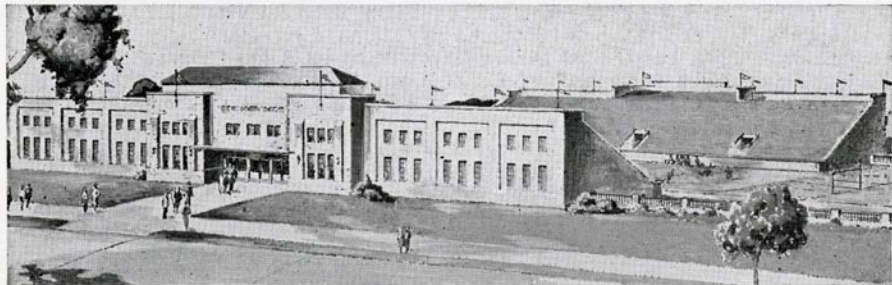

HISTORY OF LEWIS FIELD

All students have "memorable dates." To Fort Hays Kansas State College, 1934, is just such a date; for it marks the beginning—only the beginning—of Lewis Field. To this date can now be added 1937. On this latter date the new Lewis Field Stadium Dormitory was opened for occupancy with accommodations for about fifty boys. Prior to 1934, the United States Government built the "barracks" as living quarters for a unit of C.C.C. men. When this group vacated the buildings, their value seemed to be nil. However, through the foresight of Dr. C. E. Rarick these seemingly useless buildings were remodeled and became the first Men's Dormitories for Fort Hays Kansas State College. Each year has seen added improvements, until now the dormitories are entirely modernized and can comfortably house one hundred and seventy-five boys.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Opening:—

The dormitories will be ready for occupancy for the 1938 Fall Program, on Sunday, September 4th.

Meals:—

Twenty meals a week are served at Cody Commons (college cafeteria.)

Furnishings:—

The men must furnish their own bed clothes and pillows. It is recommended that each boy bring at least three sheets, two pillow cases, and quilts or blankets. The College will have the bedding laundered. A steamer trunk or small chest which can be locked and put under the bunk is recommended.

Cost:—

The room rent is \$1.25 per week. The board is \$3.00 per week.

Recreation Facilities:—

Recreation rooms equipped with ping-pong tables, radios, a pool table, and a hand-ball court.

Study Facilities:—

A quiet study hall furnished with small desks is provided. Each desk is equipped with individual study lamps.

Scholastic Standing:—

A tradition has been built up that no Lewis Field boy should have a grade average of less than three point. It is the hope of Lewis Field boys that this standard will always be maintained.

Camp Upkeep:—

There will be janitors, waiters, night watchmen, study hall keepers, etc. to maintain the dormitories. **No free hours of labor are required.**

Supervision:—

Dr. W. D. Moreland is faculty sponsor for the Lewis Field Dormitories. He has general supervision of all activities. There will be competent paid supervisors in charge at all times. Andy Reigel will be general supervisor for the school year of 1938-1939.

SOME LEWIS FIELD RULES

Room and board is due and **must** be paid each month in advance at the Business Office of the College.

A student desiring to move from Lewis Field **must** give thirty days notice to the Faculty Supervisor before he can move. If this notice is not given, the student is required to pay one month's rent.

Boys staying at Lewis Field and on the College Work Program will not be allowed to have or operate cars.

Drinking and gambling is strictly forbidden to those staying at Lewis Field.
