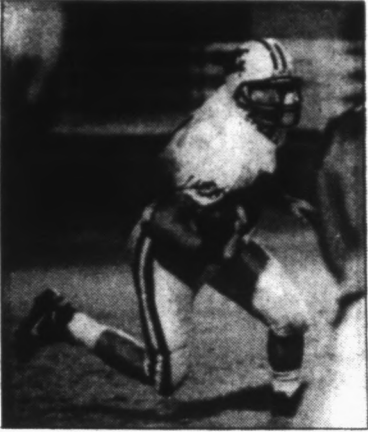

Mother found innocent in children's death

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. (AP) — A woman who claimed a masked burglar broke into her townhouse, tied her to her bed and smothered her two young daughters after they started crying was found innocent in the slayings.

A jury late Friday rejected charges that Susan Stark, 24, murdered her children two days after her divorce from their father became final so she could be with her new boyfriend.

Four-year-old Christina Marie Stark and her 18-month-old sister, Ashley Brooke, were found dead in their beds in July 1994.

The panel of eight women and four men took three hours to reach a verdict. If convicted, Mrs. Stark could have faced the death penalty.

African leaders defend decision

LAGOS, Nigeria (AP) — Rejecting criticism by the West and fellow African leaders, Nigeria's military rulers said they were right to execute playwright Ken Saro-Wiwa and eight other anti-government activists.

The Clinton administration imposed travel restrictions after the executions Friday, and leaders of the Commonwealth, comprising Britain and its former colonies, today suspended Nigeria from their group, effective immediately.

Miller Annex bursting at seams

Plans to shuffle around various administrative departments in order to create more space at the Miller Courthouse Annex have been put on hold for the moment.

Calloway Circuit Clerk Ann Wilson said state officials from the Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC) and the owner of a vacant building could not come to an agreement on the amount of renovation needed on the building before the move was made.

Plans were in the works to move the driver's license testing bureau into a building located on Fourth Street across from the courthouse annex in order to create space for the office workers.

Wilson said the current number of filing cabinets in the clerks office, used to house the numerous cases filed in Calloway County each year is becoming a nuisance.

"We were told when we moved into this building that it would provide for our needs for the next 10 years. We've passed that mark by a few years now."

"I told myself that my last resort would be to put filing cabinets in the hall (of the basement floor) of the annex. We've reached that point," she said. "We just have too many filing cabinets."

Currently, every court case

from the recent past and present filed in the county is kept in filing cabinets. Most of these cabinets are in Wilson's office.

Wilson said one case, especially if it's a big one, can fill half a cabinet drawer by itself.

"For example, the case file of the Concerned Citizens versus the fiscal court takes up almost a whole drawer."

"If you take the number of cases filed each year with the number of filing cabinets we already have, it won't take long to realize that we've been slowly running out of room for years," Wilson said.

When she recently she tried to make room in a cabinet drawer, it took her a week to clear one of back case logs.

"I have been told to look for other possible sites that could accommodate us, but there are no other buildings close by to move into," Wilson said.

Calloway County has submitted proposed blueprints to the AOC for a new 18,000-square-foot judicial facility.

The facility plans call for it to be located in front of the new jail currently under construction.

The facility will house new district and circuit court rooms along with larger administrative offices.

"The current facilities are woefully inadequate," Circuit Judge

David Buckingham said. "We passed the first hurdle in the process by getting approved by the AOC"

Buckingham said the AOC has a construction fund set up for counties like Calloway that need new facilities.

Counties submit proposals to the AOC which approves the ones it feels are needed.

The proposals received by the AOC, if approved, then go in its budget for the upcoming year. The AOC then submits their budget to the state legislature for approval.

"We call it a pooled project group," said AOC Facilities Manager Harry Hoffman. "We group several projects together in one proposal. If it's passed (by the state legislature), the money is allocated for the counties."

Buckingham said Calloway County is included in the AOC's 1996 budget.

"We're just waiting to see if that money comes through from the legislature," he said.

Of the more than 20 requests the AOC received, it approved only eight in its budget.

Buckingham said of that eight, Calloway County is in the lower half.

"The AOC prioritizes these projects once the legislature

United Way nears 60 % of campaign goal

The United Way campaign goal of \$280,000 seemed very aggressive back in January when Bill McCarthy accepted the chairmanship of the campaign. The 20 percent increase over last year's campaign still seems aggressive but much more achievable.

"We are nearly at 60 percent of our goal at this point," McCarthy said. "Even though the campaign is taking a bit longer than I expected, I still feel like we will exceed our

goal."

"We asked Briggs & Stratton and Wal-Mart to be pacesetters this year. When they accepted the invitation, that meant their goals would be at least a 20 percent increase over their campaigns last year," McCarthy said. "Not only did both organizations exceed their goals, but they really did set a challenging pace for the rest of us to follow."

The employee campaign at Briggs & Stratton had a 38 percent

increase, and Wal-Mart had a 27 percent increase. The campaigns are still increasing at both places.

Not to be outdone, the employees of Kenlake Foods accepted the challenge issued by McCarthy, general manager of Kenlake Foods.

"Our campaign committee set a goal of \$21,000 this year. Bill told us that he would kiss a pig if we reached \$25,000," Joe Donato, em-

Patton not ready to name staff

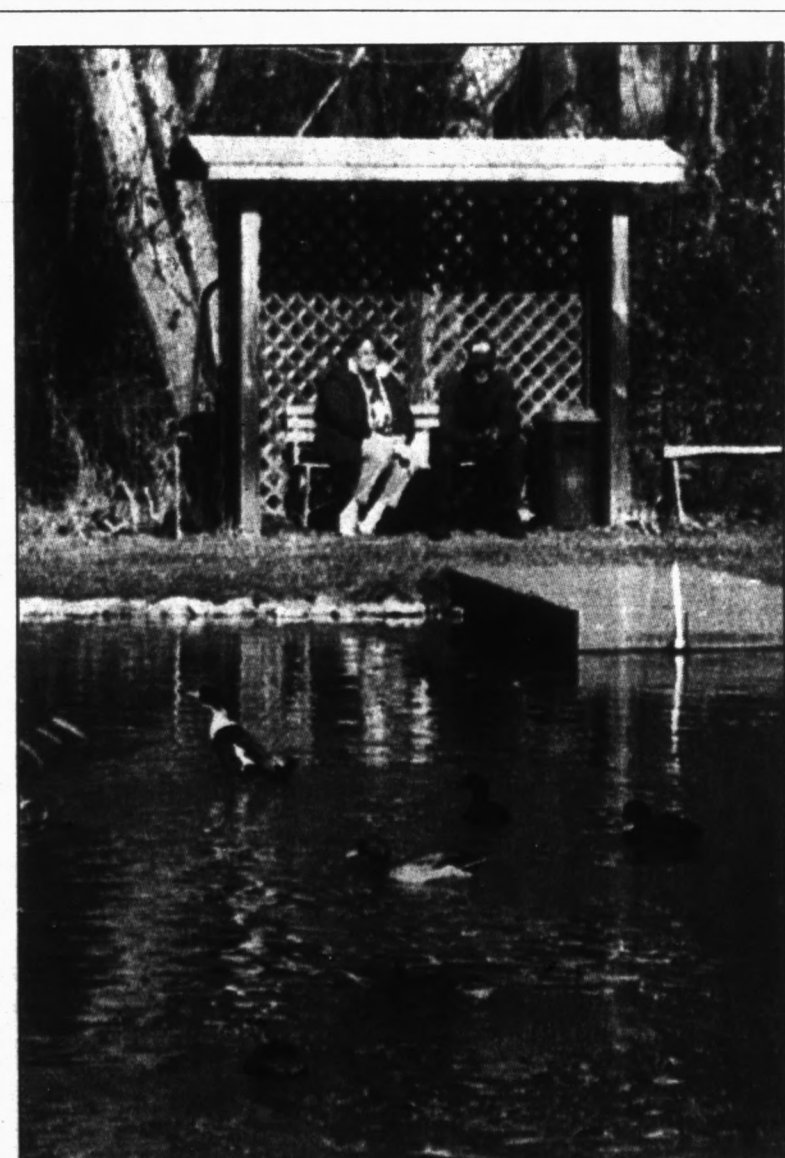
FRANKFORT, Ky. (AP) — It's unlikely that Gov.-elect Paul Patton will be in a position to announce the key appointments to the Governor's Office staff until next week, a spokesman said.

"That announcement is more likely to be made next week," said Andrew "Skipper" Martin, the chairman of Patton's campaign. Martin said he will probably assume the job of chief-of-staff in the Governor's Office.

Patton closeted himself in the Lieutenant Governor's Mansion on Thursday, making phone calls to supporters and others seeking advice on the key appointments to fill out his administration.

Martin said the key appointment Patton will make soon is that of cabinet secretary, a job that entails serving as the governor's top policy adviser and liaison with various cabinet secretaries.

"Paul wants to get that set. That person will be sort of a CEO. And Paul wants that person to be in place and with him when he talks to candidates for the various cabinet secretary jobs," Martin said.

Lovett home survives arson fire in Owensboro

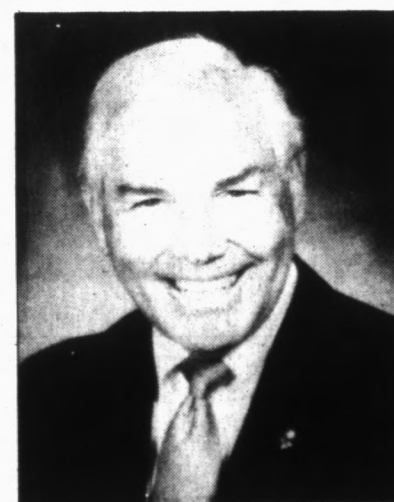
Murray State University Regent Wells Lovett, of Owensboro, was awakened Thursday morning by a telephone call from his next door neighbor.

The call, which came at 3:30 a.m., alerted Lovett and his wife, Mary, to a house fire next door to them. The Lovetts soon discovered that not only was a fire raging through Faith and Dan Miller Jr.'s house, but one had been set in front of their own garage door as well.

Within the next few hours, the Millers' \$300,000 home would be in ruins and three other houses in the Stone Creek Park subdivision would be damaged by individual fires.

Lovett confirmed in a telephone interview Friday that the Kentucky State Police have ruled the fires arson. All four fires apparently were started with piles of charcoal placed next to the garage doors of all four houses. There was a total of 12 people in the four houses when the fires began, but no one was injured.

"I say if no one was hurt, then forget it," Lovett said.

"We're just thrilled to death that none of us was hurt," Lovett's neighbor Don Gipe said. "This is 12 counts of attempted murder in my eyes."

Miller, an insurance agent, and his family were awakened to the fire by the barking of their cocker spaniel, Chi Chi. All escaped the house without injury, but firefighters were able to salvage only

ployee campaign chair for Kenlake Foods, said.

"He then said we could pick exactly where he would kiss the pig if we reached \$28,000. Bill had to kiss the pig's rear end when we ended up with over \$29,000." Two years ago, Kenlake Foods' campaign was \$3,400, and last year it increased to over \$17,000. This year's campaign represented a 65 percent increase for Kenlake.

Keeping up the pace set by Briggs & Stratton and Wal-Mart, Southeastern Book had an 83 percent

increase in its campaign while the employees of West View Nursing Home had a 73 percent increase in their campaign. The faculty and staff at Murray State University have shown in excess of a 42 percent increase at this point. Peoples Bank had a significant 16 percent increase and 100 percent participation.

McCarthy attributes a lot of the early success of this campaign to many factors.

"Murray Cablevision produced a local video that shows what is being done in this community by many of the agencies supported by United

Way. There has been a lot of positive response to the video," McCarthy said. "People realize it's their friends, family and co-workers who are being helped by United Way."

Other factors contributing to the success include a presentation McCarthy put together that compares the local United Way support with two benchmark communities, Danville, KY and Cape Girardeau.

"We chose those two communities as benchmarks because their population and effective buying incomes are the same as ours," McCarthy said. "A few of us even visited Danville earlier this year to learn why their United Way is so successful. The main differences were that per capita giving (total campaign divided by population) in Danville was more than \$20; Cape Girardeau's was more than \$15, and Calloway County's giving was \$7 per person. Their organizations have also been around for about 50 years as opposed to this one which is about 10 years old."

Danville's United Way raised over \$532,000 last year compared to Murray's \$237,000.

"Robert Billington's leadership during last year's campaign led Murray to a 17 percent over the previous year's totals. The average campaign increase across the nation last year was 1.8 percent," McCarthy said.

"There is a lot of community pride in Murray-Calloway County, and this is the first time we've ever compared our United Way to United Ways in communities our size. We have been able to show people facts and figures about how we could easily be raising over half a million dollars. As a matter of fact, if everyone working in Calloway County would give just one hour's salary a month, we could be raising over \$2 million."

A new approach is being taken with the local business campaign this year also. Instead of doing a mass mailing, volunteers and agency representatives conducted a business blitz. This approach saved on mailing costs and also gave volunteers a chance to say thank you

for past support while trying to educate people about how United Way works in Calloway County. "Loaned executives" from Briggs & Stratton and Kenlake Foods are actively participating in this campaign also. These two companies have "loaned" several of their employees to work in the United Way campaign.

While major employee campaigns are winding down, a couple of the local businesses have expressed an interest in conducting employee campaigns.

"We will be more than happy to do employee presentations for anyone who is interested," McCarthy said. "No employee group is too small for us to come visit."

The professional division campaign and retiree division will be taking place over the next couple of weeks.

"With all the retirees that have moved here over the past few years, we feel they are an audience we still haven't been able to tap into effectively," McCarthy said. "Many of them worked with companies that were strong supporters of United Way so they are very aware of how important United Way is to a community. We learned through a survey conducted by Melanie Ellingsworth, a Murray State grad student, that the number one reason people don't contribute to United Way is because they aren't asked. Please consider this your personal invitation to contribute to the United Way campaign."

approves their budget," Buckingham said. "Cities with greater needs get first priority."

Hoffman said once the AOC and its budget are approved, an individual project must go through several more stages after that.

"A proposed plan usually has small changes made to it in order to conform to its proposed budget and needs," Hoffman said.

Calloway County will initially have to pay for the facility, but will be reimbursed from the AOC fund by way of monthly payments.

"It's kind of difficult to explain, but the counties have to pay to build the facility and the AOC pays rent to that county which supplements its cost. It works out that the state pays for the building in the end," Buckingham said.


Hoffman said Calloway County will be notified after April 15 if it will receive the funds for the new judicial complex.

In the meantime, Wilson said she hopes to find a temporary facility.

Calloway school board reviews audit

In little less than an hour, the Calloway County School Board sped through its agenda Thursday.

Topping the business at hand was the 1994-95 audit report completed by Richardson, Howe & Melton.

"This is a very clean report that represents good steady financial growth," said Red Howe.

"This is being handled within the guidelines of the state," Howe pointed out that since 1992, there has been a 25 percent increase in the general fund. In addition, instructional costs represent 76 percent of the budget this year compared to 73.5 percent in 1992.

"One of the reasons we have some of the funds that we do is that we have been fortunate enough to have a significant portion of the capital outlay funded

by the state," said Calloway County Superintendent Dr. Jack Rose. "Another thing is the credit goes to Dr. Nancy Lovett and her people for getting the federal money through grants.

"We have a strict adherence to good bookkeeping," Rose said. "We don't want any sloppy work. When you look at the percentage of money going to instruction, that's because the money has

been freed up."

In other business, the board: *Agreed to consider ideas about an addition to Calloway County Middle School.


"Based on enrollment, it looks like we need it," said Chairman Tim Stone.

The board is expected to discuss it further at its next meeting.

*Agreed to consider hiring a technical specialist at the next meeting.

*Approved a contract for random drug/alcohol screening for bus drivers.

a handful of clothes.

Both the Gipe and Miller families also had fires set in their vans that were sitting outside their houses, said Trooper Larry Abel of the Kentucky State Police. "It's an insane sickness," Gipe said. "What kind of creep would take life that cheap?"

The fire chief said the end of the Miller house with the attached garage was fully engulfed when he arrived, and within minutes a huge explosion inside the home — possibly from one of the cars — blew the bricks off the side of the house.

The force of the blast knocked firefighter Scott Westerfield 15 feet back, but he was not hurt.

Firefighters confiscated a handwritten note found stuck on a Halloween sign in the neighborhood that read, "Thanks a Heap. Spontaneously Yours, The Vandals." The sign was stolen around Halloween and reappeared in a neighboring yard Tuesday morning, but Abel said police don't know if it's related to the fires.

Don Parker, arson investigator for the state police in the Henderson post area, began sifting through the rubble Thursday afternoon. Abel said evidence was found at each house that will be tested to determine what started the fires, but he would not confirm it was charcoal. He said the evidence shows all four fires were set independently.

Police are working under the assumption the arsonists set a fire at one house, then moved to the next, but Abel wonders if it's truly random.

Election outcomes cheer Democrats, trouble Republicans

WASHINGTON (AP) — Democrats claimed victory in Tuesday's off-year elections and Republicans, less believably, congratulated themselves, as well. In fact, the outcome was a draw that caused unease among some GOP lawmakers struggling to complete their revolution in Congress.

"The results weren't what we'd like to have seen but it won't stop the revolution," House Republican Whip Tom Delay of Texas told reporters after the GOP held the Mississippi statehouse but failed to wrest the Kentucky governorship or Virginia legislature from Democrats.

In private, some GOP lawmakers are more troubled, with the party not yet able to claim it has delivered on its promise of a balanced budget, yet battered by Democratic charges it is cutting Medicare and Medicaid to finance tax cuts for the rich.

"I wouldn't want to run right now," said one conservative southern lawmaker with a safe Republican seat.

Three GOP moderates, also speaking on condition of anonymity, said House Speaker Newt Gingrich, R-Ga., is a political drag in their congressional districts, even though they said the public strongly supports the GOP drive to balance the budget.

House Democrats, who have been waiting a year for any shred of positive political news, seized on their ability to repel Republican attacks on Kentucky and Virginia, and on Maine, where they regained control of the state house of representatives.

"What happened last night," said Rep. Martin Frost of Texas, chairman of the Democratic Congressional Campaign Committee. "And make no mistake, Newt Gingrich will be on the ballot in every congressional district in the country next year."

Frost convened his news conference with the words of Kentucky's Gov.-elect Paul Patton as a backdrop: "Kentucky said no to Newt Gingrich and Bob Dole. Kentucky said no to cuts in Medicare. Kentucky said no to the Contract of America."

Democrats are test-marketing a similar concept in California, where Jerry Estruth is attempting to keep the seat of former Rep. Norm Minetta in Democratic hands in a special election set for Dec. 12.

One television commercial says Estruth will "stop Newt Gingrich's cuts in Medicare for our seniors and education for our children."

The Republican candidate, former Rep. Tom Campbell, favors abortion rights and parts company with Gingrich on other social issues. And he's keeping his distance from the controversial speaker. No Gingrich appearance is planned before the Dec. 12 election. "He hasn't asked and we haven't asked," says Kevin Spillane, Campbell's spokesman.

Frost dismissed as "garbage" Republicans' claims they will gain more seats next fall, and predicted Democrats will take back control of the House. The GOP now commands a 233-199 majority, with one independent and two vacancies.

They'll gain at least one more, and soon. Mississippi Democratic Rep. Mike Parker's long-anticipated switch to the GOP is expected Friday. He would be the fourth House member to change parties since last fall's election and others are possible.

Republicans are counting on victory in Louisiana's gubernatorial election later this month, as well, and could barely contain their happiness that Colin Powell combined his decision not to run for president with a declaration that he is a Republican.

Of more immediate concern for congressional Democrats, laboring in the minority after holding power for so long, is the growing number of departures.

Rep. Cardiss Collins of Illinois on Wednesday became the 12th House Democrat to announce retirement — compared with a total of 10 in 1993 — and more are expected.

Some of the Democrat seats should be relatively easy for the party to retain, including those held by Collins and Rhode Island Rep. Jack Reed, who is running for the Senate. One, being vacated by Rep. Sonny Montgomery of Mississippi, will be next to impossible to keep.

Others offer Republicans clear opportunities, including Rep. Pete Peterson's seat in Florida; Rep. Jim Chapman's seat, one of three in vacancies in Texas; and Rep. Tony Beilenson's in California. He is retiring after winning a 10th term last year by fewer than 4,000 votes.

Democratic leader Dick Gephardt of Missouri has made a strong effort this year to hold down the number of retirements. "You know people get older," he said recently. "It's just reality."

All things being equal, Democrats would prefer to have incumbents in as many races as possible, since they are proven vote-getters with an ability to raise sufficient campaign funds.

Clinton can breathe easier

WASHINGTON (AP) — The presidential race just got a little simpler and — perhaps — a lot less interesting. With Colin Powell's retreat, Sen. Bob Dole can reclaim his Republican front-runner label from cold storage. President Clinton can breathe a little easier, too.

The retired general's unequivocal announcement Wednesday that he will not seek the presidency in 1996 ends the autumn freeze that had descended on the GOP field.

And, unless House Speaker Newt Gingrich seeks a new opportunity for himself, Dole clearly gains the most with Powell out of the picture.

"Time is the friend of the front-runner and the enemy of the challenger," said Rich Bond, a Dole strategist. "And two more months have just run off the clock."

Dole's team confidently expected many fence-sitting Republicans who'd been holding out for Powell to now come their way. The other candidates were hopeful too.

"Everybody who is running is happy in the short run," said Steven Wayne, a political scientist at Georgetown University. "Dole gets the nomination, the Republicans presumably unify, Clinton

does well one-on-one with Dole. All breathe a collective — and very private — sigh of relief."

But the race becomes far less fascinating.

"You're back to the Clinton-Dole yawner," said New York pollster Lee Miringoff, director of Marist College's Institute for Public Opinion.

None of the contenders has been able to generate the kind of enthusiasm the popular retired general did as he crisscrossed the country in his 25-city book tour.

For his part, Dole voiced "great respect and admiration for Colin Powell" and said he hoped the general would help his campaign in some way.

With no Powell factor, Dole continues to run strong among Republicans in polls, comfortably outdistancing his nearest competitor, Sen. Phil Gramm. While the limelight shone on Powell Wednesday, Dole picked up the important endorsement of New

Hampshire Gov. Steve Merrill. Even rivals conceded Powell's withdrawal helps Dole the most.

"Sure. From the standpoint of had Powell run, Dole would have been totally eclipsed in about 30 days," suggested Charlie Black, a Gramm strategist.

White House officials publicly contained their enthusiasm. "We were prepared to take our case to the country no matter what Colin Powell decided to do," said deputy chief of staff Harold Ickes.

But they privately rejoiced. Polls showed Powell would be a far more formidable opponent than Dole or any of the other GOP candidates.

"We've dodged the big bullet," said one Clinton aide.

Powell's withdrawal could present an opportunity for Gingrich, who has said he probably wouldn't run for president but hasn't ruled it out.

But Gingrich has always been

plagued with high negatives. "He's too smart to run. He knows his numbers. But he also wants to be president. You can never read these guys," said Stuart Rothenberg, a political newsletter publisher.

Among the other candidates, both former Tennessee Gov. Lamar Alexander and Gramm predicted Powell's withdrawal would help them.

"I think that now that we don't have the spectre of a genuine American hero in Colin Powell basically looming over the race, now that the field is set," Gramm said.

And Alexander, who might get some of Powell's moderate GOP support, said, "the field is now clear and the race is now between a respected Washington insider Bob Dole, and an outsider, me."

But California Rep. Bob Dornan suggested he had trouble seeing the development as anything but a big plus for Dole. "It's Dole's to lose," he said. "I've said that from Day One, and it's crushed my fundraising. But anything can happen. I'm staying in the race."

What's needed in this brave new world we have created is hot patches.

For the young who have never seen them, let me describe them.

Automobile tires and bicycle tires used to have separate inner linings called inner tubes. So did the lace-up leather footballs and basketballs of those days.

Inner tubes would develop holes, which were called punctures. Rather than leaving one's car abandoned on the side of the road or postponing a game to replace a ball, a patch was a quick expedient. One simply removed the inner tube from the tire or ball and glued on a patch taken from a band-aid-style box (with a rough lid to rub on the hole to take the glue better). Then one put the deflated inner tube back into the tire or ball and, using a manual pump (with needle in the case of the balls), one pumped in air.

In those days, one never made a trip without expecting at least one flat tire, and one seldom got through a whole sandlot game of football or basketball without one blow-out. (There was never more than one ball available in any neighborhood. The most important and envied kid on any team was the one who brought the ball.)

Some tires and balls had more patches than an Eagle Scout has merit badges.

All that has changed, of course.

Tires and game balls today are as sophisticated as the complicated automobiles and professional teams they serve. They are often self-healing.

Nothing stays the same anymore. We aren't surprised that our young don't know what a coal yard or icehouse was. But who would have dreamed that someday basketball players would wear shoes that could be pumped up or that a whole generation of kids would live in a world without ever seeing, much less riding, a passenger train?

A teacher barely gets used to a textbook before it is replaced with another. A dictionary hardly gets printed before 10,000 new words need to be added to it. The fall phone book arrives and within a month five percent of the numbers in it are wrong. An upgrade replacement for your new computer is being built in factories even as you sign the credit papers to buy it.

If you buy a Rand McNally road atlas, be ready to replace it within the year. If you buy a globe, get one

that you can write new names and draw new lines on.

We surf upon Internet seas and submerge in 120-channel television sets.

Roll over, Beethoven. A "classical music" album these days is one that lasts more than one week at the top of the charts.

As for medical advances and space explorations, we can't even begin to count the changes. Once a visit to a doctor's "office" was actually to an office, usually on a second-story overlooking a court square, and we thought space travel has reached its zenith when jet planes appeared at the end of World War II.

But then, we also thought civilization had peaked when the ballpoint pen and the shockproof wristwatch came out about that same time.

Both in sheer numbers and in the ability to astonish us, the marvels that have fluttered out amongst us in the last half of the twentieth century make Pandora look like a reactionary piker.

Change is our way of life. The globe has become a giant mobile home. We learn to live with momentum and in movement, or we die.

The trouble with change is that it has taken over. It's not small change anymore. It's just plain flabbergasting. If nothing is constant, to what do we moor ourselves?

"Part of the problem is that many people don't think of cable theft as stealing," said Dale Haney, marketing manager.

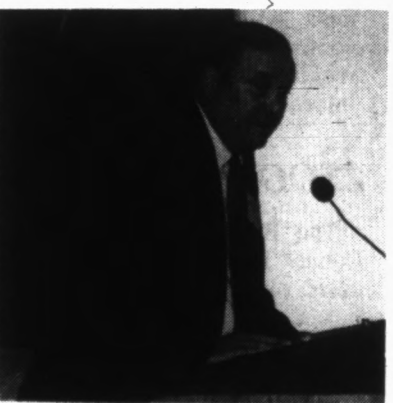

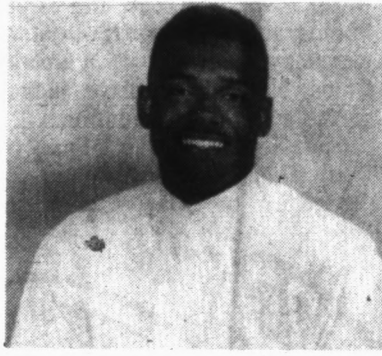

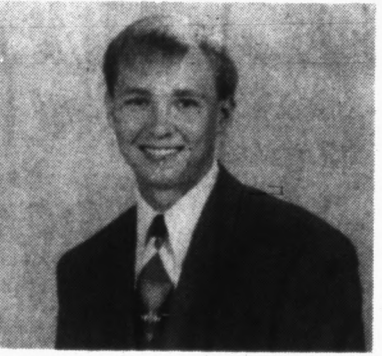

Lake level on the way up

The lake is on the rise again from near winter pool to almost summer pool in less than a week. I wish we could get this much water in the month of February and keep it! It would be warm water from the south and the fish would get turned on for sure.

I fished with Mae and Brad Gerkie on Thursday in spite of the wind and 29 degree weather we caught several fish. Nine different species were caught on grubs, minnows, and maribou jigs.

Brad threw his ever present silver buddy several times, but a yellow stripe was the only taker.

We lost several fish for various reasons and missed many more when they began to strike short.

The strong winds kept us in the bays and more or less confined to the south banks. Maybe Friday will be better!

Mae started the morning off in excellent fashion by catching a largemouth, smallmouth and then a 2 pound crappie in about 20 minutes. The wind really got tough

about then and we had to leave the area for a more protected bank.

Surprisingly enough, we found our best fish between 7 and 10 feet over brush. This was in accord with the times of our solarium table giving the major feeding period and after that time frame had passed, we found the crappie back down to 15 and 19 feet.

I maneuvered the boat along the banks and ledges looking for schools of fish hungry enough to take our offerings but was surprised at the small number we found. Usually our first and second encounter resulted in a couple of good

2 pounders and then they would scatter. I couldn't tell if it was the motion of the boat from the wind or just members of their group disappearing.

Anyway, we had some blank spaces that we couldn't fill without changing locations and as soon as another school was located the process was started over again.

The fish, and I'm including all different species we caught, were in very small groups of three to eight. Many times there was only one crappie on a brushpile, but it would bite.

The ratio of big fish over little

fish was higher Thursday than it has been all fall.

The ones we caught were fat and had excellent skin color which we have come to expect from our two lakes.

It was very difficult to tell any amount of baitfish which must be in the bays, but you can be sure the predators will find them while the water temperature was 52 degrees and reached 54 degrees by early afternoon. This is still a very good temperature for us to get some great fishing action.

I think the main problem we face now will be the strong winds keeping us from working and traveling the areas we need to be in.

We hope to be able to catch a few sauger while Mae and Brad are here and that would just about put icing on the cake.

Mae wants a big bass, any species, to put on her wall and that would make her year complete. Maybe she will hook onto one of our big rockfish stripes!

Orange best hunting color

CONCORD, N.H. (AP) — In case you haven't heard, the latest fashion for serious game stalkers this fall is Predator Hunter Orange.

That doesn't mean it will replace the Trebark camouflage outfits, or Realtree and Realtree All Purpose (a lighter shade) that remain popular among fashion-conscious shooters. Woodland also stays.

Predator is just the latest design in clothing to give hunters a leg up on those clever deer and other quarry that don't see so

well.

And the folks in New York's Garment District needn't snicker.

With more than 15 million hunters in this country alone, there are more than 1,100 clothing manufacturers, 100 distributors and 14,000 retailers totally or largely dependent on the hunting market, according to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service.

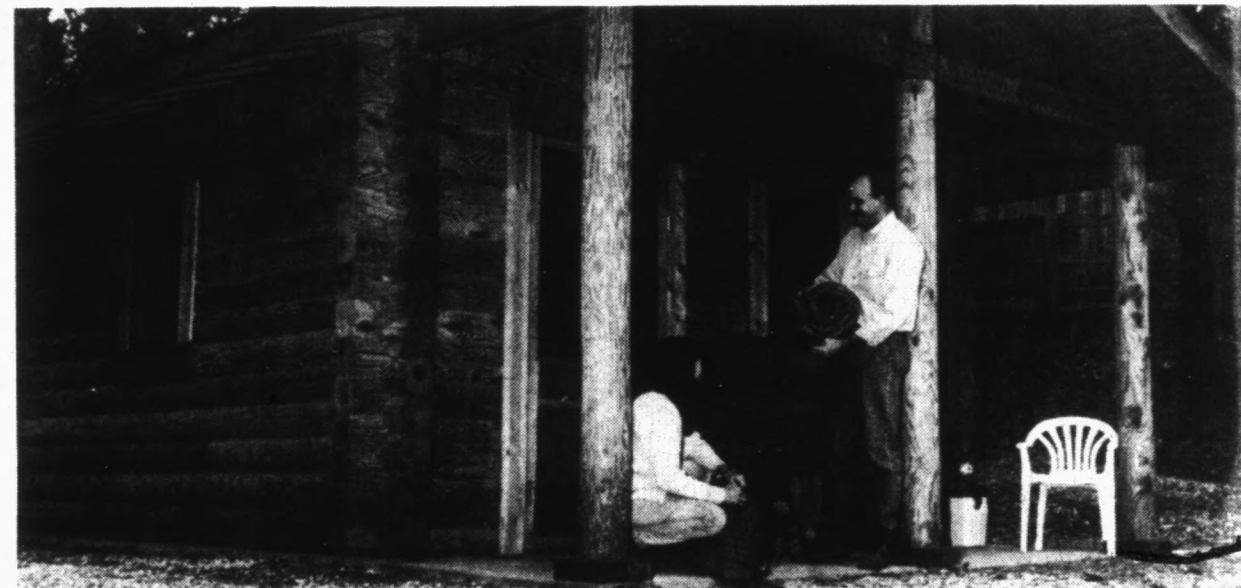
A Fish and Wildlife survey showed sales of more than \$273 million in 1994. And that did not count overseas sales, trendy teens who dress grunge, and Rambo wannabees.

"Huge, huge, huge numbers," says Blake Shelby of Mossy Oak

in West Point, Miss., one of the country's largest camouflage manufacturers.

Sales are so lucrative that major retailers have jumped into the field. Wal-Mart alone says it sells about 3 million pieces of camouflage clothing a year, from hats to insulated jackets.

Gary Adams of the Kittery Trading Post in Maine says his store sells camo shirts for \$9.99, and jackets can go for \$300. For the well-dressed hunter who hits the woods in more than one season, four or five different patterns and weights are not unusual.

Ten tips for preventing accidents while hunting

HENDERSON, Ky. (AP) — A firearms fatality at Land Between the Lakes during a youth hunt earlier this month again points up the importance of constant vigilance in the field.

The accidental shooting, which resulted in the first gun hunting fatality in the 32-year-old history of Land Between the Lakes, occurred when a deer rifle fell from the tree stand of a 13-year-old hunter. The firearm dis-

charged and the bullet struck the young hunter's father according to Tennessee Valley Authority officials.

While freak accidents such as this may be almost impossible to prevent, observing the recognized rules of firearms safety can make us all more secure, especially during the upcoming statewide deer season.

Whether in the field, on the range, in camp or at home, the likelihood of gun mishaps can be substantially lowered by follow-

ing these rules suggested by the National Rifle Association:

1. Always keep the muzzle pointed in a safe direction. One way to make this a habit, is to ask yourself periodically "What would happen if this firearm went off right now?"
2. Treat every firearm as if it is loaded, even if you think it isn't. Enough people have been shot by "unloaded" guns to make this mandatory.
3. Keep the action open except

when expecting to fire momentarily or when storing an empty gun.

4. Use the right ammunition. Carry only the proper ammunition; this is particularly important for shotguns.

5. Always keep the gun's safety on until you're ready to fire, but don't use that as an excuse for sloppy firearms handling. Any mechanical device can fail.

6. Keep your finger outside the trigger guard until you're ready to shoot. If you're not touching the trigger, you can't pull it

accidentally.

7. Always be sure of the target and of what's behind it. The bullet from a high powered deer rifle may not stop in the target, even if you hit it.

This is particularly important to hunters shooting from the ground. Shooting from an elevated stand usually lets the earth serve as a backstop, while also keeping the hunter out of the likely line of fire of ground hunters.

8. Alcohol, drugs, and shooting

don't mix. Chemicals can impair judgment and keen judgment is vital to responsible hunting and shooting.

9. Beware of fatigue. Like alcohol and drugs, fatigue can impair judgment and make you careless and clumsy. When you decide that you'd rather be at home than hunting, it's a good idea to follow your inclination. Don't push yourself too much.

10. When you're finished hunting, unload and store your firearm safely.

Tigers hang on to dump Trigg 14-12

CADIZ — Rick Fisher wasn't fooling anyone after Friday's game with Trigg County.

As much as he wanted everyone to think those drops of moisture on his forehead were caused by the rain that occasionally fell, in reality, they were from sweating it out in a do-or-die playoff battle on the road.

Trigg gave Fisher plenty to sweat about in the fourth quarter, pulling to within two points, dropping an almost sure touchdown pass and moving to the Tigers' 25 in the final minute, but as usual, Murray's defense held out long enough to preserve a 14-12 victory in the second round of the playoffs at Perdue Field.

"We dodged a lot of bullets tonight," a happy (and relieved) Fisher said after the hard-fought win that saw his team outgain 250-109 in total yardage. "They

season started: a regional championship matchup with Mayfield's (11-1) next Friday at Mayfield's War Memorial Stadium. The Cardinals defeated Todd County Central Friday, and already own a 34-7 victory over Murray this season.

"Next week will be a big game," said Murray senior lineman Joe Hayman, before adding, "next week will be the game of the century."

Murray scored its 14 points in just over a minute late in the first half on an 81-yard punt return by Johnny Harrison and an eight-yard TD pass from Allen Thompson to Albert Byrd, set up by a Jerome Olive interception.

"We played an awfully good football team tonight," said Mitchell, whose Lakers end the year 8-4. "They've got everything they need to go all the way."

A year ago, Calloway was eliminated by Bowling Green, last year's Class AAA runner-up. This year, Calloway was sent home by Miguel Merritt.

A Mr. Football candidate who has already given the University of Kentucky a verbal commitment, the 6-1, 200-pound senior led Hopkinsville (12-0) with three touchdowns and 247 total yards.

Merritt was the difference in a

Marshall County's Dan Langhi announced Friday that he is attending Vanderbilt.

Langhi, ranked one of the top 40 prospects in the nation, averaged 20 points and nine rebounds per game last year to help give Marshall County High School in Benton a 23-12 record.

"Dan is a tremendous player and if he continues to improve he could go down as one of the great players in Vanderbilt history," head coach Jan van Breda Kolff said.

The 6-9 swingman chose Vanderbilt over Connecticut, Indiana and Louisville. Morehead State and Western Kentucky each signed a prospect Friday during the early signing period for college basketball.

Jermel Thomas, a 6-foot-6, 205-pound power forward from Neosho Community College in Chanute, Kan., signed with

Western. Thomas averaged 12.4 points and 6.8 rebounds a game last season.

"Jermel is an outstanding athlete who will fit in very well in our system and style of play," said Hilltopper coach Matt Kilcullen. "He has not yet reached his potential and he's only going to get better and better."

Also Friday, Jeremy Prater, a 6-6, 200-pound guard-forward from Lakota High School in West Chester, Ohio, and Moberly (Mo.) Junior College, signed with Morehead.

Prater averaged 18 points and 11 rebounds last season as a senior at Lakota. He will attend Moberly this year and will join the Eagles in the 1996-97 season and have three years of eligibility remaining.

"Jeremy is a shooter who can help us replace the outstanding senior shooters we have this year," coach Dick Fick said.

Rams open dome with Carolina

Panthers look to even record

Don't look now, but the expansion Carolina Panthers could wind up this weekend with the same record as the Super Bowl champion San Francisco 49ers.

The upstart Panthers will help the St. Louis Blues open their new home, the \$280 million Trans World Dome, on Sunday in a meeting between teams that have gone in opposite directions in recent weeks.

St. Louis had a 4-0 start to the season, including a 31-10 thrashing of the Panthers in Game 3. That was when Carolina was losing its first five games.

But the Panthers are riding a four-game winning streak, and last week they knocked off the 49ers 13-7. If Carolina defeats the Rams and San Francisco loses at Dallas on Sunday, the Panthers, Rams and 49ers would have identical 5-5 records.

"Everybody's pretty excited," Carolina rookie quarterback Kerry Collins. "You can feel the excitement building."

Not only will the Rams finally play in their new 65,300-seat

building, they'll finally have 41-year-old Jackie Slater in the lineup. Slater, who will make history by playing in his 20th season, reinjured his surgically repaired elbow a few weeks ago during rehabilitation, and it's not known how long his comeback will last.

"I suppose it would have been easy to just call it a day, but I put in too much time trying to get to this point," Slater said. "I'm honored that I'm going to have a chance to play and it's going to be gratifying even if it's one or two snaps."

He already has played 258 games, more than any offensive

lineman in NFL history and fourth on the league's career list.

Besides Carolina (4-5) at St. Louis (5-4) and San Francisco (5-4) at Dallas (8-1), other games Sunday will have Indianapolis (5-4) at New Orleans (3-6), Oakland (7-2) at the New York Giants (3-6), New England (3-6) at Miami (6-3), Cincinnati (3-6) at Houston (4-5), Seattle (3-6) at Jacksonville (3-6), Carolina (4-5) at St. Louis (5-4), Tampa Bay (5-4) at Detroit (3-6), Chicago (6-3), the NFC Central leader, at Green Bay (5-4), Minnesota (4-5) at Arizona (3-6) and Denver (5-4) at Philadelphia (5-4).

Rodman optimistic about return

DEERFIELD, Ill. (AP) — Dennis Rodman was right. It's a pulled calf muscle, and he's out for up to four weeks.

The Chicago Bulls said Friday that medical tests confirmed what Rodman already knew.

"The only good news I have is Dennis said, 'I think I can take

this month and maybe make it two weeks,'" Bulls coach Phil Jackson said.

Because of the slight chance that the four-time NBA rebounding champion could return before he sits out the five games required of players placed on injured reserve, Rodman will remain on the active roster.

Dickey Simpkins will start at

Rodman's power forward spot again tonight when Chicago plays host to the Portland Trail Blazers. Simpkins had 12 points and four rebounds in 21 minutes as the Bulls improved to 4-0 by beating Cleveland on Thursday.

The injury occurred Tuesday in the closing minutes of Rodman's best game for the Bulls: 11 points, 13 rebounds, six assists

against the Toronto Raptors.

While the team insisted on listing Rodman's injury status as "day-to-day," Rodman told reporters that he'd "probably miss the next month."

Rodman was drawing on experience: He pulled a calf muscle during the 1992-93 season, when he was with the Detroit Pistons.

Colbert leads Senior event

Seeks redemption for last year's end

MYRTLE BEACH, S.C. (AP) — Jim Colbert was just happy to be a millionaire last year. In 1995, he wants to be the best millionaire on the Senior PGA Tour.

And he's halfway there, taking a 3-shot lead after two rounds of the Senior Tour Championship. His 69 on Friday left him three strokes ahead of Isao Aoki and five in front of Hale Irwin and Tom Wargo.

When Colbert qualified for the year-end tournament last year as one of the top 31 money-winners, he found out that last place paid \$15,500 — more than enough to give him \$1 million for the season.

"That just about ended any

chance I had of winning this thing," said Colbert, who batted balls around The Dunes Golf & Beach Club on the way to a last-place tie with Chi Chi Rodriguez.

This year, Colbert wants more. He's fourth in the money standings with \$1,182,386 and, with the winner's check of \$262,000, could pass current cash leader Dave Stockton for first place on the Senior Tour.

Stockton, who must finish no

better than third for Colbert to be No. 1, shot a 71 and was eight strokes behind at 145.

"There's a definite difference of attitude on my arrival here," said Colbert, who has made only one bogey in two days to stand at 7-under-par 137.

Colbert was strong in mild weather as well as cold. After shooting a 68 in frigid conditions on Thursday, he quickly took advantage of the warmer climate

with a birdie on No. 1.

After a bogey on No. 6, Colbert landed an 8-iron within 5 feet to set up a birdie on the seventh. He moved back out to a 3-shot lead over Aoki on No. 9, dropping a 6-iron within 10 feet for a birdie.

Bob Murphy, who leads the Tour with four victories this year, and Lee Trevino were even at 144. Murphy had a 71 and Trevino, whose first round included a 9 on the par-5 13th hole, came back with a 70.

Ray Floyd, tied for second after the first round, made a double-bogey 5 on the ninth hole and fell to 1-over with Stockton.

game that was much closer than the 18-point spread indicated. Friday night's game was definitely closer than the 46-14 Tiger win on Sept. 29 at Calloway.

Calloway got as close as 27-14 early in the third, but Merritt had an answer.

Tiger quarterback Deontey Kenner hit Merritt on a short route out of the backfield and the muscle-bound speedster rambled 66 yards for the score. The two-point conversion made it 35-14 with 6:43 to play in the game.

"(Hopkinsville) knew we were a good football team, that's why they decided to play it close to the vest and let their running backs win the game," said Mitchell, referring to the Tigers' ground game.

Calloway trailed just 14-7 midway through the second quarter on an Alberto Villanueva two-yard touchdown run.

Again, Merritt answered. After gaining 45 yards to the Calloway 15-yard line, Merritt rolled into the end zone from 15 yards out on the next play.

Leading 21-7 at halftime, Hopkinsville gave Merritt the ball on their first play of the second half and he went 66 yards to make it 27-7.

Calloway held Merritt to just 24 yards rushing on Sept. 29, but Kenner threw four touchdown passes.

"He's had a year now to improve as a running back," Mitchell said of Merritt, who rushed for 183 yards on 11 carries. "He was breaking tackles and outrunning us. He's hard to stop."

Calloway had several opportunities to pull closer to the Tigers, but either Merritt or a penalty stopped them.

With :08 to play in the half,

trailing 21-7, Arnett hit Tom Watkins for an apparent 40-yard touchdown. However, a holding penalty brought the play, and the score, back.

"I was real excited when I threw it, but then I saw the flag," said Arnett, who threw for 246 yards on the night. "Stuff like that happens, that's good officiating. In the playoffs, they're looking for little things."

PAT kick failed, leaving the Wildcats down 14-6.

An intercepted pass on the first play of the fourth period set up Trigg's next score, a one-yard quarterback keeper by Rush that capped a 10-play, 89-yard drive. The Wildcats were then forced to go for two points to tie the game, but the pass attempt failed following a five-yard illegal procedure penalty.

The remaining six-plus minutes were prime nail-biting time for Murray as Trigg seemingly had all the momentum on its side. A three-yard Tiger punt gave the Wildcats the ball at Murray's 40, but Trigg's Carlos Acree dropped what appeared to be a sure touchdown pass on the second play, and Murray eventually regained the ball on downs.

"Our biggest task tonight was to contain them," Fisher said. "When you play against a strong running team they can lull you to sleep and then get behind you with a pass. But we said we had to get out in front because they have the type of team that can score from anywhere on the field."

Diabetics Taking Control thanks everyone in the community who took part and helped with the event,

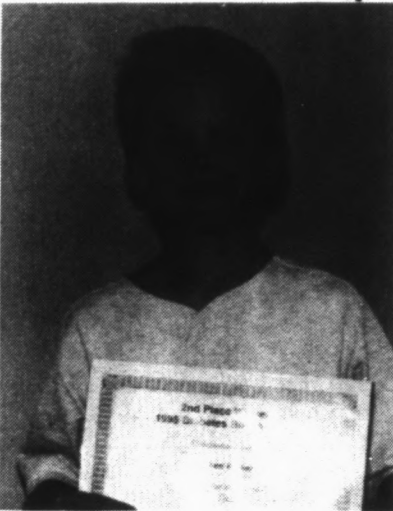

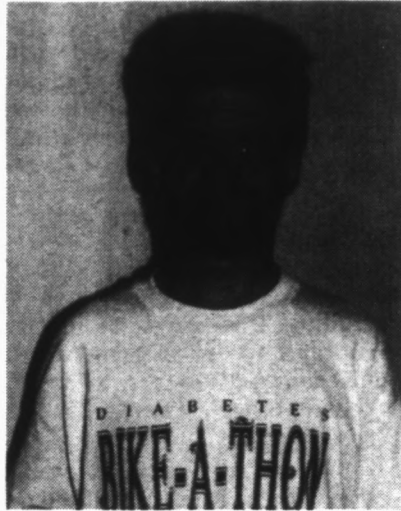

DR. GOTT

DEAR DR. GOTT: Ever since I moved to this neighborhood, I've had problems with the local children — and their parents — who have vandalized my home, threatened me and my children, stolen from me, and sent letters promising to kill me. Although I have filed charges with the local police, the white officers refused to take any action. I don't know where to turn.

DEAR READER: From the sound of your lengthy letter (which I have abstracted), I am concerned not only about the lack of law enforcement activity but the fact that you and your family are clearly in danger.

I suggest the following strategy: First, take your complaints to the best attorney in town. He or she may be able to set the proper legal proceedings in motion. Because you are African-American, your case may be strengthened if the authorities have disregarded your civil rights.

Second, take the evidence of your harassment to the nearest newspaper office or television/radio station. From your description, the problem you have in your community should make an

interesting story that could well generate much public sympathy. This would "encourage" the law enforcement officials to take a more active stance.

Third, consider bypassing your local police and file a complaint with the state police.

Finally, don't place your family in jeopardy. Until the situation is straightened out, consider staying in a "safe house." (Many communities have such resources for victims of domestic violence.) Or, if possible, stay with a relative or friend.

The most important consideration here is your welfare and your children's safety. Violence is epidemic in this country today and, based on the material you sent me, it is unquestionable that the police won't do more to help you. Therefore, you may have to seek the alternatives I mentioned.

DEAR DR. GOTT: Why are my hands swollen and painful every morning? I just started taking birth control pills and my doctor ignores my question.

DEAR READER: Hormone therapy, such as birth control pills, often causes cycles of harmless fluid retention, much like the puffiness experienced by many women in conjunction with

their menstrual cycles.

You may be helped by reducing salt in your diet. If this is ineffective, you should be examined by your family physician, who will order blood and urine tests to make sure that you don't have a kidney disorder, a metabolic imbalance or early arthritis.

I don't think that further testing is necessary, however, because puffy, painful hands (or feet) is such a common consequence of birth control pills. Incidentally, if I'm correct, you'll notice improvement during the days you aren't taking the pills, in the normal cycle recommended by the manufacturer.

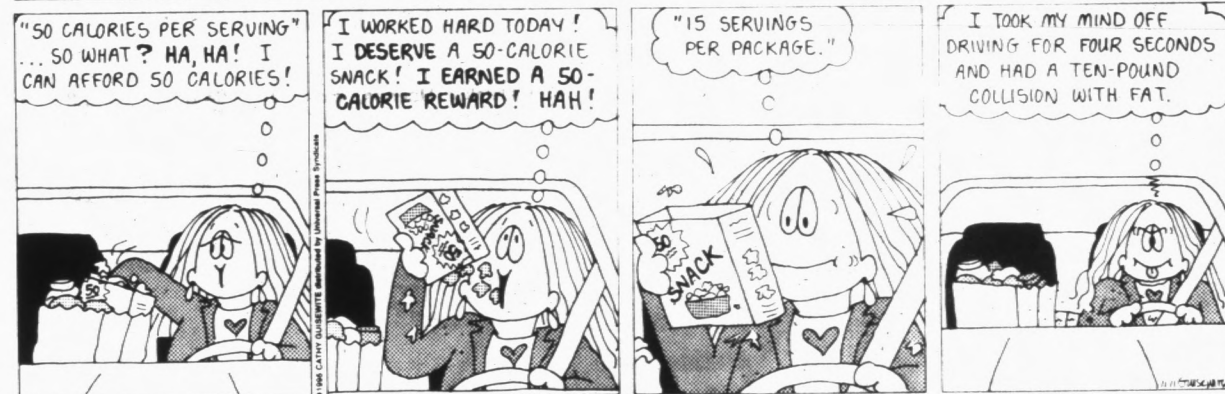

TODAY IN HISTORY

Five years ago: Stormie Jones, the world's first heart-liver transplant recipient, died at a Pittsburgh hospital at age 13.

One year ago: President Clinton set out for an Asian trade conference, suggesting it could help bring prosperity to dissatisfied Americans. A suicide bomber detonated his explosives at an Israeli military checkpoint in Gaza, killing three soldiers.

Opening lead — ace of clubs.

Although bridge is basically a game of percentages, it nevertheless offers generous rewards for ingenuity. For example, take this case where South got to four spades on the bidding shown. West led the ace and another club, declarer ruffing high when East continued the suit at trick three.

Having lost the first two tricks, and with the ace of hearts also sure to take a trick, declarer had to try to

find a way to avoid losing any diamonds. This seemed an impossible task, for while one diamond loser could eventually be discarded on a high heart, there seemed to be no way to avoid the other one.

Declarer considered the possibility of leading a heart towards dummy, hoping West would make the mistake of rising with the ace if he had it. But South dismissed this thought because he felt certain East had the ace of hearts for his vulnerable overcall once West had shown up with the ace of clubs.

South therefore concluded that his only possible chance for the contract was to lay a trap for East. Accordingly, at trick four he crossed to the queen of spades and returned the deuce of hearts!

It was very difficult for East to imagine that South would make this play without holding the jack of hearts, so, afraid that the jack might be singleton, he rushed up with the ace. As a result, South later discarded both his diamond losers on the K-Q of hearts and wound up making four spades.

You could argue, quite justifiably, that East made a poor defensive play, but even if the play had failed you would still have to give South an A for effort.
