Hodsdoni Dear dir: Your letter, with accompanying blanks, anailed 22ª aist, was secured in due Learon, and I hastened to Comply with the order by filling out the blanks and delivering there to God. Staples, who immediately mailed then to your office. From the tenor of the note and the style of the blanks I judged that you devided to ascertain the state of the band as it originally left the the seat of way, and I filled out accordingly. Line we have been in service, there have been several discharged, (as I showed in the "Remarks,") and others taken in by transfer from Companies.
