# Blandford's conviction is not the end

FRANKFORT, Ky: (AP) -The conviction of former House Speaker Don Blandford was a milestone in a federal investigation of official corruption in Ken-

tucky. It was not an ending. U.S. Attorney Karen Caldwell said Friday there would be more indictments "in the relatively near future.'

Blandford, 55, of Philpot, was found guilty of extortion, racketeering and lying to FBI agents. He was the 11th and most prominent defendant convicted to date as a result of the investigation code-named Boptrot.

A U.S. District Court jury decided Blandford took bribes from a lobbyist who wanted to influence horse-racing legislation in 1992. The racketeering charge involved misuse of campaign funds and mail fraud. He was acquitted of a conspiracy charge.

Blandford said he would appeal and had no specific comment

about the verdict. "But there'll be another day. I'm not giving up, believe me," he said.

U.S. District Judge Joseph Hood scheduled sentencing on July 22 in Frankfort. The maximum penalty would be 45 years in prison and fines totaling \$750,000: Blandford remained free without bond.

Defense attorney Allen W. Holbrook of Owensboro said Blandford was damaged, ironically, by the count of which he was acquitted.

To support the conspiracy. charge, prosecutors used tape recordings that dealt with payments to other legislators, Holbrook said.

They included former Rep. Jerry Bronger, who was chairman of the House committee that handled the 1992 bill. Bronger has pleaded guilty to extortion conspiracy, admitting he took \$2,000 from lobbyist Bill McBee and

promised to kill legislation opposed by the harness-racing industry.

Without a conspiracy charge, "I don't think there would ever have been any evidence on what Bronger did," Holbrook said, Jurors "heard a lot be evidence they might not otherwise have heard that spilled over" into the

rest of the case, Holbrook said. Prosecutors disagreed. "We believe we could have gotten that evidence in even without the conspiracy charge," said Bruce Reinhart, one of three prosecutors in the trial.

"The prosecution always gets accused of piling on," added U.S. Attorney Joseph Whittle.

The jury deliberated for 11 hours over two days. Through a day of nervous tedium Friday, Blandford roamed the federal courthouse, occasionally wandering into the courtroom to chat with reporters.

Blandford declined later to say whether the convictions had ended his 25-year House career.

He said he did not know whathe would do about his House seat. Kentucky's constitution does not require forfeiture of the seat, but Blandford could be impeached and removed.

## Lawmakers feel effects of probe

FRANKFORT, Ky. (AP) -The federal investigation of state government corruption has caused the entire General Assembly to suffer, one state lawmaker said.

"Every honest person has taken a black eye for it," said Rep. Tom Burch, D-Louisville.

Former House Speaker Don Blandford, 55, of Philpot, became the 11th defendant to be convicted in the investigation codenamed Boptrot when he was found guilty Friday of extortion, racketeering and lying to FB1

## Early-morning strategy session focuses on Bosnia

WASHINGTON (AP) - President Clinton today brought together top foreign policy advisers for an early-morning strategy session as he neared a decision on "clearly defined" steps to

help quell the violence in Bosnia. Secretary of Defense Les Aspin and Colin Powell, chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, were among the first to arrive for what aides described as a final consultation before Clinton settled on a course of action.

"It's very important that anything we do be clearly defined in terms of its strategy," Clinton said Friday night in an with four newspapers. "That is absolutely important.'

Also among those summoned for the White House meeting was Secretary of State Warren Christopher, who was expected to travel to Western Europe and Russia to rally support for Clinton's plan.

The president said Friday he wanted to "get an updated report on the situation and ... ask a lot of questions" in the meeting with Christopher, Aspin, national security adviser Anthony Lake and

"I may want to make another round of phone calls after we meet with the principals," Clinton said. "And I expect then we'll be pretty close to deciding where we are.'

The main options under consideration were lifting an arms embargo against outgunned Bosnian Muslims and air strikes against Bosnian Serb positions.

With pressure for stronger action mounting, a bipartisan group of 16 senators Friday sent a letter to Clinton expressing support both for multinational air strikes against Serbian artillery sites and lifting of the arms embargo.

But support for such action is far from unanimous in Congress, and U.S. allies in Europe have particular concerns about the impact of such a strategy.

Clinton has been wrestling with the Bosnian issue ever since he took office, calling it by far the most difficult foreign policy question he faces. His goals are to bring a swift end to the ethnic

## Three House Republicans draft alternative health care plan

FRANKFORT, Ky. (AP) — Three House Republicans have drafted a health-care proposal that differs drastically from Gov. Brereton Jones' plan.

Reps. Bob Heleringer, Bob DeWeese and Anne Northup, all of Louisville, expect to publicly release their plan next week.

Their proposal seeks to achieve universal coverage while minimizing bureaucracy by using a voucher system for the uninsured.

Heleringer will ask the cochairmen of the interim joint Health and Welfare Committee for an hour to present the proposal.

The governor has said he intends to convene a special legislative session on May 10 to deal with health care.

The Republicans' bill would require waivers from the federal government to expand the Medicaid program. But it does not include several elements that are in Jones' plan. It does not have a state health-care authority, does not call for government control over medical fees and does not impose new payroll taxes nor

health benefit mandates on

The legislation would:

-Require all Kentuckians with incomes above 110 percent of the poverty level to obtain at least a basic health insurance plan. The state would help those whose income is less than twice the poverty level

-Require all insurance companies to offer a basic plan, for a monthly premium of \$120, with standardized benefits, and claims

-Provide annual vouchers worth \$720 to families under the basic plan. The vouchers could be used as cash to pay health-care providers, who would be required to accept them. Unused vouchers

## Kentucky Derby draws celebrities

LOUISVILLE, Ky. (AP) -George Bush and First Mom Virginia Kelley may be politically far apart, but they'll have something in common on Saturday they'll both be at the Kentucky Derby.

The former president and Bill Clinton's mother are among a host of celebrities descending on the Bluegrass for the festivities.

Bush will be the guest of his good friend Will S. Farish III, owner of Lane's End Farm in Woodford County, and chairman of the Churchill Downs board.

Kelley, a longtime racing fan, will be the guest of Democratic Gov. Brereton Jones. From comedians to CEOs,

from soap opera actors to sports heroes, there's aslong list of notables planning to be spectators for the two-minute sports event and the daylong extravaganza that accompanies it.

Mery Griffin and Ed McMahon are both expected for the Derby, along with quarterbacks Jim Kelly and Joe Namath and weathermen Willard Scott and Spencer Christian.

## May Day protest rocks Moscow

MOSCOW (AP) - Pro-Communist demonstrators set trucks on fire and battled police today during a May Day rally that left dozens injured. There was an unconfirmed report that one person was killed.

Protesters hurled stones, bricks and pieces of wood at police and special riot troops, who beat demonstrators with rubber

The fighting broke out after police prevented thousands, of supporters of the hard-line Trudovaya Rossiya (Russian Labor) group from marching to Red Square and the protesters headed away from the city center.

"It's a war," yelled one elderly woman as police on horseback rode up to the riot.

Both police and demonstrators suffered head injuries in what

appeared to be the most serious civil disturbance in the Russian heartland since the failed coup in August 1991. Several policemen were hospitalized in serious condition, police spokesman Nikolai Boiko said.

A policeman at the scene who declined to give his name said that one person had been killed. Neither the identify of the person nor the circumstances was cl

Long said an ethics law passed earlier this year and new leadership in the House should help accomplish that.

Senate Majority Caucus Chairman Nick Kafoglis, D-Bowling Green, said Blandford was a capable speaker who got into trouble because of the special attention that lobbyists give legislative leaders. He said small favors turned into big ones.

"I think the relationship with lobbyists and accepting money even if there's no bribery - certainly is inappropriate," Kafoglis said. Blandford and others who got into trouble "crossed the line without realizing it," he said.

Rep. Thomas Anthony Smith, a Knox County Republican convicted earlier this year in a separate federal investigation, announced this week that he was resigning.

Position: Former Democratic state senator from Henderson. The charge: Extorting \$4,850 from Riverside Downs harness track, keeping some for himself and giving the rest to other legislators. Also interstate travel in aid of racketeering for traveling to Las Vegas in

other legislators were paid. Status: Pleaded guilty May 5. Faces maximum 25 years in prison, \$500,000 fine or both. Under plea agreement, sentence could be less if cooperative. Has testified for government.

December 1990 to attend a Jockey Guild convention, where bribes to

Jay Spurrier Position: Former chairman of the Kentucky Harness Racing Commission; influential lobbyist on utility and racing issues.

The charge: Extortion for offering to use his influence to help Riverside Downs in a dispute over simulcasting dates. Got at least two payments from Riverside. Paid \$20,000 to an unidentified state official to influence a state-appointed arbitrator. Also guilty of wire fraud

Status: Pleaded guilty May 22. Faces maximum 25 years in prison, \$500,000 fine or both. Under plea agreement, sentence could be less if cooperative. Has testified for government.

Position: Former Democratic state representative from Dry Ridge; chairman, House Agriculture and Small Business Committee; member of the Business Organizations and Professions Committee.

The charge: Interstate travel in aid of racketeering. Took \$400 bribe from a representative of Riverside Downs while in Las Vegas. Status: Resigned office; pleaded guilty June 12. Faces maximum five years in prison, \$250,000 fine. Under plea agreement, sentence

Position: Former Republican state representative from Leitchfield; member, Business Organizations and Professions Committee.

The charge: Conspiracy to commit extortion for taking a \$400 bribe from a representative of Riverside Downs during the December 1990 trip to Las Vegas. Also lying to a federal agent about accepting the

Status: Pleaded guilty June 12. Faces maximum 25 years in prison, \$500,000 fine or both. Under plea agreement, sentence could be less if cooperative.

Position: Former Democratic state representative from Burlington; chairman, Business Organizations and Professions Committee, 1987-91; became lobbyist after election loss.

The charges: Three counts of conspiracy to commit extortion, one count of interstate travel in aid of racketeering. McBee took \$30,000 from Dueling Grounds Racecourse and conspired to extort \$30,000 from Riverside Downs, keeping some and passing the rest.

Status: Pleaded guilty June 25. Faces maximum 25 years, \$500,000 fine or both. Under plea agreement, sentence could be less if cooperative. Has testified for government.

Jerry Bronger

Position: Former Democratic state representative from Louisville; chairman, Business Organizations and Professions Committee. 1991-92.

The charge: Conspiracy to commit extortion. Took three bribes totaling \$2,000 from McBee and promised to kill legislation.

Status: Resigned office July 21; pleaded guilty July 22. Faces maximum 20 years, \$250,000 fine or both. Under plea agreement, sentence could be less if cooperative.

Bruce Wilkinson

Position: Former appointments director for his uncle, former Gov. Wallace Wilkinson. Currently employed by uncle's company, Wilkin-

The charges: Extortion conspiracy and mail fraud. Charged with taking \$20,000 after promising to influence state-appointed arbitrator in dispute between Riverside Downs and Ellis Park race tracks in

Status: Convicted March 22 of conspiracy to commit extortion. Acquitted of mail fraud. Sentencing scheduled May 20. Maximum penalty would be 20 years in prison and \$250,000 fine.

Position: Former Democratic state senator from Paducah; majority whip, 1982-90. Became lobbyist after losing 1990 primary election. The charge: Mail fraud. Took \$2,000 from a representative of

Status: Pleaded guilty Sept. 4. Faces maximum five years and \$250,000 fine. In poor health following stroke; relies on wheelchair. Under plea agreement, prosecutors will recommend no prison time. Sentencing scheduled Monday.

Buel Guy

Position: Former chief administrative assistant to House Speaker Don Blandford; former state representative from Scottsville, 1978-80. The charge: Lying to FBI agents on March 31, 1992 about receiving money from former state Rep. Bill McBee for legislation relating to

Dueling Grounds race track in 1990. Status: Pleaded guilty Sept. 22. Faces maximum five years and \$250,000 fine. Under plea agreement, sentence could be less if cooperative. Has testified for government.

Position: Speaker of the House, representing Daviess County. The charges: Extortion and attempted extortion, for allegedly taking \$1,500 from Riverside Downs, funneled through McBee; racketeering involving mail fraud and alleged misuse of political campaign funds; lying to federal agents.

Status: Convicted Friday of extortion, racketeering and lying to FBI. Acquitted of conspiracy. Sentencing scheduled July 22. Maximum combined penalties would be 45 years in prison and \$750,000

Position: Racing industry organization.

The charge: Paying bribe money to then-Rep. Bill McBee in 1986. Status: Pleaded guilty Feb. 1. Fined \$25,000.







# The Derby: ain't nothin' like it

compares to the two thrilling minutes of annual suspense known to all as the Kentucky Derby on this first Saturday in

Scribes have searched the limits of their creativity since 1875 to do justice to the national fiesta in Louisville. None has - but the late humorist Irvin S. Cobb, a Kentuckian himself, perhaps came closest.

He captured a bit of the unique glamor and let a little of his own pride show through in the inimitable Cobb style with these words:

"Imagine a track that's like a bracelet of molten gold encircling. a greensward that's like a patch of emerald velvet ... all the pretty girls in the state turning the grandstand into a brocaded terrace of beauty and color...all the assembled horsemen of the nation going crazy at once down in the paddock...and then yonder in the yellow dust the gallant kings and queens of the horse kingdom fighting it out...

"But what's the use? Until you go to Kentucky and with your own eyes behold the Derby, you ain't been nowheres and you ain't seen nothin'."

He was right. At least to another Kentuckian he was right. Thronged with pilgrims, all roads lead to Louisville when May's merry madness engulfs Kentucky. People of all ilk flock

to old Churchill Downs like hom-

ing birds at sundown. Many motorists traverse the Bluegrass on highways bordered by plank and stone fences that

rise and fall over gently rolling hills. The fields are tinted with that springtime hue of grayishblue from which the Commonwealth gets its nickname.

Playful colts frolic on the thoroughbred farms, as did racing greats of yesteryear. They gambol over limestone-rich pastures, building the strength, stamina and speed their owners and trainers hope will carry them to the winner's circle to be wreathed in garlands of flowers and applauded admiringly.

Derby enthusiasts also arrive in the state's largest city by air and rail and water - some even coming on steamboats down the waterways that flow into the Ohio River.

No place on earth is quite like Louisville at Derbytime. The mood spreads quickly like a contagion. Political big-wigs and television and movie celebrities rub elbows with collegians and stenographers. Mint juleps flow freely, and justice relents a little as carefree and boisterous merrymakers are smilingly tolerated.

From a distance the picturesque twin spires of historic Churchill Downs beckon invitingly. First-time visitors often exude an air of awe as they trip the clicking turnstiles.

Sprawling grandstands house many of the mob of more than 100,000 who gather annually at this convention of mankind. The green-trimmed white clubhouse and multi-hued landscape quickly catch the eyes of racing fans turning out to be inaugurated into that fraterally that has seen at least one edition of the fabled "Run for the Roses."

Labyrinths of flowers and shrubs rioting in full spring color provide the backdrop for an infield that was once the haunt of three-card monte dealers, crapshooters and grifters. The traditional giant horseshoe bedecked with red roses marks the winner's circle where the victor will be saluted in that grandest moment of glory.

Shirt-sleeved humanity mills in the infield and threatens to spill over the guardrail onto the loamcushioned mile oval. People arrive equipped — with bright umbrellas, camp stools and other accouterments for their comfort and pleasure.

Fashion-conscious ladies meander about in the finery of the season. Some of them seize the once-a-year opportunity to show off to thousands their

There is nothing like it anywhere — the magic, the romance,

the distinction, the pride. Nowhere is that pride more evident than where there are sons and daughters of Kentucky away from home. They are proud of all their state's longstanding traditions - beautiful belles, fine bourbon, colonels and long rifles. But most of all, they are proud of the Derby.

These strayed souls are not the only ones, however, who feel a twinge of nostalgia as the multitude stands to sing the Stephen Foster anthem:

"The sun shines bright in my old Kentucky home..." Thousands more wish they were from Kentucky too.

Millions of television and radio bystanders impatiently join those on hand in person as the select of three-year-old horsedom parade from the paddock to the starting gate. As they prance into position in the lengthening late afternoon shadows, a low murmur drones out of the crowd. A mile-and-aquarter separates one of them from a coveted niche in the annals of racing

Then the big moment...a roar...they're off!

And a blanket of roses awaits another champion.

That's a little bit of a feel for what it's like — but as Cobb so fittingly wrote those many years

"But what's the use?...Until you go...you ain't been nowheres and you ain't seen nothin'."

# Empowerment to the people

Public television and public radio apparently strike our national legislators as "luxuries", so much so that a few years back they critically curtailed appropriations to them, forcing them endlessly to solicit private gifts to keep programming on the air waves.

We all owe a great debt to corporations and foundations for putting up big money and to thousands of average citizens shelling out ten or a hundred dollars a year to keep quality public television and radio going.

It seems futile to suggest that the same result could have been obtained by closing down a Senate swimming pool or a Pentagon restaurant, or by limiting the number of tax-paid mailings provided free to congress-persons.

The fact is that underwritten by private donations, ironically, public television and radio continue to enrich our national and local cultural life. We can hear classical music elsewhere unavailable except on expensive recordings, we can see plays and concerts it would cost us hundreds of dollars to go to New York City or Dallas to attend, we can attend debates and lectures and forums and discussions we would be lesser citizens for missing, we can get news analyses that present all sides of a question in depth rather than in early morning or late night sound bites, we can be part of

interviews and investigations on topics unthought about with people unknown to us except through public airing, and we can be entertained with comedy and repartee and practical advice (on what to do about a '69 Volvo wheel bearing, for

More and more, people everywhere are turning on public radio and television and tuning out the more commercial stations and channels. More and more, people are scanning the skies for hope and

Public broadcasting does not offer us simple answers to modern complexity, but it does help us to face that complexity rationally, rather than prompting us to flee from it into narcotic uninvolvement and simplistic over-kill solutions.

There was a time when public radio and television bore an onerous onus of being something so effete and esthete as to smack the elite. Their tastes were so elevated that they seemed to divide culture from high culture and to separate the art of living from the fine arts. In short, they seemed snobbish, and snobbery is difficult to interpret

as anything but a put-down. An unanticipated consequence of cutting federal support to public radio and television is that they have become owned by "we, the people". The stigma of being apparatuses of an offensive high culture has been aborted without giving birth to the predicted opposite stigma of becoming tools for homogenized mass culture.

A price is being paid for this. The commendable lack of commercials on public stations has been offset by the increasing frequency of phonathon appeals for donations. Almost monthly squadrons of volunteers have to man (and woman) phone banks for longer and longer hours to solicit the transfusions that keep the malnourished public system alive. Immediate effects of this process

have been 1) less time available for

costs of fundraising administration to the public stations.

A third effect will become more apparent as more time passes; 3) fewer funds for innovating and initiating new programs will be available. In industry and government, such funds are called Research and Development (R&D) funds. R&D funds are the source of freshness and of technological and use advances. R&D is the primary response of any institution or agency to a nation rooted in expectations of novelty and change. A nation retrenched into reruns of its

past does not move ahead. We forego R&D at our peril. About the only R&D funding we have left in our nation is in industries with military contacts and a few corporations which realize that their fate rests more in their research labs than in their sales offices.

Our appetites for public radio and television have increased because they have educated and elevated our tastes. We have been converted by them into consumers of them. It will be hard to swallow the realization that our relatively recently acquired desire and need for these alternative networks may go unsatisfied unless more of us and more of our profitmaking enterprises support them



## Crappie under extreme pressure

By JERRY MAUPIN Ledger Outdoor Columnist

Most crappie anglers did very well the first part of the week and then the cold front settled in on us and shut the fish down.

They were coming into the shallow areas to spawn in the 62 degree water and they were taking minnows and jigs like old times. The Blood River area has always produced some big crappie and this year is no exception.

I always enjoy casting the banks when the males are in close because they fight as hard as a bass if you use light tackle. We still need another foot of water so these fish can go even farther back into the shallows and spawn in reasonable safety and the fry will have better protection for growing into adults.

I checked with several docks around the area and found the situation to be the same all over. However, some anglers are finding a few good fish early in the morning and late in the afternoon. I think the cold fronts and extreme pressure will move the fish out deeper during the day and after the winds die down they will come back in and finish spawning.

We had the same thing happen a few years ago and the results were terrible. The change to a lower elevation always pulls the fish out even though they are trying to

The few females we have brought in indicate a large number of fish have completed their spawning in a very short time.

It's a little confusing but out of 150 crappie this week we only had five females and their egg sacks were depleted.

•It looks as if we are in for a good bluegill season from the size and quantity we have cuaght on crappie jigs again this week.

They are scattered down the banks and a little skittish because the bass and pickerel are hungry and cruising for a meal. I found one large crappie with a half grown bluegill in

ints stomack so they have to be cautious on a bare bank.

•The water milfoil is growing nicely and will provide shelter for all species of fish. As you know; the backs of the bays are always bare in the spring but once covered with warm water they blossom into a great fish hatchery, and haven.

•We should have some activity out of the big old catfish before long. They will be coming into the banks to do their nature thing soon and will take nightcrawlers and minnows all day and night.

# Kentucky wetlands down from 1.6 million acres; 20 percent still forested

FRANKFORT, KY. — Wetlands once covered nearly 1.6 million acres in Kentucky, but today only 637,000 acres remain, a loss of 929,000 acres - 58 percent of the original lands.

Only 20 percent of Kentucky's wetlands remain forested. Nearly all the remaining wetlands have been degraded by pollutants, such as pesticides, acid mine drainage, siltation, brine water, and domestic and industrial sewage. Or they have been modified by channelization, development, impoundments, or road construction.

To call attention to wetlands and to the many benefits they provide, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has once again designated May as American Wetlands Month.

Wetlands - bogs, marshes, swamps, and similar areas - are often regarded as unproductive wastelands, sources of mosquitoes, flies, and unpleasant odors. Historically, they were considered areas to be drained for agriculture or development.

Recently, there has been a growing realization that these transition zones between dry land and deep water serve ecological functions that result in valuable services to humans and to the environment. Some of these benefits include acting as protectors of both surface and groundwater. Because they are positioned between upland and deep waters, wetlands act as water filters, improving water quality of rivers and other water bodies by catching surface-water runoff from land before it reaches open water. Floodwater storage, streambank stabilization, groundwater recharge, and food chain support are other benefits.





DEAR DR. GOTT: Will a pacemaker keep a person alive regardless of his health status? What if old people sim ply decide to call it quits

DEAR READER: A pacemaker which is really a battery-run genera tor, will not keep a person alive regardless of other circumstances. By this I mean that a patient whose heart stops beating will be maintained by a pacemaker - this is what the device is designed to accomplish but if he stops breathing or the heart muscle simply gives out, the pacemaker will continue to discharge ineffectually. despite death. Life will not be

restored. Pacemakers have been a godsend for patients who, for a variety of reasons, suffer from dangerously slow pulses or outright cardiac arrest. In such instances, the tiny generators will ensure an active, productive life

as long as other vital body organs. such as the brain and kidneys, are functioning reasonably well.

Because many patients with termi nal or catastrophic illnesses eventual ly die of heart stoppage, pacemakers will, in these instances, postpone death. However, from a practical standpoint, a person should not refuse a pacemaker merely because of a fear that he can't "call it quits" when the time comes. Usually, when death is imminent, most of the body organs. malfunction; therefore, the pacemaker issue becomes relatively unimpor





#### Paducah man given 20 years for fraud

PADUCAH, Ky. (AP) — A judge has sentenced a convicted con-man who claimed to be a billionaire to 20 years in prison.

A McCracken Circuit Court jury convicted Purdy L. Sisson of 18 fraud-related felonies in March, after a three-day trial. The charges stemmed from violations of securities law and from filing false financial statements.

The jury recommended Sisson be sentenced to three years on each of 18 counts, for a total of 54 years. The law, however, allows only a maximum of 20 years when there are multiple Class D felonies.

Judge Ron Daniels on Friday ordered the 55-year-old Paducah man to serve the 20 years. He will be eligible for parole in four

Sisson, now penniless, claimed to be 14 times as rich as Ross Perot, the billionaire presidential times the assets of Ashland Oil Inc., the largest Kentucky-based corporation.

He bonded government contractors after using fraudulent documents to convince officials he was worth nearly \$50 billion.

Sisson, a high school dropout, took advantage of a loophole in a federal bonding law that in the late 1980s allowed people who could document sufficient private assets to underwrite performance bonds for contractors who won contracts on federal construction jobs. The law now requires stringent documentation for underwriters.

On at least 13 of the bonds that Sisson guaranteed, contractors went broke and could not finish the job. When the government tried to collect from Sisson, he did not have the money.

His company claimed debts of more than \$200 million when it candidate, and to have nearly 10 filed for bankruptcy protection in

#### Three nabbed in forgery scheme

LEXINGTON, Ky. (AP) -Three University of Kentucky students have been charged in a high-tech scheme that produced fake Louisiana driver's licenses that turned up in some local bars, police said.

The students sold the licenses for \$15 and \$40 each, said Carl Harmon, chief of enforcement for the state Alcoholic Beverage Control board.

The arrests followed a monthlong investigation in which police were tipped off by ABC agents and bouncers who noticed the fake Louisiana licenses surfacing in the city.

"They looked tremendous," Harmon said of the licenses.

Charged in the scheme are Paul Scott Little, 18, a freshman; his roommate, Jerry J. Hurford, 18, also a freshman; and Jay M. Phillips, 26, a junior. The students pleaded innocent this week in Fayette District Court.

UK spokesman Bernie Vonderheide said campus leaders needed more information about the arrests before commenting on the investigation.




