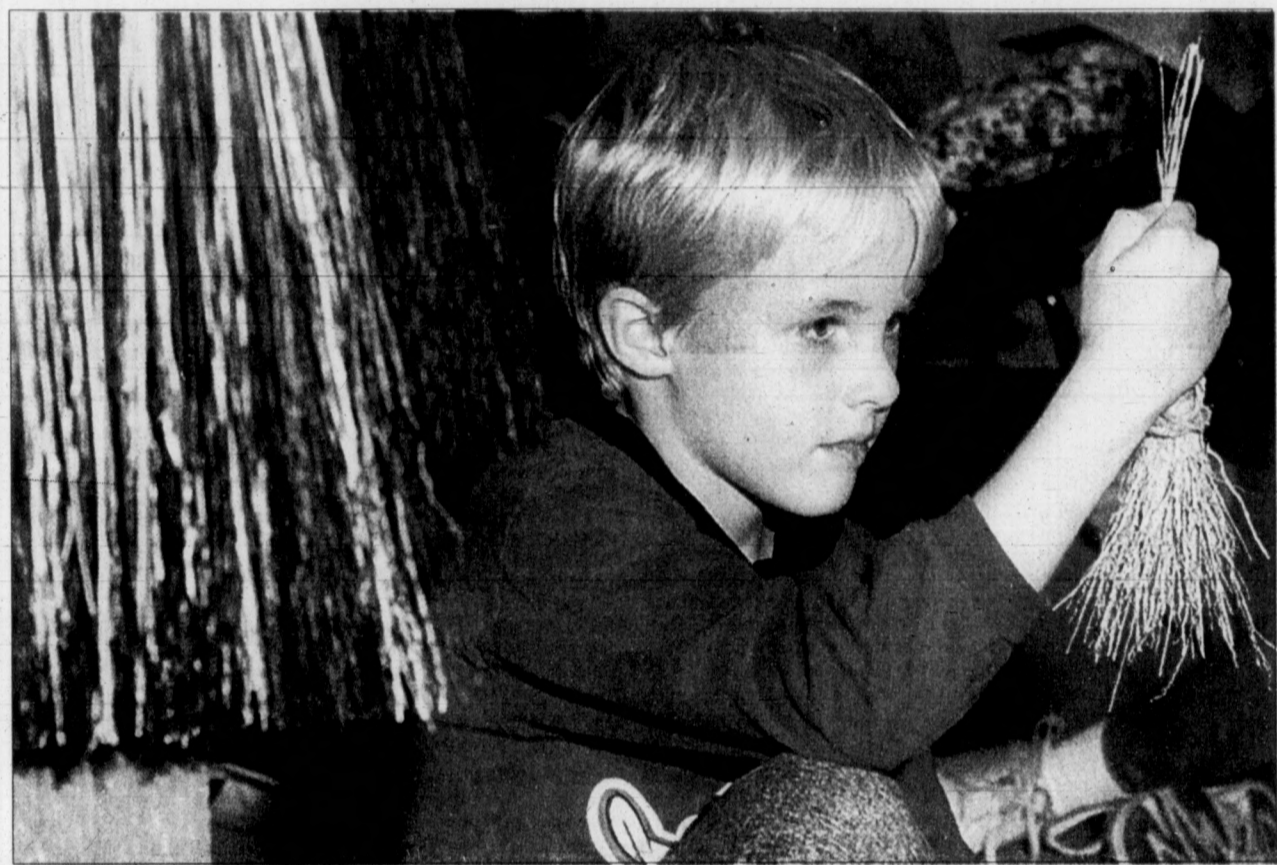

Ethics

County code challenged

Prior to the passage of the county's new ethics code Thursday, residents challenged the Calloway County Fiscal Court to devote more time to it.

"I'd really like to see more teeth in it," said Fayte Brewer. "I think it should show that our elected officials are not above the law. I'd also like to see the nepotism policy changed because you shouldn't hire your family." The court is required to have an ethics code in place prior to Jan. 1 as mandated by the state in House Bill 238.

According to Calloway's ordinance, the purpose is to provide a clear guideline for standards of ethical conduct by elected and appointed officers, as well as county employees.

The residents objected to the penalties which could be imposed for violations.

The penalties contain a five-step process ranging from issuing

an order for the violator to halt the violation to referring evidence of criminal violation to the county attorney or commonwealth's attorney.

"We really need a strong, hard-hitting ethics code," said Ron Ball. "The state legislators were cheery and left it up to 120 counties to do it themselves."

Residents also brought up the example of Calloway County Court Clerk Teresa Rushing, who has been indicted on charges of felony theft by failure to make required disposition of property.

Although the indictment was handed down June 29, 1994, Rushing is still in office even though she has passed her duties as fiscal court secretary to Elaine Paschall.

"Why not relieve her of her duties and restore our confidence in you?" asked Max Canady, County Attorney David Har-

Rickman asks about pay rumor

Rumors raised a ruckus at Thursday night's city council meeting. Following the regular meeting, Johnny Rickman, an outspoken advocate of the Murray Police Department, questioned the council about a rumor that one officer has been promoted and has received a \$6,000 a year pay raise.

None of the council members responded to the question, which was posed during new business prior to adjournment of the meeting.

Murray Police Chief Larry Elkins did not say whether the rumor is true and referred the question to the city's finance department.

Local minister urges moderate vote

LOUISVILLE, Ky. (AP) — Top moderates are urging members of their faction to turn out in force for next week's presidential election to prevent a conservative takeover of the Kentucky Baptist Convention.

Seeking the presidency are a moderate, a conservative and a "middle of the road" candidate. The convention's annual meeting will be next Tuesday and Wednesday in Frankfort.

In a widely distributed letter, moderate leaders accused conservatives of targeting Kentucky for takeover during a September meeting in Nashville, Tenn., of

national Southern Baptist leaders. The moderate leaders endorsed the Rev. Bob DeFoor, pastor of Harrodsburg Baptist Church, in the letter.

"No election in recent years has been as critical to the future

of Kentucky Baptists as this year," reads the letter, signed by Don Mantooth, pastor of First Baptist Church in Morehead, and Greg C. Earwood, pastor of First Baptist Church in Murray. "Take a day off from work to assure

that fundamentalists don't take over the KBC."

DeFoor, first vice president of the state convention, has said his election "would establish that a moderate could be honest about their position and still hold a position of influence in state Baptist workings."

Conservatives have called the letter's suggestion false. Mike Routt of Shepherdsville, a conservative leader in the state convention, said he attended the Nashville meeting and the issue of Baptist state conventions did not come up.

WW II uniform still fits veteran

He walked into the office just as fit and trim as he was 52 years ago, and he was wearing the uniform to prove it.

World War II army veteran Wayne Williams commemorated Veteran's Day Friday by donning his dress uniform, doing a radio show, and spending a few minutes at the Ledger.

"I feel very sentimental today," he said.

The olive-green wool uniform was neatly pressed and adorned with various pins, stripes and honors.

In preparation for his radio broadcast, Williams put together a recording of military music from all branches of the armed

forces. "I think about the GIs from World War I and II, Korea and Vietnam and they fought hard and they deserve a lot of credit," he said.

Williams saw a great deal of the world during his 3½-year tour of duty.

He enlisted as a 23-year-old graduate of Murray State University.

In fact, Williams married in February 1942 and shipped out four months later.

"The president of the university even moved graduation up two weeks so we could all graduate otherwise the draft board would get us and we wouldn't get our degrees," he said.

Bill Gates buys Da Vinci papers

SEATTLE (AP) — Microsoft Corp. Chairman Bill Gates won the bidding war for a Leonardo da Vinci manuscript, paying a record \$30.8 million for 72 pages of notes and diagrams exploring the mysteries of the cosmos.

Christie's America in New York said the purchaser was anonymous, but a spokeswoman for Gates' public relations firm confirmed that he was the buyer, the Seattle Post-Intelligencer reported today.

"Leonardo represents the fusion of art and science," said the spokeswoman for Waggener-Edstrom of Portland, Ore., who refused to be quoted by name. "I think that's why he is of such interest to Bill Gates."

The manuscript contains Leonardo's distinctive backward handwriting and meticulous drawings, and includes his explanation for why the sky is blue and his advice on building dams.

Gates plans to tour the work in museums around the world, the spokeswoman told the Post-Intelligencer. Gates was unavailable for comment.

Christopher Burge, chairman of Christie's America, said Friday's sale was the highest price paid for any work of art sold at auction in the past four years, and the highest ever for a manuscript.

In the document, dated 1508 to 1510, Leonardo studies the water and cosmos through words and pictures. His explorations range from astronomy to the atmosphere, from physical geography to geology, from hydraulics to canal building.

On one page, he remarks that the light of the moon is reflected sunlight. He wrote a century before Galileo proved that the moon does not shine of its own

South American missionaries visiting here

Allen and Maria Dutton of Itu, Brazil, South America, are visiting in Calloway County. Dutton will speak at the 10 a.m. service and talk about his work as a missionary and show slides at the 6 p.m. service on Sunday, Nov. 13, at University Church of Christ.

Dutton has been working as a missionary for the Churches of Christ in Brazil for 32 years. Formerly of Fort Worth, Texas, he went with a team of 14 families in 1961 to the city of Sao Paulo in southern Brazil to work as missionaries.

Being the only single member of the group, he was given Portuguese language lessons by Maria, a Brazilian language teacher. Their relationship continued to grow and on Nov. 20, 1962, Allen and Maria were married and have continued to work as Church of Christ missionaries there.

The Duttons have lived in Sao Paulo, Porto Alegre, Jundai and now Itu in these past 32 years. They have established churches in all of these areas. In all 99 congregations have been started in the vast country of Brazil which has an area of 3,286,488 square miles. It is a nation of large cities with over 18 million people.

Dutton said "he is now working in leadership training, going all the way from southern Brazil to the Amazon area of northern Brazil to the city of Manaus where Church of Christ congregations are established.

"We strive to teach the people of the congregations to take the leadership in the churches and that is part of my work now to continue to help the congregations grow in those areas." He said he travels over 3,000 miles to these churches twice a year to train elders and deacons and to give them leadership and encouragement.

Allen and Maria have three children — Dr. Allen Dutton Jr., an ophthalmologist and medical missionary in Brazil with his wife, Robin; Dr. Cynthia Gaiane, who operates a veterinary clinic in the city of Itu where her husband, Dr. Caio Gaiane, is a cardiologist; and Priscilla Purgago, a language teacher in Sao Paulo, married to Cesar, who works for the Bank of Brazil there.

Murray's defense rocks Trigg 21-0

Trigg nets -27 yards in rocky second half

While Trigg County's rocks rattled, Murray High was rock-solid in Friday night's Class A playoff game.

Murray limited the Wildcats to minus-27 yards of total offense in the second half to roll to a 21-0 second-round playoff win in front of the season's largest crowd at Ty Holland Field.

"The game went the way we expected it," said junior linebacker Jon Bell. "Both crowds were in it, and it was intense. Our whole defense just played awesome."

Murray (10-2) limited Trigg's new wing-T offense to just 122 total yards in a physical matchup of two smash-mouth offenses. Murray, which rushed for 232 yards on the night, scored three times in the second half to put the game away and set up next week's trip to arch-rival Russellville.

"Even though they had something new, it all came down to our kids," said Tiger head coach Rick Fisher. "They played with a lot of heart and a lot of determination."

"In the second half we started playing better and powered it right down their throats," said senior Adam Blalock. "We beat them at their own game."

Boone gets get-well gift in Tigers' shutout

Since Murray High defensive coordinator Tony Boone spent Friday night's playoff game in a Memphis, Tenn., hospital, the Tigers gave him two get-well gifts: a signed game ball and two eggs.

"As in goose eggs. "We wanted to shut them out to give him something," Tiger senior Adam Blalock said after signing the game ball from Fri-

day's 21-0 victory over Trigg County. "He would've loved it."

Boone, a Tiger assistant coach who was a leading force on Murray's 1974 state championship team, suffers from Crohn's disease.

The illness, which effects the small intestine, got so bad after Tuesday's practice that Boone was sent by ambulance to a Memphis hospital where he was placed in intensive care.

Rival Russellville next

"He was battling for his life for a while," said Tiger head coach Rick Fisher, adding that Boone's blood pressure dropped to dangerously low levels.

Boone has since stabilized and should move into a private room in the next day or two, according to Fisher.

Fisher said the episode shook

the team early in the week leading up to last night's game, but it soon became a motivator. Many Tigers had a "T" taped to the back of their helmets.

"The kids really wanted to win this one for him," said Fisher. "I think our kids learned a lot from this; it's hard for them to feel sorry for them-

selves with what Tony's going through."

"It was a surprise to all of us," admitted senior linebacker Ted Booth. "Coach Boone is the type of guy that after practice you hate him, but you love him after a game."

Tiger assistant Eddie Rollins, a teammate of Boone's on the '74 team, has kept in touch with Boone and his family in Memphis.

"I talked to (Boone) 10

minutes before the game and he said, "Tell the kids to win this one because I'll be back Friday," said Rollins, referring to the upcoming playoff game at Russellville.

Much of the Tigers' toughness on defense stems from Boone, who went on to play linebacker at Murray State under Mike Gottfried. He was a tough-guy when he played and

Norton, Haley key players in Cowboys-49ers collision

Top quarterbacks also a big part of Sunday's matchup

The Dallas Cowboys and San Francisco 49ers each have a disruptive defense led by a Pro Bowl player. Ironically, Ken Norton Jr. and Charles Haley both starred for both teams.

Norton was a Pro Bowl linebacker for the Cowboys before joining the 49ers as a free agent prior to this season. Defensive end Charles Haley was traded by the 49ers to Dallas in 1992.

On Sunday, the two teams meet in a replay of the past two NFC championship games. Dallas (8-1) won both en route to consecutive Super Bowl titles.

Haley, who will be making his fourth appearance against his former team, is hoping to increase his record to 4-0 against San Francisco (7-2).

"Every time he plays against San Francisco, he wants to play his best game," said 49ers tackle Steve Wallace, who will try to

keep Haley out of the San Francisco backfield. "I know I have my work cut out for me in more ways than one."

Norton will be facing his former teammates for the first time. "This is a very exciting time, a very emotional time," said Norton, who led Dallas last year with a career-high 159 tackles.

The Cowboys enter Sunday's game with the league's top-ranked defense. San Francisco has the top-scoring offense and Steve Young leads the league in passing efficiency.

The 49ers have won three straight regular-season games between the clubs at San Francisco, but the last was in 1985 when Joe Montana passed for two touchdowns in a 31-16 victory.

Young leads the NFL with a 101.8 passing rating on 179 completions in 259 attempts for 2,138 yards and an NFC-best 16 touchdowns.

Dallas quarterback Troy Aikman is the NFL's No. 2 passer with a 97.8 rating on 151 completions in 231 attempts for 1,825 yards and 12 touchdowns. The Cowboys also ride the running of Emmitt Smith, the league's No. 2

rusher who is only 89 yards short of his fourth straight 1,000-yard season.

Smith will be shadowed by Norton whenever the Dallas offense is on the field.

"Without a doubt I expect Ken Norton to be everywhere I go," Smith said. "Ken is a great linebacker."

Other NFL Sunday matchups have Cleveland at Philadelphia, San Diego at Kansas City, Chicago at Miami, the New York Jets at Green Bay, the Los Angeles Raiders at the Los Angeles Rams, Minnesota at New England, Seattle at Denver, Atlanta at New Orleans, Arizona at the New York Giants, Houston at Cincinnati and Tampa Bay at Detroit. Indianapolis and Washington are idle.

Buffalo plays at Pittsburgh Monday night.

Fall weather good for fishing

When you can find a bank where the wind isn't too strong to cast you can catch some fish. Usually the first of November is balmy temperatures with little or no winds.

Bass anglers are in search of that big trophy to put on the wall or just photograph and release for next year's quest.

The shad baitfish are still pretty active in schools that are still growing in size and most are very near the surface. They still jump and catch the gnats which hover the waters surface and this movement in turn telegraphs to the feeding bass where the food is.

Soft plastic twitch baits, chug bugs, pop-R's, zara spooks and a few other noisy topwater lures will draw a strike from the schooling bass.

The water temperature has cooled to 58-59 degrees already and will probably come down some more this weekend.

This helps the bass, crappie,

sauger and other species to become very active just like they do in the spring when the temperature is going the other way.

These fish know to feed and put on weight so they can live through the cold weather months when everything slows down.

Brad Gerkie brought his mom Mae Gerkie and his girlfriend Leslie (Grace) Lee down from Frankfort to fish for these hungry bass. Mae wanted a trophy to hang on the wall and Leslie just wanted to catch a fish.

We had two days of typical fall weather including a rain but we caught a lot of good fish. There were largemouth bass, smallmouth bass, big sauger, white stripes, pickerel, drum and skipjacks taken on shallow crankbaits and power craws, kalin grubs and rattletails.

Brad is the finesse angler and he could catch bass behind the crankbaits with soft plastic grubs or craws.

I almost forgot the chugbug, but don't you leave home without it! If there are bass within ten feet of the

surface the chugbug will bring them up. It is actually two lures in one. A face or lip like a pop-R and a body that will walk back and forth like a zara spook when twitched rapidly. It is really the hottest lure of 1994 on the market.

Brad, Mae and Leslie are super fine folks to be with and they can fish. We just had some bad weather to slow the feeding down a bit.

We caught a lot of fish anyway and they carried some great fillets home with them.

We will definitely have another go at them come spring time but I think Mae said she would rather wait out the winter by the fire!

Gun deer season set for Nov. 12-21

Before the end of the season, 200,000 people will go deer hunting in the Bluegrass state and spend more than \$78 million in Kentucky, according to figures from the Kentucky Department of Fish and Wildlife Resources (KDFWR).

Kentucky's modern deer gun season is set for Nov. 12-21 in most counties. (Some counties in eastern Kentucky will have a five-day modern gun season because of lower herd sizes.)

Deer hunters are required to have permission from landowners before entering private lands. During any firearms season, deer hunters must wear hunter orange clothing on the head, chest and back. The season limit is two deer, only one of which may be an antlered deer. Hunters should check regulations for the area they plan to hunt to learn when antlerless deer hunting is permitted.

The archery deer season will close statewide Jan. 15. Crossbow season extends for 10 consecutive days following the close of the 10-day modern gun season. The final segment of muzzle-loading season is Dec. 10-16.

Persons under age 16 must be accompanied by an adult when hunting deer with a firearm. Those born after Jan. 1, 1975 and required to have a hunting license must also complete an approved hunter education course before going hunting and carry a course completion (orange card) while hunting. Unless license-exempt, hunters under 16 must have a junior hunting license and may purchase up to two youth, one-tag deer permits (\$12.50 each) or one two-tag permit (\$21). Hunters 16 and over must purchase the two-tag permit in addition to the appropriate hunting license.

Deer hunting beneficial to economy, farmers

HERNDON, Ky. (AP) — The fellow wearing orange and sitting in a tree in mid-November is doing a good deal more than waiting for a deer to pass.

Although Kentucky's several deer seasons begin October 1 and end January 15, it's during the modern firearms season (Nov. 12-21 in most areas) that white-tail hunters are most visible. This is also a period during which the nimrods have their greatest impact on both the deer herd and

the state's economy.

The impact on Kentucky's herd this season should be to remove about 100,000 whitetails from a population of some 400,000, says biologist John Phillips, head of the Kentucky Department of Fish and Wildlife Resources' deer program. That estimate includes a 10-15 percent increase over the 1993 harvest.

Phillips, using a Cornell University computer program, has a record over the past decade of predicting the annual harvest within about six percent.

Using the same computer program, Phillips has done a projection of the effect on the Kentucky deer herd if sport hunting were ended.

Had hunting ended in 1990, his base year, the Kentucky deer population would now number about 2,000,000, up considerably from the current 400,000. A number of effects would be evident, Phillips' projection shows.

By 1996, the number of deer-vehicle accidents would jump from 1990's reported 4,673 to about 35,800. The number of

human injuries and deaths as well as auto insurance rates would climb.

Agricultural crop depredation would soar. The natural forage decimated, deer would concentrate on corn, soybeans, alfalfa, garden vegetables, and ornamental plants.

Eventually, the herd would stabilize at about 1.25 million, the environment's "biological carrying capacity," but far above the "social carrying capacity," as the needs of the deer and the human populations collide. Deer

would be pests rather than the state's premier game animal.

In the economic sphere, too, the deer hunter is a significant factor, the wildlife agency points out.

Some 210,000 deer hunters spend more than \$78 million in Kentucky each year. That involves food, gasoline, lodging, supplies, equipment and licenses.

Southwick Associates, a Virginia-based consulting firm, says that by the time these dollars ripple through the state's economy, they generate about \$170

million. All types of hunting produce about a half-billion dollars annually in the state.

That half-billion dollars translates overall, the same survey says, to some 8,000 Kentucky jobs, about a third of them deer-hunting related. Sport hunting licenses furnish about \$750,000 to local budgets because county clerks share in license fees.

Finally, deer hunters provide some \$6 million for the fish-and-wildlife agency, for the furtherance of conservation programs.

CRP set to be reauthorized

ATLANTA (AP) — The stage is being set for next year's attempt to reauthorize the Conservation Reserve Program, a farm program hailed by conservationists as one of the most successful ever.

Started as part of the 1985 Farm Act, the CRP allows the Agriculture Department to pay landowners to take highly erodible land out of production and plant it with grasses, legumes or trees that hold the soil and provide wildlife habitat.

The program is up for reauthorization by the next Congress. It is given credit for this year's rebound in duck production in the United States' prairie pothole

country and has benefited a variety of other birds including bobolinks, bitterns and Western meadowlarks, according to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service.

"The landscape where CRP and wetlands come together is teeming with life," said FWS biologist Ron Reynolds.

But "both water and CRP are ephemeral and could disappear as fast as they came," said Steve Miller of Wisconsin's Department of Natural Resources. "All gains realized this year could be lost" unless the program is reauthorized.

Coupled with spring and summer rains, CRP produced excellent habitat this year.

"The weather and the Conservation Reserve Program have put

millions of acres of duck nesting cover on the prairies," said Robert G. Streeter, U.S. co-chairman of the planning committee for the North American Waterfowl Management Plan.

Ducks Unlimited, in a report last month, says "CRP is demonstrating that wildlife population declines are reversible by extensive habitat restoration."

Waterfowl nesting success has tripled on CRP lands in the prairie pothole region of the United States. CRP land is estimated to have produced 3 million additional ducks in North and South Dakota and Montana in 1994, the report says.

The Fish and Wildlife Service's fall flight index of ducks this year is 71 million, a figure

based on surveys in the Upper Midwest and Canada. That is up from 59 million a year earlier.

CRP also has been a big help in helping double populations of ring-necked pheasants in many CRP states, the DU report says.

The report cites six features of CRP which are most important for wildlife:

- Amount of land, some 35 million acres.
- Emphasis on prairie land.
- Creation of blocks of habitat larger than 80 acres.
- Relatively undisturbed nature of the habitat.
- Establishment of cover suitable for wildlife, including native grasses.
- Restoration of diverse habitats, including previously farmed wetlands.
