Bound in red leather. 230 pp., 28 x 20 cm. The Guest Book was purchased by Hans and Rosaleen Moldenhauer in Denver, Colorado, following their marriage on March 20, 143, while Hans

Moldenhauer was serving in the 87th Mountain Regiment and Rosaleen Moldenhauer with the Red Cross at Camp Hale. The Conservatory had been founded in the early fall of 1942. It was incorporated in 1946 as an educational institution, not for profit, under the laws of the State of Washington. By unanimous resolution of the Boardsof Trustees of both the Spokane Conservatory and Whitworth College, the Conservatory merged with the College, and the "Spokane Conservatory of Whitworth College" was announced on Dec. 14, 1986, during a convocation celebrating the Spokane Conservatory, see recto of back flyleaf. The following catalogue of individual entries does not include local musicians, friends and guests. The omission of other names is explained by their absence from the standard biographical dictionaries.
