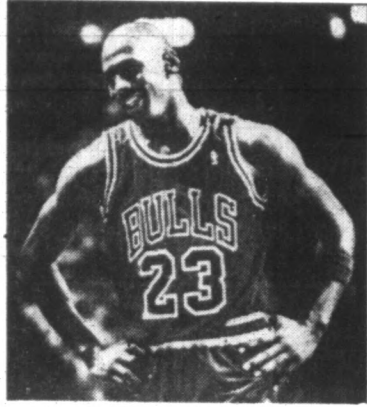

Two killed in area wreck

GAGE, Ky. (AP) — Two people were killed and three were injured in a two-vehicle wreck in Ballard County, Kentucky State Police said.

Sabrina Meyer, 18, of Kevil, was eastbound on Kentucky 286 near Gage and crossed the center line, police said. Meyer's car struck a westbound pickup truck driven by Loarn Shuemaker, 71, of Cairo, Ill., head-on. The accident occurred about 3:15 p.m. CDT Friday.

Meyer died en route to Lourdes Hospital in Paducah, police said. Shuemaker's wife, Betty, 73, died instantly in the collision.

Also in the car with Meyer were her cousin, Melissa Traylor, 18, of Kevil, and Meyer's daughter, 1-year-old Grace Yarbrough.

Traylor, Shuemaker and the baby were taken to Lourdes and were in serious condition.

Kentucky 286 was closed for much of the afternoon and evening.

Chancellor dies

PRINCETON, N.J. (AP) — John Chancellor, one of the nation's pioneers in television journalism who interviewed every president since Harry S. Truman and reported from more than 50 foreign countries, has died of cancer.

Chancellor, who was treated for stomach cancer two years ago, died Friday at his home here, said NBC spokeswoman Beth Comstock. He would have been 69 on Sunday.

Chancellor spent more than 40 years at NBC.

Kerns family struggles to help daughter

Just by looking at the Kerns family, it is almost impossible to see the turmoil that has taken place during the past six years.

Yet a conversation with Tracie Kerns is all it takes to realize that this is a family with a survival instinct, determined to play the cards dealt by fate.

When Steve and Tracie Kerns had their first daughter, Brynn, she was a healthy baby. Three and a half years later, all that changed when she developed leukemia.

"She took chemotherapy and the medication caused massive brain damage and seizures,"

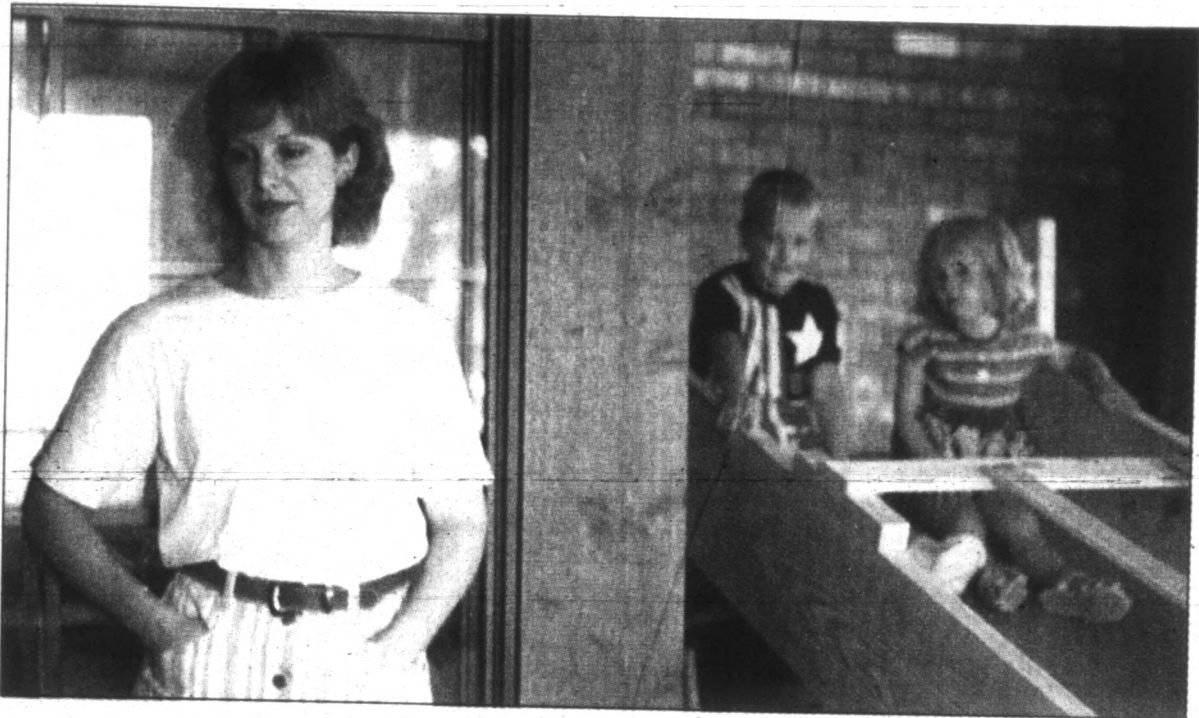
Kerns said. "She started regressing gradually and she is now on the level of a 12 month old."

The family moved to Murray from Texas when Brynn started regressing.

At age 9, Brynn looks like a healthy youngster. She is fully mobile and full of energy.

But there is something missing. In order to regain the skills that were lost because of the brain damage, her parents are willing to do and try anything.

"Once we stopped the chemotherapy, it took awhile for it to get out of her system," Kerns said. "We've had her all over the eastern part of the United States to see doctors. We have tried

every drug available, put her on a special diet and this program that we are on now is our last chance."

The Kerns turned to the Institute for the Achievement of

Human Potential in Philadelphia for assistance.

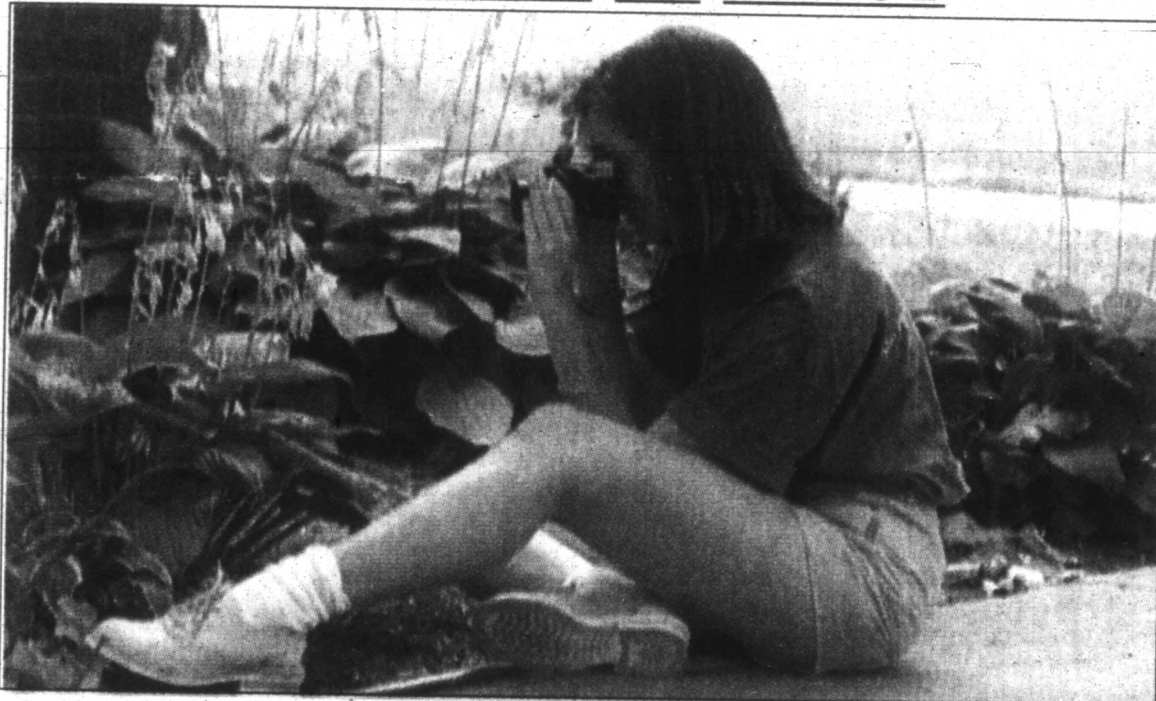
"We actually heard about the institute 2½ years ago when we saw a commercial about it on television," Kerns said. "We were

scheduled to take her two years ago, but she ended up in the hospital."

Complicating the situation is

Suit filed in MSU fire

The state Finance Administration Cabinet and Murray State University have filed a lawsuit seeking damages incurred when a fire all but destroyed the school's fine arts annex in July 1994.

The suit was filed against Progressive Constructors, Inc., of Princeton and Presley, Inc., of Paducah who were hired in June 1994 by the state to renovate the school's facility.

The lawsuit seeks payment for damages to the structure and expenses for cleanup and rental of additional space for class instruction.

An exact figure sought by the lawsuit filed Friday in Calloway County was not listed. Estimates place it at approximately \$1.5 million based on emergency money allocated by the state at the time of the blaze.

The \$3.5 million project was supposed to be completed by July 1995.

The fire, which was reported about 6 p.m. July 15, 1994, put the project another year behind schedule.

The annex, which houses classrooms, a recital hall and practice rooms, is connected to the six-story Price Doyle Fine Arts Center through an enclosed hallway.

The fire gutted the annex and caused extensive smoke, water and other damage to the entire Price Doyle Fine Arts Center and Lovett Auditorium.

According to Murray Fire Chief Pat Scott, the fire was the largest multi-story blaze in the city's history and the hardest he ever fought.

Bertha batters Carolina coast

MOREHEAD CITY, N.C. (AP) — A weakened Bertha plowed north into Virginia today after crashing across North Carolina's coast and damaging what might have been a peak summer weekend in the Carolinas.

"Losing one day in July is an economic disaster," said John Bone, executive vice president of the Outer Banks Chamber of Commerce.

Hurricane Bertha raked North Carolina's coastline Friday with winds gusting to 118 mph, pushing surging water over sand dunes and washing out beaches and piers, toppling trees and power lines and submerging scores of homes in seawater. About 250,000 vacationers abandoned beaches for safer land.

But by early today, Bertha was downgraded to a tropical storm, its top sustained winds having dropped to 44 mph. As of 3 a.m., the storm was about 45 miles southwest of Norfolk, Va., and quickly weakening as it aimed for Chesapeake Bay.

Torrential rain and wind gusts battered boarded up oceanfront cottages and businesses in Virginia Beach early today.

Almost 5 inches of rain fell before midnight along Virginia's eastern shore and a tornado touched down in Smithfield, Va., damaging 15 to 16 homes along a half-mile path 100 yards wide, the National Weather Service said.

In North Carolina, almost 400,000 were still without power.

Project Vision sends inner-city teens to MSU

MURRAY, Ky. (AP) — Inner-city teen-agers are sampling college life this summer, spending a week at Murray State University under a program that could eventually earn them scholarships.

The group of about 30 attend sessions in which professors

explain career options in various fields and provide tips on such things as resume building, public speaking and business etiquette.

In addition, Murray has arranged trips to an amusement park, swimming pools and theaters. There also are plenty of

cheeseburgers and onion rings in the cafeteria for the youths.

Project Vision was born in 1992 when the organizers targeted several dozen disadvantaged youths and their parents or guardians and put this offer on the table:

If they agreed to participate in a seven-year program to improve their living and academic skills, and if their grades were solid enough to secure admission to college or a vocational school, Project Vision would foot the bill.

The \$2.2 million price tag is being paid by a judgment in a lawsuit brought by Louisville lawyer (and now state Supreme Court Justice) Nick King, who was injured when a shotgun blew

Couple finds therapy successful for child

Almost a year ago, Mackenzie Brooke Cowart began treatment for a moderate brain injury.

Her parents, Chris and Crystal Cowart, found the Institute for the Achievement of Human Potential in Philadelphia after reading books from the Calloway County Public Library.

At that time, Mackenzie was 14 months old and had not mastered the skills required for crawling. In addition, she had not been able to develop the movements required for eating and had to be fed with a tube.

The Cowarts had been to leading neurologists, but no one could tell them the cause of Mackenzie's brain injury. All they learned was that there were some small calcium deposits in her brain.

Now, after spending almost 12

months following the program suggested by the institute, the Cowarts have been able to see some progress.

"She's doing really well," Chris Cowart said. "She's crawling now, but we are still patterning her."

Patterning involves placing her on a table and one person turns her head while a person on each side of the table moves her arms and legs.

"She is now sucking from a bottle, but the institute wants her to weigh 25 pounds before removing the tube so we are still putting formula in it," he said. "She is also sitting up."

At 2 years old, Mackenzie has already made much progress.

"There were 30 kids in her group and when we went back for evaluation, she was the second highest in the number of improvements," Cowart said.

"She's like a different child." She is now on an extensive treatment program that started in February.

"Her biggest problem is respiratory and we are concentrating on that now," he said. "Her mobility will come in time."

The Cowarts also have a 3-month-old son named Corey.

"We are using some of the techniques on him to help him get his mobility," Cowart said. "He will take it in 10 times faster."

The Cowarts are especially thankful for all the volunteers who assisted in the patterning activity. They are still seeking people to help, even if it is simply to watch Corey.

"We have had a lot of help," he said. "This therapy works. It will turn your whole life upside down, but if you want to see your child do what others do, you'll do it."

the fact that Brynn has seizures — an average of 15 to 20 per day — in which she falls. She had brain surgery that seemed to help alleviate the seizures, but they have now resumed.

"We decided we had to deal with the seizures first," Kerns said. "She has several different kinds of seizures in addition to the ones in which she falls, but they aren't grand mal seizures." Because the Kerns feel Brynn is the most alert she has been and the seizures aren't as bad as they have been in the past, they decided to contact the institute.

"We didn't realize what was wrong with her two years ago," Kerns said. "We didn't think the institute could help her because she slept 16 hours out of 24 each day and was not awake enough for the therapy that would be required."

It turned out that Brynn was sleeping so much as a result of medication.

"Steve and I spent a week in Philadelphia going through classes learning how and what to do in the program," Kerns said. "We learned how to evaluate our child and then we brought her to the institute last week."

During her evaluation, it was determined that Brynn was profoundly damaged throughout her brain.

"They think she is still very intelligent although she is incapable of responding," Kerns said.

In developing a program for Brynn, the goal is to perform activities that will help create pathways to her brain. In addition, she is now on a diet that excludes sugar and salt. She also takes massive amounts of vitamins.

To create the pathways, activities such as patterning, masking, crawling, creeping, reading and walking are emphasized. Touch and auditory stimulation are also included.

The most challenging activity for the family is patterning in which Brynn is placed on a specially-built table and her arms, legs and head are moved to create pure sensory input to her brain.

"It takes five of us to do it," Kerns said. "We have to pattern her 12 times a day and she has a minimal goal of creeping 50 meters a day on her belly which helps in focusing."

When a baby develops, it goes through various stages of learning. It has to creep before it crawls, crawl before it walks. In Brynn's case, she is able to walk, but she has lost many of the

skills that are gained as a result of the learning process.

"Part of Brynn's brain needs to be re-developed," Kerns said. "One of the biggest goals of the institute is to expand lung capacity."

In order to prepare Brynn for patterning, the Kerns sometimes use their other two children in a demonstration.

Unfortunately, Kerns said Brynn is still very aggressive and resists the activity.

John David, 7, still remembers what Brynn was like prior to her regression while Taylor, 4, is familiar with Brynn as she is now.

"The children have had different reactions," Kerns said. "We've had people criticize us about the other two kids, but they are part of the program too. They feel like they are helping save their sister."

According to Kerns, the five-member family is rarely able to go out together. Instead, one parent usually stays with Brynn while the other takes the two children out.

"We can't go to the movies or restaurants with her because it is too stressful for us and she gets very frustrated," Kerns said. "It tends to divide our family because one of us stays home with her."

Prior to being enrolled in the institute, Brynn had been attending special education classes at East Elementary.

"At this time, she is not educable," Kerns said. "They do their best to stimulate her."

Since the Kerns just returned from Philadelphia, this week marked the beginning of the therapy. They are in need of volunteers to assist in patterning.

"We are still trying to get organized, but without a housekeeper and patterners, we can't do it," she said. "We have spent years trying to find answers and this is the most drastic one. This will require 12 hours a day for seven days a week."

Tracie's parents, Lydia and John Whitwell, have been assisting in the patterning, in addition to one of Tracie's friends.

The family will return to the institute in February for an evaluation.

"If this fails and she continues to regress and be combative, we will have to look at residential housing or we will have to medicate her," Kerns said. "When she was diagnosed with leukemia, we knew it would be bad for a while, but we expected her to go into remission."

"If we can get her better now, we are better off," she said.

Government may be slow to let go of old secrets

WASHINGTON (AP) — Researcher Morris Moses hopes that a new presidential order to declassify old government secrets will finally help him discover the techniques used to read Americans' mail during World War II.

But advocates of giving researchers like Moses what they want are not as optimistic that government agencies will be eager to comply with President Clinton's 1995 order.

"Historians are pretty frustrated with the new executive order," says Page Putnam Miller, who lobbies for such groups as the American Historical Association and the Organization of American Historians. "It appears agencies are not doing much to implement it or are trying to delay to see what will happen with the election."

CIA spokesman Mark Mansfield disagrees.

To comply with the order, the CIA is preparing to review 40 million pages either manually or by computer — an amount of material Mansfield likens to "a stack of boxes 50 Washington Monuments high."

In a decade of trying, Moses, 72, a retired engineer, has obtained only snippets of information about the technology used by the wartime Office of Censorship to intercept mail, radio or teletype transmission that might contain secrets about troop movements or battle plans.

Of the 100 pages the government has turned over so far, Moses says, many portions are blacked out to protect still-classified secrets.

"I got a bit here, and a piece there," he says.

"They give you a piece of paper and right in the middle of the piece of paper would be two words and the rest would be all blacked out," says Moses, of Albany, N.Y., who has already written a book about the technology of the Minox camera.

Despite his frustration over the delay, Moses says he is optimistic that a new panel set up by Clinton's 1995 order to hear appeals by researchers like himself will overturn the government's refusal to declassify the files he wants.

The Interagency Security Classification Appeals Panel — called ICECAP by the bureaucrats — consists of representatives of the National Security Council, the CIA, and the departments of Justice, State and Defense.

It also has the authority to review requests by government agencies for exemptions from the order that records older than 25 years be automatically declassified. Exemptions would give agencies five years to conduct page-by-page reviews of records.

Critics fear that the order will not be successfully implemented because of traditional bureaucratic inertia and resistance to releasing secrets, however old they might be.

"There have been a lot of obstacles that are being raised in various agencies to actually getting this done," says Kate Martin, general counsel of the National Security Archive, a private group that seeks to open secret government files.

Instead of listing specific files or groups of records, agencies have claimed that broad categories of information should be examined page by page, critics say.

Some agencies that "cited way too broad a sweep" of documents will soon be told to provide more detailed justifications for exemptions, says Steve Garfinkel, who coordinates the implementation of Clinton's order as director of the Information Security Oversight Office.

In the meantime, most "agencies are very busy reviewing and declassifying documents. ... that is going on at an unprecedented pace," he says.

Since 1994 the government has declassified 87 million pages, Garfinkel said. Estimates of secrets covered by the order run as high as half a billion pages.

Another obstacle is money. The intelligence authorization bill passed by the House has cut from \$25 million to \$12.5 million the money set aside for agencies like the CIA and the National Security Agency to review their records.

Congress also gave the Energy Department the power to exempt itself from automatic declassification to protect atomic secrets.

Meantime, Moses is waiting for action on his appeal along with about 10 other researchers who have longstanding requests for classified material.

Without giving any promises, Moses says Garfinkel told him his prospects are rosy. "I hope they know what they are doing down there."

There's no doubt that golfers are the most obsessive of sports equipment fanatics.

They snap up overpriced stuff so high tech that unless they are physicists or engineers, they don't even understand what they are spending all that money on.

If you browse through a golf magazine, you'll be told of the astonishing success you will have with one ball that has "a formulation of polybutadiene" and a "440 cubo-chaedral dimple pattern."

Another gives you a "patented Tetrachaidodecahedron dimple pattern."

You can flail with a "megazized grooveless titanium driver," or an iron that has a "diamond cut four way cambered sole."

And maybe a shaft with a "patented frequency dampened core" that reduces that vibration of hitting a golf ball.

There's no other game like it. A bowler has a ball, shoes and maybe a wrist brace. Basketball players need only a ball and a hoop. In tennis, it is a racquet and a willingness to expose your knobby knees.

And while sheeplike golfers spend billions on all this silly stuff, most admit the sad truth: a pitiful golfer with the most expensive equipment is still a pitiful golfer. But a good golfer with relics from a garage sale will still be good.

Until now.

Finally, someone has invented a golf club that will let anyone hit a golf ball more than 200 yards exactly where it is aimed.

And by "anyone," I mean those who are so lacking in hand-eye

coordination that they cannot take dead-aim at the potty.

With this club the most pathetic hackers can send a ball soaring impressive distances down the center of fairways.

It will do all that the hot-selling, bit, fat, obese Bertha slob-of-a-club can only promise to do but usually doesn't.

The brains behind this remarkable weapon are D. James Duncalf and Roy Taylor, who own an engineering firm in California's Silicon Valley and spend most of their time designing tools for companies that make computer chips.

A few years ago, a retired geezer came to them and said that he could not hit a ball far enough to make him happy. So, he asked, could they help him?

Place the head of the club behind the ball.

Don't swing the club. That is the worst thing you could do, which is why most golfers are so awful.

Instead, you pull a trigger in the handle of the club.

This sets off an explosive charge in the head of the club. It has the equivalent power of a .22 caliber bullet.

The explosion thrusts out a strike plate in the head of the club, which hits the ball with awesome force and sends it soaring down the fairway.

After learning of this invention, I chatted over the phone with Duncalf and learned that he is originally from Illinois and had attended Rock Island High School at the same time my wife, the blond, went there.

"You remember her, I'm sure," I said. "Since she led the Rock's tennis team to all sorts of great victories."

"No," he said, "I was a nerd and I hung out with nerds, and we didn't pay that much attention to sports."

Amazing. An admitted nerd comes up with the most significant leap forward in the history of golf.

As well as a major advancement in mental health.

Mental health? Yes. A shrink will tell you that the golf club is a phallic symbol. And failing to hit the ball long and true leaves a male golfer feeling, well, rather flaccid.

Most golf merchants wish they could get away with naming their clubs, well, you can imagine.

One club manufacturer did bring out a driver called "The Windy City Whacker." A friend who bought one said: "I like it because the name sounds like a headline about a notorious gigolo."

But with the exploding club, every feeble golfer can walk away feeling as if he had successfully ... well, you can imagine that, too.

There are barriers Duncalf and Taylor must overcome. First, they must find someone who can market their remarkable product.

And the thin-lipped fogies who make golf's rules will probably say it is illegal for official play.

Hah! Like some guy playing at a \$15-a-round municipal course, or at a private country club, cares what they think?

At last, parity. Every hacker a long hitter.

The only problems might be in the short game. How do you use the thing for those in-between shots?

As Duncalf said: "If you hold the club farther away from the ball, the explosion won't propel it as far."

So, while chipping, you make a mistake and shoot your opponent dead with a golf ball. The old game can use a bit more spark.

EDITORIAL ROUNDUP

July 9 — Albuquerque (N.M.) Journal on new meat and poultry inspection regulations:

The overhaul of America's outdated system of meat and poultry inspection is good news for consumers. Scientific tests and sanitation safeguards that have been available for years will finally become mandatory parts of the inspection process in meat and poultry plants across the United States.

For 90 years, inspection has relied mostly on the "sniff and poke" method. Inspectors looked at selected carcasses, felt them and smelled them. Any that seemed diseased or questionable were discarded. Those inspection methods were a distinct improvement when they were implemented in the early part of this century, when unsanitary conditions in meat plants were a national scandal.

But some contamination can't be seen with the naked eye, or smelled with even a sensitive nose. Even though the scientific tools exist for detecting microbial contaminants, their use hasn't been mandatory in the routine inspection process.

If the new regulations work as intended, lives may be saved.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, each year an estimated 4,000 people die and 10 million people become sick from eating meat or poultry contaminated by pathogens such as E. coli and salmonella.

President Clinton, in his announcement of the new regulations, said the rules can be carried out without excessive government red tape. If so, that will be quite an accomplishment, since the federal government has repeatedly loaded down improvements in regulations with heavy paperwork. But the new rules are promising, since both consumer groups and industry groups have praised the final product.

People will still have to use their common sense — and their senses — when preparing and eating meat. If it doesn't look right or smell right, don't eat it. And all meat should be carefully cooked. But, with the new federal meat and poultry inspection regulations, consumers can have more confidence that what they can't see or smell won't hurt them.

New sides to old friends

(Larry McGehee is vacationing. In his absence, this column is reprinted from 1986.)

He is 66 now, and retired a second time, and I have known him since he was the age I am now. But I realized as he visited that we barely scratch the surface in really knowing our friends.

I knew him when he owned a store. His earlier career as an army officer in the engineers was in other times and places, and we had never talked about it. We had in common a love for education, for helping students, for college athletics, for bragging about our daughters, for playing with model trains, and for drinking coffee and kidding one another.

I never heard him tell a war story. Considering his age, I assumed his wartime duty was in Korea. In the course of his visit, I idly asked where he had served.

It was as if I had opened a bottle of warm cola that someone had shaken for five minutes. His memories gushed out non-stop for over an hour while I listened, mesmerized by what I was hearing and wishing for a tape-recorder—to capture the word-pictures he was dredging up from his past, so that his grandchildren and my children would hear them. I know now why Robert Penn Warren spent his early years at the foot of his Civil War grandfather in the vicarious exhilaration of being invited to share a warrior's world.

My friend, in Ancient Mariner fashion, skipped tales of his training and induction period and of North

Africa, and went straight to the action—starting with Monte Cassino in Italy and ending with luncheon with generals at Hitler's Berchtesgaden on V-E Day. (His war was World War II, not Korea.)

His group was so highly skilled it could build bridges under enemy fire in minutes—and make roads almost as fast. It was the model wedding of humans and machines to breed inventiveness, adaptation, and efficiency, bio-machines of steel and blood that took Italy, landed in southern France, and raced across Europe—and stored its memories for future reference, to be used after first assuring there would

be a future.

He arrived in Dachau two hours after it was liberated. A Jewish photographer with him found his own mother and father there—still alive amidst the railway cars and ovens. That's a glimpse into what my friend carried around all these years.

I'll not tell his stories here. They are his, rightfully earned. I am grateful—no, humbled—that he shared them, but there is an intimacy to such stories that defies description, as if for a moment a hidden soul exposes itself. One cannot—ought not—go public with a friend's nakedness.

He recalled dates and places as if he were there, and he remembered each man's death or wound as if he were seeing it flashing on a screen in his mind. Ravines, upended trucks and jeeps, potholes, night battles, a day as a prisoner of war, encounters with greats like Mark Clark and then-colonel Goodpasture, and especially his men—he recalled them all in microscopic detail. To hear it—to watch his eyes in the telling—was an experience I never got from the hundreds of war histories I have read and war movies I have seen.

Perhaps "you had to have been there to understand it." Perhaps. But because he was there, with hundreds of others like him in the early 1940's, perhaps I am here now. And perhaps he was saying, "Try to keep from ever having to be there."

By the time his wife could get him to leave, he and I both were crying. The tears come again each time I think about the hour he gave me, a gift from the very bowels of eternity.

Has it taken him almost half a century to be able to face his memories? And if so, how long does it take a world that treats its teenagers thus to come to grips with its larger scrapbook?

He was only 25 when his war ended. Now I know why he has loved life and people so very deeply. That war has never ended for him, and his engineering now is through faith, hope, and love—the bio-machine he missed most and bled for so many years ago.

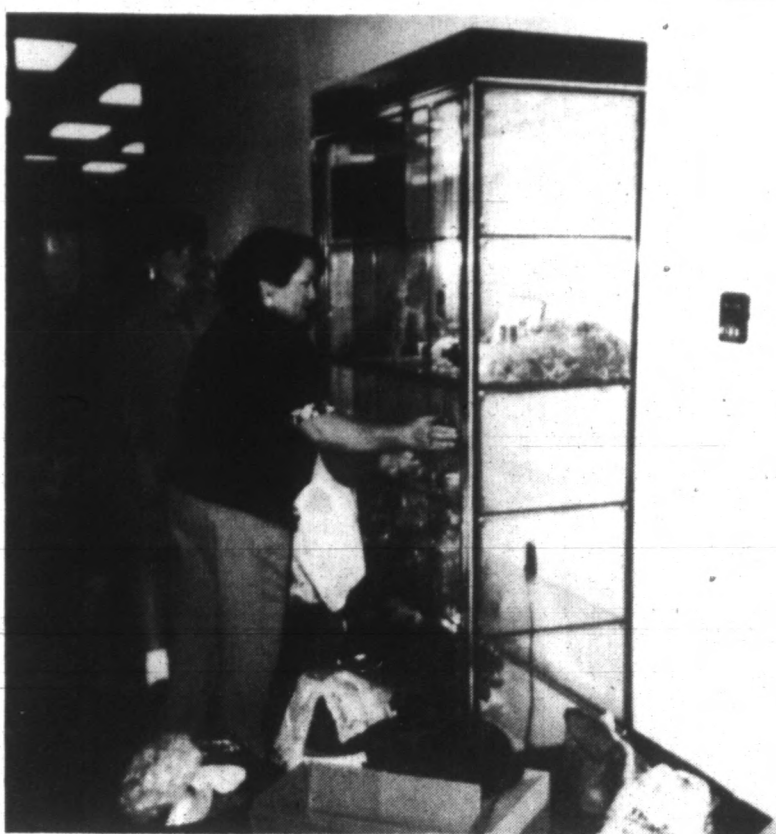

Jordan signs one-year deal with Chicago

\$25 million contract reportedly richest in pro sports history

CHICAGO (AP) — Michael Jordan will be the NBA's highest-paid player — at least for one year.

The league's premier player and the Chicago Bulls agreed to a one-year contract Friday worth at least \$25 million. It is the richest one-year contract in team sports history.

Terms of the contract were not divulged by the Bulls, but a team source, who spoke on condition that he not be identified, told The Associated Press the deal was worth at least \$25 million. The contract still has not been signed.

While his agent David Falk and Bulls chairman Jerry Reinsdorf were negotiating over the phone in conversations that Reinsdorf said took less than an hour, Jordan was playing in a celebrity golf tournament in Stalene, Nev.

"This is something Jerry and I agreed upon. It really didn't take any negotiations, which is the way I wanted it," Jordan said, confirming the contract was for one year while declining to disclose the value. "I'm very happy with the agreement we have."

Jordan, who shot a 2-over-par

74 and was seven strokes off the lead of the Isuzu Celebrity Golf Championship, said a one-year deal was the best way to go.

"This team could have a good chance of winning the championship again. Then after that, you don't know," he said. "They may want to take a business approach to it and change the team. And I want to give them the flexibility to do that."

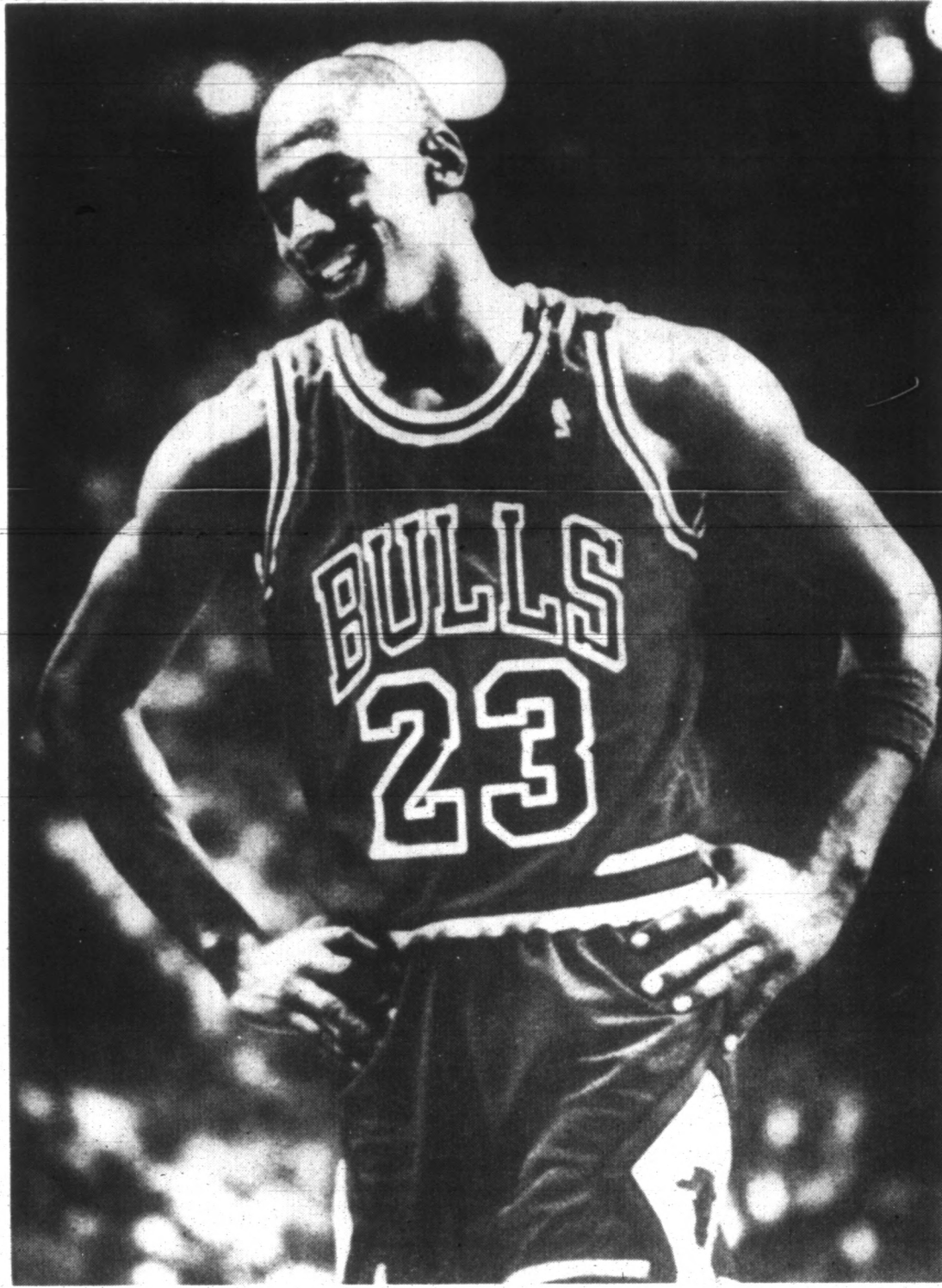
Jordan had said at the end of last season that he would be looking for at least \$18 million per season. Falk quickly jumped in and said Jordan was worth much more. The \$20 million to \$25 million figures began to circulate.

"It is Michael's desire to be the highest-paid player in the game," Falk said earlier. Another Falk client, New York Knicks center Patrick Ewing, made \$18.7 million last year, but that was part of a long-term contract and not a one-year deal.

Jordan's career of unparalleled excellence with the Chicago Bulls has featured four NBA titles, eight scoring championships, four MVP awards and a worldwide following.

He already makes an estimated \$40 million in off-the-court endorsements but his contract had been a bargain for the Bulls, compared to other salaries for lesser players. Jordan made about \$4 million in salary last season.

Incidentally: Dream Team tops Aussies in exhibition

SALT LAKE CITY (AP) — The Dream Team had its first international incident Friday night.

Playing against a physical and scrappy opponent, the U.S. Olympic team beat Australia 118-77 in a game highlighted by two altercations and a flurry of 3-pointers by the visiting point guard.

"We've grown up respecting those guys, but we won't back down from anybody," said Australia point guard Shane Heal, who nailed eight 3-pointers and confronted Charles Barkley, thereby supplanting Karl Malone and John Stockton as the fan favorite for one night.

When the game ended, Heal and Barkley exchanged smiles and laughs after a second half that was violence-free.

"I think they appreciated that we stood up to them. They respected us for that," Hale said.

Heal, shooting from as far as 30 feet, was 8-for-13 on 3-pointers and 10-for-17 overall as he scored 28 points — the most by any opponent in the Olympic team's four exhibition games.

Reggie Miller led the U.S. team with 19 points on 6-for-6 shooting. Shaquille O'Neal had 18 points, while Mitch Richmond added 16 and Malone 14. The United States shot 58 percent and had 13 dunks — almost half as many as they had in their last game against China.

The final stop on the Olympic team's exhibition tour is Sunday at Indianapolis against Greece.

Tom Glavine (10-5), replacing scheduled starter Greg Maddux, gave up seven hits in seven innings to win for the third time in four decisions.

Mark Wohlers struck out the side in the ninth for his 19th save.

Maddux was scratched because of a cracked toenail on his right foot, sustained during an at-bat in a July 7 game against Houston. The four-time Cy Young winner is expected to start Monday's game against Montreal.

Leiter, who retired 15 of 17 Braves in one stretch, gave up four runs and six hits in 6 2-3 innings.

Mark Whiten went 3-for-4 with two doubles for the Braves.

Gary Sheffield homered and Terry Pendleton drove in two runs for the Marlins, playing their second game under new manager John Boles.

Glavine didn't allow a hit until Sheffield led off the fourth with his 26th homer to tie it 1-1.



St. Louis' 7 HRs down Cubs

Wrigley Field winds lift Cards to 13-3 win

CHICAGO (AP) — Last in the National League in homers, the St. Louis Cardinals seemed an unlikely bunch to tie a 56-year-old franchise record for power.

Welcome to Wrigley Field, where a strong wind blowing out Friday helped the Cardinals hit seven home runs in a 13-3 win over the Chicago Cubs. The homer barrage tied a team record set by the Cardinals of the "Gas-house Gang" era on May 7, 1940, against the Brooklyn

St. Louis center fielder Ray Lankford hit one of the Cards' seven homers Friday at Wrigley.

Dodgers.

"Maybe we'll just be the Gas Gang," said a smiling Gary Gaetti, who along with Ron Gant homered twice. "We haven't been hitting like this. This ballpark is conducive to this, though."

Brian Jordan, John Mabry and Ray Lankford each homered once as Andy Benes (7-8) won his fourth straight decision. He held the Cubs to three runs and nine hits in eight innings.

Benes lost seven consecutive starts in April and May, but he is now 6-1 in his 10 starts since May 19.

"He's getting a lot of payback for early in the season," Cardinals manager Tony La Russa said. "He was pitching a lot better than his record."

Benes managed to keep the ball out of the jet stream above Wrigley better than All-Star Steve Trachsel (7-6), who lost his second straight game as the Car-

dinals hit consecutive homers in the third and fifth innings.

"When the wind is blowing out, even popups can go out," said Mabry, who led an 18-hit attack by going 4-for-5. "Trachsel had good stuff, but he was just on the wrong side of the wind."

Trachsel left after allowing seven runs — six earned — and nine hits in four-plus innings.

"Seemed like no matter what I threw, they were hitting," he said. "They hit them high, they hit them low, they hit breaking pitches, fastballs, everything."

The Cardinals' win stopped an eight-game losing streak at Wrigley Field dating to July 1, 1995.

The homers started leaving Wrigley in the third, when Mabry hit a two-run homer, his eighth, to give St. Louis a 4-0 lead. Gaetti followed with a solo shot.

Then in the fifth, Lankford and

Puckett announces retirement

MINNEAPOLIS (AP) — Kirby Puckett, the roly-poly Minnesota Twins center fielder who was one of baseball's most beloved players, retired Friday after an operation revealed irreversible damage to his right eye.

Puckett, 35, underwent surgery early Friday in Baltimore and then flew back to Minneapolis with his retinal specialist, Dr. Bert Glaser, for a news conference at the Metrodome to announce his retirement.

"The world is not over," said Puckett, with his ever-present smile and a bandage over his eye. "Baseball has been a great part of my life. Now I have to close this chapter and go on with part two of my life."

Puckett was joined at a news conference by his wife, Tonya, and several Twins teammates, many of whom had tears in their eyes as he spoke.

"Don't take it for granted," Puckett said. "Tomorrow is not promised to any of us, so enjoy yourself."

Puckett always did on the field, whether it was hitting a game-winning home run in the World Series or leaping above the center-field wall to rob someone of a homer.

One of baseball's most popular players in an era of sometimes snarling stars, Puckett won two World Series titles with the Twins. He retired with a .318 average in 12 seasons, and finished his career with 2,304 hits, 207 homers and 1,085 RBIs.

Puckett awoke on March 28 and was unable to see out of his right eye. He was diagnosed with glaucoma and underwent several laser surgery treatments.

On Friday, Glaser performed a vitrectomy to remove fluid from Puckett's eye, but the damage to his retina was too severe.

"There's very little, if any, blood supply nourishing the retina and, sadly, no further treatment is available," said Glaser, of the Retinal Institute of Mary-

land. "Basically, the retina will not recover from this status."

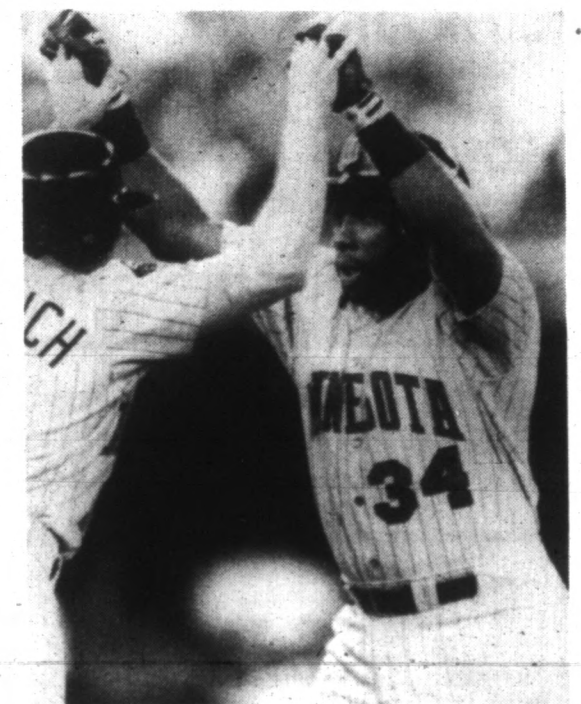
A video tribute to Puckett's career was shown during the seventh inning of Friday night's game between the Twins and Cleveland Indians.

"It was a pleasure for me to be able to sit and watch every game that he played," Twins manager Tom Kelly said. "How lucky am I?"

Kent Hrbek, Puckett's longtime teammate who retired in 1994, said the affable outfielder was "fun to play with and a joy to be around."

"I'm just happy I can say I played alongside of him," Hrbek said. "I had the best seat in the house to watch him. If we were kids and he was on my block, he'd be the first guy I'd pick for my team."

"He's one of the nicest human beings in baseball," added Twins general manager Terry Ryan. "We're never going to replace Kirby Puckett."

Bowe blamed for MSG brawl

NEW YORK (AP) — Boxing's latest black eye came courtesy of a wild post-fight brawl ignited by heavyweight Riddick Bowe's huge entourage, a nationally televised fistfight that could block the Brooklyn native from ever returning to Madison Square Garden.

The Thursday night melee, which started in the ring and spread into the stands, resulted in

16 arrests, 22 injuries and yet another low blow for the beleaguered fight game. The brawl raged for more than 30 minutes before more than 250 police officers and Garden security personnel managed to restore order. "It was a very ugly night," said Bowe's manager, Rock Newman. "I apologize ... for the pain, grief, anguish and embarrassment it has caused all of us."

Two of the suspects in custody and a third at large were mem-

bers of Bowe's entourage — and all three had criminal records, said police commissioner Howard Safir. The trio, including a man who sprinted across the ring to club Bowe's opponent, Andrew Golota, with a walkie-talkie, were identified from videotape of the fight, he said.

The man with the walkie-talkie, identified by police as Jason Harris, surrendered to police Friday and was charged with second-degree assault and

criminal possession of a weapon, police said. Another man who was charged with third-degree assault, a misdemeanor, was identified as Steven Bowe, but police could not confirm that he was related to the boxer.

Newman himself could also face criminal charges, Safir said. Newman entered the ring shouting and pointing at Golota — a gesture that some took as a call for others to follow. Newman said Friday that was not true.

Reinsdorf said it was the 33-year-old Jordan who requested the one-year deal, "because he never wants to play if he is unable to meet his own high standards."

"This way, Michael and the Bulls will be able to discuss what is appropriate after each subsequent season," Reinsdorf said.

"Michael's desire for a one-year contract is refreshing in this era where athletes often seek to be paid beyond their productive years," he said.

Another factor might have been Jordan's desire to play for coach Phil Jackson, who signed a one-year contract last month for \$2.5 million.

During the season, Jordan had threatened to leave if Jackson did.

Losing Jordan would have caused a civic crisis in Chicago, where he is given deity status.

A statue of him stands in front of the United Center, proclaiming him the greatest player who ever lived. It was erected when Jordan

was on a 17-month respite from basketball.

He ended his retirement after trying minor league baseball. He came back late in the 1994-95 season, only to see the Bulls eliminated in the playoffs by the Orlando Magic. Last season he led the Bulls to the best regular-season record in NBA history (72-10) and Chicago then rolled to another title, winning 15 of 18

playoff games.

Jerry Krause, the team's vice president of basketball operations, said in the statement that Reinsdorf and he shared a common goal — "to do whatever it takes to bring another NBA championship to the city of Chicago. Without a doubt, today we took another giant step toward accomplishing that goal."

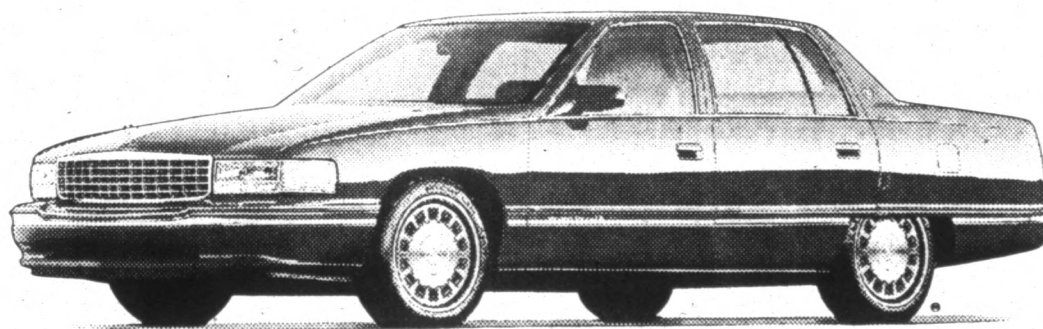

LBL has reopened eagle bays

GOLDEN POND, Ky. — TVA's Land Between the Lakes national recreation area and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers have reopened portions of Hughes Bay and Mammoth Furnace Bay to fishing and boat traffic. Both bays had been closed since last winter to protect nesting eagles.

LBL has been home to several active bald eagle nests since the mid-1980s, when biologists first attempted to re-establish bald eagle populations at LBL using a raise-and-release technique known as "hacking." In 1984, LBL was home to the first "hacked" eagle known to return to nest in the southeast. This year, LBL biologists observed four active bald eagle nests, which produced a total of six eaglets.

Vacation time benefits local area

Vacation time is here for thousands of families across these United States and many of them come and visit here.

They tour our parks, cities and lakes looking for places of entertainment, food and lodging. Not only do they bring money, some of them bring new ideas and techniques for doing things which are of interest to many of us.

We must remember that we are in the vacationland and need these folks to come here for so many reasons. We as an area of many miles have a lot to offer year round so let's take care of our resources! Interest in fishing ranks at the top and at this time people are looking for white stripes, largemouth, smallmouth, catfish and bluegill.

The lack of rainfall in this area and South through the state of Alabama is having an effect on the amount of water coming down the Tennessee and Cumberland rivers. The first thing you notice is the absence of surface feeding by our

predator gamefish. Without a good current, the minnows which are still schooled everywhere there is cover, will not travel the main lake in great numbers and attract the fish we are wanting to catch.

It's purely simple, but if there is water being pulled at the dams we can catch fish just about everywhere.

The white stripes are a favorite for lots of folks because of the liberal limit and they fight so hard when hooked. Also they feed like a pack of wolves and will strike many different kinds of lures. They are an

excellent eating fish as well as many enjoy taking them home.

The black bass also use the currents to seek out areas of the open water where there is ample cover. From this point, they can ambush any food which comes by slipping by.

We had occasion to witness some huge bass charge into a small school of 12 and 14 inch shad. They struck these big shad so hard they stunned them and as they lay on the surface barely twitching, the bass came up and swallowed every shad there.

The two men with me were flabbergasted at what they had seen and declared that just one of the bass would be enough for a lifetime trophy! I was careful to keep my boat back and away from the strike zone but close enough for casting a Carolina rig.

We caught some smaller bass at first, but as they began to adjust to the big shad in their gullets the larger bass came back for more food and found some 11 inch worms crawling around. Jim White got the bite and when he set the hook, I knew we had a trophy on the line.

I turned the boat several times to keep the bass out of the motors and told Jim to relax and take this time. We did a good job until the bass made a big run close to the boat and then out and away. Jim forgot what he was doing and when the fish started away he pulled back like he was moving a piano and this extra

pressure caused the line to break. The tension was so great that Jim

talked for five minutes and I couldn't tell you a single thing he said! We all calmed down finally and it was time to come in and start all over. Jim knows he had the trophy he wanted but made a major mistake and will have a lot of time to think about it before next year's trip!

Several large hatches of mayflies have kept the bluegill near the surface and active.

Crickets, worms, popping bugs and tiny spinners will get you a strike along any rocky shoreline where there is timber close to the water.

Crappie can be caught again since the water flow has almost stopped. Minnows and jigs will produce some good fish from the medium to deep ledges. Sauger are slow like the others until the current starts again. Crankbaits or spoons worked along the bottom will draw some action.

We should have a good weekend coming up so get ready!

What can cause paint to blister and peel? Much like mildewing problems, dampness is the culprit. If the wood was not completely dry prior to painting, the moisture prevents the paint from adhering properly, which in turn causes expansion, bleeding blisters or bubbles in the paint. The blisters break and the paint peels.

There is no fast or easy way to solve the problem. The first step, as always, is to determine the source of the dampness. Dampness could be caused by moisture from the inside out. Next, scrape and sand the faded areas. Be sure the wood is completely clean and dry. Repaint with a quality paint.

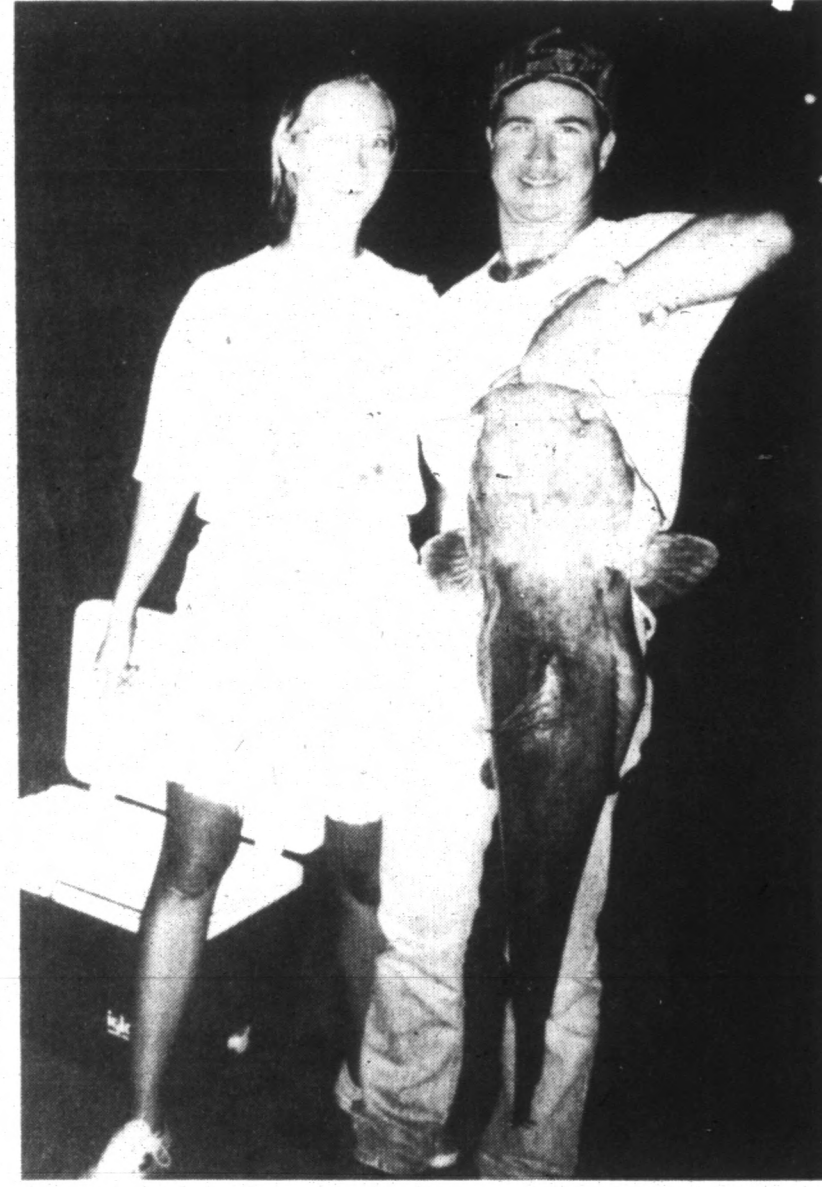

GOLDEN POND, Ky. — The timing couldn't have been better: as officials from TVA's Land Between the Lakes and the Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation prepared to open LBL's new Elk & Bison Prairie, the first elk calf sighted at the national recreation area made its appearance.

TVA and RMEF staff spotted the calf June 20 while they were at the site preparing for dedication ceremonies the next day.

"It was a moment we'd all been anxiously awaiting; the fact that TVA and RMEF staff got to experience it together made it all the more special," said LBL wildlife biologist Steve Bloemer.

Visitors wanting to see bison or elk should plan to make several trips through the area. There is currently no fee to drive through the prairie, although donations are accepted to help fund project completion. Guided van tours are available in the evenings at a fee of \$5 for adults and teens and \$3 for ages 12 and under. Group tours can also be arranged. TVA is entering the final stages of the Shoreline Management Initiative (SMI) which will result in new shoreline development standards for residential access along the shoreline of agency lakes. Based on earlier public participation, TVA has developed six potential shoreline management alternatives and analyzed impacts of each in a Draft Environmental Impact Statement (DEIS). In the DEIS, the agency has identified its preferred alternative which would provide new standards for the size of docks and type of vegetation management permitted by TVA. The preferred alternative would also allow new shoreline areas to be developed. The DEIS examines proposed cost recovery charges associated with management activities. Although TVA has identified a preferred alternative, a final decision will not be made without a thorough public review. TVA extends an invitation to property owners, lake users and anyone else interested in the management of TVA lakes to comment on this document at the time and location listed below. 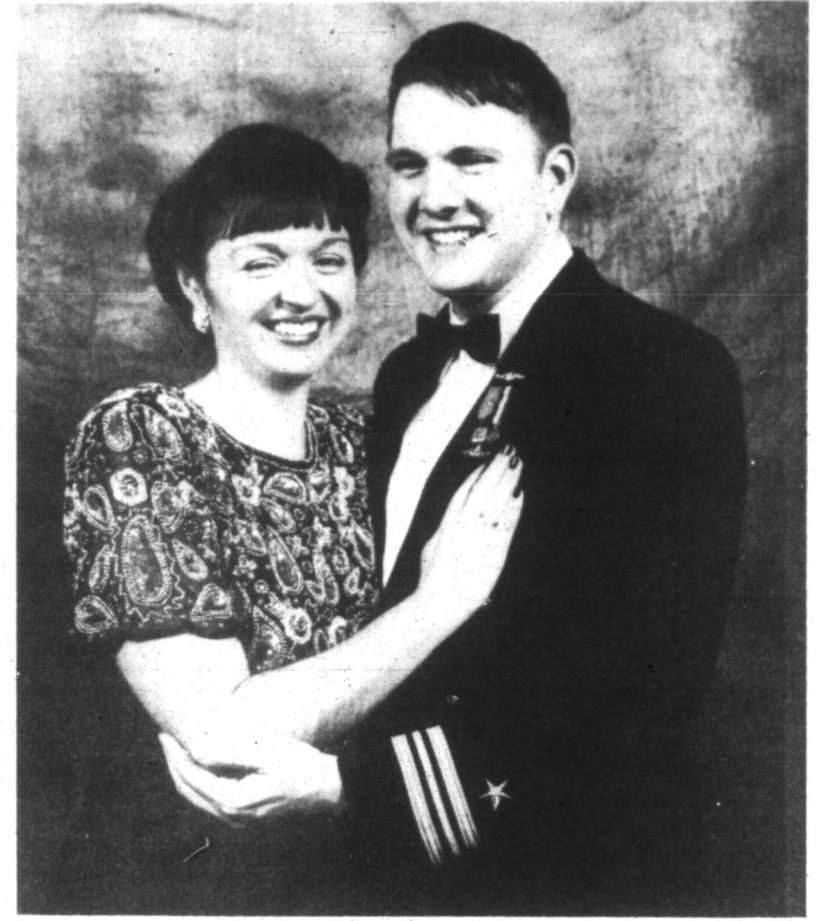

DEAR ABBY

DEAR ABBY: I am 24 years old and have been married for 2 1/2 years. I met "Rick" when I was 15. He was my first love.

We are not poor. Rick works two jobs and I work part-time and go to college. After our wedding, I paid all the bills and balanced the checkbook. But after a while, I got frustrated because I was a few cents off, so I let Rick take over the checkbook because he promised to find the discrepancy.

A few months later, I began getting calls at work and at home about unpaid bills and bounced checks. I'd tell Rick about them. He said not to worry, he'd take care of it; money was just tight.

Two weeks later, my car was repossessed. We got it back after paying a large repo fee plus a month's payment in advance. Obviously Rick had lied to me about being up-to-date on the bills. I know he's not gambling or spending the money elsewhere; he was just late paying the bills and it snowballed.

Last week I typed up monthly and annual spread sheets to organize our budget, and made it plain that I would have to see every bill that comes in. From now on, I will write the checks and manage our finances. Rick agreed. He has apologized repeatedly, and is trying hard to become more responsible. I believe he is sincere, although my credit as well as his is ruined now. At the moment, we are stabilized and not in danger of losing our car or home, but I'm really scared.

He learned his behavior from his mother. (I'll call her Shirley.) When he was a child, his father died. Shirley is now on her fourth husband.

I work with her current husband, who makes really good money

but is hurting financially because Shirley goes on spending binges. And this is the clincher: I found out today that Shirley was fired for embezzling money. She was cutting checks for herself and later replacing the money. Rick is terrified his mother will go to jail.

I'm terrified Rick will turn out just like his mother. Shirley is a compulsive shopper, while my husband is merely irresponsible. However, I'm still afraid for our future.

This is the only real problem in our marriage. Rick is a sweet, gentle, loving, funny man who will one day be a great father. I don't want to give up on him, but I don't want us to end up like his parents, either. His stepfather may leave Shirley over this.

Am I doing enough by controlling our finances myself, or are there other measures I should take? I know that people rarely change. Should I leave him? I am...

IN A PANIC

DEAR IN A PANIC: That would depend on how important an honest husband and financial security are to you. Before making any decision about starting a family, please consult an attorney and a credit counselor about safeguarding yourself from Rick's financial irresponsibility.

DR. GOTT

DEAR DR. GOTT: You have indicated in the past that unusual behavior during a full moon is a myth without valid scientific finding. I think you rely too much on the printed word and not enough on clinical observation. I'm an RN with 17 years of clinical experience, seven of them in an acute and chronic mental health-care facility. The phase of the moon and barometric pressure changes do affect moods. During the full moon or approach of a storm, our patients are more manic, more active and difficult to manage. Even the approach of a storm can be predicted by the behavior of our patients. I would like your rebuttal to my commentary.

DEAR READER: I don't have much of a rebuttal because I, like most health professionals, have had experiences similar to yours. When the crazies start mobbing the office, my secretary and I shrug our shoulders, grin and say that there must be a full moon. And often there is.

This perception notwithstanding, there have been no valid scientific studies that prove the presence of truly bizarre behavior in conjunction with the phase of the moon. The problem is that if you tell someone who's high-strung that he may go slightly bananas during the full moon, he will. Such is the power of suggestion. In addition, most people who misbehave do so without regard to celestial happenings.

Never having had extensive experience in psychiatric hospitals, I can't comment on whether disturbed patients change moods before a storm. I suppose this is possible. But I do know that people who have sustained fractured bones can often predict with uncanny accuracy, many years after the fracture, that the weather will change. Somehow the alteration of barometric pressure causes aching or pain at the site of the old fracture.

I think that most doctors rely heavily on the printed word — as well they should. So, until science proves that a full moon triggers wacky behavior, I'll assume that this relation is merely a cultural myth — despite the term "lunacy," which was derived from "luna" (Latin for moon).

Most responsible scientists pooh-poo the idea that human behavior is governed by the stars, so we reject astrology as nothing more than man-made magic. Shakespeare said it best: "The fault, dear Brutus, is not in our stars..."

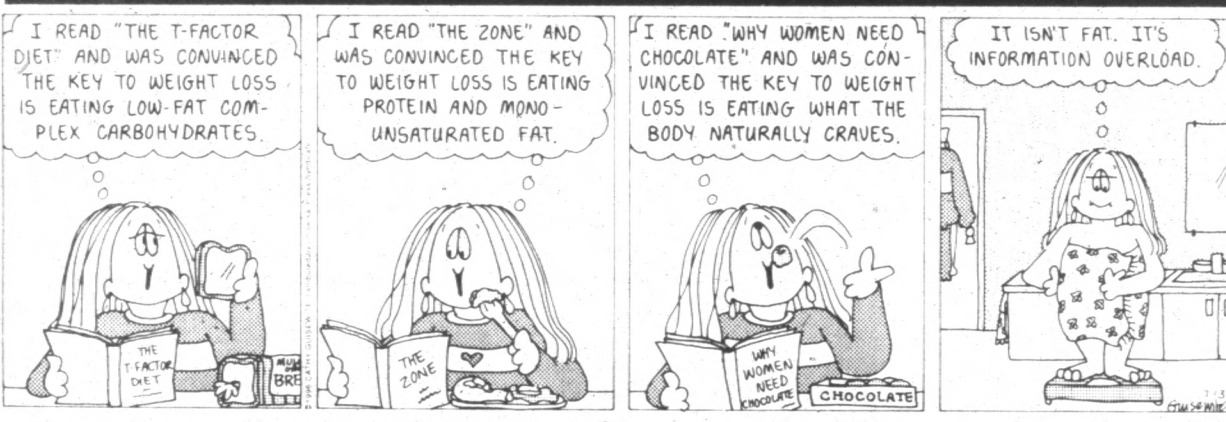

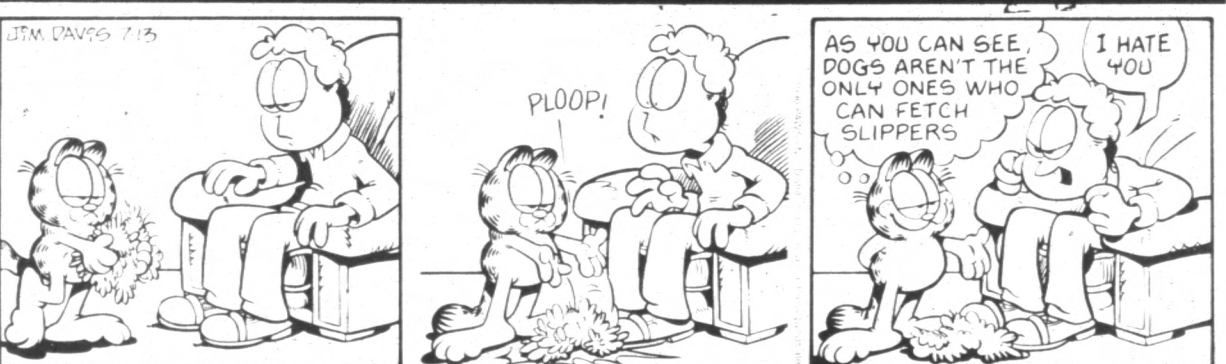

Here is a story of long-distance planning that turned out remarkably well.

West led a spade against five diamonds, and declarer realized that, given the bidding, he would probably go down with normal play. He had a right to assume that East had the king of clubs, but this in turn meant that West was sure to have the ace of hearts for his opening bid.

Therefore, though he could avoid a club loser, he would later lose three heart tricks and go down one.

Faced with this problem — a difficult one to solve even with all 52 cards in plain view — South came up with a brilliant solution. For starters, he ducked the opening lead of the king of spades!

West could do no better than play another spade, which declarer ruffed. South now cashed dummy's A-K of trumps, taking care to retain the deuce, after which he led the queen of clubs, which held. Next came the key play: He cashed the ace of spades and on it discarded the ace of clubs!

Having thus gotten out of his own way, South now led the jack of clubs from dummy. When East covered with the king, South ruffed high and reentered dummy by leading his carefully preserved deuce of diamonds to dummy's four. He then discarded two hearts on the 10-9 of clubs, lost a heart trick to the ace, and so made the contract.

Note that five diamonds could not have been made except in the highly unusual manner shown. But while South's play might be deemed sensational, plays of this sort do more than make a good story; they also make good sense.

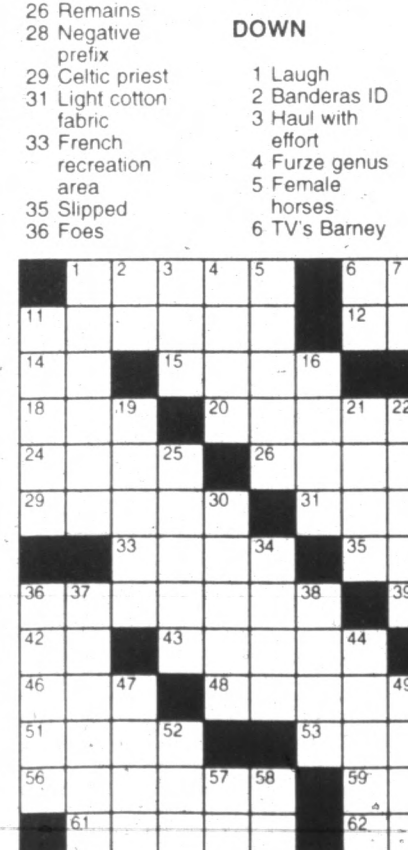

Running of bulls injures six people ■ MSU...

PAMPLONA, Spain (AP) — Two people were gored and four suffered minor injuries Friday during the sixth day of the running of the bulls at the San Fermin festival in northern Spain.

Jose Ramon Lacosta, 37, was in serious condition after being gored in the armpit and buttocks by one of the six bulls that make the 800-yard run each morning during the nine-day festival.

Another Spaniard, Angel Irurti-a Imaz, 34, was in serious condition after being gored in the groin.

Three Spaniards and a 52-year-old American woman, Mary Rocklein of Isla Santa Elena, Pa.,

were treated for bruises after falling or being trampled during the run.

The running of the bulls, the main attraction of the festival that began Sunday, takes place each morning at 8 a.m. when several hundred people run alongside the six bulls through the narrow cobblestone streets of this medieval city in northern Spain.

The bulls are fought later by professional matadors in the Pamplona bull ring.

The San Fermin festival dates to 1591 but was made internationally famous by American novelist Ernest Hemingway in his book "The Sun Also Rises."

Thousands of foreigners flock to Pamplona annually for the festival, which includes concerts and all-night parties.

Isabel Munoz, spokeswoman for the Navarra government, said 38 people had been injured so far in this year's festival.

More than 100 firefighters from Murray, Calloway County and surrounding areas responded to the scene.

The multi-alarm fire started in a second-floor office as a result of workers cutting out walls and pipes with a cutting torch.

An earlier fire that started about 1:30 (p.m.) in Room 212 of the annex was not reported to officials at the time.

"That was a Friday and the workers left about 3:30 p.m. for

the weekend. They thought they had it extinguished, but the State Fire Marshal (Dennis Decker) ruled later that it started in that same office," Scott said.

Items listed in the suit include stage settings, seats, carpets, drapes, various supplies and musical instruments.

The suit charges both contractors with "unreasonable dangerous activities" which caused the fire to break out.

Attempts to contact the attorneys for the school, state and both contractors Friday were unsuccessful.

up in his hand and tore off two fingers and a thumb.

He won \$6.4 million from Remington Arms Co., the gun's manufacturer, in 1988 and used part of the money to set up the King Foundation for Social Justice. One of the first things it did was establish Project Vision.

Four years into the program, the vast majority of the youths have stuck with it, even though they have to grapple almost daily with such inner-city problems as drugs and violence.

One student has dropped out, and one moved away, said Stella Hill, the coordinator for Project Vision.

"It's become a family," she said. "We have gone wall-climbing, caving and hiking together."

If she sees a student or family slipping, Hill said, she reaches out to bring them back into the program, which includes weekly meetings.

Among those at Murray State is 16-year-old Idarion King, a junior at Southern High School in Louisville. He wants to become a psychologist.

When he learned earlier this year that he would be spending a week in Murray, he mentally rolled his eyes.

"But then I decided to make the best of it, and it's been OK," he said. "I would consider going to college here."

The experience, he said, has been invaluable in showing him what college life will be like.

"I've got a better feeling of the campus and a better idea of what professors would be expecting," he said. "Like getting (to class) on time."

Mia Gregory, a junior at Shawnee High School who wants to be an anesthesiologist, came away from one career sessions unimpressed with the salary outlook for teachers.

"I want a good job with dollars," she said, adding that she knew teachers who struggled from paycheck to paycheck.

But then Project Vision chaperone Bartholomew Little offered some advice.

Little, a naval science teacher at Central High School, told Mia a job doesn't make someone short of cash. Instead, he said, it's how you manage your money.
