

Ohio Digital Library: Summer Reading at Your



Fingertips

With summer on the horizon, traditionally it is a time to grab a beach read or to take a break from scholarly reading with a fiction book. While many physical library locations are closed due to the pandemic, Ohio residents can still access thousands of leisure reading titles online for free through the Ohio Digital Library. The Ohio Digital Library is a program of the State Library of Ohio and is supported in part by federal funds from the Institute of Museum and Library Services.

You can use any Ohio public library card to access titles or sign up in just a few seconds using a mobile number with an Ohio area code. A variety of mysteries, science fiction, graphic novels, thrillers, historical fiction, children's books, nonfiction titles and more are instantly available. In addition to ebooks and audiobooks, you can stream popular films and read digital magazines.

SAMPLING OF TITLES

In a recent search, *Becoming* by Michelle Obama, *The Alice Network* by Kate Quinn, *The Reckoning* by John Grisham, *Born a Crime* by Trevor Noah, *Dark Sacred Night* by Michael Connelly, and *Big Little Lies* by Liane Moriarty were just a sampling of readily available book titles.

HOW TO READ THEM

You can read the books on a Kindle, e-reader, or web browser, or you can download the free Libby or OverDrive apps to read on your iPad, iPhone or Android device.




