Roll in mud saved Greenup County farmer with leg caught

GREENUP, Ky. (AP) — Rolling in the mud staunched the flow of blood and probably saved a Greenup County man whose leg was severed in a farm accident, officials said.

James Zerkle, 40, was listed in fair condition Friday at Our Lady of Bellefonte Hospital at Ashland. He underwent surgery there following the accident to remove his injured right leg just above the knee.

Zerkle, a part-time worker on the Greenup County Farm operated by Burtee Hall and his son, Ralph Hall, apparently caught his coat in the power-takeoff shaft of a tractor while operating a conveyor loader at a corncrib Monday, Ralph Hall said.

"He apparently was on the wrong side of the machine when he got his coat caught in the shaft and fell into it," Hall said. "It stripped him of his clothes — all that was left was his shorts and his left boot."

Hall said the machine severed Zerkle's right leg and injured his right shoulder, but "he had got back on the tractor even with his leg off, blew the horn for help and tried to drive to get help when he fell off."

Greenup County Sheriff's Deputy Jim Hamilton said Zerkle fell in a muddy area behind a barn near the Hall house.

"As far as I'm concerned, he actually saved his life by what he did," Hamilton said. "Apparently, he got down and rolled in the mud that was six to eight inches deep. Being cold, it caked on his injuries and stopped the bleeding."

Hall said Zerkle was semi-conscious when found by a fellow worker, James Bryant.

"He didn't say he actually tried to pack mud on his leg, but he was just lucky it was muddy," Hall said. "If it hadn't been he would have lay there and bled to death."

Zerkle had been wrapped in blankets by the time Hamilton arrived, the deputy said. "He was conscious all of the time I was there. He was going into a state of shock, but he never did lose consciousness."

By Wednesday, Hall said, Zerkle was "in good spirits and doing well," and had been removed from the hospital's critical list.

"The doctors thought he had done exceptionally well," Hall said. "He's a tough little fellow."

WASHINGTON — Nicaraguan rebels operating in northern Costa Rica engaged in cocaine trafficking over the past year helped finance their war against Nicaragua's leftist government, according to U.S. investigators and American volunteers who work with the rebels.

MASERU, Lesotho — South African commandos shot to death nine people, including anti-apartheid refugees, in a raid on two homes, Lesotho charges. South Africa denies its troops were responsible for the attacks in which seven black guests at party and a South African white woman and her husband were slain.

BEIRUT, Lebanon — Terry Waite, the archbishop of Canterbury's envoy, flew to Beirut for the third time in his attempt to free American hostages held by Shiite Moslems and says he hopes to end their captivity by Christmas.

WASHINGTON — The economy grew a lackluster 2.4 percent in 1985, the slowest pace since the last recession, but the year ended on a slightly faster note, giving the Reagan administration and many private economists hope that 1986 will be better.

WASHINGTON — A die-hard Congress, short of sleep and down to a skeleton crew in the House, shelved its budget stalemate, adjourned and dashed for the airport amid forecasts of worse fiscal turmoil next year.

JOHANNESBURG, South Africa — The army says it has been granted wide, police-style powers to quell domestic unrest, as South Africa faces renewed violence along the borders with its black neighbors.

PEKING — Teresa Ma stopped attending Mass in 1958 when the communists closed Bei Tang cathedral. On Christmas Eve, she returns for a midnight Mass celebrating not only Christ's birthday but the reopening of the century-old church. Lovingly restored, the cathedral is a symbol of the toleration of the thaw between church and state permitted by China's current government.

Legislators support lower interest rates

MAYFIELD, Ky. (AP) — Two state legislators told a congressional subcommittee Friday it's imperative that lower interest rates be made available to farmers.

"You can loan them (farmers) all the money at 13 percent and even if you bail out the system, it will be broke again in five years," said Rep. Ward (Butch) Burnette, D-Fulton.

He was the leadoff speaker at a meeting called by the subcommittee of the U.S. House Committee on Banking Finance and Urban Affairs.

U.S. Rep. Carroll Hubbard, D-Mayfield, the subcommittee chairman, presided at the session, attended by subcommittee

member Rep. Stan Parris, R-Va., and about 80 residents of the area.

Burnette, a grain farmer, is chairman of the General Assembly's farm-credit task force and chairman of the House Agriculture Committee.

Burnette criticized a congressionally-approved measure that is designed to reduce the indebtedness of Farm Credit System, which includes production credit associations and federal land banks.

"Farm Credit Administration officials should guarantee that the federal assistance would result in lowering the interest rates charged borrowers," Burnette said.

Rep. Richard Turner, R-

Tompkinsville, criticized federal policies which, he contended, penalize farmers who are good managers.

He charged that many farmers cannot borrow from these lenders because their finances are not dire enough to meet requirements.

Turner, the GOP nominee for agriculture commissioner in 1983, said agriculture has been victimized by lending agencies' "sales pitch" of the 1970s to increase production, even if that required extensive borrowing.

Rates, now at the 13 percent level, need to drop under 10 percent to allow farmers to handle their debts, Burnette said. Foreclosures on delinquent farm borrowers should be limited to those unable to pay

due interest, he added. Many farmers' problems with low profits also have caused a dangerous decline in farm land prices, Burnette said. The task force found that farm land values in Kentucky had fallen almost 50 percent in five years, he said.

The drop in values will cause an increasing number of farmers, even those making a profit, to get out of the business as they lose equity, he said.

Burnette said a motion prefiled for the upcoming General Assembly seeks to allocate surplus state funds for production loans. These would be administered by production credit associations, land banks and banks at about 6 percent interest, he said.

Courtroom siege ends

NANTES, France (AP) — The three gunmen who seized a courtroom full of hostages ended a 34-hour standoff with police after receiving a promise that one of them would be sent home to Morocco, France's top policeman said.

No one was injured in the siege, which began Thursday when the Moroccan, Abdel Karim Khalki, burst into the courtroom where two French comrades were being tried on armed robbery charges.

Carrying a grenade and a pistol, Khalki grabbed the judge by the throat and ordered guards to turn over their weapons.

The siege ended Friday night, when the trio released the last of their 32 hostages on an police-encircled airport runway, from where the gunmen had hoped to fly to freedom.

Police Commissioner Robert Broussard told reporters the three surrendered after police promised to expel Khalki, 33, to Morocco. He said officials appealed to the other two gunmen to "return the favor" Khalki had performed in trying to free them by allowing him to return home.

"They realized that they were sending their friend to his death" by holding out, Broussard said. "We found the breach because the Moroccan was linked to the affair by generosity and friendship."

Police said they assumed Khalki would be tried by Moroccan authorities.

During the takeover, Khalki, who has lived in France since 1974, claimed links to an extremist Palestinian organization. Officials declined to discuss the claims.

Police said Khalki befriended the two robbery suspects, Georges Courtois, 38, and Patrick Thiolet, 24, while all three were serving terms in a French prison.

Khalki had been in jail for an armed holdup, and was released Nov. 29.

During the courthouse standoff, the three freed most of their hostages, while issuing political statements, criticisms of the French legal system and society, and claims that they would rather die than return to jail.

Thirty hours after seizing guards' weapons and taking over the courtroom, the gunmen persuaded police to allow them and four remaining hostages — all court officials — to drive to the airport outside Nantes.

Handcuffed to their hostages, the gunmen walked to a car provided by police and drove first to the train station, where they picked up additional weapons.

Liquor, beer confiscated in raid

The two officers confiscated 100 bottles of beer, 141 cans of beer, a partial bottle of wine, a small quantity of illegal, untaxed moonshine, two half pints of whiskey, and several trash bags filled with beer and liquor containers. The raid on the store, located on North L.P. Miller Street, was prompted by a tip from an informant and an investigation by the police department, according to Mills. Arrested Friday night was Thurman N. Cowen, proprietor of the store, and charged with possession of alcohol in a dry option territory for the purpose of resale.

Panel recommends use of artificial heart

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Jarvik-7 artificial heart, criticized by some patient rights advocates as causing more suffering than it's worth, should continue to be used in humans, but with case-by-case approval and new reporting restrictions, a government advisory panel is recommending.

The Food and Drug Administration scientific panel, after two hours of public testimony and about six hours of closed debate, voted Friday night to allow the permanent artificial heart program to continue, despite a history of strokes and other serious complications among implant patients.

The panel's recommendation is not binding on the FDA. But the agency ordinarily follows such recommendations, and will

be under special pressure to do so in the highly charged artificial heart case.

The restrictions also are limited to use of the Jarvik-7 as a permanent heart replacement, not to its use as a "bridge" between a failed heart and an anticipated transplant heart.

Dr. Charles L. McIntosh, a National Institutes of Health surgeon and chairman of the advisory panel, said the committee agreed unanimously to allow the experiments to continue, but under tighter reporting requirements.

"They will include reports every three months on each patient receiving the Jarvik-7 as a permanent replacement heart and FDA approval for each operation, based on the success of the previous operation. Continued serious medical

complications in the next implant patient still could prompt the advisory committee to recommend a halt to the experiments, McIntosh said.

"Obviously, I think if there were multiple problems, the same kind of problems that we were reviewing today, that were persistent from patient to patient, that might give the panel food for thought for saying perhaps the sixth or seventh patient shouldn't be done," McIntosh said.

The panel's recommendation marked a victory for Dr. Robert Jarvik, developer of the artificial heart, and Dr. William DeVries, the Louisville, Ky., surgeon who is authorized to perform seven permanent implants.

Both worked hard on Friday to dissuade the panel from stopping the program. Jarvik testified publicly and met with reporters afterward. DeVries testified extensively in the closed session on medical questions, but did not attend the public session or a news conference afterwards.

They were arguing against critics who said the suffering for the patient in the artificial heart program outweighs any benefit to that patient, making it an unethical form of human experimentation.

George Annas, a patients' rights advocate and professor of health law at Boston University, said the "devastating results" of

the first four U.S. implants justified a halt.

"The notion that terminally ill people are somehow fair game for human experimentation has no historical credibility and no logical credibility," Annas said, arguing that the FDA has a responsibility to protect the terminally ill from improper medical experiments.

Dr. Sidney M. Wolfe, director of the Ralph Nader-organized Health Research Group, said any of the four patients to date would have been better off with a natural heart transplant. He noted there have been more than 500 heart transplants since the first Jarvik-7 implantation, with growing success.

"Tinkering with Jarvik-7 to iron out the serious problems accompanying its use in humans, and thereby exposing more humans, seems unscientific as well as immoral and unethical,"

Wolfe said. "It is time to go back to the drawing board and more experiments on animals."

The FDA four years ago authorized DeVries to implant seven permanent artificial hearts. He has completed four operations — on Barney Clark in December 1982, William Schroeder in November 1984, Murray Haydon in February 1985 and Jack Burcham in April.

Clark and Burcham have died, Burcham after only 10 days. Schroeder and Haydon are alive but have suffered serious complications, including debilitating strokes and internal bleeding and clotting.

Jarvik argued, however, that all four would have died without the heart. All accepted the risk of an experimental device knowing the odds were against them, he said, and knowing their experience could help others.

Electronic puppets draw crowds

puppets since their unveiling Nov. 26.

In one window, a 3-foot-tall Santa Claus plays a pipe organ, revolving occasionally on his stool to face his audience as if accepting applause.

Other windows show a musical instrument shop, where puppets with miniature tools shape violin parts and paint brightly colored horns passing on a hand-cranked conveyor belt.

Another display features a composer who writes his music with a quill pen while picking out the harmony on a gilded harpsichord.

"All the hard work pays off when I'm standing out there listening to people oohing and aahing about the characters in the windows," Krempetz said.

"They walk away a little happier."

Krempetz and Ed Breed began work on the display designs last April and started construction of the puppets and their elaborate settings in June. The display is the first joint effort by Krempetz' company, Stage One, and Breed's Entertainment Research Group.

The I. Magnin project uses technology from robotics, pneumatics and electronics to create "more natural movement than normal display motors that can only move in one direction," Breed said.

Krempetz said the puppets' faces and hands are made of skin-like latex and then air-brushed to accentuate the features; glass eyes and wigs of real hair also were used.

including a machine-gun pistol, from a locker, police sources said.

Police allowed them to drive onto a runway about 400 yards from a parked Mystere 20 executive jet, and they released two more hostages.

Surrounded by police and told they would not be allowed to leave, they gave up four hours later, releasing the last two hostages, Judge Dominique Bailhache and his assistant, Bernard Bureau.

Although many of their demands were vague and rambling, one was clear. They insisted on, and received, extensive coverage from French television and radio.

News broadcasts of the siege stirred controversy over the use of the media by the gunmen. One French network refused to air any footage Thursday night.

A sampling of state editorials

The Kentucky Enquirer, Covington: All America mourns the loss of 248 of her finest — soldiers of the Army's 101st Airborne Division — in the crash of a chartered DC-8 bringing them home for Christmas. The tragedy must occasion steps to modify military transport policy to reduce the future risk of such disasters.

This is surely no time for excuses or any notion that accidents just happen. The crash just after takeoff from Gander, Newfoundland, almost certainly could have been prevented.

Many Americans were astonished that the soldiers were being returned to Fort Campbell from Sinai duty by a small Miami charter airline. With the giant transports in the U.S. Military Airlift Command, it seemed unreal that the Army had to hire Arrow Airlines — an airline the Federal Aviation Administration cited last summer for sloppy operations.

President Reagan and the appropriate committees of Congress should review the charter-flight policy. ... The military, moreover, has tighter control over its own planes and crews. Congress and the president should determine why charter flights are cheaper — and whether the economy factor should govern.

That these stalwart members of the 101st, and all eight crew members, died just before Christmas was all the more tragic. The nation can best respond by ensuring to the extent possible that such a tragedy

never again occurs.

Middlesboro Daily News, Middlesboro: As the upcoming 1986 session of the General Assembly approaches, the state Chamber (of Commerce) has released its basic lobbying program of goals it hopes to achieve this term. Most of them, we've concluded, seem worthy of support.

The Kentucky chamber says it favors an increase in the state motor-fuels tax but wants a respite from new taxes aimed strictly at business. The chamber, the state's largest business organization (2,000 members), also says it supports a constitutional amendment to make the superintendent of public instruction an appointive instead of elective office.

The chamber's first legislative policy manual urges a thorough examination of the number of sales-tax exemptions the state allows, and more aggressive pursuit of taxes on out-of-state vendors doing business in Kentucky.

The chamber manual says the group also favors a right-to-work law; preservation of an appointed Public Service Commission; voluntary health insurance; formation of a task force to study workers' compensation; and repeal of a law that sets the wages to be paid on public-works contracts.

At the least, we would hope that our legislators will study the chamber's proposals. ... We don't expect them all to be passed, but we believe they should get a full hearing.

Remembering Christmas Days past

Back-then, between two grandfathers' houses 150 miles apart, Christmas stretched for miles and for days, like a strip of inner-tube lashed to the fork tips of a slingshot.

Both grandfathers bore old scars.

One, a farmer-politician, lost an eye when a stray kindling stick catapulted off an axe at the woodpile, out past a well in the side-lot of the weather-grayed farmhouse.

The other, a city-dweller, had his leg bowed permanently by a stray bullet that passed through his bunkhouse wall in the railroad camp where he worked in his earlier days.

Each December school day ended with a chorus of "Hark the herald angels shout; a few more days 'til we get out." We don't recall decorated trees and wrap-

ped presents there, but we remember table-bending meals and pie safes full of between-meal pies and cakes. We liked best the cold biscuits for finger-sticking and filling with sorghum.

That was before TVA gave us night lights, and so we three piled early into one of the two feather beds in the livingroom where our grandparents and the fire were. Huddled onionskin tight against each other, with the oldest in the choice outside spot nearest the fire, in the flickering firelight our grandfather's glass eye stared at us from its heavy water tumbler at one end of the mantel. In a twin glass at the other end, our grandmother's deplures smiled down upon us. A snuff can divided them.

Then, Christmas still days

away, we boarded the L & N for Memphis. There seven boy cousins slept on pallets we rolled up to clear a day-time lounge for our endless games of Battle and Crazy-8's, in full view of a grandmother who thought cards were sinful. We played around the grandfather's easy chair, hiding marbles in his red tobacco can from which he rolled cigarettes, also on the grandmother's unapproved list. He would limp out to get the paper, and with us at his feet, use it as his text in teaching us how to cuss without profanity as he explained how wronged his world was by FDR and Boss Crump. Looking up at him from our floor seats, he looked like a cross between God and Lionel Barrymore.

Unto us a girl cousin was born who grew old enough to dare to enter our all-male domain of

grandfather and seven male dwarfs sitting on the floor nearer him than any of us, her pants leg and gently rubbed the shin dent left by that long-ago bullet. Somehow we learned more about the meaning of the Garden of Eden story than from all the times the grandmother had told it. But was this girl cousin Eve or the serpent?

So we took our grandfathers with their wounds and ways and wrapped them in feather mattresses and "Press-Scimitar" sheets, and tied them in our memories to Christmas tree cuttings and fruitcake slings, and passed through the depression without ever knowing there had been one. We needed no electric trains, for we had our L & N and grand-grandparents at either end.

WASHINGTON (AP) — Chairman Dante Fascell is pointing the House Foreign Affairs Committee toward an active 1986, whether it's tracing Soviet expansionism or challenging the Reagan administration's interpretation of nuclear arms agreements.

In two years as chairman, the Florida Democrat has reshaped the committee in the image of his spirited personality.

The committee was quick to challenge the cost-effectiveness of President Reagan's "Star Wars" program, and the way his quest for a shield against nuclear missiles was "bumping against" the 1972 Anti-Ballistic Missile Treaty.

"We had some impact in getting things changed around," Fascell said with some satisfaction the other day as he reflected on this year's record and looked ahead to 1986.

He seemed particularly pleased to spot that Assistant Secretary of Defense Richard Perle, who has led the administration's charge on the value of U.S.-Soviet agreements, now supports a narrow interpretation.

In weighing appropriations for Star Wars, which by some estimates could wind up costing \$1 trillion, Congress now is inclined to question spending more on a futuristic defense than it would cost the Soviets to pierce the shield.

Fascell is gearing up to push the Reagan administration next year into opening negotiations with the Soviet Union to ban all underground nuclear tests. He and Rep. Berkeley Bedell, an Iowa Democrat, have rounded up about 200 co-sponsors of a resolution to promote the talks. It also calls for Senate action on

two treaties to limit such tests. The pacts were reached in the mid-1970s but never ratified.

"It's still a legitimate concern," Fascell said of the attempt to apply a brake to the arms race.

A veteran of 31 years in the House, Fascell knows the limits the Constitution places on Congress, particularly the House.

On arms control, Fascell acknowledged, "we don't have a lot of input because we cannot direct the negotiators. That's a private matter, strictly between the president and the negotiators."

In reviewing treaties, the Constitution gives the power of ratification or rejection to the Senate — not the House.

But through resolutions and the like, Fascell said the House — and, by inference, his committee — could have an impact.

In fact, he said, "we could raise Cain" by introducing a resolution to abolish a particular treaty that did not seem to be in the U.S. interest. "We in the Congress have a legitimate reason to be involved in all these processes and considerations," he said.

Part of the committee's new look under its feisty chairman are the 10 hearings held this year on various foreign policy issues. Fascell calls them "seminars," designed mostly for educational purposes.

One of his pet projects is the investigation the committee launched after the recent assertions by Secretary of State George Shultz and Assistant Secretary Elliott Abrams that the Cubans had become more involved in helping the Nicaraguan government fight U.S.-backed rebels.

Toyota will affect entire state

COVINGTON, Ky. (AP) - Georgetown is the obvious boom town if Toyota decides to build its \$500 million U.S. car assembly plant in Scott County, but the impact of such an industry won't end at the county line.

The plant would employ more than 2,000 workers to assemble about 200,000 cars a year, but a University of Kentucky economist predicts another 2,000 to 4,000 jobs will follow in the area over two to three years.

Finance professor Charles F. Haywood said the ripple effect on the region's economy probably will be felt throughout central and northern Kentucky, linked to Georgetown by Interstates 64 and 75.

Some people from northern Kentucky might be willing to commute an hour or so to work at a new auto plant or be willing to relocate closer for employment, and neighbors displaced at southwestern Ohio auto plants are likely to watch the developments with interest.

Haywood told The Kentucky Post his predictions were based on an economic belief that for every job created by a source of demand outside a community, such as cars, at least one other job exists to serve the local market in retail, wholesale or service-oriented industry.

Many people feel that accounts deal primarily with taxes and business problems. Another very important function of accountants is assisting individuals with personal financial planning.

Tax planning is important, particularly on any transaction involving amounts equal to 10 percent or more of your net worth.

Extensive estate and gift tax planning is appropriate for those individuals who have more than adequately provided for their retirement. There are, however, some estate planning considerations for all individuals. For example, even if you have no accumulated assets, who will be the guardian of your minor children in the event of the death of you and your spouse?

Personal financial planning can be of significant benefit to all individuals, old or young, rich or poor.

Murray 67, Calloway 59 OT

'Typical' battle waged for rivalry game outcome

A 67-59 overtime game between victorious host Murray High and visiting rival Calloway County left most of the capacity crowd in 1,600-seat MHS gym uttering the same thing at the end.

"Another typical Murray-Calloway basketball ballgame."

Friday's matchup fit the bill for almost every collision between the two schools with enough surprises, turnarounds, comebacks, rejections, and yes even an overtime to more than satisfy every fan's entertainment dollar.

Neither team led by more than five points in regulation and the only two times that was achieved was when Calloway held a 27-22 lead at halftime and Murray led 42-37 in the third period.

The lead switched hands 11 times in the second half and both teams had opportunities to wrap up a win in the original 32 minutes.

Calloway's Mark Garrison canned a put-back with 1:28 showing to give the Lakers a 57-56 lead. Murray's Ramsey Ellington was fouled on the Tigers next trip down court and he hit one of two free throws to

tie the game at 57 with 1:12 left.

The Lakers ran the clock down to 12 seconds, called timeout, then at :01 Mark Garrison had an open shot at the corner of the foul line and it bounced off the front rim into Stanley Rutledge's hands. End of regulation.

In overtime, Rutledge, who led all scorers with 28 and all rebounders with 21, scored four of his team's 10 points and Mark West was perfect on four free throws to give the hosts their first district win of the season.

MHS coach Cary

Miller said it took a halftime adjustment to get his team back into its offense and after that the results favored the Tigers down the stretch.

"When we couldn't run our offense, we fell apart on defense. In the second half we went back to our man-to-man and we started running our offense and playing basic basketball. When we run our offense, we're not a bad ballclub," Miller said.

Jack Pack, whose Lakers dropped to 4-2 and 0-2 in league play, said his team's inexperience reared up in untimely situations.

"We gave up way too many free throws, got into foul trouble ... even with all that," Pack continued, "we still had a shot to win the game and missed it. Anytime you come into a place like Murray High and have a final shot to win the game, that's all you can ask."

The Tigers dominated the boards, according to MHS stats, by a 38-29 margin. Mark Garrison led the Lakers with nine rebounds.

The Lakers even unleashed a mystery player on the unsuspecting Tigers when Madisonville transfer Jeff White made his first major contribution

to the Calloway program by scoring 10 points and blocking one shot in a reserve role.

However, the 6-foot-2 junior center was slapped with a costly technical when he missed the front end of a two-shot free throw trip and slammed the ball down in frustration. At the time of the unsportsmanlike infraction, the Lakers were trailing only 44-43 with a chance to gain the lead at 5:56 in the third period.


West went to the line for Murray and hit one of two technical free throws to extend the lead to two points, 45-43.

White, who missed the earlier Calloway games because of an illness, stepped in for starting center Tony Jackson who had 10 points before being saddled with his third and fourth fouls only 30 seconds into the third period.

Miller admitted he was impressed by White's reserve performance against the Tigers' star Rutledge, "but after 16 years coaching basketball nothing surprises me anymore," Miller stated. "I thought both teams played extremely hard and both played good basketball at times."

Calloway managed to score one more basket from the field, 25-24, but the Tigers took the advantage at the line hitting 19 of 28 free throws to Calloway's 9 of 19.

Chuck Adams was the leading Laker scorer with 15 followed by

Mickey Garrison with 13.

Murray had West with 13 from the point and Ellington with 12.

Calloway is idle until after the Christmas break when the Lakers host regional powerhouse Graves County, Jan. 3.

Murray, now 4-3 and 1-2 in district standings, takes a short breather before travelling to Charleston, Ill., to defend its Christmas basketball tournament championship held at Eastern Illinois University. The Tigers, seeded No. 3, face Taylorville in

the 10:30 a.m. game on Thursday, Dec. 26.

UK crushes East Carolina, but Pepperdine no pushover

LEXINGTON, Ky. (AP) - Kentucky coach Eddie Sutton doesn't believe his Wildcats will have any easy time with unranked Pepperdine in the championship game of the Kentucky Invitational Tournament tonight.

And Pepperdine coach Jim Harrick hopes Sutton is right.

Kentucky, ranked 13th, crushed East Carolina 86-52 in the opening round of the tourney Friday night. Pepperdine had a more difficult time, downing Southern Methodist

68-56 in overtime.

"I think Pepperdine is an excellent team," Sutton said. "They are well-balanced, which makes it difficult to play against them. You can't concentrate on stopping one player because they have four or five who can hit you for 20 points."

"We have great respect for Pepperdine and they'll be one of the finest teams we'll play all season."

Pepperdine, which blew a 17-point first-half lead against Southern Methodist, won its seventh straight game

after a season-opening loss to sixth-ranked Kansas.

"You will see a different team tomorrow night," Harrick said of meeting Kentucky. "But I am not naive in the face of Kentucky's record here in Rupp Arena. Tonight you didn't see the quickness we normally have. We will have to play better tomorrow night. A lot better."

Forward Eric White and Dwayne Polee tossed in 20 points apiece as Pepperdine handed Southern Methodist its first setback in seven games this season.

White gave Pepperdine the lead for good in overtime at 68-66 on an 18-footer with 3:02 to go. The Waves added seven more points before Southern Methodist's Kevin Lewis scored with four seconds left.

Anthony Frederick added 11 points and Jon Korfas scored 10 for the winners.

Center Terry Williams and Lewis each tallied 20 points for Southern Methodist.

But Southern Methodist rallied to tie the game at 60-60 on Lewis' three-point play with 2:27 to go.

Polee gave Pepperdine a 62-60 lead on two free throws at 2:10, but Southern Methodist pulled even with nine seconds to go on Jones' basket. Pepperdine's White missed a 25-footer as regulation time ran out.

Kentucky star forward Kenny Walker, wearing goggles to protect his injury-prone eyes, scored 19 points and guard James Blackmon added 18 as the Wildcats improved their record to 6-1. East Carolina fell to 4-2.



Lady Laker pressure buries host Murray High, 67-34, Friday

When the county's two high school girls' basketball teams met Friday night on the Murray High floor they each used every inch of the court, pressing almost continuously throughout the contest.

Although the Lady Lakers and Lady Tigers shared the use of the entire floor, the Calloway girls were very stingy with the scoreboard, trouncing on the hosts 67-34.

It was the worst beating that the Lady Lakers had handed Murray in the past four seasons under their respective coaches.

"They put a lot of pressure on us early," said Murray skipper Jimmy Harrell. "We just couldn't handle it and couldn't adjust to it."

"We knew we were going to come out and press them," Calloway County coach John Orr said. "We knew they were not going to handle the ball that well. We had watched them, they're young a team."

"We wanted to come out and get the tempo up," said Orr. The Lady Laker coach said that his strategy was to come out fighting and get in front early. "We

jumped out 8-0 and that really set the tempo," he said.

Actually the Lady Lakers led 10-0 before the hosts could muster their first basket almost six minutes into the first period when Michelle Westerfeld connected on a three-point play.

The Laker women went into a heavy press with just under 4:00 remaining in the opening quarter and began to force the turnovers that eventually destroyed the Lady Tigers.

Calloway forced 39 turnovers, led by Anita Hill who forced 10, and capitalized on the majority of the Tiger women's mistakes, as the Lady Lakers shot 46 percent from the field during the first half.

"A lot of people press us because they know we're young and inexperienced up front," said Harrell. "When you've got young and experienced ballhandlers you're going to turn the ball over a lot."

At the half Calloway had built a substantial 39-20 lead, but did not show any signs of mercy on the Lady Tigers. The Laker women opened the second half with extreme defensive pressure in the Murray back court and con-

tinued to force turnovers.

With a 28-point lead to open the third period both teams went to the bench, but the Laker reserves continued to gain ground until the 33-point victory was confirmed at the final buzzer.

Christy Darnell, who had nine rebounds, led the Laker attack with 14 points, while Amberly Moss and center Christy Anderson added 12 each. Capping the Murray High offense was Kelly Ridley who scored eight points, all of which she earned in the first half.

The Lady Lakers improved their record to 4-2, before the two-week Christmas break, while the Lady Tigers settled for an even 3-3 mark.

Both teams will resume action Jan. 6 with Calloway at home against Graves County and Murray at Carlisle County.



Singer arrested after shooting

HILLSBORO, Ohio (AP) — Country singer Johnny Paycheck was jailed Friday on a charge of felonious assault for the shooting of a man during a tavern dispute, police said.

Paycheck, who also gave police the name he was given at birth, Donnie Lytle, appeared before Judge Jon Hapner in Hillsboro Municipal Court for arraignment. The judge set bond at \$25,000 and postponed the arraignment until Monday morning to allow Paycheck time to obtain a lawyer.

Paycheck was incarcerated in the Highland County Jail in

this southwestern Ohio town about 40 miles east of Cincinnati, police spokesman Randy Sanders said.

Police identified the accused man as the country singer Paycheck, who was born May 31, 1941, in the nearby town of Greenfield, Ohio.

The singer is best known for his 1978 country hit song, "Take This Job and Shove It." He also recorded the hits "Drinkin' and Drivin'" and "I'm the Only Hell (Mama Ever Raised)." In 1977, the singer was given an Ohio Governor's Award, an annual honor bestowed on Ohioans deemed outstanding in their

professions. Hillsboro Police Capt. Kenny Cumberland said Paycheck shot a Greenfield man with a small-caliber pistol about 11:30 p.m. Thursday in this Highland County community. Hapner identified the shooting victim as Larry Wise, who was not seriously injured.

Authorities said Paycheck fled and was arrested at a trailer in a mobile home park in adjoining Clinton County. Authorities said he didn't resist arrest. The shooting victim was released after treatment at Highland District Hospital, Cumberland said. Sanders said police

are investigating the shooting and do not know why it occurred.

Paycheck's attorney in Nashville, Tenn., Ralph Gordon, said he spoke with the singer after the arrest.

"Johnny tells me he's a victim of circumstances," Gordon said. "The facts have not been fully developed. He feels he's not guilty."

Paycheck was scheduled to perform Friday night in Paducah, Ky. His manager, E.R. Rhines, said attempts were underway to get Paycheck out on bond to keep the Kentucky commitment.

Mayor-elect plans personnel changes

HOPKINSVILLE, Ky. (AP) — Republican Mayor-elect Herb Hays, who takes office next month, was given the go-ahead to oust the police and fire chiefs and other city administrative officials after the city council became deadlocked over a personnel ordinance.

The council's 6-6 vote Thursday night reversed a preliminary decision two days earlier when the council unanimously approved a proposed law that would have prohibited the mayor from firing top city officials without council approval if the official objected.

The 6-6 tie was enough to defeat the proposal because passage requires a majority. Mayor Sherry Jeffers, a Democrat who lost to Hays in November, could have voted to break the council tie, but she declined.

After the ordinance was tentatively approved Tuesday, Hays and his supporters launched a lobbying campaign and packed the city council meeting Thursday night to convince the council to defeat the measure.

All council members said they had been inundated with phone calls from opponents of the proposed ordinance.

The controversy was sparked by Hays' announcement that he would fire Police Chief Frank Boyer and Fire Chief Paul Barnes. Both were hired four years ago to fill vacancies and were chosen over applicants from within the department.

After the council vote Thursday, a tearful Boyer stood before the packed chambers and said, "I'm sorry we came to this community and upset you."

Owensboro teen acquitted in accident

EVANSVILLE, Ind. (AP) — The 17-year-old driver of the pickup truck that crashed into a crowd of people after a concert last summer was found innocent of a felony criminal wrongdoing.

Nanette Berry, an Owensboro, Ky., high school junior, was driving a truck that hit two cars and 13 people on July 2 after a Mesker Music Theatre concert by singer Bryan Adams. Three of the people were injured seriously. Several lawsuits have been filed against Miss Berry and the city.

During a delinquency trial in juvenile court on Friday, Miss Berry said

she was driving the truck because "I thought my friend (who had been driving the truck) had been drinking and I didn't want to take any chances."

Miss Berry tearfully told Vanderburgh Juvenile Court Judge Robert Lensing that she had driven the truck once before, but "panicked" when she couldn't get the truck to stop as the car in front of her slowed down.

"The pedal wouldn't go down," she said. "I pushed it and the brakes wouldn't work and I panicked and I went into the other lane." Miss Berry said "I saw an oncoming car and I

didn't know what to do."

Miss Berry swerved back, hit a parked car and began striking pedestrians.

Witnesses in the trial speculated that a cup or plastic pitcher on the floor of the truck may have been wedged between the brake pedal and floorboard. The brakes were examined by police and found to be in working order.

Police said tests revealed no trace of alcohol in Miss Berry's blood and she gave no sign of being under the influence of drugs.

Miss Berry's defense attorney, Jack VanStone, submitted 24 letters from friends,

neighbors, school officials and community leaders testifying to Miss Berry's character.

Lensing said Miss Berry should be complimented for volunteering to drive the truck because her friend was drinking. He said she may have been negligent and showed an error in judgment, but those are civil responsibilities, not criminal.

Lensing said Miss Berry was innocent of criminal recklessness because there was no evidence she intended to harm anyone or knew that what she was doing could result in such serious harm.

Pilot makes emergency landing

HEBRON, Ky. (AP) — A pilot flying a load of overnight-delivery packages made a safe emergency landing Friday after deciding to return to Greater Cincinnati Airport because ice had formed on the wings and tail of his twin-engine airplane, airport officials said.

The pilot, Bill Chinchon, who works for an Ypsilanti, Mich., air cargo company, had taken off from the airport and was about 35 miles out when he noticed ice forming on his plane's left wing. Rescue units were dispatched to the airport and air traffic controllers guided Chinchon in for his emergency landing at about 5:30 a.m. EST.

The landing did not damage the plane, he said. The airport is in northern Kentucky, across the Ohio River from Cincinnati.

Appeals court settles 'power struggle'

FRANKFORT, Ky. (AP) — The Court of Appeals on Friday tried to resolve a continuing "power struggle" between the Cabinet for Human Resources and district courts in Kentucky over the fate of children who are wards of the state.

The cabinet contends that once it is selected by the court to take care of the child, the court loses the authority to tell the agency how to take care of the child. All three members of the appeals panel agreed with that position.

But the judges split on the issue of whether district courts can hold the cabinet in contempt for failing to follow valid court orders.

Three cases from different counties were consolidated to resolve

the underlying issues. "These three cases stem from a power struggle between CHR and the juvenile session of district court," the appeals panel said.

Two judges said district courts have "both express and implied authority to enforce valid orders to CHR through contempt proceedings."

Judge Anthony Wilhoit said the majority opinion went too far. Wilhoit said it is clear that district courts have no authority to direct the cabinet where to place a child once it is in the agency's custody.

But Wilhoit said he has reservations about whether the cabinet, as opposed to its secretary or some other employee, can be held in contempt.

In another case, the

court ruled that the Public Service Commission can legally allow utilities to collect a surcharge, despite objections by the attorney general's office that such a move is void because it amounts to retroactive legislation.

The commission allowed the surcharge to Elzie Neely Gas Co., Phelps Gas Co. and Pendleton County Water District after they fell behind in payments to their supplier, Columbia Gas of Kentucky.

A surcharge is not in itself illegal as long as it "does not impose a new duty on the customers of the utility in question," the court said.

"It is a clear case of the commission making the best of an impossible situation," the court continued. "There appears to have been no

reasonable alternative in insuring survival of the retail suppliers and uninterrupted service to their customers."

The court also ordered that back wages be paid to a Louisville police officer who was dismissed after his felony conviction in Shelby Circuit Court.

The conviction of John W. Vaden was reversed on appeal and he was acquitted during a second trial.

Agreement: 'A real good present'

FIREVILLE, Ky. (AP) — Though terms weren't immediately clear, coal miner Irvin Smith called Friday's news of an end to the United Mine Workers selective strike against A.T. Massey Coal Co. "a real good Christmas present."

"I actually cried" when word of UMW President Rich Trumka's announcement came, Smith said

when reached Friday night.

The 43-year-old miner and some other members of UMW Local 1440 were awaiting further news at his home at Buskirk, in Pike County's Blackberry Creek area near the Kentucky-West Virginia border, he said. "Some of my friends have already heard it on the radio."

celebrating," said Smith's wife, Hazel, adding that the family would welcome a regular paycheck after existing on \$200 a week union strike benefits. "You better believe it," she said.

In spending for herself, her husband and three children, she said, "I was used to a \$2,000-a-month budget and now it's \$800. That's quite a cut."


