Pacer Point development still in works

Members of the Calloway County Fiscal Court sped through the agenda Thursday, spending equal amounts of time in open and closed session.

In the absence of County Judge/Executive J.D. Williams, Magistrate Dan Miller chaired the meeting.

The court heard an update from Bill Hamilton, owner of Harbor Hill Marine, who had asked in August if he could work out a lease agreement so he could improve Pacer Point.

Hamilton's marina is located near the area. While Pacer Point is the area's official name, it is also referred to as White Beach or Anderson Shores.

The 37-acre area was leased to Calloway County in the early 1980s by the Tennessee Valley Authority. The county agreed to maintain and care for the property.

When the interest level dropped, the county changed the

agreement to cut down on the amount of land it was required to be responsible for.

"I have talked with TVA and completed a general questionnaire about the area," Hamilton said. "I was told that prior to anything being done, there has to be a current appraisal done. I am waiting for a formal letter from TVA."

Hamilton said he expected to pay for the appraisal.

According to Vicki Jones, who was filling in for County Attorney David Harrington, TVA is expected to execute a sublease next month.

In other business, the court:

•Appointed Linda Lester to serve on Fire District #2 and Chuck Williams to serve on Water District #3.

•Appointed Clyde Hale and Williams to serve as court representatives to look at a 15-foot alleyway in Dexter that two residents have asked to be closed.

Literacy project helps woman regain skills

With a high school diploma in hand, Sylvia Story began working in a factory.

She stayed there for 15 years until she realized that she wanted to do something different.

Now, at age 40, Story is struggling to learn some long-forgotten skills with the assistance of the Calloway County Adult Literacy Project.

"I didn't use my skills as a production operator," she said. "I felt like I was pushed through school because I didn't feel I knew a lot. If you don't use what you have learned, you lose it."

Story said although she started school when she was 5 years old, she was held back in both first and second grades.

"It was a struggle all the way through school," she said. "I should have gone on and made something of myself, but I went to the factory."

Although Story said she had no problems with the factory work, she said she began thinking about doing something else such as working as a receptionist or as a salesclerk. She quit her factory job in 1990.

"I didn't know how to reach out for help," she said. "I wanted to, but I was scared. If you are going to work, you have to be educated."

Story was told to contact the Adult Literacy Project, which was then located in the Lowry Center at Murray State University.

"I was told I could get a tutor in reading and spelling and even learn how to work on a computer," she said. "When I first started out, I knew what the words were, but I wasn't able to comprehend all of them. I was just calling words out."

Story has been involved off and on with the program for about four years. She had to take time off to help care for her

71-year-old mother who has been ill.

"Once you do this every day, you are going to learn it," she

said. "I didn't learn it like I should have when I graduated."

With the assistance of various tutors, Story has boosted her vocab-

ulary and reading comprehension skills.

"The tutor will give me a book to read and then will ask me questions about it," she said. "Sometimes it is hard for me to concentrate. The tutor also gives me a list of words to study and learn how to spell. A lot of words I know, but I just can't spell them."

Even when her daughter, Angela, was young, Story knew her reading skills were weak.

"When she was in kindergarten and first grade, I read to her," she said. "As she got older, I could still read to her, but there were big words I didn't know. She could tell me things I didn't know. I wanted to help her, but I didn't have enough education."

Story said not being able to help her daughter really hurt. Her feelings were often compounded by the difficulty she had in pronouncing certain words.

"Even now, I have trouble pronouncing my words," she said.

"A lot of times, I just keep my mouth shut because there are some words I have trouble with."

Through the program, Story has improved her reading and spelling skills.

"I've learned that I can do it," she said. "If I could do it every day, I think it would really help. When I was in high school, I typed 42 words per minute. Fifteen years later, I could only type 15 words per minute. But I am improving on it."

Although Story said she is still scared because of her lack of education, she said the program has really helped her.

"I think the program is the best thing that can happen to a person," she said. "It is bad for people to go through life without an education. Where are they going in life?"

Story received an additional boost of self confidence earlier this year after being recognized

Officer now knows who he arrested

PADUCAH, Ky. (AP) — It took five days and a lot of detective work, but Paducah police Officer Scott Aycock now knows the name of the man he arrested last week.

His name, Aycock learned Wednesday, is Gil Mayersdorf, 26, of Jacksonville, Fla. And he is wanted by Dade County, Fla., authorities on charges of grand theft auto and violating probation.

"He gave us so many different names," Aycock said. "Once you thought you had it, you believed him and thought he was really sincere, you'd follow up on it and it would be a dead end. Then you'd have to start all

over."

Aycock stopped a motorcycle Friday night because the driver wasn't wearing a helmet and the bike's license plate was unreadable.

The driver presented an operator's license bearing the name Robert Ramsay, of Miami. But that wasn't his name, and neither were a half-dozen others he gave officers during questioning.

Aycock said he was writing a citation to "Robert Ramsay" when he noticed the height on the operator's license was 6-foot-1. The driver of the motorcycle stood about 5-9, he said.

Another officer came to the scene and agreed the man in the

photograph wasn't the driver of the motorcycle.

Mayersdorf refused to answer any more questions, and was arrested.

"We put him in jail under the name John Doe because he refused to give any information," Aycock said. "The next day, we started working on it."

The man's story changed as often as his name, Aycock said:

"Before we left (the arrest site), he told me he was AWOL from the military."

Aycock managed to get a partial name on the man "in checking local establishments he's been in."

"He kept insisting he was scared he was going to be deported back to Israel; that was the reason for him giving a false name," Aycock said. "He said he had dual citizenship. He is American-born but became a citizen of Israel after denouncing his citizenship in the U.S."

Aycock called the Israeli consulate in Chicago, and "all they would give me was general information."

During an interview, Aycock said he found the man has ties in Illinois. That prompted a statewide search through directory assistance. In Springfield,

Group fighting church's plans to move cemetery

OWENSBORO, Ky. (AP) — It has been 90 years since the last burial in the Macedonia Baptist Church cemetery. Many of the headstones are cracked and crumbling, and some graves aren't marked at all.

But now, descendants of those buried in the historic cemetery are organizing to fight the church's plan for moving it to improve traffic safety and to make way for a possible future expansion.

"They created a cemetery because they felt it would be protected," said Sam McDowell, vice president of the Old Macedonia Cemetery Alliance. "It's ironic to me it's the church that wants to do away with the cemetery."

The cemetery has been next to the church southeast of Owensboro since the early 1850s. At least one Civil War veteran and several early church elders are buried there.

During the past 150 years, Macedonia has grown from a tiny country church to one that attracts 400 to 500 members each week.

Steve Potat, a member of Macedonia Baptist who also is the church's attorney, said church members want to move the cemetery

as the program's "Student of the Year."

"I was proud and excited about the improvement I had made," she said. "I feel better about myself than I did. I always ask myself if I can do it. It's not easy, but you can't give up. If you do, you won't be able to do anything. You always have to give an effort."

Both her daughter and her husband, Bobby Ray, are supportive of her efforts to improve her skills.

"My dad always encouraged me to go to school," she said. "He talked to me many times and said it was hard for him to get through life with only a fourth grade education. He was really a

smart man even with the little education he had.

"My mom graduated from eighth grade and she is able to spell words that I can't," Story said. "I knew there were kids in high school who were smarter and it made me feel backward."

Today, Story feels differently about herself. "I think I would like to give college a try, but I think I need more training first," she said.

Aycock hit on a Dr. Assa Mayersdorf, who is the man's father.

"He said he has not heard from his son in over a year," Aycock said. "He was under the impression his son had set up a successful business in Florida. His dad gave us his real date of birth and Social Security number."

That information produced the warrant for Mayersdorf from Dade County, and a lengthy crim-

inal history from five states, Aycock said.

In July a man was released from jail in Mayfield after serving eight months for refusing to identify himself. James Lee Willis, who was finally identified through fingerprint records, served 249 days in the Graves County jail for contempt of court after being charged Nov. 19 with hitchhiking on the Purchase Parkway.

in order to remove an earthen berm that obstructs the view of drivers leaving the church parking lot.

Based on records, church members believe there are 52 graves in the cemetery, though only 38 headstones remain. Poteat said the church does not plan an immediate expansion on the half-

acre tract. But he said the church can't remedy the safety problem without moving the graves.

The church members plan to move the remains to a special section of a newer cemetery across the road. Poteat stressed that the graves would be moved in a respectful way, and church members plan to conduct a memorial service out of respect for people whose family members are buried there.

"We're extremely sympathetic with their position," Poteat said.

The church argues it has the legal right to move the cemetery, because it has been abandoned. Church members are the only ones who have maintained it in recent years, Poteat said.

The Daviess County Fiscal Court approved the church's request to relocate the graves last month. But state law requires such plans be advertised for at least 60 days before a cemetery can be moved.

Members of the Alliance take exception to the church's contention that the cemetery has been abandoned. And they plan to fight the church's plans.

Bruce Ferguson is a descendant of the Rev. Reuben Cottrell, one of the church founders. Cottrell is among those buried in the cemetery, and Ferguson is the secretary for the alliance.

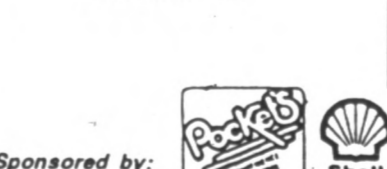

Demand for social workers is growing

FRANKFORT, Ky. (AP) — A legislative report has reiterated a frequent complaint among state social workers — there aren't enough of them to properly deal with the growing number of cases.

The report says the state needs more than 150 additional social workers, and that current social workers spend much of their time doing tasks that could be given to social service aides.

The report, which drew praise from Human Resources Secretary Masten Childers II, was presented to the joint Program Review and Investigations Committee on Thursday.

Many state social workers spend at least some time doing things like transporting clients to appointments, supervising court-ordered visits and helping clients find financial aid, the report said. While reports of child and adult abuse are increasing, the number of social workers in the Department of Social Services has stayed about the same during the past five years.

The report said hiring the 179 social workers and supervisors needed to match the number called for in a 1986 law would cost \$6.3 million.

The report was commissioned by the Program Review and Investigations Committee after four Wayne County social workers were charged with complicity to murder in the abuse death of a 22-month-old boy. They were acquitted in June.

The report discusses numbers of employees, caseloads and how social workers use their time.

Despite attempts by the department to reduce workloads,

"social workers still say they don't have enough time to provide all the services they would like to," said Jere Schneider, the Legislative Research Commission project manager who oversaw the study and subsequent report.

The cabinet acknowledges that a social worker's average caseload is about 31 — six cases more than state law allows and about double what national advocacy groups suggest.

The report claims that caseloads actually are even higher because the department's method of tracking cases is misleading and confusing.

However, Childers dismissed the importance of caseloads, saying "you shouldn't hang your hat on statistics."

He then quoted a sentence in the report: "The caseload numbers may not be as critical as reducing the workload complexity... and shifting less-critical tasks to other support staff, professionals or agencies." That one sentence says it all," Childers said.

In an effort to deal with increasing caseloads, the department has begun hiring social workers — who earn about \$17,000 a year — to replace lower-paid social service aides. Since 1991, the number of social workers has increased by about 3 percent, but the number of aides has dropped by about 20 percent to 151, the report says.

And because other agencies who work under state contracts to provide social services have not kept up with demand, the report says, state social workers must also spend more time counseling families.

Eastwood joins practice as local veterinarian

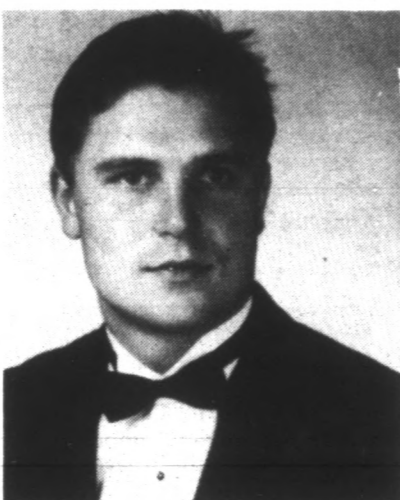

EDITORIAL ROUNDUP

Sept. 9 — *Star Tribune, Minneapolis, on Sen. Packwood:*

To the end, Bob Packwood was full of self-serving hot air. Resigning from the U.S. Senate, he said was "the honorable thing to do for the country, for the Senate." Hogwash; resignation was the only course left to Packwood. Even his most ardent defenders in the Senate had turned on him, sickened by his behavior toward women, toward the Senate, toward the truth. They were going to throw him out on his keister, and he knew it. He resigned to avoid that indignity.

In Packwood's defense, it was said that he has long been a strong champion for women's rights, as though that undeniable fact somehow excuses his private behavior or disproves the charges against him. It does neither.

It was also said that Packwood had rendered the nation great service with his mastery of the tax code. That also is true — and it amplifies Packwood's failings. He had much to offer to Majority Leader Robert Dole, to his Republican caucus, to the Senate and to the country — and he failed them all.

In the end, he couldn't even bring himself to acknowledge the failure. There was no apology, no remorse, no appeal for forgiveness. And despite Packwood's claim to act out of duty and love for the Senate and for the country, there was no honor in his going — just a pitiable last attempt to put a positive spin on pathetic acts.

Sept. 11 — *The Oregonian, Portland, Ore., on the Federal Elections Commission:*

If anyone still has doubts about the ease with which politicians can skirt federal election law, Bob Packwood has silenced them.

Packwood admits in his infamous diaries that he saw an advance copy of a letter the National Rifle Association planned to mail out, supposedly independently, to aid his 1992 re-election campaign. The diaries also revealed that Packwood knew in advance of expenditures an auto dealers group planned to help his campaign.

Such revelations underscore the need for the Federal Elections Commission to get tougher and to change its stance from lapdog to watchdog. With a presidential election campaign already under way, the time has never been better.

President Clinton should begin shoring up the commission by filling two commission posts that have been open for more than four months. Clinton has not yet named replacements for FEC Commissioner Joan Aikens, a Republican, and John Warren McGarry, a Democrat, whose terms expired in April.

The commission has important work ahead. Public dissatisfaction and cynicism with the election process has rarely been higher. Yet Congress has cut the elections commission budget substantially.

The commission's failure to resolve half of its cases last year is unacceptable. Its slowness to complete investigations renders decisions meaningless. For example, the commission only recently completed the investigation it began seven years ago into illegal corporate contributions to the National Senatorial Campaign Committee arranged by a Bob Dole fund-raiser.

It comes from Frank Powell, of Florence, Ala., who frequently writes to assure me that I'm an effete, sniveling liberal, which probably surprises many liberals who frequently write to tell me that I'm a flint-hearted right-wing swine.

Here's what Mr. Powell has to say:

"During the Trial of the Century (no not O.J.; Mark Fuhrman's trial) support for Fuhrman has, shall we say, been rather niggardly. I note that you genuflect to the PC police by studiously avoiding a consoling word in his behalf and sprinkling your remarks with adjectives like 'hate' and 'loathsome'."

"You figure it out. I would challenge you and all the other hypocrites who are so quick to condemn Fuhrman to walk in some young cop's shoes for six months. You might find it hard to suppress the 'N-word' from your thoughts.

"Recently there have been a series of public attacks on law enfor-

Sure being a cop can be difficult work. There's nothing new about that. It isn't a secret. Every applicant

and every recruit knows about the kind of work he is seeking.

But there isn't one high-crime big city - not Chicago, New York, L.A., Detroit or Philadelphia - that doesn't have more applicants for police jobs than it can hire.

Why are so many young men and women eager to put on that badge?

I'm sure some are idealists. But there is also the allure of power. Few jobs provide that kind of instant authority.

There's also the instant status and sense of identity. You tell someone you are a cop and you are immediately believed to be in the know, streetwise, capable, and privy to society's darkest secrets and sins.

You are not a faceless fringe player. You are part of the mainstream that keeps society ticking.

Plus the pay is good, the fringe benefits are better than most, the hours aren't too bad, when you develop a big gut you can wangle an easy desk job, and you don't have to take any crap from mopes.

And it isn't boring. Boredom, it should be remembered, is probably the single biggest cause of job burnout.

So while we can appreciate the good work that good cops do, let's not exaggerate the frustrations of police work.

Cops become cops because they want to. And they remain cops because they like it.

And I didn't notice any gray hairs in Fuhrman's designer haircut.



No love lost on spiders

In the aftermath of recent rains and the cooling of the weather, the local spiders have come out. I daily walk into a fresh cobweb as I grope up the drive in the dark to get the morning paper.

There's little love lost between spiders and me. Four decades ago, in high school, we were terrified by having to read Jonathan Edwards's sermon, "Sinners in the Hands of an Angry God." Edwards compared Man to a spider held over a fire by a wrathful deity. I doubt the piece is included in today's textbooks.

Edwards wasn't off base in his choice of metaphors. A spider isn't a bad symbol for modern man.

On the one hand, the spider, sitting comfortably at the center of an elaborate web spun artistically but cheaply, is a celebration of achievement.

What man has wrought, in our lifetimes alone, not to mention over many centuries, is simply awesome. Man's chief tools are his inventing and improvising, and everywhere from submarines to space ships his work proclaim his accomplishments.

Right now, Man is celebrating networks he has made, his "web" of computer internets, interstate highways, phone systems, electric systems, microwave systems, radio and television systems, and sewer systems. The world is criss-crossed with the wires, pipes, roads, canals, dams, and waves of Man's inven-

tions.

It is impressive.

Spider-Man, satisfied and a bit boastful, eyes alert to passing morsels of opportunity, sits in the center of the things he has made. Theologians, sociologists, and literary critics call this image of man "anthropocentrism."

On the other hand, there's another side to the image.

Spiders are ugly. Spiders aren't very loveable, not even to other spiders. Spiders are deceitful and

dangerous. They thrive by entrapment and consumption of their fellow creatures. They are self-serving. Spider webs are awfully flimsy.

All of which can also describe Man-and his works.

The spider, content to sit in the center of his self-made world, believes himself the center of the universe. So, too, Man-Galileo's discoveries notwithstanding.

The web the spider weaves is so beautiful it bewitches him as much

as it does his prey. So, too, with Man. We hypnotize ourselves with our manmade things, not thinking how fragile they are. We provide ourselves on making what, in an instant, can be blown away. Our manmade world is a puny thing, and Man himself is a puny inventor.

Jonathan Edwards was making two points with his metaphor. One is that an invisible force, far large and more impressive than us, creates, sustains, judges, and redeems us, more than we are willing to admit. Without our link to that spiritual power, we can't exist at all. We may pretend it's not there, but it's essential to our being.

But Edwards was also saying that the power that holds us over the fire does not dangle us like puppets. The very nature of God is that we are given, in addition to the grace of living, freedom of choice about how to live. The power that holds us over the fire merely holds us. In the end, it is we who decide whether we live or die.

The purpose of evil in our world and in ourselves is so that we can overcome it by choosing to do good. That's a hard assignment. Sometimes the beauty of the webs we weave fools us into thinking we have achieved it.

Maybe we're fortunate that unfortunate things befall us frequently. Else we would mistake our webs for ultimate reality-and ourselves for God.

Mitchell: 'We did a great job of throwing the ball'

LONE OAK — When the running game was stopped early on, Calloway County was reduced to simply taking what Lone Oak would give them.

Luckily, the Purple Flash gave the Lakers exactly what they wanted — open passing lanes and plenty of time to throw.

After Calloway's early-game attempt to establish a running game was stifled by Lone Oak's defense, Laker quarterback Sam Arnett seized the opportunity to take to the air. He rolled up 238 passing yards, completing nine consecutive throws during one stretch, to led Calloway to a 41-14 district romp at Flash Field Friday night, putting a damper on Lone Oak's homecoming festivities.

Arnett wound up completing 13 of 18 attempts for four touchdowns, all to different receivers, as Calloway successfully bounced back from last week's loss to Hopkinsville and moved to 3-1 overall, 1-1 in district play. "We tried to establish the run, but Lone Oak is a good team, and they were sound defensively," Calloway coach Billy Mitchell

said. "The run wasn't happening early, but Sam was on track, and in the second half he did a great job of throwing the ball."

Calloway continues its string of three straight district games next Friday, visiting Union County. The Braves are 0-4 overall and 0-1 in district play after taking a 48-0 pounding at the hands of Hopkinsville Friday.

Lone Oak, obviously aware of the Lakers' tendency to go deep, put two free safeties on the field at once to prevent the bomb. The alignment allowed Arnett to find a new, valuable weapon.

Arnett completed three passes to junior tight end David Cavitt for 96 yards, including a 60-yard touchdown pass, by far Cavitt's best receiving night of the season. Cavitt, however, left the game after being hit hard on a fourth quarter reception, and was taken to a Paducah hospital for observation.

"We took what Lone Oak would give us, and the middle of the field was open," Arnett said. "We've got to get the ball to David more because catching the ball like he did tonight will give me confidence and will give me more confidence in him."

Considering his Tigers had nine penalties, four fumbles and two touchdowns called back, Rick Fisher was happy to walk off the field Friday night with a win.

Dodgers, Karros end St. Louis streak 7-6

ST. LOUIS (AP) — Tom Henke's amazing run couldn't last forever, and neither could the St. Louis Cardinals'.

Eric Karros hit his third run-scoring single with two outs in the ninth inning as the Los Angeles Dodgers ended St. Louis' six-game winning streak with a 7-6 victory Friday night. They also handed Henke, who leads the National League with 33 saves, his first decision in 48 appearances.

No player has ever gone more than 42 games and finished the season with no decisions.

"If somebody had told me I'd get my first loss in the middle of September, I'd be pretty happy with that," Henke said. "I'd liked to have kept that all year."

"If I do my job, I'm not going to get a lot of decisions."

The Dodgers survived blowing a three-run lead in the eighth to win for the eighth time in 11 games. They remained one game behind Colorado, which beat Florida 6-3, in the NL West and

stayed in front in the wild-card race.

"It was a scary game," Dodgers manager Tommy Lasorda said. "It was a nerve-wracking game."

Chad Fonville singled with one out in the ninth, stole second with two outs and scored on Karros' single up the middle on a 3-2 pitch. Karros has 15 RBIs in his last 14 games.

David Bell had a two-run double off Antonio Osuna and pinch-hitter Mark Sweeney, who's 5-for-10 in that role, singled Bell

home as the Cardinals tied it 6-6 in the eighth.

Piazza added two RBIs for the Dodgers, including his 29th homer with two outs in the seventh.

St. Louis' Ray Lankford homered for the fifth time in six games and extended his hitting streak to 15 games. Lankford hit his 23rd homer in the sixth. He also singled, doubled and walked and is 27-for-50 (.540) during the streak, which matches the longest of his career.

Cardinals shortstop Ozzie

Smith set the major-league record for double plays by a shortstop, turning No. 1,554 in the sixth inning. Candiotti bunted to the mound with a runner on first and Smith's relay was barely in time.

Smith tied Luis Aparicio's mark on Monday. He left Tuesday's game after six innings due to shoulder stiffness without turning a double play, sat out Wednesday's game and St. Louis had the day off Thursday. Smith had arthroscopic surgery on the shoulder in May.

CLEVELAND (AP) — This was not Boston vs. Cleveland. This was Mo Vaughn vs. Albert Belle.

Belle homered twice for the Indians on Friday night, but it was Vaughn's three-run shot in the eighth inning that made the

difference as the Red Sox won 6-3.

The Boston victory, coupled with New York's loss at Baltimore, reduced the Red Sox's magic number for clinching the AL East to four.

Vaughn's home run during a five-run eighth inning temporarily tied him with Belle for the

league lead. But Belle pushed ahead again in the ninth inning with his second home run of the game and his 39th of the year.

"That's good for both of us, because it keeps us both swinging," Vaughn said. "The thing is, I'm glad we won the ballgame because now our magic number is down to four. We're close, but

we're not there yet."

Belle's 39 homers are the most by a Cleveland hitter since Rocky Colavito had 42 in 1959.

The sellout crowd of 41,833 pushed the Indians' season attendance to a franchise-record 2,634,139, surpassing the mark of 2,620,627 set in 1948. Jacobs Field has been sold out 52 times

this season, including the last 47 in a row.

Erik Hanson (14-5) gave up five hits in eight innings as the Red Sox won for only the second time in their last eight games.

Hanson allowed one run, struck out five and walked one

Arnett completed a four-play drive with a one-yard touchdown plunge. With 4:30 remaining in the first quarter, Russell Lencki's point-after kick made it 7-0.

Lone Oak tied the game with a 15-play, 86-yard drive that ate up the first eight minutes of the second quarter. Sanderson matched Arnett's earlier one-yard drive for the score, and Kyle East's kick made it 7-7.

"We worked all week on what responsibilities we had against Lone Oak's offense," McKeel said. "We were well-prepared for the option. Our defense is playing pretty good right now and we're really starting to come together."

Calloway made it 41-7 early in the fourth on an 18-yard sprint to the end zone by Justin Morton. Lone Oak completed the scoring on a 38-yard rumble by Jason Moore.

Calloway outgained Lone Oak 371-160, with all of the Purple Flash's yardage coming on the ground, led by Moore with 96

Unfortunately, Murray showed up in the second half.

"Actually, (Fisher) was pretty calm," Tiger senior Joey Mehr said of Fisher's halftime chat. "He just told us what would happen if we didn't get up and start playing like we should."

Big stripes caught in Tennessee

I went stripe fishing one morning with Hoyt, Don and Hadd in the Tennessee section of Land Between the Lakes. We were looking for stripers and were able to find some willing to take a roostertail.

They were slow to feed on a northeast wind, but the ones we caught were big.

Some were 4 inches thick and solid power on light tackle.

Hadd used a light spinning outfit and a few of his fish were almost too much for him to handle. Hoyt always gets his share but sometimes slows down too quick. Don was snakebitten, nothing worked for him for the longest time and he was in a quandary about what to do. Finally he caught some fish, but I think a man could have bought his rod & reel at a good price that day!

I bass fished with Marvin Ahr and his son Gregg on Friday and we had a pretty good day. These guys wanted to learn some areas to fish

and a few techniques, so we went out and did it.

The weather was great and the bass seemed to be active all day for us.

We fished a lot of topwater torpedos, Marvin's favorite and he put several bass in the boat.

Gregg and I fished the fluke and by the way this is an awesome lure, plus a black and blue product worm.

We didn't want to keep any bass

and that made for a good trip, so if a fish shook free it was O.K. by us.

I think we might be able to get another trip in October when the big ones are up!

Happy fishing.

Conditions continue to improve as the water and air temperatures both drop to a level where living creatures are actually comfortable.

We still need some more rain to set the stage for a great fall fishing bonanza.

The largemouth and smallmouth are reacting to the length of the days now and they are feeding to build fat which will enable them to survive the coming cold winter.

The moon phase still has an affect on their timetable and the length of each feeding period, but as the days become shorter, the fish feed longer if conditions are good.

The prime source of food at this time is the skipjack and threadfin minnows which are in abundance. They jump out of the water and catch the small gnats hovering over the surface. This jumping and splashing sound serves as a dinner bell to many species of gamefish and they come from great distances to take a meal.

Later on, larger bass will take the big gizzard shad which moves slower and spends a lot of time in shallow water.

Crawfish, eels, lizards, water dogs, frogs, mice, voles and birds

will make up the diet of a wintertime bass. These food sources are considered desserts because small fish and minnows of all species are a regular food for a bass.

This is one of the reasons you can catch bass on so many different types of lures.

They will take just about anything if its presented properly and imitates something alive.

Fall is a season for topwater fishing for many anglers the world over. I think most folks get such a rush at seeing the fish strike, it becomes their favorite. Actually its a real heavy shot to get a strike on any other type of lure too!

We should have a couple of months yet to search for a trophy or a photo of one.

I think the water level will be held lower than we are used to seeing, so take care where you run. No doubt some folks will run aground in places they thought were deep!

TIPS

These finishers are not difficult to remove - however always use caution when using any type of caustic material - glove (rubber), protective glasses, and plenty of ventilation.

To remove shellac - you'll need #000 steel wool and denatured alcohol on the item and using a circular motion cut the old shellac off - be patient as it takes time for the old finish to soften.

To remove laquer use the same procedure but using lacquer chemical instead of alcohol.

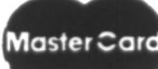

DR. GOTT

DEAR DR. GOTT: My father died recently of arteriosclerotic heart disease. He had a terrible stomach ache before he collapsed and had a history of aneurysm 10 years prior. Could this whole situation have been prevented?

DEAR READER: One of the ways of answering questions such as yours is to obtain an autopsy, which usually shows the cause of death. This information may be important to the living relatives, especially if the deceased had an illness related to genetic makeup (such as a heart attack) or an infection (that could have been spread to survivors).

In my opinion, your father probably died of a heart attack or ruptured aneurysm.

It's impossible to judge whether his death could have been prevented. Certainly, many conditions — including the two I mentioned — can be successfully treated if diagnosed early, before irreparable harm has occurred. However, this is not always possible.

I suggest that you ask your father's doctor whether an autopsy was performed and, if so, what were the

results. If no post-mortem exam were conducted, you're left with an unfortunate and uncomfortable uncertainty about what actually happened at the end of your father's life.

DEAR DR. GOTT: Is there any real treatment for tendinitis of the elbow or better a person simply rest until it gets better on its own?

DEAR READER: Inflammation of any tendon can be a painful physical phenomenon. In many instances, heat, gentle physical therapy, ultrasound treatments, and anti-inflammatory drugs (such as Motrin and Indocin) will aid healing and reduce pain.

Sometimes, in resistant cases, cortisone injections may be necessary. If calcium deposits aggravate tendinitis (and are seen on X rays) they may have to be surgically removed. Most important, people must avoid the

activity that causes the tendon inflammation in the first place.

Although most cases of tendinitis clear up with therapy prescribed by a family practitioner, some patients may require the services of orthopedic specialists for injections or surgery.

DEAR DR. GOTT: Please discuss a bone density test and who should have it. Is it recommended for someone who is depending on calcium supplements?

DEAR READER: The bone density test is a method of measuring the concentration of calcium in bones. It is particularly useful in patients being treated for osteoporosis, because consecutive bone density measurements enable physicians to assess the success of therapy.

This test is generally only available at large hospitals.

It is not appropriate for all patients with the age-related loss of bone calcium that we call osteoporosis. Rather, the test is used to monitor the progress of people who are being treated for this condition, especially if "crush" fractures are present.

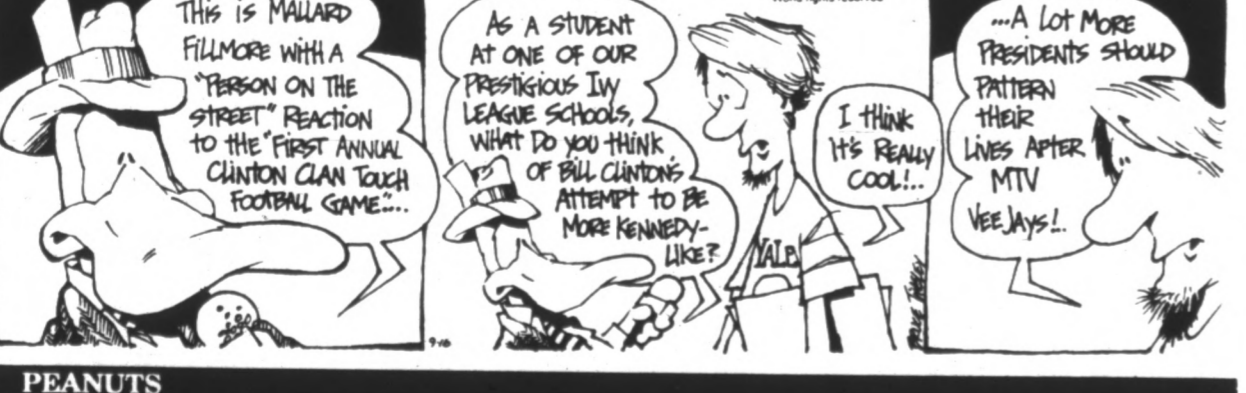

Now that a trump trick must be lost, South is in danger of going down in a contract that a moment earlier appeared certain. The outcome at this point seems to depend on whether East or West has the ace of hearts.

But it would be wrong for declarer to stake the outcome solely on the location of the heart ace. To lead a heart to the king would be relying too much on the element of luck, and, in the actual deal, would prove fatal.

Instead, declarer at this point cashes the king of spades and A-K of diamonds, then ruffs a diamond. Next a club to the ace is followed by leading dummy's last diamond. East follows with his queen, but instead of ruffing, South discards a heart!

This simple but elegant move ends play East. He is forced to return a heart to dummy's king or concede a ruff and discard. Either way, South loses only three tricks.

By adopting this line of play, declarer gives himself an extra chance for the contract. He does not know which opponent has four diamonds, or who has the ace of hearts, but it costs him nothing at all to try for the endplay before touching the heart suit.
