## "Better to die voluntarily crashing than to have the enemy send you down in flames" -- William 'Billy' Avery Bishop

Fall 1911: Entered the Royal Military College 2 June 1917: Awarded the Victoria Cross

Canada's highest award for military
valour – for destroying several German
planes during a solo mission

1939-1945: Promoted to Air Marshall at the outbreak of WWII, Bishop was in charge of recruitment for the RCAF
