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

Ending Book Deserts: 3rd Annual Book Drive

The University Libraries Diversity and Inclusion Team is teaming up again with The Conscious Connect, and the student organization BATU (Black Action Thru Unity) to collect diverse books to end book deserts in Dayton. Many are familiar with the problem of urban "food deserts" — areas without adequate access to affordable fresh fruit, vegetables, and other whole foods. Book deserts are similar: A recent study at New York University has defined "book deserts" as high-poverty neighborhoods where access to children's books is lacking.

The goal is to collect new or gently used K-12 books that focus on science, technology, engineering, or math (STEM) topics and feature diverse characters. Books will be distributed to the West Dayton Strong initiative and other Dayton Public Schools. 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
