1. ZONOTIC DISEASES ECOLOGY

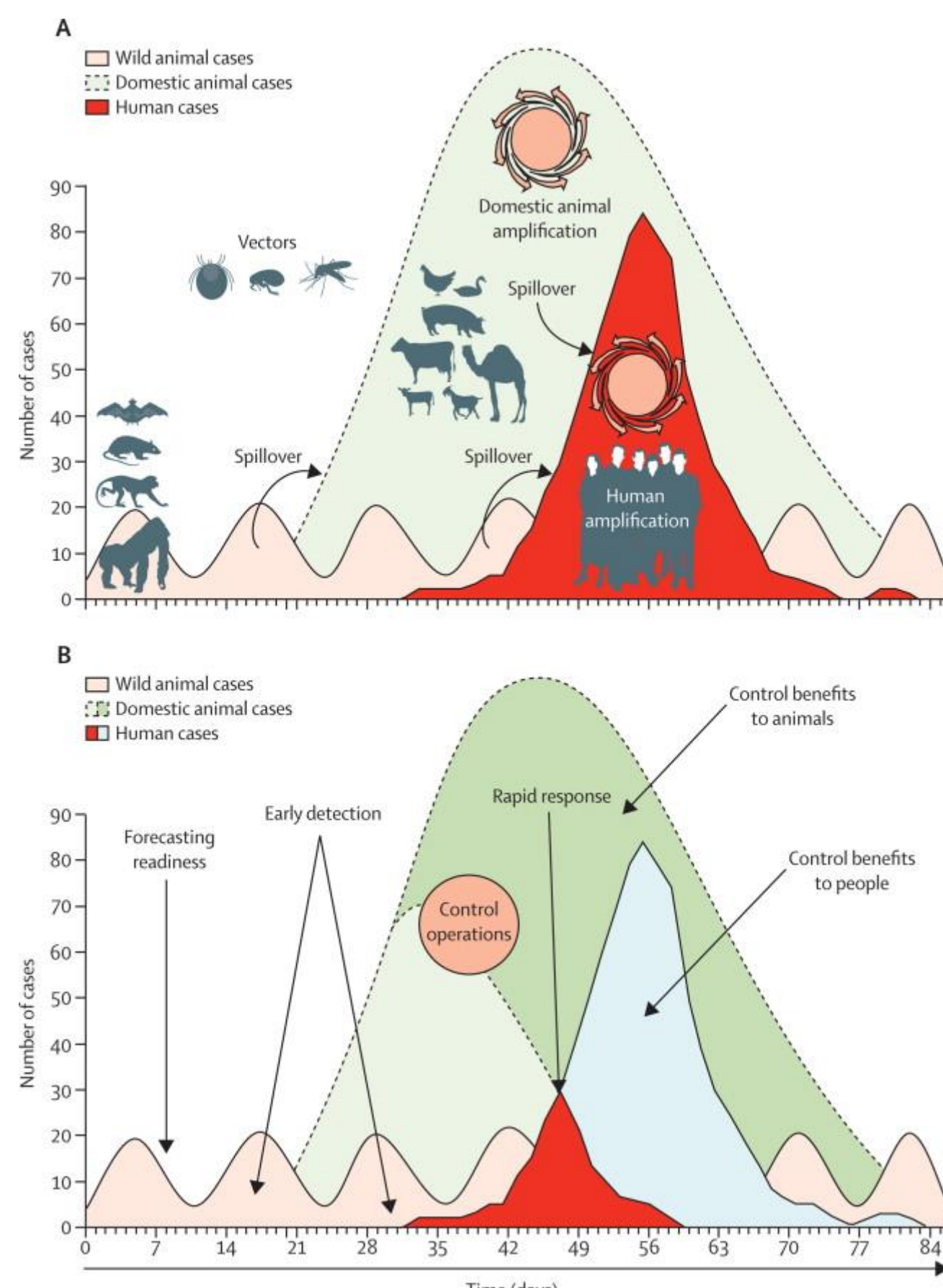


Figure 1: Transmission of infection in people (bright red) occurs after a pathogen from wild animals (pink) moves into livestock to cause an outbreak (light green) that amplifies the capacity for pathogen transmission to people. (Kalesh B. et al 2012)
