Co. when they built the Webster School when the Government bought the old town of 20 elster to build a Dom for flood controll on the South Solomon River. That is where I started working for Busboom + Rauh. From there we moved to Phileyssburg to build the present state Highway maintainance and construction office we moved from that yob to Fort Hays compres to build the two wings of agnew Hall. I don't know when we started and finished agnew Hall but I stayed in the upstains noom in the home of Henry g. Mc Forland 206 West ash Street. I have a card sent to me grom my sister at that address Post marked December 20 1954 so it was being built at that time. We started in

Warm weather and ended in warm weather. We moved from Hays to Liberal Kans, to build two one story grade schools and two story school building. I joined the army September 17 1955 The two story school was just getting started good at that time so that gives a rough time france of the buildings before agnew Hall, you may have a record of the start and pinish of agreer Hall const, but I don't have any other record, There was another college building being built at the same time south reast of agnew Hall with the creeke seperating the two buildings. The other building I was told was housing for male students, I am not sure but as I remember they were ahead of us in their building. I don't know what const co, was but our building

inspector and theirs was the some Person so he spent part of the day with both of us. andy anderson was the foreman for the building of agrew Hall as he was for webster + Phillips any project. (NIBS) horbert Dreiling and Lefty Dreiling (brothers) from Hoys were the Head carpenters. Then father Hung all of the doors on all projects. Dan Schmidt later to be chief of Palice in Hays worked will the carpenters. I believe most of the workers were from the Hays area I don't know who the brick foreman over the brick loyers was not from Hoys but stayed in the Hotel near Weisners ctolking store. I was habor foreman for the men working with the crick layers, & was also the one to may the motor used in the coulding also for webster & Phillips ound'
