

Grand jury indicts Elder

The Calloway County man accused of shooting his roommate/business partner to death Tuesday made his first appearance in Calloway County Circuit Court Friday.

Jeffrey W. Elder, 32, pleaded not guilty to a Calloway County grand jury indictment in the shooting death of Jack McCuiston, 45.

Elder allegedly shot and killed McCuiston at the trailer they shared for more than five years on White Oak Drive, off Highway 280.

Elder was taken into custody after he called and surrendered to sheriff's officials less than two hours after the shooting took place around 3:11 p.m.

According to court documents, Elder claims he and McCuiston had been arguing the day of the shooting and that McCuiston pro-

duced a .38-caliber pistol and threatened to "kill him."

Elder stated that he pulled a .22-caliber pistol out from underneath a chair where he was sitting and fired three rounds at McCuiston.

Elder claims McCuiston was allegedly facing him about 12 feet away when he shot him three times in the chest.

But Elder's statements are inconsistent with evidence gathered at the crime scene by Calloway County Sheriff Stan Scott.

According to Scott's affidavit, McCuiston was found with two bullet "entrance" wounds in his chest and one in the upper left portion of his back.

According to Scott's statement, McCuiston's wounds and clothing showed signs of powder burns which Scott said indicate "close contact wounds."

Scott confirmed that a .38-ca-

liber pistol was found with McCuiston but would not comment on whether it had been fired.

"We're waiting on all the evidence to come back from the lab before we release anything," he said.

Elder's affidavit claims McCuiston fired at least one shot at him.

Scott said all evidence has been sent to Frankfort for processing but doesn't expect the test results for some time.

"With it being the holidays, I don't expect to hear from (the lab) for at least two to three weeks," he said.

At Friday's proceedings, Steve West, Elder's court-appointed attorney, made standard discovery motions which were granted by Judge David Buckingham.

Buckingham set a deadline of

Clerk's records among worst

FRANKFORT, Ky. (AP) — The Floyd County clerk has a deficit in her office of at least \$195,000, and she is personally liable, according to a state audit Friday.

The shortage might be worse, but Clerk Carla Boyd's records are so bad it's impossible to tell, the report said.

Records for 1992 and 1993 "were inconsistent, incomplete and inaccurate. ... Records for collection and distribution of delinquent taxes were not reliable. The county clerk's records do not permit the application of necessary auditing procedures," the report said.

In an accompanying statement, state Auditor Ben Chandler said Boyd's records were "the worst of any clerk's records" he had seen.

"The clerk's records are so bad that the auditor's office cannot issue an audit opinion as to the exact financial position of the clerk's office," the statement said.

However, Boyd "owes her fee account a minimum of \$195,126 from personal funds," the audit said. The case had been referred to the attorney general's and Kentucky State Police for possible further action, the statement said.

Boyd said in a brief telephone interview that she disagreed with

the report.

"It's really serious, but it will all be straightened out. I don't see a problem," she said. A certified public accountant now is working on her records, she said.

Chandler's auditors reported that Boyd apparently tried to hide shortages with a "lapping scheme" — taking money from new accounts to cover debts in old accounts.

They said more \$44,000 apparently was transferred in that manner to cover shortages for 1991 and 1992. They said she also deposited \$11,704 of her own money.

The audit also said Boyd col-

Congress approves benefits

WASHINGTON (AP) — Congress headed home for the Christmas holiday, putting negotiations over the federal budget impasse on hold for a week, but not before assuring benefit checks for 3.3 million veterans and dependents and 4.7 million welfare families.

President Clinton late Friday signed a measure, given final approval by the Senate hours earlier, to authorize distribution of the payments.

And in a voice vote that followed brief discussion, the Senate also approved a proposal by Majority Leader Bob Dole to declare the 260,000 federal workers who have been furloughed for a week essential and allow them to return to work on the promise they would be paid later.

"We're going to pay the federal employees," Dole, R-Kan., said. "It's no fault of their own they're not working."

The same promise of eventual pay went to 500,000 other workers in nine Cabinet departments

and other agencies who were declared exempt from layoff and have remained on the job even though their organizations have no budgets in place.

The House could vote on the measure as soon it returns from its holiday recess Wednesday.

Dole's proposal was designed to address a legal roadblock that forbids furloughed workers from returning to their jobs even on a voluntary basis. But the workers' agencies would remain unable to

Lab performs reindeer exams

There are advantages to being the nation's first fully accredited veterinary diagnostic laboratory. Murray State University's Breathitt Veterinary Center in Hopkinsville, Ky., has been selected for the 15th consecutive year by Santa Claus to perform important diagnostic testing on his team of flying reindeer.

Dr. Wade Kadel, BVC director, feels that the lab's accreditation by the American Association of Veterinary Laboratory Diagnosticians (AALVD) is definitely a factor in Claus' choice of the BVC to conduct reindeer pre-flight examinations. "Accreditation assures the people we serve that tests have been done by competent people and that the results are credible," Kadel said. "It's a confidence factor — the public knows they can trust our results."

The laboratory goes through a rigorous accreditation process by the AALVD, beginning with a self-completed questionnaire which is followed by a site visit from the accrediting agency. The site team files its own report on the lab

addressing both strengths and weaknesses. Kadel views the accreditation process as a good way of identifying areas which need to be enhanced. Also, he noted, obtaining a full accreditation means that there are no limitations on the laboratory.

"I think that Santa saw that we were fully accredited and somehow learned of the speed at which this lab works," he continued. "I'm very proud of our turnaround time. It compares favorably with other diagnostic labs in the country." An average turnaround time of 3.2 days is important to a lab which serves not only owners of companion animals, but owners of food industry animals.

"The Christmas season is busy and Santa Claus is no different than

the rest of us," Kadel noted. "When the time comes, he wants to test his reindeer as close to Christmas as possible so that he knows the test results are still valid during the time of the flight."

The lab works on a veterinarian referral basis only. Veterinarians submit samples such as body fluids, tissue and animal feed for examination by the lab. Even a celebrity like Santa Claus, Kadel explained, doesn't get preferential treatment there. "A veterinarian referral basis ensures the best use of taxpayer dollars," Kadel said.

Dr. Ollie L. Elf submits such samples each year to the BVC. Kadel said that Elf, veterinarian at the North Pole Animal Clinic, has

been the contact elf from year-to-year. Each year a package of specimens is delivered to the loading dock of the BVC before the work day begins. The BVC staff never knows when to expect the package Kadel explained because, of course, they do not know if the lab will be chosen that year to perform the testing. Upon receipt of the specimens of blood, fur, nasal swabs, hay and grain the lab goes to work testing for reindeer fitness.

Luckily, the laboratory will work for out-of-state clients as well as in-state. Work for veterinarians in West Virginia, a state which doesn't have an animal diagnostic lab, is regularly performed, Kadel noted. The lab also has some steady customers from as far away as Hawaii. Dr. Elf, Kadel confirmed, is the laboratory user from the most northern location.

Using the latest technology, the laboratory conducts tests in the serology, microbiology, toxicology and pathology sections looking for any indication of disease in the animals. The testing procedures

used for analyzing the reindeer samples are the same as those used in diagnosing disease and its cause in food and companion animals.

Generally, no diagnostic fees are charged to food producers in Kentucky. There are, however, charges for testing for companion animals and for animals belonging to owners in other states. Claus' reindeer fall into the approximately 20 percent of animal owners using the lab from outside of Kentucky's borders. Naturally the reindeer are considered to be companion animals and not a part of the food industry.

The serology and microbiology sections test the reindeer each year for infectious diseases including rednose, bluetongue and greentail. This year, as in the past, the lab report indicates that Dasher, Dancer, Prancer, Vixen, Comet, Cupid, Donner and Blitzen are clean on all counts. Rudolph tested positive for rednose, as he always does, but the lab report explains that the

"positive result obtained was for the fact that this deer has a red glowing nose."

Microbiology testing found no evidence of disease in the deer. Special testing performed by the lab confirmed that the reindeer have not been exposed to any virus that causes "head colds."

Toxicology examined the hay consumed by the reindeer and found that it was contaminated with some "sparkly stuff." Dr. Ramesh Gupta, head of the toxicology section, sends a minute sample through a mass spectrometer, a high-tech

computer setup with a staggering 77,000 chemical compounds in its library. When a match is made, Gupta noted, it can be said with 98 percent probability that the compound is present in the sample. Pretty good odds, Gupta believes.

However, a match between a formula and the "sparkly stuff" has not been made although the lab has theorized that the hay additive might play a part in how the reindeer fly. "We know why they fly," Kadel

said, "but results are inconclusive as to how they fly." An explanation of the "sparkly stuff"? "Magic," BVC scientists speculate.

Kadel's examination of the case report, only one of the approximately 60,000 times per year he looks at case folders, concludes that the reindeer will indeed be capable of worldwide flight this Christmas Eve. Their insulating fur, Kadel said, will enable them to withstand snow, ice and cold. According to Kadel, lab results have been faxed

to Dr. Elf at the North Pole. Kadel said the outlook for an event-free flight this year with an especially heavily laden sleigh full of goodies looks very positive. In fact, an e-mail message from Claus was received at the lab indicating that his sleigh will be from 20-25 percent larger this year.

It looks like, once again, MSU's Breathitt Veterinary Center is going to be able to live up to the brag posted outside its building, "We Keep 'Em Flying."

Feb. 2 for that evidence to be turned over by Commonwealth's Attorney Mike Ward's office.

Buckingham, however, denied a defense request to reduce Elder's bond from \$50,000 to \$10,000.

"In normal murder cases, the bond is usually much higher than this, so I'm going to keep it where it is," Buckingham told West.

Elder will be back in court on Feb. 9 at 1:30 p.m. for a standard pre-trial hearing.

Elder and McCuiston owned J. J. & Co. Hairstyling, formerly housed in the Central Center Shopping Center. The two men moved their business out to their trailer about three years ago.

Scott said his office has previously responded to domestic dis-

putes at the location and that there were signs of alcohol involvement the day of the shooting.

Elder was escorted back to the Marshall County Detention Center where he is being held in lieu of \$50,000 cash bond.

lected \$570,000 in delinquent property taxes in 1992 and 1993. The clerk is to distribute that money to the state and to local taxing districts for schools, the library and fire department.

But \$103,900 apparently was not distributed and no longer is in Boyd's 1992 and 1993 accounts, the audit said.

Part of the problem was that Boyd accounted for delinquent tax collections three ways: a receipts ledger, monthly reports generated by computer and monthly reports prepared manually and sent to taxing districts.

"These records contradicted each other for the 24 months examined and never did the three records agree for the amounts recorded for delinquent taxes collected," the audit said.

Boyd declined to comment on that finding and others in the audit.

The \$103,900 shortage in delinquent taxes accounted for most of the overall shortage, the audit said.

It also said there were "numerous delays in obtaining records" from Boyd. Several bank statements, canceled checks and deposit slips were missing, and some had to be obtained from the bank, it said.



spend money for other purposes, such as providing aid to state and local governments for various programs.

Earlier Friday, President Clinton and Congress' Republican leaders discussed their budget clash and reported making progress. But all they could agree on was to meet again next Friday, and no new offers were presented.

Staff aides were told to list options for finding savings in Medicare, Medicaid and other major programs that negotiators could consider next week.

"Right now the attitude of everyone is very positive and I hope we can do what the American people want us to do — come to some agreement to balance the budget," Dole said.

"Things are going well," House Majority Leader Dick Armey, R-Texas, agreed after the session involving himself, Dole, Clinton, House Speaker Newt Gingrich, R-Ga. and other congressional leaders and administration officials. "I think there is a very healthy rapport being established."

With negotiations more than a month old, there was agreement that the budget should be balanced by 2002 but wide gulfs over how to do it.

The most intractable conflicts were over GOP proposals to scoop deeper savings out of Medicare, Medicaid, welfare and other domestic programs than Clinton wants, and a Republican tax cut proposal far bigger than the president's.

With Christmas just three days away, lawmakers seemed eager to avoid being blamed for imposing suffering on some of America's most vulnerable — or politically active — citizens.

To accomplish that, Congress approved and Clinton swiftly signed the bill permitting benefit checks be mailed to 3.3 million veterans and their dependents; to 13 million welfare recipients — 9 million of them children — getting Aid to Families With Dependent Children; and for adoption and foster care.

The veterans will be receiving their monthly checks a bit late — on Dec. 30 or Jan. 2 instead of the originally planned date of Dec. 29, officials said.

New publisher named

OWENSBORO, Ky. (AP) — Robert W. Mong Jr., managing editor of The Dallas Morning News since 1990, was named publisher of the Messenger-Inquirer.

Friday's announcement came 18 days after the A.H. Belo Corp., owners of the Morning News, announced plans to buy the Owensboro newspaper.

Mong will succeed John Hager, who plans to retire when the sale is finalized in early January. Hager's family has owned Owensboro newspapers since 1909.

Burl Osborne, publisher and editor of the Morning News and president of Belo's publishing division, announced Mong's appointment to the Messenger-Inquirer staff Friday afternoon.

Mong, a 46-year-old Ohio native, told the staff he doesn't expect any immediate changes.

"One of the things I'm about is listening," Mong said. "To the staff and the community. I'm not one of those people who comes in and says everything has to be changed."

Mong said he considers the move "a step up. Being a publisher is different. This allows me to continue to grow."

He oversees a newsroom staff of 500 in Dallas. The newspaper has a daily circulation of more than 525,000 and a Sunday circulation of 800,000. The Messenger-Inquirer, with a daily and Sunday circulation of roughly 33,400, has a total of 175 employees in all departments.

McQueen dies from burns

Butterfly McQueen, who played Scarlett O'Hara's young, scatterbrained slave Prissy in "Gone With The Wind," died Friday after suffering critical burns when a kerosene heater caught fire. She was 84.

McQueen told firefighters her clothes caught fire when she was trying to light one of two kerosene heaters in her one-bedroom cottage just outside Augusta, Ga. She was lying on the sidewalk when firefighters arrived.

She was taken to Augusta Regional Medical Center with second- and third-degree burns over 70 percent of her body and was listed in very critical condition, said Butch Dorman, nursing director at the hospital's burn center.

McQueen's career spanned Broadway, the movies and television. But for better or worse, her immortality rested on her small role in the 1939 film that became an enduring phenomenon — by some measures the biggest movie hit ever.

EDITORIAL ROUNDUP

Dec. 10 — The Seattle Times on the federal budget:

After weeks of poll-watching and spin control, President Clinton finally has returned to the budget table, presenting a seven-year plan that gives the Republican Congress something they can work with, if not live with.

So work with it. No foot-dragging. No extended deadlines. Taxpayers are fed up with this budget game, where the chips are valued in the billions of dollars and the table talk is worthless. Both sides are approaching a reasonable compromise that minimizes sacrifice on the part of the low-income and the elderly, but that makes tangible strides toward balancing the federal books by the year 2002.

Clinton's offer substantially narrows the gap. He agrees to a 20 percent cut in most domestic spending, sparing only a few worthwhile pet programs such as job training. He reduces the cuts in Medicare, Medicaid, farm subsidies and other entitlements. And he agrees to the seven-year target, based on Congressional Budget Office projections.

There are flaws in his plan. It assumes an optimistic rate of economic growth. That optimism may be justified; a balanced budget itself could trigger an economic surge. But at this point, both sides should assume a conservative rate of growth, leaving elbow room in the event the economy outperforms expectations.

Republicans can give way to Clinton on welfare and Medicaid, key elements in the federal safety net. But the GOP should stand its ground on middle-class entitlements, especially farm subsidies and Medicare, both of which issue checks regardless of need. Despite Democratic demagoguery, most Medicare recipients are willing to pay a greater share of their health-care costs. That's precisely the kind of sacrifice necessary to balance the federal budget.

The next move belongs to the Republicans. By standing firm on entitlements and backing off from the high end of their tax cut, they can conclude a compromise budget to take home and brag about over the holiday recess — and so can the president.

Real Nixon proves elusive

WASHINGTON (AP) — Richard Nixon was the most written about, talked about, argued about American of his time and yet no book, no transcript and no film has managed to bring this very complex man into focus.

Nixon could not do it in his own 10 books. A long trail of television versions of this event or that period didn't do it. And even Oliver Stone admits at the start of his epic new movie, "Nixon," that it is based on an incomplete record.

How could it be? It spans all 80 years of a life so full of well-known events, that it has to skip like a stone over water from Alger Hiss, to Checkers, to the China triumph and the Soviet detente, to Daniel Ellsberg and Watergate.

And with the fanciful hints about a Nixon involvement in the two Kennedy assassinations and an attempt on Fidel Castro, pointing the finger at a secret group of rich and manipulative Texans, the big events get short shrift.

Was he the backstabbing anti-Semite depicted in a recent TV

drama, "Nixon and Kissinger," who snarled: "I want this explained to me now; my Jew boy, where's my Jew boy?"

Or was he the Nixon of the movie, appalled by hearing his own words on a tape that exclaims: "I never said this about Jews. It makes me sound like an anti-Semite?"

If he had such deep-seated animosity, why did he make so many Jews important to his life: Murray Chotiner, the political adviser; Henry Kissinger, his foreign policy handler; Leonard Garment, his Watergate defender?

In Stone's movie, he is haunted by the memory of his stern, unapproachable father.

But as Nixon himself described him, Frank Nixon worked hard and "had an Irish quickness both to anger and to mirth... Whatever talent I have as a debater must have been acquired from my father, from his love of argument and disputation."

And, said Nixon, "my father's

interest in politics made him the most enthusiastic follower of my career from its beginnings."

The recent television program, which covered the period when Kissinger met quietly with the North Vietnamese to get a peace agreement, is laced with backstabbing, suspicion of one another and turf-protecting by both men.

Yet it was Kissinger, not any of the other advisers, to whom Nixon turned in the last days in the White House to kneel with him in prayer.

Some earlier Nixon books, especially "The Final Days," painted him as having cold relations with his wife, Pat. But in the Stone version, he is a sweating, psychotic boozier who seeks her approval. In the Stone movie, Nixon's wife threatens to leave him if he continues in his paranoia that everyone is against him.

There is this exchange with Pat Nixon, when Senate investigators learn about his secret taping system and demand the recording

reels:

Nixon: They'll never see those tapes and neither will you.

Pat: And what would I find out that I haven't known for years? In the movie, Nixon comes across as whiny, uncertain and fearful, even in public.

But in his diaries, H.R. Halde- man, his most trusted aide, says Nixon insisted in a 1971 conversation, "It's extremely important that the leader never be in the position to allow the impression that he was wrong."

That was an example of Nixon's skewed view about the infallibility of the presidency. He said much the same thing in 1977, three years after his resignation, when he defended wiretappings, burglaries, mail-openings and other covert activities.

"When the president does it," he told a television audience, "that means that it is not illegal."

named "Torches". For centuries, Europeans celebrated Christmas with torchlight parades and pageants.

The light of the torches symbolized the stars of God's great firmament, especially the Bethlehem star. It stood as well for the radiance surrounding the heavenly host that sang Glorias that first night and, more importantly, the Light of the World just born. The halos painted around angels' heads and around Mary, Joseph, and Jesus by latter-century artists were radiant beams of the sort we associate with Christmas lights and candles.

Gnostic Christians associated lights with souls. Each human has a soul like a little light, and all the little lights came from one great light and merge back towards it throughout life, with death liberat-

ing the body-bound lights to join the divine one light.

Something of that same image is found in our popularized saying, "If we each would light just one little candle, what a bright world this would be."

In the first two-thirds of this year now ending Americans recalled World War II and celebrated in May and August its ending. For those of us in the 60-and-over age bracket, this year's millions of Christmas lights are a bright contrast to our memories of that war's dark days. (So are Bing Crosby recordings and electric trains.)

For those of us with long memories, Christmas lights are a memorial to our days of youth and to those marvelous men and women who

sacrificed so much so that we could have a youth to remember. When the lights go on each Christmas, some of us think each of them glows in memory of some one who lived and died for us.

This December 1995 finds American soldiers again on European soil, called to duty in a grief-stricken and war-torn Bosnia. The darkness there may not be as widespread, what with the demise of both Nazism and communism across Europe, but rest assured that it is every bit as dark in Bosnia today as it was around the world half a century ago.

One lesson of the World War II lights is vigilance. We must make sacrifices that honor those made for us, to keep the lights on around the globe.

Another lesson is optimism. We must continue to believe, in this and every Christmas season, in the better angels of human nature, despite ourselves.

And a third lesson is sharing. It takes a lot of lights to brighten a night, and each of us is but a twinkle. Yet, string us together and we can shine through anything, including a depression or a world war—or just through growing old.



Spicy green onions and nonfat cream cheese lend a distinct flavor to mashed potatoes — without adding a lot of fat or calories. In the recipe below, each serving has 167 calories and 1 gram of fat.

Cream Cheese and Chives Mashed Potatoes
1 and 1-3rd pounds (4 medium) potatoes, cut into 1-inch

cubes
½ cup nonfat cream cheese
¼ to 1-3rd cup 1-percent milk
1-3rd cup snipped fresh chives
or 2 tablespoons dried snipped chives

Salt and pepper, to taste
In medium saucepan, cook potatoes in 2 inches boiling water, covered, about 12 minutes, until tender; drain thoroughly.

Mash potatoes with electric mixer, or potato masher.
Mix in cream cheese until melted.

Mix in remaining ingredients. Do not overbeat. Stir gently over low heat just until heated through. Makes 4 servings.



Study of children's height on life made

CHICAGO (AP) — Short children are no more likely to be shy, anxious or depressed than taller kids, according to a study that contradicts earlier research. The study, financed by a group

that supports the use of growth hormones, suggests that parents who hope expensive hormone treatments will improve their children's self-esteem may be wasting their money.

"The strongest case for treatment should ... not be based on the assumption that if you're short you're having problems," said study co-author David Sandberg, a professor of pediatric psychiatry at the State University of New York in Buffalo.

The study, published Wednesday in the journal *Pediatrics*, was financed in part by the Human

Growth Foundation, a nonprofit group that backs the use of growth hormones. Foundation members supported the study's findings.

The research was based on surveys of 180 boys and 78 girls, ages 8 to 14, who were referred to a program for treatment of height deficiency. Researchers would not disclose the hospital where the program is based.

They found that short boys described themselves as less socially active, but did not have more behavior problems than a group of average height.

Older boys who were shorter than expected tended to show slightly more problems, probably because they have been living with their shortness for a longer period of time, Sandberg said.

Girls, though, were nearly indistinguishable from the normal group and seemed to be better off in some cases. The younger girls — 8 to 12 — described their athletic promise and social skills more positively than even normal-size girls.

"Society accepts petite girls more than petite boys," said study co-author Susana Campos, an assistant professor at State University of New York at Buffalo.

The findings contradict earlier studies suggesting shorter youngsters are more likely to be maladjusted than taller kids.

Jim Weiss, a spokesman for Genentech Inc., which earned \$216 million last year on growth hormone sales, said the findings were consistent with the company's philosophy.

About 20,000 U.S. children have taken human growth hormone. The National Institutes of Health estimate about 8,000 receive the drug solely for cosmetic reasons. Doctors say perceived psychological reasons are frequently the only problems cited by parents requesting the treatment, which costs about \$30,000 a year.

Many doctors recommend hormone treatment for children only if it's medically necessary, such as when kidney failure leads to a deficiency in the natural growth hormone.

Otherwise, researchers said, the treatment may be more traumatic than whatever social problems the parents are trying to avoid.

"Having to go to the endocrine clinics, the daily injections and parental supervision — are these factors even more stressful?" Campos said.

Jeremy Rifkin, president of the Washington-based Foundation on Economic Trends, a think tank that studies the ethical, social and economic implications of new technologies, said the study shows there's nothing wrong with being short.

"The bottom line is this," said the 5-foot-7 Rifkin. "Diversity is part of what being human is about."

Custodians vow to continue fight

CLEVELAND, Tenn. (AP) — William Ashe vows the fight has just begun for custody of the five children of his sister-in-law, who was fatally bitten during a snake-handling church service in Kentucky.

"I think the general public believes there is a threat to the children," he said. "So, oh no, this is not over. It's just getting started."

On Tuesday, Cocke County Juvenile Referee C. Philip Owens granted custody of the children, ages 15 months to 9 years, to their father John Wayne "Punkin'" Brown Jr. of Parrottsville.

Brown's wife, Melinda, 28, died last August, two days after being bitten by a rattlesnake at a church service in Middlesboro, Ky. She refused treatment.

"No doubt, this is one of the toughest cases I have ever had," said Owens, who reviewed an investigation by the Department of Human Services that concluded Brown "did not exhibit anything psychologically that would not make him a proper parent."

A Tennessee Supreme Court decision gives a parent priority over any other custodian unless a

judge finds the children will suffer substantial harm in parental care.

In returning the children to Brown's permanent custody, Owens enjoined the minister from taking the children to churches where snakes are handled. The judge also ordered Brown not to keep snakes in his home, a frequent practice of those in the faith.

The Ashes had temporary custody of the children. The Cleveland couple was ordered to return the children to their father this week.

Ashe said he has hired a private investigator to dig into the events surrounding Melinda Brown's death. He said he intends to take that information to a Bell County grand jury.

"I don't care where he takes it," Brown said. "That doesn't trouble me, what they do, because all what they said were lies. They have not told the truth from the start, and I have right on my side."

Brown said he was glad the long battle was over.

"They talk about their loss but nobody wants to talk about my

loss," he said of the Ashes. "I lost a wife and a mother to my kids."

He denied forcing his wife to

handle snakes against her will, adding that she and Mrs. Ashe grew up in a snake-handling church.

Carbon monoxide may have killed five

CLEVELAND (AP) — Two adults and three children found dead in a house were apparently the victims of carbon monoxide poisoning, a fire official said.

"Right now we are 95 percent sure the cause was carbon monoxide," said fire Capt. Edward Norman. He said the Cuyahoga County coroner would determine the cause of death.

Norman said the victims had black soot around their mouths and noses, a sign of carbon-monoxide poisoning.

"We're sure they have been dead for at least a day, possibly two or three," he said.

The two adults were found in the living room and the children were found together in a bedroom about 8 p.m., Norman said.

Identities of the victims were not immediately released, but a police officer who would not give his name said the victims were a man, his three children and the man's girlfriend. The body of a dog also was found.

The victims were found after a neighbor called police.

"I just noticed there was nobody over there for couple of days, and the kids were usually outside playing," said Dave Mel-

ton, 30, who lived next door to the 1½-story frame house in the middle-class neighborhood.

He said he called police Thursday night after trying to reach the family for two days without getting a response.

"I had knocked on the door several times and tried phoning, but I couldn't get an answer," he said. "I could see that the lights were on and there was music playing. I just had a feeling something was wrong."

He said he had not seen the man since Monday or Tuesday, when he was shoveling snow.

"It's just a terrible thing," Melton said. "I just hope everybody checks their furnaces and prevents something like this from happening."

Police Lt. Don Meel spoke with reporters as the bodies were carried out.

"I'll tell you, I'm going out tomorrow and buy a detector for sure," Meel said, shaking his head.

Police knocked down the door to get inside. They said they noticed an odor of gas and that icicles had formed on the insides of the windows.

Supreme Court strikes down marriage doctrine

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP) — The state's high court has struck down a century-old law requiring husbands to pay for their wives' housing, food, clothing and medical bills.

Since the constitution demands "equality between the sexes, it follows that a husband can no longer be held liable for his wife's" debts, the Florida Supreme Court said Wednesday in a 5-2 decision.

Lawmakers should determine a state policy that supersedes the "doctrine of necessities," Chief Justice Stephen Grimes wrote for the court, which overturned the law after a series of conflicting decisions involving hospitals that sued to collect unpaid bills from patients' spouses.

The ruling also thwarts efforts to make wives responsible for debts incurred by their husbands.

The ruling stemmed from a

1993 lawsuit by the Southwest Florida Regional Medical Center in Fort Myers against Ken and Barbara Connor of Naples. The hospital performed cancer surgery on Ken Connor, 68, that cost nearly \$100,000.

When Connor, who was uninsured, could not afford to pay the entire bill immediately, the hospital sued to make his wife pay by extending the doctrine to the wife.

The court's precedent-setting ruling stops the hospital from trying to collect from Mrs. Connor, said Thomas Garlick, the couple's lawyer.

It prevents the hospital from pursuing her assets or any of the couple's joint assets to pay the bill, said Garlick.

"I feel that it's fair," said Mrs. Connor, who hasn't been able to work because her husband has suffered several relapses.





Films claim Golden Globe nominations

BEVERLY HILLS, Calif. (AP) — "Sense and Sensibility" collected a leading six nominations today for the Golden Globe Awards, and "The American President" earned the second most selections with five.

Nominated for best dramatic motion picture were "Sense and Sensibility," "Apollo 13," "Braveheart," "The Bridges of Madison County" and "Leaving Las Vegas."

Nominated for best musical or comic motion picture were "The American President," "Babe," "Get Shorty," "Sabrina" and "Toy Story."

Nominations for the 53rd annual awards were made by about 90 members of the Hollywood Foreign Press Association. The Globes often presage the Academy Awards. The awards, plus an honorary award for Sean Connery, will be presented Jan. 21 in a program broadcast by NBC.

Unlike the Oscars, the Golden Globes divides films into two categories, drama and musical-or-comedy. Nominated for best dramatic actor were Nicolas Cage for "Leaving Las Vegas," Richard Dreyfuss for "Mr. Holland's Opus," Anthony Hopkins for "Nixon," Ian McKellen for "Richard III" and Sean Penn for "Dead Man Walking."

The dramatic actress selections were Susan Sarandon for "Dead

Man Walking," Elisabeth Shue for "Leaving Las Vegas," Sharon Stone for "Casino," Meryl Streep for "The Bridges of Madison County" and Emma Thompson in "Sense and Sensibility."

Michael Douglas was among the nominees for best actor in a musical or comedy for "The American President." He faces Harrison Ford in "Sabrina," Steve Martin in "Father of the Bride II," Patrick Swayze for "To Wong Foo, Thanks for Everything! Julie Newmar" and John Travolta in "Get Shorty."

The musical or comic actress nominees were Annette Bening for "The American President," Sandra Bullock for "While You Were Sleeping," Toni Collette for "Muriel's Wedding," Nicole Kidman for "To Die For" and Vanessa Redgrave for "A Month By the Lake."

The Golden Globe voters snubbed two films that had been considered favorites for both Golden Globes and Academy Awards for best 1995 films: Oliver Stone's "Nixon" and Martin Scorsese's "Casino" both failed to be nominated for best dramatic movie.

Scorsese did get a nomination for best director, however. Stone did not. The other best director nominees were Mike Figgis for "Leaving Las Vegas," Mel Gibson for "Braveheart," Ron Howard for "Apollo 13," Ang Lee

for "Sense and Sensibility" and Rob Reiner for "The American President."

Named for best supporting actress were Anjelica Huston for "The Crossing Guard," Kathleen Quinlan for "Apollo 13," Kyra Sedgwick for "Something to Talk About," Mira Sorvino for "Mighty Aphrodite" and Kate Winslett for "Sense and Sensibility."

Nominated for best supporting actor were Ed Harris for "Apollo 13," John Leguizamo for "To Wong Foo, Thanks for Everything! Julie Newmar," Brad Pitt in "Twelve Monkeys," Tim Roth for "Rob Roy" and Kevin Spacey for "The Usual Suspects."

In nominations for television shows, the picks for best drama series were "Chicago Hope," "ER," "Murder One," "NYPD Blue" and "Party of Five."

The best comedy nominations were "Cybill," "Frasier," "Friends," "Mad About You" and "Seinfeld."

Man calls search 'illegal'

TRAM, Ky. (AP) — A black man has sued three eastern Kentucky deputies over what he claims was a racially motivated, illegal search, but a sheriff said Thursday that the suit is baseless.

Curtis Gardner of the Tram community in Floyd County claims the three deputies broke into his home without a warrant on Dec. 1 and confiscated three antique guns. He said the officers also conducted a road block in the area and searched a number of black people, calling them "boy" and other slang names.

The suit was filed Tuesday in Floyd Circuit Court against deputies Rick Thornbury, Steve Toy and Ricky Newsome. None of the men could be reached for comment Thursday.

But Sheriff Paul Hunt Thompson said the officers had a valid warrant to search Gardner's home for drugs and drug paraphernalia. The warrant shows officers seized some marijuana, pills, syringes, guns and other items.

"We don't break into people's homes," he said. He also denied there was a roadblock, but did say deputies arrested one man on a drunken-driving charge.

Gardner said a number of blacks from Ohio and Michigan were in town that night for a wake. He said he thinks the officers conducted the road block and search on the assumption that there must have been drug dealing going on with so many outside blacks around.

The suit seeks \$1 million in punitive damages and \$100,000 in general damages.

Final two men sentenced to life in prison

GREEN BAY, Wis. (AP) — Three years after paper mill worker Thomas Monfils was found dead at the bottom of a pulp vat, a 50-pound weight tied to his neck, the last of six co-workers were sentenced Wednesday to life prison terms for his murder.

Michael Hirn, 31, and Rey Moore, 49, are ineligible for parole until 2010, about 2 1/2 years beyond the minimum date under Wisconsin's life sentence law.

The James River Corp. workers were convicted in October of participating in the murder of Monfils, who vanished Nov. 21, 1992, after being accused of telling police that a fellow worker planned to steal some inexpensive electrical cord from the mill. Monfils was found in the vat the next day. An autopsy determined he was alive when thrown into the mud-like pulp.

The men say they're innocent. "If I would have been around when Thomas Monfils was being assaulted, I would have stopped it," Moore told Circuit Judge James Bayogoon.

Hirn said prosecutors "made me out to be a monster. I am not a monster."

The other defendants were sentenced last week to life terms, with different parole eligibility dates. Keith Kutska must serve 20 years, Dale Basten, 17, Michael Johnson, 15 and Michael Piaskowski, 13 1/2.

Prosecutors contend that Kutska obtained a tape-recorded call that Monfils anonymously made to police reporting that Kutska planned to steal the cord. Testimony showed Kutska played the tape repeatedly for workers and confronted Monfils with it.

Unemployment rate same in November

FRANKFORT, Ky. (AP) — Kentucky's unemployment rate remained at 5 percent in November, the Workforce Development Cabinet reported.

The number of Kentuckians with jobs increased by nearly 14,000 from October, but so did the number seeking work, the cabinet said Thursday in a monthly report.

Carlos Cracraft, the cabinet's chief labor market analyst, said November traditionally is a high-employment month. Schools are at full employment, holiday shopping is in full swing and tobacco markets open.

Courthouse lawn decorated

LEXINGTON, Va. (AP) — Someone decorated the Rockbridge County Courthouse's lawn with 53 red-handled toothbrushes, stuck in the grass in two rows: uniformly spaced, bristles facing out.

"There's a lot of wacky things that happen in this town, but this has to be on the top of the wacky list. Just for sheer oddness. And mystery," Doug Harwood, editor of the monthly magazine Rockbridge Advocate, said Wednesday.

The magazine often chronicles strange happenings in Lexington, home to two colleges with storied histories of mischief: Virginia

Military Institute and Washington and Lee College.

Harwood said people have been going out to look at the toothbrushes since they were discovered Tuesday. "But once we get there, it's kinda like looking at the cows. What can you say? 'Sure is a fine crop o' toothbrushes you got there, Homer. Think they're about ready for harvesting?'"

Circuit Court clerk Bruce Patterson said folks at the courthouse will leave the holiday-colored toothbrushes up through Christmas — in keeping with the season's spirit.

Girl with asthma sues for smoking in bathroom

TINLEY PARK, Ill. (AP) — A high school student with asthma is suing her school, claiming she could die because officials have failed to stop teachers and other students from smoking.

Heather Morrin, a junior at Tinley Park High School in this suburb southwest of Chicago, repeatedly encountered classmates smoking in the girls' bathroom, in the stairwell and on the school bus, the lawsuit claims.

"I'd start coughing and then I couldn't breathe," Miss Morrin said. "And it isn't only the stu-

dents smoking." Teachers smoke in the school office, she said.

The smoke triggered several severe asthma attacks that sent her to a hospital emergency room, and she now must take steroids and other medication, said her mother, Nadine. Miss Morrin also has missed about six weeks of school.

The lawsuit, seeking more than \$30,000 in damages, may be among the first tests of enforcement of a state law passed in July that prohibits smoking on school property.

Prosecutor helps woman who stole two avocados

INDEPENDENCE, Ore. (AP) — When the prosecutor found out why Maria Sofia Barajas stole two avocados from a grocery store, she not only dropped the charges — she helped Barajas raise money to pay off a debt.

Barajas and her husband, Juan, both migrant workers, have been struggling to pay for the funeral of their son, who died in July of heart disease at age 42, and to raise his 6-year-old boy.

The funeral bill left the Barajas with almost no money for food, and when the grandson begged Barajas for avocados at the store Oct. 4, she shoplifted them.

Daina Vitolins, Polk County deputy district attorney, learned of the problem when Barajas appeared in court Dec. 4. Vitolins dismissed the theft charges and started a trust fund 10 days ago

to raise the \$2,097 still owed for the funeral.

On Wednesday, Vitolins delivered a "paid-in-full" receipt to Barajas with \$1,638 still left in the trust account.

"The response has been incredibly overwhelming," Vitolins said.

"I don't meet that many nice people in my job," she said. "I see the worst part of people, and I get cynical."

Maria Elena Pena, who works at St. Patrick Catholic Church here, said dozens of people have dropped off donations for the family, including a marker for the son's grave, a Christmas tree, a promise to give Barajas' grandson a bicycle for Christmas, and a hearty supply of avocados.

"Every time I go to their home, she just cries with joy and gratefulness," Pena said.

Wildcats' Pitino wary of U of L's talented starters

LEXINGTON, Ky. (AP) — Although these may be difficult times for No. 25 Louisville, don't expect No. 4 Kentucky to overlook its biggest rival.

"I wasn't comfortable against Massachusetts, and I'm not comfortable against U of L," Kentucky coach Rick Pitino said of Saturday's nationally televised game in Rupp Arena. "I think U of L's first unit can play with Massachusetts."

dealt Kentucky (6-1) its only loss of the season, scoring a 92-82 victory in the Great Eight on Nov. 28. Kentucky was ranked No. 1 at the time.

Louisville (7-3) recently learned that forwards Jason Osborne and Alex Sanders failed to meet academic eligibility. And the school is also undertaking an internal investigation of its basketball program for possible NCAA violations.

"I think this team has kept tremendous focus on the job at hand because they've had one problem after another, and I think they've done a great job of concentrating what's important, and that's on the basketball court," Kentucky coach Rick Pitino said of Louisville.

Louisville has won four of its last five games, including an 81-72 victory over Murray State on Wednesday night. The Cardinals

are shooting 53 percent from the field, including 38 percent from 3-point range.

"They take great shots and we have our hands full defensively because Samaki Walker is certainly in the same league with (Massachusetts') Marcus Camby," Pitino said of Louisville's 6-foot-9 sophomore center.

Walker is shooting 71 percent from the field while averaging 16.1 points and 8.4 rebounds. In last year's 88-86 victory over Kentucky, he recorded the only triple-double in the school's history with 14 points, 10 rebounds and 11 blocked shots.

Brewery will sell Redbirds to lawyer

Hanser-led group to purchase Cards

ST. LOUIS (AP) — Anheuser-Busch announced Friday it has agreed to sell the St. Louis Cardinals for \$150 million to a group of investors who say they will keep the team in the city.

The deal still must be approved by Major League Baseball, and the new owners, led by St. Louis lawyer Fred Hanser, expect to close the deal Feb. 15.

"We can't wait for spring training, we can't wait to get started," Hanser said. "Let's play ball!"

The deal includes Busch Stadium and its parking garages. The stadium will keep the name, officials said.

In addition to Hanser, the group includes Andrew Baur, president of Southwest Bank in St. Louis, and William DeWitt Jr., a Cincinnati businessman who has owned interests in the Baltimore Orioles, Texas Rangers and the Cincinnati Reds. DeWitt's father once owned the St. Louis Browns and later the Reds.

Anheuser-Busch announced in October it wanted to sell the team, which it has owned since 1953, to focus more on its core businesses. The company claimed the Cardinals lost \$12 million in 1995.

Anheuser-Busch is the world's largest brewer. It also owns Busch Gardens, a theme park in Tampa, Fla., and the Sea World chain.

The Hanser group was one of several that expressed interest in buying the team. By Thursday, there was no evidence of remaining competition.

Cardinals President Mark Lamping said Thursday he was excited about the prospect.

"With their significant ties and roots to St. Louis and St. Louis baseball history, this would make an excellent group," Lamping said.

Hanser said the new group hopes to sign Lamping to a multiyear contract.

Walker cleared for UK game; car parked by U of L officials

LOUISVILLE, Ky. (AP) — Louisville basketball player Samaki Walker has been cleared to play Saturday against Kentucky but the university is still investigating circumstances of his receipt of a car, a school official said Friday.

Walker's father, John Walker, bought a 1991 Honda Accord from Corporate Insurance Services Inc., according to Jefferson County registration records obtained by The Courier-Journal. The company's president is Anthony Huff, who was Samaki Walker's summer employer.

Louisville center Samaki Walker will play at UK today, but two Cardinal teammates won't.

The car originally was owned by David L. Huff, Anthony Huff's brother and co-worker. The title was transferred to the business on Oct. 9, 1992, according to the registration records.

John Walker's purchase of the car and Samaki's use of it could be a violation of the NCAA's extra-benefit rule, the Louisville newspaper reported Friday.

The title to the Accord was surrendered to John Walker on Dec. 6, but Samaki Walker was believed to already have been driving the car for several months, the Louisville newspaper reported.

Ray Nystrand, the University of Louisville's assistant to the president for athletics who is overseeing the school's basketball probe, said at a news conference Friday that the situation first

came to the university's attention after several parking violations were traced to Walker's car.

Nystrand said the school filed an eligibility appeal to the NCAA Thursday. The appeal was subsequently granted, paving the way for Walker to take the court against the fourth-ranked Wildcats.

"It had to do with repayment for some parking tickets, and he made that payment," Nystrand said. "Because those tickets had been paid initially by the previous owner of the vehicle (Huff), we had to demonstrate that he (Walker) made restoration for that, and he did in fact do it."

However, Nystrand said the ruling does not end the school's inquiry.

Coach's habits questioned

OU players questioned about Schnellenberger's drinking, paper reports

TULSA, Okla. (AP) — University of Oklahoma athletic compliance officer Larry Naifeh interviewed players and athletic department personnel about Howard Schnellenberger's personal habits in the days before the coach abruptly resigned, the Tulsa World reported Friday.

The newspaper said two high level sources who spoke on condition of anonymity confirmed the interviews, which included questions about the consumption of alcohol on university property and while representing the school in official business.

Schnellenberger resigned Monday


after a year and two days as coach of the Sooners.

The newspaper said Naifeh reportedly spoke with a player who said he smelled alcohol on Schnellenberger's breath during a university-related function. It said athletic director Donnie Duncan confronted Schnellenberger about the accusation Sunday.

The newspaper said an atmosphere existed in the meeting with Duncan that would have left no choice but for Schnellenberger to step down.

A message left on Schnellenberger's answering machine at his home in Norman was not immediately returned Friday. He has maintained his silence since issuing a videotaped statement announcing his resignation.

Murray loses to Daviess

Panthers early rally dumps Tigers 72-52

MORGANFIELD — Daviess County used a 20-0 run in the first quarter to pull away from Murray High and eliminate the Tigers from the Union County Classic with a 72-52 semifinal win Friday night.

Murray (2-5) tied the game at 10-10 early in the first quarter, but Daviess (4-3) used a full-court press to extend the lead to 30-10.

Daviess, which shot 18-for-24 (75 percent) in the first half, outscored the Tigers 34-7 from the time the game was tied to lead 44-17 at halftime.

For the second straight night Jason West led Murray in scoring, tossing in 17 points. Ethan Crum added 13 for the Tigers, who shot 21-of-65 from the field and were outrebounded 21-16 by the taller Panthers.

Murray outscored Daviess 26-11 in the fourth quarter.

Next up for the Tigers is a trip to the Centrafrica Tournament where they will meet East St. Louis (Ill.) in the first round on Wednesday.

Temple knocks off No. 1 Kansas 74-66

EAST RUTHERFORD, N.J. (AP) — Temple scored the first 10 points of overtime and beat top-ranked Kansas 74-66 Friday night, nine days after beating then-No. 2 Villanova.

The Owls (3-4) lost to No. 9 Cincinnati in between the wins over Nos. 1 and 2 and things didn't look too good for them

against the Jayhawks (7-1) in the opening game of the inaugural Jimmy V Classic at the Meadowlands.

Jerod Haase of Kansas was at the free throw line with 8.2 seconds left in regulation and the score 56-56. He was 10-for-10 from the line until then, but missed both. Temple didn't even

get a shot off, but it didn't matter.

Kansas, which had shot horribly throughout regulation against Temple's 2-3 zone, couldn't get any worse in the overtime. The Jayhawks missed their five shots and by the time they got on the board with 1:22 left, Temple had a 66-56 lead.

Kansas finished 20-for-71 from the field (28 percent), well off its 49 percent season mark.

Mark Jackson had a career-high 31 points and 12 rebounds for the Owls and he had four of the opening points in the extra session.

INDIANAPOLIS (AP) — Mark Jackson needed less than nine minutes to double his scoring and stage a fourth quarter rescue for the Indiana Pacers. Jackson scored 10 of his 20 points in the final quarter Friday night to power the Pacers to a 90-79 victory over the struggling Dallas Mavericks.

Popeye Jones, pulling down a team-high nine rebounds, came back from one of his weakest games of the season — six points in a 114-101 loss to the Chicago Bulls — to score 17 points for the Mavericks, a total matched by teammate Tony Dumas.

Shaq leads Magic over N.Y.

O'Neal tops Ewing with game-high 28 in 111-90 Magic win

ORLANDO, Fla. (AP) — Shaquille O'Neal got the better of Patrick Ewing and that almost always bodes well for the Orlando Magic against the New York Knicks.

The defending NBA scoring champion had 28 points, 12 rebounds and six blocks to win another matchup between the All-Star centers and lead the Magic to a 111-90 victory Friday night.

In four games since returning from a thumb injury that sidelined him the first six weeks of the season, O'Neal has averaged

29 points and just under 10 rebounds in helping Orlando to a 3-1 record.

He had only eight points after halftime but broke a 16-minute drought to help the Magic hold off the Knicks, who fell behind by 19 in the first quarter and never got closer than 14 the rest of the way.

"I had a pretty good first half," said O'Neal, who made 12 of 24 shots. "In the second half I missed a lot of shots. But team-wise, we played well. We came out and really set the pace, played good defense and won the game."

Dennis Scott had 26 points, 11 in the Magic's 37-point first quarter, and Anfernee Hardaway added 19 as Orlando extended the league's longest home winning streak to 21 games, including 14

this season.

Derek Harper led the Knicks with 21 points, 12 in the fourth quarter when he single-handedly kept New York in the game until O'Neal made a pair of free throws for a 90-74 Orlando lead with 7:13 to go.

Ewing made just 5 of 20 shots and finished with 13 points, nine rebounds and four blocks. The Knicks shot just 39 percent and only got seven points from John Starks.

Ewing said he was disappointed in New York's effort in the first meeting of the season between the top contenders in the Atlantic Division.

"They're a great team, but we didn't come out and play like we were a good team, too," Ewing said. "We just didn't play. That's it."

points, while forward Alvin Sims contributes 14.9.

"We're not quite as physical right now as we'd like to be," Crum said. "We still can play well. We're still a competitive team."

While Walker is an imposing presence around the basket, Louisville's Denny Crum is concerned about Kentucky's frontcourt that features Mark Pope and Walter McCarty, both 6-10, and 6-8 Antoine Walker.

"They are physically a lot better than we are," he said. "They have more depth and more size than we do."

Kentucky, which is riding a five-game winning streak, has been outrebounding opponents by seven a game and leads the Southeastern Conference with 12.5 steals.

"They are deserving of their No. 1 ranking in the preseason

and they could be there at the end of the season," said Louisville forward Brian Kiser. "We can't let the fact that they're stacked intimidate us."

Kentucky has five players scoring in double figures, led by Walker with 16.3 and Tony Delk with 15.3. The Wildcats are averaging 91.1 points while giving up 73.

Kentucky's bench also has been productive, averaging 30.6 points, 13.3 rebounds and 10.0 rebounds.

"We know it's going to be really tough," Crum said. "We intend to go play as hard as we can play and whatever happens we'll go on with the rest of our season."

And Kentucky will be ready. "I know it's going to be a war and great game," said Kentucky guard Anthony Epps. "I'm looking forward to going out and having fun."

"We're still looking into the nature of the transaction," he said.

The university has been conducting an internal investigation of its basketball program for several months with the help of a law firm in Syracuse, N.Y. Nystrand said a comprehensive report of the internal investigation could be finished by early January.

"The trade-off for being thorough is time," said Nystrand. "No one wants to get this finished as fast as we do."

Walker did not start Louisville's 81-72 win over Murray State Wednesday. He entered the game late in the first half but radio reports said Walker was suffering from an ankle or back injury.

But Nystrand said there was some question as to whether Walker was eligible Wednesday in lieu of the possible NCAA violations.

This is the second Huff vehicle driven by Samaki Walker that has led to school and NCAA scrutiny. The player's extensive use of a Ford Explorer last summer as part of his employment at another Huff firm, North American Trucking Association, was deemed a violation of NCAA rules and led to a two-game suspension at the start of this season.

Nystrand said the Huffs are in no way affiliated with the university as boosters or in other capacities. If the school determines that a violation occurred, Walker's future eligibility could be jeopardized, the newspaper reported.

Schnellenberger said his decision had nothing to do with "inaccurate reports or hurtful rumors that often accompany head coaches and top programs."

Duncan was out of the office and not available for comment. Duncan told the World on Thursday that he could not comment on personnel matters.

"I cannot comment on anything related to personnel," Naifeh said. "I won't confirm or deny anything."

Schnellenberger has disputed the allegations of drinking on the job, the newspaper said. The coach said last week that he was aware of rumors about himself.

"Some of the rumors were ridiculous and not worth looking into," one of the newspaper's sources said. "Others were serious enough that they required looking into. You have an obligation to if any of this is true. Most of the time, the rumors were not true, but some were. The process was done very clearly to separate fact from fiction."



more than likely. I haven't heard much news on sauger fishermen lately either, but they are usually easier to find and catch than anything else.

Gary Crass said he caught a limit before the cold front hit, but they were all holding in one little spot.

Water conditions are still good with a slight rise in elevation. The temperature is near 44 degrees and

that is ideal for catching sauger. The northwest wind will be a big factor on fishing the main lake. Hopefully, we can work some banks which are protected.

Bass are slow but can be caught on crankbaits, spinnerbaits and jigs worked slowly close to deep cover. They probably will suspend also, so be prepared to do a little finesse fishing!

Catfish are moving and biting well near the river channel. Minnows are the best bait since that is a catfish's main diet anyway. Blood baits or stink baits don't do much good in cold water, but a live nightcrawler might be OK too.

Bluegill will take a waxworm or mealworm and nightcrawler if you can locate them. They may be a little deep too.

Trees can find uses after holidays

HENDERSON, Ky. (AP) — Getting a Christmas tree has changed since I was a boy a half-century ago, but the end of the season still brings the same question: What can we do with the tree now?

Locating and cutting the holiday tree was once as much a part of the season as decorating and gift giving. Often the whole family would walk the countryside and search for the perfect specimen.

Lots of trees looked great from a distance, but on closer examination most turned out to have a flat side or a thin side or were otherwise imperfect.

Eventually, the best of the crop — it was invariably a cedar tree

— went home with us across the fields to make the season bright.

Today, most of us buy trees from a regular retailer or a charitable organization, but regardless of their origin, natural-cut trees still eventually have to be disposed of.

The problem can be avoided by buying a live tree which finds a place in the yard later. But even cut trees don't have to wind up on the curb waiting for the trash collector; they, too, can find new careers after Christmas.

Most of the cedars we dragged home ended up either on the woodpile or in a nearby gully by Jan. 1. This not only cleared the house so we could get a running start into the New Year, but it also did a bit to heat the house or to stop erosion and provide wild-

life cover. These plans still work.

But if you're short on fireplaces, wood burning stoves, and gullies, a retired tree makes a great bird feeder and will last the rest of the winter. The best idea is to set the butt of the tree on the ground and tie the top of the evergreen to an overhanging tree limb.

That way you don't need a tree base and the evergreen will stand up to the wind and neighborhood dogs if they're attracted to some of the birds' goodies such as beef suet or pine cones smeared with peanut butter.

Bird seed poured on the top of the tree will sift to every level, including the ground, and serve most seed-eating species.

When bird-feeding season ends, the tree can be relegated to

a corner of the yard or to a fence row to serve as cover for birds and other small wildlife.

Farsighted anglers sometimes use discarded trees to build fish attractors. The evergreens are attached to concrete blocks and sunk in a likely spot. The thick foliage serves as natural cover for insects and other small creatures and attract bait fish. The cover and the concentrated prey then bring in game fish.

The same idea works on land, too. A retired Christmas tree or a stack of them creates a brush pile beloved of rabbits, quail, and songbirds.

And, these brush piles will eventually return to the soil and help produce Christmas trees for many a future holiday.



Agriculture department gives farmers some relief

WASHINGTON (AP) — Farmers may have as long as three years to return \$1.7 billion in advance subsidy payments that were made before corn and wheat prices skyrocketed.

Agriculture Secretary Dan Glickman said Wednesday his department would announce the relief as early as this week. Senate Democrats said the Agriculture Department would give farmers up to three years to repay the money.

The refunds have been a selling point for the Republican farm plan, contained in a larger budget-balancing bill being negotiated between the Clinton administration and congressional Republicans.

The GOP-passed plan, which would give farmers lump-sum payments that decline over seven years, won farmer support partly because it will let growers deduct the refunds from their next year.

Glickman and other Democrats have criticized the Republican plan, engineered by Rep. Pat Roberts, R-Kan., chairman of the House Agriculture Committee, for rewarding farmers when crop prices are high.

Subsidies traditionally fall when crop prices rise. The Republican plan would end the traditional subsidies and the red tape surrounding them, using the lump-sum payments to ease the switch.

A House Agriculture Committee aide, Tom Hemmer, said Glickman's announcement on repayments undercut Democratic arguments. USDA is acknowledging that "many farmers, despite high prices, are experiencing extreme financial difficulties this year," he said.

Most farm programs end Dec. 31, putting pressure on Congress to either agree or extend existing programs. At this point, even Democrats are feuding among themselves.

Fiscally conservative Democrats from the House said Wednesday that some liberal Midwestern senators, including Minority Leader Tom Daschle, D-S.D., and Sen. Byron Dorgan, D-N.D., one of the negotiators, were hindering an agreement.

Rep. Collin Peterson of Minnesota, a leader of the conservative Democrats, said that if senators

accepted the Republican plan in principle, they could negotiate additional price protections for their farmers.

"We're in a position to get the safety net for agriculture," Peterson told reporters.

Dorgan countered that support for the proposal is shallow — the House Agriculture Committee never passed it, and no one's had a chance to debate it.

The Senate Democrats want to base subsidies on the difference between higher domestic prices and lower world prices. Critics say the proposal could drive up production and government payments.

Glickman said he has talked to Roberts about blending in parts of the Senate Democratic proposals and some of his own with the Republican plan. The secretary wants to see some of the money diverted in high-crop-price years toward crop insurance, conservation and rural water and sewer projects.

"This is a complicated thing to do," he acknowledged.

In another politically popular move, Glickman said he will appoint a commission as early as next month to investigate monopoly control of the meatpacking industry and its impact on farm prices. He also wants to look at concentration in the grain and rail industries.

Wolf pup killed in Yellowstone

YELLOWSTONE NATIONAL PARK, Wyo. (AP) — A delivery vehicle struck and killed an 8-month-old male wolf pup born to one of the Canadian wolves released into the park this year to increase the population, officials said.

"This is a very unfortunate incident because the loss of any animal from this tiny population is a great loss to the restoration program," park superintendent Mike Finley said.

The pup was healthy and weighed 65 pounds when it was struck Tuesday near the Buffalo Ranch in Yellowstone National Park's Lamar Valley, Finley said.

The mother, one of 14 Canadian wolves released as part of the federal government's reintroduction program, had given birth to eight pups in April near Red Lodge, Mont. They were moved back into the park in May after her mate was illegally killed.

The pups were placed in a fenced enclosure and biologists brought them food until they were released in October. Only one other wolf pup was born in Yellowstone this year.

Finley said no action was anticipated against the driver.

Chinese scientists find river dolphin

BEIJING (AP) — After searching for three years, researchers have found one of the nearly extinct freshwater dolphins of the Yangtze River.

The 10-year-old, 7½-foot long female Baiji dolphin was captured Tuesday near the central industrial city of Wuhan and placed under observation in a dolphin reserve along the river, the China Daily reported today.

The Baiji (white fin) dolphins appeared 25 million years ago. Scientists value them as an important subject for the study of evolution and the development of mammals.

China has only one other Baiji dolphin in captivity, a male named Qiqi (pronounced chee-chee).

Chances the pair will mate and produce offspring are slim. Qiqi, who has been alone swimming circles around a 10-yard-diameter pool for 10 years, is 18, somewhat old for successful reproduction, the report said.

Fewer than 100 of this ancient

species of dolphins are believed to remain in the Yangtze, China's longest river. With such small numbers remaining, it will be very difficult to save them from extinction, the official Beijing Review said in a report earlier this year.

The newspaper quoted experts as saying the dolphins cannot survive 25 more years at the present rate of decline.

The Baiji dolphin lives only in the heavily polluted middle and lower reaches of the Yangtze River. In this densely populated area, fertilizers and pesticides run off from the fields and waste spews from factories lining the river. In some places, its dark waters are frothy with pollution.

The dolphin also is threatened

by a decline of fish stocks, increasing numbers of motor boats, and fishermen who catch them illegally or accidentally.

The giant hydroelectric dams on the Yangtze pose another threat. The river already is blocked by the Gezhouba dam in its middle reaches in Hubei province. The world's largest hydroelectric project is being built near Gezhouba in the Three Gorges.

The newspaper held out some hope for the Baiji, because Qiqi finally has a chance to mate.

"Thank heaven, our darling boy will now have a mate and possibly offspring to escape extinction," the report quoted an unidentified expert as saying.

The number of Baiji dolphins fell drastically from 6,000 in the

1950s to 400 in 1984. Last year, the Chinese estimated that fewer than 100 remain.





DEAR DR. GOTT: I recently learned that the boy my daughter is dating has a chemical imbalance due to food allergies. His mother says he must avoid foods with preservatives in them. My mother, on the other hand, feels he is mentally ill. He is very moody, short-tempered and difficult to get along with. Could such a chemical imbalance cause symptoms of emotional instability?

DEAR READER: I don't want to get in the middle of the inter-generational shouting match about whether your daughter's boyfriend's behavior is or is not governed by food additives.

I tend to think not, but some food allergies, notably those involving monosodium glutamate, can cause people to become ill with headaches, weakness, sweating, palpitations, and other symptoms. I suppose you could call this a chemical imbalance, but this is different from the chemical imbalances often associated with depression and related conditions. In

all fairness, I doubt that a food reaction would explain away really bizarre behavior.

I think that your daughter ought to proceed with great caution. Food sensitivity or not, her boyfriend is responsible for his own behavior and, perhaps, should be tested by an allergist. If his behavior remains inappropriate and he appears unstable, she'd do better playing the field and leaving him to another woman who doesn't mind putting up with his shenanigans.

DEAR DR. GOTT: Please discuss lichen planus. Is there any medication to hasten its demise?

DEAR READER: This recurring, itchy skin disease, of unknown cause, rarely affects children. The initial attack consists of discrete lesions that

eventually coalesce into larger, rough, inflamed patches that may last weeks or months, disappear and recur without warning.

The condition, which is harmless, is diagnosed by its appearance — and by biopsy.

Mild cases require no therapy. For more troublesome lichen planus, cortisone cream is beneficial.


In advanced cases the presence of severe itching may necessitate cortisone by mouth.

In my opinion, patients with lichen planus should be examined and treated by dermatologists.





TODAY IN HISTORY

Today is Saturday, Dec. 23, the 357th day of 1995. There are eight days left in the year.

Today's Highlight in History:

On Dec. 23, 1823, the poem "A Visit from St. Nicholas" by Clement C. Moore ("Twas the night before Christmas...") was published anonymously in the "Troy (New York) Sentinel."

In 1941, during World War II, American forces on Wake Island surrendered to the Japanese.

In 1947, the transistor was invented by Walter H. Brattain, John Bardeen and William Shockley of Bell Laboratories.

In 1948, former Japanese premier Hideki Tojo and six other Japanese war leaders were executed in Tokyo.

In 1968, 82 crew members of the U.S. intelligence ship Pueblo were released by North Korea, 11 months after they had been captured by the Communists.

In 1975, Richard S. Welch, the Central Intelligence Agency station chief in Athens, was shot and killed outside his home.

lead and cashed the queen of hearts,

Trezel made the first of several good

plays when he had the foresight to

play dummy's ten on the queen. Next

he led a heart to the king and cashed the king of spades.

After cashing the queen of diamonds, Trezel returned a trump and took the marked finesse of the nine.

He then played the ace of hearts, discarding the king of diamonds from dummy, followed by the ace of spades, discarding the ace of diamonds from dummy.

Trezel next conceded the ten of diamonds to West's jack, and that was the end of the hand. Declarer won the rest, since he had three diamond tricks and a trump left.

All of these plays turned out to be necessary for the contract to be made.

If Trezel had neglected to unblock the ten of hearts at trick two he would have been defeated. Similarly, if he had failed to cash one of dummy's high diamonds, as he did, he would also have gone down.

And finally, if he had not discarded the A-K of diamonds when he did, he would have made only three diamond tricks instead of the four he needed, and again would have failed.

The unblocking plays in diamonds were a safety measure to guard against a possible 4-1 diamond break.

Trezel's plays were all logical enough, but they were of the type that most players would be more apt to think of after the play of the hand than during it.

Charles claims he won't remarry after divorce

LONDON (AP) — Determined to be king, Charles says he doesn't plan to remarry after a divorce. Friends of his longtime love are quoted as saying she will stand by him as his uncrowned queen. So where does that leave Diana?

Fed up with the public bickering between the prince and princess, Queen Elizabeth II has urged them to divorce and be

quick about it. The 34-year-old princess is not known to have replied to her mother-in-law's demand. But she is known to be angling for a job as a roving goodwill ambassador.

In a television interview last month in which she spoke of her husband's adultery, her emotional problems and anger with the palace, she made a bid for an ambassador's role. And she has

been talking with royal officials about formalizing her future role.

Just hours before Buckingham Palace confirmed on Wednesday that the queen had had enough of the soured royal marriage, Diana met with Prime Minister John Major. She is thought to have discussed her future with Major, but no outcome was announced.

Daily Mail reporter Richard Kay, Diana's closest press confidant, wrote today that she's ultimately unlikely to resist the queen's wish.

But he said Diana is determined there will be no divorce until her status is assured, and she holds an ace — by law, Charles can't divorce her without her consent until they have lived apart five years. So far, they've been separated for three years.

Kay quoted an unidentified friend of Diana's as saying the princess "won't be pushed" and is "very calm."

The queen's patience with public backbiting between Charles and Diana snapped after the princess, in the Nov. 20 BBC interview, questioned her husband's suitability to be king.

In that same interview, Diana told BBC she did not want a divorce but added: "I await my husband's decision of which way we are all going to go." She said she did not intend to "go quietly."

Diana's lawyer, Lord Mishcon, is on holiday until the New Year. Kay said this provided her with a perfect excuse for not replying to the queen, who sent a letter to her and Charles that said "an early divorce is desirable."

Rodney Barker, a constitutional law expert, said although Diana would automatically be barred from becoming queen in the event of divorce, the palace might let her keep the title of princess.

On terms of a divorce settlement for Diana, The Sun quoted an unidentified senior palace source as saying: "Some people are talking about a 15 million pounds (\$23 million) settlement. But that is simply not on. The queen would have to find most of that money and she is not prepared to do so."

The source said Diana would get one-third of Charles' \$4.5

million annual income.

Charles has told Diana he agrees they should divorce soon, a palace spokesman said.

On Thursday, the 47-year-old prince said he has no plans to remarry after divorcing Diana, his wife of 14 years. His statement was greeted with relief by the Church of England, which frowns on divorced people remarrying.

The British monarch is temporal head of the Church of England. Some bishops were appalled at the prospect of a divorced heir to the throne seeking to marry

Camilla Parker Bowles, the divorced mother of two whom Diana blames for the break-up of the royal marriage.

At The Sun newspaper, unidentified friends of Mrs. Parker Bowles were quoted today as saying she'll stand by him as his "uncrowned queen."

The Sun quoted the friends as saying that the 48-year-old Mrs. Parker Bowles has told them: "I will always be there for the Prince of Wales although I will never be his wife. I want nothing more than to see him on the throne" after his 69-year-old mother dies.

Vote splits House along party lines

LOUISVILLE Ky. (AP) — Kentucky members of the U.S. House split along party lines in a vote Thursday on a House-Senate compromise bill to overhaul the welfare system. The measure was approved in a 245-178 roll call vote.

A "yes" vote was a vote to approve the bill.

Voting "yes" were Republicans Jim Bunning, Ron Lewis, Hal Rogers and Ed Whitfield. Voting no were the Kentucky delegation's two Democrats — Scotty Baesler and Mike Ward.


