## Council names new principal

### Veteran educator takes post

Jim Sloan of Mayfield has been named as Southwest Elementary's new principal.

The announcement was made late Friday by members of the school's site-based council.

"He exhibited the leadership qualities I feel will benefit our school," said council member Sherry Monroe. "He is very knowledgeable about the Kentucky Education Reform Act and about fourth grade writing and math portfolios."

Sloan has been a teacher at Reidland Middle School for 26 years. He has taught science, mathematics, technology, computer literacy and journalism.

A 1968 graduate of Murray State University, Sloan is a native of Marshall County. He is married to the former Debbie Cooper, a Calloway County native who teaches fifth and sixth grade social studies at Carr Elementary in Fulton.

Sloan's son, Greg, is the owner of Baskin Robbins in Murray. "The Calloway County School System is known for its progressive efforts to provide a quality education experience for the students of this county and I am honored to become a part of this system," Sloan said.

Council members have been working since June to find a replacement for former principal Kent Barnes who accepted the superintendent's position in Greenup County.

"We had a number of applicants and we are convinced that we made the right decision as a group," said interim chairman Donna Harris.

Parents are urged to attend the Back to School Nights to meet with Sloan and talk with him about his plans for the school year.

Back to School Night for primary students is Aug. 15 at 6 p.m. and Aug. 16 at 5:30 p.m. for intermediate students.

"The faculty, staff and parents have established goals for the

upcoming school year," Sloan said. "It is my desire as principal to provide the leadership necessary to fulfill these goals in doing what is in the best interest of the students."

"I am committed to using my time, knowledge and abilities to assist in the process to meet the needs of Southwest Elementary's most precious resource — the children," he said.

Sloan said he plans to contact the faculty and staff and talk with them about the upcoming year.

"I am really glad with the decision that we have made and I look forward to a good year," said council member Diana Jones.

Calloway students will begin the 1994-95 school year with new principals at three of the schools — Cloyd Bumgardner at Calloway Middle School, Patsy Whitesell at East Elementary School and Sloan at Southwest Elementary.

## Fiske replaced as prosecutor

WASHINGTON (AP) — In a dramatic postscript to congressional Whitewater hearings, a federal court is installing a new independent counsel to investigate President Clinton's Whitewater land deal and its aftermath.

Kenneth W. Starr, a top Justice Department official in the Bush administration and a former federal judge, got the job Friday barely after the first round of congressional Whitewater hearings ended. No further hearings have been scheduled.

He replaces Robert Fiske, who had been a special counsel appointed by Attorney General Janet Reno.

"The appointment of Ken Starr probably will set back the timetable for the investigation by several months," said Rusty Hardin, a lawyer working with Fiske. "I think one has to assume that Starr will want to assemble his own staff."

Friday began with a Democratic-led, post-midnight trade in Senate Whitewater hearings against former White House counsel Bernard Nussbaum. He was roundly criticized for failing to keep White House officials and a friend of Clinton distanced from the investigation.

The morning and afternoon

brought a peculiar finale to a week of grueling hearings. A government lawyer told the House Banking Committee that a colleague secretly tape-recorded her talking about the Whitewater investigation.

Bleary-eyed lawmakers resumed the Senate Banking Committee hearing Friday after a few hours' sleep. The current White House counsel, Lloyd N. Cutler, asked lawmakers not to make it impossible for Roger C. Altman to stay on as deputy Treasury secretary.

Altman, an old college friend of Clinton, was the acting chief of the Resolution Trust Corp., the agency that is looking into a failed Arkansas savings and loan tied to the president's Whitewater investment.

Sen. Alfonse D'Amato, R-N.Y., jumped on the Starr announcement, suggesting that the independent counsel investigate whether administration officials committed perjury in their testimony before the banking panel this week.

"I am convinced that certain individuals testifying before the panel were not being truthful," D'Amato said.

## Radio exposes city, university to those passing by

The City of Murray and Murray State University have a new tool to help maximize their marketing capabilities.

A radio tower located near U.S. 62 will enable motorists to tune in to 1540 AM and hear a recorded list of events going on in the community and on the MSU campus.

Steve Zea, executive director of the Murray-Calloway County Chamber of Commerce, said the radio station will give the city and campus added exposure.

The venture is a cooperative effort between the chamber, the Murray Tourism Commission and MSU.

Zea said the idea for the station originated after discussion between the parties indicated they wanted to do something with their money that would produce the most benefits.

"This is something we think will be a long, lasting way to help promote the university, community and the area," he said.

Zea said the state-of-the-art tower, receiver and antenna package was purchased with approximately \$6,500 left over from the city's 1987 fundraising effort to promote retirement in the area.

After raising around \$200,000 for the 1987 campaign, Zea said the chamber budgeted the money and devised a marketing plan.

He said it was decided about a year and a half ago that the remaining \$6,500 should be spent on

something that would continuously attract people to the community.

Other cities including Paducah have similar tourist information stations.

Joe Haynes, MSU's radio and television specialist, will be responsible for programming and main-

taining the station.

Zea said the chamber donated the radio station equipment to MSU with the agreement that the university take on the responsibility of maintaining it.

Zea said the chamber will have virtually no involvement in the project once it is on-line.

"We worked to put this thing together for a year and a half while various things happened to set us back," Haynes said.

"The biggest problem we had was a site problem for the tower," he said.

Joe Belcher, who Haynes called a strong supporter of the university, donated a portion of his land off U.S. 62 near Kentucky Dam for the tower's

## Bell wins state chess tournament

Wayne Bell, of Murray, became the 1994-95 Kentucky State Chess Champion, when he won the state round-robin play-offs in Lexington last weekend.

Bell did not lose a game in the two-day event, winning four games and drawing one.

The state chess championship is determined through a grueling round-robin tournament involving the top six qualifiers in the Commonwealth. Qualification is based on performance in the Kentucky Open tournament and automatically includes the immediate past state champion.

That Bell was included in the year's play-offs required a twist of fate. He had only qualified as an alternate and received a call to play at the last minute when one player dropped out.

"I've played in this tournament

## Juveniles charged with six burglaries

Seven juveniles are facing burglary charges in connection with a rash of break-ins in the New Concord and Hamlin areas, according to the Calloway County Sheriff's Department.

Chief Deputy Brian Wilburn said the youths, ranging in age from 11 to 17, are accused of entering six homes, vandalizing property and stealing items including guns.

"Through our investigation, we followed up on physical evidence and were able to locate one suspect," Wilburn said. "Eventually all other suspects were identified."

The residential burglaries, which have been occurring since June, have been a concern to neighbors in the area, Wilburn said.

"They'd just prowl around on four-wheelers and look for someone," he said.

In one case, Wilburn said bolt cutters were used to gain entry.

He said all of the homes hit are owned by retired out-of-state residents who visit on weekends or during the summer.

Starr, like Fiske a Republican, was chosen by a three-judge panel of the U.S. Court of Appeals in Washington — the court where Starr served as a judge before becoming solicitor general, the government's chief courtroom lawyer, under President Bush.

Fiske was appointed a special counsel last Jan. 20 as an employee of the Justice Department. Reno had wanted an independent counsel to investigate Clinton's business dealings, but the law authorizing the court-appointed counsel had died under the threat of a Republican

filibuster.

Recently passed legislation restored the law. It included a special provision that would have allowed Fiske to get the job and continue the investigation he was conducting with about a dozen lawyers and 20 FBI agents.

But the court chose not to use the exception, sticking with the traditional prohibition that prevented a government employee from becoming an independent counsel.

Reno said in Kansas City, Mo., "I pointed out in the beginning that if I appointed a special counsel there would be a problem with people wondering whether he was impartial. Now the statute can operate as it was intended to."

In a statement, Fiske said he wished Starr "the very best and will do everything I can to help him with a speedy and orderly transition."

three other times, I only won a total of four games out of the 15.

"This time, I didn't get a chance to practice or prepare and I went in and played the best chess I've ever played," Bell said.

Bell's first round win was again fellow Murrayan Mark Galloway, and he went on to defeat current state champion Billy Woodward of Lexington and Robert Faust, 1992 state champion from Louisville in first day play. On the second day, he defeated Danny Kinkade of Bowling Green, avenging an earlier loss in the Kentucky Open, and in the final match played to a three and one half hour draw against Jerry Baker, Lexington.

In talking about his style of play for the tournament, Bell described what he considered to be a major change in the way he approached each game.

"For the past 15 years, I've always used an aggressive, wide-open style of play. After teaching with Gregory Kaidanov (Kentucky's only resident chess Grandmaster) the past two years in the Murray Chess Camp, I decided to play the way we've been teaching," said Bell.

Kaidanov's summary of positional play in tournament chess is: "You must put your pieces in good places and get your opponent to put his pieces in bad places." Bell's deliberate, patient play in this tournament allowed him to gain a slight advantage by the middle game and carry it to the end and victory.

Bell, professor of mathematics at Murray State University, is best known for his abilities as a chess organizer and chess coach. He is the current president of the Kentucky Chess Association and has been selected by the U.S. Chess Federation to direct the 1995 National Elementary Chess Championships in Little Rock next spring.

As a chess coach for the Murray City Schools and the MSU Chess Club, he has produced nine state scholastic team championships over

the past eight years and has coached eight scholastic individual champions in the same period. At the national levels, his scholastic teams have finished in the top five nationally the past four years, taking second place in the National JHS Tournament this past spring. He is instructor and co-organizer of the summer Kaidanov Chess Camp at Murray State University.

He has won many tournaments over his 30 years of chess competition, but this is his first state championship.

"I've watched my students win state titles. So I know something about the excitement of being a state winner; but I've never known what it is to be the State Champion. It's a great feeling. I might like to do this again," he said.

"It was like a little organized group," Wilburn said, adding that the juveniles watched homes and only entered those whose owners were not permanent residents.

While inside, the juveniles spray-painted walls, dumped food on the floor and broke furniture. "They did hundreds and hundreds of dollars worth of damage," Wilburn said.

He expects additional charges to be filed. An investigation by Sheriff Stan Scott, Cpl. Dennis McDaniel and Wilburn is continuing.

placement.

The first site was chosen, but Haynes said it wound up being on land adjacent to, but not owned by Belcher, which caused Zea and Haynes to search for an alternate site on Belcher's property.

Haynes said all that is lacking now is the placement of six road signs which will tell motorists to tune in.

Two signs will be placed on I-24, two on the Purchase Parkway and two on U.S. 62.

Haynes said the station is technically on-line now, but tourist information will not be aired until the state has erected the signs.

He said he could not predict an exact date when tourist information will begin being aired, since placement of the signs is in another agency's hands.

A phone line will be connected to the tower to allow him to program messages via telephone.

He said the phone line is not

necessary for service, it simply allows him to program it without driving to the site every time he needs to change the message.

Haynes predicts the yearly maintenance to cost around \$450. He said the only expenses will be the cost of the electricity and phone line.

He said the station will promote events such as Racer football and basketball games, art shows, theatre performances and exhibits on display at the Wrather West Kentucky Museum and the

National Scouting Museum.

He said the longest message the station can broadcast is five and a half minutes. Since the signals can be reached from 10 miles on either side of the tower, he said motorists will not have trouble hearing the entire message.

Haynes and Anne Adams, director of the Murray Tourism Commission, will be responsible for determining what events to promote.

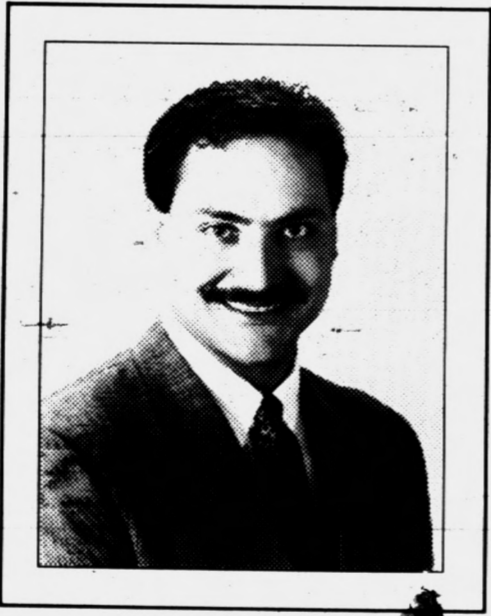

In March 1986, Robert Billington, Jr., son of Bob Billington became affiliated with the agency and became a principal thereof in 1990.



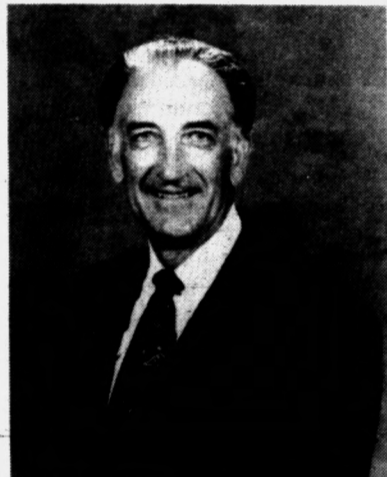

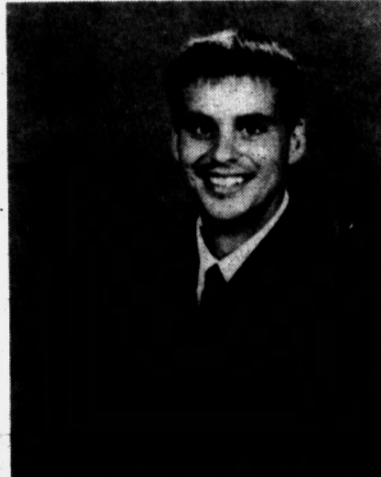

## Bentsen may be forced to make choices as the Whitewater saga continues

WASHINGTON (AP) — The lofty Lloyd Bentsen never answered a quietly insistent question posed by a House Republican: whether the fracas among top Treasury Department officials had compromised his leadership.

That it came up at all, however, reflects an extraordinary week in which Bentsen and his three top aides displayed to congressional Whitewater investigators the survival instincts that brought them this far.

It wasn't pretty.

President Clinton said at his midweek news conference that it was up to Bentsen to resolve "the management questions" raised by the ruckus. The only real question appeared to be who would go and who, if anyone, would stay.

One Republican, Sen. Alfonse D'Amato of New York, compared Deputy Treasury Secretary Roger Altman to "the type of guy that if he's on a sinking ship he throws the women and children over." In this case, that meant Treasury General Counsel Jean Hanson and chief of staff Josh Steiner, a mere 28 years old.

A day earlier, in his marathon 10-hour session before the Senate Banking Committee, Altman had disputed their recollections of White House-Treasury contacts on the federal Whitewater probe.

"I can understand why he would want to blame me for things, but I won't return the favor," Hanson said later when asked if she'd been hung out to dry.

Fate and connections brought together the trio of aides now fighting to preserve their jobs and reputations, along with the secretary trying to stay above it all.

Altman knew Clinton from college. Steiner was friendly with senior White House adviser George Stephanopoulos and other administration aides from having worked on the 1988 Dukakis-Bentsen campaign. Hanson, a Minnesota native, worked at a New York law firm and had no political background. Bentsen knew none of them well.

The former Texas senator had made one critical personnel decision — to promote Steiner from Altman's assistant to departmental chief of staff earlier this year. But his Capitol Hill colleagues were not inclined to hold that or anything else against him.

There have been "outbursts demanding resignation" of other witnesses, House Banking Committee Chairman Henry Gonzalez said Thursday. "I'm glad nobody has demanded that in this case," he added, smiling at the absurdity of the idea.

Which leaves Altman, Hanson and Steiner as potential scapegoats.

All three have been thoroughly beaten up by Congress, in addition to beating up on each other.

Steiner insisted through a long, sweaty day that he hadn't really meant what he wrote in his diary about torture, agony and disaster in connection with White House pressure on Whitewater. Impatient senators called him evasive and uncooperative.

Altman denied two of Steiner's more colorful descriptions of situations involving him. Stephanopoulos said he couldn't recall an inflammatory remark attributed to him and angrily refused a senator's request that he read the passage aloud.

Senators of both parties remain incensed over Altman's February testimony suggesting there was only one Treasury-White House discussion of Whitewater (the latest estimate is there were 40).

They scored Hanson for failing to correct the record promptly or fully, though she knew at the time the testimony was misleading. Altman blamed her for that too; he also contradicted her claim that he instructed her to notify senior White House officials of the Whitewater probe.

White House staff secretary John Podesta told senators Thursday that immediately after Altman's flawed testimony, he had prodded Altman without success to fully correct the record.

Altman's central role and the calls for his resignation, however, may be offset by a White House patron anxious for him to stay on.

Clinton set the tone with measured but supportive comments at his Wednesday news conference. The next day senior White House economic aide Robert Rubin said he would vouch for his 20-year friend on "absolutely anything."

Bentsen also thawed. "I find him a very intelligent, hard-working man and I believe in his integrity," he told House members.

It was a rare departure from his neutral principle. He had just told lawmakers he supported not only Altman's accounts of various Whitewater developments, but also Hanson's conflicting recollections of the same events. "These are two very busy people," Bentsen said by way of explanation.

At some point he may be forced to choose between them.

## It wasn't supposed to be this way

WASHINGTON (AP) — This wasn't in the game plan, this deadline drive to overhaul health care during the last 100 days before the voters choose a new Congress. Not on President Clinton's signature proposal, the one he planned to put on congressional desks in his first 100 days.

It took nine months instead, and now, after nine more, Clinton's own bill, drafted under his wife's supervision, is gone, supplanted by differing House and Senate proposals.

"The plan I originally proposed has been changed and much of it for the better," Clinton said Wednesday night. "The proposals before Congress are less bureaucratic. They're more flexible."

They're also more limited, particularly the bill drawn up for Sen. George Mitchell, the majority leader, aimed at getting 95 percent of the American people covered by health insurance by the year 2000. "This is the best I can do," Mitchell said.

And Clinton said it's good enough for him. He brandished a veto pen at Congress early this year, saying he would reject a health care bill providing less than universal coverage. He said the Mitchell bill meets his objective, "and I would sign it."

Mitchell didn't claim that his bill was for universal coverage, calling it a milestone on the way. House Democrats have a version of their own, to get to universal coverage in 1999, a year later than the original Clinton bill. The

president wouldn't choose between them, saying he wouldn't try to be a legislator. "My job is to try to keep the American people's eye on the ball and to try to keep the members of Congress working together," he said.

That might have been more productive sooner. The health care task force Hillary Rodham Clinton ran was superimposed on a drafting process that was going to wind up at the Capitol anyhow.

In a way, the tortuous path on health care reform fits the pattern of the Clinton presidency so far, as does Mitchell's observation on his embattled proposal:

"No one ever said it would be easy."

Clinton has had a succession of mini-campaigns and strategies in the quest for health care reform. In one way, it worked. "I think the president deserves enormous credit for having put health care reform at the top of the national agenda," said House Speaker Thomas S. Foley. "It wouldn't have happened without him." Even Republicans who oppose the Democratic version of reform

agree on that point.

The president said there is now a consensus in the country for universal health care. The idea is widely supported in public opinion polls, as were other Clinton aims. But those same polls showed majorities opposed when the question was yes or no on the Clinton bill.

Clinton began his prime time news conference Wednesday by boasting of the economic upturn, the new jobs, lower deficits, trade expansion and other achievements of his administration. At the White House, they don't think he's getting proper credit for what's going right, and wasn't, even before the current congressional hearings on Whitewater became a troubling distraction.

The president's job approval ratings have been slumping;

asked why, he said he wasn't the best judge. "Maybe I'm just not as good a talker as you folks thought I was when I got elected president," he said. "Maybe there's so much going on it's hard for anything specific to get through. Maybe it's partly a function of the times in which we live."

But there's no maybe about the problem, heading into the campaign for the Nov. 8 congressional elections, when health care will be an issue as Democrats try to cut the losses that are almost inevitable for the president's party.

There was a touch of the campaign to come as Clinton said Republicans ought to be answering the health care questions now, because they are the ones balking at bipartisan action.

Clinton said the House and Senate should pass the health care bill they can best explain back home as a solution to a national problem.

"We listened to the American people, all of us did," Clinton said in conceding two weeks ago that his original plan was a goner.

But what people want done depends on who is describing it. "I don't think the American people will tolerate inordinate delay and irresponsible legislative gymnastics," Sen. Edward M. Kennedy, D-Mass., said when Republicans said the Senate should take its time on health care.

"No bill is better than a bad bill," said Sen. Bob Dole, the GOP leader. "I think that's where the American people are."

## Fredericksburg trip enlightening

Much as I love studying the Civil War, it never really struck me how much of it was fought almost within earshot of Washington.

No wonder the Union kept switching leaders so often: Lee was virtually in their backyard the whole time. A little luck in following up one of his victories, at 1st or 2nd Manassas or Chancellorsville or Fredericksburg, and Washington could have fallen.

That sense of "how close it came to being otherwise" struck me for the first time last month when, driving south from Washington on I-95, we detoured at the Fredericksburg exit.

It was one of those random off-ramp veers that turns off ever so often to have been a happy call.

We followed old U.S. 1 into Fredericksburg and instantly picked up a well-designed sign system for touring the battlefield by car, starting at the old federal cemetery and national tourist center in the middle of the old Confederate battleline up the hill overlooking the river and just west of the town itself.

It was early Sunday morning, and except for a few bikers and joggers, we had the whole park road to ourselves. Most of it led through thickets and forests with the protective ditches that Longstreet's and Jackson's men had gouged out for themselves still visible, following the serpentine contour of the high

ground they occupied and held.

It had rained the night before, and an eerie fog draped some of the lower spots of the hillsides, clustered like clumps of ghostly brigades from the lines marked for McLaws, Pickett, Hood, Early, and the others.

Down in Fredericksburg itself, the quaint little town, laid out in rectangles with most homes and businesses edging the streets, looks much as it must have looked before Union cannon fire and waves of marauding infantrymen nearly de-

stroyed it that mid-December of 1862. We could see the fields and marshes that Franklin's men tried to cross, on the Union left of town. We could feel the trapped futility of French's, Sturgis's, Hancock's, and Sumner's troops in the town trying desperately and ridiculously to charge up Marye's Heights.

It was probably the greatest slaughter of Union army virtue. Delays gave Lee time to bring up his own men, entrench them tightly on the concealed and protected high

ground, and then to turn them loose to fire at will.

Once Lee was entrenched and ready, it was madness for Burnside to insist on fighting the battle. There were 12,653 Union casualties in that battle. Most fell in front of the stone wall on the hillside just above the town.

The lopsided victory contributed to the myth of Lee and his men. After Fredericksburg, who would deny that they were skilled, lucky, victorious—and maybe even God-anointed? No wonder they felt invulnerable when their own turn to charge futilely as their northern opponents had at Fredericksburg came at Gettysburg six months later.

The overwhelming one-sided victory of the South filled its men with faith in their own powers and filled the patriots and politicians and papers at home with optimism and new resolve. Ironically, it was faith triggered by this fluke of a victory which fueled the South into further sacrifice which brought it hardships unimaginable. After Fredericksburg and Chancellorsville, the southern sun began to set more visibly and rapidly.

Except for a raid later in the War that brought General Early and his men into the city limits of Washington, the South would never again get that near to taking Washington.

There are two basic rules that apply when you're considering whether to double the opponents for penalties at a high-level contract.

The first is that you should expect to beat the contract at least two tricks; it is usually bad policy to double when you expect only a one-trick set.

The second rule is that you shouldn't double when by doing so you reveal so much about the nature of your hand that it helps declarer to make the contract.

West's two club bid was conven-

tional and indicated good support for both majors; his later double of six clubs, though tempting, was questionable and eventually proved fatal.

Declarer won the heart lead with the ace and concluded that West, for his double, almost surely had all three missing trumps. In line with that thought, South decided that his only real chance for the slam depended on a successful endplay in trumps.

Accordingly, South ruffed a heart in dummy at trick two, cashed the A-K of spades, discarding two diamonds, then ruffed a spade, a heart, a spade, a heart and another spade to produce this position:

North ♦ A 5 ♦ 10 8  
South ♦ K 6 ♦ A Q  
West ♦ 8 ♦ K J 5  
East ♦ Q J 10 9

Declarer now played the A-K of diamonds, forcing West to ruff the second diamond and lead from his K-J of trumps into South's A-Q. South thus made six clubs doubled for a score of 1,740 points on a hand where, if West had not doubled and alerted declarer to the 3-0 trump division, the slam would almost surely have gone down one.

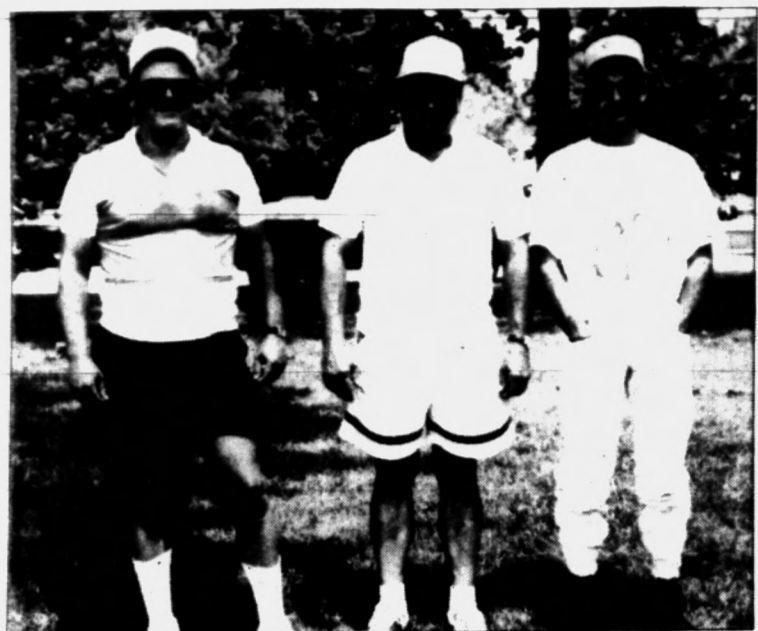

Later on in the week, the conditions improved and the current kept sweeping baitfish down to the waiting strippers. Mike, Joe and Bruce Lynch brought Garrett over to take advantage of this good fortune.

We threw roostertail spinners and slab spoons over the channel banks and cranked in some big fat stripes. One location proved to be the best when we hit a school of largemouth and smallmouth bass mixed in with the whites.

Joe caught a smallie about three pounds and it set him on fire for awhile.

Garrett did a super job after I put some line on his reel. He kept the boys in the other boats wary because

with the extra line he could cast farther. Several times he splashed a lure within a foot or two but he caught fish after learning the technique.

Kent Chappell brought his grandson down and we caught a limit of stripes on the very next day. Jeremy really enjoyed the fight the fish put up when hooked.

Kent reeled a good fish in and was about to lift it into the boat when he yelled for me to look at this fish. A huge largemouth bass had struck the stripe and was trying to swallow it! Kent was doing a figure eight and the big bass kept after its prey until it was almost dead. The stripe could barely wiggle now and

the big bass seemed to lose interest and just spit it out and swam away! It was a big one.

I went another day with Drs. Leon and Bill Striegel and seven and a half year old Tim "Big Fish".

We basically did the same thing as before and relied completely on the amount of current we had to bring the fish up to us.

They were working early chasing shad and striking hard on our lures. Tim earned the title "Big Fish" because of the outstanding size and quantity of strippers he caught while standing beside my seat up front. Lots of times it took both of us to bring the fish in and get it into the cooler.

"Big Fish" gave out around 10 a.m., but he did a super job and Granmother Striegel bought him a hat which says he is the "World's Greatest Fisherman" as further reward. I feel sure we will join forces again!

A huge mayfly hatch over much of the lake has brought the bluegill up to get full of the tender morsels. Almost anything cast in their vicinity will get you some action. Happy Fishing!

## 'Iron Mike' Hall of Famer Ditka to lecture in Murray

Ditka. The name is synonymous with football.

Mike Ditka, who led the Chicago Bears to a 1985 Super Bowl victory, will be in Murray Sept. 22 for a lecture sponsored by the Murray State University Center Board.

The 7:30 p.m. lecture titled "Attitude, Character and Enthusiasm" will be held in the Calloway County gymnasium. Originally scheduled for Lovett Auditorium on the MSU campus, the location had to be changed after Lovett received smoke and water damage from a fire in the adjacent fine arts complex.

Ditka's National Football League career began in 1961 when the Bears made him their first-round selection from the University of Pittsburgh. His impact was immediate and was named NFL Rookie of the Year. He played five more seasons with the Bears, earning a Pro Bowl trip each year, before being traded to Philadelphia in 1967.

After two years with the Philadelphia Eagles, he played four more years in Dallas, where he caught a touchdown pass in the Cowboys' 24-3 win over the Dolphins in Super Bowl VI.

He retired from playing following the 1972 season, but was hired by Cowboys' head coach Tom Landry as an offensive assistant and special teams coach. In his nine seasons the Cowboys were in the playoffs eight times, won six division titles, three NFC championships and the NFL

crowd following the 1977 campaign.

Prior to the 1982 season, Ditka signed on as head coach of the Chicago Bears, taking over a team that had just two winning seasons in the previous 19 years.

During his 10-year tenure as head coach, Ditka led the Bears to six NFC Central titles, three additional appearances in the NFC title game (each time, their opponents went on to win the Super Bowl), and a Super Bowl victory in 1985.

He was named coach of the year in 1985 and 1988 by "The Sporting News," Associated Press and pro football writers.

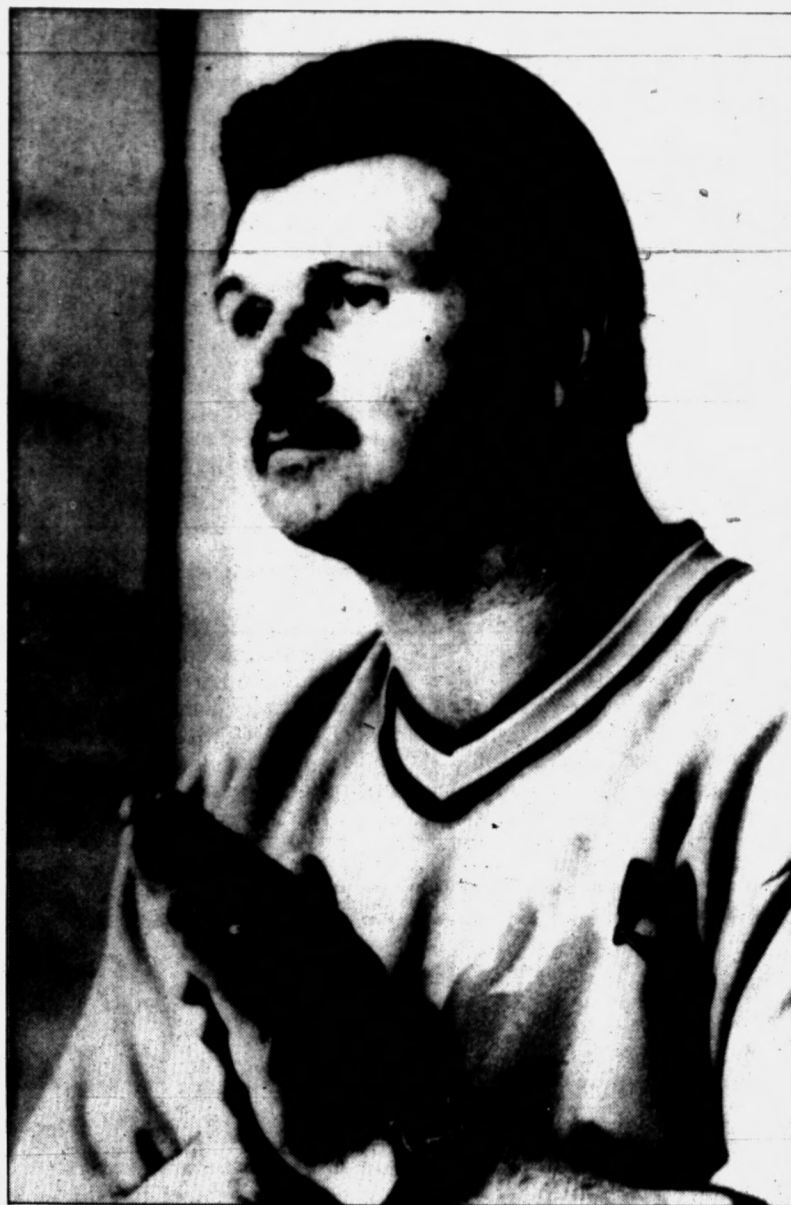
Ditka is one of only two men to have won a Super Bowl as a player, assistant coach and head coach.

He retired after the 1992 season, and now serves as an NFL analyst on NBC's Sunday NFL news and highlight show, "NFL Live."

In 1988 he was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame.

Born Oct. 18, 1939, in Carnegie, Pa., Ditka was a three-sport star at Aliquippa High School, playing basketball, baseball and football. He enrolled at Pitt and was an all-America as a senior in 1960.

## Buddy kicks off Cardinals tenure with 17-7 victory

Buddy Ryan got what he wanted out of his defense, which gave the Arizona Cardinals what they wanted — a victory over the San Francisco 49ers.

The Cardinal defense came up with six turnovers, including three interceptions by linemen, in handing San Francisco only its second loss in 16 exhibition games dating back to the 1991 season.

"That's Buddy's way of doing things," said Clyde Simmons, who returned an interception for a touchdown early in the second quarter and picked off another pass minutes later in Arizona's 17-7 victory. "He wants the defense to deliver the ball to the offense."

"Our first team looked pretty good, but you can't believe how stupid our second team was," said Ryan, who was making his debut as Cardinals coach.

Besides Simmons' two thefts, reserve linebackers Garth Jax and David Merritt recovered fumbles, rookie Perry Carter stopped a late San Francisco drive with a pick-off on the 4-yard line, and Lennie Jenkins, another lineman, inter-

cepted Bill Musgrave's pass on the Arizona 35 in the final minutes.

"We obviously didn't execute," 49ers coach George Seifert said.

In other exhibition games Friday night, Detroit defeated the New York Jets 26-13, Indianapolis stopped Seattle 13-9, Chicago downed Philadelphia 12-6 and New England battered New Orleans 24-6.

Today, the Los Angeles Rams played Green Bay at Madison, Wis. Tonight's games will have Pittsburgh at Miami, Cincinnati at Tampa Bay, Cleveland at the New York Giants, Houston vs. San Diego at San Antonio, Atlanta at Denver and Kansas City vs. Minnesota at Tokyo.

**Colts 13, Seahawks 9**  
In Indianapolis, rookie running back Marshall Faulk set up two first-half field goals and Leonard Humphries returned an interception 52 yards in the fourth quarter for a touchdown to power Indianapolis.

Faulk, the second player taken in the NFL draft, rushed for 38 yards on 15 carries before sitting out the second half.

## McGriff hits No. 30

CINCINNATI (AP) — Fred McGriff trotted out his 30th homer without a hint it was something very special. His peers would expect nothing less.

McGriff joined the ranks of Aaron, Ruth, Gehrig and Mantle on Friday night with the most meaningful homer in a game full of them. His two-run homer broke open a close game and led the Atlanta Braves to a 16-6 drubbing of the Cincinnati Reds.

McGriff became only the ninth major leaguer to hit 30 homers in seven consecutive seasons when he connected in the sixth off

Johnny Ruffin. The homer underscored his consistency, while his trot illuminated his character.

And he does it with a consistency rarely matched. The other eight players with 30 homers in seven or more consecutive seasons: Jimmie Foxx (12 straight years); Lou Gehrig, Ed Matheus and Mike Schmidt (9); Mickey Mantle (8); Babe Ruth, Hank Aaron and Ralph Kiner (7).

## Lynchburg to sell 'Jack' for first time since 1909

LYNCHBURG, Tenn. (AP) — What a great idea, visitors to Jack Daniel's said Friday when learning a referendum had been passed to let souvenir bottles of the whiskey be sold at the distillery.

And what a shame the sale can't start until Jan. 2.

"We were going to take some for souvenirs," Carla Doyle of Valrico, Fla., said from the national historic site 90 miles south of Nashville.

"We have some friends who really would have enjoyed it," Jack Daniel's hasn't been drunk — legally — on site since Tennessee signed on to Prohibition in 1909. The nation repealed its vow of abstinence in 1933 with the 21st Amendment to the U.S. Constitution.

But tiny Moore County has remained dry, a fact that never fails to strike visitors' curiosity, said distillery manager Roger Brashears.

"Drinking is not and has never been allowed at the distillery," said Brashears. "It's not against the law to drink whiskey in a dry county. It's just against the law to buy it or sell it."

That may be the law, but it "doesn't make sense," said Bill Crawford from nearby Manchester. He often brings out of town visitors by to see huge wooden casks in the Barrel House.

The casks hold the charcoal that give Jack Daniel's its distinctive flavor, and are a centerpiece of the laid-back, country porch approach marketing plan carefully crafted for the 128-year-old distillery.

"I think it's great," said Robin Jechura of Tullahoma, Tenn.

Moore Countians voted 842-541 on Monday to allow this small crack in its liquor law.

Because they are getting married in a non-Catholic service, we have decided to invite only the immediate family from our side of the family. Brad will have more relatives attending the wedding. His family even helped them move in together! (My husband and I refused to help them move. Our religious beliefs do not condone this sinful living-together business.)

DEAR MOTHER: Don't thank me — that's what I'm here for. However, perhaps had you shared your views with your daughter while she was maturing, you would not have had to deal with this "living-together business." And while we're on the subject of religion and weddings, read on...

DEAR ABBY: I am very much in love with a girl I have been going with for nearly two years, but my parents are trying to break us up because we are of different religions.

I don't think they have any right to object, because they don't practice their own religion and rarely go to church themselves.

My girlfriend is devout in her faith, but I am not the churchgoing type. I know that our love is strong enough to make a go of our marriage, even with the religious difference. Do you think my parents are being fair?

DEAR IN LOVE: Parents who do not practice their own religion should not be surprised when their children decide to marry out of their faith. It may sound trite and corny, but the family that prays together usually stays together.

DR. GOTT

DEAR DR. GOTT: My 5-year-old son has recently started feeling the need to urinate every half hour and sometimes more during waking hours. Urinalysis didn't reveal infection, and his pediatrician feels he will outgrow the habit. In the meantime, he's taking Ditropan to desensitize the bladder. Are there further tests I should have run by a specialist or is the pediatrician on the right track?

DEAR READER: Some children do develop bladder spasms that lead to frequent urination. The cause of this is unknown, but Ditropan is appropriate medication for the problem.

If, within a few weeks, your son's symptom has not improved significantly or disappeared, request a referral to a urologist because, in some cases, urinary infections may not be evident during routine urine testing.

Also, some children with urinary frequency suffer from inherited malformations of the urinary system, which can only be diagnosed by X-rays and other special tests.

Finally, make sure that the pediatrician checked your son's urinary sugar. Diabetes, a common disorder, often causes frequent urination.

DEAR DR. GOTT: I read your recent article on restless leg syndrome and feel I may have an answer for other sufferers — vitamin C tablets. One or two of these provide relief every time for me. Is there a placebo effect or does this remedy really work?

DEAR READER: The cause of restless legs is unknown, but the affliction can be a torment for unfortunate victims who experience uncontrollable twitching and uneasiness in their legs night after night.

Since I mentioned this condition in a previous column, I have received scores of letters from interested readers, who suggested a variety of "cures," including sleeping alone, using sweat pants at night, taking calcium pills, eating bananas or yogurt, avoiding caffeine-containing soda, using quinine tablets or aspirin, taking various prescription drugs and an over-the-counter compound called Legatrin.

All I can say is that true restless legs syndrome doesn't respond to most of these antidotes. (Nocturnal leg cramps, a separate condition, may, however.) Most experts still recommend Elavil (an anti-depressant) with or without Sinemet (a drug used to treat Parkinson's disease). Nonetheless, if something as simple as vitamin C works for you, go with it.

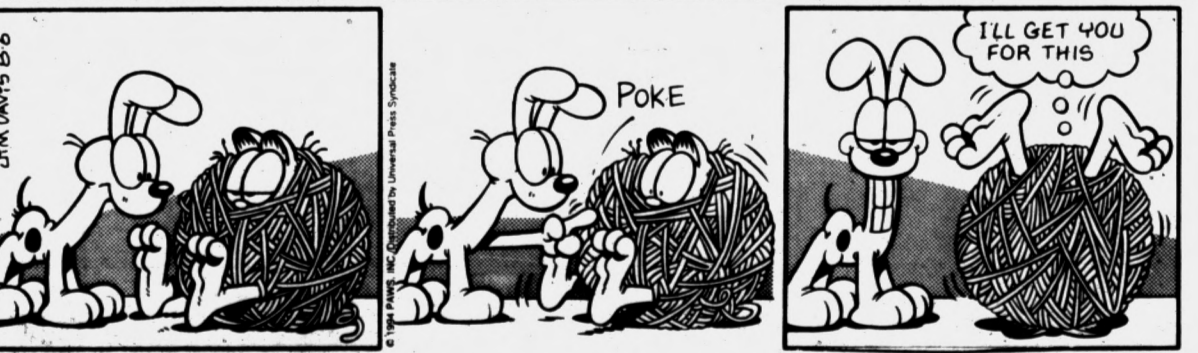

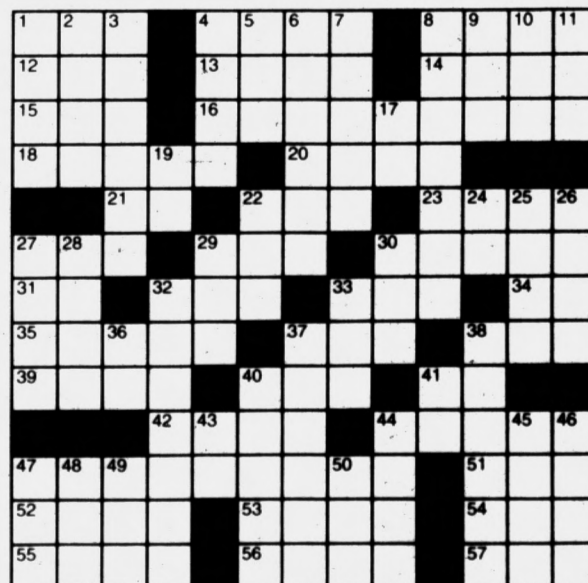

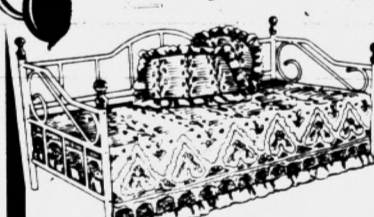
