Group to narrow list of coaching hopefuls

A nine-member committee has been assigned the task of sorting through the applicants seeking to be Murray State University's 11th Racer head basketball coach.

MSU President Dr. Kern Alexander said Friday afternoon that the committee will meet this weekend to discuss the applicants.

"We've got resumes and we will make some judgments from those," Alexander said. "Although it will be up to the committee to decide, we will probably bring in five or six candidates for a campus visit."

Serving on the committee

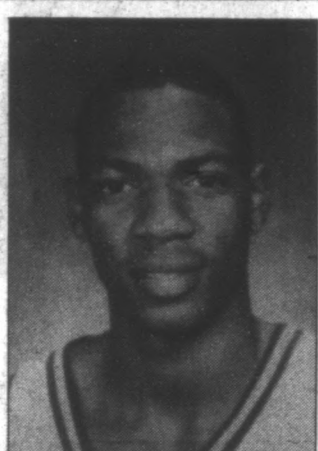
are: Beverly Ford, chairman of the regent's athletic committee and vice chairman of the board of regents; Karl Hussung, MSU professor of chemistry and faculty athletic representative; James Butts, former regent chairman; Sid Easley, current regent chairman; Marcus Brown, Racer basketball player; Pete Waldrop, community member; and Jim Frank, president of the Racer Club.

MSU Athletic Director Mike Strickland and Alexander will serve as ex-officio members. Ford will serve as chairman. "We have gotten some good people together for the committee," Alexander said.

replacement for Scott Edgar, who left earlier this week to take the head coaching position at Duquesne University in

Pittsburgh.

Edgar had compiled a 79-40 record in four seasons with the Racers, including three Ohio Valley Conference Championships, two trips to the NCAA Tournament, including one March 17, and a trip to the NIT Tournament.

According to Alexander, about 80 people have applied for the position.

"Maybe by Monday we will have some candidates lined up to visit the campus," he said. "We aren't setting any specific deadlines at this point."

While the university hasn't released a list of potential candidates, names that have been publicly tossed around include

Racer assistant coach Ken Roth, former University of Kentucky standout Kyle Macy, and two former MSU Racer coaches, Steve Newton and Ron Greene.

Based on university procedures, the president is responsible for recommending a new coach to the board of regents, which will meet in mid-May.

Alexander said it is important to find a coach who can reflect the university's desire for a bigger, better basketball program. "It is very important that we project this position as one that is an opportunity for Murray State," Alexander said. "MSU is in the big time and we are going to be big in basketball. We want this selection to show that."

Gingrich says Congress will call the shots

WASHINGTON (AP) — The speech bore all the earmarks of a presidential address. And in case anyone missed the point, House Speaker Newt Gingrich drove it home in an interview afterward: He and the Republican Congress, not President Clinton, will control the national agenda.

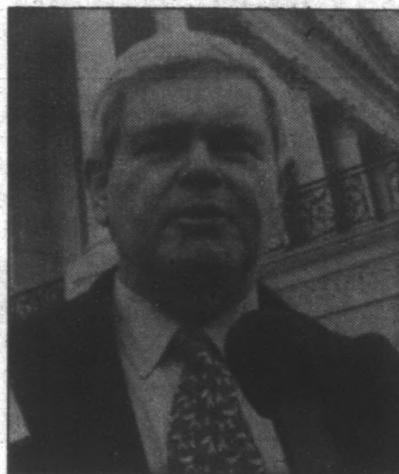
"I felt like a leader," Gingrich told CBS after the network televised his 30-minute speech on the Republican agenda.

Gingrich, R-Ga., delivered his look back on the first three months of the GOP-led Congress and look ahead to the rest of the year while seated casually on the edge of his office desk.

It was a presentation much like what one would expect from a president. He outlined proposals, countered political foes, and said his party, having kept its "Contract With America," was worthy of voter trust.

And while Gingrich disclaimed any White House ambitions, he frankly admitted in the post-speech interview that he proposes to set the national agenda.

"I just see it as a healthy, peacetime redistribution of power from the White House to the

Capitol and from there to the states," Gingrich said.

For the moment, President Clinton left the national stage to Gingrich. During the speech, Clinton was flying aboard Air Force One from Dallas to Sacramento, Calif., and read rather than tune into the talk from the plane.

Earlier, Clinton said Gingrich would "claim a lot of credit for what he has done, and he should." He promised to search

Jones wants special session

FRANKFORT, Ky. (AP) — Gov. Brereton Jones plans to call a special session later this year to address juvenile crime, his cabinet secretary said.

Jones favors opening some felony hearings involving juveniles to the public, Mark Guilfoyle said Friday.

But the governor also wants to ensure that youngsters who make mistakes aren't unduly — and unfairly — labeled for the rest of their lives, Guilfoyle said.

"Removing the cloak of confidentiality seems to make sense in some cases. But don't forget the reason why we have confidentiality. People shouldn't have to live with an innocent mistake for the rest of their lives," Guilfoyle said.

The issue of secrecy of juvenile proceedings was thrust back into the limelight this weekend in Jefferson County when it was revealed that a 17-year-old charged with raping, sodomizing and strangling a 12-year-old girl

had admitted two years ago to raping a 7-year-old. The 12-year-old's parents said they would never have allowed their daughter to be in the 17-year-old's home had they known.

Although the 17-year-old admitted the offense in 1993, the case was "informaled," meaning the charges were dropped in return for his promise to go to counseling.

He attended only a few counseling sessions and despite promises from prosecutors to haul him back into court if he didn't go to counseling, nothing was done.

Guilfoyle said Jones is committed to making changes in the state's juvenile code during the special session.

Jones will listen to recommendations from state Attorney General Chris Gorman and a legislative subcommittee that is gathering information on the subject, Guilfoyle said.

Daughaday will hear injunction

Graves County Circuit Judge John Daughaday will determine whether a temporary injunction should be granted to halt construction of a new Calloway County jail.

The Concerned Citizens of Calloway County, represented by Walter Lee Stealy, filed a lawsuit in late March against the fiscal court, including County Judge/Executive J.D. Williams.

Also named in the lawsuit are Jim Woodrum, jail consultant, and Clint Kelley, bond officer.

The group's attorney, Mark Medlin, requested that a special judge be appointed to hear the case. No hearing date has been set and it is unclear where the hearing will be conducted.

The suit asks that all negotiations, agreements or other activities for design, construction,

funding and relocation of the proposed jail cease.

The suit asks that the county: •Resume negotiations with the City of Murray regarding a property exchange that was originally proposed.

•Terminate professional service contracts with Woodrum and Architecture Plus, and to obtain reimbursement of all expenses and professional fees paid effective following submission of jail plans.

•Withdraw a proposed resolution and ordinance of the fiscal court approving both an insurance premium tax and a conditional ad valorem property tax referendum.

The suit alleges that the fiscal court has not properly bid the jail project and has held private meetings in violation of the Kentucky Open Meetings Law.

Van driver was on probation

A Murray State University official violated his probation when he admitted to the Kentucky State Police that he had been speeding at the time of a fatal van crash in March.

Mike Young, MSU cheerleading sponsor and driver of the university van involved in the March 18 wreck that injured 12 and left one dead, was on probation for compiling 12 points in a two-year period for traffic violations.

According to Kentucky Department of Transportation records, Young had been cited for the following violations:

•Sept. 22, 1992, in Calloway County for disregarding a stop

sign. (three points)
•Sept. 4, 1993, in McLean County for traveling between 16 and 25 mph above the posted speed limit. (six points)

•April 3, 1994, in Hopkins County for traveling less than 16 mph above the posted speed limit. (three points)

He had also been cited in 1991 in Marshall County for traveling less than 16 mph above the posted speed limit, which is also a three-point violation. Records of infractions for a three-year period are available for public inspection.

It hasn't been determined whether Young was driving a university vehicle at the time of the citations.

MSU spokesman Joe Hedges said late Friday that he is not aware if the university knew about Young's previous driving record.

According to university policy, a driver must have a valid operator's license in order to drive a university vehicle. Hedges said a copy of the driver's license is kept in a file at the university's motor pool.

Hedges said the university is waiting for a final report from the KSP and that the investigation of the accident is continuing.

"In Kentucky, we have a point system and drivers want to keep zero points," said one state transportation official. "Every time you are cited for a moving viola-

tion, points are added. If you get 12 or more, you are put on probation."

However, anyone on probation must meet certain stipulations that are set by a hearing officer. Typically, one of the most common stipulations is that the driver not commit any more moving violations.

According to the Associated Press, Young acknowledged the speeding tickets Friday and said that he was aware he would lose his license "if I got another."

According to a partial report released Friday by the Kentucky State Police, investigators of the accident determined that the

for common ground with the GOP but said he would veto some measures if they are not modified in the Senate.

In his speech, Gingrich unveiled no new blockbuster proposals. He said Republicans would simplify the tax code, leave Social Security untouched and give the elderly more choices in their government-funded health care.

He promised that the rest of the federal government, including the military, would be subject to budget cuts. The result, he said, would be a balanced budget in seven years "to free our children from the burdens upon their prosperity and their lives."

Democratic leaders used their television response time to accuse Gingrich and the Republican majority as having no sympathy for the poor while handing out tax breaks to the rich.

But the evening had much less to do with substantive debate and much more to do with image. Casting himself as a break from the tradition of stuffy, untelegraphic congressional leaders, Gingrich brought along a bag

full of props designed to show him as, at once, human and modern.

He showed viewers a "Dear Mr. Newt..." letter from a Georgia first grader.

He held up one of the "Contract With America Bills," stamped "PASSED."

He showed the card House members use to cast votes electronically, calling it, "the most expensive credit card in the world," for all the debt it has run up.

He juxtaposed an old-fashioned radio vacuum tube with a high-tech microchip that could bring the equipment used by federal air traffic controllers up to date, and compared a fat copper telephone trunk line with a barely visible fiber-optic cable.

The message was that smaller — as in smaller government — is

better, and Republicans want to make government more modern even as they shrink it.

Throughout the speech, Gingrich stressed the simplicity of the Republican program, and sought to put voter fears to rest.

"Our goals are simple," he said. "We don't want our children to drown in debt. We want baby boomers to be able to retire with the same security as their parents. We want our senior Americans to be able to rely on Medicare without fear."

The letter from the first grader, it turned out, was a pre-emptive public relations strike against the two Democrats given television time to respond to Gingrich. House Minority Leader Dick Gephardt, D-Mo., and his Senate counterpart, Tom Daschle, D-S.D., spoke from an elementary school in suburban Arlington, Va.

Appropriately, both led off by telling viewers that Gingrich and the Republicans want to take school lunches away from kids. Just as Gingrich sought to assuage fear, Gingrich and Daschle sought to instill it.

"Many of Speaker Gingrich's ideas are so extreme, so unfair and so wrong that even the Republican-controlled Senate will refuse to pass them," said Daschle, who delivered his remarks in shirtsleeves.

Gingrich got in the last word. In an interview on CNN, he said that while Clinton is willing to at least listen to the Republican point of view, "The Democratic leadership (in Congress) is trapped in some kind of small left-wing clique."

speed of the van at the time of the accident was approximately 82 mph.

The group was returning to Murray from the Nashville airport where they had flown after the Racers' appearance in the NCAA regional basketball tournament in Tallahassee, Fla.

KSP Trooper Bryan Pitney of Nortonville said the speed estimate of 82 mph was based on an accident reconstruction that considers the length of skid marks and the "crush factor" of metal in the van frame.

"The metal in the van has a known strength," he said. "To cause that kind of crush, the van has to be going a particular speed."

In a statement to police officers at Blanchfield Army Hospital at Fort Campbell immediately following the accident, Young was quoted as saying that he

thought he was going 70 mph "and that was what he usually tried to drive."

The accident occurred on Interstate 24 in Christian County, which is a 65 mph zone.

The accident report also quotes a witness as saying that at the time the van passed him, he (the witness) was driving 71 mph.

Police investigators also concluded that the tire tread separated and wrapped around the axle, but they said that did not cause the wheel to lock as previously speculated, the report said Friday.

"The major contributing factor ... was the driver's reaction to the tread separation, which was greatly affected by the speed of operation," the report said.

However, Racer cheerleader Kevin Carr of Mayfield, who was treated and released after the accident, told the Louisville Courier-Journal that the 82-mph estimate was "absolutely atrocious."

"Everyone that I have encountered, and the people that were

behind us following in the pickup truck, say 60 to 70 miles an hour," Carr said.

He also said he felt safe with Young's driving.

"I've never once dreamed of Mike's driving being bad," Carr said.

Pitney said Young will not be issued a citation in this case because speeding is a misdemeanor charge, which must be witnessed by a trooper at the time of the violation.

"Even if the case were taken to a grand jury, speeding would still be a misdemeanor which calls for nothing more than a ticket," Pitney said.

However, Pitney told the Associated Press that the final police report will be turned over to the Christian County commonwealth's attorney's office, which will decide whether to ask a grand jury to consider criminal charges of manslaughter or negligent homicide against Young.

The report is not expected to be completed until late May.

CCFR reports house, wood fires

Calloway County Fire-Rescue Deputy Chief Robert Trenholm reported Friday afternoon that firefighters were kept busy with several fires.

Firefighters were alerted to a house fire at the home of Dennis Jones, located northeast of Lynn Grove, at approximately 6 a.m. Friday.

Five vehicles and 15 firefighters were on the scene for about seven hours battling the three-alarm fire that caused major structural damage to the home. No one was injured in the fire.


Trenholm said the state fire marshal was notified to determine the cause of the fire although arson was not a factor. In addition, one truck and four

personnel responded to a woods fire on Highway 732 at the nine-mile marker off Highway 94 East.

The Division of Forestry was also at the fire, which involved about an acre of woods.

Trenholm said firefighters also investigated a report of a gas smell in Dexter.

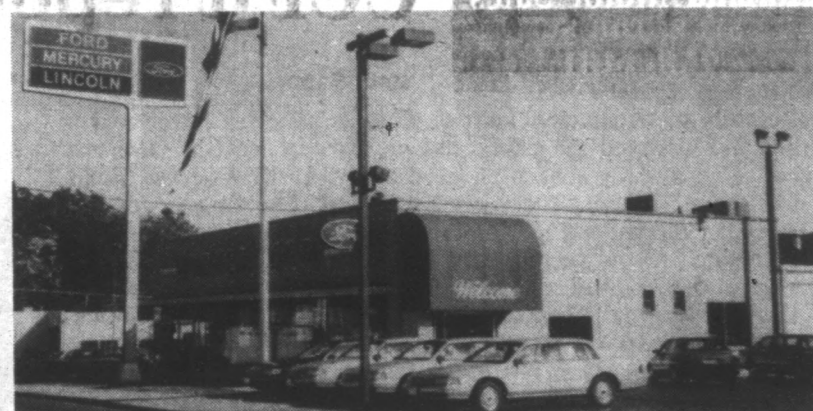

Writer supports petition

Dear Editor:

The most welcome words that can fall on the ears of American taxpayers today are "Tax Cuts" and "Spending Cuts."

Those words thunder from our national capital, but what has happened on the local level? Our local leaders haven't breathed a word about tax cuts or spending cuts. When asked at a public hearing if they had looked closely at the budget and considered spending cuts, they were struck dumb by the idea. At least I assume they were, because they did not answer the question. Rather than talk about spending cuts, their idea was to impose a 9 percent insurance premium tax. When the people of the county spoke long and loudly against that proposal, the fiscal court appointed a citizen's advisory committee to come up with an alternative.

The committee was given one month to study an issue that had haunted the court since 1991. The people appointed were aware of the problem, worked hard for that month, came up with alternatives.

In summarized form they proposed the following: that the court impose an ad valorem tax not to exceed the cost of constructing the jail; that the court obtain needed funds from a local lending institution for immediate construction, following that with a direct FmHA loan for final funding; and that the contracting and construction packages be bid in such a manner as to encourage bidding by local contractors.

The court agreed to review the committee's report and hold a special meeting. At that meeting, the court voted to pass an ordinance which would give voters a choice between an ad valorem tax or an insurance tax, with no ending date on either because those taxes would be applied to the maintenance of the jail in addition to debt service.

A lot of folks don't think that's much of a choice — an 8 cent ad valorem tax or a 9 percent insurance tax — and both go on until the new jail falls down or is closed by the state.

Now some of us who don't like either of the offered packages have gotten together and found that we share other concerns as well as this one. We have come together as the Calloway County Association of Concerned Citizens, a non-partisan group formed out of our concern for the future of our county. We are presenting an alternative to those two choices by way of a petition that asks the court to create a special taxing district for the purpose of collecting revenue to retire the debt incurred by the constructing and equipping of the jail. When that debt is retired, the tax will be removed, just like the toll booths on Kentucky's parkways.

According to revenue estimates provided by the Department of Local Government, that debt, even if it reaches the projected \$4.5 million, can be repaid in 10 years or less. Operational costs would be covered by the revenue produced by the jail while the maintenance is already a budget allotment of the jail fund.

You have a choice — you can do nothing and pay for the next 30 years or you can sign the petition and send this message to our leaders: We are perfectly willing to pay our debts and we do not wish to pass them on to our children and grandchildren.

Dole pressured from all sides

No one is more painfully aware of the contrast than Dole.

House Speaker Newt Gingrich is shoving through one major "Contract With America" promise after another.

The Senate, in Dole's rueful words, moves at the speed of grass growing. "The founding fathers probably knew what they were doing," he told one audience recently, leaving the impression he had a few doubts.

The contract is the driving dynamic all across Capitol Hill. Gramm, a chief Dole rival for the presidential nomination, warns against the Senate becoming "a black hole" for the document's provisions. Rep. Jim Nussle, R-Iowa, says Dole's record on the contract may determine whom he backs in the critical Iowa presidential caucuses.

"The contract did come up" at a meeting with Dole, Nussle said. "He asked me about support, and I indicated what I thought was necessary to gain that kind of support. It was done very respectfully. I'm not trying to tell you I was threatening the majority leader of the Senate."

The Senate already has killed one major element of the contract, the balanced-budget amendment to the Constitution. Last week, after days of intensive negotiations, senators passed the line-item veto — another key item. Dole's relief was palpable. "I think we've got a chance to catch up with the House," he said optimistically.

But there could be plenty of rough times ahead.

In the aftermath of the balanced-budget vote, a bitterly disappointed Dole was forced to mediate between two GOP factions: aggressive conservatives who wanted to punish Sen. Mark Hatfield of Oregon, whose "no" vote provided the margin of defeat, and veterans who said Hatfield was entitled to vote his conscience.

And similar divisions are developing over generous tax cuts outlined in the contract. Gramm and Sen. Dan Coats of Indiana are collecting signatures on a letter asking Dole to support one of its proposals, a \$500-per-child tax credit they call crucial. But some influential GOP senators, including Finance Com-

mittee Chairman Bob Packwood of Oregon, say deficit reduction is more important. Dole is signaling support for a small tax cut — a compromise bound to disappoint contract hard-liners in both chambers.

The majority leader did move to mollify party conservatives by promising a review of federal affirmative action programs and assuring a vote on repealing last year's ban on assault weapons. The latter earned him a tongue-lashing from The New York Times.

The editors accused him of "a bumper sticker, not presidential-level thinking on social policy." They further charged he had become "a slave to the fear that Phil Gramm or Pat Buchanan," another conservative presidential candidate, would outflank him on the right.

In fact, after Dole proposed the assault-weapons repeal vote, Gramm remarked: "I think Bob Dole's beaten me to the punch on this."

Dole also seems to be keeping an eye on the White House. At one point President Clinton joked that there would be one more American employed after retired basketball star Michael Jordan rejoined the Chicago Bulls. A week later, Dole issued his own statement on Jordan.

He suggested Jordan might consider running for the U.S. Senate when he gets tired of basketball. "The way he drives to the basket," Dole said, "he might be able to get things moving there, too."

KENTUCKY EDITORIAL

Lexington Herald-Leader:

Recently the Kentucky Court of Appeals upheld a lower court's ruling that declared the public has no right to see Gov. Brereton Jones' official daily schedules, even after they have become final.

The Herald-Leader, The Associated Press, The Courier-Journal, The Kentucky Post and the Kentucky Press Association sued under the Kentucky Open Records Law to obtain the schedules after the governor declined to release them.

Chances are you haven't lain awake wondering what the governor's schedule looks like. Perhaps you wonder why newspapers care about the question. To understand why, think about another recent news story, this one from the business pages.

The story reported that leading Kentucky Derby contender Afternoon Deelites and another horse, Soul of the Matter, would go to Jones' Airdrie Stud farm after their racing careers are over. Both horses have been owned by music mogul Burt Bacharach. Bacharach and Jones are selling shares in the syndicate that will own the horses during their careers at stud. The syndicate will include 42

shares priced at \$100,000 each.

And when is Jones going to be doing this sales job? During his workday as governor? It's impossible to tell without access to his schedules.

It is already obvious that the governor mixes the public's business with his own. Bacharach was one of the people who received state police escorts to the Kentucky Derby last year — at the instruction of the governor's office. What bearing do such publicly financed perks have on the governor's success in the horse business? How much of his working time does Jones spend on his own business and how much on the public's? These are hardly idle questions. They are questions that go to the heart of the public's trust in government and elected officials.

That's why the Herald-Leader and other news organizations went to court over this issue. The question isn't really whether reporters have the right to look at the governor's official schedule book. It's whether you and the rest of the state's citizens have a right to know what their governor is doing while he's on the job.

Nightmares ride again

My favorite line in Norman Maclean's bestseller, "A River Runs Through It," is the closing one, from which the title of the book is taken: "All things converge, and a river runs through it."

Some peculiar things have converged for me in recent weeks. Snakes.

Like most sensible people, I have a natural aversion to reptiles. But, quite against my wishes, they've wiggled and squirmed their way into my consciousness.

First, St. Patrick's Day, and with it the annual obligatory luncheon conversations about who St. Patrick was and what he did to warrant having a day named for him. No one knows how snake-infested Ireland was, but things must have been pretty bad.

Next came some research I was doing which chanced to be in a scholarly journal which also had in it an essay by a reputable sociologist describing his visit to an Appalachian snakehandling religious service. He described how the service was so engrossing that he lost his objectivity and almost became converted, despite the fact that one member of the congregation was bitten and had to have medical treatment. He was at a loss to explain his being bitten by the spirit.

About the same time we had a vacationing college student doing some waterproofing of our basement. He had the garage door open so the fumes could escape. A little patterned black snake with a flat head wandered in. Our student

picked it up and put it in a bucket and took it home for his brother to play with. (They released it in a field after their mother stopped screaming.)

As I noted earlier, I am convinced that the majority of mankind shares my distaste for snakes. Yet, we remain drawn towards them. In my youth, visiting grandparents often in Memphis, we spent much time in the Overton Park Zoo. We detested "the Snakehouse," but never seemed to avoid visiting it. It was clearly not a case of likes attracting. It was more of a fascination with the forbidden.

In the Bible, of course, the snake

is obviously a symbol of darkness and evil. It is the tempter in the Garden, it is the symbol of Satan elsewhere, and it is the thing Adam and his heirs in exile are consigned, for punishment, to crush beneath the heel while working.

In a hypnotic book on archeology by Charles Pellegrino, "Return to Sodom and Gomorrah," the author explains (or at least theorizes about) this human suspicion and caution towards reptiles. Long after the earth was formed and evolving, Pellegrino suggests, somewhere around the year 20,000,000 B.C., tribes of dryopithecine apes spread, attracted by bamboo grasses that

had become to spread four million years earlier.

The apes of that age were definitely a minority race, dominated and persecuted by the more powerful snakes of the globe, the ancestors of cobras and pythons. They were capable of swallowing the minority apes whole. To protect themselves, the apes developed a genetic fear of snakes.

The story of St. George and the dragon, Pellegrino notes, like the story of St. Patrick and the snakes, and like the story of the Garden of Eden, testifies to the long-ago warfare between man (ape) and snake. In civilized times, it has taken on additional weight by being woven into our theologies, with snakes becoming a metaphor for Evil.

The enmity is worldwide. One sound universal to all human languages is the whispered shush to get silence. It is an imitation of the snakes' sound, used by humans as a warning, something that has survived from our earliest roots millions of years ago.

Another evidence of this residual fear is in our art and letters. Throughout recorded history are records and representations of snakes, made by humans. From drawings on Egyptian tombs through standards carried by Roman legions and even on to this century, and throughout the written works of the centuries, snakes are elevated, celebrated, and kept alive. Ironically by their worst enemies — human beings.

Afternoons good for crappie

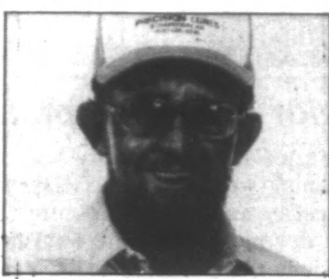
This week has been interesting in several ways, but the best is the fact that the crappie were turned on to afternoon feeding.

I don't mean you couldn't catch a few in the morning, because some people did, but the majority of the big slabs brought in were caught after twelve noon.

The water temperature has dropped to the high fifties again but should climb steadily from now on. The male crappie are in a pre-spawn move and are prowling the shallow banks looking for a site to bring the females in and deposit their eggs.

These fish are the largest ones we have seen in several years, so let's hope they drop tons of millions of fertile eggs. Most often, you will find them concentrated near stumps or fallen treetops where the sunlight can reach the eggs and help them to hatch. This usually takes about 36 hours and then the little fish are on their way to surviving and reproducing someday about three years from now.

Most anglers are casting the shorelines with ultra light rigs which will throw the light lead head jigs and crappie like to strike. A sixteenth is plenty for most but some want to use the eighth ounce and both are dressed with a curtail

grub of some kind. We have used a dark green filled with gold sparkle for several weeks and it has worked very well for us. Others prefer all white and then there is chartreuse. Green heads, pink or white really doesn't matter when the fish are ready to feed, they will strike them all.

Some anglers are doing well on minnows fished over brush and stumps with the aid of bobbers to keep from hanging the brush. A little twitch every now and then, and the minnow will jump and dance, causing a strike from the hungry crappie. We have used the little number five shad rap with great success when we found a school. They smack it with force much like a bass would.

The lake elevations are about to change and rise to a summer pool stage of 360 or 361 feet, we hope. The old mark of 359 is too shallow in the bays, and the fish can't get to the brush or trees for cover or to spawn. The erosion in the backs of the bays has been going on for 50 years, and unless the water is held at a higher level, you can't use the area for anything. Maybe TVA can help us out with this problem.

I had the pleasure of fishing with Mr. Rick Lampkins on Wednesday and you can be sure we will do it again. Rick is a gentleman and will tell you up front what he can or cannot do. He has some running mates who help keep him on the path from time to time, so there's no cause to worry about him in the

outdoors.

We took a 66 mph ride up the lake in a 36 degree morning to start the day off right, but he didn't complain. ... he couldn't talk! We wanted to catch some crappie for him to take home, so we picked a good-looking bank and started casting. After the sun came up, the water temperature revealed the low of 55 degrees, and the east wind continued to blow steadily. We discussed the effects of this wind and noted that while the ripples were really moving, no strikes occurred, but the instant there was a pause and the surface calmed, we could catch a fish.

Rick caught the largest fish of the day, but I can't tell you the species; he'll have to — I'm still laughing!

We missed a lot of fish because of short strikes while the wind was whipping our lines. I kept looking at different places until the afternoon feeding started. Suddenly, Rick had a reason to holler! He caught a sack full of big slab crappie to take home. It was a lot of fun because of all of the songbirds, eagles, ducks, herons, hawks, and the beautiful shorelines just coming alive again with new blossoms and leaves, not to mention the fishing. Thanks, Rick Lampkins. Happy fishing!

Spring is the time to remodel lures in your ole' tacklebox

ATLANTA (AP) — Spring is a time for remodeling.

It's a time to give a facelift to lures in the tacklebox, especially those that never have caught their weight in fish.

Spinnerbaits are among the most fun to remodel. They come in a pretty standard assortment of sizes, but a whole individualized line of spinnerbaits can be created with a longnose pliers and some spare parts available at a good tackle shop.

Crankbaits and even spoons can be remodeled to be more efficient.

The only thing that can't be changed on a spinnerbait is the hook. But a stinger hook can be added by fitting the eye of the second hook over the shaft of the spinnerbait's hook. A stinger frequently is the answer when fish are striking at a lure but missing short.

A little extra color can be painted on the jig head. A dab of red here and there — perhaps simulating gill cover openings — seems to increase the number of strikes.

But there's a lot of fun in remodeling spinnerbaits by changing the blades. A selection of blades can be bought at a tackle shop or through any of several fishing tackle catalogs.

The rule of thumb is the larger the blade in relation to the weight of the spinnerbait, the slower the bait can be worked on the surface, and the slower it will fall when given slack line.

Put an oversized Colorado blade — the widest of the three most common blade styles — on a smallish spinnerbait, say one-quarter ounce, and the lure will almost float over the top of underwater grass beds. Given slack line, it will fall tantalizingly slowly along the edge of a weedbed or into a hole in the grass.

To fish deeper water structure, take a heavier spinnerbait — say five-eighths or three-quarter ounce — and put on an undersize Indiana or willow leaf blade.

That new bait will get to where the fish are in a hurry and still be flashing and chattering when it gets there.

While you're at it, you can replace worn skirts.

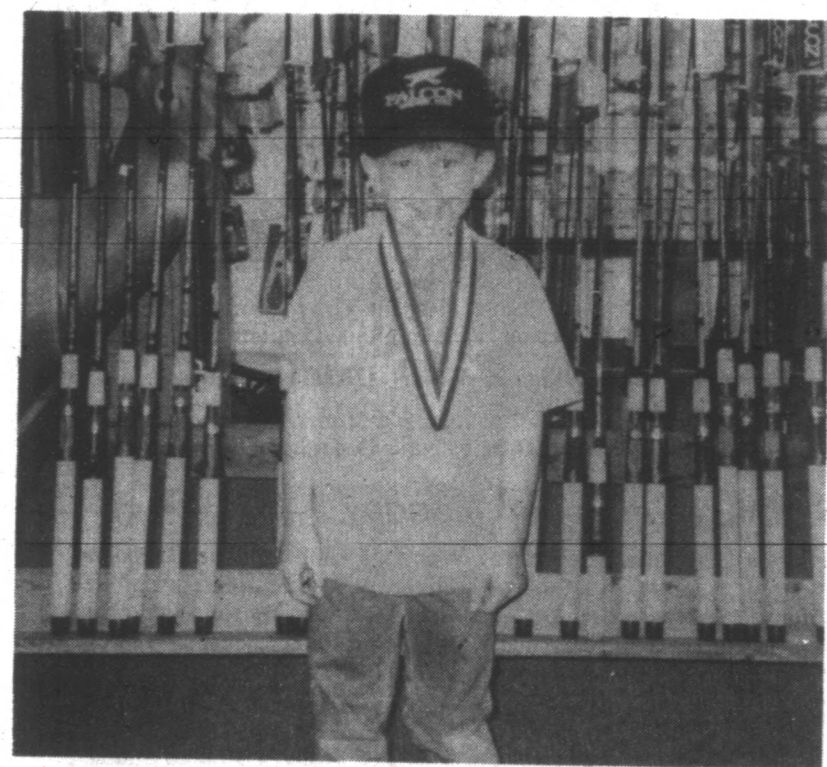

O'Bannon winner of Wooden

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Ed O'Bannon remembers when the last things on his mind were championships and awards. As tough as those days were 4½ years ago, he now believes they helped him.

O'Bannon, who tore up his left knee just before his career at UCLA was to start, received the John Wooden Award as college basketball's player of the Year on Friday — four days after playing his final game for the Bruins.

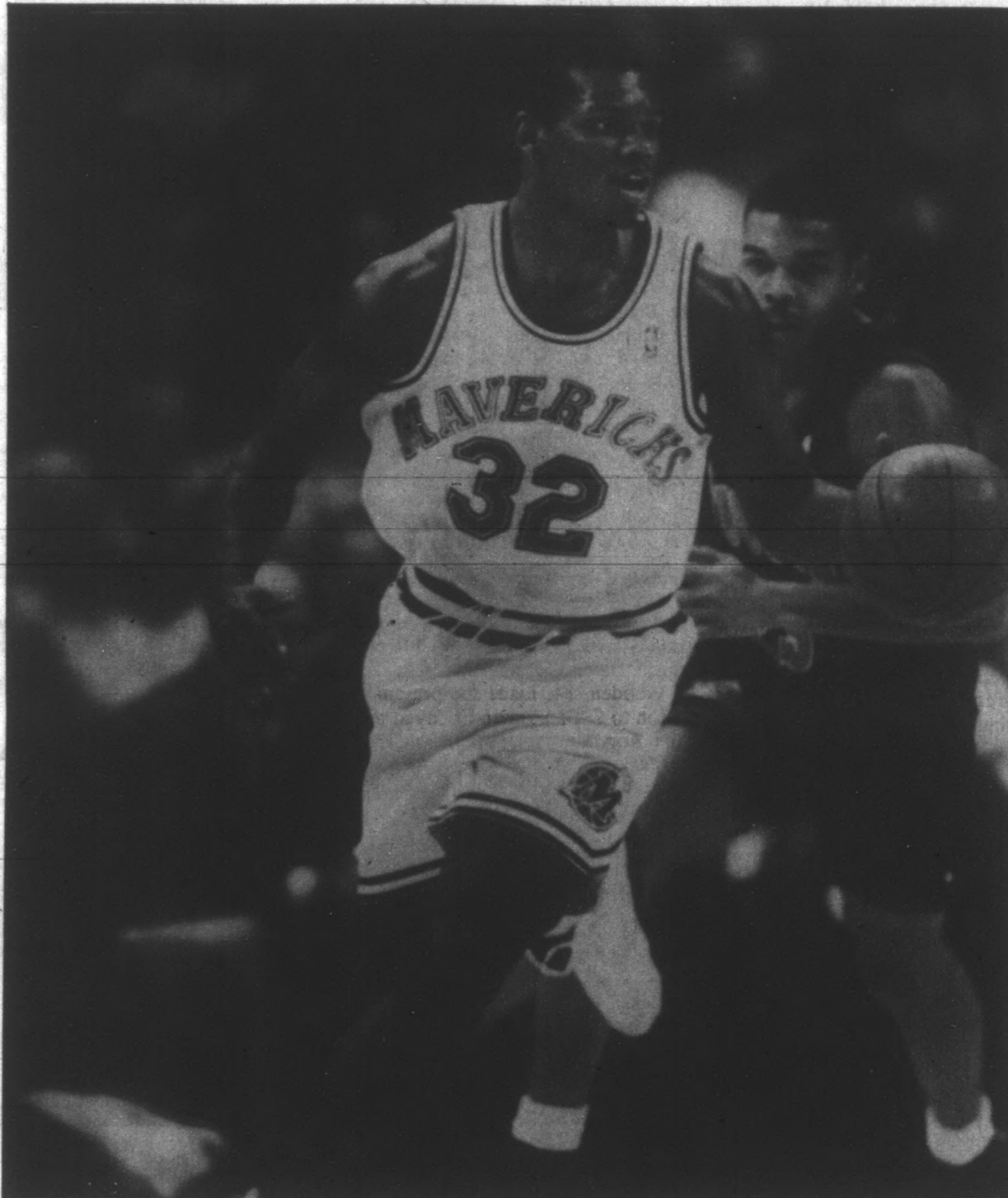
And what a final game it was — O'Bannon's 30 points and 17 rebounds led UCLA to its first NCAA championship in 20 years.

"At the time, you say, 'Why me?'" O'Bannon said of the injury he suffered in a pickup game on Oct. 9, 1990. "Now, I look back, it helped me become a better person. At that time, all I could think about was I wanted to play, even play pickup basketball. I wasn't thinking about championships or individual accomplishments."

O'Bannon suffered a torn anterior cruciate ligament in his knee. Nine days later, he underwent five hours of surgery.

He missed the entire 1990-91 season and didn't make his

Latest win has Dallas looking at playoff spot

Mavericks down T'Wolves 111-94

DALLAS (AP) — Jason Kidd is pulling the Dallas Mavericks closer to the playoffs, one triple-double at a time.

Kidd registered his second career triple-double in as many games with 11 points, 13 assists and 10 rebounds, and Jamal Mashburn turned in a 31-point game as the Mavericks won for the eighth time in their last 10 games, 111-94 over the Minnesota Timberwolves on Friday night.

"I don't expect that it will ever be routine," Kidd said. "All I can say is my teammates are playing very well. We're a very confident team right now. We've come a long way."

Dallas pulled within 1½ games of the Denver Nuggets and Sacramento Kings in the race for the eighth and final Western Conference playoff position.

"It's hard to totally put the playoffs out of your mind," Mavericks forward Popeye Jones

said. "We're starting to talk about it. We can't control what Denver and Sacramento are doing. We've just got to keep winning."

Minnesota opened the fourth quarter with an 18-6 spurt to reduce a 22-point third-quarter deficit to 93-83. But Dallas coach Dick Motta returned his starters to the lineup, and the Mavericks went on an 8-0 run capped by Kidd's layup, giving him double-figure points.

Kidd then snatched his 10th rebound with 2:55 to play to complete the sixth triple-double in club history and the first in back-to-back games in the NBA this season.

"He came up and thanked me after he came out of the game," Motta said. "Hey, I thanked him. It's hard to get that with mass substitutions. Oscar Robertson averaged a triple-double, but it's tough for a point guard."

Mashburn scored 23 points while the Mavericks were building a 16-point halftime lead.

Dallas, which held a commanding 58-37 rebounding advantage, stretched its home winning streak to five games, the longest since a 10-game streak in 1990. The

Thomas, Figgs are named Mr. and Miss Basketball

LEXINGTON, Ky. (AP) — Charles Thomas of Harlan and Ukari Figgs of Scott County, who were five-year starters and set school scoring records, were named Mr. and Miss Basketball.

Thomas, a 6-foot-4 senior forward, averaged 23 points and eight rebounds in leading Harlan to the Boys' State Tournament this season. He scored more than 3,300 points in a career highlighted by back-to-back All A Classic titles in 1994-95.

"This is a thrill, something I've dreamed of the last five years," said Thomas, who has signed to play college basketball at Minnesota. "I always thought about helping my team first and putting individual honors second, but I'd be lying if I said I didn't want to win this award."

Figgs, a 5-9 guard, averaged 18.8 points, 6.4 assists and 6.2 rebounds in leading Scott County to the girls state championship. Figgs earned MVP honors for the state tournament and ended her career with more than 2,500 points. She scored 14 points in Scott County's 68-45 win over Pulaski County in the title game.

"This means a lot," said Figgs, who has signed with Purdue. "But the best part of this season was our team getting to the state tournament for the first time and then winning it. That was awesome."

The state's high school coaches voted for Mr. and Miss Basketball. The sponsoring Kentucky Lions Eye Foundation tabulated the ballots, and the

results were announced Friday.

Thomas and Figgs will wear the No. 1 jerseys in this summer's all-star basketball rivalry against Indiana. The series will be played June 17 in Indianapolis' Market Square Arena, and June 24 in the University of Kentucky's Memorial Coliseum.

Kentucky's boys' and girls' all-star teams will be chosen this weekend after tryouts are held at South Laurel High School in London.

VonDale Morton of Lexington Catholic and Joe Harney of Covington Holy Cross were the other finalists for Mr. Basketball.

Shea Lunsford of Jackson County and Marrita Porter of Louisville Butler were the other finalists for Miss Basketball.

MTSU edges MSU in OVC play

MURFREESBORO, TENN. — In a regular-season battle for the conference lead, the Murray State tennis team dropped a tight 4-3 decision at Middle Tennessee Thursday.

The Racers earned victories at the #2, #3 and #4 singles positions but were unable to gain the doubles point, which has been a major part of MSU's early success.

"I feel really good despite the loss," said coach Mel Purcell. "Our doubles really hurt us today because we just really didn't even compete. However, I think this was a good measuring stick for us as we get ready for the OVC Tournament in a few weeks."

The Middle Tennessee sweep in doubles play was only the second time this season that MSU failed to at least win one of the three doubles matches. In addition, Hiort and Fredriksson both extended their consecutive win streaks to eight matches.

"I couldn't believe it," Harrick said. "We rode back from Palm Springs and hardly a word was said for two hours by any of our coaches. We sat there stunned. We were in shock."

"You always go through adversity before you reach the mountain top. It's a great story."

O'Bannon, a 6-foot-8, 217-pound senior, averaged 20.4 points and 8.3 rebounds for the Bruins, who went 31-2, including a 19-game winning streak to end the season.

The Wooden Award is named for the former UCLA coach who guided the Bruins to 10 NCAA championships in a 12-year span ending in 1975, when he retired.

The Bruins' 89-78 victory over Arkansas at Seattle on Monday night in this year's championship game gave them their first title since that time.

Wooden, 84, made the presentation to O'Bannon on Friday at a Los Angeles Athletic Club news conference.

"It's a great honor for me," O'Bannon said.

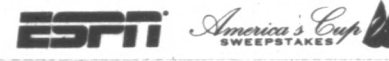

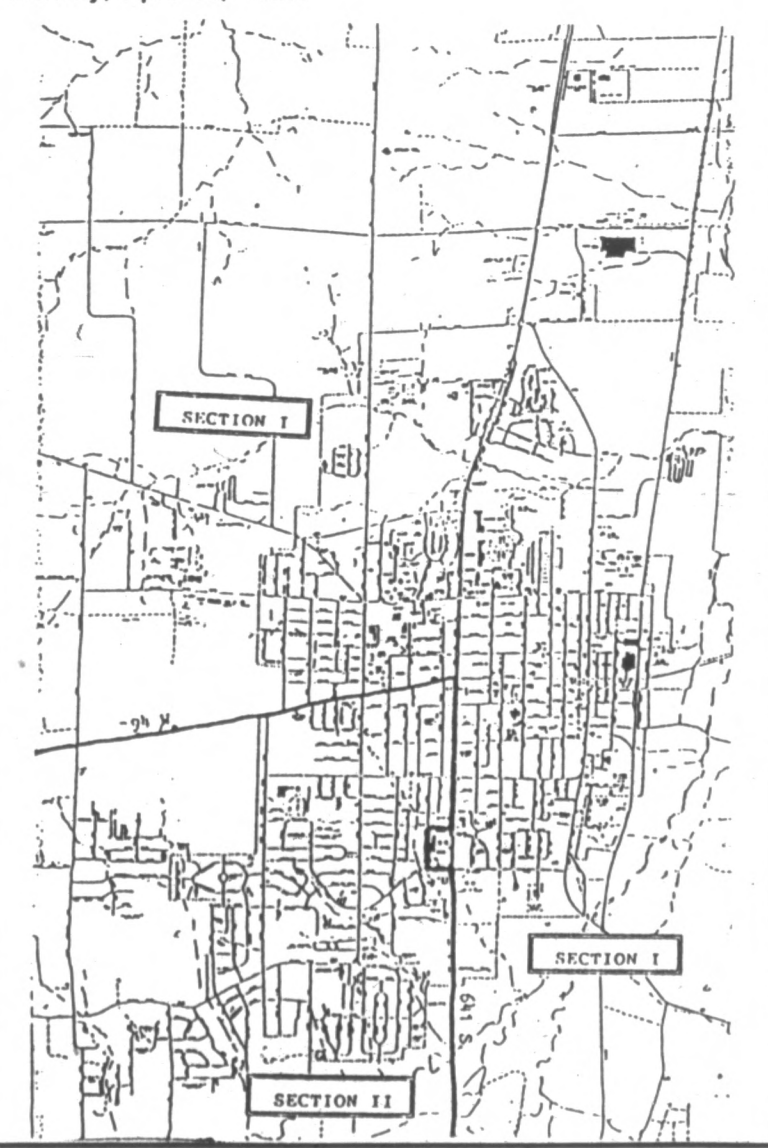

Western Ky. board seeks nominee

The agency provides a wide variety of mental health, mental retardation and substance abuse services to the nine county region. In fiscal year 1994, the WKRMH-MR Board, Inc. provided 98,003 services to the 5,943 individuals. The agency employs a staff of 150 individuals. Included in that figure are a number of psychiatrists, psychologists, social workers, psychiatric nurses, case managers, substance abuse counselors, and other professionals.

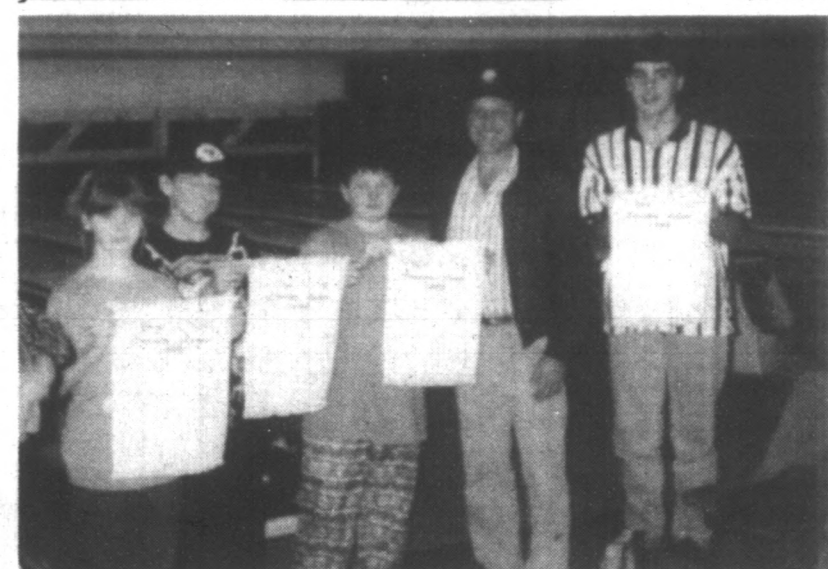

DR. GOTT

DEAR DR. GOTT: What causes night-time leg cramps? Is it a lack of exercise or diet insufficiency and what, if anything, can be done to prevent them?

DEAR DR. GOTT: The cause of nocturnal leg cramps is unknown, although some experts believe that this painful, recurring affliction may be due to inadequate circulation to the calf muscles, a common complication of aging.

Many patients have found that one or two tablets of Quinamm (quinine) at bedtime effectively prevent nocturnal leg cramps. Ask your doctor about this.

DEAR DR. GOTT: My friend has been diagnosed with tuberculosis. Is it contagious?

DEAR DR. GOTT: Indeed it is. Tuberculosis is a serious lung infection that is spread by water droplets (breathing and coughing) from an infected person.

After several years of declining prevalence, TB is once again on the rise. Most significant is that up to 20 percent of cases involve tuberculosis

bacteria that are resistant to traditional anti-microbial therapy.

Therefore, TB is rapidly becoming a major public health problem, especially among immigrants, the destitute, the homeless, and persons with immune deficiencies, such as AIDS.

You and any individuals who had prolonged close contact with the tuberculosis patient should be tested for TB. This can be done by skin tests. Ask your doctor about this.

DEAR DR. GOTT: I'm supposed to take calcium, yet when I look at the bottles in a store, one says phosphate and the other says carbonate. Which is the best one to use?

DEAR DR. GOTT: It doesn't matter, either will do. The phosphate and carbonate substances are just compounds to which the calcium ions are attached. During digestion, the body splits off the calcium and uses it for metabolism and for strengthening bones.

DEAR DR. GOTT: I get herpes blisters every time I have even a bit of an upset stomach, or if I'm in the sun too much. Some years ago my doctor gave me a series of 6 gamma globulin shots over a 6-week period to get rid of the blisters. Then, I went annually for a booster. I've since moved and my new doctor doesn't know what dosage to attempt. Do you?

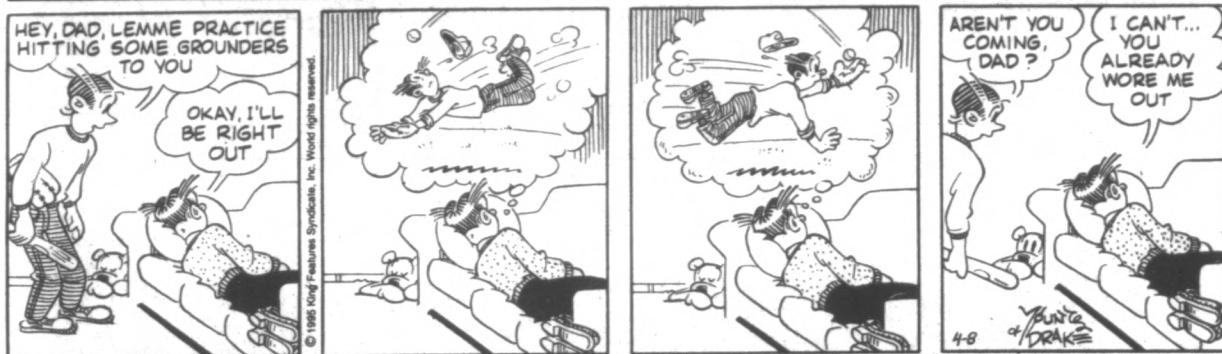
DEAR DR. GOTT: Gamma globulin is no longer used to treat herpes blisters. Rather, anti-viral drugs, such as Zovirax or Famvir, are more effective, especially when taken at the earliest sign of an infection. Ask your doctor for a prescription.

Gamma globulin, a blood product containing a variety of antibody proteins, is now used in people with certain immune deficiencies, or as a hepatitis A preventive for people traveling to the Third World.

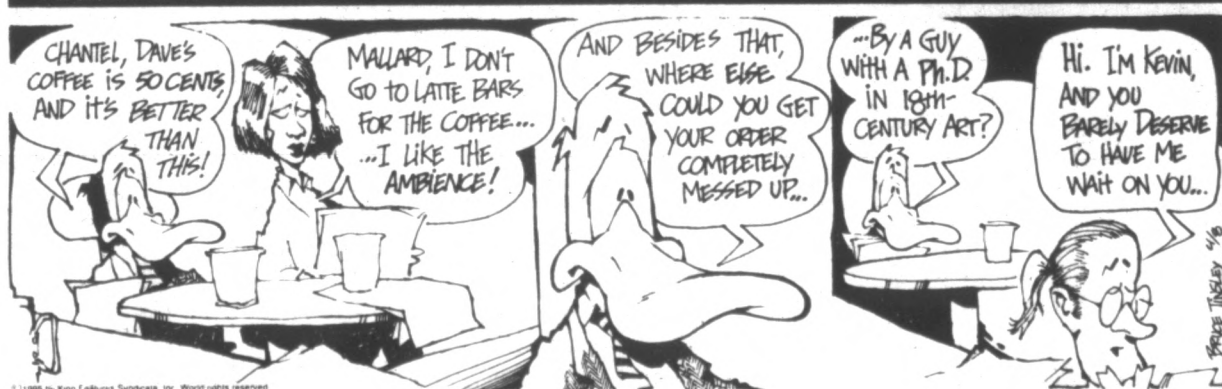

It isn't easy to see how South can make six hearts against best defense, but actually the slam is ice-cold if declarer plays correctly.

He wins the club lead with the ace and draws trumps, discarding a diamond and a spade from dummy. He then cashes the king of clubs and plays a spade to the ten.

East cannot afford to win with

the ace, which would make life easy for declarer, so he ducks. South thereupon trumps the jack of clubs, producing this position:

South now cashes the A-K of diamonds and leads a spade to the jack. East takes the ace and must return a spade, giving declarer the slam.

Of course, one can argue that this is all very smart, looking at all four hands, but how can anyone be expected to play this way seeing only two hands?

All the same, the fact is that the hand should be played in this fashion because it offers the only real chance for the slam. It is plain common sense that if a contract can be made only when the defenders' cards are divided a certain way, one must assume they are divided that way and proceed accordingly.

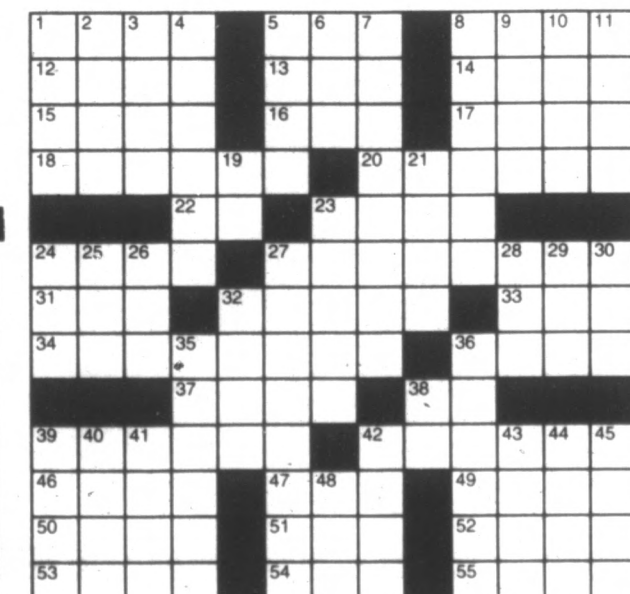

Floyd County finds 911 funds

PRESTONSBURG, Ky. (AP) — The Floyd County Fiscal Court voted Friday to transfer more than \$833,000 from various county accounts into a separate 911 account.

Judge-Executive Bob Meyer told residents recently that the money had been lumped in with the general fund and simply wasn't there anymore. But he said Friday that officials worked most of the week to "reclassify" the money in other accounts and put it in an account dedicated just to 911.

The transfer comes about two weeks after 10 residents sued the Fiscal Court, saying the funds were collected illegally. A local grand jury asked for a state investigation into why there was still no service after five years of collecting an 89-cent monthly telephone surcharge.

County officials also have acknowledged that the Fiscal Court never adopted the ordinance required to collect the fee. County Attorney Jim Hammond filed a suit last week for a ruling on whether it would be illegal to adopt a retroactive ordinance.

The court hired attorney Ned Pillersdorf to represent it in both cases. Pillersdorf said he would work free of charge.

Meanwhile, Meyer said he plans to meet with emergency personnel Wednesday to discuss how to get the system in place in short order. He said the sudden transfer of money from other funds will force some belt-tightening but shouldn't prompt layoffs.

Angry residents were scheduled to stage a caravan to the courthouse Saturday to protest the 911 situation and other alleged instances of "corruption."

UK professor wins fellowship to research reading practices

LEXINGTON, Ky. (AP) — A pair of psychology professors from the University of Kentucky and the University of Turku in Finland plan to use a high-tech computer to learn more about the way people read.

The computer can measure how many seconds someone spends reading each word and can keep track of whether the reader backs up to re-read any part of a text, said Jukka Hyona, the Finnish professor.

Robert Lorch of UK will travel to Finland for two months to work with Hyona.

Lorch hopes to figure out why some people understand what they read better than others.

The way people's eyes move while they read might be the clue that unlocks the mystery of how their minds work, Lorch thinks. He recently won a Fulbright Fellowship to research that question this summer.

"The time it takes to do things gives you a general assumption about what's going on in the head," Lorch said. "Where the eyes are is where the mind is."

The Fulbright Fellowship pays \$5,000 toward his travel and living expenses in Finland, Lorch said.

About 1,000 faculty members in the United States get Fulbright awards each year, said Suzanne Kifer, an international affairs adviser at UK. There are about 40 faculty members at UK who have been Fulbright scholars, she said.

Lorch and Hyona have been corresponding by electronic mail on the Internet about their research. But they've never met each other, and they haven't even talked on the phone.

Lorch said he still thinks he knows Hyona fairly well.

"E-mail is much more personal than a letter, because you're doing these blurbs really quickly and casually, almost like conversation," he said. "If I'd just corresponded by letter, I'd be a lot more reticent about jumping on a plane to meet him."

Lorch, who came to UK in 1980, said he is especially interested in seeing whether the use of headlines and summaries in a text influences how well readers understand it.

"I wouldn't say the eye movements themselves are what's important," Lorch said. "They're just a tool to reflect what's going on with the comprehension."

Hyona said in an interview conducted by electronic mail on the Internet that he had read of Lorch's work and became interested in collaborating with him because he thought their research projects would mesh well together.

"To me, our study has both theoretical and practical implications," Hyona said. "Theoretically, the key question is how the quality of processing is related to

the subsequent memory representation. Practically, the results will have implications to the way texts should be written."

But Lorch, who has studied reading for 15 years, said that coming up with certain answers will take time, because so many factors influence reading comprehension.

"It's a really complex process. There are a lot of things going on at once," Lorch said. "But it's an inherently important activity, because most people in society have to learn to do it well."
