

President fires Elders

WASHINGTON (AP) foes of Surgeon General Joycelyn Elders' social views are celebrating her firing by President Clinton. But Elders, defiant to the end, said she does not regret saying school children should be taught about masturbation and suggested that her remarks were misinterpreted.

'People have taken a lot of things I've said in a most unusual way," she said Friday in a telephone interview from her home outside Washington.

Incoming House Speaker Newt Gingrich, who has repeatedly assailed Elders' views, called her 'a remarkably destructive person" who has long deserved removal from office.

And Rep. Marge Roukema of New Jersey, the most senior Republican woman in the House, said, "Great! What took her so long?" after Clinton demanded and received Elders' resignation.

White House Chief of Staff Leon Panetta said Clinton acted because Elders had ignored repeated warnings from administration officials to moderate her public statements. "This was one too many," he said.

ments in which she said the government should consider legalizing drugs, consider "teaching five-year olds to use condoms" and for saying that anti-abortion Catholics have "a love affair" with fetuses.

Her firing stemmed from her remarks Dec. 1 at a World AIDS Day conference in New York, when she was asked whether taboos about the public discussion of masturbation should be

Elders said: "As per your specific question in regard to masturbation, I think that is some thing that is a part of human sexuality and it's a part of something that perhaps should be taught. But we've not even taught our children the very basics. And I feel that we have tried ignorance for a very long time and it's time we try education.'

Elders said on Friday she had intended to explain her belief that masturbation is a natural act that would have to be included in any comprehensive discussion about human sexuality. But she does not believe young people should

LBL now has guidepost for land management

It may have taken 51/2 years, but officials at Land Between the Lakes have given birth to a 5-ounce plan for managing natural resources that will guide them through the next decade.

'The process we went through to develop this plan was very important," said John Mechler, manager of resource management at LBL. "We took a very critical look at what had been in place essentially since 1964.

LBL is a 170,000-acre outdoor recreation and environmental education area in west Kentucky and Tennessee.

The final environmental impact statement was signed by Kathryn the Resource Group Dec. 6.

"This plan represents a framework for us that is flexible," Mechler said. "It is not set in concrete so that we wouldn't be able to look at other methods or put a new trail in an area." The draft statement was released in November 1993 and

was then subject to a public hearing. From there, changes were made in response to more than 2,900 letters prior to completing the final plan.

The plan calls for an increased emphasis on scenic beauty, sightseeing, wildlife viewing and a

more natural appearance of the

forest as part of a new approach

to natural resources management. The controversial part of the plan deals with timber harvesting, which has not been practiced at

LBL since September 1992. Commercial logging was suspended after environmentalists

threatened a lawsuit. LBL paid more than \$850,000 to settle canceled logging contracts. The new plan replaces one that pro-logging forces objected to

last fall - one that emphasized "scenic vistas" and "visual corridors. After the protests, LBL offi-

cials went back to the drawing

board and made changes.
"I'm very comfortable with the

changes that were made," Mechler said. "Increasing the amount of land for the biosphere reserve is good, as well as making provisions for improving the visual

quality. Under the new plan, timbe harvesting would be reduced. Each year, even-aged harvesting would be conducted on 1,110 acres and uneven-aged harvesting on 1,070 acres, with an approxi-mate 20 percent reduction in the amount of timber removed as

Student faces lesser charge

Indictments returned by grand jury

The Murray State University student charged with attempted murder after firing a shot at another person was indicted by a Calloway County grand jury Fri-

day on a lesser charge.

Dennis B. Park, 25, Farmer Ave., was charged with seconddegree wanton endangerment, a Class A misdemeanor.

A female, who was with Park when the incident occurred at approximately 1:30 a.m. Oct. 31 near the intersection of 15th and Main streets, was not indicted.

Police charged Jessica Wilson, 19, Springer Hall, with attempted murder, but the grand jury returned a "no bill" against her, which means charges are

Dave Brodsky, 25, Madison, Tenn. is the alleged victim in the incident. Reports indicate that Brodsky and Wilson were acquainted.

The cases against Park and Wilson were sent to the grand jury after a preliminary hearing. District Judge Leslie Furches determined that there was sufficient evidence to send the case

According to police reports, Park and Wilson followed Brodsky from a party and allegedly

threw a bottle at Brodsky's car. When Brodsky stopped the car, Park hit the rear of Brodksy's vehicle.

The couple approached Brodsky when the vehicles stopped, and Wilson allegedly began strik-

'Night Before Christmas' manuscript auctioned off

NEW YORK (AP) - 'Twas right before Christmas, and for one famous poem, a man paid big money, and then took it home. Ralph Gadiel won a bidding war Friday, paying \$255,000 for a rare handwritten copy of "A Visit From St. Nicholas."

The famous 56-line poem was written in 1822 by Clement Clarke Moore. The copy being auctioned Friday — one of just three surviving handwritten copies — was transcribed by Moore at the request of an admirer in 1860 when he was 81 years old.

Christie's auction house had estimated that the poem, written in brown ink on a single 8-by-5-inch piece of paper, would sell for between \$70,000 and \$90,000.

But a bidding war drove the price up. Gadiel said he was determined to have it at any price. Gadiel, an entrepreneur from Northbrook, Ill., whose company

sells gifts and collectibles, plans to market a limited edition of copies of the manuscript in time for next Christmas. He already is manufacturing a miniature house like the one

described in the poem.
"It has Santa and his reindeer on the roof, and the father throwing open the sash," Gadiel said. "The house can be opened, so you

can see the children 'nestled all snug in their beds." Legend has it that Moore came up with the poem while he was out buying a turkey for his wife to roast on Christmas Eve and give

to the poor of the local parish. He jotted the verses down when he got home, and the following Christmas, a family friend sent a copy to the editor of the Sentinel newspaper in Troy, N.Y. It was published in 1823 and reprinted anonymously in newspapers and on broadsides until 1837, when Moore made his authorship public.

Kuttawa foundation falls under scrutiny

KUTTAWA, Ky. (AP) -Nearly all land that's not owned privately in Kuttawa belongs to a foundation that exercises substantial influence over the sixth class

city's affairs. The Kuttawa Relocation Foundation's finances are cloaked in mystery. It refuses to allow public inspection of its records. Until new directors were named this fall, the board seldom, if ever, met.

Critics accuse the foundation of stifling development — espe-cially development that might compete with established

The foundation was established in 1960 by local civic and business figures to help move the small town (population 535) when Lake Barkley was impounded.

'It's a closed society," said Clyde Adams, a Kuttawa City Council member who is developing a retirement center. "Nobody knows when they meet or what

they do. Nobody knows about their money.

Foundation President W. G. McConnell said "we have never discouraged business from coming here, but we have asked people what they want to do with land they want to buy.'

In the past four years, according to records at the Lyon County Courthouse, the foundation has sold 21 tracts for \$138,450, mostly to individuals for home sites.

No one, including McConnell, seems able to explain why Kuttawa hasn't grown appreciably in 30 years, while nearby Eddyville

The two largest buildings, a former grocery and a hardware store, are vacant.

Aside from two gas stations and a branch bank, the primary businesses are McConnell's drug store and the small insurance agency that bears the name of

Meanwhile, Park reportedly fired a shot in Brodsky's direction. Police reports indicate he waved the handgun in the direction of four witnesses. Police charged Park with

attempted murder and four counts of first-degree wanton endangerment. Witnesses at the scene have

been quoted as saying that Wilson was screaming that Brodsky had raped her. According to another grand

jury document, Wilson testified that on Oct. 1, 1994, Brodsky raped her.

However, the grand jury did not indict Brodsky on those charges. According to the court documents, Wilson said Brodsky committed first-degree rape when she was physically helpless.'



South rising again in Congress

WASHINGTON (AP) — The South is rising again on Capitol

Conservative Southern Republicans intent on shaking up Congress are chasing away the ghosts of the powerful Southern Democrats who once dominated the landscape.

The top three leaders of the new House are from the South, as are the chairmen of some key committees. In the Senate, a Mississippian ousted a Westerner from the No. 2 leadership post. The strict Senate seniority system, meanwhile, will put elderly Southerners in charge of the Foreign Relations and Armed Services committees.

The regional resurgence signals changes in both politics and policy. There are more Southern Republicans than ever, and they often reflect the country's most conservative leanings on fiscal and social

The November midterm elections were a breakthrough for Republicans in the 11-state South from Virginia to Texas. The GOP now holds a majority of Senate and House seats in the region — 64 of 125 in the House, 13 of 22 in the Senate.

"They've never been able to achieve that before. And there's still considerable potential for more Republican seats in the South," said Earl Black, a Southern politics specialist at Rice University.

Some Southerners say it's taken over 100 years for their region to forgive the Republican Party for the Civil War and its aftermath. Disillusionment with Democrats began with the civil rights movement, and has gradually trickled down from the presidential to the congressional level.

The trend has been reinforced by what some see as a reversal in party roles. The GOP, long faithful to business interests, is now viewed by many as a populist party. And its increasing social conservatism in recent years is compatible with prevailing Southern cultural attitudes toward religion, the military and other institutions.

But the major driving force behind the shift, according to political scientists, is suburban sprawl and the conservative economic attitudes it spawns wherever it occurs.

"This is the rise of the suburban middle-class Republican. All

these leaders and committee chairs — that's the type of district they're from," said Black. "The themes they emphasize aren't necessarily Southern."

At the head of lineup are incoming House Speaker Newt Gingrich of Georgia and incoming Majority Leader Richard Armey of Texas, both of them Northern transplants who represent affluent suburban districts.

The other rising Southerners in the House include Tom Delay and Bill Archer of Texas, the No. 3 House leader and designated chairman of the Ways and Means Committee, respectively; Bob Livingston of Louisiana, incoming chairman of the Appropriations Committee; Floyd Spence of South Carolina, new chairman of the newly named National Security Committee; and Larry Combest of Texas, incoming chairman of the Intelligence Committee.

On the Senate side, Trent Lott of Mississippi ousted Alan Simpson of Wyoming for the No. 2 whip job. But Lott, like his close ally Gingrich, has a national, rather than Southern, vision of conservatism.

Only a couple of decades ago, when term limits were not even a gleam in an eye, the House and Senate were run by people like Wilbur Mills, the House Ways and Means chairman who represented Arkansas from 1939 to 1977, and James Eastland, the Senate Judiciary chairman who served from Mississippi from 1943 to

The contemporary counterpart is South Carolina's Strom Thurmond, 92, a 40-year veteran who'll chair the Senate Armed Services Committee. The other Southern chairman will be North Carolina's Jesse Helms, 73, who is inflaming political passions as he prepares to head the Foreign Relations Committee.

The preponderance of Southerners — particularly Texans — in the new leadership raises the question of whether the region will benefit in the traditional manner of regions with influential legislators. The answer, given the party's national emphasis on shrinking government and cutting spending, may be no.

Pork barrel "has been a part of politics forever and it's certainly going to be a part of this Congress," says former Rep. Vin Weber, R-Minn. But he says it's not as potent as it once was and urges new legislators to focus on the broader picture.

Picturing Words

We get nostalgic and even selfrighteous about how much better we could see through books and radio -stimulating our imagination -- than through television and videos, but there is little evidence that today's youngsters have less imagination than did we. If anything, we lived in economic and social times that forced us to place self-limits on our imaginations that most children don't have constraining them today.

In fact, a case can be made that books in those days helped us tame our imaginations more than they unleashed them. We drew our role models and morals, even our dress and speech patterns, from them. Most of them were written using formulas, and hence quickly predictable. They structured us every bit as much as they liberated us.

Maybe video tapes and video games do the same for today's young folks. We shouldn't disparage or dismiss them too quickly. As learning aids, they certainly beat cruising the malls and the drive-ins.

Like books, they fill vacuums of

loneliness, and like books, they sometimes connect eyes to brains. Those are two achievements of some difficulty and consequence. Actually, videotapes are slowly becoming classified materials. Cer-

productive shopping tips for this Christmas season is to spend a couple of hours prowling through a video rental center and reaching some judgments about which tapes would be the best cultural enhancers for young minds on your list this year.

Despite paper shortages, books on cheap paper were in plentiful supply. There were classics like "Robin Hood" and "Treasure Island", shelves of Bobbsey Twins adventures and Albert Payson Terhune books about collies, Hardy Boys and Nancy Drew mysteries, the Laura Ingalls Wilder "Little House" series, a look-alike series of biographies of presidents, and lots of books about planes and wartime aviators.

We had no time-filling television or computers, and even radio offered little fare for the imagination beyond the evening comedians: Fibber McGee and Molly, Edgar Bergen and Charlie McCarthy, Fred Allen, Jack Benny, and Bob Hope.

Movies were popular, but limited to

two features a week and a Saturday

When enough of us got together, we had games: Chinese Checkers, Monopoly, Uncle Wiggily, Parcheesi, Authors, and Old Maids. We even made arcs around upright pianos and sand the words from the sheet music the girls playing for us took out of the benches.

But there were long periods of entertaining oneself. Books filled the void.

When we visit the local video rental store today, something about it reminds us of the public library of fifty years ago. In today's video store, one sees one's neighbors and schoolmates, just as we saw ours in the court-square library. The plastic video rental card is the same access avenue as yesterday's library card.

Even the conversations are the same. People discuss the merits and demerits, the plots and characters, of video tapes the same way we discussed books. They buy them, lend them, give them and shelf them the same way, too.

We used to peruse each other's bookshelves and judge others' tastes by what they read. Now we scan the video tape shelves and reach the same judgments. Everything has changed, but little has changed.

But, as the Senate debate made clear, the new agreement under the General Agreement on Trade and Tariffs (GATT) is not the coming of the fabled millennium. It should be improved upon in the future

The U.S. card in the negotiations traditionally has been access to the world's largest market. But now, the European Union can in some respects claim that distinction, and it was less amenable to U.S. demands than we would have liked.

The government, under three presidents from two parties, did make some important gains. But it has far from exhausted the possibilities in such areas as entertainment, financial and other services, agriculture and investment. ...

Still, it must be noted that freer trade means that some will lose their jobs, including textile workers in this state. Certainly those workers have a right to expect government to redouble its efforts to help them — through education and training — so they can continue to compete effectively in an increasingly global marketplace.







Crappie fishing best in years

anglers are enjoying some of the best fishing they've had in years.

Since most of the moss beds are gone, the big crappie have gone back to our old brush piles and dropoffs to hang out and feed The influx of water from Ten-

nessee and Alabama for the past two weeks has brought the temperature up about three degrees and I think this is one reason the fish are staying shallow.

Another reason could be the complete cloud cover which has lasted so long. If the baitfish will stay shallow, then the gamefish will do the same.

As we said earlier, the fresh water coming in from the South is warmer and it is carrying silt or mud and this "color" acts much the same as a curtain. I'm sure you have noticed whenever you catch a fish that it is lighter in color if it has been in muddy water for any length of time. This acts like a camouflage, so the predator can get closer to the prey and exert only a minimum

amount of energy It is tougher to fish out on the the sauger feed easily.

main lake when water is coming through this fast, but you can find some fish willing to eat. They may not stay very long, so be prepared to look around some. Minnows are working better

We are using a 1/0 hook with a single split shot and it is working a lot better than a two-hook ring. Another group of anglers who is having a great season so far is the sauger men. A current is what we look for, so the baitfish will

Most guys use a one-ounce lead head jig with a plastic minnow or grub attached. In addition to all of this, put a large minnow on the hook and a stinger hook through its tail.

The stinger hook is very important because most of your fish will be caught on it! A number six or eight works great.



Kentucky's duck population has increased

Today marked the opening day of Kentucky's second duck season. Hunters have heard all summer that duck populations are as high as they have been in the past 20 years. The number of mallards, pintails, gadwalls and widgeon were some of the most successful species. Biologists hope that this is the beginning of better things to come. Duck numbers have been at all time lows for the past decade, and duck hunters had to cut back on limits and the number of days to hunt.

With this good news in the increase of duck populations, biologists were careful in not allowing any increase in limits, but they did increase the number of days from 30 to 40. This careful planning will allow a better chance for more birds to return north to breeding grounds to hopefully continue the up swing duck numbers. Counting these

ducks is an important part of the management of ducks. One local biologist does just that.

Vernon Anderson, Kentucky Department of Fish and Wildlife distrcit biologist, twice a month takes waterfowl surveys by airplane. He takes his count in western Kentucky that extends from the Mississippi River to the Smithland Pool.

A few years ago, while a student at Murray State, Vernon invited me to go on one of these surveys. We started on Kentucky Lake, crossed over to Barkley and then up to the Smithland Pool. We then came back down the Ohio River to the Mississippi River and stopped the survey at the Kentucky-Tennessee line. It is impossible to count each individual duck, but a method called block counting is used. Vernon, along with other biologists, is trained to count in blocks of hundreds, and this method is remarkably accurate. That day, we counted over 10,000 ducks and 4,000 geese.

The survey is done twice a month on the first and 15th in the fall and winter months. Surveys are funded by the Pitman Robertson Act. These surveys tell biologists duck migration movements, as well as individual species' numbers. When Anderson conducted the survey on Dec. 1, duck numbers were not impressive in western Kentucky.

Swan Lake led the way with 7,500 ducks and 100 geese. Ballard County Wildlife Refuge had 2,600 ducks and 2,500 geese. Along the Mississippi River from Barlow to Fulton, there were 800 ducks and Kentucky and Barkley had around 4,000 ducks and 325 geese. Anderson said that the last big migration we had was on Nov. 27 and since then, duck movements have come to

There were some impressive numbers at Reelfoot Lake with 200,000 ducks with 75,000 of these mallards. Northeast Arkansas had almost 1 million mallards on the last count. Central and southern Illinois also counted around 500,000 birds. There is still plenty of waterfowl north of us. All we need is a little cold weather to push another migration through our area. Traditionally, Kentucky and

Barkley lakes will not hold many ducks until most of the shallow lakes and sloughs are frozen to the north of western Kentucky. If this happens this year, duck hunters can expect one of the best seasons in recent memory. I will try to keep waterfowl

hunters up to date on the numbers of ducks and geese throughout the



DEAR DR. GOTT: My husband use the herb rutin to relieve hemorrhoid discomfort. Is this appropriate?

DEAR READER: No, it isn't. Herbal remedies have not been shown in medical studies to be as effective as medicated suppositories. Severe hem-orrhoids that bleed or cause chronic pain may need surgical treatment.

DEAR DR. GOTT: I'm 16 and suffer from hypoglycemia. I can't get much information about my problem around here and would like to know more

DEAR READER: Hypoglycemia (low blood sugar) is defined as a blood sugar level below 45 milligrams per deciliter in conjunction with symp toms, such as hunger, faintness, palpi symptoms have to be corrected by uming sugar in order to establish the diagnosis.

True hypoglycemia is very rare and is usually due to a glandular imbalance. In the past, hypoglycemia was a "fad" illness, used to explain chronic atigue and other vague complaints Therefore, most reputable practition ers are loath to diagnose this ailment without careful documentation.

If you do, indeed, suffer from hypo glycemia, you need further testing to define the cause. Such blood tests can be coordinated by an endocrinologist a specialist in glandular disorders who will also prescribe a low-sugar high-protein, frequent-feeding diet.

DEAR FAVORITE READER: Bone meal with vitamin D is safe to take along with your present calcium supplement. However, because you unsure about the dose, I suggest that you ask your doctor about thi

Most experts recommend 1,500 to 2,500 milligrams of calcium supplements daily for post-menopausal women at risk of osteoporosis. (Women during their reproductive years need less, pregnant women need much more.) Although calcium supplements are harmless, it is not a guarantee that you'll avoid spinal curvature às you age.
