The project From So Far to SO-CLOSE: Enhancing Social Cohesion through Sharing the Cultural Heritage of Forced Migrations, financed by the European Union's Horizon2020 Research and Innovation Programme (Grant Agreement No 870939) has produced two datasets that summarize the information obtained through qualitative research techniques.
