





RATS ARE TOUGH LITTLE ANIMALS— THEY CAN PLUMMET FIVE STORIES TO THE GROUND AND SCURRY OF FUNHARMED OR SURVIVE BEING FLUSHED DOWN A TOILET AND ENTER BUILDINGS BY THE SAME ROUTE



RATS CAN GNAWTHROUGH LEAD PIPES AND CINDER BLOCKS WITH THEIR. CHISEL TEETH WHICH CAN EXERT AN INCREDIBLE 24,000 POUNDS PER SQUARE INCH.
