## Historic Appointment Hale, Nix will serve on board

The Calloway County school board will once again have five members, one of whom will go down in history as the first female to serve.

Robbie Ann Hale, 45, will represent district 1 and John Warren Nix, 27, will represent district 4. "I've had kids in the school system for 14 years and still do," Hale said. "I think it's time for a woman school board member, but I'm a little nervous about it."

Parent-Teacher Organization. She volunteers for the school system often.

"It's hard to understand all the changes that KERA is bringing about, but I am trying to learn," she said. "I want to make the parents understand."

Nix is the assistant vice president at United Commonwealth Bank and is a farmer.

"My objective is to carry on with what has been done in the past," Nix said. "I feel I have something to give as a school board member."

University. "It's tough to make the KERA changes, but I plan to help continue to implement the new project," he said.

"It is a great opportunity to serve the community," he said. "I think they will be good board members and I look forward to working with them."

The applicants were interviewed by a three-member committee consisting of William R.

## Barnett appears in court

Billy Barnett Jr. appeared in Calloway County Circuit Court Friday and pleaded not guilty to an Oct. 8 grand jury indictment charging him with tampering with evidence.

Barnett, 24, of Hazel is also charged with first-degree murder in connection with the death of 20-year-old Roger Dale Jones of Hazel.

Barnett's half-brother, James, was arraigned in Marshall County Circuit Court Oct. 15 on charges of tampering with evidence. He entered a not guilty plea.

James Ray Barnett, 20, of Aino also faces charges of hindering prosecution.

Both men were arrested Sept. 16 on the charges. They are lodged in the Marshall County Detention Center. Bail for Billy Barnett is \$250,000 cash. James

Barnett's bail is \$25,000 cash or approved surety.

During Friday's arraignment, public defender Dennis Lortie, who represents Billy Barnett, discussed preliminary motions with the court.

First, he asked Circuit Judge David Buckingham to make a judgement on a motion to dismiss the case on the grounds that the Commonwealth does not have physical evidence to support that a crime was committed in Calloway County.

"Unless the Commonwealth can produce some evidence that a crime was committed in Calloway County then the indictment must be dismissed," he said.

Hunters found Jones' body in Stewart County, Tenn. Land Between the Lakes Sept. 4. The remains have been positively identified by specialists in Knoxville, Tenn.

However, Jones' skull was found in Shady Oaks Mobile Home Park in Calloway County July 13.

Lortie quoted a case in which charges were dismissed because the prosecution could not prove a crime was committed in the jurisdiction of the court.

Assistant Commonwealth Attorney Vickie Jones said the dismissal in the case which Lortie referred to occurred during trial proceedings, not pre-trial proceedings.

She also said the court could not dismiss charges that stem from a grand jury indictment.

Additionally, because Lortie filed this motion Wednesday, the prosecution did not have ample time to prepare a response.

Buckingham said he had not read the case Lortie quoted, but

## Haitian government seeks embargo exemption

PORT-AU-PRINCE, Haiti (AP) — Apparently backing down under army pressure, Haiti's premier said he would ask the

United Nations for a partial exemption from an oil embargo aimed at forcing the military to restore democracy.

Texaco, Shell and Esso, the three gasoline distributors in the country, stopped deliveries to gas

stations after a U.N. oil and weapons embargo took effect on Tuesday.

On Friday, motorists waited in long lines at the few stations open in the capital. Stations that were closed wrapped the rubber

hoses around the pumps.

The embargo was reimposed to punish Haiti's repressive army for not following through with a plan that would lead to the Oct. 30 return of exiled President Jean-Bertrand Aristide, who was

ousted in a coup two years ago. An earlier embargo had been lifted after the army signed the accord in July.

Aristide's premier, Robert Malval, said that next week, he would ask the United Nations for

an exemption from the embargo, allowing distributors to supply gas stations from their existing local stocks.

Those reserves could supply

## Harvest is in good shape

As the days begin to grow shorter and the temperatures start to drop, farmers are out in their fields preparing for the changing season.

Although the rain has hampered portions of the harvest season, Ted Howard, Calloway County extension agent, said the county is in pretty good shape.

"The rain is good and we are fortunate to have had an earlier harvest period," he said. "But the problem with rain is that you can't turn it off and on when you need it. I'd say we are about where we want to be right now."

The majority of the dark-fired tobacco farmers are in the firing process right now.

"The dark-fired tobacco is not as good as last year, but last year's crop was superior," he said. "The thing to do is get a

## Lawsuit Attorneys defend police action

Attorneys for the three police officers named in a \$9 million civil lawsuit say they feel confident their clients acted appropriately.

Robert Stogner, 49, of Murray filed the suit in U.S. District Court Oct. 12, which alleges his civil rights were violated when Murray Police Det. Sgt. Ronald Wisheart, Calloway County Deputy Stan Scott and Kentucky State Police Det. Sgt. Dennis Crawford arrested him on a mental health warrant Jan. 15.

The suit also names the City of Murray and Calloway County.

Stogner alleges that when officers arrested him they used excessive force and denied him prompt medical attention. He also charges Wisheart with obtaining the mental health warrant without probable cause.

Don Overbey, who represents Wisheart, said after interviewing him and reviewing the case file, he thinks there was definitely probable cause for an arrest.

Overbey said he does not think the case will ever go to trial. He said he thinks the defendants named in the suit will win a summary judgement.

"The city is sorry to be named as a co-defendant," he said. "We feel the actions taken by Det. Wisheart were proper and the city used its best judgement to effect the service of the warrant of arrest."

Mark Bryant, who represents Crawford, said because the case is being litigated, he does not want to talk specifically about the charges.

However, he said he thinks Crawford handled the arrest appropriately.

"Sgt. Crawford followed all the

basic policy and procedure of the Kentucky State Police and he has done nothing wrong under the law."

"I am confident that the state police and Sgt. Crawford will prevail."

Capt. Joe Williams, KSP Post 1 Commander, said according to Kentucky Revised Statutes, officers must determine probable cause before making arrest. Additionally, statute, as well as the KSP policy manual, state an officer should not use any more force than necessary to effect the arrest.

Bryant said he will be filing an answer to the complaint Monday in U.S. District Court in Paducah.

Ken Devitt, who represents Scott, said from the information he has received, there was probable cause to issue an arrest

# Burn victim talks of healing

WEST PALM BEACH, Fla. (AP) — Instead of vengeance, Christopher Wilson spoke softly of healing after the two white men who taunted him with racial slurs as they set him afire were sentenced to life in prison.

Mark Kohut, 27, and Charles Rourke, 33, received life terms Friday for attempted murder in the attack that left the black New York City stock brokerage clerk with burns over nearly 40 percent of his body.

"I just want to get on with my life," Wilson said. "Justice was done."

Calling the torching one of the most "senseless and atrocious" crimes he had ever seen, Circuit Judge Donald Evans gave Rourke 40 years for kidnapping and rob-

bery on top of his life sentence. Kohut got an additional 27 years for kidnapping and robbery, less than Rourke because prosecutors were unable to prove he was armed at the time.

Evans also granted a defense request to keep both men protected while in prison because of the nature of their crimes. The men cannot be paroled.

"We're going to prison as convicted racists," Kohut told Florida News Network. "The prison population is 85 percent black. Now, I don't want to die, I sure don't want to be hurt for something I didn't do."

Prosecutors had asked for the maximum three consecutive life sentences because of the racist nature of the attack and the

extreme physical trauma Wilson suffered. He told the judge he has constant pain, nightmares, can't work or even go out in the sun.

"Doctors say one day I will get back to normal. I don't know," Wilson testified Friday. "I just have to keep trying and forget what happened to me."

"I wish it just never happened. It happened for no reason at all."

The two day laborers from Lakeland were convicted last month of abducting Wilson on New Year's Day outside a suburban Tampa shopping plaza and forcing him to drive to a remote field. There they doused him with gasoline from a plastic jug, insulted him and laughed as they set him on fire.

Testimony from the soft-

spoken 32-year-old was credited with winning the convictions despite the mid-trial walkout of the lead prosecutor and a lack of any physical evidence tying the suspects to the crime.

Some jurors wept when Wilson described how he stood soaked in gasoline and heard his attackers warn, "Now you're going to die, nigger."

Kohut and Rourke showed no emotion as they listened to the sentences, but Kohut burst into tears earlier when his mother pleaded for mercy. Rourke's voice trembled as he read a statement maintaining both men were scapegoats.

Attorneys for both men said they plan to appeal. The judge rejected a motion for a new trial.

# Coffman is first female federal judge

LEXINGTON, Ky. (AP) — Jennifer B. Coffman is the newest member of the U.S. District Court in Kentucky and the first woman appointed to the federal bench in the state's history.

"As a woman attorney, I can't say how honored I am to be part of this historic moment," Marsha Riddings, vice president of the Kentucky Bar Association, said after Coffman took the oath Friday from William O. Bertelsman,

chief judge of the Eastern District of Kentucky.

After the ceremony, Coffman said that she felt like a pioneer.

"You can't escape that," she said.

But Coffman said she didn't have aspirations to serve as a federal judge.

"Not really," she said. "I had a very active practice and I'm surprised I'm here."

Coffman takes the seat previously held by Judge Eugene E. Siler Jr., who was elevated to the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Sixth Circuit in 1991.

"I feel a good deal of gratitude and reverence on this occasion," Coffman said after taking the oath.

Coffman, who was born in Union City, Tenn., earned law degrees from the University of Kentucky. Before her appointment, she was a member of the

Lexington law firm of Newberry, Hargrove & Ramburc.

An overflow crowd of several hundred people, including local, state and federal judges, family, friends and lawyers, attended the 40-minute ceremony in a courtroom inside the Federal Courthouse in Lexington.

Coffman, 45, will be a swing judge for the Eastern and Western districts. She will be based in London.

Leslie G. Whitmer, clerk for the Eastern District, read the commission from President Clinton signed by President Clinton.

Her husband, Dr. Wesley Coffman, held the Bible while she repeated the oath from Bertelsman.

In his remarks, Bertelsman recalled an episode from the television show "L.A. Law," where a lawyer appointed to the bench said that the difficult part of his

job was that a judge couldn't walk away from making a decision.

"It will change you as a person and your life," Bertelsman told Coffman. "I know you won't step down and walk away from that obligation."

Ronald E. Meredith, chief judge of the Western District, said, "My only advice is not to watch 'L.A. Law,'" but added, "On behalf of the judges in the Western District, I want you to know we admire you and we think you will be an outstanding judge."

Coffman said she was filled with emotions of gratitude, amusement, humility, reverence, excitement, sadness and anxiety in taking the position.

"My life is altered forever and I know that," she said.

Devitt said people who have been interviewed have indicated at the time of the arrest, Stogner was threatening bodily harm to a former employer. That, and other circumstances, could be considered probable cause, he said.

"Since that fact is wrong, it makes me wonder about all the facts," he said in reference to other allegations listed in the suit.

He said Scott had no involvement in obtaining the warrant and was at the scene only to assist with the arrest.

At this point, Devitt said he does not think Stogner's civil rights were violated in any way.

Devitt represents 110 counties in Kentucky. He said law enforcement officers are often subjected to civil suits.

"Certainly they are in a posi-

agreed with the Commonwealth that a dismissal would not be appropriate at this time.

He said he will make an official ruling on the motion next week.

Lortie also asked whether the Commonwealth would seek the death penalty or try the case as a capital offense.

Jones said no.

After the arraignment, Jones said there are specific cases, cited in the Kentucky Revised Statutes, which allow a murder case to be tried as a capital offense.

"Basically, another crime has to be committed in addition to murder," she said.

For instance, if a person were raped then murdered or kidnapped then murdered, those actions would be considered a capital offense, she said.

Lortie also asked the court to exclude the media from evidentiary hearings.

"There has been extensive pre-trial coverage," he said.

good finish on the tobacco."

To his knowledge, there have been only three tobacco barns lost so far this year.

Burley tobacco farmers have already begun the stripping process.

"The burley market will probably be sluggish because of the foreign tobacco producers," Howard said. "But the dark-fired prices should be pretty good."

Calloway County should produce an average corn crop this year, about 15 to 20 bushels an

Lortie thinks the media coverage will make it difficult to seat a jury and hinder Barnett's right to a fair trial.

He said he anticipates filing a motion for a change of venue or to pool a jury from surrounding areas.

Jones said the Commonwealth was not prepared to make a response on Lortie's motion to exclude the media.

If Lortie files a motion requesting a change of venue, the Commonwealth will respond at that time, she said.

Buckingham said counsel will argue whether the media should be excluded from evidentiary hearings Nov. 12.

Motions for discovery were entered and ordered.

Jones said the Commonwealth will turn over interviews and other material. However, all test results on evidence that is currently at the forensic lab has not been returned.

An official cause of death has not yet been given.

We were before television, before penicillin, before polio shots, frozen foods, Xerox, plastic, contact lenses, frisbees and the pill. We were before radar, credit cards, split atoms, laser beams and ballpoint pens, before pantyhose, dishwashers, clothes dryers, electric blankets, air conditioners, drip-dry clothes and before man walked on the moon. In our time, closets were for clothes, not for "coming out of." Bunnies were small rabbits and rabbits were not Volkswagens. Designer jeans were scheming girls named Jean or Jeane, and having a meaningful relationship meant getting along well with our cousins.

We were before house-husbands, gay rights, computer dating, dual careers and computer marriages. We were before day-care centers, group therapy and nursing homes. We never heard of FM radios, tape decks, electric typewriters, artificial hearts, word processors, yogurt, and guys wearing earrings. For us, time-sharing meant togetherness, not computers or condominiums; a "chip" meant a piece of wood; hardware meant hardware, and software wasn't even a word.

We hit the scene when there were 5 and 10 cent stores, where you bought things for five and 10 cents. Ice cream cones were a nickel or a dime. For a nickel you could ride a street car, make a phone call, buy a Pepsi or enough stamps to mail one letter and two postcards. You could buy a new Chevy coupe for \$600, but who could afford one; a pity too, because gas was 11 cents a gallon!

In our day, cigarette smoking was fashionable, grass was mowed, Coke was a cold drink and pot was something you cooked in. Rock music was a grandma's lullaby and aids were helpers in the principal's office. We were certainly not before the difference in the sexes was discovered, but we were surely before the sex change; we made do with what we had. And we were the last generation that was so dumb as to think you needed a husband to have a baby!

In 1940, "made in Japan" meant junk and the term "making out" referred to how you did on your exam. Pizza, MacDonald's and instant coffee were unheard of. We got married first and then lived together. How quaint can you be? No wonder we are so confused and there is such a generation gap today!

## Ideas abound for MSU's search

Many people have many different ideas about the most desirable qualities and qualifications to seek in the next president of Murray State University.

Representatives of various constituencies spelled out some of them in three different meetings last month. They were invited by the presidential search committee to offer suggestions for its consideration as the process began to unfold.

Faculty, students, staff, MSU Foundation trustees, alumni and members of the general public had an opportunity to suggest criteria for use in identifying and hiring someone to succeed Dr. Ronald J. Kurth.

Most were predictable; a few were not. But all were certainly fascinating — at least to me, a close observer of the presidency on the campus where I worked almost a quarter of a century before my retirement in 1992.

A composite drawn from the three meetings would make the ideal new president, among other things, someone who:

- Is energetic, enthusiastic, accessible, compassionate, visible, bold, humble, promotable, student-oriented, friendly, imaginative, and a good listener and skilled communicator with a record of fundraising success.

- Has demonstrated notable leadership ability in higher education and has both classroom and administrative experience, as well as a thorough understanding of university culture.

- Can earn the respect of all university constituencies and

serve as a consensus builder among them and can work cooperatively and effectively with the governing board.

That's not all — but it gives some idea of the accumulated expectation a presidential search always seems to engender.

Nobody mentioned anything about making a quick change of clothes in a telephone booth or leaping tall buildings in a single bound. But, looking at everything else, that might not have been altogether inappropriate.

Academic credentials and background relating to professional experience are easily documented. However, the intangible human qualities more often than not the difference between success and failure are quite another matter.

Candidates eventually selected to visit campus will likely be extremely adroit at selling themselves. Anyone who has observed one of these rituals firsthand knows exactly what I mean.

But the problem, to paraphrase a familiar saying, is that "what you see is not necessarily what you get" — unless the candidate is someone already known who can't get away with adopting a bogus persona.

That persistent shadow of uncertainty makes me thankful that the responsibility for a final decision on the next president belongs to others — and not to me.

But I do have definite opinions about it. They were formed against a backdrop of almost 25 years at Murray State that included three presidential searches and at least some part of four different administrations.

First of all, I think it absolutely imperative to find someone with integrity above reproach, with an honest-to-goodness sense of ethics who values truth for all occasions. To some that may seem too obvious — but there are no guarantees.

Murray State also needs a leader who cares about people and who can inspire, involve and encourage others, both on and off campus, by seeking to advance them instead of self. The last thing needed is a president controlled by his/her ego.

Of course, the ability to communicate effectively, including the art of listening, is essential. A president should have something to say and be able to say it without talking down to people whose

support he/she needs.

A president should recognize the role of Murray State as a regional university and learn as much as possible about its service area, then seek to fit into the area community instead of expecting it to conform to him/her.

Along that same line, the new president should not be stricken with the notion that people in the local and area communities are yokels just waiting for him/her to come along to elevate their intellectual and moral tone.

Considering dwindling state support for higher education, the president without question should be someone with a record of success both as a fundraiser and as a fiscally prudent manager.

Whoever is selected should also have the temperament and the common sense to be such a stabilizing force that people on the campus who perform satisfactorily in their jobs will feel secure and appreciated.

These ideas readily come to mind as I ponder the task ahead for the search committee and the board as a whole. Certainly there are others — but I submit that these few would make a good beginning.

Oh, and one other thought that involves both the board and the president-to-be.

Both should have a clear understanding of what is expected of a president before the job is offered or accepted. As far as possible, nothing should be left for later-on assumptions.

### EDITORIAL ROUNDUP

#### Oct. 19, The Press-Courier, Oxnard, Calif., on the Denny beating verdicts:

A brick in the head gets a slap on the wrist. That's the message from the (partial) verdicts Oct. 18 in the case of Damian "Football" Williams and Henry Watson, two of the men who savagely beat truck driver Reginald Denny at the flashpoint of the L.A. riots.

For those who don't remember the videotape, Williams and Watson were leaders of a gang of rampaging hoods who terrorized whites, Hispanics and Asians near the corner of Florence and Normandie avenues (April 29, 1992) just after four LAPD officers were acquitted of most state charges in the beating of Rodney King.

Video shot by a news crew flying overhead clearly showed Williams hurl a brick to the side of Denny's face, and then dancing for joy as Denny lay crumpled in the street near death.

On (Oct. 18), the jury in the case decided the brick delivered by Williams was a case of "simple mayhem," bringing a maximum sentence of eight years in prison.

The most serious charge pinned on co-defendant Henry Watson was simple assault, a six-month sentence maximum, meaning he could be immediately released for time served in jail during the trial.

We find ourselves outraged by these verdicts, as much as we were when the Simi Valley Courthouse jury acquitted the four Los Angeles police officers who beat King.

In fact, if anything, we're more outraged.

At least the King case hinged on the complex legal question of when does police use of force become excessive force. ... But Watson and Williams had no right to even touch Denny, much less pull him from his truck and subject him to the brutal beating he received.

The multiple felonies shown by the tape of the beating were so blatantly obvious that the jurors must have closed their eyes, or maybe their minds, when it was played in court.

Justice is supposed to be blind. But not that blind.

#### Oct. 8, The Marion (Ohio) Star on Supreme Court proceedings:

Harvard Law School professor Alan M. Dershowitz has proposed that Supreme Court proceedings be opened to the public.

Professor Dershowitz may have hit on something very fundamental. We need to know and we have a right to know what is being decided in that hallowed chamber.

He maintains, and we agree, that openness and more critical scrutiny of the Supreme Court would be good for all Americans. Now that C-SPAN broadcasts the House of Representatives, why not carry key Supreme Court proceedings over the airwaves as well? It is time for the high court to get off its high horse and open its proceedings to the public.

The Harvard professor is correct when he says: Even those who watch over our liberty must be watched by all who care about liberty.

## Past in South is close at hand

Except for a few high-fashion (with prices to match) salons, the average antique shop in the South is only a daily step indoors from the weekend outdoor flea market or the occasional neighborhood yard sale.

The specialty items are pure Americana, not British or Chinese imports. The most frequent comments from browsing customers are not, "How unusual" or "I've never seen anything like this," but "We had one of those when I was growing up" or "I remember my grandmother cooking in one of those."

The thing about living in the South is that the past is always all around us, close at hand and familiar. We have brought it with us to the brink of the 21st century.

You see a lot of Coca-Cola memorabilia in antique shops. Coca-Cola is the southern trademarked symbol of much of what we southerners are, because it has stayed with us decade after decade, not as a curio but as something accessible that is ageless, pretty much the same today as it was for our grandparents.

The same is true of a lot of things we associate with being southern: our speech patterns, our metaphors, our religion, our schooling, our local governments, our faith in individualism, and our skepticism of easy rides and shortcuts and fast paces.

I read recently another one of

those collections of essays intended to analyze the South. A new one seems to get printed every year. Like the others, this one confesses there are still some distinctly southern things lying around, especially in the South outside the city limits of big places like Miami and Atlanta.

Like the others, too, it seems intent upon pronouncing the South dead, absorbed no longer with itself but into mainstream America. Wal-Mart, interstate, look-alike motels, air-conditioning, and sound-alike television news anchors have made Yankees of us all. The Solid South has thawed into

a Sun Belt, and the Sun Belt is now thawing into atoms of mixed characteristics that make stereotypes inaccurate and impossible to apply.

About the only things southern that are left, according to some of these essayists, are matters of convenience, useful for public relations or to wrest some trading or status advantage from another region, another company, or one another.

We still put columns and porches on our homes, even though they have no function. We still dress and talk southern for television entertainment shows, although it is becoming difficult to tell southern from

western in our music or drawl or posture.

But, as one essayist describes it, using a cartoon from Doug Marlette's "Kudzu" strip, the good of 'boy mechanic down at the corner body shop has gone to work to make something of himself in computer sales. You can tell the difference because "Booger got his only tooth capped!"

We may leave Civil War photos on our coffeetables and television sets but we have dens instead of parlors and front porches now. We decorate our seldom-used kitchens with Grannie's old bread-dough bowl, but it is only for appearances while passing through on our way out to Hardee's more than for any use we make of them.

So now here we are, the South only seven years away from the next millennium, and faced with an identity crisis as severe as even those of Bill Clinton or Russia.

If we aren't what we were, what have we become?

More importantly, what ought we to want to make of ourselves?

And do we have anything to say about it, or is it something that just is "bound to happen" to us outside our control?

And if it is out of our control, is it completely so?

Or is something we could be doing not only to be "able to live with it" but "to make the most of it?"

It is usually difficult for declarer to play a suit contract in a 4-3 fit. For a good example of how declarer sometimes handles this situation, consider this deal where South gets to six hearts as shown.

Superficially, it seems declarer must ruff two diamonds in dummy to score 12 tricks. But closer inspection reveals that if South adopts this approach, he will not be able to reenter his hand safely after ruffing the ace

When South next plays the ten of hearts to draw East's last trump, West is finished. Whatever he discards, declarer scores the remaining tricks. Ducking the first spade — known as "rectifying the count" — immediately puts South in the position of having all the tricks but one, a position that often leads to a successful squeeze. In the actual deal, the initial duck enables South to bring in the slam.

## Tigers grab share of First

LACENTER — It wasn't Funny Noses and Glasses Night at Bomber Field Friday, but those Murray High Tigers were incognito.

The Tigers didn't look much like district champions Friday at Ballard Memorial, even though that's where Murray stood when the night was over.

A rather ugly 36-13 Murray victory over Ballard Memorial, coupled with a 53-0 Fulton County pounding of Heath helped the Tigers clinch at least a share of the Class A First District title.

Murray didn't resemble a district champ, a 9-0 club, and No. 2-ranked team in the win over the Bombers Friday.

But maybe the Tigers, who were banged up a little entering Friday's game, were due a subpar performance after rolling to

impressive wins over the last month.

"It was the one, if we were going to get it, it was going to be tonight," Murray coach Rick Fisher said. "We weren't ready to play. There's been too many distractions this week."

But the Tigers also played it conservatively. Two starting defensive tackles, Robert Weatherly and Josh Emerson, didn't see playing time because of injuries — and Murray used the matchup against Ballard to try some combinations and experiment.

"It was one of those that maybe we needed a wake up call," Fisher said. "I guess it's good to get one when you can win. Maybe this will be the one that helps us wake up."

Ballard Memorial opened the game with a nice drive that

moved to the Tiger 32, but the Bombers stopped on fourth-and-short.

Murray opened the scoring with Brent Keller hitting Jeremiah Rayburn on a quick pass, with Rayburn scampering 33-yards for the touchdown to give the Tigers a 7-0 lead with 5:11 left in the first quarter.

After forcing a quick Ballard punt, the Tigers looked to have another opportunity for a quick score with the ball on the Bomber 43, but on the first play, a Keller pass was tipped and intercepted by Ballard's Philip Lawrence, who snared the ball on the Bomber 35 and took the interception back for a touchdown. The point-after-touchdown was blocked, and Murray held a 7-6 lead.

Murray answered quickly as

Chris Cheaney ripped off a 71-yard touchdown run with 1:05 left in the opening quarter, and David Gressler's PAT made it 14-6.

A nice punt return from Murray's Victor Perry helped set up a David Gressler 29-yard field goal with 3:23 left in the half to make it 17-6. Another Murray scoring threat ended late in the half when a Keller pass was picked off by Lawrence in the end zone.

"We've been a quick strike offense all year long," Fisher pointed out. "They (Ballard) really whipped us the first half. It was their ballgame. If it hadn't been for Chris Cheaney's long run and Jeremiah's pass-catch, they pretty much dominated us."

Any hopes of a Ballard upset ended early in the third quarter. Runs by Chris Cheaney and Mitch Downey helped set up a

## Tilghman scrapes past Calloway 35-0

PADUCAH — Those around the Paducah Tilghman football team call him "Buffy." And not because he wears argyle socks or dates a boy named Tab. No, they probably call him "Buffy" because he tells them to.

When you weigh 260 pounds and run like dump truck going downhill as Tilghman fullback Javon Reed does, you get that kind of respect.

Members of the Calloway County defense probably wanted to call him "A cab" to get him off the field after he jarred a few Laker bones.

Reed, a 6-1 senior, rushed 16 times for 161 yards and Tilghman's first three touchdowns in Friday night's 35-0 win over Calloway.

"He didn't come to my side too much," said a relieved Mike Arnett, a 5-7, 160-pound cornerback who practiced ankle tackles all week. "Actually, he got mad at us for tackling around his legs. He said we were trying to hurt him. That's the only way to get

that guy down."

"You see him coming at you at 260, he's a little bigger than most running backs," said junior safety Tyler Bohannon. "I saw him on film and didn't think he was that good. He ran right through us. He's better than I thought he was."

After scoring on runs of eight and 23 yards in the first half to give Tilghman a 14-0 halftime lead, Tornado head coach Allan Cox unleashed "Buffy" in the second half.

"At the end of the first half we started to throw the ball and got sloppy," said Cox after winning his fifth game in a row. "In the second half we got Buffy the ball."

"He got some good holes...HE makes some good holes."

Reed rambled into the end zone from 29 yards out with 6:56 to play in the third quarter to give Tilghman a 21-0 lead. On the next drive, Reed carried twice for 14 and eight to set up backup quarterback Richard Dillard's

## Sir Charles to Boris: Tennis anyone?

MUNICH, Germany (AP) — Although he is in Munich to play some basketball, Charles Barkley's biggest moment in the Olympiad came when he met Boris Becker.

The German tennis star dropped in to watch Barkley and the Phoenix Suns keep the NBA's record in the McDonald's Open perfect with a 145-115 victory Friday over Spanish champion Real Madrid.

Barkley still enjoys tennis, although his main non-basketball occupation is golf.

Becker was with his pregnant, half-American fiance Barbara Feltus.

"I was really excited to meet them, I was really pumped up," Barkley said, waving as Becker and Barbara walked past the press room during Barkley's post-game interview.

"Bye-bye," Becker and Barbara shouted across the room. "We are now going to hit some bars together," Barkley joked. "It was a great honor to meet Boris Becker and his family."

Barkley said. "I played tennis before I took up golf, and it was a great honor to meet a player of his caliber."

Jokingly, Barkley proposed playing a game — Becker gives him three of four games headway in tennis, he gives him 20 points in a game of hoops.

In the real basketball game, the Suns actually had a few early anxious moments before "the talent level took over," as Barkley put it.

The Suns trailed 38-30 after the first quarter, but began to rally in the second and led 70-66 at halftime.

When the teams returned, the Suns took off. Madrid was particularly hurt by the quick accumulation of fouls by Lithuanian center Arvidas Sabonis.

"He is huge, really huge," Barkley said. "I tried to knock him and nearly got the wind blown out of myself."

## New Jays ready for clincher

TORONTO (AP) — With one more victory, the Blue Jays will become the first repeat World Series champion in 15 years. Well, at least half of them will.

Only half of the current roster was playing last year when the Blue Jays beat the Atlanta Braves for Canada's first World Series title. Twelve of those 25 have been replaced this fall.

"That's why a lot of guys are playing hard," Blue Jays manager Cito Gaston said Friday, when the World Series returned to the SkyDome with the Blue Jays leading the Phillies 3-2.

Dave Winfield, Jimmy Key and Tom Henke are gone. Jack Morris is injured. Paul Molitor, Dave Stewart and Toronto native Rob Butler have arrived.

Some top teams get stale, losing the spark that got them there. But general manager Pat Gillick made sure that didn't happen. Although some players' hands could get heavy with a second Series ring, others have empty fingers just itching to put on their first one.

"They'd love to see Paul Molitor win a World Series ring, Darnell Coles and Dick Schofield," Gaston said. "That's where I get my satisfaction."

After winning last year, some wondered what would happen once Key and the others left. But during the winter meetings, the Blue Jays got Molitor for \$13 million over three years and Stewart for \$8.5 million over two.

"But we've had some other factors to consider," Gillick said. "We traded Kelly Gruber, and Eddie Sprague has stepped in and played better third base than some of the people in this organi-

zation probably ever expected.

"And if you came out of spring training and said that Al Leiter and Pat Hentgen would win 28 games between them, you would have thought it was more likely that Stewart and Morris would have done that. And Tony Fernandez may have been our most valuable player since coming back over to us."

Morris, at 7-12, was a bust, his elbow finally flaming out at age 38. Fernandez, dealt by Gillick after the 1990 season, was hitting .225 when the general manager rescued him from the New York Mets on June 10. Fernandez hit .306 the rest of the way and drove in 50 runs in 94 games.

"Some people did not make us the favorite to repeat this year after all the changes we made," said Duane Ward, who took over as the closer when Henke became a free agent and wasn't re-signed.

Quarterback Sam Arnett hit Wesley Cogdell for a 14-yard gain and tight end Brad Lowe for 32 to take the ball to the Tilghman 32 at the start of the second quarter.

Running back Brandon McCuiston had gains of 11 and six on consecutive carries to move the ball down to the 21. Tilghman then stiffened and left Calloway with a crucial fourth-and-four. Arnett's pass to McCuiston went for one yard to end the drive.

Mike Arnett recovered a Terrell English fumble on Tilghman's next drive to set Calloway up at their own 23. The Lakers used 12 plays to get to the Tilghman 23, but Bohannon's 40-yard field goal attempt was blocked.

Calloway didn't threaten the rest of the evening.

"In the first half the kids played a great football game," Mitchell said. "We had a great offensive plan but we fell short inside the 30."

In the second half, the only excitement was a scuffle between Calloway's Lowe and Tilghman's Johnson.

With just under six minutes to play and Tilghman holding on to a 35-0 lead, Cox sent his first team offense back onto the field after reserves played most of the fourth quarter.

With 5:11 to play, Lowe and Johnson had a hold of each other after a play and started swinging. Neither connected solidly, but both were ejected.

According to KHSAA rules, neither player will be able to play next week. Tilghman has a key district game against Hopkinsville while Calloway hosts Hart County.

Tilghman coaches felt Lowe started the altercation and said they saw the Calloway junior hit Johnson in the back of the head with his helmet.

Johnson, the state's most sought after college recruit who stands 6-5, 230, is 40 pounds heavier than Lowe and has 40

The rainfall did lower the surface temperature a few degrees and slowed the minnow activity about eight hours.

However, it is late October and the food chain must continue to work and get the predators fat enough to survive the winter.

Maybe the water elevation will remain at the present level and help keep the fish where they are now. Most of the bays that still have moss will provide cover for the gamefish until winter sets in. They are in good shape now and can be fished easily with a wide variety of lures. Buzzbaits, worms, jigs, spinnerbaits and

shallow running crankbaits are good fall lures that will produce strikes for you.

I think the weather will settle soon and we can have some real good fall fishing yet. A few days without the wind would be nice so the crappie anglers could get out on the ledges and locate the slabs again.

Minnows and jigs are taking crappie when worked slowly over these ledges and brush piles. The crappie had moved into shallow water around the first of the month when the shad baitfish came in but with all of the recent commotion they pulled out again.

Next week should be quieter and then the local folks will have a chance to get out and enjoy the beautiful fall colors along the shorelines. The ospreys and the loons are here taking advantage of the numerous schools of shad while the eagles are holding back until everyone leaves.

I haven't seen any geese come through yet but it won't be much longer before they start passing by.

## Wildlife won't lead to compensation

DURHAM, N.C. (AP) — Interior Secretary Bruce Babbitt dismissed complaints Friday that environmental restrictions decrease property values and said the government will not compensate everyone whose land is affected by wildlife protection regulations.

Babbitt criticized congressional efforts to require government payment to property owners, saying that could lead to situations where "it pays to pollute" — as in a case where a polluting company would suffer financial loss under government regulation.

He acknowledged that environmental regulations "taken for valid public purposes can have consequences that inconvenience people." But he likened such rules to city zoning codes and anti-pollution laws.

"There will never be enough money to say every time there's a government regulation somebody gets paid," he said. He targeted a House resolution introduced by Rep. Robert Smith, R-Ore., that requires the federal government to compensate property owners for any "diminution in value" caused by environmental regula-

tion as being a window to endless government payouts.

Babbitt made the comments to the Society of Environmental Journalists at Duke University a day after the administration tangled with Congress on another issue affecting natural resource protection — the effort to raise grazing fees on public lands.

Western land interests and their Senate defenders succeeded Thursday with a parliamentary tactic to hold up efforts to increase federal grazing fees and implement environmental changes on government-owned land.

Led by Sen. Pete Domenici, R-N.M., who says such changes would destroy the Western rural way of life, the Senate rebuffed an effort to shut off debate on the grazing issue.

Babbitt said in an interview Friday that he hoped to have Congress "draw this to a close" after years of debate over bringing subsidized grazing fees closer to market value.

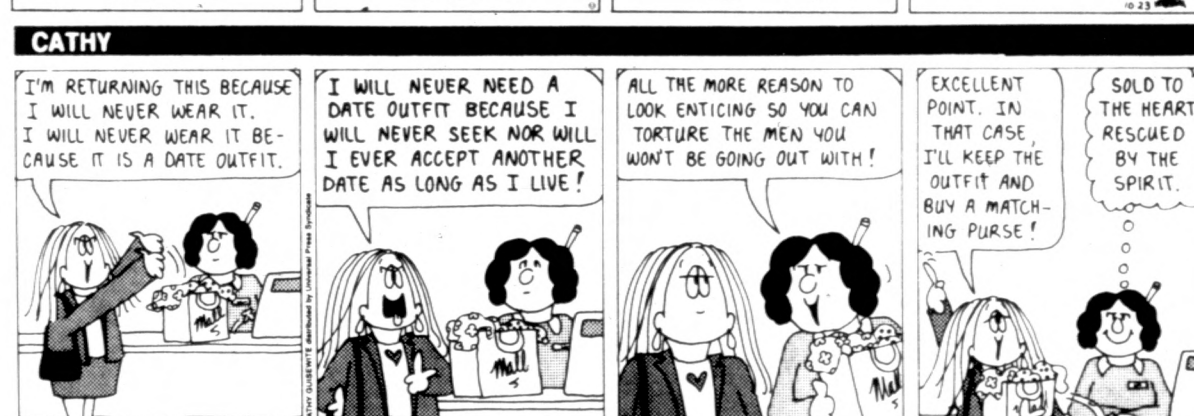
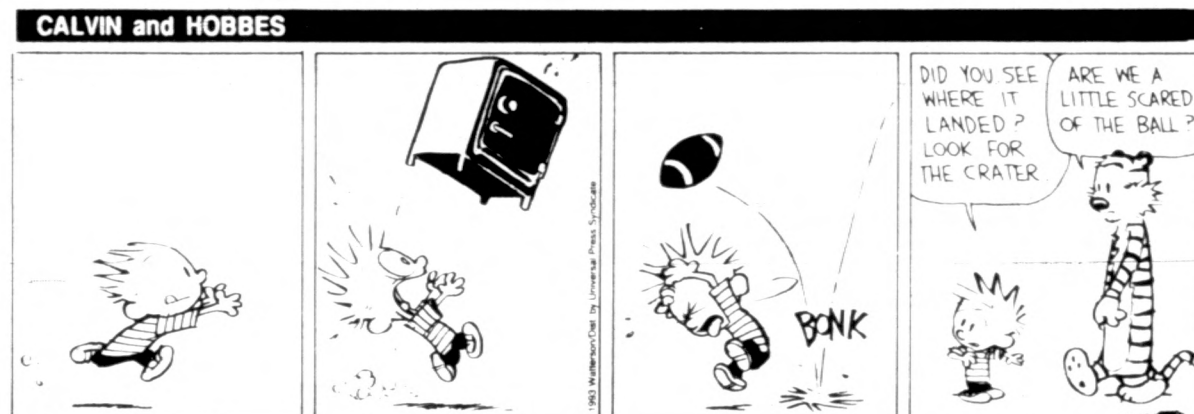

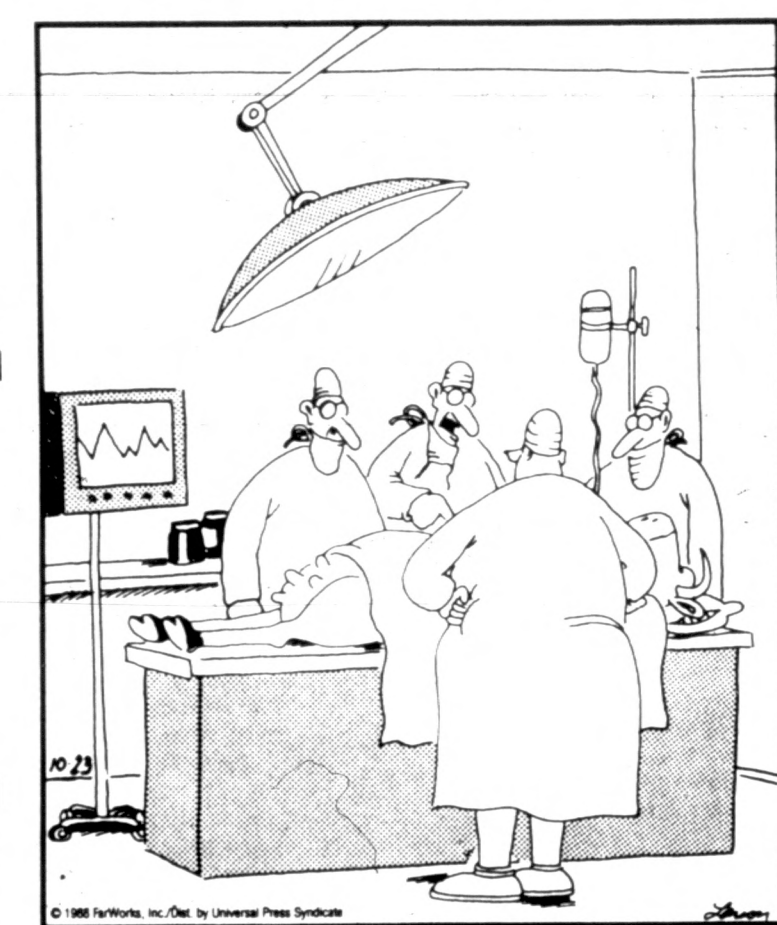

### Babbage reports on candidates

Calloway County is one of the 118 counties in which women are candidates for election on November 2. Only Knox and Hancock counties, where no woman currently holds office, report that no women are seeking elective office this year, according to Secretary of State Bob Babbage.

Over 950 women are candidates for office this fall. A total of 878 women currently serve in public office statewide, Babbage estimated.

The largest potential increase is likely to occur in city offices. Presently 371 women serve on city councils. A total of 571 women are candidates for those seats this fall.

Mayorships and fiscal court memberships could have a decline in women officeholders, Babbage said.

Women elected to fiscal court could decrease because 50 women currently serve on fiscal courts and only 50 are candidates this year. A total of 71 women hold the office of mayor now and 68 females are candidates for that office this year. "This is a missed opportunity," Babbage said, "and unfortunate that over one-half our counties will still have no female members of the county's governing body."

Two women are running for major offices in two of Kentucky's largest cities, Babbage noted. Mayor Pam Miller of Lexington is running for a full term for that office and Melissa Mershon, a member of the Louisville Board of Aldermen, is a candidate for Sheriff of Jefferson County.

Nine women are candidates for county judge/executive, an office to which four women were elected for the current term.

Of the total women elected to office in Kentucky 206 or 23 percent are members of local school boards. Most are members without races in 1993.

"We encourage women to seek school council memberships," Babbage said. "Although membership to local school councils is non-elected, school council members have a significant role in school decisions under the provisions of KERA," he noted.

The number of female county

clerks may increase after the November election. Currently women hold 59 of the 120 county clerk offices and 75 females are candidates for those offices this year.

The fact that only six of Kentucky's 138 legislative seats are held by women received national media attention earlier this year, Babbage said. He added that the number could increase by one because a woman is a candidate for the unexpired term in House of Representatives district 26. A special election for that term will be held in conjunction with the regular election on November 2.

Two of the three candidates for the remainder of the unexpired term of women hold office and more will," Babbage said. "Certainly more should."



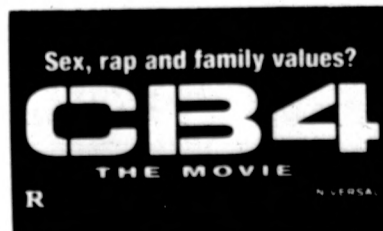
