Slashing LBL

Reduced funding looms in future

With the threat of budget cuts coming closer to TVA, the future of Land Between the Lakes once again hangs in limbo.

Because of the uncertainty, the question of commercialization has been tossed around as a possible solution.

However, some people don't think it should even be an option.

"I've heard about a possible 50 percent cut and a multitude of other rumors," said Harry Todd, tourism director for the Cadiz-Trigg County Tourist and Convention Commission. "LBL is probably the flagship of the tourism industry in Kentucky."

Todd said people visit LBL to see nature, not to spend time in camping facilities.

"If the facilities were shut down and the roads were kept open, it wouldn't hurt us," Todd said. "I would rather have them do that than commercialize. Private commercialization is what we have to be afraid of."

Todd, who is on the board of directors of Kentucky Western

Waterlands, said he has talked with everyone in the political arena from Sen. Jeff Green on the state level to U.S. Sen. Wendell Ford on the federal level.

"I am sure there will be some reductions that will lessen the quality of service," Todd said. "The biggest threat is if LBL is sold off and commercialized into motels and restaurants. That would really bite into the quality of life around here. I don't mind the facilities being leased out as long as LBL is operated like it is now."

Although LBL has reduced much of its staff, Todd said 70 percent of the budget is for salaries.

"That is unreal," he said. "For years, LBL has never had to worry about money. But now we have a Republican Congress and a Democratic president all wanting a balanced budget. Now people like those at LBL are fighting like hell to save their jobs."

Todd is not very optimistic about LBL's future with TVA. "Within the next five years, TVA will not own or operate

LBL," he said. "I think it will be contracted out piece by piece. As funds begin to draw up, the leasing of a piece here

and a piece there will start." Todd emphasized that a reduction in funds for LBL probably wouldn't net much of

a reaction from the former landowners.

"But if they try to privatize it and sell it off, the landowners

will be in an uproar," Todd said. "It should be strictly a nature center with limited facil-

ities." ■ See Page 2

Jones prepares list of requests

LEXINGTON, Ky. (AP) — Taking a line from a would-be successor, Gov. Brereton Jones said he may ask the General Assembly for a tax cut. It could be in the form of a higher standard deduction on Kentucky income taxes.

Lt. Gov. Paul Patton, the Democratic nominee for governor, has promised to seek an increase in the standard deduction if he is elected.

"If you compare our standard deduction with surrounding states, it's a lot lower" than the other states, Jones said Friday during taping for WLEX-TV's "Your Government" program.

Jones said such a tax cut would be aimed at Kentuckians earning \$10,000 to \$50,000 per year.

Patton proposed raising the deduction from \$650 to at least \$1,700 — a move he said would cost the state \$33 million per year in revenue. Taxpayers who don't itemize take the minimum standard deduction.

But Jones said the amount that the deduction could be raised would depend on how much money will be available to the state and what sort of agreement he could reach with lawmakers. He stressed that he is open to alternatives, so long as they reduce working people's taxes.

Many legislative leaders have said they want to address only court-ordered redistricting if Jones calls a special session. Legislators have said the time is not right for the state to spend money on projects. Jones has indicated he will call a session to begin July 31.

But Jones said Friday he still intends to press for the projects he considers to be an investment in jobs and education.

He said examples would be construction of community college buildings and purchases of school computers.

Several legislative leaders told Cabinet Secretary Mark Guilfoyle on Wednesday that there was little sentiment among rank-and-file legislators for a special session of any considerable length. Jones was in Cumberland County that day to break ground for a lodge at Dale Hollow Lake State Park.

Jones said Friday he wants to meet with the legislative leaders next week.

The money that Jones proposes to use at the special session would be a combination of surplus General Fund revenue (about \$60 million) and savings from state government belt-tightening (maybe \$30 million) that would be available when the fiscal year ends June 30.

Local students accept prestigious award

Three students from Murray have accepted Presidential Scholarships at Murray State University.

Considered Murray State's most prestigious scholarship award, the Presidential Scholarship covers the cost of tuition, room, board and fees for a total of four years. These students are among only 14 entering freshmen selected to receive the scholarship. They were chosen from a pool of more than 1,000 students.

Applicants for the Presidential Scholarship must rank in the upper seven percent of their class and have a minimum composite ACT score of 29, or be a National Merit Semi-Finalist. Scholarship recipients must maintain a 3.2 grade-point average at MSU.

Thomas Richter, a 1995 graduate of Calloway County High School, is the son of Fred and Margaret Richter of Murray. He had a 4.0 grade-point average and was valedictorian, ranking first in his graduating class of 227 students at Calloway High. He achieved a composite score of 32 on the ACT.

While in high school, Richter was involved with several organizations, serving as the Student Council president, band president, Beta Club vice president, academic team captain, math team captain, Co-Ed Y Club president, class officer, as well as the lead role in the school play. He also held memberships in the Foreign Language Club and jazz/pep band.

Richter is very active in his church, having served in the choir, youth group, and as a Royal Ambassador counselor and Church Brotherhood director. During his years in high school, he has

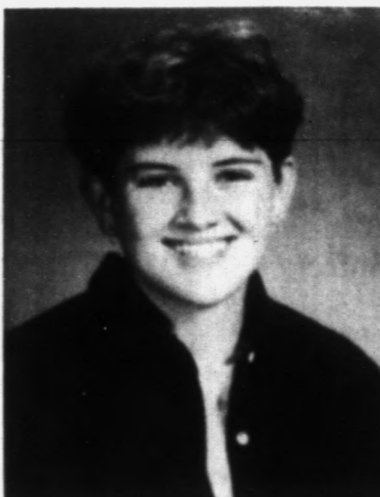

preached at churches throughout the area.

Richter's honors include having been named a National Merit Semi-Finalist and a Governor's Scholar. Recipient of a DAR Good Citizen Award, Richter has been selected to the All-District and All-State Band. He has also been recognized as a National Latin Exam medalist for three years. Aside from being named a HOBY Ambassador, Junior Honor Bandsman, and State Bible Drill winner, Richter has received recognition for nine years of perfect Sunday School attendance and four years perfect high school attendance. He has been awarded seven state Foreign Language Festival medals and several superior ratings by the Kentucky Music Educators' Association.

Other honors include receiving class achievement awards for maintaining the highest grade average in advanced-placement Latin, honors

English, accelerated geometry, honors chemistry, pre-calculus, advanced-placement U.S. history, and physics. In addition, Richter was licensed as a minister in 1993.

His career objective is to be a minister.

Keisa Bennett, a 1995 graduate of Murray High School, is the daughter of Dr. Donald and Jean Bennett of Murray. Graduating with a 4.0 grade-point average, she served as valedictorian, ranking first in her class of 80 students. She achieved a composite score of 34 on the ACT.

Her high school activities included serving as an officer and section leader of the band, as well as a member of the chorus and National Honor Society. In addition, she served as captain of the Academic Team, the winner of the district and regional competition which placed ninth out of 144 schools in the state meet. Bennett

also coached the fourth and fifth grade Murray Middle School Academic Team.

A National Merit Semi-Finalist and Governor's Scholar, Bennett's other honors include having earned letters as a four year member of the Kentucky Academic Association Governor's Cup Competition, she received first place at the district and regional level in language arts and general knowledge. In addition, Bennett won first place in science and essay, as well as first place in overall score for the Academic Decathlon Team.

Her other awards include having received first place in world history at Murray State Day, and member of the first place team at MSU Biology Day. She is also the recipient of a Girl Scout Gold Award.

Bennett plans to major in bio-

At this stage in the budget process, no one is sure what the final plan will be for LBL.

Based on the plan approved early this week by a House appropriations subcommittee, the budget for LBL could be cut in half.

Slicing \$3 million from LBL's \$6.15 million budget could prove devastating for the 170,000-acre recreational and environmental education area, especially since LBL is still trying to recover from reductions made in October 1994.

"If that funding level is approved, it could be disastrous for LBL," said John Mechler, manager of LBL's resource management. "There is certainly cause for concern."

The House Appropriations Committee's energy and water subcommittee voted Tuesday to cut TVA's 1996 nonpower budget from \$140 million to \$103 million.

If the \$103 million funding level is approved, it would be the lowest level since 1989.

"This is only a subcommittee report and it still has to go through other committees," Mechler said. "It is still early in the process."

Although LBL officials are trying to remain optimistic, Mechler acknowledged that only receiving half of the federal appropriations would make it virtually impossible to maintain the same level of operation.

"It has been suggested that we raise user fees," Mechler said. "That would be ludicrous. If we phased in the cuts over multiple years, that might be possible. But to do it immediately is impossible and would cause major closings."

It would also mean reductions for LBL's staff of about 120

employees, which excludes seasonal and part-time workers.

After a round of budget cuts last fall and a mandate from Tennessee Valley Authority urging LBL to become more self-sufficient, LBL officials initiated 30-percent reductions in both its operating expenses and its workforce.

LBL began its 1994-95 season minus three of its veteran facilities. Since then, the Land Between the Lakes Association reopened the North and South Welcome Stations (visitor centers at each entrance to LBL).

LBL is currently seeking an organization to lease Youth Station, a resident outdoor environmental education center.

Meanwhile, LBL officials are compiling a public use plan regarding the future of the recreational and environmental education area.

"We are making good progress on the plan, but we aren't even close to implementation," Mechler said. "We definitely can't handle this kind of budget reduction."

U.S. Sen. Mitch McConnell will tackle the funding issue when it reaches the Senate's Appropriations subcommittee on energy and water development.

"We will try to save as much of the funding as we can," McConnell said in a conference call earlier this week. "Congressman Ed Whitfield and I will try to do as much as possible to save what we can."

However, McConnell expressed concern about the TVA appropriations.

"In this environment, we are lucky to save the TVA non-power budget at all," he said. "There is no question that the TVA projects on the western Kentucky border will be impacted."

However, transferring the operation of LBL to another federal agency didn't gain much support from McConnell.

"All of the agencies are taking a hit right now," he said. "We will look at all options because LBL is extremely important to Kentucky and it is one of our national treasures."

Merchants from China shipped dishes and fine china and they used the seed pods from the paulownia tree to pack and protect the dishes from breakage. The packing was then discarded and the fine seeds found

their way into ideal growing conditions in all of Kentucky and surrounding states.

The original trees, growing since the 1880s, have been searched out and bought by buyers from Asian countries because of its value to them in the building of musical instruments and traditional hope chests, etc.

The tree is very fast growing and has a very beautiful and fragrant purple bell-shaped flower. The flowers bloom in mid to late spring and last for a number of weeks. These trees are so fast growing that they are ideal for children to watch the growth and learn to appreciate nature.

Gateway Nursery has begun to grow a number of these trees from seed and will be making them available on an adoption basis or outright purchase. Bring your child, or just adopt one for yourself. Gateway will care for it until it is ready for transplanting into your yard.

The "princess" tree is a beautiful shade tree with very large leaves and will grow to about 65 feet. It has been known to grow 16 to 20 feet in just one year!

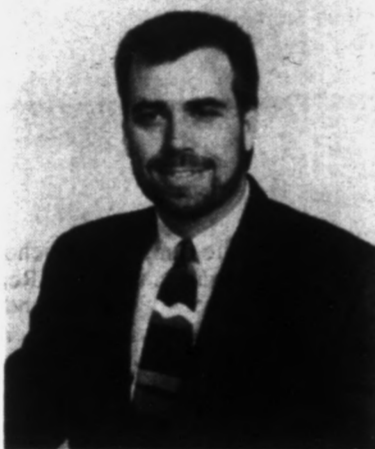
Rollins reaches million dollar production level

GOP chairman says presidential field may grow

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Republican Party is brimming with White House hopefuls, and the party chairman said Thursday the pack still may grow. However, said Haley Barbour, he does not expect House Speaker Newt Gingrich to be among the latecomers.

"I would be quite surprised if he did," Barbour told a handful of reporters at his office. Gingrich has heightened speculation with plans for an upcoming visit to New Hampshire, the site of the nation's first primary and a virtual second home to presidential primary candidates.

Barbour refused to be drawn into speculation about who might still enter the race other than California Gov. Pete Wilson, whose announcement has been delayed until later this month because of throat surgery.

"I'm not sure the field is set. There could be more candidates to get in the race," even after Wilson, he said. Among potential contenders, Gov. Tommy Thompson of Wisconsin is actively considering a bid.

Barbour said he did not know the plans of Joint Chiefs of Staff Chairman Colin Powell, who often is mentioned as a possible contender. But he said he did not envision Powell making a bid as an independent, as is sometimes mentioned, because that would relegate him to the role of "a spoiler."

The number of Republican candidates dipping into the federal trough for 1996 campaign funds also is growing.

The Federal Election Commission received documents late Wednesday from the campaigns of former Tennessee Gov. Lamar Alexander, Senate Majority Leader Bob Dole and TV commentator Patrick Buchanan to certify they have qualified for federal matching funds.

Sen. Phil Gramm, R-Texas, was the first to qualify several weeks ago.

Gramm and Dole are using matching funds despite their recent votes to do away with the federal funding system. The Senate defeated that effort, with two other presidential hopefuls, Sens. Arlen Specter, R-Pa., and Richard Lugar, R-Ind., voting to keep the system.

To receive matching funds, a candidate must prove he or she has raised \$5,000 in each of 20 states in increments of \$200 or less. The matching funds are not disbursed, however, until the beginning of the election year. The money comes from a fund supported by the voluntary \$3 checkoff on individual income tax returns.

President Clinton now is joining what has become a pre-election ritual for White House contenders — a pilgrimage to Larry King's television show.

Clinton, along with Vice President Al Gore, will appear on CNN's "Larry King Live" on Monday.

The Republican candidates have virtually worn out the rug on King's prime time set, all appearing to discuss their ideas about running, decisions to run and announcements on running.

Former Secretary of State James A. Baker III took a veiled swipe on Thursday at Dole and Gingrich for their advocating moving the U.S. Embassy in Israel from Tel Aviv to Jerusalem.

The status of Jerusalem, claimed as a Holy City by Jews, Arabs and Christians, is one of the most sensitive issues in the region.

Baker said any discussion of Jerusalem should continue to be deferred until other issues in the peace process are resolved.

"The worst thing we can do for the peace process is to talk about Jerusalem," he said. "Jerusalem is the thorniest issue of all..."

The more you talk about it now, the tougher it's going to be to have a successful peace process."

In a news conference, Baker declined to criticize Dole and Gingrich directly, but when asked about their advocacy of the embassy move, he said, "It's really important that those of us who want to see peace go forward understand the quickest way for it to get bogged down and sidetracked is if we try and put Jerusalem at the top of the agenda."

Former Democratic National Committee Chairman David Wilhelm is seriously considering running for the Illinois Senate seat being vacated by Democrat Paul Simon, confidants said Thursday.

Wilhelm, who returned to Chicago after leaving the DNC in January, is working for Kemper Securities as an investment counselor. Former Illinois Attorney Gen. Neil Hartigan, who was considered the Democratic frontrunner, decided this week not to run.

Wilhelm spent Wednesday and most of Thursday calling Illinois Democrats and friends around the country to assess his prospects for fund-raising and support. He is expected to decide in the next week or so.

The Republican lieutenant governor is the favorite for the GOP nomination. Other Democrats likely to run include U.S. Rep. Richard Darbin. But Wilhelm associates believe a Chicago-based candidate would have a better chance.

Business took me to New York City for two days back in April. The business meetings confirmed that New York is still a very large city, teeming with millions of people, all of whom seem dedicated to making it difficult to walk or get to a cab just when one needs to be somewhere.

But then came three surprises—verifying that even in crowded New York, the world is still a small one. The first came at breakfast of the second day. Reading the New York Times, I stumbled upon a review of a play, "The Heiress," an adaptation of a Henry James novel. The review was very complimentary, especially of the play's leading actress, a young woman named Cherry Jones.

Cherry Jones is indeed a talented actress. She is also a native of Paris, Tennessee. We share the same home town, and I've known her parents, Jack and Joan Cherry Jones, an English teacher and a florist, for years, and knew her grandparents as well. We also shared the same speech and drama coach, the late Ruby Krider. Paris' sterling answer to Sarah Bernhardt and Mother Teresa.

I wished in vain for another night in New York so I could see Cherry perform. Six weeks later, I did see her on television, receiving a Tony Award as Best Actress. Not bad for a Paris girl—but no less than Miss Ruby expected of her. It now appears that "The Heiress" may be playing for some time, so we expect to get up to see her before summer ends.

My path back to the hotel from the bookshop took me by St. Thomas Church, an Episcopal cathedral. The bulletin board on the steps of the Gothic structure caught my eye, announcing a forthcoming organ recital at 5:15 p.m. on Palm Sunday (two days hence) by someone named Quentin Lane.

Some 25 years ago, when I was a young administrator at the University of Alabama, I had known a talented student named Quentin Lane, an African-American national merit scholar from Selma, who had demonstrated impressive music ability. I recalled that he had won a fellowship for graduate study at the Eastman School of Music in Rochester. I rushed into the church, where I heard someone tuning the organ. It was not Lane, but a brochure in the narthex told me that he was from Birmingham. Back at work, a call to the Alabama alumni office provided me with an address, and I wrote the Quentin Lane I had known. Shortly afterward, he phoned, delighted that I had tracked him down and that we could renew our acquaintance. He has had a distinguished career in church music in England and this country.

The point of all this is not that I travel a lot or know a good many people. Rather, I think these chance encounters demonstrate that I am a typical small-town southerner.

Most southerners have some inbred radar that guides them through mass and anonymous society to familiar faces and names. It is a commonly held southern gift, and I have no more portion of it than do most other southerners. It has proved itself to be a blessing, and I marvel that it has been given us. Anything that can make an enormous metropolis such as New York seem personalized is quite a gift.

Nicklaus faces closing ceremony at Open

Shinnecock manhandles Golden Bear

SOUTHAMPTON, N.Y. (AP) — Jack Nicklaus said he'd leave golf before he'd become a ceremonial golfer.
Too late.
That day has already come and gone. Any remaining doubts melted as Nicklaus strolled onto the 18th green at Shinnecock

Hills, clearly embarrassed as much by the ovation as the 81 he was going to have to put down on his scorecard Friday.

The great man reluctantly

doffed his cap, then raised his arms, palms turned up, to try and cut short the growing roar. Now grimacing, now grinning painfully, he looked exactly like the celebrity he never wanted to be.

"It was nice," Nicklaus said, the ovation still ringing in his ears. "It's too bad I couldn't play up to it."

Sentiment will prop up a legend only so long — sometimes, too long.

Few things in sport were sadder than watching Willie Mays playing center field for the Mets,

stumbling so badly after fly balls that he wasn't beyond asking for pity. "Growing old," he once explained, "is a helpless hurt."

Nicklaus needs no one's pity. And golf, for whatever other cruelties the game inflicts, at least allows its competitors a graceful exit. Now is the time for Jack to begin thinking about how to make his from the major tournaments.

The 55-year-old Nicklaus has played every major every year since the 1962 Masters. If he continues, he threatens to tarnish

the greatest record the game has ever seen. But if he picks his spots, as Nicklaus might be willing to do, we can laud him for discretion as much as for valor.

There is no nice way to say this: Grand slams tournaments in the 1990's have become a disaster for Jack, almost a crash-and-burn cliché. According to research by Sal Johnson, author of the U.S. Open Almanac, Nicklaus is averaging just under 72 in the opening round of the majors and almost 74 on Day 2. And those tournaments where he sur-

vives the cut almost always end badly. Although Nicklaus managed a sixth-place finish in the Masters as recently as five years ago, his Sunday average in the majors is 73.3.

The problem is that Jack thrilled nearly as many people with his 81 here as he did shooting 66 over some other U.S. Open three decades ago.

Our eyes will no longer go along with the deception. But our hearts — remembering his epic

Lankford HR, steal delivers Cards 6-5 win over Giants

ST. LOUIS (AP) — New style, and a nice result.

New St. Louis Cardinals manager Mike Jorgensen picked up where the fired Joe Torre left off as the NL Central's fourth-place team made it five out of six with a 6-5 victory over the San Francisco Giants on Friday night.

Ray Lankford hit a two-run homer and stole home to show off Jorgensen's more aggressive style for St. Louis, which continued its best stretch of the year. Jorgensen, named manager earlier in the day, had been their director of player development since 1992, and he sweated out his first game.

"I checked the lineup probably about 18 times before I left the office," Jorgensen said. "That wouldn't have been a very good start to go out there with a messed-up lineup card. I'll feel more comfortable tomorrow."

Lankford, moved to the cleanup slot vacated by the trade of Todd Zeile to the Chicago Cubs hours earlier, hit his sixth home run with two outs in the first off Bill VanLandingham (0-1).

Lankford got the Cardinals' first steal of home since Vince Coleman on July 24, 1990, a little more than a week before the conservative Torre was hired as manager, on the back end of a double steal with Chris Sabo in a four-run fifth.

"That's Ray," Jorgensen said. "He saw the play develop and got a jump when (catcher Kirt) Manwaring threw the ball. He ran the play perfectly."

Sabo, whose contract was purchased from Triple-A Louisville earlier in the day, made a fielding error at first base in the second, that led to a run but had a run-scoring single in the fifth before the double steal.

Shinnecock turns scary for weekend

SOUTHAMPTON, N.Y. (AP) — Here we go again. Greg Norman is in position to win a major championship. And this time the U.S. Open could be turning into the kind of tournament Norman loves.

Shinnecock Hills was as stubborn as ever in Friday's second round but Norman was magnificent, shooting a 3-under-par 67 to take the halfway lead at 135, two strokes ahead of Jumbo Ozaki.

Norman worked and willed his way through a five-birdie, two-bogey round over an already difficult Shinnecock course that was getting tougher by the hour as steady sea breezes dried the links.

It was a round that would have been a 64 — or better — on most any other course. "Shinnecock is starting to show its teeth," Norman said. "By No. 7 the wind started to pick up and it's getting tough. It's going to be

Houston Rockets, fans celebrate NBA title

HOUSTON (AP) — Waving signs and banners, peering through skyscraper windows and hanging from parking decks, an estimated half-million Houston Rockets fans jammed downtown Friday for a parade to honor their repeat NBA champions.

A broad stripe of red and gold — the Rockets' colors — was painted down the middle of the 22-block-long parade route as Houston players and coaches rode aboard city fire trucks.

Many of the streets were tem-

porarily renamed to reflect Rocket names, like Sam I Am Street, named for Sam Cassell, the (Mar-10) Elie Expressway, the Rudy T (Tomjanovich) Tollway.

"I'm having a ball," Elie said from atop one of the trucks, wearing a red T-shirt proclaiming "Two — The Hard Way."

"The turnout is great," he added, blowing kisses to the throng. "It's a beautiful day for a celebration. Hopefully we can do it again next year. We're just having an exciting time. I'm going to savor this moment the rest of my life."

"It's a three-ring circus," teammate Kenny Smith said.

The Rockets' amazing run through the playoffs was capped Wednesday night when they completed a four-game sweep of Orlando in the NBA Finals for back-to-back titles. With a No. 6 seed in the playoffs based on their regular-season performance, they became the lowest-seeded team ever to make it all the way to the championship.

"I would say it's better (this year)," Frank Porter, a 44-year-old tailor, said standing outside his downtown shop. "I think

when they came along and were able to sweep somebody four games in a row, I think that's great."

This year's parade was bigger than one staged after the Rockets' first crown a year ago, with cheerleaders, marching bands, floats, and huge helium-filled basketballs.

"This is fantastic," said Clyde Drexler, whose trade Feb. 14 to his hometown of Houston after a dozen years in Portland is credited with sparking the Rockets to a repeat title.

"Nothing could be finer,"

Drexler said. "This is absolutely phenomenal. It's also a lot of fun."

Carl Herrera, whose shoulder injury kept him out of most of the playoffs, hoisted the championship trophy over his head, then passed it to teammate Cassell.

"I'm having fun," Cassell said. "I've got the trophy in my hands."

Fans began showing up at daybreak, hours before the late-morning start for the procession.

"I knew it. I knew they couldn't help but do it," Phyllis Harris, 42, said. "Last year they

had to learn what to do. This year, they just put it in force."

She was wearing a red Rockets T-shirt and had dressed her dog in a similar shirt.

Once the parade started, confetti streamed down like snow, something rarely seen in steamy Houston.

The parade a year ago was marked by 100-degree heat and nearly equal humidity, prompting scores of people to seek assistance for heat exhaustion.

Few problems were reported Friday with temperatures in the relatively comfortable mid-80s.

1962 U.S. Open battle with Arnold Palmer at Oakmont, his 1977 "Duel in the Sun" with Tom Watson at Turnberry, his closing rush in the 1986 Masters at age 46 — would let it go on forever. But not all of golf's governing bodies are prepared to go along.

Among the majors, the Masters and PGA Championship grant former champions lifetime exemptions. And the British Open, in order to give Palmer one final go-round at St. Andrews, recently bumped its exemption for past champions from age 60 to 65.

The U.S. Open grants champions only 10-year exemptions, though it often makes special cases — as it has this year for Nicklaus. But his pairing Friday with former U.S. Open champion Andy North and British Open champion Ian Baker-Finch — a decidedly unglamorous pair — may have been a subtle message from the U.S. Golf Association that he is not in line for many more exemptions.

Nicklaus himself may have picked that up.

"I've said many times, if the USGA felt I could be competitive, an addition to their tourna-

ment, they might be better judges than I. You never know what your own abilities are. Sometimes, I think mine are better than they are; sometimes, I think they're worse."

Friday's round left little doubt which it is at the moment.

On No. 7, Nicklaus hit a 7-iron so poorly, it surprised even him. "It was 30 yards off-line," he recalled dispassionately, as though he were talking about someone else. On Nos. 13 and 16, knowing he needed birdies to make the cut, he hit driver and dumped both tee balls into the left rough. He made bogey and double-bogey at those two holes.

"Every time I tried to make something happen," Nicklaus said softly, "it got worse."

And it isn't going to get any easier. The hardest part now for Jack is to let it be known that he would accept special exemptions at the remaining Open venues where he made history or history made him. He played in 39 Opens and won four. Besides those wins, a few more hold special meaning.

"Next year at Oakland Hills would be 40," he said, "a nice round number to finish off. I'd hate what I did today to be my last round in the U.S. Open." So would we all.

Among those missing the cut for the weekend rounds were defending champion Ernie Els, Seve Ballesteros, Hale Irwin,

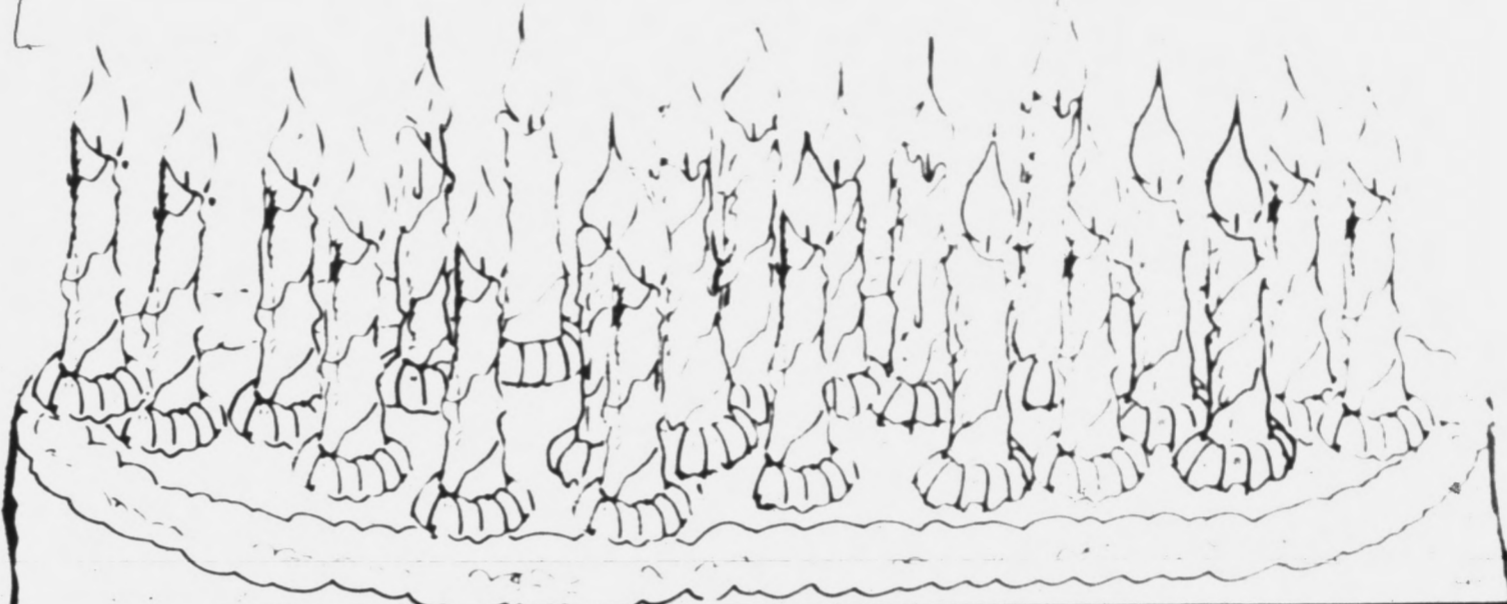

Archaeology weekend planned

Murray State University's Wickliffe Mounds Research Center will host its annual archaeology weekend on June 24-25.

"This is one of our big events," said Kit Wesler, director of the center. "A lot of our visitors look forward to it every year. Demonstrations of prehistoric crafts are what draws the visitors. Demonstrations are planned both days."

"Our demonstrators are expert at reproducing artifacts as they would have been made by the people who lived here about a 1,000 years ago," Wesler said.

Returning this year are Tamara Beane, potter; Susan Wilson, finger weaver; Jerry Wilson, bone, shell

and gourd worker; Ron Webb, hide tanner; Albert Meyer, copper worker; Larry Kinsella, flint-knapper; and Marilyn Kinsella, storyteller.

"On Saturday, we also have excavations on site. Weekends are the only time that many people can come out and watch excavations going on, so we have always included that as part of archaeology weekend," Wesler said.

This may be one of the last times visitors can see the Wickliffe site being excavated, according to Wesler.

"I expect we'll also do some digging here next year, especially around archaeology weekend, but

after that, we'll be preserving the site and analyzing what we've got, rather than continuing to dig," Wesler said. "We'll keep the museum going, of course. As we continue to analyze the site, we'll add that information to the exhibits."

The center's research interests are shifting to other sites in Ballard, Carlisle, Hickman and northern Graves counties, according to Wesler.

DEAR DR. GOTT: I'm a 62-year-old Caucasian male who has experienced headaches most of my life due to dust allergies, milk, mold, beer, wine, etc.

For example, in your case, dust and mold are everywhere; you can't be isolated from them.

I suggest that you place yourself under the care of an allergist for the purpose of desensitization injections.

The specialist will concoct batches of serum, in increasing concentrations that contain the substances to which you are most allergic.

The arthritis in your neck may also play a role. If the allergist agrees, he may choose to refer you for physical

therapy, in conjunction with the shots. I believe that you could really be helped by an allergist.

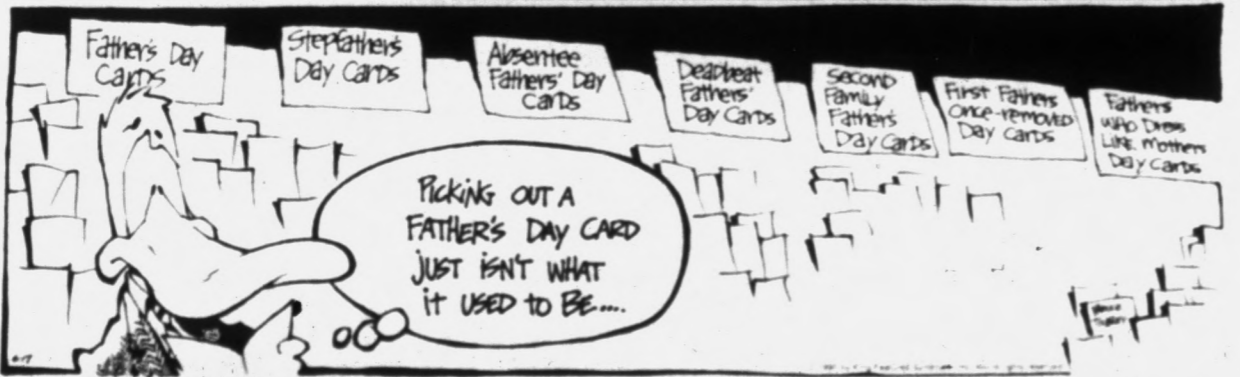

TODAY IN HISTORY

Today is Saturday, June 17, the 168th day of 1995. There are 197 days left in the year.

Today's Highlight in History: In 1991, the remains of President Zachary Taylor were briefly exhumed in Louisville, Kentucky, to test a theory that Taylor had died of arsenic poisoning.

Ten years ago: On day four of the hijacking of TWA Flight 847, Amal militia leader Nabih Berri said the hostages had been scattered to thwart a possible rescue.

Five years ago: South African black nationalist Nelson Mandela and his wife, Winnie, arrived in Ottawa, Canada, en route to an 11-day tour of the United States.

CONTRACT BRIDGE

North dealer. Neither side vulnerable.

NORTH: A Q 2, A 10 5, K 6 2, J 9 8 4.

WEST: K 9 8 6 4, 8 3 2, Q J 4, Q 3.

SOUTH: J 10 5 3, K Q J, 9 8 5, A K 10.

The bidding: North East South West 1 Pass 2 NT Pass 3 NT.

Opening lead - six of spades. When and when not to finesse is a problem often encountered by declarer.

Consider this deal where South got a spade lead, which he won with the ten. Assuming West had the spade king, declarer could count three spade tricks, three hearts, and two clubs as sure winners.

South saw there were two sources from which he might acquire a ninth trick. One was to play West for the ace of diamonds, in which case a lead towards the king would produce trick number nine.

clubs, in which case the contract could be made by finessing the ten. Since it was too dangerous to test the diamond situation first, South cashed the ace of clubs at trick two, entered dummy with the queen of spades, led a club and finessed.

Unfortunately, the ten lost to the queen, and West, having no other hope, shifted to the queen of diamonds. The defense then rattled off four diamonds and declarer went down one.

Of course, if South had known the actual club situation, he would have played the A-K, caught the queen, and made four notrump. The question is whether South should have played in this fashion without the benefit of a peek at the East-West cards.

Strange as it may seem, this is the right line of play. If the matter is considered objectively, it is clear that South should not have taken a club finesse.

Obviously, the basis for the finesse is the hope that East was dealt the queen of clubs. But if this is actually the case, declarer is nevertheless sure to make the contract by playing the A-K-10 of clubs. East may take the queen, but declarer acquires his ninth trick in the form of dummy's jack without running the risk of West gaining the lead for the potentially fatal diamond shift.

Cashing the A-K also guards against West's having started with the Q-x of clubs, and thereby increases South's overall chances.

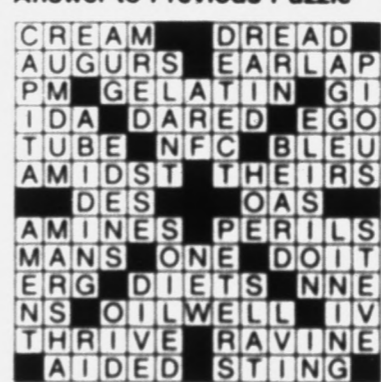

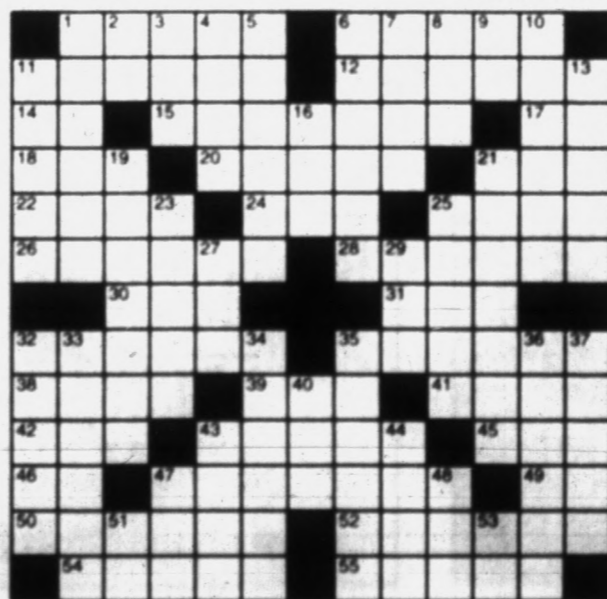

Cold moon rises on lake

Recent front lowers temps, cools fishing

The full moon suggests good fishing, but it hasn't been quite like that this week for everyone. A three day cold front moved in and caused a lot of fish to suspend or move to deeper water and wait for better conditions.

I fished with Gary and Chad Lanville before conditions got tough and we put together a pretty good pattern on bass. It was simple hard work to crank a big bait for several hours but the rewards were worth the effort.

The guys were here to learn about Kentucky Lake and how to fish it after spawn is over. Chad caught his largest ever bass quickly on our first stop and I was 114 behind. He had a six pound twelve ounce beauty and it made his week! I made some pictures with him holding it, but they may be blurred. He was shaking so badly that I held his shoulders, and Gary made a shot or two for good measure. They were a super nice father and son team to fish with and I look for them to come back again.

Rob and P.H. Bradley came down to fish for shell crackers and bluegill, rain or shine. It was mostly rain, but the fish didn't mind because they were already wet!

We used a few tubes of crickets in two days and that's a lot of baiting a hook, but we kept 189 solid fat fish to make a family fish fry. As usual, we culled the small and mediums so the big ones were easy to fillet and everyone was damp but happy. The Bradley brothers are coming back to chase the stripes around when they get going again.

Dr. Richard Blalock and Dr. Todd Bohannon fished with me the

first day of the cold front and it was tough to get a hit.

We mostly threw Carolina rigged lizards and there were lots of bumps, thumps, pecks and nudges, but the takers were few. We caught some small bass and Dr. Blalock

could have had the fish of the day, but it had other plans. He set the hook on a bass, and for just a few seconds, it was a good run starting. He said there was some weight still on the line but it wasn't a fish. When his rig came out of the

water, it was hooked to another hook and lizard with a line and swivel attached. He had hooked this lizard and hook that was still inside the bass' mouth from someone else's rig that had broken off at the swivel! It was a hungry bass, but he was also very lucky! We plan to attack again in a few days.

I went out again with Tony and Andy from Dallas, Texas and had a great time. We were looking for a big smallmouth for Tony, but the cold front kept the big ones subdued most of the day. We think he had a good shot at a couple, but didn't detect the strike soon enough. Three-and-a-half pounds was the best we could reach in the largest, but we sure caught a lot of them after the noon hour.

A Carolina rig was the answer and color didn't matter because we used six different ones at the same location, and all caught bass. We just had to put the KK wiggle to it and they would bite it.

The water temperature is 80 degrees and the elevation is stable at this time. Mayflies have started hatching and lots of fish are feeding on the surface while they are hatching from the water. Just about every species of fish in the lake will eat mayflies, so you know where to look when you see them now!

I fished side by side with Larry Corder and Gary Staggs Thursday morning. We went to a hatch I had found the day before and used small hair jigs to cast into the shallows under the flies and the trees.

I really don't know how many bass, bluegill and shellcrackers we caught and released in a four hour trip, but I kept 50 big bluegill and that was enough for Jeanne and me for several meals. Larry and Gary went back for more later on, so I would guess they did well!

Watch for the action to begin if you can find the mayflies this weekend. Happy fishing!

Latest budget cuts forcing state parks to close nationwide

ATLANTA (AP) — American sportsmen are again under assault by powerful lobbies who want to turn public lands into private resources, Interior Secretary Bruce Babbitt said.

The latest tool they are using is the budget, which could force the closing of 200 parks and 75 wildlife refuges and leave the Interior Department with a tremendous financial problem, the secretary said.

"My sense is there are an awful lot of people who are out there who don't want to solve the problem, they want to see public lands shut down and lands divested," Babbitt said during the first in a series of telephone news conferences with outdoor writers this week.

Babbitt suggested timber and mining companies want to force the department to sell off land to pay its employees. The people don't understand what's happening, Babbitt said.

"When I go to Capitol Hill, I am last in line behind scores of lobbyists who say, 'We won the election and here are the due bills,'" Babbitt said.

Republicans accused Babbitt of using scare tactics. Sen. Slade Gorton, R-Wash., chairman of the Senate Interior Subcommittee,

described it as "Washington Monument Syndrome."

Ever since Woodrow Wilson was president, "whenever a proposal not to appropriate part of the National Park Service's wish list was made, the threat came down that the Washington Monument would be closed," Gorton said.

The proposed House budget would cut his parks operating budget, for example, by 16 percent, the Senate by 10 percent. Both then would freeze those budgets for seven years. That means an actual cut, compared to inflation, of 40 and 30 percent over seven years, Babbitt said.

This follows a cut of 10 percent over the last three years. "We can meet those targets by closing down the six largest national parks or the 200 smallest. I'm not prepared to do either," Babbitt said.

The Fish and Wildlife Service faces a 30 percent cut by 2002, which will mean 75 refuges will be closed or mothballed with no active conservation management.

That will hurt the service's ability to manage both game and endangered species, Babbitt said.

In addition, Congress will not give the Interior Department the right to raise fees to help raise money to offset the cuts.


