



## County code challenged

Prior to the pasage of the county's new ethics code Thursday, residents challenged the Calloway County Fiscal Court to devote more time to it.

teeth in it," said Fayte Brewer. "I think it should show that our elected officials are not above the law. I'd also like to see the nepotism policy changed because you shouldn't hire your family."

The court is required to have an ethics code in place prior to Jan. 1 as mandated by the state in House Bill 238.

According to Calloway's ordinance, the purpose is to provide a clear guideline for standards of ethical conduct by elected and appointed officers, as well as county employees.

The residents objected to the penalties which could be imposed

for violations.

The penalties contain a five-

an order for the violator to halt the violation to referring evidence of criminal violation to the county attorney or commonwealth's attorney.

"We really need a strong, hardhitting ethics code," said Ron Ball. "The state legislators were cheesy and left it up to 120 counties to do it themselves."

Residents also brought up the example of Calloway County Court Clerk Teresa Rushing, who has been indicted on charges of felony theft by failure to make required disposition of property.

Although the indictment was handed down June 29, 1994, Rushing is still in office even though she has passed her duties as fiscal court secretary to Elaine Paschall.

"Why not relieve her of her duties and restore our confidence in you?" asked Max Canady. County Attorney David Har-

### Rickman asks about pay rumor

### WW II uniform still fits veteran

He walked into the office just as fit and trim as he was 52 years ago, and he was wearing the uniform to prove it.

World War II army veteran Wayne Williams commemorated Veteran's Day Friday by donning his dress uniform, doing a radio show, and spending a few minutes at the Ledger. "I feel very sentimental today," he said.

The olive-green wool uniform was neatly pressed and adorned with various

pins, stripes and honors.

In preparation for his radio broadcast, Williams put together a recording of military music from all branches of the armed

forces.

"I think about the GIs from World War I and II, Korea and Vietnam and they fought hard and they deserve a lot of credit," he said.

Williams saw a great deal of the world during his 3½-year tour of duty. He enlisted as a 23-yearold graduate of Murray

State University.
In fact, Williams married in February 1942 and shipped out four months

"The president of the university even moved graduation up two weeks so we could all graduate otherwise the draft board would get us and we wouldn't get our degrees," he said.

#### Bill Gates buys Da Vinci papers

SEATTLE (AP) — Microsoft Corp. Chairman Bill Gates won the bidding war for a Leonardo da Vinci manuscript, paying a record \$30.8 million for 72 pages of notes and diagrams exploring the mysteries of the cosmos

Christie's America in New York said the purchaser was anonymous, but a spokeswoman for Gates' public relations firm confirmed that he was the buyer, the Seattle Post-Intelligencer

reported today.

"Leonardo represents the fusion of art and science," said the spokeswoman for Waggener-Edstrom of Portland, Ore., who refused to be quoted by name. "I think that's why he is of such interest's Bill Color."

The manuscript contains Leonardo's distinctive backward handwriting and meticulous drawings, and includes his explanation for why the sky is blue and his advice on building dams.

Gates plans to tour the work in museums around the world, the spokeswoman told the Post-Intelligencer. Gates was unavailable for comment.

Christopher Burge, chairman of Christie's America, said Friday's sale was the highest price paid for any work of art sold at auction in the bast four years, and the highest ever for a manuscript.

In the document, dated 1508 to 1510, Leonardo studies the water and cosmos through words and pictures. His explorations range from astronomy to the atmosphere, from physical geography to geology, from hydraulics to canal building.

On one page, he remarks that the light of the moon is reflected sunlight. He wrote a century before Galileo proved that the moon does not shine of its own

He correctly explains the pre sence of marine shells and fossils on mountains and plains far from the sea. He offers advice on flood control, dams and canals. He explores the principles of siphons and steam power. He presents engineering designs for the snorkel and submarine.

must have darkness beyond it and hence it appears blue," he writes. The manuscript was sold by the Armand Hammer Museum of Art and Cultural Center in Los Angeles. The late oil tycoon Armand Hammer had bought the work at a 1980 auction in London for \$5.6 million.

The pre-sale estimate was \$10 million to \$15 million. But after bidding opened at \$5.5 million, the auction turned into a feverish battle between Gates, bidding through a Seattle representative and a representative of the Cariplo Foundation of Milan, Italy, who was in the auction room.

The two raised the price in increments of \$500,000 and \$1 million. When the 21/2 -minute duel ended and the gavel finally went down, the standing-room only crowd applauded and

"It's an extraordinary moment in auction history," Burge said. The losing bidder, Alessandro Penati, noted that Leonardo had worked on the manuscript in

Milan and Florence, and said it 'belongs to our cultural heritage. ... Obviously, we wanted to bring it back really badly."

Gates, 39, was listed this year by Forbes magazine as the country's richest man, with assets of \$9.2 billion. Microsoft, based in the Seattle suburb of Redmond, is the world's largest maker of personal computer software

The Seattle Art Museum learned the manuscript would be for sale three months ago, and the

His travels began in Africa when he was assigned to a military police company in the port city of Oran, Algeria and charged with guarding supply shipments that were being sent to Sri Lanka. Until 1972, the island of Sri

Lanka, located off the coast of India, was known as Ceylon. Following his duties in Africa,

Williams was sent to China where he and other soldiers were to establish radio communication

Williams said he was under the direction of Maj. Gen. Joseph W. Stillwell who commanded U.S. forces in China and Burma, as well as trained the Chinese National Army.

He also provided communications support for Adm. Louis Mountbatten, Great Britain's supreme Allied commander in Southeast Asia.

Williams said that soliders did not understand the gravity of what had happened when an-American B-29 bomber dropped the first atomic bomb ever used in warfare.

"We didn't really know what that was (the bomb) or what it could do," he said.

World War II evokes a number of other memories for Williams. He said it was the first time that women were involved in the war effort.

A number of women were enlisted in the Army's Signal Corp, which decoded messages. "It was a very important job," Williams said. "And it was good

to see American ladies.' The Army created a division of female soldiers known as Women's Army Corp (WAC). By the end of the war, more than 100,000 women were enlisted or serving as officers.

But the military has changed in

the last 50 years.

"It seems like they're a lot more lenient," Williams said. "Back then, you couldn't look cross-eyed at anyone.

Regardless of the changes in the military, Williams, still has a great deal of respect for those who have, are or will serve in the United States military.

"I appreciate them. And I appreciate the university having an ROTC program," he said. 'They do good work."

Of course, Williams has plenty

to be proud of himself. He was among the largest mobilization of soldiers the U.S. Army's history.

What began as 190,000 toops in 1939 ended with about 8.2 million in 1945.

The first drafted men entered the Army in 1940.

Of course, the greatest amphi bious attack ever mounted was part of the Allied effort during World War II. The event, known as D-Day, commemorated its 50th anniversary this year on the beaches of Normandy, France.

#### **Despairing Cubans** look northward

WASHINGTON (AP) — From the beginning 35 years ago, the Cuban revolution was intent on purging every vestige of American influence on the island.

Capitalism; consumer goods, even chewing gum were systematically shunned. Instead of brothels and gambling casinos sponsored by American mobsters, the revolution promised schools, hospitals and museums. In one speech, President Fidel Castro denounced American "imperialism" 88 times.

But that was in an earlier, more ideological, phase of the revolution. Nowadays, the pariah status once accorded to things American has been shed:

With living standards abysmally low after the evaporation of et largesse, Cubans desperate for a way out increasingly are looking northward for help.

Despite some signs of an upturn resulting from free market pricing and growing foreign investment, Cuba is still a country where a quart of quality paint can cost four months' pay and a two-pack-aday smoker can puff away an entire month's pay on cigarettes

Castro used to dismiss the U.S. economic embargo as a minor inconvenience but, lacking outside support these days, he has changed his tune. Promoting an end to the more than three-decade embargo has become the highest foreign policy priority for the Cuban Foreign Ministry.

Cubans have been told for years that the country's catastrophic economic situation is the result not of systemic flaws, but of the embargo, and it follows that an end to the sanction will usher in an era of abundance

So, many Cubans find themselves analyzing developments in Washington with the intensity of Talmudic scholars, looking for any sign that pro-embargo sentiment in the United States is

Was there a hidden meaning to the visit to Cuba a few weeks ago by former presidential candidate George McGovern? Or to the administration's easing of policies toward a group that has defied restrictions on travel by Americans to Cuba. Will President Clinton be in a better position to relax the embargo after Tuesday's congressional elections, when political risk-taking will be easier?

Even if all the answers are "yes," Castro is determined not to allow Cuba to become just another Latin American country where education and health care are in short supply and unemployment abounds. The name of the game is to preserve what he and his supporters like to call "the conquests of the revolution."

Universal education remains one of the country's proudest achievements, along with health care, despite setbacks attributed to the country's economic decline. Castro has said, and independent analysts concur, that hundreds of thousands of Cubans are alive today who would have been victims of infant mortality were it not for the country's system of comprehensive prenatal and postnatal

Castro's problem is finding gainful employment for all of his healthy, well-educated constituents, many of whom lost their jobs when the economic decline began accelerating four years ago. Guaranteed employment is one of "the conquests of the revolu-

tion" which the government, out of necessity, has had to sacrifice. Some Cubans, aside from losing their jobs, would lose all hope as well were it not for the possibility, however faint, that the Americans, the closest of enemies, will somehow come to their economic

Nov. 2 - Liberation, Paris, on the Muslim fundamentalist insurgency in Algeria:

President Gen. Liamine Zeroual (of Algeria) announced ... presidential election "before the end of 1995," but also will "eradicate the terrorism" practiced by "the criminals, the traitors and the mercenaries who are attacking their own people in the name of Islam."

These two propositions are, of course, contradictory since the first, vague, months away, and difficult to achieve in a civil war climate, was meant to satisfy countries furnishing aid to Algeria while the second, applicable now, was designed to reassure the most hard-core military factions for whom the only solution possible is the intensification of repression.

More than ever, it is the military of both camps who are monopolizing the scene.

There remains one question, unfortunately theoretical in the actual climate: will the Islamists, after having shown their true nature, now be able to win a presidential election, like the one they had won at the end of 1991?

Nov. 7 — Riyadh (Saudi Arabia) Daily on Bosnia: The Bosnian Serbs are clearly on the run. The sudden thrusts by the Sarajevo government army have caught the Serbs by surprise Their much-touted military prowess has evaporated as the long subdued Bosnian Muslims have punched out of their corners in a bid to take as much territory before winter sets in.

Evidently the tide now is running in the favor of the Bosnian fuslims. Their offensives have retaken much territory that had been cleansed of Muslim identity by the Serbs. The government in Sarajevo is determined to make its long-withheld strength felt. The promises of succor made by countries involved in the region, have

As winter approaches, the Muslims are not going to allow Serbian besiegers to deny them what meager rations come their way. The events around Sarajevo recently have demonstrated the inability of the international protection force to perform the basic duty of protecting vital lifelines into the city.

Nov. 9 - New Straits Times, Singapore, on Asian culture: The Western world cannot continue to hold on to the notion of a monopoly culture. Southeast Asia has one of the world's most ethnically diverse populations.

The spread of Indian, Islamic and Chinese civilizations into the region have contributed to a tolerance and an understanding for each other's culture, worthy of emulation by the West.

China offers not just immense opportunities for trade, in terms of size and population, but also a history anchored in a cultural lineage closer to Asian values than any other Western nation can

Confucian emphasis on family, community, hard work, mutual respect are in consonance with the Asian lineage.

By and large, Asia has been selective in what it accepts from the West, tempering its Western acquisitions with traditional

It is a unique formula which must be preserved.

#### Turkey spotted in the straw

plateau just north of the Newport, Tennessee, exit on I-40 last May, only a mile or two from a bustling town. My wife, riding in the passenger seat, was shocked to see a wild

It was standing at the edge of a field, tail folded in, looking out at the passing traffic. I was driving and only caught a glimpse of it, enough to think it was only a billboard for Wild Turkey bourbon, but my wife saw it fully. It was truly alive.

It was not a sight easily forgotten. We have driven slowly along that stretch of interstate several times since then, hoping to find it and to have again what so far is truly a "once-in-a-lifetime experience.

Don't be deceived by the stacks of butterball turkeys in your supermarket this Thanksgiving or the pounds of sliced turkey at your favorite delicatessen. A wild turkey is indeed a "rara avis" (i.e., a "rare

Wild turkeys are the blood kin of buffalo and Native Americans. They are scarce, rarely seen, and vanishing before our eyes. Like them, too, they are symbols of America, especially around Thanksgiving.

Once their abundance made them emblematic. Nowadays, however, it is their rarity.

An old truism, bordering on being something Yogi Berra would have said, holds that "you don't miss them until they're gone.' Well, of course not. How can

In William Faulkner's wonderful hunting stories, which I think are his best writings, he describes how the bear and the wilderness have disappeared together, eaten up first by clearing the forests for farms, and then by coming of developers of towns and factories and shopping centers. For Faulkner, the old symbol of America was the bear, and the new is the bulldozer.

Science and technology and the manmade things science and technology provide are the real symbols. We have moved in less than a century's time, quite understandably


Most of all, we can learn that staying linked to the land and flocking together are good things a new society ought not to give up too



#### Murray's defense rocks Trigg 21-0

#### Trigg nets -27 yards in rocky second half

While Trigg County's rocks rattled, Murray High was rocksolid in Friday night's Class A playoff game.

Murray limited the Wildcats to minus-27 yards of total offense in the second half to roll to a 21-0 second-round playoff win in front of the season's largest crowd at Ty Holland Field.

'The game went the way we expected it," said junior linebacker Jon Bell. "Both crowds were in it, and it was intense. Our whole defense just played

Murray (10-2) limited Trigg's new wing-T offense to just 122 total yards in a physical matchup of two smash-mouth offenses. Murray, which rushed for 232 yards on the night, scored three times in the second half to put the game away and set up next week's trip to arch-rival Russellville.

"Even though they had something new, it all came down to our kids," said Tiger head coach Rick Fisher. "They played with a lot of heart and a lot of determination.

"In the second half we started playing better and powered it right down their throats," said senior Adam Blalock. "We beat them at their own game.'

The Dallas Cowboys and San Francisco 49ers each have a disruptive defense led by a Pro Bowl player. Ironically, Ken Nor-ton Jr. and Charles Haley both

starred for both teams. Norton was a Pro Bowl linebacker for the Cowboys before joining the 49ers as a free agent to this season. Defensive end Charles Haley was traded by the 49ers to Dallas in 1992.

On Sunday, the two teams meet in a replay of the past two NFC championship games. Dallas (8-1) won both en route to consecutive Super Bowl titles.

Haley, who will be making his fourth appearance against his former team, is hoping to increase his record to 4-0 against San Francisco (7-2).

'Every time he plays against San Francisco, he wants to play-his best game," said 49ers tackle Steve Wallace, who will try to keep Haley out of the San Francisco backfield. "I know I have my work cut out for me in more

touchdowns in a 31-16 victory. Young leads the NFL with a 101.8 passing rating on 179 completions in 259 attempts for 2,138 yards and an NFC-best 16

touchdowns. Dallas quarterback Troy Aikman is the NFL's No. 2 passer with a 97.8 rating on 151 completions in 231 attempts for 1,825 yards and 12 touchdowns. 



#### Fall weather good for fishing

When you can find a bank where the wind isn't too strong to cast you can catch some fish

Usually the first of November is balmy temperatures with little or no

Bass anglers are in search of that big trophy to put on the wall or just photograph and release for next years quest.

The shad baitfish are still pretty active in schools that are still growing in size and most are very near the surface. They still jump and eatch the gnats which hover the waters surface and this movement in turn telegraphs to the feeding bass where the food is.

Soft plastic twitch baits, chug bugs, pop-R's, zara spooks and a few other noisy topwater lures will draw a strike from the schooling

The water temperature has cooled to 58-59 degrees already and will probably come down some more weekend.

This helps the bass, crappie,

sauger and other species to become very active just like they do in the spring when the temperature is going the other way.

These fish know to feed and put on weight so they can live through the cold weather months when eyerything slows down.

#### Gun deer season set for Nov. 12-21

Before the end of the season, 200,000 people will go deer hunt ing in the Bluegrass state and spend more than \$78 million in Kentucky, according to figures from the Kentucky Department of Fish and Wildlife Resources (KDFWR).

Kentucky's modern deer gun season is set for Nov. 12-21 in most counties. (Some counties in eastern Kentucky will have a five-day modern gun season because of lower herd sizes.)

Deer hunters are required to have permission from landowners before entering private lands. During any firearms season, deer hunters must wear hunter orange clothing on the head, chest and back. The season limit is two deer, only one of which may be an antlered deer. Hunters should check regulations for the area they plan to hunt to learn when antlerless deer hunting is permitted.

The archery deer season will close statewide Jan. 15. Crossbow season extends for 10 consecutive days following the close of the 10-day modern gun season. The final segment of muzzle-loading

Persons under age 16 must be accompanied by an adult when hunting deer with a firearm. Those born after Jan. 1, 1975 and required to have a hunting license must also complete an approved hunter education course before going hunting and carry a course completion (orange card) while hunting. Unless license-exempt, hunters under 16 must have a junior hunting license and may purchase up to two youth, one-tag deer permits (\$12.50 each) or one two-tag permit (\$21). Hunters 16 and over must purchase the two-tag permit in addition to the appropriate hunting license.

#### Deer hunting beneficial to economy,

HENDERSON, Ky. (AP) The fellow wearing orange and sitting in a tree in mid-November is doing a good deal more than waiting for a deer to pass.

Although Kentucky's several deer seasons begin October 1 and end January 15, it's during the modern firearms season (Nov. 12-21 in most areas) that whitetail hunters are most visible. This is also a period during which the nimrods have their greatest impact on both the deer herd and

the state's economy.

The impact on Kentucky's herd this season should be to remove about 100,000 whitetails from a population of some 400,000, says biologist John Phillips, head of the Kentucky Department of Fish and Wildlife Resources' deer program. That estimate includes a 10-15 percent increase over the 1993 harvest.

Phillips, using a Cornell University computer program, has a record over the past decade of predicting the annual harvest within about six percent

ram, Phillips has done a projection of the effect on the Kentucky deer herd if sport hunting were

Had hunting ended in 1990, his base year, the Kentucky deer population would now number about 2,000,000, up considerably from the current 400,000. A number of effects would be evident,

Phillips' projection shows. By 1996, the number of deervehicle accidents would jump from 1990's reported 4,673 to about 35,800. The number of

human injuries and deaths as well as auto insurance rates would climb

Agricultural crop depredation would soar. The natural forage decimated, deer would concentrate on corn, soybeans, alfalfa, garden vegetables, and ornamental plants.

Eventually, the herd would stabilize at about 1.25 million, the environment's "biological carry-ing capacity," but far above the "social carrying capacity," as the needs of the deer and the human populations collide. Deer

would be pests rather than the state's premier game animal. In the economic sphere, too,

the deer hunter is a significant

factor, the wildlife agency points Some 210,000 deer hunters spend more than \$78 million in Kentucky each year. That

involves food, gasoline, lodging, supplies, equipment and licenses. Southwick Associates, a Virginia-based consulting firm, says that by the time these dollarsripple through the state's economy, they generate about \$170

million. All types of hunting pro duce about a half-billion dollars annually in the state

That half-billion dollars translates overall, the same survey says, to some 8,000 Kentucky jobs, about a third of them deerhunting related. Sport hunting licenses furnish about \$750,000 to local budgets because county clerks share in license fees.

Finally, deer hunters provide some \$6 million for the fish and wildlife agency, for the further ance of conservation programs

#### CRP set to be reauthorized

By BILL SCHULZ Associated Press Writer

ATLANTA (AP) — The stage is being set for next year's attempt to reauthorize the Conservation Reserve Program, a farm program hailed by conservation groups as one of the most successful ever.

Started as part of the 1985 Farm Act, the CRP allows the Agriculture Department to pay landowners to take highly erodible land out of production and plant it with grasses, legumes or trees that hold the soil and provide wildlife habitat.

The program is up for reauthorization by the next Congress. It is given credit for this year's rebound in duck production in the United States' prairie pothole

country and has benefited a variety of other birds including bobolinks, bitterns and Western meadowlarks, according to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service.

"The landscape where CRP and wetlands come together is teeming with life," said FWS biologist Ron Reynolds.

But "both water and CRP are ephemeral and could disappear as fast as they came," said Steve Miller of Wisconsin's Department of Natural Resources. All gains realized this year could be lost" unless the program is reauthorized.

Coupled with spring and summer rains, CRP produced excel-

millions of acres of duck nesting cover on the prairies," Robert G. Streeter, U.S. cochairman of the planning committee for the North American Waterfowl Management Plan.

Ducks Unlimited, in a report last month, says "CRP is demonstrating that wildlife population declines are reversible by extensive habitat restoration."

Waterfowl nesting success has tripled on CRP lands in the prairie pothole region of the United States. CRP land is estimated to have produced 3 million additional ducks in North and South Dakota and Montana in 1994, the

report says. The Fish and Wildlife Service's fall flight index of ducks this year is 71 million, a figure

based on surveys in the Upper Midwest and Canada. That is up from 59 million a year earlier.

CRP also has been a big help in helping double populations of ring-necked pheasants in many CRP states, the DU report says. The report cites six features of

CRP which are most important for wildlife:

-Amount of land, some 35 million acres.

-Emphasis on prairie land —Creation of blocks of habit larger than 80 acres.


-Relatively undisturbed nature of the habitat. -Establishment of cover suitable for wildlife, including native

grasses. -Restoration of diverse habitats, including previously farmed wetlands.



DEAR DR. GOTT: What is the cause of ringworm? Is it contagious?

DEAR READER: Ringworm is a contagious fungus infection of the skin, spread by direct contact. It usually appears as an enlarging, itchy ring of inflammation with a red and scaly interior.

Treatment with anti-fungus drugs such as Nizoral, is almost always

DEAR DR. GOTT: During a recent employment physical examination, I was found to be slightly anemic. My doctor was alarmed and put me through several tests, including two CT scans at nearly \$1,000 each. I gave blood three months prior, but it didn't occur to me that I should tell him this Is there a connection, or do I really have a problem?

DEAR READER: I can't be certain Although blood donation rarely caus es significant anemia (because the bone marrow promptly replaces the cells that were donated), if you were slightly anemic to start with, I sup pose giving a unit of blood could conceivably push your blood count into the abnormal range. Customarily, however, the Red Cross personnel check a donor's blood for anemia and certain infections before removing a

ransfusion. It's more likely that your doctor was on the right track: He chose to investigate the anemia further. In most healthy persons, the most common cause of mild anemia is iron deficien-cy due to blood loss (from heavy menstruation or internal bleeding), or iron-deficient diets. Nonetheless, other causes of anemia, such as can cer or vitamin deficiencies, have to be considered.

To allay your anxiety and answer the question you raise, ask your doc tor for a complete and intelligible analysis of the tests you had, the cause of your anemia, and the nature of any proposed therapy.

DEAR DR. GOTT: I read an article that indicated recent studies show that as little as two cups of coffee daily may significantly interfere with calcium absorption. Does caffeine have such an effect?



#### AIDS activist dies at 22

MIAMI (AP) Pedro Zamora, who educated the public about AIDS by discussing his life with the disease on MTV's Real World," died Friday, hours after his farewell appearance was broadcast on the show's season finale. He was 22.

Zamora was sick but still active in June when he filmed the closing episode of the program, which documents the real lives of a group of young roomates.

a group of young roommates. "That's where the real tragedy, the real-mystery of the disease lies," said Doug Herzog, MTV executive vice president of programming and production in New York. "He leaves the house a healthy man, or seemingly health-y. Four short months later, we're saying our goodbyes to him."

Zamora learned he had the AIDS virus when he was 17. Handsome, trim, dark-eyed and a gifted speaker, he went on a lecture tour, telling audiences at high schools and other organizations that he was infected through unprotected sex.

He testified before Congress, showing that "AIDS is a disease with a human face," President

Clinton said Friday.

'If you want to reach me as a young gay man, especially a young gay man of color, then you need to give me information in a language and vocabulary I can understand and relate to,' Zamora said at a congressional hearing July 12, arguing for more explicit AIDS educational programs.

He also was a member of the AIDS Action Council, a lobbying group for AIDS legislation, research and funding.

This year, Zamora appeared on the MTV program, in which a camera crew follows the unscripted activities of real people who were chosen to live together.

In the final episode, shown Thursday, they said goodbye to each other as they moved out of the house.

"The message was, 'Look at me: I'm 22 years old. I look healthy, I look vibrant ... but there's a killer lurking inside of me and it can come up and grab me at any moment. And we have to think of a way to stop it," Herzog said.

#### Tribe says emotions irrelevant

FRANKFORT, Ky. (AP) — The Standing Rock Sioux tribe says the custody battle over an 1-year-old girl is strictly a jurisdictional matter and has nothing to do with emotion.

"This case, like many under the Indian Child Welfare Act, brings forth strong emotions relating to the interests of the child, family members and the tribe," the tribe wrote in brief to the Kentucky Court of Appeals in the case of Kayla American Horse.

But the tribe says Kayla is its ward, and that Boyd Circuit Judge C. David Hagerman had no authority to grant custody of the girl to Loni Rye, who has raised Kayla since 1984.

"Congress has specifically provided that the appropriate role of a state court in a case involving the custody of an Indian child is to apply the jurisdictional mandate of ICWA, not to address whatever emotional backdrop the case may present," said the tribe's brief, filed on Wednesday.

The tribe is seeking Kayla's return to its reservation on the North Dakota/South Dakota border. But Hagerman ruled April 11 that it would not be in Kayla's best interest to return her there.

The case has focused attention on the conflict between tribal rights and the child's wishes. Rye claims she found Kayla living in squalor on the reservation. The tribe granted her and her ex-husband, tribe member Kim Weasel, temporary custody

of Kayla, while retaining her as a

When the couple separated in April 1993, the tribe intervened in the case to assert its jurisdiction over Kayla. At the time, Hagerman granted the motion to intervene based on the 1978 federal act, which was passed to stem the flow of adoptions off the

reservations.

Rye argued that the tribe had not shown an interest in Kayla for 10 years, including refusing to pay for a heart operation. Hagerman agreed.

#### Vatican predicts deficit

VATICAN CITY (AP) — The Holy See on Friday projected a \$22.4 million deficit next year despite an expected increase in contributions to the church.

The Vatican, which has reported just one surplus in 24 years, makes money from investments and real estate in addition to getting money from dioceses.

The Detroit cardinal overseeing Holy See finances, Edmund Szoka, said low interest rates at Italian banks and unstable currency exchanges in 1994 were to blame for putting the Vatican in the red. He said estate income was expected to rise slightly.

Contributions from dioceses, religious orders and money-raising foundations were pre-

dicted to be \$44 million, up from \$33.8 million in 1993.

With other earnings, the Vatican projects total income of \$157 million.

The cost of running the Vatican and its embassies rose 12 percent over two years, to a projected \$84.5 million in 1995. The balance of the Vatican's \$179.4 million in expected expenditures will pay for administration of religious orders and other Catholic institutions.

The Vatican announced a surplus of \$1.5 million in 1993, the first in 24 years and the last year for which figures were available.

The deficit hit \$87.5 million in 1991, but fell to \$3.3 million in 1992. It was projected at \$26 million in 1994.

#### Carmen McRae dies at 74

BEVERLY HILLS, Calif. (AP)

— Carmen McRae, a scat-singing jazz virtuoso with a smoky, seductive voice, is dead at 74.

McRae, who died on Thursday
a month after suffering a stroke,
was ranked with such song stylists as Sarah Vaughan, Ella Fitzgerald and Betty Carter.

"She said, 'I don't want a

memorial. I don't want a memorial. I don't want a funeral. I don't want a funeral. I don't want flowers. All I want to be remembered for is my music,''' said Jan March, her secretary and friend of 26 years. "That was her whole world."

With phrasing that often sounded effortless, she blended tones ranging from the nasal to the guttural.

He repertoire included "God Bless the Child," a song closely associated with her biggest influence, Billie Holiday; Cole Porter's "I've Got You Under My Skin;" Billy Joel's "New York State of Mind;" and Dave Brubeck's "Take Five."

"Every word is important to me," she once said. "The lyrics of a song I might decide to sing must have something that I can convince you with."

McRae had been bedridden since suffering respiratory failure four years ago during a show at the Blue Note nightclub in New York. She never performed again.



Still, if you feel you must see "Scarlett," tune in the first episode Sunday night.






