Electric Play for Outside the March in Toronto.

Nicola Pantin - Choreographer

Nicola is co artistic director for 3degrees, an independant dance theatre company in Toronto. Upcoming; dancer/assistant choreographer on Siona Jackson's Hearing Voices (Theatre Sheridan), Joseph and Summerland (Wexford Collegiate), and Kelly Robinson's Bittegirl (Charlottetown Festival).

James Smith – Musical Director and Additional Orchestrations

This is James's second season musical directing at Sheridan. James is a Toronto based musical director, composer and sound designer. He has been working professionally across canada for over five years. Recent theatre credits include: associate musical director/conductor/pianist for Canada Rocks; first keyboardist for Anne Of Green Gables (Charlottetown Festival); musical director for Parade (Sheridan College); assistant sound designer/assistant keyboard programmer for London Road (Canadian Stage); musical director/arranger for Aladdin and several other pantomimes (Moonpath Productions); musical director for The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee (Thousand Islands Playhouse). His Shaw Festival credits include composer/ sound designer for Faith Healer; assistant sound designer for Guys and Dolls and Ragtime; associate composer/musical arranger for On The Rocks; substitute conductor for The Admirable Crichton; and he was the 2011 musical director. intern for My Fair Lady and Maria Severa. Other credits include: associate musical director/ band leader for Assassins (MTC/Talk Is Free Theatre/Birdland); musical director for Guys and Dolls, and Great Expectations (Talk is Free Theatre); composer/sound designer for The Ends of The Earth (Vertigo Theatre); musical director/arranger for Diamond Tooth Gerties (TNT Productions); second keyboard/accordion for Assassins (Talk Is Free Theatre, Birdland, Dora Mavor Moore Award for best production of a musical); assistant sound designer for Bethune Imagined (Factory Theatre) and The New Electric Ballroom (Mackenzie Ro, Dora Award for best sound design). He'd like to send some big ol' love to Sara, Boz, Mo, and Cin.

Jon Grosz – Set and Prop Designer

Jon Grosz is a Toronto-based designer and prop builder, currently in his fourth season with the Shaw Festival, and second in their design studio. While there he has assisted some of Canada's foremost theatre designers with model building, design meetings, and deadlines. He was given the opportunity to design the Neil Munro Director's Project as part of the 2014 season, working with a pair of up-and-coming Canadian directors. As a freelance designer, his work has featured with Outside The March, in designing their Dora Award-winning production of Mr. Marmalade in 2012. Jon has also been involved in several theatrical and artistic endeavours across Southern Ontario, including SETtlement, a green theatre initiative that seeks to repurpose dumpster-bound sets and props for use as temporary homeless shelters. The project has enjoyed success since its inception in 2011, and has received exposure at art exhibits and theatre venues in Toronto, Hamilton, and St. Catharines. He has designed and built props for a number of children's theatre productions, including Hamilton Conservatory for the Arts' 2014 drama workshop, Canada: From Colony to Country. Jon is thrilled to return to Sheridan College - his alma mater - to collaborate with his former teachers. and supervisors on this uniquely ambitious theatre project. In addition to his work as a designer, Jon's semi-regular work with The Rabbit's Choice prop shop as a prop builder has appeared on Broadway (Aladdin, Annie, Lion King), on television (Reign, Copper, Expanse), and in film (Mortal Instruments, Poltergeist).

Kenneth MacKenzie – Set and Prop Designer Ken's most recent design credits include the lighting design for the Dining Room as well as the set and lighting design for Spoon River at Soulpepper. Ken was the production designer for Bloody Family at the Theatre Centre as well as Set and Costume design for Lungs and Soliciting Temptation at Tarragon Theatre. Ken has also designed set and costumes The Gigli Concert, the Set and Costume designer for Kim's Convenience, Home and A Midsummer Night's Dream at Soulpepper. Ken's upcoming work includes the set design Outside-the-March's, site-specific version of Mr. Burns and the double at the National Arts Centre. Ken has earned numerous awards and nominations including a Dora award for his ensemble work in *Alligator Pie* at Soulpepper. Ken is a resident artist at Soulpepper Theatre Company.

Nina Okens – Costumer Designer

Nina's costume designs have been seen across Canada for such companies as Le Théâtre Français de Toronto, Théâtre la Catapulte, Humber River Shakespeare and Young People's Theatre. She is a seven time Dora Mavor Moore Award nominee, and the recipient of a Prix Rideau Award for outstanding costume design as well as a Harold Award for her contributions to the Toronto Independent theatre community. This is her twelfth show with Sue.
