Contract for Alice McDonald ally canceled by department

FRANKFORT, Ky. (AP) — A consulting contract for a political supporter of the state school superintendent has been canceled by the Department of Education after a legislative subcommittee questioned the need for it.

Louisville attorney Robert E. Barnett III was to be paid \$23,333 this fiscal year on a personal service contract to finish developing a course to train paralegals in state vocational schools.

Barnett, who said he helped shape Alice McDonald's platform in her 1983 campaign for superintendent of public instruction, was paid \$16,667 on a previous contract to survey the need for a paralegal training program and write a report.

The legislature's Personal Service Contract Review Subcommittee twice deferred action on the second contract when the need for additional paralegal training was questioned.

The chief reason the contract was canceled July 29 was that Barnett was going to recommend against pursuing such a training program, said Barbara McDaniell, a spokeswoman for McDonald.

Barnett said extensive news reports and "unfair" criticism of McDonald led to the cancellation.

"I had a part in forming the platform that she used when she ran for superintendent. It's just natural for her to continue to rely on my expertise," Barnett said.

"I have not been rewarded in any fashion whatsoever. Every service that I have ever performed has been greatly undervalued. I like to think in terms of it being strictly a public service."

Higher education officials questioned the need for paralegal training in vocational schools, noting that Midway College and three state universities already offer programs.

De Lorean says he may build high speed DMC-12 in Ohio

COLUMBUS, Ohio (AP) — John Z. De Lorean says he has enough potential investors to make him believe he can be selling a new high-speed sports car by the first of the year, though he has no financing or factory as yet.

De Lorean said Thursday he will team with Gordon Novel of New Orleans to assemble a successor to his defunct DMC-12 De Lorean car here.

He said he and Novel have agreed in principle to buy enough parts of the old De Lorean car from Marvin Katz of Columbus to build several hundred of the new cars. Katz and his wife own the Kapac Co., which has the De Lorean parts.

DURBAN, South Africa — The unofficial death toll rises to 50 in three days of anti-apartheid rioting and ethnic violence after fighting erupts between blacks and Indians. Zulus wielding short spears and sticks patrolled the streets in an attempt to restore order.

BEIRUT, Lebanon — Although kidnappers freed two abducted foreigners, there still is no word on when, or if, 12 Westerners, including seven Americans, will be released.

WASHINGTON — Low pay for top federal officials, including judges and congressmen, is drawing the talent supply and posing a threat of government by the rich, a presidential commission says.

LOME, Togo — After meeting with sorcerer priests who lead ancient animistic tribal cults, Pope John Paul II travels to the Ivory Coast to consecrate a modernistic new cathedral in Abidjan. His departure from Togo ends the first of his seven-nation African tour.

BOSTON — The presence of microbes or viruses from other diseases that affect the immune system may account for the alarming spread of AIDS in some African countries and transmission of the deadly ailment among homosexuals, a researcher says.

WASHINGTON — Following a nearly two-month search by conservative claims that the cause of lesbianism would be advanced, the Justice Department has approved a \$293,904 grant to a group that aids battered women.

TVA forecasts six percent rate hike

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. (AP) — The Tennessee Valley Authority on Friday forecast a 6 percent jump in 1986 electric bills for 2.6 million residential customers in seven southeastern states.

The climbing utility costs can be traced to safety problems which have shut down TVA nuclear plants, inflation, and a lack of rainfall, TVA spokesman Alan Carmichael said.

"The same pressures on TVA to raise its revenues are forcing an increase in home electric bills," Carmichael said.

The forecast, prepared by TVA power manager Robert C. Steffey, could become official at TVA's Aug. 29 meeting when the federal utility's board of directors considers how to increase its revenues.

"This is the first adjustment

we will have made since 1982," said Dick Crawford, manager of energy use in Chattanooga.

"We've had some minor ups and downs the last three years. We gave money back at the end of 1983 and had power credits in 1984 and 1985.

"But this year, starting Oct. 1, we need \$166 million more than the base rates will produce. This still leaves our residential rate as one of the lowest in the country," he said.

TVA's staff has recommended a 6.9 percent increase in revenues, about half of which would make up for \$150 million in carryover funds no longer available.

The remainder is due to the more expensive power TVA has been forced to generate because of problems with nuclear plants at Browns Ferry near Athens,

Ala., and at Watts Bar 45 miles south of Knoxville.

The predicted rate increase for industrial customers are comparable and range from 5.8 percent to 6 percent.

A typical family living in a 1,250-square-foot home would use 4,000 kilowatt hours during an average February. Under that example, the family's home heating bill would climb from \$192.36 to \$203.80, a jump of 5.9 percent, Steffey said.

For commercial and industrial customers who use up to \$400,000 kilowatt hours per month, the average bill would climb from the present \$18,495 average to about \$19,596.

The cheapest power TVA produces in hydropower from its system of dams. However, rainfall in the Tennessee Valley is at

an all-time low of only 34.9 inches for the past 12 months.

Nuclear power production has also been off with one of TVA's two operating nuclear power plants down since March 27. TVA elected not to restart the Browns Ferry plant after numerous safety complaints from the Nuclear Regulatory Commission convinced TVA it had a management problem in its nuclear division.

Hugh G. Parris, who took over as chief of TVA's nuclear program, still has not released a timetable for restarting Browns Ferry or for resuming efforts to license Watts Bar.

TVA supplies electricity to Tennessee and parts of Kentucky, Virginia, North Carolina, Georgia, Alabama and Mississippi.

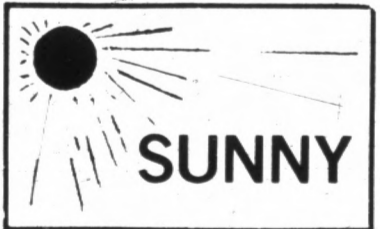
Young farmers tour

Convicted spy plans to testify against brother

NORFOLK, Va. (AP) — Convicted spy Arthur J. Walker will try to avoid the possibility of spending the rest of his life in prison by testifying against his brother and other alleged spy ring members, his lawyer said.

Walker, 50, a retired Navy lieutenant commander, was convicted Friday of seven counts of espionage for selling Navy secrets to the Soviet Union through his brother, John A. Walker Jr., the alleged mastermind of a spy ring.

Officials have called the ring one of the most damaging in U.S. history.

Arthur Walker faces up to three life terms plus 40 years and \$40,000 in fines. Sentencing was set for Oct. 15 after defense attorney J. Brian Donnelly said he wanted to try to cut the sentence by cooperating with prosecutors.

"I think Arthur will be willing

to cooperate," Donnelly said. "He has nothing to hide at this point."

John Walker is scheduled for trial Oct. 28 in Baltimore. Also charged with espionage are John Walker's son, Navy seaman Michael L. Walker, and associate, Jerry A. Whitworth of Davis, Calif.

Arthur Walker, of Virginia Beach, confessed to FBI agents that he passed documents on Navy ship repair to his brother in 1981 and 1982 for \$12,000. The documents were from VSE Corp., where Arthur Walker was an engineer.

He was found guilty by U.S. District Court Judge J. Calvin Clarke Jr. after 10 minutes of consideration following a weeklong non-jury trial that defense attorneys contended might not have been necessary.

Donnelly said Justice Depart-

ment officials in Washington overruled local prosecutors and spurned a plea bargain because they wanted a "public display" in the first trial involving any of the four.

"I wouldn't be surprised also to see this used as fodder for the death penalty provision of the peacetime espionage act," said defense lawyer Samuel W. Meekins.

The case has sparked calls on Capitol Hill and elsewhere for a renewal of the death penalty for espionage during peacetime.

Donnelly and Meekins said Walker had been willing to plead guilty to one count carrying a maximum life sentence. He said the U.S. attorney's justice was interested but that Justice Department officials rejected the plea.

Assistant U.S. attorney Tommy E. Miller refused to discuss plea negotiations, whether he would recommend a sentence

and whether Walker would be asked to testify in the other trials. Amy Brown, a Justice spokeswoman, said the department had no comment.

Arthur Walker was held without bond, and Donnelly said there were no plans for an appeal.

Walker "is very apologetic for what he did wrong," Meekins said, and he does not regret his confession but is "sorry that it was turned against him."

He was convicted largely on the basis of his statements to FBI agents and a grand jury, with prosecutors presenting corroborating evidence and detailing the arrest of John Walker after he allegedly left secret documents at a drop site in Maryland.

Defense attorneys presented no witnesses, and Walker did not testify.

'College was something I just had to try'

Dyslexia doesn't stop Boyd from attending Murray State

How many Murray State University students struggling with a reading disorder decide to brave the challenges of professional schooling after graduation?

Meet David Boyd.

A senior agriculture major from Caruthersville, Mo., Boyd will take courses this year in chemistry and biology to round out his list of classes needed for admission to dental school in 1986.

"College was just something I had to try. I had been really turned off with high school but I thought college might be different. I came to Murray State because it's far enough away from home to make me work harder at my studies," he said.

Boyd, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Clyde J. Boyd of 1721 Ward Ave. in Caruthersville, found he had problems reading his assignments in elementary

school. His second-grade teacher — who was also his aunt — noticed his difficulties and took him to specialists. They diagnosed him as dyslexia.

A reading disorder associated with the central nervous system, dyslexia causes a person to reverse the words in a sentence, to misinterpret the sequence of letters in a word, and even to confuse left and right.

"At the time I was found to be dyslexia, even the experts didn't

know about it. Some of the programs I was put on for treatment actually were detrimental. They forced me to read — and that pressure eventually gave me a bad attitude about school," he said.

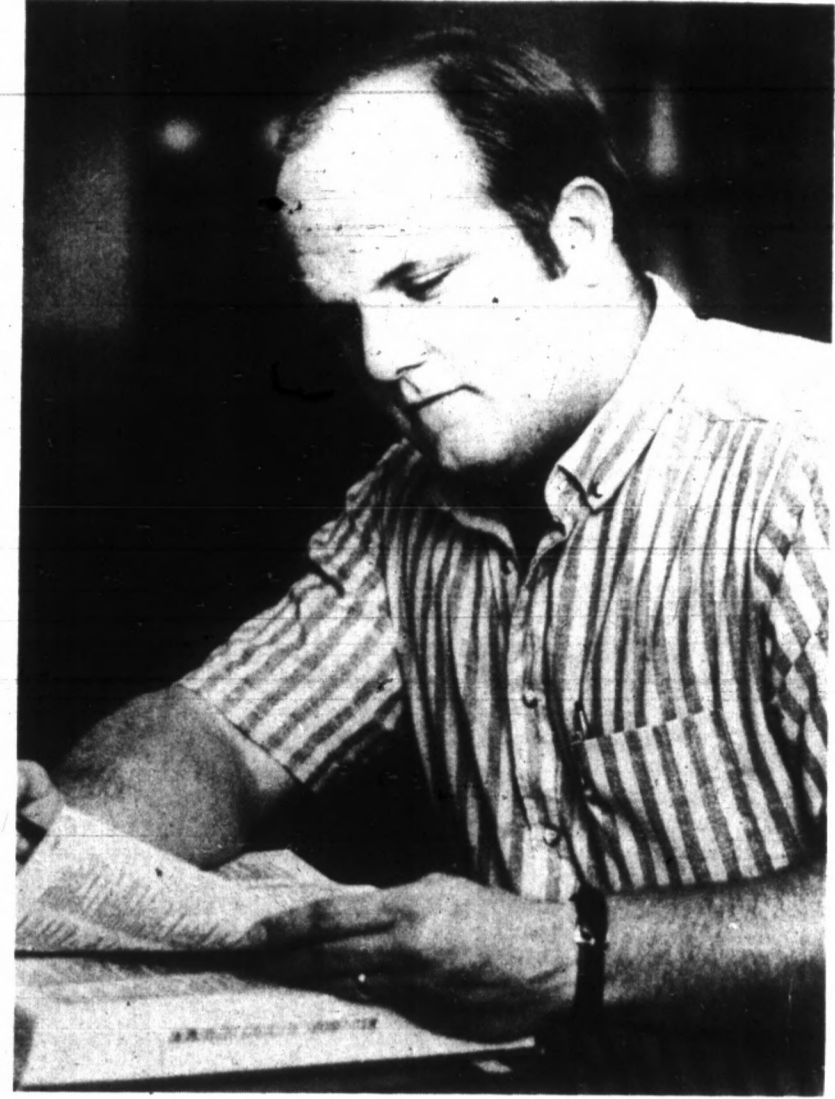
Even though he felt discouraged about learning, Boyd — who is now 26 — said he has had relatively few problems adjusting to college life.

"My professors have been good about giving me extra office time to explain things I didn't understand from the class readings. They've never watered down the test, though," he explained, laughing.

Specialists in the Department of Special Education at Murray State worked with Boyd his first semester, testing him to see if he were ready for a full load of college-level classes. Sessions with Dr. Loyd Jacks, his departmental adviser in agriculture, and a reading improvement class in the university's Learning Center also helped him.

"My family has supported me a lot in my decision," Boyd said. "At first, I was afraid to tell them about wanting to become a dentist. We had always planned for me to go back (to Caruthersville) to run the family farm after graduation. When I told them my plans, though, they just said 'Great!'"

"I haven't always felt so confident. But seeing what I could do here (at Murray State), I guess I'm not too worried now about trying difficult things."

Physical fitness is creating a new type of generation gap in families

A new generation gap has developed as parents are racing about on the jogging track and pumping iron in fitness clubs. Kids are sitting in front of television tubes, getting fat.

National concern is focusing on fitness levels of children. From businessman to parents to the Pentagon, adults are looking at their malnourished, under-exercised future generations.

Many people incorrectly assume that children, especially younger ones, will get all the exercise they need when left to their own devices.

Fitness is a learned trait, and right or wrong, the burden of teaching children falls mainly on the school systems.

Kathy Newton, physical education teacher, and Ray Dunn, principal, at Southwest Elementary School have made a positive approach to the problem.

Construction is now underway at the school on a fitness track to build pupils' strength, flexibility and cardiovascular abilities

necessary to pass fitness tests.

Mrs. Newton said that when she tested grades K through 6 last fall, only 20 percent passed the fitness challenges for their level.

"They thought they were in shape," said Mrs. Newton. "They were shocked to find out how little they could do."

She found that students were weak in leg and arm strength, and playground equipment was inadequate to develop that strength.

By the end of the year, 49 percent passed. Mrs. Newton's goal, with the help of the new track, is 60 percent.

There are 12 stations with four warm-up, six aerobic and two cool-down steps along a running track beside the school playground.

Pupils will do situps, pullups, pushups and climb parallel bars. Aerobic activities include "jump and touch," rope climb, tire run, log jump, log vault and tire climb. They will cool down on the balance beam and monkey bars.

"It's exciting to work with this

age group," said Mrs. Newton. "They are the key. If we can get children to understand the importance of fitness in their overall health picture, we're giving them a health insurance policy for life."

Mrs. Newton practices modern physical education techniques which no longer favor natural athletes, addressing more typical, less talented students. Teaching trends are aimed at a variety of "lifetime" — as opposed to team — sports.

Nationwide, only 36 percent of students in grades five through 12 have daily physical education. Southwest allocates 40 minutes every other day to physical education.

Mrs. Newton said that through their physical education program, students get the gratification of improvement, increased self-awareness and a desire to participate.

"The only competition on the track is within themselves," she said. "It gives a sense of achievement and is adaptable to anyone's needs."

"I think we will see results not only on the playground, but in the classroom. Teachers are excited, and everybody has been supportive."

"Communicating with parents, and making them aware of what needs to be done," said Mrs. Newton, is an important component in getting children fit.

It is important for parents to support their children. More important than money is time — to listen, watch, help, applaud. Studies show that when fitness is important to parents, their children are fit.

Mrs. Newton encourages parents to get involved in activities with their children — taking walks, swimming, playing ball. "Be positive. Instead of sitting, take 45 minutes to go walk with your child."

Parents at Southwest helped raise the money for the fitness track. The PTA raised between \$1,200 and \$1,300 from a Read-A-Thon, and local labor was enlisted for construction.

Orthopedists focus on bones

DEAR DR. GOTT — What do orthopedists do? Why are they listed apart from other physicians in directories (such as the Yellow Pages), although "MD" is given after their names? Are they "legitimate" specialists? How do they differ from chiropractors?

DEAR READER — Orthopedists are medical doctors who, after completing training in general surgery, choose to specialize in problems relating to the body's bones, joints and muscles. As a group, they are certainly legitimate, but there is a variation of skills between members of the specialty.

My local Yellow Pages lists "Orthopedic (Musculoskeletal)" in the same manner that other medical-surgical specialties are listed. Since all M.D.s are licensed as physicians or surgeons, it is not surprising that the telephone company indexes them as such.

Chiropractors do not have medical degrees, and therefore are not listed with doctors. Orthopedic surgeons provide many more services than do chiropractors — for example, they

can operate and chiropractors cannot. They are also pretty good at fixing broken bones, dealing with sports-related injuries and generally keeping us old folks on our feet.

DEAR DR. GOTT — Are bad breath and digestive problems related?

DEAR READER — Digestive problems can release gases and foul scents that may be perceived as bad breath. Certain foods can cause halitosis, as can some diseases and infections. Ordinarily, however, most bad breath arises within the mouth, where particles of food are digested and decomposed by saliva and then get caught in or around teeth. Persons with bad breath should improve their oral-hygiene habits before they malign an innocent and misunderstood digestive tract.

DEAR DR. GOTT — Ever since menopause, I have suffered from terrible insomnia. Will estrogen help?

DEAR READER — Possibly, but insomnia is not an appropriate reason to take the hormone. A frank discussion with your doctor might be more beneficial. After menopause, many women have difficulty sleeping. The reasons vary. Depression, anxiety and a decreased sleep requirement are examples of insomnia-producing factors that are more likely causes for your sleeplessness than hormone deficiency. Your doctor may be able to guide you without the necessity of taking medication — either estrogen or a sedative. That would be a better option.

A 46-year-old Hardin man was shot and killed early Friday afternoon in Aurora, according to the Marshall County Sheriff's Department.

Benjamin Frankie Colson, of Route 1, Hardin, was shot in the chest with a .22 caliber pistol about 1:47 p.m. Friday. The shooting occurred in the trailer residence of George Glenn Turner, 53, of Route 1, Hardin.

Colson, after being shot in the chest, drove about 400 feet from the trailer, where he died, according to the Marshall County Sheriff's Department.

Turner is currently being held in the Marshall County Jail.

A Murray man was arrested Friday morning after police investigated a fracas at South Side Manor Apartments on Broad Street Extended.

Steve Barnett, 33, of 1314 Vine St., was arrested at Mary Weatherbee's apartment at about 2:30 a.m. Barnett reportedly was breaking windows and kicking in doors at the home.

Police reports say Barnett assaulted police officer Lyle Pridemore, but the policeman was not seriously injured.

Barnett has been charged with criminal mischief, disorderly conduct, public intoxication, resisting arrest and assault on a police officer. He was jailed as a result of the charges.

A potpourri of state editorials

The News-Enterprise, Elizabethtown - "The state report charging Hardin County Water District No. 1 with willfully endangering the lives of workers leading to the deaths July 5 of four Radcliff men comes as little surprise to those who have followed the case. It was apparent almost from the day of the accident that things were wrong with the safety management of Radcliff's sewer system.

Not only did the accident itself occur that sad day, similar problems took place earlier that week and there was no proper, responsible reaction from the Water District's management. More damning is the fact that what safety equipment was available, such as a ventilation fan in the station, did not function.

If anything worthwhile is to come from this tragedy, it is the knowledge that such an accident should not occur again, at least not as the result of slipshod safety practices, in Radcliff or other water systems.

According to state investigators, probes of other sewer systems across Kentucky have been launched in the aftermath of the Radcliff accident.

The likelihood of such a tragedy happening again has been reduced. The tragic toll on families and a community just should not reoccur."

The Sunday Independent, Ashland - "Devestating. That's the one word that seems to best describe the recent announcement that the Kentucky Electric Steel plant in Boyd County will be closed permanently.

Through a business decision made by the plant's owners in California, the people who worked at the mill have lost their means of livelihood.

In its prepared statement, Triton said the closing is "not expected to have any serious financial impact" on the firm.

Well, maybe through tax write-offs the closing will not have a serious impact on Triton, but it certainly will have a critical financial impact on the people who worked for it in Boyd County. The company displayed an uncaring attitude in announcing a decision that will affect the lives of so many people in such cold business terms.

Despite the announcement, we are convinced there still is a future for Kentucky Electric Steel. Within the past five years, more than \$500 million has been invested in improvements for the mini-mill. It is a modern electric steel operation capable of making quality products at competitive prices.

Surely, a buyer can be found for the closed mill. The challenge of everyone interested in economic future of the community is to do everything possible to find a buyer willing to reopen the mill and once again make it a viable operation."

The State Journal, Frankfort - "No one who has followed the often difficult work of the Kentucky Commission on Human Rights the past 20 years can have been anything but saddened by the long months of acrimony between commission executives and some of its employees. That sorry spectacle climaxed recently in hearings by the state Personnel Board into charges the commission discriminated against its black and female workers.

Clearly, if the Personnel Board finds substance in the charges by the nine employees, the only conclusion can be that the commission's important work has been performed amid the rankest kind of hypocrisy which cannot be tolerated. In that event, the only alternative is a complete overhaul of the state's civil rights agency.

Sadly, even if the Personnel Board finds no basis for the discrimination charges, the allegations made by the nine employees will remain as a serious blot on the commission's record. In fact, when the commission released a report condemning Fayette County schools for maintaining what it believes to be segregated schools, there was a feeling that the commission ought to put its own house in order before condemning others.

Like Caesar's wife, the Commission on Human Rights must be above reproach and, regardless of what the Personnel Board rules on the matter, there is every indication that is no longer true, at the very least from the viewpoint of some of its own black employees. That does not make the commission's job any easier."

As you like it

Biographies must be harder to write than fiction.

Fiction can let the imagination roam where it will. The task of the biographer is to cut through the imagination to the hard facts.

Even then, the biographer will not reach the truth, because much of the fact of a person dies with the person, in the unopened subconscious motivations and plans and self-perceptions of the mind.

Much of the biography we read and discuss is really fiction.

Those who are important enough to be written and read about are myths and legends. The raw materials for biography are both fact and fiction.

Our view of George Washington, for example, is strongly colored by what "Parson" Weems wrote about him in his *Life of Washington*, once found in every home.

Similarly, our sense of Lincoln is in part determined by the writings of his former law partner, Bill Herndon, who never let fact stand in the way of a good story.

Just how hard biography is to write can be seen from reading two very fine biographies now available, the first scholarly

treatments of two important American figures whose fictional lives have long affected our national self-image.

One is Evan S. Connell's best-seller, *Son of the Morning Star: Custer and the Little Bighorn* (San Francisco, North Point Press, 1984). The other is William A. Settle, Jr.'s *Jesse James Was His Name, or Fact and Fiction Concerning the Careers of the Notorious James Brothers of Missouri* (University of Missouri Press, 1984, fifth printing).

The big events in both their lives occurred just a little over a century ago. So famous were they in their day, and so recent was that day, we ought to be able to see both Custer and James as they really were.

No chance, say their biographers.

What we can see is only a shadow, a dim outline of their lives - where and when they were born, a little genealogy, where they were on selected days but not on other days, who knew them, what was going on in the world around them, who they married, their children's names, and what was happening in national and local politics that affected them.

We can also, from scholarly research, see what was not true

about them. Perhaps that tells us more about our legends than anything.

Custer was not, for example, a man with long yellow hair on the day he died. He cut his hair short and was balding. About his only distinction at Little Big Horn was that he was the only soldier who wasn't scalped.

The big question about Custer was his competency. He was last in his class at West Point, held the record for disciplinary demerits there, never fought any kind of a battle except those in which he charged the enemy (whether Confederate or Indians), usually substituted audacity for manpower and plans, and wrote his own biography several times over as if he were writing a fiction for a presidential candidate. He was court-martialed several times, reprimanded often, demoted, transferred, and generally disliked.

All his biographer, Connell, can make of him is a parcel of paradoxes and riddles that he still not-be sorted out. Was he a hero, or a fool?

In the same way, Settle's view of James leaves us knowing little more about him than what we knew before.

The big question about Jesse James, of course, has always

been whether he was a villain or a Robin Hood.

Settle finds concrete evidence for seeing him either way, and both ways.

Both Settle on James and Connell on Custer place great emphasis upon the events around and touching their subjects' lives. They imply that heroes are made by accidents as much by their own intentions and actions.

More importantly, the biographers imply that the American public is the real writer of biographies. The facts only get in the way. A Custer is needed to justify American Indian policy and western expropriation of others' lands. A James is needed to justify American's resistance to "the system" and the right to operate outside the establishment.

In the end, when Custer dies at Little Big Horn, and when James is shot by Bob Ford, the facts most pertinent to the reader are that both operated outside the rules and proscribed our lives, and that both live on as we wanted them to be remembered, not as they were.

And thus, fiction and fact cannot be separated. They are intertwined to give us what we want to hear. History is a "likely story." It is also a "liked story."

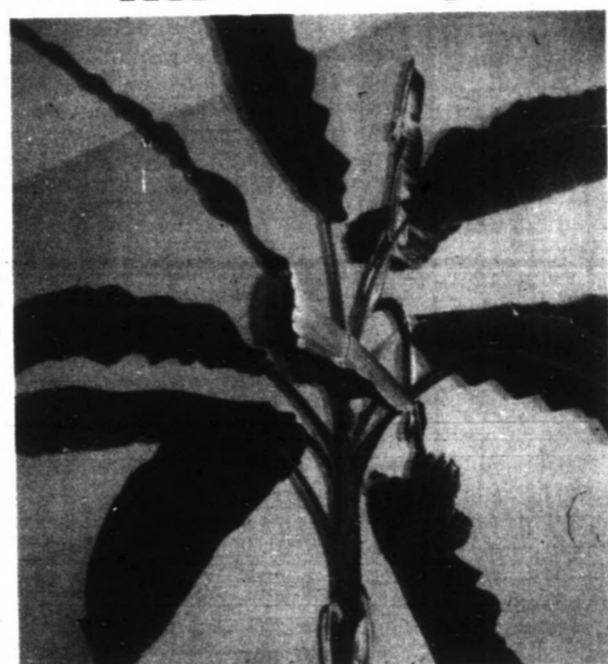

Price report delayed

WASHINGTON (AP) — In a rare occurrence, the Labor Department on Friday was forced to postpone release of one of its economic indicators — the wholesale price report for July.

The department's Bureau of Labor Statistics blamed "processing errors" for the delay and said it would require work through the weekend to have the Producer Price Index ready for release, probably on either Monday or Tuesday.

Thomas R. Tibbetts, assistant commissioner for industrial prices,

said that a series of errors were discovered Thursday night, too late for the report to be corrected for release Friday morning.

Tibbetts blamed the errors on the fact that government statisticians were making a number of modifications to this month's report. One of those changes is the elimination of the one-month lag in reporting changes in energy prices.

"We were doing so many things that we were somewhat distracted on focusing on any one thing," he said.

Consumers warned about fraud scheme

INDIANAPOLIS (AP) — Attorney General Linley E. Pearson warned consumers not to take part in a "pyramid" investment scheme known as the "Smoky Mountain Traders" based out of Fort Mitchell, Ky.

The scheme requires a deposit of \$15 to \$45, but Pearson said the only person who will profit from the scheme is the Kentuckian who is supposed to receive the membership fees of "suckers who fall for the pyramid."

Notices circulating in the Indianapolis area suggest members of the scheme will receive thousands of dollars from people all over the world, Pearson said Thursday. Handbooks are issued to members in which they are told to solicit three other persons for \$5 each, then those three solicit three others, he added.

Pearson said information on the notices being circulated was being forwarded to the Kentucky attorney general's office.

The Yankees had blown a 3-0 lead and trailed 6-4 when Henderson stepped to the plate in the sixth. Boston's Bob Stanley had just relieved Bruce Hurst, who hit Bobby Meacham with the bases loaded. Henderson promptly tied the score with a single and then stole his 51st base, tops in the league.

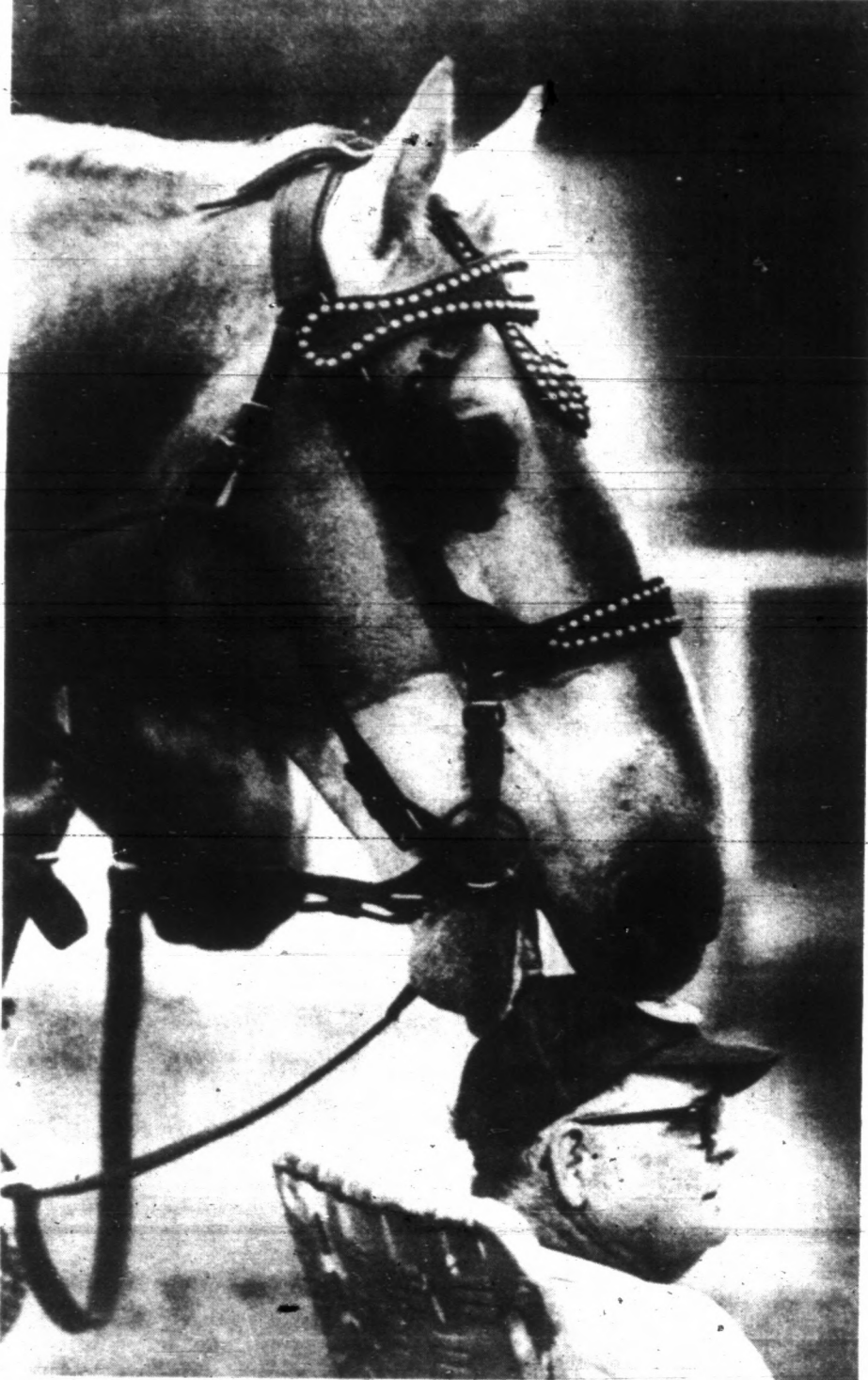

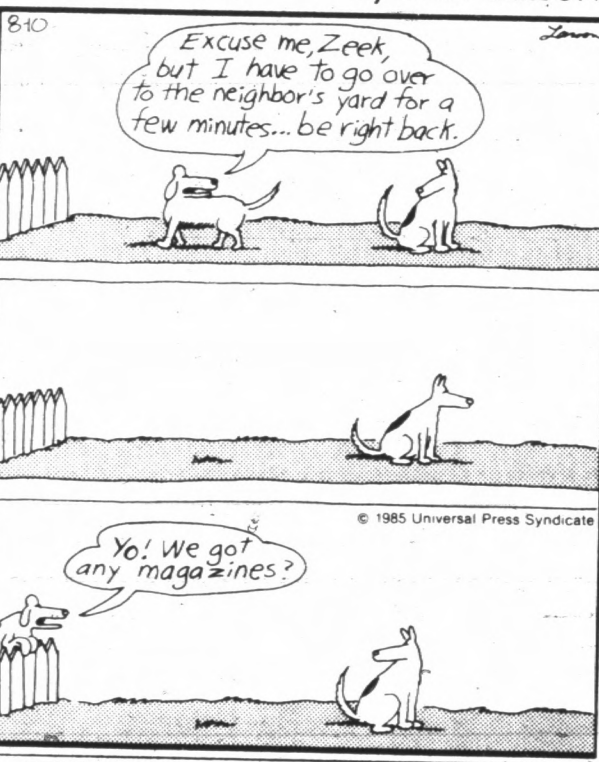

Seven die in car headed for Springsteen concert

CHICAGO (AP) — A city bus crushed a car that swerved in front of it at a busy lakefront intersection Friday, killing seven people in the automobile who were heading for a Bruce Springsteen concert and injuring 60 on the bus, authorities said.

Those killed had been "thrilled to get the tickets," for the concert a Soldier Field, about a mile away, said Sue Trizna, a sister of Bette Cipolle, 21, of Joliet, one of those killed.

"The others in the car were friends — boyfriend and girlfriends," said Mrs. Trizna.

Darlene Knox, 34, a passenger on the bus, said she thought the car, a green Cadillac, was trying to move into the left lane in front of the bus when the bus rode up over the car.

"The car cut in front of the bus," said Michael Kagle, a passenger on the bus.

"It was trying to get off at an exit and it cut the bus off." He said the bus wound up on top of the car and crushed it.

A crane was used to remove the bus from the auto, said Jim Morrison, a Fire Department spokesman. Iron workers from a nearby construction project helped rescue workers move the bus.

Morrison said seven people were killed and 60 injured in the 1:30 p.m. accident, with most of those injured being released after being treated at the scene.

Nine area hospitals reported treating 25 people from the accident. Spokesmen said those treated had mostly neck and back injuries and that none were critically hurt.

Some stunned victims sat on the grass near Lake Michigan, while others were laid out on gurneys to be picked up by ambulances. Many were fitted with neck braces.

The car's vinyl top was crushed into the seats from the weight of the bus. Rescue workers trying to free victims inside had to use an electric saw to cut the top away and pull it back like the lid of a can.

Social worker: guidelines commendable but too late

CHICAGO (AP) — The American Medical Association's new guidelines for helping doctors deal with the estimated million cases a year of child abuse are commendable but late, says a spokesman for social workers.

"There has been considerable underreporting by private practitioners," said Rae M. Hamilton, a spokesman for the National Association of Social Workers, based in Silver Spring, Md.

"They haven't been fully trained to recognize abuse, and they're only beginning now to teach medical students the signs of abuse and the proper response to it," Hamilton said Thursday.

His comments came in response to publication of the guidelines for the first time in today's Journal of the American Medical Association. They were adopted at a meeting of the organization's House of Delegates in December.

The guidelines cite estimates that more than 1 million children are seriously abused annually, including both physical and emotional abuse, and that 000 of them die as a result of their injuries.

Dr. Douglas A. Sargent, chairman of the AMA panel that drafted them, agreed that doctors have not taken an active enough role in combating abuse, saying, "The medical response has not been what it was imagined to have been."

The guidelines alert doctors to the main signs and symptoms of physical abuse, including bruises and

welts, burns in certain patterns, certain types of fractures and bleeding caused by shaking.

They also say doctors should look for signs of neglect, such as malnutrition, fatigue, poor hygiene and for signs of sexual and emotional abuse.

In addition, they outline characteristics of families in which abuse seems most often to occur: low income, proceeding, but only a violent behavior between parents, adults

Kennedy, a 27-year-old employee of the city Office of Business Development, is acting in a play at the Irish Arts Center.

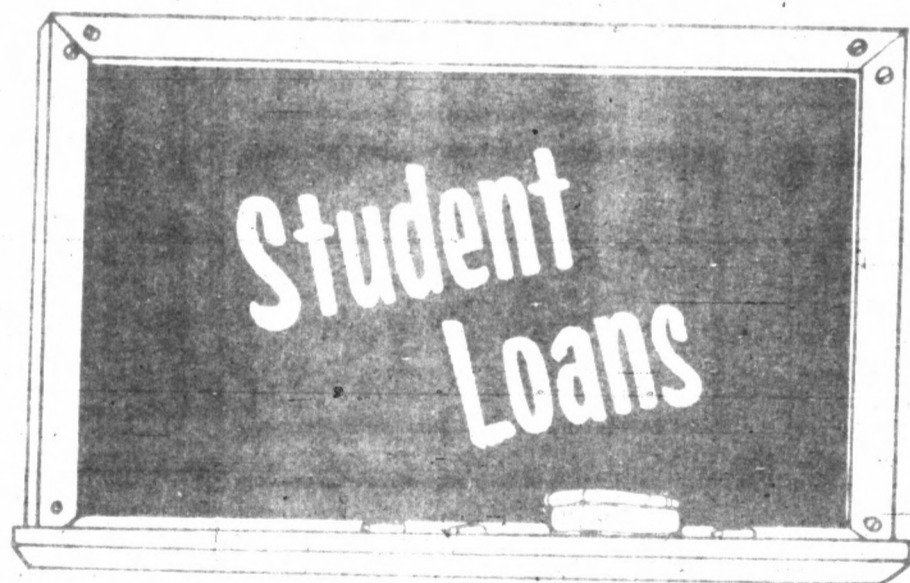
"This is definitely not a professional acting debut by any means. It's just a hobby," the son of the slain president said of his appearance in the two-character play "Winners" by Brian Friel.

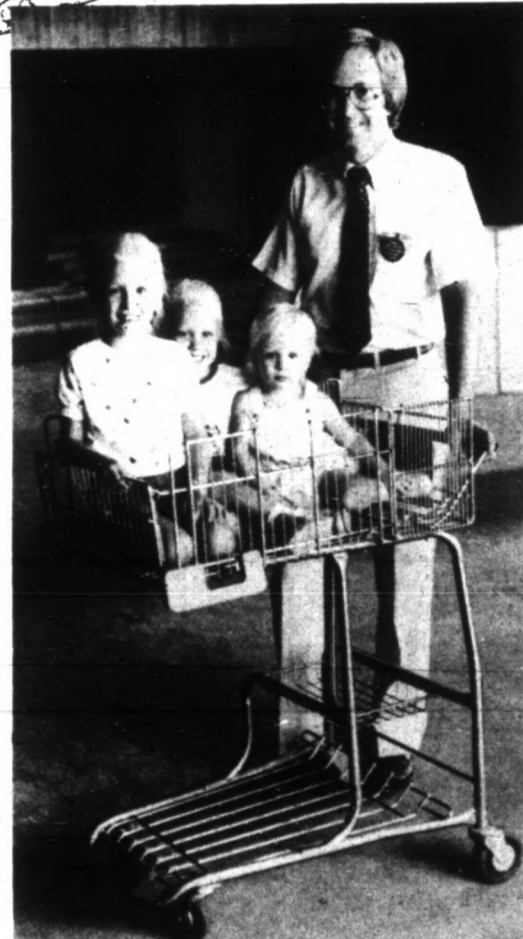

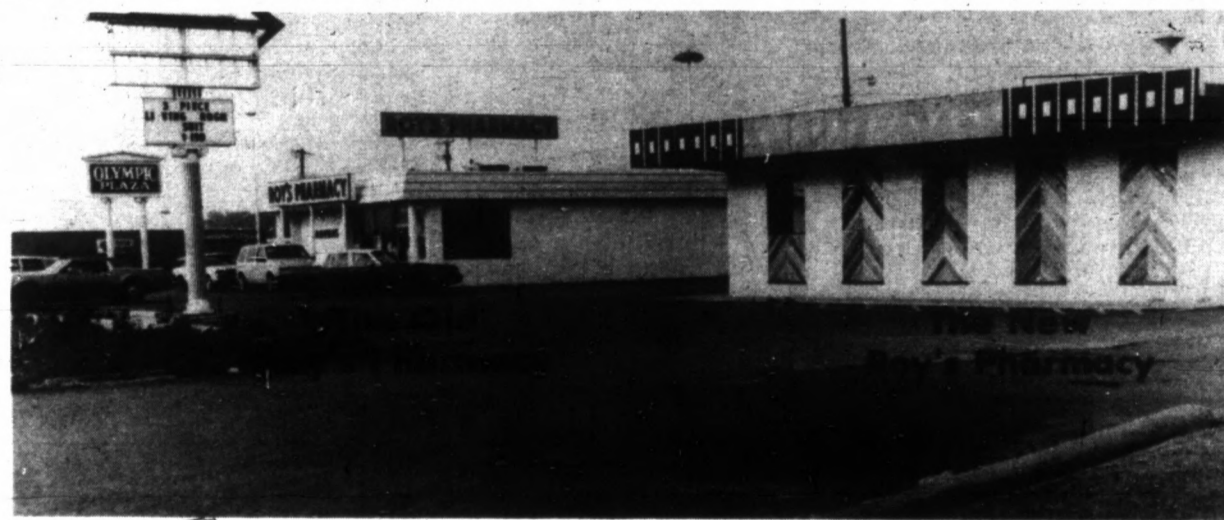
