# Grand jury makes history with inquiry

A group of randomly selected residents have come together to make history in Calloway

A grand jury plans to investigate local crime and the state of the city and county's law enforcement agencies following a report from its predecessor.

Commonwealth's Attorney Mike Ward said that the grand jury is "just starting to scratch the surface" of local problems.

A special grand jury issued a report to the Ledger Friday morning which said: "We feel that the sheriff's department and the Murray Police Department are doing an excellent job with the resources and funding they have. But we are concerned the departments

are underfunded, and will soon face officer retention problems, as well as equipment

inadequacies."

Murray Police Department has already lost one officer, a five-year veteran with a college degree who left MPD and joined the forces of the Benton Police Department, which offers a higher salary.

Ward said this is the first time in his 14 years as a prosecutor that a grand jury has undertaken the task of investigating local

In fact, Ward said the event is even more noteworthy because the special grand jury (which was the regular grand jury seated in October) and the new grand jury (which was seated this month) joined together to discuss the

problems of law enforcement, crime and funding dilemmas.

Ward said the grand juries have almost "unlimited" powers,

especially in the realm of issuing subpoenas.

Douglas Tucker, foreman of the special grand jury, said members are concered about the lack of an adequate jail and the crowded conditions, the lack of a juvenile detention facility, the salaries of police officers and deputies.

"We began to feel like something was radically wrong," Tucker said. "There is a law and order issue or problem in Calloway County."

Tucker said members of the special grand jury began discussing whether it should investigate local problems based on their own personal knowledge of issues, as well as the things they saw and heard during their terms of jury service.

Therefore, the group asked Circuit Judge David Buckingham to appoint them as a special grand jury so members could continue their work.

Then the special grand jury asked Murray Police Chief Larry Elkins and Sheriff Stan Scott to explain what problems may exist within their respective departments and how each agency operates.

"We learned that the county deputies have no medial insurance coverage and are required to buy their own patrol cars, their own weapons and even their own

ammunition," the report said.

It added that the base deputy salary of \$16,100 per year is "inadequate to attract, and more importantly, to retain professional personnel."

Furthermore, the special grand jury supports funding for two more full-time deputies in an effort to alleviate personnel constraints within the department.

The report stressed that "Calloway County deserves better" in the area of law enforcement.

Currently, the sheriff's department is financially unable to provide 24-hour patrol and the number of deputies, which includes three full-time and four part-time, is the same as it was 11 years

The report also noted that while the Murray Police Department has a large staff, the beginning salary of an officer is \$14,300.

The city, which has a 24-hour

## Jones says regionalism took back seat

FRANKFORT, Ky. (AP) — Gov. Brereton Jones said the General Assembly rose above "regionalism" in a special session that ended Friday.

The session's nine working days produced bills for tax cuts, construction projects and legal help for some county officials. Jones signed them Friday in a ceremony in the Capitol Rotunda.

Most attention was given to the projects — a state history museum in Frankfort, a new convention center in Covington and expansion of Commonwealth Convention Center in Louisville.

Chief beneficiaries were cities of the state's "golden triangle"— the Lexington area, Louisville and northern Kentucky. Legislators from eastern and western Kentucky complained they were slighted, but the projects never were in real jeopardy.

"We have taken a major step away from regionalism," Jones said. "When we help one part of Kentucky, we help all of Kentucky."

Jones proposed paying the state's share of the projects with \$67.5 million in bonds. The Senate, however, attached an amendment to require cash payment of the history center's portion — \$17.5 million.


The House, where the bill originated, refused to go along. The Senate backed down Friday morning, withdrawing the amendment and passing the bill to avoid having House and Senate conferees negotiate a compromise.

The Senate also went along with the House's amendment to a bill designed to give the University of Louisville a site for a football stadium. The bill mainly provides for an exchange of state land in eastern Jefferson County and \$3.5 million in cash for a tract near the university campus owned by CSX Transportation.

In a complicated arrangement, the cash for CSX is to come through the university, but it is to be paid by the Kentucky Kingdom amusement park, which would benefit from the new stadium's parking area. The House amendment would require Kentucky Kingdom to post a performance bond or otherwise guarantee the money to protect the university.

Meanwhile, the House went along with Senate amendments to

# Candidates support balanced budget idea

LOUISVILLE, Ky. (AP) — Four gubernatorial candidates pledged to back Kentucky's ratification of a federal balanced budget amendment during a forum as each laid out their themes for the primary campaign.

But the candidates, Republican Larry Forgy and Democrats Paul Patton, Bob Babbage and Gatewood Galbraith, had little to say about the amendment's impact on Kentucky — which receives about \$3.5 billion in federal funds each year.

"I'm not saying it won't be painless," Patton told the forum Friday at the Kentucky Press Association's winter convention. "But I don't understand deficit-

spending — never have."

If the amendment requiring a balanced federal budget in 2002 clears the U.S. Senate, it likely would come before the Kentucky General Assembly as ratification is sought from three-fourths of the state legislatures before becoming part of the U.S.

Constitution.

In opening statements to the statewide newspaper group, the candidates gave a preview of how they may sell themselves to voters during the campaign for the

May 23 primary election.

Patton, now the lieutenant governor, painted himself as the only

patrol, maintains a minimum of

three officers per shift. According to the report, Murray police opened between 1,500 and 2,000 criminal cases and investigated an equal number of traffic accidents.

Another concern of the special grand jury, according to Tucker, is the increasing amount of drug activity in Murray and Calloway

"I'll use Paducah as an example," he said, referring to a massive drug bust in McCracken County this week in which officers served about 100 warrants related to drug activity.

"But it can't be just Paducah," Tucker said of the drug problem. "It has to be located in Murray and Mayfield and other cities."

"There is no effective department within the sheriff's office to combat drugs," Ward said. "And

Murray just has two officers." Linda Graves, a member of the special grand jury, said she lives in the North Douglass community - an area she said is infested with drug dealers and users.

"I've lived there 26 years, and it has really gone down because of the drugs," she said. "Kids are coming in there and making a fortune. These kids are 12 and 13 years. old."

Ward said he thinks many residents would be willing to pay higher taxes if they knew the money was going toward the fight against crime.

"But we don't know where it will go," said one new grand jury

Van Russell, foreman of the new grand jury, said he thinks some money that is currently in city and county coffers could be rechanneled.

"The central focus is credibility and accountability," Tucker said.

Russell said the new grand jury will begin its focus on those issues as it begins its investigation.

"We can stop this problem if we start now," another new grand juror said.

When asked how important the issue of crime and law enforcement support is to the members of the special grand jury, one member said: "We're back. That's how important we think it

Russell said he has even been out on patrol with a county

"You wouldn't believe the things that happen out there," he

But the special grand jury believes Russell. In the report, members said: During our tenure, we have learned of criminal activity with-

in the county that surprised us.

We realize that the sale and use

of drugs is not limited to metropolitan areas, but affects us, our children and our community. "We urge all agencies, elected officials, the city council and the fiscal court to work together, and with our law enforcement agen-

bills that phase in a limited repeal of the state taxes on inheritances and pensions.

Jones wanted both taxes repealed entirely. Instead, "lineal descendants" - grandparents, parents, children and grandchildren — would be exempt from inheritance taxes after four years.

Public employees, whose pensions now are tax-exempt, would

have to pay tax on pension income greater than \$35,000 and earned after Jan. 1, 1998. An exemption for private pensions would be phased in, reaching \$35,000 in four years.

The inheritance-tax bill nearly ran aground in the House. A Senate amendment to have the bill cover half-brothers and halfsisters was rejected in the House on a 48-48 tie vote.

House Democratic leaders had to maneuver to get the vote rescinded, then try again. The roll call was stuck again on 48-48 when Majority Leader Greg Stumbo of Prestonsburg warned that refusing to concur with the Senate would kill the bill. The roll call suddenly went to 51-47, and the amendment was secured.

The Senate went along with two House amendments to a bill that would repeal a forfeiture-ofoffice penalty under an obscure law that requires some elected county officials to post performance bonds before taking office.

The law was used to force the removal of a judge-executive in Breathitt County and a clerk in Powell County.

One amendment would let an officer who was ousted before the change petition a circuit court for the right to run again. The former officeholder would not be reinstated, however. The other amendment would set a \$1,000 fine - not forfeiture of office for future violations.

#### Frank adds wit, bite to arguments

WASHINGTON (AP) — It's been 40 years since House Democrats have been reduced to backbench sniping at a Republican majority, but they've quickly found a chief sniper who's a master at the fine art of making opponents wince.

Rep. Barney Frank, D-Mass., has long been famed for his quick wit and debating skills. So he was a natural when Democrats set out to show that the new Republican agenda should be treated with a good deal of skepticism, and a dash of humor.

'When you are in the majority, sometimes inevitably you've got to defend some dumb things," Frank, a liberal whose views have not always coincided with the Democratic mainstream, told Republicans on the opening day of the new session. "But in one day, you have been dumber than we were in two years."

Frank was the point man for testy Democrats as Republicans kept them on the floor until well past midnight, voting on a host of measures to change the way the House does business.

"You told us you would be family-friendly," Frank said. "You forgot to tell us it would be the Addams Family that would be friendly, because we will be doing it at 3 o'clock in the morning."

Last year's Republican minority also had its floor watchdogs, such as Reps. Bob Walker of Pennsylvania or Dan Burton of Indiadgered Democrats with questions and challenges. But Frank has the ability both to irritate and amuse.

'Parliamentary inquiry," Frank called out shortly after midnight during the marathon opening session. "Will the speaker tell me if it is his ruling that it is still Wednesday?

"I just want to know what day this is. I was told we have to do this on the first day," he said, referring to the Republican promise to pass a host of reforms on the first day.

Even Republicans voiced their admiration. Rep. Matt Salmon, a freshman from Arizona, praised Frank's eloquence: "I am impressed. You are even better in person than you are on C-Span.'

Frank, 54, has gained a reputation during his 14 years in Congress as a champion of liberal causes and a supporter of deep In an interview, Frank said Democratic Whip Dave Bonior of

Michigan had asked him and Rep. Robert Wise of West Virginia to be in charge of about a dozen Democrats assigned to keep Republicans on their toes during floor debate. Their job, he said, will be to point out the "weaknesses, flaws

and hypocrisies" of the opposition. It's a task that is less satisfying than writing legislation but also more fun, he said. Humor "both lightens and sharpens" the political battle, he added.

Despite pledges of bipartisan cooperation, new Speaker Newt Gingrich, RaGa., is a "most thoroughly confrontational guy," Frank said, and there are bound to be disputes as the session

He gave a preview of that when he chided Republicans for their post-midnight vote on a bill forcing members of Congress to abide by the same worker protection laws as other employers, a bill supported by Democrats but blocked by Senate Republicans last year. Republicans are lucky the bill does not apply to copyright laws, he said, "because if it did, this example of intellectual theft and

#### Not in favor of public broadcasting

Recently, as the freshman Congressmen have begun debate on the possibility of a Balanced Budget Amendment, we have been hearing cries throughout the public sector supporting the "need" for certain

One cry I've heard is about the Public Broadcasting Service which produces such programs as Sesame Street. I believe it's time to get rid of public broadcasting except in the case of national emergencies, even if it

I simply can't imagine how many people can view without some degree of protest, programs that I understand are aired by KET today promoting the "acceptance" of homosexuality as an alternate lifestyle while knowing that their tax dollars are paying for it. We can live without "public" broadcasting. We'll simply find other ways to get our information. Oh, for the days when we weren't so divergent.

# Erasing an old image

WASHINGTON (AP) was Cher's scorned ex, a '60s has-been, a political lightweight. But this week the insider crowd was laughing with Sonny Bono, not at him, and his image may never be the same.

The idea of Bono in Congress has always been strange, and he didn't make it seem any more natural after he won a House seat in November.

"The last thing in the world I thought I would be is a U.S. congressman, given all the bobcat vests and Eskimo boots I used to wear," he said.

Still, when the 104th Congress convened, there he was — such an anomaly that Time magazine began a weekly feature called "Sonny Bono: The First Hundred Days.'

His was a pretty humdrum existence until a black-tie Washington dinner on Wednesday night. Bono was the clear standout, convulsing a hardboiled audience of politicians and journalists with a rambling commentary that captured their workaday world in all of its surreality.

Only C-Span televised the latenight dinner remarks, and there was a run on the cable network Thursday to view the tape. Bono was showered with congratulations from colleagues on the House floor and in the adjoining Speaker's Lobby.

"I have never laughed so hard," said freshman Rep. Joe Scarborough, R-Fla.

Other reviews were more circumspect. "Interesting commentary on the times we live in," said White House press secretary Mike McCurry. "A sort of performance art," said Rep. Barney

Frank, D-Mass. A star is born, or in this case,

perhaps reborn. "I'm overwhelmed at the impact it had," Bono said Thursday. "It's definitely the buzz."

Bono, a California Republican, said his one fear had been that "the other side would take it the wrong way." But a prime target of his speech was another Republican, Bob Dornan, who had gotten himself gagged earlier Wednesday for saying something particularly harsh about President

Clinton on the House floor. Bono made numerous cracks about Dornan's lack of focus during a purported conversation the two were having, and his instant "forget it, I'm outta here" reaction when the House parliamenta-

rian ruled he'd been out of line. "I said, 'Bob, why did you DO that?"' Bono said. "Bob says, 'I'll be on C-Span every hour. Who cares?"

"So I love this game," Bono continued seamlessly. "I am so pleased that we are all so dedicated to mankind - unlike show business where, there you have egomaniacs and you have powermongers and you have elitists."

On the morning after, Dornan was nothing if not congenial. He clasped Bono's shoulders, invited him to breakfast and pledged to focus on him like a laser beam in future conversations.

"Bob, you got a minute?" Dornan asked himself, pretending to be Bono.

"Sonny, I got 30," he answered himself and waved to an imaginary secretary. "Cancel everything on my schedule." 'You're a good sport," Bono

Among the confidences Bono imparted on Wednesday night: He really wanted to be a

senator because "it appeared like they could tell anyone to go to hell and they would say, 'Yessir. Thank you and God bless you.""

He's still trying to determine what Sen. Phil Gramm, R-Texas, meant when he told an audience that "you can't eat corn if you ain't a pig.'

-He loves "political lingo" and can't wait to learn it.

Bono, who became a restaurant owner and then Palm Springs mayor en route to Congress, came to town knowing full well he was not perceived as a brilliant player.

"I feel fine about it, answering questions about my ability," he told The Washington Post. "I am a very thick-skinned person."

That image was good, however, for a couple of jokes at the dinner. The organizers, he said, had ordered him to be funny and it saddened him greatly.

"Evidently none of you know what I've gone through to be serious," he said. "Look back a little bit. Remember the other woman, of course. She wasn't easy to shake when I wanted to pursue this career."

Cher wasn't easy to shake even after he got his career.

"Politicians are one step below used car salesmen," she said after he won. She further predicted Sonny would be "perfectly at home" in his new milieu.

On that second point, she turned out to be right. For better or for worse.

# Teaching's loss

A year after learning he had incurable pancreatic cancer. Douglas Paschall died. He had just turned 50. It was three days before Christmas.

The only thing that makes sense of Douglas's senseless death is his life. He lived a terrific one, much fuller and richer than most.

The obituaries for him were many and unusually long, and the eulogies at standing-room-only memorial services in Nashville and Sewanee were simple and dignified.

They all paid tribute to the bare facts of his life: rural west Tennessee high school valedictorian, Mid-South spelling bee champion, University of the South honors graduate and football captain, Rhodes Scholar and classmate at Oxford of Bill Clinton, recipient of a Ph.D. in English and of an honorary doctorate from Sewanee, headmaster of Montgomery Bell Academy author, organizer of the Southern Literary Festival, grandson and son and nephew of educators, beloved husband and father.

By all accounts, Douglas was that rarity: a Renaissance man. That he was, indeed — and much more: the personification of the inquisitive and achieving scholar-athlete-gentleman he wanted each MBA student to be.

Yet, if pressed to select one word to describe himself and how he would like to remembered, he would have quickly chosen "teacher."

We shared a common geography of Henry County, Tenn., origins, and a deep affection for his father. I saw him as a youngster, tagging along with his father to farm field baseball games when his father was still pitching in his forties, and I had two lengthy conversations with him in his

adult days, once over dinner and until her death 35 years later. into the evening at his father's house and years afterwards when he brought a van of students to visit our Wofford campus in

There was some correspondence in between talks. He was close enough to call friend and If one thinks back through

those conversations and then scans closely his installation and valedictory addresses at MBA, and some interviews in between, the evidence of Douglas's commitment to teaching is overwhelming. He taught at the college level

for 18 years and at the prep school nearly seven: together, half of his life. Even in his final illness, after having given up his headmastership, he continued to

"I can't remember ever seriously thinking of being anything else" than a teacher, he told a Nashville reporter a year ago, when the MBA fine arts center he had built was named in his honor.

"I taught a little bit of everything, a Shakespeare class for majors, critical theory, modern drama, Renaissance poetry. I love being in the classroom." At a father-son banquet in

1988, Douglas encouraged his MBA students "to begin to think like a teacher." His own mother had begun

teaching at 19, and continued

His father began at age 26, after five years in the armed forces and World War II, and taught for over 30 years.

His father's mother began teaching in a one-room schoolhouse in 1905, at the age of 16. Eight of her 12 children became teachers.

Douglas met his wife at Sewanee Academy, where she taught

From that background came the sense I had from my family that teaching was the most interesting, most challenging, and most noble of all the pursuits open to bright young people," he

"My parents and relatives never bothered to debate whether learning or teaching were valuable, but only how they might be done better; and they conveyed to me, from my earliest recollections, the excitement and intrinsic regards of life as a teacher."

His credo was simply stated, but difficult to achieve: "The greatest thing a school can do is to provide students a base of factual knowledge, certain practiced, but flexible skills, and above all, the range of specific learning experiences, both within and without the classroom, that will insure their ability to go on learning for the rest of their lives.

And not only to insure this ability in terms of acquired skills

and powers, but also to instill in students the habits of curiosity and skepticism, so that they will always be ill-content with the easy answer; and likewise to enforce the childlike instincts of wonder and fascination that will invite them to watch and respond to a world with a special quality of alertness, concentration and finally, love."

At the end, he ran toward teaching, not from it.

"I am exactly where I want to be," he said last summer. "To head off somewhere would be a punishment. I would rather go to English class every morning. If you're doing what you love, you're situated where you belong."

At the Commercial Bank over in Henry County, the soil from which this Antaeus sprang, a Douglas Duane Paschall Scholarship receiving fund has been set up for the local high school.

Graduates going on to study English as Douglas did will be competing for scholarships bearing his name and legacy. He'll be a hard act to follow.

Shakespeare, whom Douglas relished and knew by heart, wrote, in "Romeo and Juliet:" "When he shall die,

"Take him and cut him out in little stars,

"And he will make the face of heaven so fine "That all the world will be in

love with night, "And pay no worship to the garish sun.

Henry County High School students reaching for the stars will find one brightly twinkling out there, beckoning them on in joyful welcome to the universe. With that honing beacon and a little luck, maybe - just maybe - the best will take up teaching.



#### Laker guard sets 3-point mark

Stephanie Holland missed her first three-point shot Friday night, but not much else.

After misfiring on her first long-range attempt against Reidland at home, the Calloway junior went on to hit a school-record nine threes, leading the Lady Lakers to an 86-66 homecoming victory, their fifth in six games, lifting their record to 8-7.

Following the early miss, Holland drilled three straight treys as Calloway opened a 9-2 lead and never trailed.

Holland made a total of four triples in the first quarter, one in both the second and third periods and finished off the night with three more in the fourth, breaking the record on a shot that hit the rim, bounced up and fell in with under 10 seconds remaining.

"I didn't know how many (threes) I had; coach didn't tell me, I guess he thought it would make me nervous," said Holland, who bested the previous record of eight threes, set last year by Vanessa Bucy. "Coach O'Rourke just told me to keep shooting.'

"Stephanie can hit the threes when she wants to," Calloway coach Peter O'Rourke said. "We want her to shoot the ball, but we really want her to play defense."

Holland was a part of an offensive clinic put on by the Lady points on the night while Molly Wisehart and Kylie Johnson both had nine. The Lady Lakers were it over but we did instead.





Calloway's defense had to step early in Friday's game, as the Lakers went through an 0-for-7 skid and allowed Reidland to tie the game at 8-8 in the first.


Calloway took the lead for good on Bohannon's baskets and led 20-13 after one quarter on a Cleaver 3-pointer with time running down.





# Stripers in abundance lately

Conditions are not too bad at this time, and the elevation of both of our lakes is under control and on the way down.

The opening of the gates on both dams turned the big rockfish stripers into feeding machines for several days, and the bank fishermen really did have some fun. There is no telling how many were caught this week, but most everyone I talked to said that it didn't take over an hour to catch a limit of three. They were weighing between eight and twelve pounds as a rule. A few nice-white stripes came up

to feed as well, and there were also anglers who took them. The large shad population has kept the predaor fish fat and sassy. The small kill we had didn't even put a dent in

I hope we can keep a large number for spawning this year. This really helps to bring the striper crappie and bass population up and keep them growing fast. Many of you remember the times

when there were schools of shad that reached across the lake from side to side, and almost as far as you could see to the north or south. We also had schools of stripers

to eight hours a day and eat those

The water temperature on both lakes is in the mid-forties and this is good. As soon as the gates are closed, the sauger will move back towards the dams and feed there until spawning time.

The clarity isn't as important in the winter months to some, but others want a little stain so they can fish their spider rigs directly over them. We are selling a lot more jigs now, and folks are reporting good catches of crappie on the green/ black, green/white, orange/chartreuse, chart/gold glitter and pink.

The first few days when there was ice forming around the shorelines,

that would stay on the surface for six anglers were catching crappie by casting jigs from the bank.

I was tickled at one stately couple who said they only caught 18 that morning. The gentleman said they had had a lot more hooked, but lost them when the fish flopped around on the ice and broke through, pulling the hook out. The wife caught the most!

Some of the schools of crappie suspended when the cold front hit. They would move to a ledge or brushpile to feed, but shortly after, they scooted out to 15-16 feet and sat there

When you find a school doing this, set your minnows or jigs one to two feet above them and see if you can trigger a feeding spree this way.

If not, move to another location and try them. Sometimes they just hang suspended waiting for a school of baitfish to come along, so you just might hit the right one and take a

This could be from the large shad populations being spread out of because the water hasn't been cold enough to make the crappie form the huge schools we used to see. The other possibility is one we don't like to think about, but it could be the reason, and that is we don't have the

numbers of crappie we used to have. Many crappie are still taken illegally about six months out of both lakes. It is only a matter of time before a lake this size is crippled forever if the violations continue. If you see it, report it!

Bass anglers are still taking few largemouth and smallmouth, but the action is slow.

Most guys and gals are getting new tackle and cleaning the old stuff to be ready for warmer weather.

There is a lot of new tackle in the stores, so break loose and stock up for '95! Happy fishing!

# Cold weather doesn't stop crappie

As most hunting seasons are coming to a close, outdoorsmen are turning their focus to fishing. Crappie fisherman are usually the first ones to hit the water. During the colder months of January and February, crappie can be found in large schools along the drop-offs and deeper water brushpiles. Over the past ten days, crappie fishermen have had some success.

Crappie are being taken in 14 to 16 feet of water along the creek channels toward the mouths of the bays. Water color seems to be stained to clear in these areas and color selection has been important. Fisherman are using orange and chartreuse or black and chartreuse in the stained water, and blue and white and red and white in clearer water. The size of fish has been good with a lot of fish in the pound-

and-a-half to two pound class. Fishermen have also reported a big portion of crappie under legal size, which is a great sign for years to

During these winter crappie fishing trips, anglers have reported that the fish are moving a lot during the day. Early in the morning, fish are being caught toward the deeper water along the ledges, but as the daylight increases, fish are moving up toward the top of the ledge. Its not uncommon for crappie to move up around eight feet during the middle of the day.

Once crappie are found, it is important to fish slowly and fish the area thoroughly before moving to another location. This time of year, fish are slow to bite, so one must fish slowly to be successful. When locating a school of fish, make sure

to keep trying different colors and different depths. This will cover all combinations that will let you put more fish in the freezer.

There have been a few bass fishermen that have already taken to the water, and their success is limited, but they have taken home some trophies. People who fish for bass this time of year must fish very slowly, trying to cover every inch of shoreline. Bass will not chase anything very far, and the angler must present the bait right in front of the fish's nose. Slow moving baits such as suspending roughs and jig and pork combinations are a good choice when fishing in cold water.

Banks that drop off into deep water are places in which the fishermen can be successful. These areas will hold bait fish, and during the

day, shad will move up into shallower water; this will allow the bass to feed. Don't expect to catch a boatload of bass this time of year--a big bass can be caught. Over the past two years, anglers have found out that live bait is the easiest way to catch a bass in the winter. By placing a BB-size shot 12 to 16 inches above a number one-size hook, bass can be taken along the same deeper banks. The big plus about fishing live fishing bait is that big smallmouth are not uncommon.

When fishing this time of year, make sure to fish with someone and bring an extra change of clothes. These simple steps can save you if you happened to fall in. It is never a good thing to take off your life jacket even while fishing. Cold water is dangerous and by being sensible, simple steps can save your

went down one. Declarer was certainly right to worry about losing the lead to West, but his safety measure did not go quite far enough. Since he was willing to concede one club trick, he should have tried harder to lose it to

East. South's best method of play is to cash the club ace at trick four and then lead low towards dummy's K-9. If West follows low, the nine is played, losing to East's ten but guaranteeing the contract. An alternative approach is to lead a low club to the eight at trick four, producing the

same result as the cards lie. Note that both approaches also overcome Q-10-x-x in the East hand After West shows out on the second club lead, declarer can hold himself to one club loser by leading toward

Note also that leading the ace followed by the jack, though it succeeds on the actual layout, is not the correct play, since declarer would have to lose two club tricks if East

will not succeed if West has the Q-10-x of clubs and five spades, but in that case declarer cannot prevent West from gaining the lead with a win the trick. But West took the club no matter how he attacks the

sure to mention the title. DEAR DR. GOTT: I'm 45 and had my nails done with acrylic for seven years. About a year ago, one nail lifted from the bed. The nail doesn't hurt. but is very white. Numerous fungus treatments have been unsuccessful Now two more nails are affected. Do I have a yeast infection or a vitamin deficiency? \*\* ;\*

DEAR READER: Without examin ing your nails, I cannot diagnose the cause of your problem. Nonetheless. two possibilities come to mind.

Fungus infection may cause the nails to become discolored (white or yellow) and to retract from the nailbeds. Such an infection can readi ly be diagnosed by scraping material from under the nails, examining it under a microscope, and identifying the typical appearance of the fungus. On the other hand (forgive the pun)

the acrylic material you have used to build up your nails could be the cul prit. This substance can be absorbed into the nails themselves, giving a white, opalescent appearance. Worse, the acrylic may affect the growing portion of the nail and inter-

fere with normal nail development. As a consequence, the nail may become brittle and can split, crack or pull away from the nailbed. To get to the bottom of your prob-

lem, see a dermatologist. In the mean time, eschew any further nail treat ments.

to realize the inevitability of frozen pipes. The only sound way to prevent freeze-ups in an unheated house is drain the entire plumbing system, but since most of us live in heated houses it is nice to know that there are several methods in which to avoid

this disaster. If power is available, plug in an electric heater or heat lamp, or hang a 100-watt bulb near vulnerable pipes. Keep a door ajar between a heated room and an unheated room with pipes so that the unprotected area will receive heat.

Set an electric fan on your furnace to blow warm air over basement pipes and insulate exposed pipes. At Treas Lumber you will find, in addition to the thermostatic heating tape, several wrap-on and snap on varieties of pipe insulation that will retard freezing.
