## Barnett goes on trial

More than a year after his arrest, Billy Barnett Jr. will go to trial for the murder of Roger Dale Jones.

Barnett, 26, has been in custody since his Sept. 16, 1993 arrest. The trial begins Monday in Marshall County Circuit Court.

Proceedings were moved from Calloway County after Circuit Judge David Buckingham ruled that extensive pre-trial publicity would prohibit Barnett from receiving a fair trial.

Commonwealth's Attorney Mike Ward has subpoenaed 11 witnesses thus far to testify in the case.

According to court documents, Kristi Farris Robinson and Barnett's half-brother, James Ray Barnett, are among those scheduled to testify.

As part of a plea agreement, James Barnett, 22, pleaded guilty to hindering prosecution, a Class D felony, Friday in Marshall Circuit Court and will testify against his half-brother at next week's trial. (See related story).

According to a police investigation, Billy Barnett allegedly killed Jones, moved the body to Tennessee and later brought the skull back to Calloway County. Jones, of Hazel, was reported missing May 28, 1993.

A skull that has been identified as Jones' was found July 14, 1993 in Shady Oaks Mobile Home Park.

Squirrel hunters discovered human remains and a wallet containing Jones' driver's license Sept. 6, 1993 in a remote area of Land Between the Lakes in Stewart County, Tenn.

A University of Tennessee forensic anthropologist, who is scheduled to testify at the trial, identified the skeletal remains and the skull as those of Jones.

Meanwhile, Ward and public defender Leah Cooper, who replaced public defender Dennis Lortie, are preparing for Monday's trial. A number of motions were discussed Friday in Marshall County.

Cooper said Friday afternoon that she plans to call many of the same witnesses the Commonwealth has scheduled to appear.

## Half-brother pleads guilty to hindering prosecution's case

Billy Barnett Jr.'s half-brother is expected to testify against him in a murder trial scheduled to begin Monday in Marshall County Circuit Court.

James Barnett, 22, was arrested Sept. 16, 1993 in connection with the murder of Roger Dale Jones, the 20-year-old Hazel man who was reported missing May 28, 1993.

Barnett of Almo pleaded guilty to hindering prosecution, a Class D felony, Friday in Marshall Circuit Court. Pursuant to a plea agreement, charges of tampering with evidence were dismissed contingent upon Barnett's testimony at the murder trial.

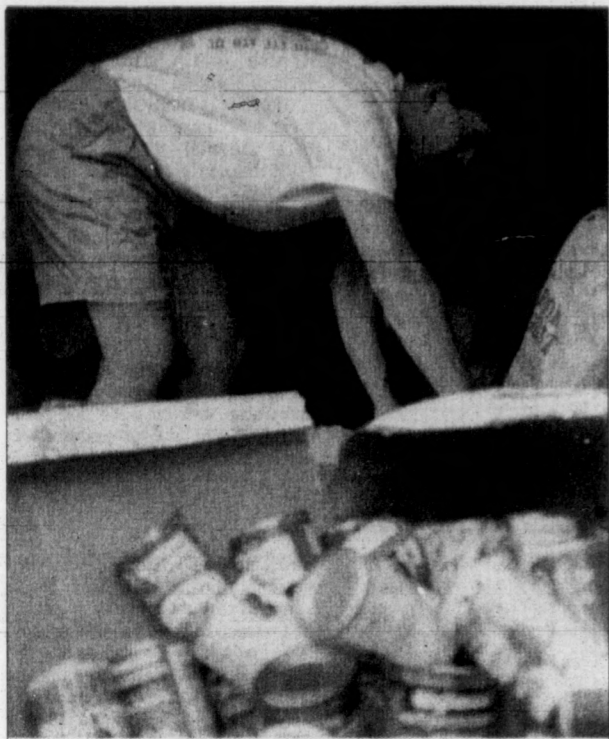
Both attorneys expect the trial to last about three days.

Barnett will face a second trial that will be set at a later date on a charge that he tampered with evidence in connection with the

Jones murder by moving the skull.

Originally, Barnett was to be tried for both the murder and tampering with evidence.

## Two Calloway School Board seats contested

Editor's note: the city school board race will be profiled in Monday's edition.

When voters head to the polls Tuesday, they will get the opportunity to select school board representatives, as well as state and federal representatives.

Of the three Calloway County School Board seats that will be on the ballot, only two are contested. John W. Nix representing district four is unopposed.

Nix was appointed to the county board last October to fill the

position of Garry Evans, who resigned because of residency issues.

Although his term has not expired, his seat was placed on the ballot because the appointment was valid only until the next election.

He will serve a two-year term. The other two seats are for four-year terms.

Candidates in the contested

positions were asked questions pertaining to experience and important issues they think the board will have to face.

Vying for the district one seat on the county board are Robbie Hale (incumbent) and Tim Stone.

Hale, of Rt. 1 Hazel, began serving on the board in October 1993 when he was appointed to fill the term held by Ray Dunn, who resigned because of residency issues.

"I really enjoy being on the board because I am interested in the school system," she said. "One of the main things I am interested in is seeing the alternative education program take off. We need it desperately and it would really be an asset."

Hale has been a volunteer in the school system for more than 13 years and has served on the high school's site-based council, as well as several other

organizations.

"KERA is still an issue that we have to deal with, as well as getting technology in the schools," Hale said. "I would also like to see the school district pull together into more of a unit. I would also like to see the volunteer program get kicked off at the high school."

Stone, 1718 Oak Hill Drive, had also applied for Dunn's position last year. An employee of

Myer's Lumber Co., he has been with the Calloway County Sheriff's Department since 1985.

"I have always wanted to help the county and I have always been interested in the school system," Stone said. "I have dealt with budgets and people in various situations. I think that experience would help me as a school board member."

Stone said he thinks action needs to be taken to solve the problems caused by having weapons at school, as well as making sure money goes directly to the

## Boy Scouts donate car project

Gifts to the National Scouting Museum are not unusual. They have received original Norman Rockwell artwork, as well as a variety of Scouting memorabilia. However, a recent gift of an automobile is a first for the museum located on the campus of Murray State University.

The bright red Geo Storm convertible is actually a Scout-related item. It's the creative work of Boy Scout Explorer Post 1870 in Warren, Mich. Students gain hands-on experience through the 18 Explorer posts jointly chartered to General Motors and United Auto Workers Local 160, an engineering and skill trades union, with 3,000 members at the General Motors Technical Center in the Detroit suburb.

Explorers are offered experiences ranging from working in computers, drafting, welding and model-making, to the complete manufacturing of automobiles, according to Tom Ellis, metal model maker for GM and coordinator of Exploring programs at the company's Technical Center.

The program encourages the

Explorers to take a step in the direction of their future," Ellis said.

Workers at the Technical Center build test vehicles, not intended to be used for sale. The building and tearing down of these vehicles results in enormous scrap materials, Ellis said.

GM Explorer posts have set up a program which enables student Explorers to come in and literally create a vehicle from scratch, pulling materials from the scrap pile to use. Restrictions are few, as these blooming engineers have access to virtually any type of vehicle parts

needed, and the freedom to make adjustments as necessary.

"If the Explorers change their mind or mess up during production, they can just throw it away and start all over," said Ellis.

Emerging as a by-product of this unique program, an Explorer group in 1991 created a Geo Storm convertible. According to Ellis, the convertible immediately captivated its viewers.

"The car reflected exactly what the youth wanted in a car, and who could be better to design a car for the young than these Explorers."

On Tuesday, Nov. 8, Ellis will represent the Explorer Post, General Motors and the UAW Local 160 at ceremonies at the National Scouting Museum in Murray. The keys to the Storm convertible will be turned over to Justin Rouse of the National Scouting Museum's Explorer post 762.

"For a time, the National Scouting Museum plans on using the Geo Storm to represent the museum in some of Murray's parades," said Mark Hunt, manager of the Scouting Museum.

## Judge closes Hubbard hearing

WASHINGTON (AP) — A court hearing to determine whether former Rep. Carroll Hubbard of Kentucky deserves leniency in his sentence in a corruption case was held behind closed doors because of the judge's concern that innocent people "might be unfairly mentioned."

Hubbard, a Democrat who represented western Kentucky's 1st District for 18 years, pleaded guilty in April to three felonies that under federal sentencing guidelines could bring a prison sentence of 33 to 41 months.

He asked for a more lenient sentence on grounds that he cooperated with an ongoing government investigation. Prosecutors, however, have argued that some of the leads Hubbard gave them led nowhere and that it "has evidence that defendant has not cooperated fully and truthfully."

Senior U.S. District Judge Louis Oberdorfer said that in the course of Friday's hearing investigations that had not panned out might be disclosed. He said the proceedings in his chambers

would become public when a sanitized transcript is released, probably next week.

A lawyer for The Courier-Journal of Louisville argued against the closed hearing.

Hubbard was engulfed by a scandal involving overdrafts at the House bank and was upset by Tom Barlow in the 1992 primary. Barlow went on to win the general election that year.

# Police say woman's world was crashing before murders

UNION, S.C. (AP) — Susan Smith's new boyfriend was leaving her because he wasn't ready to be a father to her two boys. She was divorcing her husband after accusing him of cheating on her.

"Her whole world was crashing," a law enforcement source said Friday, speaking on condition of anonymity. "She caught her husband in adultery. She was having a relationship with another guy and he was breaking it off. He had told her he wasn't ready for a ready-made family."

Then, police say, Mrs. Smith sent her car plunging into a murky lake with 3-year-old Michael and 14-month-old Alex strapped into their safety seats. She concocted a story of a

carjack-kidnapping, but confessed after nine days of tearful on-camera pleas for the boys' safe return, police say.

A memorial wreath and bouquets of flowers were left at the lake's edge Friday.

New prayers went out Friday night for the family and for a community coping with "a lot of broken hearts," as Mayor Burton Williamson Sr. described the town during a memorial service.

"Those children will always be part of all of us," said the Rev. A.L. Brackett, one of several ministers who spoke at the service designed for mourning and racial reconciliation. Mrs. Smith, who is white, had claimed a black man abducted the children.

Funerals for the boys will be held Sunday.

Earlier Friday, the 23-year-old secretary ducked low in the back seat of a sheriff's car that delivered her to the courthouse through a hostile, jeering crowd. Police held back a crowd of about 100 people that surged forward as Mrs. Smith appeared.

"Hold your head up! You're a baby murderer!" one woman shouted as others yelled obscenities.

"She deserves the same thing that happened to those two kids," said Sarah Sims.

Mrs. Smith's lawyer waived a bail hearing for the murder charges and she never appeared in court. She was taken to a prison near Columbia to be held in isolation for her safety, a spokeswoman said.

Prosecutor Thomas Pope said he may seek the death penalty.

Mrs. Smith's lawyer, David Bruck, would not discuss a possible defense strategy or other aspects of the case. All he would say about Mrs. Smith was that "she is heartbroken."

Mrs. Smith's confession led authorities to her burgundy 1990 Mazda submerged in John D. Long Lake, and the bodies were found in the back seat, investigators said. Divers had unsuccessfully searched the lake before.

An autopsy indicated the boys

were alive when the car plunged into the water on Oct. 25, Sheriff Howard Wells said.

Tom Findlay, 27, said in a statement that he broke off his relationship with Mrs. Smith on Oct. 18.

"I was not ready to assume the important responsibilities of being a father," he said, adding that there were other problems.

"At no time did I suggest ... that her children were the only obstacle in any potential relationship with her."

He and Mrs. Smith worked at Conso Products, where Findlay was a graphic artist. Findlay is not a suspect, but authorities were suspicious of Mrs. Smith almost from the beginning because of inconsistencies in her story, the law enforcement source

said.

Mrs. Smith claimed the carjacking happened at a red light with no other cars around — but the light could only be triggered to red by another car. She also told police she had been at a Wal-Mart in the hours before the abduction, then said she was out driving, the source said.

During the investigation, the sheriff had tried to dampen speculation that Mrs. Smith was the culprit. Sources speaking on condition of anonymity said police feared she would commit suicide and take the secret of the children's whereabouts to her grave.

The Greenville News reported today that Mrs. Smith told authorities she was upset about money problems, her failed marriage and a series of relationships

that had gone bad. She told police she contemplated suicide at the edge of the lake, the paper said, citing an unidentified source.

The case bore similarities to a 1989 murder case in Boston in which a white man, Charles Stuart, told police a black man shot his pregnant wife. Stuart later jumped to his death from a bridge as investigators zeroed in on him as the killer.

In Oregon, the case reminded residents of Diane Downs, who claimed in 1983 that a stranger intercepted her car on a lonely country road and shot her and her three children, killing one of the children. Downs, now serving a life sentence, was convicted of trying to kill them because her boyfriend didn't want children.

But since the charges involve separate crimes allegedly committed at different times, Buckingham ruled two trials are necessary.

Friday, Buckingham denied a defense request to admit a polygraph test that Barnett voluntarily took prior to being charged with murder. According to court records, he passed that exam.

Buckingham ruled that polygraph tests are inadmissible in Kentucky courts, but Barnett will be allowed to present evidence concerning the tests as part of his testimony.

However, Cooper argued Friday that the murder indictment should be dismissed because Barnett was told by investigating officer Sheriff Stan Scott that if he passed the polygraph he would not be charged.

Buckingham did not dismiss the murder indictment, but said he would conduct an evidentiary hearing Monday afternoon after the trial begins. That hearing will deal with any statements Scott may have made.

Cooper also asked Buckingham to dismiss the indictment on the grounds that the Commonwealth has not supplied all evidence involved in the investigation.

She said test results on carpet fibers taken from the trunk of Billy Barnett's car have not been produced by the prosecution.

Finally, Cooper argued that the Commonwealth has prohibited two witnesses from talking with her about the case.

She said Scott and Robinson have said they will not discuss the case without the presence of a representative from Ward's office.

Buckingham said that neither witness is required to talk with Cooper, but the Commonwealth cannot prohibit them from doing so.

Barnett has been incarcerated in the Marshall County Detention Center in lieu of a \$100,000 cash bond for more than a year. He has repeatedly asked Buckingham to reduce his bond.

Buckingham denied those requests. That decision was appealed to the Kentucky Court of Appeals, which affirmed Buckingham's ruling Aug. 30.

Marshall County law enforcement officials will tighten security at the trial.

At Barnett's previous appearances in Calloway Circuit Court, the sheriff's department has beefed up security by clearing the courtroom for searches before allowing spectators, who had to pass through metal detectors, to re-enter.

Marshall County Sheriff Brian Roy said Friday that he expects to assign more deputies to the courtroom, but he does not plan to implement any other security measures.

People say that school boards don't have as much power as they used to," he said. "We still control policy and play a vital role. I don't feel threatened by KERA, but I do think it needs to be ironed out."

Blackford emphasized that during his tenure, the alternative education program has gotten underway, which has been one of his pet projects since he came on the board.

"I am really impressed with that," he said. "I think we have a good plan with our board and should stick with it."

Grogan, Rt. 3 Murray, is a salesman for Frito Lay. His late

father, John D. Grogan, was on the school board while Steve was a student in the Calloway system.

"I want to do something to help the kids," Grogan said. "I graduated from Calloway and I have two kids in the system."

Grogan said he thinks there should be more discipline in the school, more teachers and more assistance provided for handicapped students.

"Discipline is a big issue and I think it has gotten out of hand," he said. "I think more money needs to be spent on the students. This is for the kids and I just want them to have more opportunities."

Hubbard pleaded guilty in April to three felonies:

- Conspiring to file false campaign finance reports with the Federal Election Commission;
- Using congressional employees to help in his wife's 1992 congressional campaign in eastern Kentucky;
- Obstructing justice by staging a phony burglary of his Paducah, Ky., office to hide records subpoenaed by a grand jury.

He was to have been sentenced in July, but Oberdorfer granted a postponement to allow time for the leniency matter at issue in Friday's hearing.

In a plea agreement the Justice Department promised to ask for a reduced sentence if it found Hubbard has provided "substantial assistance" in investigating and prosecuting others.

The former congressman's wife, Carol Brown Hubbard, had been accused of using her husband's congressional staffers in her own failed 1992 campaign, which resulted in a charge of stealing government property. She also pleaded guilty in April.

Oberdorfer sentenced her on June 30 to five years of probation and 100 hours of community service and ordered her to pay \$27,000 restitution.

Hubbard was disbarred by the Kentucky Supreme Court after admitting "unethical and unprofessional conduct."

He will be sentenced to five years in prison, which will be probated.

According to Ward, the Commonwealth agreed to merge the tampering with evidence and hindering prosecution charges based on the prosecution's supposition that James Barnett assisted Billy Barnett in removing the skull from Jones' body and placing it in another location.

"In essence, he hindered prosecution by tampering with the evidence," Ward said.

Barnett's final sentencing is scheduled for Dec. 9 in Calloway Circuit Court.

According to a police investigation, Billy Barnett allegedly killed Jones, moved the body to Tennessee and later brought the skull back to Calloway County.

The prosecution alleges that James Barnett participated in moving the skull from one location to another.

Billy Barnett will be tried Monday for first-degree murder.

## Tower completed for WKYQ

Construction was recently completed on the tallest radio tower in western Kentucky and southern Illinois. WKYQ has already started using the new tower that they began building during the spring of this year. The tower, which is visible from 1-24 on the south side of Paducah, is nearly 1,000 feet tall. It has enabled WKYQ, Kentucky's oldest country FM station, to increase its power to 100,000 watts—the maximum allowed by federal law.

The new tower puts WKYQ's signal into areas such as Madisonville, Cadiz and Hopkinsville in Kentucky and Union City, Martin and Paris in Tennessee. It also fills in isolated "dead spots" that the

station used to have in some southern portions of Kentucky.

"This will prove to be an incredible advantage for our Murray businesses who attract customers from Tennessee," said Jamie Futrell, WKYQ account executive for Murray.

"While we will and have already begun to experience audience growth from the increased coverage," Futrell explained, "I'm most excited about improving the reception in the areas we already served."

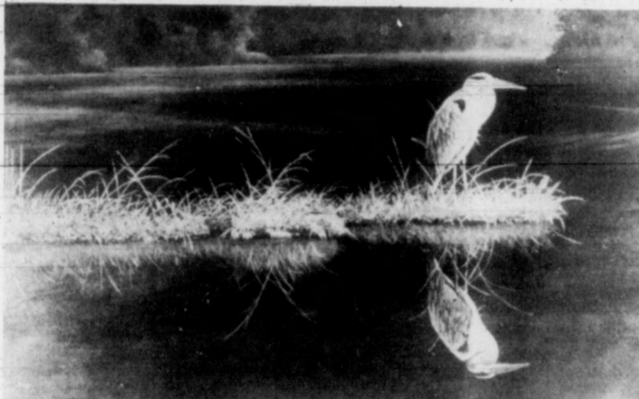

#### Cherry supports amendment

With the passage of this amendment, our city's rating could improve to a second or first class city.

2. Permit cities to incur long term debt. Cities can do this now through public "property corporations" for water and sewer and building projects, but this method costs more because those bonds get lower ratings, costing the tax payers millions of dollars.

3. Requires cities to have a balanced budget. The constitution now merely implies that cities should have a balanced budget.

4. Places a "home rule" provision in the constitution. Home rule is a city's authority to govern its own affairs, which is embodied in statutes, but not in the constitution.

Again, I ask for your support, as well as the support of the Kentucky voters. Let's give our city every chance to have the best and be the best!

## An interview with...

### SCATTERED THOUGHTS

In a recent column I mentioned the Fort Campbell's Pratt Museum and that if you're interested in history, you should take the time to drive up to the base and take a look around. This week I'm once again writing about the army base, but this time it's a little more personal.

Several members of my family are serving in different branches of the armed forces so with the events happening in the Middle East now, and with one nephew already over there, I wondered how it felt to know you might be called upon to leave your family and your home at a moment's notice.

When I went up to Fort Campbell recently, for two of my nephews' football games, I decided to ask some of the people I met there. The first person I spoke with was a pilot. (I thought this appropriate since they were one of the first ones called to go over seas to Kuwait by our Commander in Chief, President Bill Clinton.)

I had never interviewed anyone before (if you can call what I did that weekend interviewing) and I didn't expect much, but was pleasantly surprised by the conversation we did have. I thank Mr. Gregory for that because he spoke about his life in the military without being asked to many questions.

.....

Let's start with the basics.

His name is Danny Gregory and he's a chief warrant officer for the U.S. Army. Originally from Florida, Mr. Gregory, now resides in Clarksville. Next June, he and his family will be leaving for a four year stint in Germany. One of the first things I asked him to do was to define three things for me. They are as follows:

(1.) What does the word soldier mean to you? His response: a person regardless of race, creed or gender that is devoted to a cause and who demonstrates teamwork and caring for the welfare of others.

(2.) What does the word military mean to you? His response: a non-voting organization (this being our national defense) set up to protect democracy.

(3.) What does the phrase military life mean to you? His response: to always be flexible and be prepared for a living hell of camaraderie.

Mr. Gregory has been serving in the army for the last 18 years and is a single father with three children, one in college and two

at home. His guideline for a better life is simple. It's J.O.Y. You think first of the rules offered by Jesus, others needs and than yourself last or if you're not religious you can follow B.O.Y. with the B standing for Brotherhood.

Because he is a single parent, I was curious as to how he would handle his personal affairs if he was sent to Kuwait for example. I was assured that everything had already been taken care of.

The army requires that if you're a single parent you have to have a backup plan for your children in case of an emergency and he has one.

At any given moment, three different people can come to his home and take over the job of managing his affairs. All three have the power of attorney to see that his bills are paid and his children taken care of, including their medical needs. His children wouldn't even have to move out of their own home.

The other person I want to

thank for speaking with me is a woman I'll refer to as Madam X. I forgot to ask her if I could use her name — some interviewer huh?

At the time of this writing, her husband was serving in Haiti.

Madam X and her four children are hoping he'll be home in time for the holidays though — Daddy is the one that puts up the Christmas tree — and with the way the situation appears to be now — knock on wood — he will be.

Speaking with her after one of the football games, her oldest son plays on the same team as my nephews, I asked her if she ever gets use to the fact that her husband has to leave his family behind.

Her answer was a definite no. She said it is always difficult to say goodbye because you never know for certain if it would be the last time you will see each other.

She also stressed to me the anguish it puts on their four children, especially their youngest daughter. It's not always easy to make them understand why Daddy has to leave and go to different 'hot spots' around the world and this uncertainty causes bursts of anger, disobedience or mute silence because frustration has to express itself.

What we don't yearn to see is the transformation of the White House into even more of a fortress.

## Port Royal prophet

Wendell Berry is a prolific writer and lecturer whose main livelihood is organic farming in his native Henry County, Kentucky. He is one of the better-known spokespersons for the "back to the soil" and "love the land" movement.

Wendell Berry is a relentless social reformer, ceaselessly pricking our consciences and sabotaging our rationalizations to make us think afresh about our human relations with nature and repent of our devastating ways and schemes for getting ahead in the modern world.

Wendell Berry is a person I admire about as much as anyone I know.

Wendell Berry wears me out. For one thing, one wonders where in the world he gets the time to write and publish as much as he does. Some years it seems there are three or four new books from Berry—essays, poetry, short stories, and novels—an amazing output for someone who doesn't even own a personal computer, especially when there are fields to be tended and animals to be fed. I'm not sure he even has electricity in his farmhouse.

Does the man ever sleep?

And why must he continue to disturb my own sleep?

Take one of his latest books, for example. It's title is *Sex, Economy, Freedom & Community* (Pantheon Books, 1994 paperback of a 1993 book, \$11.00), and it's just short enough (177 pages) to digest in an evening.

Clever. Berry gets you hooked with some provocative propositions and good prose, and then keeps you from putting him aside by making his message brief. I tell you, the man is devious.

Then, in a usual preface, comes a disclaimer, which summarized goes something like this: "I'm writing this because I have to say it. I don't care a hoot whether you like me personally

or agree with me a hundred percent (or even half that much). I do care that we all acknowledge our guilt and responsibility for the sad shape into which things have gotten in this sad world, and that we, individually, and in small groups (called families and communities and crossroads), try to climb out of what we have done to each other and ourselves and nature."

That is followed by a collection of sermons from the soil. Most of them are jeremiads. Berry has a sense of humor, but it is mostly irony and cynicism and skepticism. One laughs at Berry's humor at one's own risk. It is a self-conscious comedy of words, but seems almost unconscious and accidental.

If not accidental, Berry's humor is at best incidental. The older he has become, the less humor he shows. Aging has made him tougher, more accusatory, more confident of the righteousness of his position, and more confirmed by hard knocks and experience in his prescriptions.

Well, he has earned the right to

take things seriously. Someone needs to, and Berry is a good one for the job.

He is fearless in pouncing on the bigness and commercialism that shape us. (He calls this virtue of denunciation "sales resistance.") He challenges us to stop thinking globally, where we are helpless to do anything, and to think simple and small, where we can have some impact and influence (which is a way to affect the globe, after all).

Berry's aggressive assault on the way things have become shouldn't mislead us. In his essence, he is a gentle man, a true symbol of what a peaceable kingdom would have for citizens. The problem is, he loves so hard, it hurts. He writes out of his pain and his struggles with the moral ambiguities and vacuums of our lives.

The fallacy in his premises is in his faith that things can be turned around when there are so many billions of people to be turned. Berry is absolutely correct, for

example, in his definition of "community": If (it) is to mean or amount to anything, it must refer to a place...and its people. It must refer to a placed people...and a people, moreover, not too numerous to have a common knowledge of themselves and of their place."

I buy both Berry's definition and his aspiration to revive or reinvent small communities in our world. But in the face of the numbers of people who would have to be educated and inspired to accept that faith, his appeal and impact is about as successful as swatting alligators with a feather.

There are just too many people out there for the world not to have herding instincts. Cities and large consolidated schools and multinational corporations are the consequence of the population that has to be fed and employed. To most of us, they seem inevitable. But Berry will not accept that inevitability.

Pessimistic and angry as Berry is, his own shortcoming is a blind optimism in the face of power and people with ways antithetical to his loving-land ways.

But that shortcoming is also his strength, for it echoes with prophecy, reminding us again and again that our long-term view is being neglected for short-sighted self-serving ends, and that a horrible pride is being paid as we propel ourselves toward moral, political, economic, and spiritual bankruptcy just around the bend.

If Wendell Berry doesn't beckon us into a spacious ark in which to escape the man-made apocalypse ahead, at least he offers to share his own rowboat.

He wears us out. He is right, time and time again, in what he sees and says, but leaves us exhausted from watching a horizon he points out recede faster and faster the more we walk toward it.

Cohen expects the publishing of his latest book to be completed this month. He said his book, "Sisters: Relation and Rescue in 19th-Century British Novels and Paintings," traces 19th-century pictorial schema for depicting sisters in art and fiction, especially the ways sisters rescue sisters.

Part of the skill of dummy play is the ability to get the defenders to make mistakes. The most common way of achieving this is by attempting to persuade the opponents that a situation exists which in fact does not exist. Here is an example.

West led his fourth-best diamond against three notrump, and East played the ten. South could see that if East had the king of clubs, he could score the first 11 tricks by winning the ten of diamonds with the jack

and taking a club finesse. But he also saw that if West had the club king and shifted to a high spade after winning the club, the contract would be in danger.

And so, to try to dissuade West from finding the potentially king defense, South won the diamond ten with the ace! He was trying to sell West the idea that East had the jack of diamonds. Declarer then played a heart to the queen, led the club ten and finessed.

West took his king and, convinced that his partner had the jack of diamonds, returned the diamond seven. South won with the nine and quickly cashed five clubs and two more hearts for a total of ten tricks.

Declarer's clever play notwithstanding, the fact is that West should not have fallen victim to it. He should have refused to take his king of clubs at trick three, giving East the opportunity to signal with the eight of spades on the next club lead from dummy.

Regardless of what declarer now did, he would have gone down at least three tricks with normal defense. Thus, if declarer conceded a club to the king, West would shift to the jack of spades and South would then find himself in very hot water. All of which goes to show that good defense can sometimes overcome good dummy play.

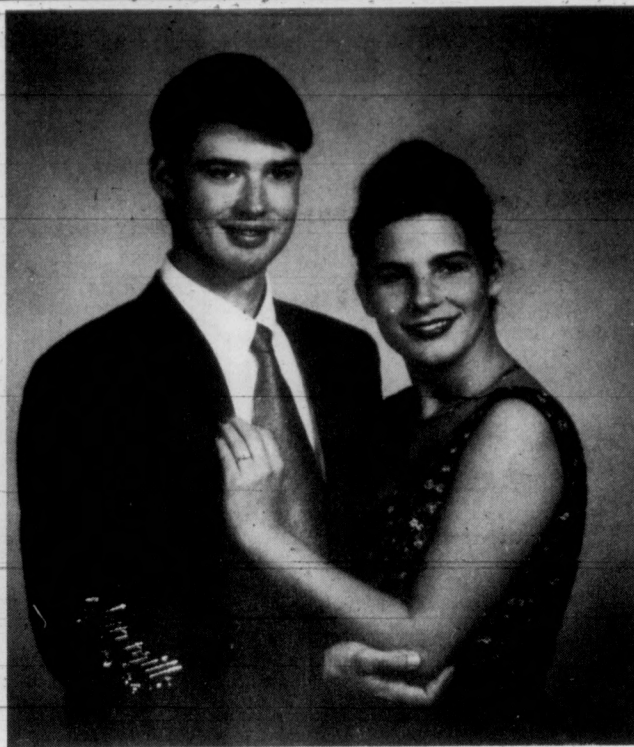

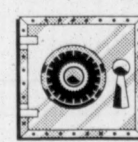

## Knicks spoil season opener of Boston Garden's farewell

BOSTON (AP) — New York spoiled the opening of the Celtics' last season in Boston Garden as Charles Smith scored 23 points and the Knicks pulled away in the third quarter for a 120-107 victory Friday night.

With Smith and Patrick Ewing getting 11 points each, the defending Eastern Conference champions outscored Boston 36-22 in the period after leading 60-55 at halftime.

Ewing finished with 21 points and 13 rebounds despite not suiting up for any of New York's seven preseason games following arthroscopic knee surgery July 6. John Starks added 17 points.

Boston was led by Dominique Wilkins with 25 points.

Leading 73-67, the Knicks took their biggest lead, 96-75, with a 23-8 run in which Ewing had nine points.

Bucks 91, 76ers 86

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — Vin Baker scored 11 of his 19 points in the fourth quarter, leading Milwaukee over Philadelphia in their season opener.

Baker's free throw with 30 seconds left gave the Bucks, playing without top draft pick Glenn Robinson, a 89-86 lead. Lloyd Daniels turned the ball over with 10 seconds left as the Sixers were setting up for a 3-point attempt.

Philadelphia led 77-74 before Baker led Milwaukee on a 10-1 run by scoring eight points, including a turnaround jumper from 14 feet to give the Bucks an 84-78 lead with 5:32 left.

Reserve Marty Conlon added a career-high 20 points, and Johnny Newman also scored 20 for Milwaukee.

LANDOVER, Md. (AP) — Rex Chapman hit a running jum-

per with less than a second left Friday night as Washington overcame a 17-point deficit and Shaquille O'Neal's 28 points to beat Orlando.

Washington trailed 108-107 with 2.4 seconds left when Mitchell Butler bounced an inbounds pass from midcourt to Chapman, who sank a 20-footer from the left side of the key. He was fouled by Horace Grant and made the free throw for the final margin.

O'Neal scored seven of the Magic's final nine points, grabbed 12 rebounds and helped foul out Washington centers Kevin Duckworth and George Muresan. Grant scored 20 and Nick Anderson had 19.

## Bowling Green dominates Calloway Co. Friday, 60-7

## Lakers end year with 7-4 record

BOWLING GREEN — Bowling Green, 10-1 and ranked number two in the state, proved worthy of their ranking Friday night with a 60-7 blistering of Calloway County in the first round of the KHSAA state football playoffs.

And made a believer out of Laker coach Billy Mitchell.

"That's the best high school team I've seen in a long, long time," Mitchell said. "They've got all their checkers in place to win a state championship."

Bowling Green was dominating in every phase:  
• The Purples rolled up 496

total yards, including 423 on the ground.

• Touchdowns ended their first nine drives, all the way to the start of the fourth quarter.

• Running backs Brian Harpool and Hovie Gurley each rushed for over 100 yards in just three quarters of action.

To their credit, Calloway County gained 150 yards, 126 of those by Sam Arnett through the air.

But Bowling Green set the tone out of the blocks.

Using only 16 plays in 12 minutes, the Purples jumped out to a 28-0 lead in the first quarter.

Calloway, which had -1 yards in the first quarter, found the end zone to start the second period when Arnett hit Tyler Bohannon on a 30-yard strike.

Calloway's momentum shattered two minutes later, however, when Bowling Green drove 64 yards before handing the ball

to 6-2, 280-pound fullback Myron Johnson for the final yard.

Bowling Green made it 41-7 at halftime on Harpool's third of four touchdowns on the night.

Bowling Green then tacked on 19 more points in the third quarter to close out the scoring. Arnett, who came into the game with 1,930 yards, produced his 126 Friday completing 12 of 36 pass attempts.

Sinich Mitchell has touted Bowling Green as a likely 3A state champion, he is not going to let the loss get in the way of a memorable year, in which the Lakers finished 7-4.

"These kids had a great season, and they came within two points of a district championship," he said. "When you play a state championship-caliber team like this, the score doesn't indicate how good a season we had."

## Drugs keep Gooden off mound for '95 season

NEW YORK (AP) — Dwight Gooden, the beloved but bedeviled pitcher who carried the New York Mets to baseball's biggest prize, was suspended Friday for the 1995 season because of repeated drug violations.

Gooden, who will turn 30 in two weeks, already had been suspended once this year — for 60 days on June 28 after testing positive for drugs. He underwent treatment at the Betty Ford Center from July 22 to Aug. 14, but tested positive again.

"Dwight Gooden needs to get his life in order," Mets general manager Joe McIlvaine said. "Dwight needs himself to realize the problem and come to grips with it."

Gooden, the NL Rookie of the

## Mets hero falls on hard times

Year in 1984 and the NL Cy Young Award winner the following year with a 24-4 record, led the Mets to the World Series title in 1986. But less than six months later, he admitted he had a cocaine problem and voluntary entered a treatment center in April 1987.

"The bottom line is he's going to have to rid himself of the problem. That's it. There's no maybe or fine line," said Gooden's agent, Jim Neader.

Neader met with the pitcher for about an hour Friday on the front steps of Gooden's home in St. Petersburg, Fla. Gooden chose not to speak publicly Friday, but probably will make a statement

next week, Neader said. "He's determined to beat it and get back to 100 percent health," Neader said. "And when that is achieved, then we'll think about baseball."

Gooden, a Cy Young winner by age 20, has been a larger-than-life figure in New York. A multi-story portrait of him on the mound is painted on the side of a building in midtown Manhattan, visible to all exiting the Lincoln Tunnel.

The last Met from 1986 championship team, he technically severed his ties on Oct. 24 when he filed for free agency after completing his \$15.45 million, three-year contract.

McIlvaine, who has spoken with Neader about re-signing the right-hander, had only one message to send on Friday: Get help.

"He has been offered the best assistance baseball and the New York Mets have to give for his problem and has not taken advantage of this guidance and help," said McIlvaine, who picked Gooden in the first round of the 1982 draft. "All of us who love this man urge him to get the help he needs, put God into his life and exhibit the same tenacity he showed on the mound, especially in the early years of his career when a lead in the seventh inning meant a victory in the ninth."

As a 19-year-old rookie in 1984, he was 17-9 with 276

strikeouts in only 218 innings. It was then that he earned the nickname "Dr. K" as adoring fans hung "K" placards in the stands after each Gooden strikeout.

After helping lead the Mets past the Boston Red Sox in the World Series, Gooden won 15 or more games in four of the next five seasons. But he dropped to 13-7 in 1991, and hasn't been back to -500 since.

He is 154-81 with a 3.04 ERA in 11 major league seasons, but is just 25-32 since 1991. He was 3-4 with a 6.31 ERA in seven starts this year, spending from April 22 through June 9 on the disabled list because of an injured right toe.

"A lot of reason for the Mets' success in the 1980s was because

## Wildlife refuge system dedicates 500th refuge

ATLANTA (AP) — After 91 years and 92 million acres, the National Wildlife Refuge System dedicated its 500th refuge in a swirl of controversy and plans for the next century.

The 500th refuge is in West Virginia's Canaan Valley, which, at 3,200 feet, is the highest valley of its size east of the Rockies. The altitude helps create a unique climate which provides conditions that many species usually found much farther north can call home.

The first tract, dedicated last month, is 86 acres. Eventually the refuge will include 20,000 acres. It will be the first refuge entirely within the state of West Virginia.

What is now the refuge system began in 1903 when President Theodore Roosevelt created the 3½-acre Pelican Island refuge in Florida, to protect egrets that were being slaughtered to feather ladies' hats.

The 500 refuges range in size from the half-acre Mille Lacs NWR in Minnesota to the 19.2 million-acre Arctic NWR in Alaska. The bulk of refuge lands, more than 76 million acres, are in Alaska. Part of the Alaska Maritime NWR, the Aleutian islands of Attu and Kiska, were seized by Japan during World War II.

Today the people in charge of the system are under attack by a variety of interest groups who use refuge lands.

In 1934, the federal "duck stamp" was created. Migratory bird hunters were required to buy a stamp each year.

## Fishing hasn't ended just yet

We still have good fishing conditions left before cold weather really sets in. I know many locals are hunting or getting prepared to hunt, and fishing is over for this year.

That's OK; there are a great number of outdoor things to do around the two lakes area and one can't do them all.

Crappie fishermen are eagerly searching the brush piles and ledges for those fat slabs that taste so good! Just about everyone is still using minnows and jigs so they will be sure to have the right bait.

Kell Dixon stopped by and said he had been catching some nice ones. A grandson was also his new fishing buddy and having a great time, too.

Our water temperature has fallen to 60 degrees and if the heavy rain comes as predicted this weekend, it will come down some more.

I fished Thursday and could tell the minnow activity has calmed down a lot in a week. The insects which hover over the water's sur-

face are more scarce, but will continue to be around until we have a heavy frost.

It was cloudy well into the morning and we could see bass taking minnows on the surface along the shallow banks. Actually, these banks were close to deep water and I think the majority of the feeding bass would slip in close, catch a baitfish and move back out for a few minutes suspended over the deeper water.

After I saw what the pattern was, we were able to move out and make

longer casts. Shallow bandits and model A's worked on some of the 2 to 3 pound bass, but it took a chug bug to really get them striking the surface.

Later on in the day, a Carolina rig-powerworm (black and purple) caught the attention of some larger bass and they put up a good fight until I swished them up with the net. Pictures were made and all were released unharmed.

The wind was very strong and the guys had a tough time with the Carolina rigs. They missed a lot of strikes they should have felt sooner.

In fact, it was impossible to fish the main lake on the east side.

I didn't see any striper activity on the main lake while we were traveling or back in the bays. The gulls got up and fed for about 30 minutes but there wasn't anything pushing the bait up to them.

They seemed to be content to doze in the warm sunshine like a bunch of old hounds!

Jimmy Quinn has caught a 17 pound striper (rockfish), but I haven't been able to contact him and get all of the juicy details, but I will. I hope he has a picture for us so we can share it with you.

The season for these monsters has just begun to get right, so stand by for news of some more being caught.

Conditions below both dams are pretty good for white stripes as well as sauger, so if you are capable of handling a boat down there, it could be a good day for you.

Catfish are still on the move on cut bait and that old smelly stuff, so if you like 'em, go catch 'em now!

## Deer hunting: what good is it?

### Study shows impact of stopping hunting

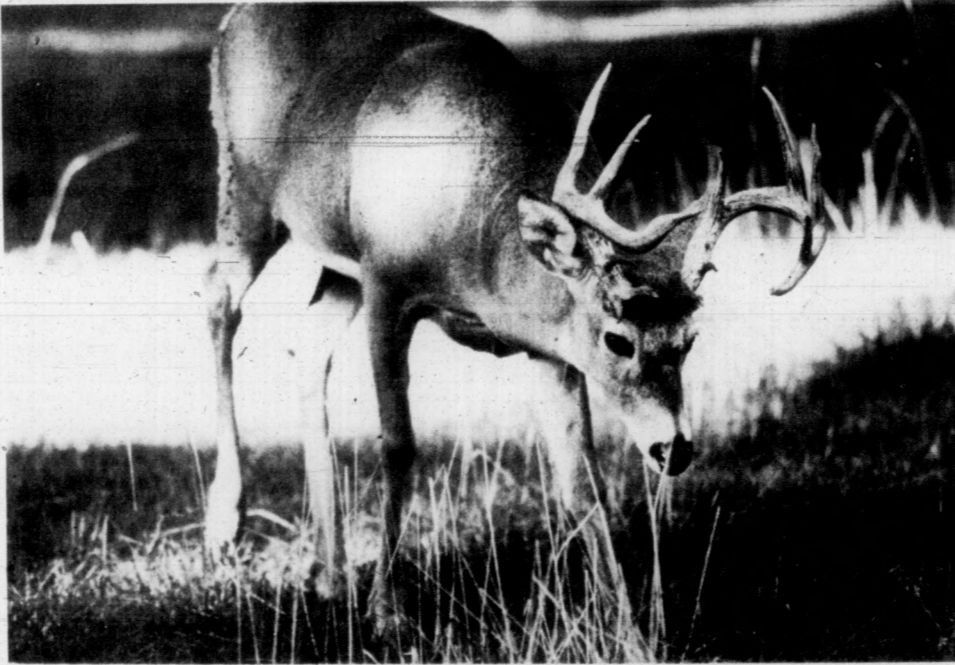
What does hunting mean to the Commonwealth of Kentucky? Indeed hunting is a tradition and a cherished part of our heritage, but furthermore hunting is a key component of the state's economy.

A recent study, completed for the International Association of Fish and Wildlife Agencies by the fish and wildlife management consulting firm Southwick Associates, revealed hunting generates over 8,000 jobs in the Commonwealth and in excess of a half-billion dollars in expenditures. Half a billion! (Shhhhhh... Did you hear anybody sneeze? Don't think so.)

That dollar amount includes food, traveling expenses like gas and lodging, equipment, clothing and other commodities, as well as the licenses hunters purchase.

According to the study, deer hunting alone accounts for over 2,600 jobs in Kentucky and for adding well over \$170 million to the state's economy. Kentucky deer hunters through purchase of hunting licenses and permits contribute almost \$6 million toward the management and care of wildlife in the Bluegrass State each year. The Kentucky Department of Fish and Wildlife Resources (KDFWR) receives no general fund tax dollars. Therefore, money from license sales is extremely important in not only paying for wildlife management, but also in purchasing lands for public outdoor recreation. Presently, the agency owns some 70,000 acres and manages one million acres. These lands are open to anyone for all kinds of outdoor recreation.

But let's think a second. What if there were no deer hunting in Kentucky? Aside from the negative economic impacts, what would happen with the deer popu-

lation? Would the deer all starve to death? Would nature control the population? Let's see what the research says.

A few years ago, the KDFWR's Deer Program Coordinator, John Phillips, addressed this exact scenario with the aid of a computer simulation program for managing deer herds. The program, called "Deer Camp," was developed by Dr. Aaron Moen of Cornell University. It not only accurately predicts harvest, fawn mortality, highway kills and poaching, but it also allows the operator to see what varying amounts of hunting pressure will do for many years to come. Phillips' harvest predictions using the model program have been within six percent of actual harvest figures each year over the past 10 years.

Using 1990 Kentucky deer population data, John programmed the computer to make predictions based on the assumption that all deer hunting was stopped. Within four years, the deer population rose from 301,166 to over two million animals. After six years of no hunting, deer numbers would rise and fall, eventually stabilizing at just over 1.26 million. During that period, the volume of deer killed on the road jumped from 4,673 to 35,800 animals. Imagine what would happen to car insurance rates, not to mention the increased potential of personal injury resulting from accidents.

Since the herd grew to almost three times the size it is right now, obviously more of the natural food supply was eaten. Each deer had to work harder for each mouthful of

food. The energy once spent producing fawns was needed to stay alive so the birth rate dropped. There was also a rise in poaching prediction, since such a large herd provided more temptation. Crop damage dramatically increased because deer had to rely more on the farmer's crops since its natural food supply was disappearing. Regulated hunting does help to keep the overall population of a renewable resource, such as white-tailed deer, at a healthy level.

How does the deer population stand now? Is hunting damaging the herd? The study completed after the 1992 deer season reveals that the deer populations in the western two-thirds of the state are stable while those in the east are growing rapidly.

## Catfish have been easiest to bring in over the past week

The weather this week has made it hard for fishermen to get out on the water. High winds and fluctuating temperatures have made it difficult to fish a lot of areas, but anglers have braved the winds have made a little success.

The fish that seems to be the easiest to catch this week is the catfish. Catfish seem to be in every depth of water, and the overall size has increased too. Most successful catfishermen are fishing from 15 to 30 feet of water. They are staying close to the old creek channels and river drop-offs. Minnows and nightcrawlers are still producing catfish, along with cut bait. I was crappie fishing in a bay earlier this week, when a commercial fisherman was running his lines. After he was finished with the line, I asked him how he was doing. He told me that he has ran 700-hooks and has caught over 1,000 pounds of fish!

The biggest part of the catfish being taken are the blue catfish. These fish are running from 2 pounds to 30 pounds. Catfish are not only being taken in Kentucky Lake, but also below the dams of Kentucky and Barkely Lakes.

Several people are starting to fish for sauger this week. Anglers that were fishing in the lake were taking several nice sauger from 20 to 30 feet of water along the old river channel. Big yellow and blue jigs tipped with minnows were the best producers. Most of the fish caught in the lake were running about 1 pound. Fishermen might be pushing the fall run a little early, but a nice bunch of sauger can be taken.

Sauger fishermen have been below the Smithland and Kentucky dams this week too. From the reports I have heard, one of the two dams will yield a limit of sauger for the angler. Fishermen report that the size is still running a little small, but this will change as the water cools. The most productive way to

fish below the dams is with a big jig tipped with a minnow. They were catching their fish in 15 to 30 feet of water. In a couple of weeks, the action will increase as the sauger move toward the swifter water to spawn.

Crappie fishing was tough this week, due to the high winds. The crappie that seemed to be the easiest to catch were around 10 feet of water. Fishing tube jigs straight down seemed to be the only way to get a crappie to bite. Red and white was the best color, followed by red and chartreuse. The fish were running a little smaller this week, with a lot of short fish being taken. If the weather will improve this weekend, crappie fishing should, as well.

For the bass fishermen, it does not look good. Bass are the hardest fish to catch right now. What few bass are being taken are on crank baits and spinner baits along some of the deep rocky banks. What few big fish that are being caught are on spinner baits near woods in six to eight feet of water. We should see the activity increase over the next couple of weeks.

Don't let the bad fishing get you down, it will improve soon.

In 1944, 50 years ago, British official Lord Moyne was assassinated in Cairo, Egypt, by the Zionist Stern gang.
In 1946, Massachusetts Democrat John F. Kennedy was elected to the U.S. House of Representatives.
In 1956, Britain and France started landing forces in Egypt during fighting between Egyptian and Israeli forces around the Suez Canal. (A cease-fire was declared two days later.)
In 1968, Richard M. Nixon won the presidency, defeating Vice President Hubert H. Humphrey and third-party candidate George C. Wallace.

DEAR DR. GOTT: In some people, a strict vegetarian diet may lead to indigestion and gas. Ordinarily, this responds to the elimination of edibles (such as beans and cabbage) that are associated with symptoms.
Nonetheless, gallstones or an inflamed gallbladder could cause you symptoms. But don't consider surgery until an ultrasound test and other examinations have proved that the gallbladder is at fault. Remember, too, that there is non-surgical treatment for gallstones, involving pills or ultrasound. Your doctor can advise you.

DEAR DR. GOTT: My 40-year-old son has been diagnosed with candidiasis. The treatment to date has been a strict diet to eliminate anything of a yeasty nature. Do you feel this is appropriate, or should something else be done?
DEAR DR. GOTT: Chronic candidiasis (infection with the candida yeast) is considered by many authorities to be a "fad ailment," used to explain malaise, depression and fatigue in otherwise-healthy individuals.
In my experience, the candidiasis diet is difficult for patients to follow because it is so restrictive (no sugar or yeast-containing foods). However, if your son feels better on such a diet, he will not be harmed by following it.
In addition, his doctor should check him for anemia, underactive thyroid, Lyme disease and other metabolic abnormalities — all of which have been associated with the symptoms I mentioned.

# Boy who took grenade to school recalls explosion

FOLKSTON, Ga. (AP) — A student who brought what he thought was a dud grenade to school said a friend dropped it on the floor twice after another student urged him to do it.

The grenade exploded after the second drop, injuring 12 students in the music class. The student who dropped it was in critical condition as doctors fought to save his feet and legs.

Speaking from his hospital bed Friday, Gregory Douglas, 17, said Shannon Chesser was holding the 40 mm grenade when another classmate said "drop it on the floor."

Chesser did, from 2 to 3 feet up. It bounced harmlessly.

"They said, 'Drop it a little higher,'" Douglas recalled. "He picked it up and held it about 5 feet high. I said, 'Don't drop it.' I turned and when I turned back around, it went 'Boom!'"

Eight students remained hospitalized Friday after the blast at Charlton County High School. Twenty-five students and a teacher — who had her back turned when the grenade was dropped — were in the classroom when the grenade exploded Thursday.

Chesser, 16, was in critical condition at University Medical Center and was scheduled for surgery today so doctors could determine if his feet and legs could be saved, said hospital spokeswoman Gerni Lowe.

One other student was in serious condition and six, including Douglas, were in fair condition.

Douglas said he found the grenade on a counter in his living room and took it to school without telling his parents. He said he

had no idea it was live.

"Daddy has taken it apart and put it together several times," he said. "I thought it was dead. A dud. He kept it boxed up, and I thought he was going to throw it away."

The boy's stepfather, Danny Neely Jr., told authorities he brought grenades home years ago while a civilian employee at Fort Stewart, an Army post, said Ken Davis, a spokesman for the Georgia Emergency Management Agency.

Neely no longer works there. He was arrested Thursday night for drunken driving after visiting his son in the hospital.

Police would not say whether Douglas or Neely would be charged. Taking explosives into a school is a violation of state law, and possessing explosives without a license is a federal crime. Removing government property from a base without permission also is a felony.

Special agent Larry Whitlock, senior bomb technician for the Georgia Bureau of Investigation, said the grenade Douglas had is designed to penetrate an armored personnel carrier, then explode once it's inside.

Joe Hanlin, an explosives enforcement officer with the U.S. Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms in Atlanta, said the grenade must be launched in order to explode. He said the grenade probably was launched during exercises at Fort Stewart and didn't explode.

"But it was armed," he said. "When it was dropped, it hit the ground in just the right way to set it off."

# Father who donated son's heart sentenced for suffocating him

CHICAGO (AP) — A father hailed for his compassion when he donated his 3-month-old son's heart was sentenced Friday to 35 years in prison for murdering the boy.

Ronald Rakow, 28, was convicted of first-degree murder in August for suffocating his son, Paul, with a pillow because he would not stop crying.

Rakow and his wife, Angela, donated their son's heart in 1991 to 13-day-old Quinn Kyles, whose need for a heart had been highly publicized in the Chicago area.

Rakow maintained his innocence throughout the case. "I only ask that you look at the evidence," he told Circuit

Judge Edward Fiala at his sentencing hearing. "I did not suffocate that child."

Rakow's lawyer, Joseph Cavanaugh, said he would appeal.

Prosecutors asked the judge for an extended sentence of 60 to 100 years instead of the usual 20 to 60 because of the nature of the crime.

"It was knowing and intentional murder," said assistant state's attorney Nancy Donahoe. "It was really cold. He sat in that house knowing that baby was suffocating. He let the child die."

Paul was born six weeks premature in August 1991 and was hooked to a portable monitor because of a respiratory problem. Rakow was watching his son

while his wife was at work. Paul was cranky because of a slight cold and was not hooked to the monitor, which would have sounded an alarm if he had difficulties.

Prosecutors say that after failed attempts to pacify the child, Rakow placed Paul on a pillow face down, knowing he would not be able to breathe.

"(Paul's) crime was that he was crying too much," said prosecutor Rimas Cernius. "His punishment was killing him."

Rakow's lawyer said the child should have been able to turn his head despite the position.

Authorities at first believed Paul died from Sudden Infant Death Syndrome. But Paul's doc-

tor became suspicious of his parents' behavior after the death.

He said they seemed too eager to proceed with organ donation.

Paul died Dec. 11, 1991, after being taken off a respirator. The next day, baby Quinn received his heart.

# Ferry service may reopen

HICKMAN, Ky. (AP) — Resumption of ferry service between Hickman and Dorena, Mo., could mean a shorter commute for some Kentuckians.

Fulton County Judge-Executive Harold Garrison said he was notified Thursday that the Mississippi County (Mo.) Port Authority has received oral approval of a \$278,800 federal grant to buy a ferry boat. Local authorities will

have to put up about \$70,000 to receive the grant.

Garrison hopes that officials from Kentucky and Missouri will meet soon to discuss raising the local share. The officials are also going to have to come up with some initial operating money until the ferry establishes some cash flow.

Ferry service between the two points was suspended in 1991 by

Hugh Lattus because of rising costs. Lattus' family had operated the ferry for 70 years.

Port Authority Executive Director Ron Crenshaw began efforts in January to revive the ferry when he heard about the federal grant program. Officials are still awaiting written approval of the grant.

# Pet python bites 4-year-old boy

INDIANAPOLIS (AP) — A 13-foot pet python that slithered out of its cage and began wrapping itself around a 4-year-old boy was killed by rescue workers.

After five men were unable to pry it off the boy Friday night, rescuers cut off the snake's head, said police spokesman Mike Brown.

The boy suffered a bite to his right leg and was hospitalized in good condition this morning, Brown said.

The 30-pound snake had wrapped itself around the boy's chest and legs and was cutting off the child's circulation, said Sgt. Dan Eland, a Marion County animal control officer.

"Somehow it got down to the basement and the kids were down (there) playing," Eland said. "And apparently one of them stepped on it or kicked it and it started wrapping itself around the 4-year-old."

The python was not poisonous.

# Dole makes campaign stop for 1st District challenger

PADUCAH, Ky. (AP) — Senate Minority Leader Bob Dole said he is optimistic that 1st District Republican congressional candidate Ed Whitfield can help the GOP achieve a net gain of 40 seats and assume control of the House.

"I can hardly wait until Tuesday night when all the victories start rolling in," Dole told about 100 people gathered for a rally at Midwest Aviation. "We're counting on one in this district."

Dole made a campaign stop Friday for Whitfield, who told the cheering crowd that his campaign has gained momentum.

Whitfield is challenging first-term Democratic Rep. Tom Barlow in next week's election in the western Kentucky district. Whitfield said Dole's visit provides additional enthusiasm as the campaign nears its conclusion.

"We feel like the momentum is growing," Whitfield said.

Republican leaders said Dole's visit signaled a GOP surge in momentum.

"When Bob Dole comes in three days before the election, it's a pretty good indication he

believes this is one that's going to be in the 'win' column on election night," state GOP Chairman Terry Carmack said.

Barlow countered that Dole's appearance underscored Whitfield's reliance on national Republican strategists.

"It's been no secret that Whitfield's campaign from the start has been managed by the Republican Party out of Washington, D.C.," Barlow said in a statement. "This last-minute, desperate stop by Sen. Dole only highlights that fact."

In a Democratic rally Thursday night, Gov. Brereton Jones predicted that Barlow and other local Democratic candidates will win their elections and criticized Republican campaign tactics.

"Our strategy is to get the truth out," he said. "When people understand what the Democratic philosophy is — to help people help themselves" — they will vote Democratic.

"Somehow, the Republican party is trying to lead people to believe Democrats are not good Christian people," Jones said at the Paducah rally.
