



City boasts growth

While officials in other cities may have to scramble to provide services as the number of residences increase, Murray officials are confident that they can accommodate the influx into the community.

"As people move in and the population grows, we have to stay ahead," said Mayor Bill Cherry. "We have to keep the infrastructure in class 'A'

In keeping with that philosophy, City Planner Don Elias said that the city is in good shape in

term of utilities. We built our water and sewer treatment plants

so they could be expanded," Elias said. Water plant operations began about two years ago and wastewater expansions were completed in 1993. The water plant can treat seven million gallons of water per day, compared to the former plant which could treat only five million.

'We continue to look at expansion of our utilities." Elias said. "We constructed sewer lines in 1994. As you get sewer and water lines available, people snap them up. We continue to look at what plans we need to make to support new growth."

Murray was propelled into the limelight after being designated the number one retirement spot by Rand McNally in 1987 — a designation that

still draws people to the area, Elias said. "That designation was very important to us," he said. "Other factors regarding why people move to Murray are low interest rates and the low crime

According to figures provided by Elias, from 1990 to 1994, a total of 115 construction permits for new single family residences was issued. In comparison, from 1980 to 1984, only 35

were issued. "In 1994, for every one home built in the city, there were three built in the county," Elias said. We continue to hear that young couples are looking for homes that are less than \$90,000."

In response, Elias said developers are doing a variety of things to accommodate those needs. "A number of the building permits are for one-

bedroom structures, which we haven't seen very much of in the past 10 years," Elias said. "We continue to see a need for duplexes and triplexes." Many of the single-family homes are being purchased and rented and then become multi-family

dwellings," Elias said. "We haven't seen a lot of homes in the \$45,000-\$50,000 range and that is a concern of ours.' Elias pointed out that many of those seeking smaller homes are retired couples or young cou-

ples without children. "We feel this market needs to be addressed," he

Preacher's death caused by snake bite

Kentucky State Police were investigating the death of a mountain preacher who was bitten by a rattle snake, but a scholar who worked with Kale Saylor said Thursday that authorities should back off.

"He died practicing what he believed in," said Dave Kimbrough, who studied with the 77-year-old Harlan County preacher for 10 years while working on a doctoral thesis.

Kimbrough considered Saylor a friend and mentor and called him one of the "wisest people I ever met." He was concerned that people know Saylor and other snake handlers "are not a freak show.'

"My personal opinion is that I think the law should stay out of these type of things," said Kimbrough, of Stanford, Ind. "We're only here for a short period of time. We want a religion; we want something looking for that better world.'

But the death has reopened discussion of the obscure Appalachian practice, which was made illegal in Kentucky in 1942.

Saylor, of Bledsoe in Kentucky's southeastern coal field, died around 1:30 a.m. EST Wednesday at the Pineville Community Hospital, according to Clay Howard of the Mount Pleasant Funeral Home. Neither Howard nor hospital officials would release a cause of death.

Saylor was minister at a pentecostal church that bears his name at Stoney Fork, just across the line in Bell County. The incident allegedly occurred Sunday, but Trooper Johnny Collins of the state police post in Harlan said it was unclear whether it happened during a religious ceremony.

Bell County Deputy Coroner Bill Bisceglia said his office was not notified. Collins said state police did not find out about the death until late Wednesday.

"We looked at the body and took pictures last night," he said. Two of Saylor's sons, Kale Saylor Jr. and Stratton Saylor, declined to comment. Attempts to reach other family members were unsuccessful.

Under Kentucky law, it is illegal to handle or display any reptile in a religious ceremony. The punishment is a fine of between \$50 and \$100.

Trooper Tony Young, a spokesman at state police headquarters in Frankfort, said Thursday that the crime has no violation code and cannot easily be accessed on the agency's computer system. He said the Harlan post knew of only two similar incidents being reported.

"It's not something that we deal with on a daily basis," he

Ruth Farler of Perry County tried to get authorities to crack down on the practice last year after her son, Virgil Gibson, was bitten by a snake at a Leslie County church. He spent several days in the hospital.

"It's so sad," she said when told of Saylor's death. "They'll just keep on handling them, of course. Why don't the police do something about that?'

But Collins, from the Harlan KSP post, said there is no practical way to crack down on the practice.

"Nobody complains at the time anybody's handling snakes," he said. "People don't

Sommers' trial may not include exhumation

HICKMAN, Ky. (AP) — The defense has made no decision on whether to exhume the bodies of two young girls before David Sommers is tried a second time on charges of killing them. Investigators who testified at the original trial contended that

13-year-old Carrie VanMeter and her 12-year-old sister, Stephanie, were dead before the fire started that destroyed Sommers' home in December 1988. The prosecution also contended Sommers may have burned the house to conceal the crime.

After examining slides of tissue samples from the girls' bodies, Dr. Cyril Wecht said in a letter to Sommers' attorney, Don Muir, that he could not confirm whether the girls inhaled smoke. However, Wecht, a forensics expert from Pittsburgh who was

hired by Muir, said there is evidence the girls inhaled hot air. "That would indicate that they were alive at the time of fire,"

comes as no surprise. Beyer contends that what Wecht noted can be attributed to the fact that the girls' bodies had not been embalmed and that two

McCracken County Coroner Jerry Beyer said Wecht's finding

weeks had passed before the first exhumation. A McCracken Circuit Court jury convicted Sommers in 1989 and sentenced him to 1,000 years in prison, but the Kentucky Supreme Court overturned the conviction and ordered a new trial. It starts

ROTC program in limbo

After more than 40 years of operation at Murray State University, the foundation of the Army ROTC Program is beginning to crumble.

Because of the low number of students completing the program, as of Sept. 30, MSU's program will be downgraded from a host school, meaning a loss of approximately \$100,000 in funding.

"The Army has decided to make us an extension center of Austin Peay," said Maj. John Harbison, chairman of the military science department. "Basically, if the Army looked and determined that the program was not cost effective, it was downsized."

MSU has been a host school since the program was founded in 1952. In fact, Harbison said that many of the people in western Kentucky graduated from the program, especially since it was mandatory for all males

until 1972.

"What really caused the problem for us was the past four to five years," Harbison said. "For 1994, we had five graduates of the program. Our quality of graduates has been high, but we have been lacking in quantity."

According to information compiled by the military science department, in 1990, the program produced 21 officers. After that, the number sharply declined to only four in 1991, four in 1992 and then increased to 11 in 1993.

"Once we become an extension center, we have to produce 10 graduates per year just to get out of hot water," Harbison said. "In order to get our host status back, we would have to have 15 graduates for three consecutive years, which would show the Army that we would be cost effective."

Harbison said one of the main problems in getting students to enter the program is that many of them have no concept of what the Army is all

"There is a lot of misinformation out there," he said. 'Maybe there is a little of Vietnam hanging on or maybe there is the fear that you will have to go and fight.

In addition, he said that many people think of Rambo, Gomer Pyle or G.I. Joe when they hear about the Army. "I'm trying to shift away

from making the Army a

tial construction is concentrated in the south and southwest parts of town.

"There is a large amount of subdivision growth right now," he said. "We are also seeing continued growth on the northwest side of town."

Although Murray has not had any big industries come into the community recently, Cherry said the existing industries have been busy working on expansion projects.

"That has really helped our economy," he said. "Our smaller businesses are expanding just as the big ones are.'

In the past few years, both Fisher-Price and Briggs & Stratton have launched expansion projects.

"We aren't in an enterprise zone, but there are basic things we can do to help out local industries such as help them find grants and adequate space," Cher-

In fact, Elias said both the Fisher-Price and Briggs & Stratton expansions were assisted by low interest loans and grants.

"It is easy for industry to do business with us," Elias said.

While Cherry said the community hates to lose a business such as Kmart, he pointed out that the Kroger expansion project will provide a variety of opportunities.

"I think the vacant sites (storefronts) will be filled as



upgrades are made," Elias said. "I know we are all concerned that we get viable businesses in those

areas.' Both Cherry and Elias said partnerships among various agencies have assisted in Murray's

"We work in a partnership with the Murray-Calloway County Chamber of Commerce, the Economic Development Corporation and county officials to get people interested in our area," Cherry

"Because we were willing to go into a partnership with the state, we were able to get the green light on the Chestnut Street project," Elias said. "Without the local commitment, projects like the one at 16th and Main streets wouldn't happen."

While the city seems to be able to adequately support the growth it has experienced thus far, Cherry said it is important to "keep things maintained so we don't get mandates to do something."

"Our workforce at the police department is stretched and we need to add more officers," Cherry said. "We also need a new firestation on the north side on town."

He said it is also important to keep a close working relationship with the university.

"In our highway network plan submitted to the state, we looked at how we can make traffic flow better," Elias said. "There are small internal improvements that we can make. I think people move to town for the amenities."

Two of the biggest projects that Cherry said need to be tackled are the park system and the airport.

"We need to find new revenue sources for the park," he said. "The airport is in the process of extending the runway and once it is completed, it will mean a lot to local industries."

While officials wrestle with those problems, they want to make sure the city continues to

"I think we've done a good job, which is shown by the amount of growth we've had," Cherry said. "Poor infrastructure shuts down growth."

career," Harbison said. "Instead, I am emphasizing that people need to get some marketable skills."

Students at MSU are able to major in any field they want and participate in the program, which promotes leadership and communication skills.

"The opportunity is there and students can take the first two years of classes without an obligation to serve in the military," Harbison said. "Those who decide to complete the full program have to commit for eight years, whether it is for the Active Army, the Army Reserve or the Army National Guard."

Harbison spoke to MSU's Faculty Senate March 7, urging faculty members to assist him in enrolling students in the program.

"All I am asking is for the students to give me a chance," he

said. "If I can't keep the students after one semester, I don't deserve to have them.'

Because Murray's program has been downsized, Harbison will lose a member of his staff. In addition, he will lose control of equipment such as uniforms, belts and sleeping bags.

"Our program costs MSU \$35,000, which is used for one secretary and an operating budget," Harbison said. "In turn, the university receives \$400,000 in vehicles, personnel, etc. A portion of those funds is even used for postage and recruiting expenses."

Regardless of the reductions, Harbison is determined to produce quality graduates.

"If I keep the financial support of the university, the students will almost not be able to detect much of a difference," he said. "We are keeping up the pressure

to target good quality students." Area high schools and community colleges have been pin-

pointed by Harbison and his staff. "We are working closely with School Relations and we are contacting any students who indicate an interest in military science," he said. "We offer some very

lucrative scholarship packages." MSU is also stepping in to offer assistance. Harbison said MSU President Dr. Kern Alexander offered to allow four-year Army scholarship students to stay in the residence halls at no charge, which is an additional incentive.

"These are very competitive scholarships, but they pay for tuition, books and fees, in addition to a monthly stipend," Harbison said.

He estimates there are between 2,000 and 2,500 people attending snake handling churches nationwide, although the practice is confined mostly to central Appalachia. He said he has personally documented 74 deaths from snake handling.

Kimbrough said Saylor's death would not be seen by other devotees of the practice as an indictment of snake handling, or as a weakening of Saylor's faith. He said Saylor's previous wife, Jean,

died in 1968 after being bitten by a rattle snake at a church at Kettle Island in Bell County. He said people will simply believe that this was God's way

of calling Saylor home. "It's not going to shake their faith," he said. "Probably, if anything, it makes them believe that much stronger."

Saylor leaves his wife, Ada; 10 children; four stepchildren; four

brothers; and two sisters. Funeral services were scheduled Saturday at noon at the Kale Saylor Pentecostal Church at Stoney Fork, with burial to follow at the family cemetery there.

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. (AP) -The Tennessee Valley Authority will begin charging fees to help recover costs of processing construction permits for waterfront development along the Tennessee River and its tributaries.

TVA will start charging two

fees March 17: - A \$100 fee for noncommercial projects, such as private

retaining walls and docks. A \$500 fee for commercial barge terminals and bridges.

Applicants will be required to pay regardless of whether they receive the permit. TVA will continue to pay for the environmental assessment of each application.

The agency processes about 2,200 noncommercial applications a year and 300 commercial ones. That means potentially \$370,000 a year now will be paid by users instead of taxpayers.

These expenses are now part of TVA's \$140 million annual development, such as marinas, appropriation from Congress for nonpower programs. But Con-

gress is in a budget-cutting mood and TVA's nonpower budget is expected to be trimmed.

"We are trying to look at all the projects I manage, look at the value to the customers and prioritize them on that basis," said Kate Jackson, senior vice president for TVA's Resource Group.

'In addition, we want to look for opportunities to cover expenses where possible," said Jackson, whose division manages some \$120 million of the appropriated programs.

Justices' wanderlust leads to controversy

WASHINGTON (AP) — No strangers to perks, Supreme Court justices have long enjoyed free travel, lodging and meals courtesy of law schools, bar groups and other organizations eager to associate with legal luminaries.

But now the propriety of such high-court excursions is under examination.

At issue are trips seven justices took at the expense of West Publishing Co., a giant legal publisher that has been a Supreme Court 'itigant five times since 1983.

No justice has been caught red-handed in a conflict of interest, but some may be red-faced for not paying closer attention to the potential for an appearance of an ethical problem.

And "for federal judges, public perception is very important," says legal ethics expert Stephen Gillers of New York University. "Appear-

In a recent series of articles, the Star Tribune of Minneapolis questioned West's sponsorship of a \$15,000 award made each year to an outstanding federal judge.

Federal judges are allowed to accept such cash awards under most

But the newspaper reported that the seven Supreme Court justices raveled to various winter meetings of the award-selection committee in such balmy places as the Virgin Islands, the Bahamas and Palm

Four current justices - Sandra Day O'Connor, Anthony M. Kennedy, John Paul Stevens and Antonin Scalia - participated. So did three former justices ry A. Blackmun.

Kennedy made no apologies about his travels when questioned this week at a congressional hearing on the high court's budget.

"It's no different than the bar association paying for a judge to

come and give a speech," he said. And his colleague, Justice David H. Souter, told the hearing he was

amazed by the suggestion that West's sponsorship of the trips would put justices in a conflict of interest. "There is absolutely no substance in any suggestion that West

might have gotten special consideration" in cases before the Supreme But changing times may have sneaked up on the nation's highest

court and on a company that has long enjoyed dominance in legal "In an earlier age, it was understandable to see West as in the same

business as the courts, and to allow West greater access to federal judges than other businesses," Gillers said.

There wasn't any competition for West back then, but the world has changed and there is greater competition in the legal publishing business today. Tens of millions of dollars are at stake, he said. The Star Tribune's reporting "made us wake up and realize that the type of generosity we previously would have tolerated is no longer

But Gillers and Geoffrey Hazard, another legal ethics expert, believe the Supreme Court's public image has sustained little harm. "The only lasting effect may be to make the justices more cau-

tious," said Hazard, a University of Pennsylvania law professor. Judges might be hesitant to help pick the winners of the Westsponsored award unless an independent foundation is created to choose and reimburse members of the selection committee.

In recent years, globe-trotting justices have been anything but hesitant about accepting all-expenses-paid trips as guest speakers and teachers

And none has traveled more than Scalia, who in the winter of 1993 attended a three-day awards committee meeting in Los Angeles paid for by West Publishing.

That year, Scalia and his wife also accepted free trips, from law schools and nonprofit groups, to Bermuda, Scotland and England. The year before, Scalia's free trips took him to Austria, Italy, Norway, Sweden, Denmark and Puerto Rico.

Like members of Congress, federal judges are required each year to disclose all sources of income, including travel reimbursements. The Judicial Code of Conduct allows federal judges and their

spouses to accept free travel for activities that improve the legal system and the administration of justice as long as such payments do not give the appearance of influence-buying.

But the payments have to be reasonable. "It's clear that judges still can play a role, but there's no reason why these meetings must be in lavish resorts," Gillers said. "And West probably shouldn't pick the recipients or those who pick the

A Jarring Absence

One of the inconveniences of modern living is the shortage of jars. Used to be every household had a shelf full of emptied Mason, Kerr, or Ball iars. You know the type-round or squarish clear or blued glass jars with flat metal tops held down by screw-on metal lids.

In other days, before foods were easier to get fresh, frozen, boxed, in cans, or in pry-off bottles in supermarkets, folks did their own canning. (Actually, what they did was jarring, since cans weren't really involved, but it was called canning anyway.)

I recall a whole closet of Mason jars in one grandmother's attic. containing blackberries, green beans, tomatoes, peaches, and a dozen other delicacies hoarded for winters. She even canned her own grape juice which, with a little luck, occasionally fermented.

The other grandmother canned, too. When I was two and staying with her while my mother was in the hospital having my brother, I backed a goat cart up in the back yard and fell out into a seated position atop a charcoal bucket my grandmother was using for canning

beans. I wound up on my stomach in the hospital bed alongside my mother. The vanishing art of canning is burned into my--memory.

There's an antique shop in town that I visit once a year simply because it has an impressive display up front of canned foods neatly lined up in rows in an old pie safe. It strikes me as the perfect family altar to the memory of tastes of tireless grandmothers. I annually ask if the exhibit is for sale and am always disappointed that it isn't.

In the absence of such a shrine in our house, I made do a while with a quart of peaches our thoughtful eldest daughter gave me for my birthday a year ago. I held out seven months before opening them for Christmas dinner.

I can accept the fact that transpor-

tation and food processing progress have changed the canning industry. Leaving aside any debate over how its taste compares with that made at home by our grandmothers, there seems to plenty of food, but it is prepared by distant hands.

It's just that the emptied jars came in so handy. That's why I mourn their loss.

Mason, Ball and Kerr jars were useful. They held assorted screws, left-over paint from the bottom of a gallon bucket, and soap powder for the washer. They were their most colorful when we used them to dye Easter eggs, to store assorted shirt and skirt buttons, and to drink iced tea, lemonade, or Kool-Aid from.

The fruit jars were especially good, with their lids punched, for storing lightning bugs (a.k.a. in the

North and in the cities as fireflies.) Farmers who found their corn too bulky to haul to distant markets came up with the profitable enerprise of distilling it and transporting it in jars. In some sections of the

South that was the primary support

of the economy for many years. And nails. Nails were big business. Thomas Jefferson even built and operated a nail factory at Monticello. Remember when nails came in wooden barrels and bins and you filled paper sacks with handsful of them, paid for them by weight, rushed home before the sack bottoms fell out, and stored them in glass jars? A ten-penny nail was three inches long and originally sold for 10 cents (or pence) a hundred. Nowadays, of course, they're prepackaged in little plastic or cardboard boxes, cluttering our drawers and shelves, begging for container

No poet has yet written a fitting ode to fruit jars. They lie in pauper's fields, under tons of landfill--

We miss them, don't we? Almost as much as we miss cigar



O.J. trial features good hair

The O.J. Simpson trial will be remembered for many things. And one of them is hair. It's possible that this trial features the most beautiful hair in the history of criminal law.

At least that is already the opinion of many hair experts who have been closely watching the testimony.

Just about everyone involved has great hair -- witnesses, cops, lawyers. We haven't seen the famous howling dog yet, but it's likely that the mutt will have a splendid coat.

This seems to defy the law of averages. You can go in any courtroom and look at all the heads and most have thatches that range from ordinary to unsightly.

But in the Simpson trial, hardly anyone has a bad hair day. There is a reason for this, the hair

experts say. 'That's California," said Michael

Kuhel, senior stylist at an Elizabeth Arden salon in downtown Chicago. "They take hair very seriously out there. They're in the salon all the time. It's what they do, you know."

"They care for their hair. much more than we Midwesterners do. No roots. You will never see any roots in that courtroom. Yes, you can be assured that there is a lot of coloring going on. They all have their hair colored."

"Extensions are a big part of it," says Alberto, a designer of hair in Marshall Field's Water Tower salon. "Extensions are pieces of hair that come in kits, and you clamp them right onto the hair for length and thickening. It's the newest thing out there in California. All those witnesses are doing it."

"Blond after blond, all those neighbors, they all have hairpieces clamped to their heads. They color

the pieces and it looks natural. Believe me, all the teasing in the world won't give you that spectacular lift and fullness that you see on that witness stand."

"Believe me, it isn't the water," says Lili Schenk, who cuts hair on Michigan Avenue. "It's all manmade. They're all getting up in the morning -- men and women -taking a bubble bath, getting dressed, going to a hair salon, getting their hair poofed up and then going to court. Have you seen any flat heads?"

Flat heads?

"Yes. Many men wake up with flat spots because they slept that way. But you don't see any flat heads in this trial. Most of the men have the full treatment. They are shampooed, blow-dried, styled, so it looks fuller, thicker and like there's more of it. Even Robert Shapiro.' "That Shapiro," says Alberto. "It's a bad color job. He'd look much better with gray.'

"Yes, Shapiro could use a little hairpiece on top," says Michael



already well in Tilghman's possession.

The Lakers missed eight straight shots over the next two minutes, including four threes, while the Tornado finally found its free throw shooting touch. Tilghman canned eight of 13 free throws during Calloway's dry spell, including five of six from Brandon Moore, to take the upset

"We're not a great free throw shooting team, but we're not a bad team there either; we hit them down the clutch," Tilghman coach Bill Chumbler said. "We were focused tonight, and I couldn't be prouder.

Brad Cleaver carried the Lakers in the first half, scoring 21 points, but Tilghman clamped down on him in the second half, allowing him only three more.

"I'd like to say we did something different, but we really didn't; we did put some special interest on him though," Chumbler said. "We knew where he was because we didn't want to let him

control the game."

Cleaver scored 12 points in the first quarter, but Tilghman's 6-6 big man, John Smith, countered with eight points of his own as the Tornado consistently worked the ball inside. Tilghman led 16-15 at the end of the first

Brandon Warfield then opened the fourth quarter with a fourpoint play to make it 52-40, a hole that proved too deep for the Lakers to work their way out of.

Cleaver wound up with 24 points in his final game as a Lakwhile Hornbuckle, also a senior, finished with 19.

"We weren't as patient tonight; if it didn't come in the first couple of passes, it didn't come at all," said Greene, who will also lose Tyler Bohannon, Jason Leet and Jay Paul Herndon to graduation. "We didn't do some of the things that got us here, but when you go from being the hunter to being the hunted, teams will play their best games against you.



The forecast we have been look ing for came Wednesday evening and many anglers made their plans for the weekend.

Highs in the 70's sounds good but don't expect the fish to be jumping in the boats just yet. The water level is climbing rapidly on Kentucky Lake and bringing in some more stained to muddy colors.

We expected the influx of water from Alabama and Tennessee to be much warmer by the time it gets here so some are disappointed at the present temperature of 48.

A few non-residents I spoke with reported finding 50 degree water that was holding fish.

Several areas which normally are good for crappie and bass were four to five degrees cooler and didn't show any fish at all.

Blood River, Cypress Creek, Jonathon Creek and Little River are some of the largest tributaries which run into the Tennessee and Cumberland rivers and they usually start producing crappie first.

Local rainfall doesn't usually affect either lake unless the elevations are down and a lot of mud flats or islands are exposed to create muddy

water. When the current is as strong as it is now the darker water passes on through quickly and leaves a deposit layer of silt on the banks. This could help move the craw-

fish around in the rocks as they search for fresh food coming in and also get the bass going for a crawfish snack. The actual food chain in our area

is quite lengthy and intricate. Biology students from all parts of the U.S. come here to do research in fisheries at the Hancock Center and they encounter many things not available elsewhere.

Bass anglers are enjoying more and larger catches this week as

The rogue twitch bait is producing some huge bass if you have the patience to stay with it. You probably need to throw this one inside a cave or bay because of the current. Pig and craw combos are not as strong as these others but they will

produce around cover better. Crappie anglers are tossing the

multi-colored tube and curltail jigs in just about every possible fashion and many are doing very well. Minnows are still good over these same areas so you can work both if the wind isn't too bad.

Lots of the fish taken this week were in the 13/4 to 2 pound class and they were very healthy.

I haven't seen any evidence of the white stripes spawning yet but it shouldn't be too much longer before they get going.

One of the best areas which is fairly close to all of us is Little River. The whites are native river fish and will go upstream to spawn much like a salmon. They will strike anything white, yellow, silver or gold if it moves in front of them. leave out the good baits from Allen

Once they drop their eggs they return to the lakes until the shad bait fish get large enough for a meal. When the young shad fry reach an inch in length the chase begins and lasts until cold weather again.

They are an important fish in our area since the tourists can usually catch a lot of them easily.

We need them all so lets keep the waters clean and free of trash. Happy Fishing!

Crappie fishermen find some success

Crappie fishermen were enjoying moderate success early this week until colder temperatures and high winds kept area fishermen off the lake. For the few that battled the colder temperatures, they still brought enough fish

home to put in the freezer. On Monday, I set out on my first fishing trip of the year to check the equipment and hopefully find out what the fish were doing before my first guiding trip later in the week.

The first hour or two produced one short crappie out of a brush pile in nine feet of water. I then decided to try some ledges with tubes and curly tails. I started fishing ledges toward the mouths of the bays. I first started casting 1/8- and 1/16-ounce jigs on some of the steeper drops I could find. This also proved to be unsuccessful without a single bite.

I was picking up a lot of fish on my locater and decided to try vertical fishing tube jigs on the same ledge. It wasn't long before I had my first fish in the livewell and was on my way to a fish

I experimented with different depths and different colors of tubes, but there wasn't any consistency. Fish were at all depths from 10 to 20 feet and hit every color jig that I tried. This is probably why anglers are having a hard time catching their limit because the fish are scattered up and down the ledge. The fish were, however, around brush, but not all at the same depth. Some of the fish I caught were right on the bottom while others were suspended several feet above the cover. Right now it is important that when you fish these ledges you keep trying different depths.

There is no doubt that a spider rig is the way to go right now. These rigs allow the fishermen to fish four to eight poles at the same time. With this many poles in the water, fishermen can try a lot of different depths and different color tubes to see what is working best.

These rigs are usually homemade to custom-fit your boat. If you are not interested in making one, you can lay your rous down on the gunnel of your boat and it will serve about the same

One product that seems to be very beneficial are fly rods or crappie poles. They range from nine to 12 feet in length and are a light action pole. This allows the angler to fish light line and light jigs that will enable the angler to detect biting crappie. Eightpound line is the standard size

that anglers use when fishing spider rigs. This light line allows the jig to hang straight down when fishing. This could be the single most important aspect when fishing spider rigs.

This is what I found out on Monday, the crappie only hit the jig when it was dead still in the water. If I was moving the boat too fast and the line started to swing with the boat you would not get a bite. This was the only factor I had to watch carefully in order to catch the fish.

It was obvious that other anglers were having good success at doing the same technique. Just about every time I looked at a few boats, someone had a crappie on the line. With warmer weather forecasted this weekend, fishing should steadily increase and bigger catches are just around the

MSU professor studying paddlefish

What five-foot long, 100-pound fish gathers below dams to spawn and has frightened divers as it cruises by with its shark-like fins and tail? Fortunately, the paddlefish, often called the "spoonbill catfish," are toothless and strain tiny food organisms from the water. Dr. Tom Timmons, professor of biological science at Murray State University, has been awarded a Presidential Research Fellowship from the university to help him finish a study of the paddlefish.

Once abundant in the Mississippi River and its large tributary rivers, paddlefish have declined since 1900. Loss of habitat for the fish and unregulated fishing by anglers and commercial fishermen, may be the problem, Timmons said. The increase in popularity of the paddlefish came with the demand for their eggs that make a world-class caviar. When imports of Iranian sturgeon caviar stopped, intense fishing

evolved, including large-scale poaching in midwestern states, Timmons said

"Reduced imports resulted in a rocketing of the price of caviar payed to fishermen from \$25 a pound to more than \$50 a pound during the 1980s," he said. "A ring of poachers in Missouri killed hundreds of paddlefish for their eggs and left the carcasses to spoil.

Through an elaborate 10-year study of the paddlefish in the lower Tennessee and Cumberland rivers, biologists of Murray State University's Hancock Biological Station have been working to determine the status of the paddlefish and the effects of fishing.

Murray State and the Tennessee Wildlife Resource Agency (TWRA) formed a partnership to evaluate paddlefish and determine what regulations were necessary. In 1993, for the first time ever, the TWRA closed the fishing season on

paddlefish between Feb. 16 and April 15, as part of the fish's spawning period. Results of the study found paddlefish of the Tennessee and Cumberland rivers, to live more than 21 years, not going through a period of spawning until they were between 8 to 12 years old.

Although the Tennessee and Cumberland rivers have been impounded, the paddlefish has found a favorable feeding habitat in the reservoirs. "In addition to food, the reservoirs have a sufficient length of flowing river below dams for the paddlefish's exacting spawning requirements," said Timmons. Through the cooperation of commercial net fishermen, biologists were able to gather a great amount of information from the harvested

"We also began collecting paddlefish ourselves with nets;" Timmons said. Throughout the last eight years, the department has caught 2,000 paddlefish, placed a plastic tag on their back, and returned them unharmed to the river.







DEAR DR. GOTT: As a teacher, I am seeing more and more children being placed on Ritalin. Parents have indicated the children are placed on this medication because they day dream or don't stay on task. Is there a testing procedure for ADD or are they prescribed Ritalin lightheartedly?

DEAR READER: No one knows the stimulants, such as Ritalin, in children with attention deficit disorder. As a ple. I am concerned — as are many teachers and health professionals about the increasingly prevalent use of Ritalin and similar drugs in schoolchildren who have trouble learning and concentrating.

Unquestionably, there are children (and adults) with ADD who are immensely helped by medication. However, the diagnosis of ADD is tricky. There is no foolproof test for the disorder, so I am certain that a significant number of youngsters are being prescribed Ritalin in hopes of when they don't have ADD at all, or future, the pendulum will swing back

People with bona fide ADD usually exhibit impulsivity, poor learning patterns, fidgetiness, poor self-esteem, and a variety of other symptoms - all of which can be helped by Ritalin and similar medications. The cause of

Therefore, I urge patients in my practice to take ADD seriously but to make sure that extensive performance tests have been administered and interpreted by qualified professionals before they allow their children to be put on powerful drugs that may produce undesirable side effects, such as overstimulation, insomnia and

more accurate, scientific and defined. DEAR DR. GOTT: What recommendations can you give to a patient who has been diagnosed as having a hiatal hernia with occasional internal bleeding

DEAR READER: Where the esophagus joins the stomach, there is normally a ring of muscle that prevents the stomach from sliding up into the chest cavity. This muscular valve also stops reflux, the backwash of gastric acid into the esophagus.

In patients with hiatal hernia, this muscular ring doesn't function properly and allows the upper stomach and lower esophagus to become irritated and inflamed, sometimes leading to intestinal bleeding.

The goal of therapy is to reduce the concentration of gastric acid. Antacids often help, but most patients need stronger prescription drugs, such as Zantac or Prilosec.
