News In Brief

KGB defector to speak at MSU in Curris Center, Tuesday, Feb. 3

Maj. Stanislav Levchenko, the highest ranking KGB officer to defect to the United States, will be the guest speaker on the Murray State University campus at 8 p.m. Tuesday, Feb. 3, in the Curris Center Theater.

As an officer in the Soviet secret police and intelligence agency, Levchenko gathered political information and implemented large-scale covert actions in Japan and other Far East countries. In this capacity, he recruited and directed high-ranking agents of influence in the leading political and media circles of Japan.

In 1979, Levchenko was promoted to the rank of major and appointed acting chief of the Active Measures Group of the agency's Tokyo residency.

In October of 1979, Levchenko asked the United States government for asylum. During his tour of duty in Japan, Levchenko said his deep-seated repugnance with the oppression of the Communist system led to his decision to defect so he could "live in peace and freedom." Since that time, he has lived in the United States.

Levchenko has been seen in disguise on major television networks throughout the U.S. and abroad and has been instrumental in uncovering KGB operations and spy networks.

John Barron's book "Inside the KGB" depicts many of the exploits and operations conducted by Levchenko while advancing through the ranks of the KGB. Since that publication, Levchenko has written "On the Wrong Side," which will be available in the U.S. early in 1987.

BEIRUT, Lebanon — As Anglican envoy Terry Waite and West Germany's ambassador try to win the release of kidnapped Westerners, the identities of two foreigners abducted on Friday remain unknown.

WASHINGTON — In what officials call "an honest mistake," the Pentagon has acknowledged it undercharged the Central Intelligence Agency by almost \$2.6 million for anti-tank missiles that were sold to Iran last year.

TEHRAN, Iran — President Ali Khamenei said 1,786 Iranian civilians have been killed in Iraqi air raids since Iran launched its big ground offensive on the southern war front two weeks ago.

CUMMING, Ga. — Thousands of civil rights marchers schooled in non-violent techniques plan to converge today for a "march against fear and intimidation" along a 1 1/4-mile route lined with at least 1,500 National Guardsmen and hundreds of other law enforcement officers.

NEW YORK — After roaring along in an unprecedented year-opening rally, Wall Street tripped over an awesome selloff that saw stock prices take some king-size swings before falling sharply lower on the busiest day in the market's history.

THE NORTHEAST U.S. — The Northeast gets the second part of winter's one-two punch today as gusty winds whip across the snowy Atlantic Coast accompanied by dangerously cold wind chill temperatures, while Florida braces for freezing temperatures.

MANILA, Philippines — A political foe of Corazon Aquino said the text of a purported telephone call between the president and her advisers indicates the United States maintains nuclear weapons in the Philippines.

WASHINGTON — The federal government for the first time has imposed sanctions against a state for failing to adequately enforce the 55-mile-an-hour speed limit — a \$50,000 fine against Arizona.

ORLANDO, Fla. — New studies suggest that very low protein intake and lowered blood pressure may slow the progressive kidney damage that forces many diabetics to undergo dialysis or kidney transplant, a researcher says.

WASHINGTON — The Federal Communications Commission has opened an inquiry that may be the beginning of the end of a regulation that requires broadcasters to cover both sides of a controversy. The proceeding, announced Friday, is in response to a court order a week ago directing the FCC to decide whether the Fairness Doctrine should continue to be enforced.


WASHINGTON — Top U.S. and European trade officials will make a last-ditch effort this weekend to resolve a bitter dispute that could result in steep tariffs on an array of European products by the end of next week. The talks were delayed Friday when the European Community's trade negotiator, Willy de Clercq, was unable to arrange a flight to Washington because of snow. The talks are scheduled to get under way today.

MSU to see three new faces

Collins makes appointments to board

FRANKFORT, Ky. (AP) — Gov. Martha Layne Collins on Friday made wholesale appointments to the eight state university boards, sacking many members in their fifth or sixth year of service, but keeping a promise to leave in place the members of the University of Kentucky presidential search team.

Appointed to the Murray State University board were Robert C. Carter, Hopkinsville, to replace Jere L. McCuiston, Trenton; Billy G. Hurt, Frankfort, to replace Richard L. Frymire, Madisonville; and C. Waitman Taylor Jr., Owensboro, to replace Jim Cooke, Louisville.

University of Louisville President Donald Swain predicted a showdown of sorts at his board meeting on Monday between old members and new appointees.

Collins appointed prominent members of her administration, political supporters and business associates of her husband, Dr. Bill Collins, to various university boards.

One member of the UK board who was not reappointed said he may challenge the changes.

"Why would anyone feel the need to replace seven of 20 members at one time?" asked UK board member Larry Jones. "I'm

quite willing to listen for an answer. If I don't get one quickly, I'm willing to do everything in my power to change that."

Asked if that meant he intended to file suit, Jones said: "If there are seven appointees, I probably will challenge it."

Jones made headlines last year when he alleged that he had been approached with an offer of reappointment if he would support the governor for the UK presidency. He said the overture came from a friend of Bill Collins, whom he would not identify. Jones declined to comment when asked if the person who allegedly conveyed the offer was among the new UK

appointees.

Collins has waited for almost eight months to make the appointments, since a Franklin Circuit Court ruling that terms of longer than four years for trustees and regents are unconstitutional. Collins did not appeal that June 1986 ruling, even though urged to do so by the judge in the case.

Controversy grew during that time after it was revealed Collins had been nominated to replace Otis Singletary, who is retiring as UK president in June.

Collins has said she does not believe she will be chosen as

Vocational School hears regional director at meeting

Local business and industry leaders met Friday at the Murray Vocational School. The group is a coalition of business, industry and education officials that are looking into being able to mutually benefit each other through the vocational school offerings in Murray and Calloway County.

During their meeting, the business and industry leaders learned of the importance vocational education can be to them for future planning.

Sandra Wells Parks, regional

director of vocational education in Region I in Paducah, conducted Friday's meeting.

Parks, a native of Calloway County and the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Purdom Parks, 1011 Westgate, is responsible for five schools in an eight-county Purchase area, consisting of four area centers and the West Kentucky Vocational School in Paducah. She was appointed to her new position in September of last year. Parks also has a son, Ben Turnbow, residing in Murray at 1400 Diuguid Dr. He works for the Ryan Milk Company.

With a Ph.D. in Adult and Vocational-Technical Education, Parks studies have taken her literally all across the United States.

Parks received her Bachelor's of Science degree in home economics from Murray State University in 1971. She then got her master's degree in secondary education, and a science minor, from MSU in 1975.

That was soon followed with a Rank I in guidance and counseling from MSU in 1977. Parks got her

State's high court may meet in Western Kentucky

PADUCAH, Ky. (AP) — The Kentucky Supreme Court has made tentative plans to meet for the first time in western Kentucky in May, so that part of the state can see first-hand how the court operates, a spokeswoman said.

Spokeswoman Pam Vest said a successful session last year in Louisville led Chief Justice Robert Stephens to envision trips to other cities once or twice a year. "Western Kentucky is the first one this year."

Ms. Vest said the Supreme Court never met outside Frankfort before 1986.

"It's an opportunity for people who never come to Frankfort to see the court work," Ms. Vest said. "We intend to send out notices to local schools and colleges to invite students to come in and see the court in action."

Ms. Vest said something could happen to postpone the trip, so Stephens was reserving comment until plans are finalized.

"We're coming," she said. "We just haven't ironed out all the little details."

Justices will be in the lakes area around the middle of May for a continuing education seminar.

Ms. Vest said, and Stephens wants to use that opportunity to hold sessions in Paducah, Owensboro and perhaps other western Kentucky cities.

Ms. Vest said all seven justices would make the trip, including Roy Vance of Paducah, who was away on vacation and unavailable for comment.

Stephens is trying to arrange for attorneys' arguments to be heard on local cases, she said.

Stephens will be available for discussions with the media and residents, Ms. Vest said, and all the justices will be open for com-

ments — not relating to pending cases — after court concludes.

Circuit Judge Ron Daniels said Stephens sent a letter asking permission to use the circuit courtroom in the McCracken County Courthouse on May 12.

"It's the first time, that I know of, that it's ever happened," he said. "And, of course, how can you say no?"

Ms. Vest said a problem is finding places big enough for all seven justices to sit. The McCracken Circuit Court bench is built for three judges, "so we still have some logistics to work out."

70 students to be at MSU today for first arts auditions

Seventy sophomores and juniors from high schools in Kentucky will be on the Murray State University campus today to audition for the first Governor's School for the Arts.

Approximately 100 to 120 students from across the state will be selected to attend the school July 5-26 at Bellarmine College and the Kentucky Center for the Arts in Louisville. Each student will have an opportunity for intensive study in his/her major field and at least one alternative discipline.

Murray State is one of seven regional audition sites in the state. A panel consisting of representatives from each of the program's disciplines — visual arts, creative writing, dance, drama, vocal and instrumental music — will conduct the tryouts.

In addition to technical training, the young artist will have an op-

LBL looking at reconstructed village

GOLDEN POND, Ky. (AP) — Faced with the possibility of more budget cuts, Land Between the Lakes officials are reviving a plan to expand Homeplace-1850, a rebuilt log cabin farmstead, into a mid-19th century town in hopes of producing more money.


"Since 1965, we have been looking at more ways and means not only of increasing our revenues but also of getting more people into LBL," said Don Bagwell, manager of information services for the Tennessee Valley Authority's Office of Natural Resources in Knoxville, Tenn., which operates LBL.

Scott Seiber, LBL supervisor of information and visitor services, would like to see a town reconstructed and operated like Old Sturbridge Village in Massachusetts.

Darwin Kelsey, head of the national Boy Scout Museum in Murray and former senior vice president of Old Sturbridge Village, said the LBL idea is a good one.

"The museum village concept has become very popular and has succeeded in a number of places around the country," he said. "It is not an easy undertaking, but they are already well on their way with the Homeplace, which opened in 1978.

Lynwood Smeiser, chief of LBL development and engineering, said park officials would like to see the village built with private

money and run by the LBL.

Admission fees would have to be charged, he said. "It would at least have to pay for itself."

Ann Wright, LBL manager of planning and marketing, said the idea for a reconstructed village is

not new.

"It all started years and years ago when we were retaining the historical structures in the LBL," she said. "The Homeplace kind of developed out of that original village concept."

The proposal depends on support not only from LBL but from western Kentucky and Tennessee, park officials said.

"Certainly there are no TVA funds at this point," Bagwell said. "We are just trying to maintain what we have there."

doctorate from Oregon State University. She also spent a summer at the "Management of Lifelong Education Institute in 1984 at Harvard University in Cambridge, Massachusetts.

While gathering her degrees, Parks also managed to teach. She was a teacher in the Murray Independent School District from 1971-1977. She left there to become state supervisor for the Bureau of Vocational Education in Frankfort. Parks was there for three years before she took the position of vocational guidance counselor at the Health Occupations Annex in Madisonville.

In 1981, Parks was appointed the director of the Caldwell County Area Vocational Education Center in Princeton. Her job requirements were numerous while in Princeton.

Parks supervised secondary and adult vocational education programs. She also managed fiscal concerns, took care of the staff and its development, while also being responsible for public relations. While working in the PR department, Parks was responsible for maintaining links with business and industry, developing funding proposals for research, adult literacy, and home health aid training programs.

Before getting the position of regional director at Paducah, Parks was the director of the Division of Staff Development for the Office of Vocational Education in Frankfort.

Parks coordinated statewide staff development activities, monitored budgets and directed a task force to study the impact of multinational economic development on Kentucky school systems.

The Curriculum Review Committee on Competency-Based Vocational Education was Parks first commission or task force to

be placed on. In 1984, she was also on the Effective Instructional Leadership Task Force, the Kentucky Tomorrow Commission, Education Committee and the Board of Directors of the Bluegrass State Skills Corporation.

Parks is also a commonly-sought speaker for educational and vocational workshops around the state.

She will continue her work with the local vocational school, seeking to strengthen enrollment and offerings at the school. The meeting Friday was a step in adding new classes at the school in the fall of 1987.

portunity to explore and develop their creative abilities. History, aesthetics, criticism and theory of the arts will also be covered during the three-week session, along with career and college counseling.

More than 800 students applied for auditions, according to David X. Thurmond, the school's director. A noted dancer, choreographer and teacher, Thurmond is the former assistant principal at the Youth Performing Arts School in Jefferson County.

"The goal of the program is to develop the artistic skills and creativity of Kentucky's talented youth by providing them with the opportunity to study with outstanding artists and teachers," Thurmond said.

Proposed by Gov. Martha Layne Collins because of the importance of the arts to a complete education, the school was funded by the 1986 Kentucky General Assembly. It is jointly administered by the Kentucky Department of the Arts and the Kentucky Center for the Arts.

University reaffirms its commitment to students in teaching profession

Murray State University has affirmed its commitment to students interested in entering the teaching profession by earmarking \$25,000 of its own scholarship money for a Teacher Incentive Program (TIP).

The new program is designed to assist freshman students majoring in teacher education, according to Dr. Janice Weaver, dean of the College of Education. Established through the College of Education, TIP will provide approximately \$5,700 awards for the 1987-88 academic year.

Weaver explained that the program is open to students who plan to teach in Kentucky on the elementary or secondary level or in special education on any level. "We in west Kentucky are already experiencing shortages in a number of teaching fields," Weaver noted. "Our best information is that more than half of our current teachers will retire by the mid to late 1990s. TIP is one way Murray State is moving to help

meet the coming shortage of teachers and we hope these scholarships will encourage some of our stronger high school graduates to enter the teaching profession."

Murray State is working through the West Kentucky Educational Cooperative (WKEC) in selecting students for the scholarships, Weaver explained.

Criteria for applicants includes American College Test (ACT) scores, academic standing, demonstration of leadership and communication skills and recommendations from high school personnel.

"We hope to award a TIP scholarship to the top applicant in every one of our WKEC districts," Weaver said.

High school seniors attending schools in WKEC districts must apply for the awards through their guidance counselors, the dean said. Winners of TIP scholarships will be notified by mid-February.

Singletary's successor and is not actively seeking the post. But she has also refused to absolutely rule out taking the job or withdraw her name from consideration.

Four of the new UK trustees contacted Friday said the subject of the university presidency was not mentioned when they were called by Collins' office.

"I indicated I would be independent with regard to the presidency," said appointee Larry Forgy, who has been in the news most recently for his withdrawal from the Republican gubernatorial race.

Forgy said he was told by Cabinet Secretary Larry Hayes that, "Collins was not interested in the presidency."

Two-car accident reported Friday by local police

Murray Police Department officials report an accident in the city shortly after 9 p.m. Friday.

Reports say Kevin Faircloth of Rt. 1 Benton was travelling south on Sixth Street when he failed to stop his 1984 Ford Mustang at the corner of Sixth and Olive. His vehicle then struck a 1978 Pontiac Gran Prix driven westward on Olive by Amy Albritten of Rt. 4 Murray, reports say.

Albritten and a passenger, Angela Hendrick, also of Rt. 4, Murray, were treated and released at Murray Calloway County Hospital. Police officials say Faircloth was uninjured in the incident.

Resolution on Collins tabled

FRANKFORT, Ky. (AP) — Some Republican legislators tried Friday for a resolution urging Gov. Martha Layne Collins to disavow any interest in the presidency of the University of Kentucky.

But they were outnumbered by Democrats who succeeded in tabling the resolution, which killed it without anyone having to record a vote.

Sen. Jack Trevey, R-Lexington, sprang the resolution at the end of a meeting of the interim joint Education Committee. It sought to have the committee urge that Collins "remove herself unequivocally" from the UK presidency picture.

Survey from Robertson Elementary to be released

Dr. Sam Minner and Dr. Greg Prater, faculty members in the Department of Special Education at Murray State University, will soon have published the results of a study they conducted at Robertson Elementary School in Murray.

Their study was conducted to test how well telephone answering equipment could be used to assist handicapped children. The special education classroom of Joan Minner served as the setting for the study.

Parents of Mrs. Minner's students called a telephone answering machine which played recorded messages of weekly spelling lists and explained methods for helping their children learn the words.

"We hoped the equipment would be interesting and innovative enough to stimulate parent involvement," Dr. Minner said. "And it did."

According to Drs. Minner and Prater, parents used the machine frequently. As a result, they said, the spelling performance of many of the students improved.

The doctors' findings will be published in the next issue of Journal for Remedial Education and Counseling. Their paper is titled "Using Phone Answering Equipment to Assist Handicapped Children."

Merchants not the "Black Hats" in MSU enrollment issue

The recent story from Paducah that their community is seeking a four-year college and will poll area residents and students is not a new idea. We have listened to that for years.

Murray merchants have been cast as the people wearing black hats with recent publicity and this isn't fair to them. Every person here whether in business, industry services or just liking to live in a college town is involved with MSU.

The university will suffer most if enrollment declines and there is a priority placed on preventing this both at the MSU and community level.

The purpose of this priority is to be a positive force in keeping the university and the community in a strong economic position. Enrollment is basic to this.

We think that MSU has served the area well and will continue to do so in the future. On that point the community is united. The university has and will continue to meet the educational need of the area. "We are meeting their needs," Dr. Kala Stroup, the president of MSU, has been quoted as saying.

This is an emotional issue that goes beyond the local economy. We want MSU to continue as the regional four-year college of Kentucky and will dedicate our time and efforts to see this.

A state editorial

Lexington Herald-Leader, Lexington: While the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency didn't do much to alleviate the fears of a PCB-removal plant in Henderson, the agency may well have assumed the role of savior for the many people whose drinking water is drawn from the rivers flowing out of eastern Kentucky.

The EPA concluded that state regulations governing brine discharges from oil and gas wells are "seriously flawed."

Brine discharges from oil and gas wells pollute the rivers and streams that provide drinking water for much of eastern and central Kentucky. Treating that pollution to reduce the salt level in drinking water can produce trihalomethanes, a suspected carcinogen.

The situation led the state to draw stringent regulations governing brine pollution. But when the oil and gas industry challenged the rules in court, Johnson Circuit Judge Stephen Nick Frazier struck down the regulations. Rather than appealing Frazier's decision, the state threw up its hands and entered into a consent agreement providing so many exemptions there might as well have been no rules at all.

The EPA's action apparently leaves Kentucky with two options: Enforce the rules as originally intended... or leave the regulation of pollution from oil and gas wells to the EPA.

While either course promises cleaner drinking water for Kentuckians, the first option seems preferable. State officials neglected their duty when they capitulated to the oil and gas industry after a single lower court decision on brine regulations. If they now stand back and let the federal government do their dirty work, they will be neglecting that duty again.

Agree Or Not By S.C. VanCuren

Potential candidates for the Democratic nomination for governor present a great scenario for one of those old-fashioned knock-and-drag-out, no-holds-barred, mud-slinging campaigns.

The possibilities include former governors Julian Carroll and John Y. Brown Jr., Lt. Gov. Steve Beshear, Dr. Grady Stumbo, who ran in the last election, Lexington businessman Wallace Wilkinson, and Jefferson County Judge Harvey Sloane, who has also run before.

The two former governors have the juiciest conditions for an attack that could last for some time in a straightforward blitz.

Right now, both of them have former staff members under indictment in federal courts.

Henry Vance, who worked in Carroll's office when he was governor, and later worked as chief of staff of majority floor leader Bobby Richardson, has been indicted as a co-conspirator in a murder case.

Sonny Hunt, who was Democratic Party chairman under Carroll, served a term in the federal pen over transgressions in that job by directing placement of state insurance policies and distribution of fees.

James Gray, who was chief of staff for Carroll, is under federal conviction with the case now in appeal for a part in the insurance deal. There is other material available to flush out a full blown attack if an opponent chooses to take the gutter road.

Former Gov. Brown also was friendly with some unsavory characters.

Brown named former Police Captain Marion Campbell as director of public safety.

Campbell was fired from that post during Brown's term as governor. Campbell is now on trial in Federal Court on conspiracy charges in connection with dealing in narcotics.

He allowed contracts without following legal procedure in some cases. Campbell said he was cutting red tape to save time and money in his plan to run the state like a business.

Brown also used a state-owned helicopter to commute from his Fayette county home to the governor's office in Frankfort. He bought the plane without legislative consent or any appropriation for at the time.

Beshear was attorney general when Brown was governor. Beshear never challenged any of these questioned actions even though newsmen brought them to Beshear's attention.

Dr. Stumbo had his problems with campaign finances, but finally got his clearance without having to go to court.

Dr. Sloane, former mayor of Louisville and now county judge, has run twice for governor. His only political scars of any consequence to date is the fact that he faced a big debt after each campaign. He has managed to satisfy his creditors.

That leaves Wilkinson, a first time runner, without any political scars.

The irony of the entire situation in the primary is that one these men could win his party's nomination with less than 30 percent of the vote as Brown did one time before.

In the face of all this opportunity, the Republicans have fielded but one potential candidate, John Harper, state representative from Shepherdsville.

Byting the Apple

Old friends often dub me a "Luddite". The Luddites were an English sect opposed to modern technology, somewhat like the stricter groups of Amish and Mennonites in our country.

Part of my anti-machine bias was inherited. Granddaddy didn't have a car or a tractor out on the farm. Once I gave him a ballpoint pen for Christmas (which was also his birthday) and he gave it back, preferring the pencil stub he kept in his coat pocket. He was a big FDR supporter, but one of the last to have electricity run into the farmhouse. Late in life, he did get a cranked wallphone and battery-operated radio.

He never let possessions, especially machines, possess him. By the time he died, all of his earthly holdings fit into one old leather satchel.

In a half-hearted sort of way, I have been particularly anti-computers.

That grew out of an earlier resistance to adding machines and calculators. I felt that any machine that does your math for you would make your mind deteriorate. All the algebra and trigonometry we had to take in high school — we were told — was supposed to make us able to reason and to think. It seemed to me that acquired skill in thinking would be jeopardized if schoolchildren started bringing

machines to class instead of pencils, erasers, and brains.

Then computers came along, and for consistency's sake I had to argue against them, too. If using pocket calculators in class was like bombing your brain, I argued, then the magnified effect of a computer would be like a nuclear holocaust. Sooner or later no one would be left with powers of logic and calculation except the machines.

I miscalculated the consequences of the coming of computers, and I here publicly confess my grievous fault.

My fall from grace was caused by temptation. I had inveighed so long and lustily against computers that, Elmer Gantry-like, I finally tasted the forbidden fruits of the Apple. I have as much guilt for being a computer convert as someone else would have for falling off the wagon.

Oh, I have excuses for the transgression. "Others" made me do it! The peer pressure of being surrounded by computer freaks at work and the embarrassment of being considered illiterate in front of our daughters at home got to me. So, too, did the feeling that computerese is a foreign language and that I was missing much of what is being said by increasing numbers of people. They were speaking in tongues. Their COBAL, PLATO, and PASCAL languages and my King James

and Shakespearean prose were from worlds apart.

Test this alienness for yourself. If someone tells you "there are bugs in the hardware", what image does it conjure for you? How about "interface" or "compatibility"? Does "software" mean "clothing"?

But the main reason for my conversion is that my basic (or is it "BASIC"?) argument against computers was annihilated. For, contrary to robbing the human brain of its exercise, it stretches and taxes the gray matter to limits never tested.

The computing processes are so multiple and so complex — no matter how much the ads say they are "easy as a-b-c" — that the only way to use them is to out-think the machinery. Unlike a pencil or even a manual typewriter, which merely functions by rote as the user subconsciously directs it, a computer requires a dialogue between it and the user that pushes the user into mental exercises. Logic and creativity get pushed to new heights, and soon the user is hooked.

Now that I think about it, that comes from my grandmother's side of the family. While Granddaddy was out trying to get around and along without wheels, she was at home working crosswords and jigsaws by the light of the kerosene lamp. Those who have crossword and jigsaw habits

quickly understand why a computer is so seductive.

Even so, a PC, no matter how "Personal", is still a machine. I haven't blacked out enough to see it as some of my fanatic colleagues do, as a substitute wife that improves upon the real thing because of having the power to shut it up or off. It is not, as some claim, "user-friendly". And it need not, if one is careful, make a slave of the user for whom it was suppose to slave. As with other potential vices, a computer is a dangerous thing if it consumes you and then becomes habitual. Used in moderation it can be a servant, a teacher, and a recreation, with few harmful side-effects.

I doubt seriously that we can return to being a non-computer society. For that reason, we ought to be anticipating the addiction problems with which our laws will have to deal sooner or later. As a start, I suggest that those computer game arcades and electronic stores in the shopping centers be required to have licenses, just as do the bars, and that there be a limit on the time and money an addict can spend there. We also need courses in safe disc-driving for repeat junkies.

Ultimately we shall need rehab centers, some place where electricity and technology are banned. Does the U.S. still own any islands?



Calloway's final game of the round-robin tournament is tonight at 7:30 against New Madrid.




Grass surface could hinder Giant rushing

PASADENA, Calif. (AP) — Take away artificial turf and you take away Joe Morris' speed. And that takes away a big advantage for the New York Giants in Sunday's Super Bowl.

So the reasoning goes, and the statistics would seem to bear that out.

But to the Giants, that reasoning is artificial and the statistics are meaningless. In fact, they seem to prefer playing on natural grass, as they will in the Rose Bowl, and not artificial turf.

"There's no difference, man," New York wide receiver Bobby Johnson said. "Football's football."

"I love playing on grass. Our receivers play better on grass. They cut better."

Morris concedes he might not be as quick on grass. But, he said, he won't be the only one when the Giants meet the Denver Broncos.

"They'll be 22 guys out there on grass and it'll affect them the same way it'll affect me," he said. "Twenty-one other guys will also be slower than usual."

But 21 other guys might not depend on speed as much as Morris. Still, he is undaunted.

"All my high school games were on grass. I started in college (at Syracuse) on grass," he said. "I did fine in college and high school. This is a grass game, and I'm going to practice and play on grass. When you get used to it, it's not that different."

So he says. The statistics say there is a difference.

Morris averaged better than 100 yards a game this season. But in three games on grass, he averaged just 62 yards.

Mandlikova wins Australian Open

MELBOURNE, Australia (AP) — Czechoslovakia's Hana Mandlikova used an excellent return of service and sparkling passing shots to stun defending champion Martina Navratilova 7-5, 7-6 (7-1) today and win the women final at the \$1.65 million Australian Open Tennis Championships at Kooyong.

Mandlikova, who recently applied for Australian citizenship, took full advantage of Navratilova's uncharacteristically inconsistent service in snapping her 58-match winning streak and winning a second Australian Open crown. Mandlikova won for the first time in 1980.

It was a Mandlikova's first win over Navratilova in their last 10 meetings, dating back to Mandlikova's win in the 1985 U.S. Open final, and only her seventh in 30 career matches.

"Beating Martina is like beating a legend," said Mandlikova.

Sweden's Stefan Edberg, the defending men's champion, tries for his second straight title Sunday when he meets Australian Pat Cash, who ousted the world's top-ranked player, Ivan Lendl, in the semifinals.

Edberg warmed up for that match by teaming with fellow Swede Anders Jarryd to win the men's doubles title today, beating Australians Peter Doohan and Laurie Warder 6-4, 6-4, 7-6 (7-3).

Navratilova, who was seeking her fourth Australian Open title, having won in 1981, 1983 and 1985, the last time the tournament was held, had problems finding any

consistency with her shots.

Mandlikova exerted such pressure with an array of fine passing shots that many of Navratilova's volleys were off target.

Navratilova made 24 unforced errors to Mandlikova's nine.

"I never got my rhythm on the serve-and-volley," Navratilova said. "The whole match I was struggling."

"I could never really get my confidence going," she added.

Navratilova had not dropped a set in the tournament going into the final.

Mandlikova, rated fourth in the world and the second seed in the tournament, collected \$115,000 for the win. Navratilova earned \$65,000.

There were 11 service breaks in the 24 games, and Mandlikova said her return of service was a key to the victory.

"I returned extremely well today, especially on her second serve," said Mandlikova. Navratilova won only 27 percent of her second-serve points.

Despite the loss, Navratilova denied her gamble of not playing any grass-court warm-up events before the Open had backfired.

"I was playing well and practicing well," she said. "Something in my head meant that my feet didn't move."

Navratilova was playing her first tournament since splitting with long-time coach Mike Estep and linking up with Randy Crawford, a Fort Worth, Texas, professional, and former Wimbledon champion Virginia Wade, who acts as a strategist and motivator.

Twitty fires six-under in Phoenix

SCOTTSDALE, Ariz. — Howard Twitty, playing on a golf course he helped design, shot a 6-under-par 65 Friday for a share of the lead after two rounds of the \$600,000 Phoenix Open.

Twitty, a native of Phoenix and a consultant in the design and construction of the new TPC course at Scottsdale, reached the tournament halfway point at 9-under-par, 133.

He was tied at that figure with Steve Jones, another resident of the area. Jones, who hasn't finished higher than sixth in three full seasons on the PGA Tour, had the lead alone until he 3-putted for bogey on his last hole, completing

a round of 68.

Mark Calcavecchia, a third-place finisher each of the last two weeks, put himself in contention again, shooting a 66 that lifted him to within one stroke of the lead at 134.

He was tied with Mark O'Meara, Jay Haas and Corey Pavin, a winner last week in the Bob Hope Classic.

Haas had a second-round 66. Pavin shot 69 and O'Meara had to rally from a string of three consecutive bogeys to match par 71 in cool, breezy weather.

Ernie Gonzalez and Gene Sauers were at 135. Sauers had a 67. Gonzalez was one of 45 players stranded on the course by darkness Thursday. He came back Friday

morning to finish off a 63, then played his second round in 72.

Fuzzy Zoeller, with a 69, was in a large group at 136, only three back with 36 holes left in the chase for a \$108,000 first prize. Defending champion Hal Sutton was at 71-138.

Erdmann joined Westvaco at the company's former Mechanicville, N.Y. mill in April 1955 and was appointed superintendent of construction and maintenance in 1960.



Pontiac creates new concept car

In the Spring of 1986, Pontiac management gave Pontiac Design the go-ahead to create a new concept car for 1987 — an exciting four-place coupe that could serve as a window into the 1990s.

"The objective was to develop a futuristic and dramatic design consistent with Pontiac's strategic, long term goals," explained Pontiac One Studio chief designer, Terry Henline.

"We envisioned a car with an aggressive new aerodynamic form which also displayed a variety of unique functional attributes," Henline said. "The challenge was to push the design envelope as far as possible while still maintaining some element of plausibility and practicality."

Henline said in the case of the Pontiac Pursuit, the Pontiac designers were testing not only themselves, but also the reaction of the public to their efforts. "It's a little like holding up a mirror," Henline noted, "to determine if the reflected image conveys a perception of the 1990s as we see it." He added, "The resulting concept car is not so much a true forecast of the future, as it is a sharing of our ongoing investigation into the next decade."

"We are given the basic functions of the concept car — four-wheel-drive, four-wheel-steer, front engine, four-passenger capacity," noted Dave Ross, a project designer in Pontiac One Studio. "The rest was up to us." Ross explained that a concept car ought to ideally test the limits and, in reality, be a competent running vehicle. "The resulting automobile obviously had to work well from an engineering standpoint," he said.

Henline agreed, adding that the visual elements of the design and all the functional aspects of a proposal do tend to develop simultaneously. "There is a synergism which naturally evolves," he explained, "when an enthusiastic group of designers, sculptors and engineers work together in organizing a new car such as the Pontiac Pursuit." "Our proposal prompted the engineering crew to explore new ways of doing things," Ross said. "Like us, they had to reexamine preconceptions about the manner in which things should be handled. We had to develop answers to questions which neither group had previously asked."

"Although the new concept car reflects a lot of reach, we've infused the vehicle with a sense of legitimate credibility," Henline stressed. "We are, after all, a driver's car organization and who knows, down the road, we might all like to own one of these. You could say that the Pursuit is Pontiac in pursuit of the future."

THE INCOME TAX PEOPLE

Major Tax Reform Will Affect Virtually Every American Taxpayer

The recently passed tax act will mean extensive changes in the United States' tax system, changes which will affect almost every American taxpayer.

"The major point to keep in mind," said Terry Powell, local H&R Block manager, "is that very few of these changes will affect the 1986 tax return that taxpayers will be filing next year. Also, the tax law changes do not all go into effect at the same time. All the changes will not be in place until 1991."

Basically, the new tax laws mean lower and fewer tax rates — the previous 14 different tax rates will be reduced to five in 1987 and to two for 1988 and later years, bringing the tax rates eventually to 15% and 28%. In addition the standard deduction and personal exemption have been raised. Some deductions have been eliminated, reduced or restricted. The special deduction for married couples who both work has been repealed. The 60 percent capital gains deduction for long-term capital gains income has been eliminated. Restrictions will be placed on IRA deductions making many taxpayers ineligible for this tax break. Tough rules have been instituted for tax shelters to eliminate taxpayers' ability to claim losses on "passive investments." The new tax law also repeals the investment tax credit, revises depreciation periods, and limits the investment interest deduction.

Income averaging has been done away with, the dividend exclusion no longer exists, and sales taxes are no longer deductible. The deduction for personal interest will phase out over a 5-year period. New restrictions have been placed on deductions for medical and dental expenses, business meals and entertainment expenses, and miscellaneous deductions.

Other areas affected by the new tax law include rental property, unemployment benefits, political contributions, earned income credit, fringe benefits, and home mortgage interest.

The reasoning behind these massive tax changes is that by lowering tax rates and raising the standard deduction and personal exemption, the majority of taxpayers should benefit and those with higher incomes, while enjoying lower tax rates, will no longer be able to bring their tax liability down with excessive deductions and abusive tax shelters. However, many people are questioning whether the intent behind the tax act will, in truth, be achieved as a result of the legislation.

"The catch is," explained Terry Powell "that everyone talks about the tax law changes as a complete, final package, but in reality, the changes happen over a period of five years. The new tax legislation will not be a complete, final package until 1991. In the meantime, many taxpayers may be hurt by the gradual implementation of this tax legislation."

While the general effective date for the tax legislation is January 1, 1987, individual tax rate cuts go into effect on March 15, 1987. Both the standard deduction and the personal exemption increase will be phased in over the next few years.

"The next few tax years are going to be confusing for many taxpayers. The best advice I can give is for people to remain aware of what the tax changes are and when these changes are effective," said Powell.

Financial Tidbits

Most people don't have time to become expert in all aspects of their financial affairs. It is beneficial, however, to at least be aware of information which can save or make you money. The following tidbits are offered to you as mind joggers.

—For some investors, the new single premium life insurance policies are worth a closer look. These are far more investment vehicles than they are insurance policies. Many of them carry favorable rates of returns, as well as special tax advantages.

—The interest rate charged on taxes due the IRS will be 9 percent, and the interest the IRS will pay on tax overpayments will be 8 percent. These new rates are effective beginning January 1, 1987.

—Consider arranging a second mortgage on your home to pay off credit cards, auto loans, etc. The Tax Reform Act of 1986 is phasing out the consumer interest deduction. The interest paid on home mortgages will still be deductible under most circumstances.

—If you want life insurance proceeds kept out of your estate when you die, you must have no control over the policy. If you can borrow against the policy, designate new beneficiaries, or have other incidents of ownership, the proceeds will be included in your gross estate when you die.

—If you own a closely-held business operating as a "C" corporation, consider electing "S" status. The new tax rates make it advantageous to be an S corporation because the company's profits are taxed only once — to the shareholders their individual tax rates.

A total of \$102,000 remains in this year's appropriation for literacy programs.

Others receiving awards in the Western Kentucky area announced Friday are the Purchase Area Literacy Commission, Mayfield, \$7,750 and Paducah Adult Literacy, \$1,180.

Beshear planning to run for office

FRANKFORT, Ky. (AP) — Lt. Gov. Steve Beshear will spend two days in early February traveling the state and announcing his formal candidacy for the Democratic nomination for governor.

Beshear will travel to 14 cities, beginning in Ashland on Monday, Feb. 2, and ending in Frankfort on Tuesday, Feb. 3.

The announcement will make Beshear the third major Democrat to formally enter the race. Lexington businessman Wallace Wilkinson and former Gov. Julian Carroll already have announced.

Former candidate Grady Stumbo is actively campaigning, though not yet announced, and former Gov. John Y. Brown Jr. is also beginning to make noises like a candidate.

Brazil, Cuba restore relations by phone

RIO DE JANEIRO, Brazil (AP) — Cuban leader Fidel Castro and President Jose Sarney of Brazil inaugurated a direct telephone line between their countries in a six-minute telephone conversation.

Castro spoke of the "importance of the direct line for the Brazilian and Cuban people and for both nations" and Sarney said the phone line would "solidify the friendship between the two countries." The two leaders viewed each other on video screens as they talked Thursday.

Brazil restored diplomatic ties with Cuba last June.

Ties had been broken in 1964 following a right-wing military coup in Brazil.



NEW YORK (AP) — Several big Protestant denominations are quitting their Eastern city headquarters and moving their headquarters westward to the heartland of America, closer to the pulsebeat of common folk.

The shift has built up like a wave, with one

mainline church after another — now totalling three — recently taking steps toward transferring their bases to the middle part of the country.

Others may yet join the migration away from the East.

"It seems to be partly tied in with a yen to get closer to the grass roots

of the country." The move west "is long overdue," he adds, aligning them with more typical environments.

This has been urged persistently by many local and regional church voices, which complained that denominational bureaucracies had lost

touch to some extent with rank-and-file constituencies.

But economic and other factors also were behind the movement, as delineated by several of the denominations making initial decisions to move to the midlands, subject to ratifications by

national conventions this spring.

Latest to line up for the parade west — to Missouri — were the Presbyterian Church (USA), booked to settle in Kansas City, and the United Church of Christ, its top offices headed for St. Louis.

The newly forming Evangelical Lutheran Church of America, was ticketed to plant its headquarters in Chicago after three Lutheran bodies merge this spring. The largest participant is now based in New York.

Altogether, denomina-






