### Murray High receives award

Murray High School is the winner of the 1996 Purchase Cup Award.

The award, sponsored by The Federal Materials Co. of Paducah, recognizes schools in the Jackson Purchase for outstanding academic and athletic achievements.

The overall score for Murray High was 145 points. Mayfield High School was second with 127.5 points and Graves County High School was third with 126.5 points. The award rates overall performances at 16 high schools.

Schools are graded by such factors as GPA, average daily attendance, graduation rates of athletes and the performance of all sports the school supports.

"This is an important and significant award for our high school," said Murray Superintendent W.A. Franklin.

Federal Materials President Rick Leeper stated in a letter to MHS Principal Dan Hampton that a trophy will be presented soon to the school.

## Woods Hall top priority for regents

Cutting through the bureaucratic red tape was on the minds of Murray State University's board of regents Friday.

After the board's scheduled meeting, MSU President Dr. Kern Alexander said the regents are concerned about the stalled renovation of Woods Hall.

The renovation was set to begin this year, but construction bids came in \$1.3 million over budget, according to Alexander. The state has budgeted \$5 mil-

lion for the project and bids came in at \$6.3 million this summer.

Alexander said they want to redesign the project so that it will come in under budget, but finding ways to prompt the state to move faster on a redesign is the tricky part.

The administration is feeling the housing crunch this year with record enrollment and every current dorm room taken this fall.

"As long as we continue to grow housing is going to be a problem, so we need to get Woods Hall renovated," Alexander said.

Alexander said they are considering several "strategies to get around all the bureaucracies we have to deal with."

Alexander hopes to have meetings in Frankfort to move the Woods project forward.

"We would like to find a way to move the redesign along so that the dorm can be open in August, 1997," Alexander said.

In other business, the board:

• Heard a report from Alexander on increased enrollment.

Alexander told the board he was pleased with the school's

attendance records.

A 6 percent increase in pre-registration numbers helped MSU break the previous attendance mark of 8,350 set in 1978 as more than 8,500 students have enrolled for this year's fall semester.

It also marks the second consecutive year that enrollment has increased. Attendance records show a 9 percent jump since 1994.

"Enrollment has materialized," said Alexander. "This is the highest enrollment that this school

has had since 1978. And we have surpassed that total."

Alexander said the enrollment increase has allowed the university to pick up many quality students from around the country.

"We feel good about the quality and the quantity of our students," he said. "We will continue to grow, but we will increase our growth through quality."

## Utility head faces 75 years for bribes

LOUISVILLE, Ky. (AP) —

The former general manager of a western Kentucky utility was convicted Friday on all 12 counts involving a scheme to receive kickbacks to help steer lucrative contracts to coal suppliers.

William Thorpe, former chief of Big Rivers Electric Corp., sat silently as the verdicts were read in U.S. District Court after jury deliberations that had been strung out over more than a week. Afterward, he winked at supporters in the courtroom.

He faces penalties of up to 75 years in prison and \$2.5 million in fines.

Prosecutors alleged that Thorpe, 65, received in bribes and kickbacks from Green River Coal Co. and other suppliers while he was executive director of the Henderson-based utility starting in the early 1980s. He was forced to resign in 1992.

The jury had been reduced to 11 members Friday after both the defense and prosecution agreed to excuse a juror who was ill. After announcing the guilty verdicts, jurors were expected to decide whether Thorpe should forfeit profits from the scheme.

Federal prosecutors and Thorpe's lawyers did not have any immediate comment on the verdict and met in U.S. District Judge Jennifer Coffman's chambers about the forfeiture proceeding.

Thorpe originally was to have

gone to trial last year with Green River Coal Co. and its majority owner, Clyde Brown Jr., but Thorpe's case was delayed when he underwent emergency surgery.

Both Green River and Brown were convicted on charges of scheming with Thorpe to pay him in exchange for inside information about contracts.

Green River landed a \$33 million-a-year contract with the Henderson-based utility. Big Rivers is seeking to cancel the contract, which forces the utility to pay about \$11 million per year above market price for coal.

Another coal operator, Eddie Ray Brown of E&M Coal Co., earlier pleaded guilty to providing kickbacks to Thorpe.

A 12-count indictment charged Thorpe with mail fraud, racketeering and filing tax returns that did not reflect the alleged kickback payments.

Big Rivers spokeswoman Susan Sauls said Thorpe's conviction will make it easier to pursue the planned merger with PacifiCorp., an Oregon-based utility that wants to lease Big Rivers' power plants.

She also said the utility planned to pursue lawsuits against all defendants in the kickback cases.

"It will make that whole job easier to complete the merger with PacifiCorp., and we will pursue all remedies against the criminal defendant," Sauls said.

## Neglect of education blamed for state's ills

LEXINGTON, Ky. (AP) — Gov. Paul Patton said Friday that most of Kentucky's ills have a root cause: "One hundred years of neglect of education."

In a speech to the Association of Older Kentuckians, Patton said Kentucky has consistently ranked near the bottom in education and economy because it long ago squandered its chance to be a leader.

Two centuries ago, Patton said, Kentucky could boast of having a nationally renowned university — Transylvania at Lexington — and a main transportation artery — the Ohio River. One of the nation's four Catholic dioceses was at Bardonia.

"Why didn't we stay that way? Why didn't we become the Chicago or Atlanta?" Patton said. "Quite frankly, I think we neglected education and infrastructure. ... We emulated the agrarian South rather than the industrial North."

Patton said he senses a mood for change in Kentucky, particularly in education, and a realization that "the only way we can

continue to compete is with ... mental power."

"The Kentucky Education Reform Act, in its entirety, is the most positive development I've seen in Kentucky in my lifetime," Patton said, bringing applause.

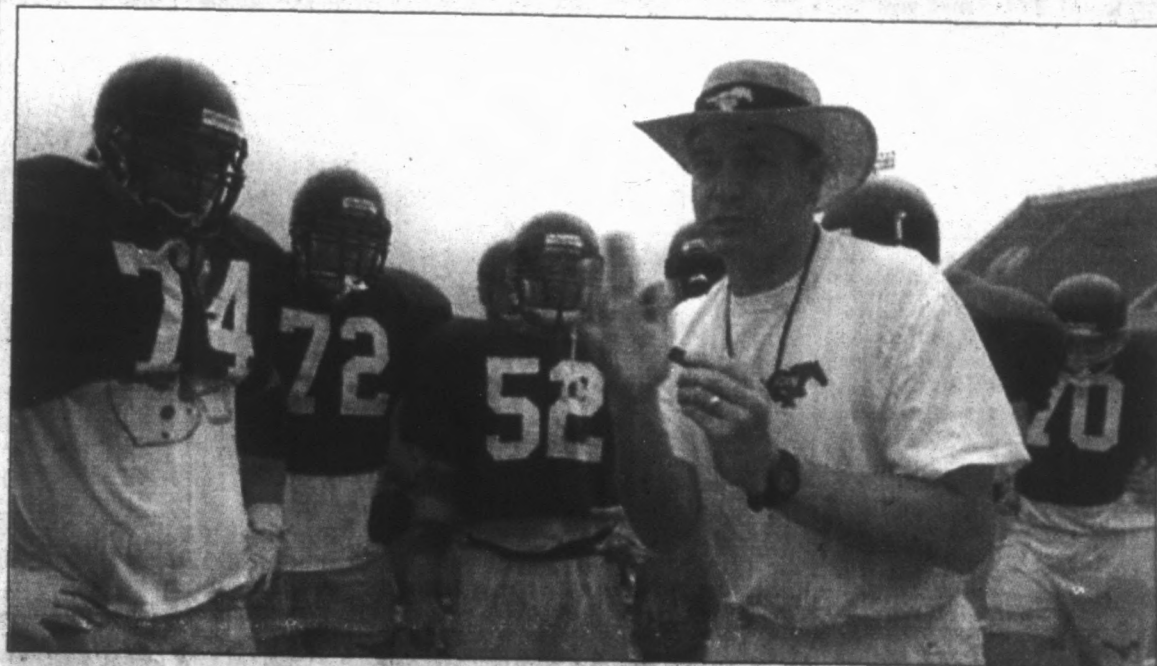
The reform act, enacted in 1990, also has been controversial from the outset. It made significant changes in Kentucky's public school system, including a switch from an elected state superintendent to an appointed commissioner.

But critics claim that basic instruction has suffered in a mania for equity — a charge disputed by the reform act's supporters — and that the complex and costly testing system created under the law is flawed.

A task force was created earlier this year to examine all aspects of the reform act. Patton appointed himself to the task force, and he said he would take part in a series of school visits and public hearings that were announced Thursday.

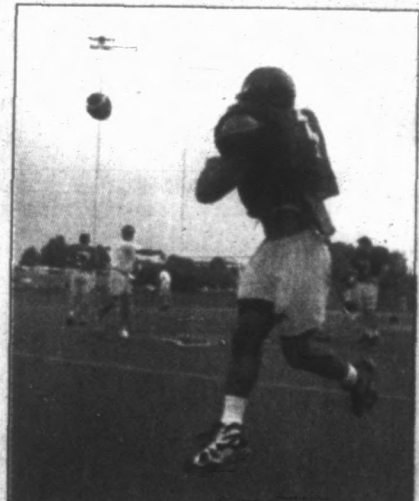
"We're committed to making ... adjustments in ways to improve the program, not to be regressive," he said.

## Dennison, Fisher recall WKU rivalry

Although he sells sports equipment these days, there was a time when E.W. Dennison donned shoulder pads and a helmet to fight for the athletic honor of Murray State University.

Dennison, a resident of Murray and owner of Dennison-Hunt Sporting Goods, played football for the Racers from 1967 to 1971. He received a bachelor's degree in 1972 and a master's degree in 1973 from MSU.

"I remember that there was a coaching change when I came to the campus as a freshman so it was Coach Bill Furgerson's first year," Dennison said.

He also remembers that the annual battle with Western Kentucky was especially rough the first year he played because the coach had started several freshmen.

"We dreaded going to Western," Dennison said. "We were a bunch of freshmen going against Western's seniors. It was a long ride up to WKU and even longer coming back."

That year, WKU trounced the Racers 42-19. Even though MSU lost, Dennison said he recalls positive moments of the game.

"We were picked to get beaten really badly, but we scored quickly at the beginning of the game," he said. "We scored again because the wind was so strong that it blew the

ball into the hands of one of our players."

Dennison said that of all the games he played, the ones against WKU always received the most local attention. "It was a huge rivalry," he said. "Beat Western is all that you heard. Huge crowds went with us for the game."

The next years, the Racers came back strong with seasoned players and defeated WKU 17-14. However, WKU began a winning streak in 1969 that didn't end until 1974.

Regardless of the score, Dennison said he has learned some important lessons from his years with the

## Helicopter supporting Clinton trip crashes

ORLANDO, Fla. (AP) — A Marine Corps helicopter accompanying President Clinton's barnstorming campaign in Florida rolled over today and burst into flames at an Orlando airport. There were no reports of serious injury.

White House Press Secretary Mike McCurry said six people were aboard the twin-engine Boeing CH-46E Sea Knight, which went down at 11:26 a.m. EDT at Orlando Executive Airport.

"I'm told they all escaped under their own power," McCurry said, but there were reports that four people aboard had minor injuries.

There was conflicting accounts of the circumstances of the crash. One witness said the chopper hit a light pole and turned on its side on takeoff. Another witness said the aircraft was landing when the accident occurred.

Clinton was being driven to an appearance at Valencia Commu-

ity College and was told later of the accident. "He is very concerned and is trying to find out more," McCurry said.

The press secretary said the helicopter was used to transport reporters traveling with the president and was heading from Miami to its base at Quantico, Va. No civilians were aboard the craft at the time of the accident.

The crash was the second such accident involving presidential support aircraft in less than a month.

A military transport plane carrying a communications van used by Clinton crashed Aug. 17 near Jackson, Wyo. Eight Air Force crew members and a Secret Service employee were killed.

A second Marine Corps CH-46 helicopter supporting the president's trip made a "precautionary landing" in a field about 15 miles south of Orlando, said a military official in Washington. No one was injured.

## Ton of cocaine found inside paper rollers

HOUSTON (AP) — With a shower of sparks from a high-speed saw and the smell of hot steel and burning rubber, the top of a 12-foot steel cylinder clanged to the floor of a grimy Port of Houston warehouse and out tumbled carefully wrapped packages of cocaine.

Dozens of customs agents Friday huddled around the find and applauded one of the biggest cocaine busts in the nation this year — more than a ton of the drug, with an estimated street value of \$100 million.

The cocaine, crammed into two

hollow steel rollers used to press pulp into paper, was seized from a Colombian-registered ship that arrived at a dock in Houston.

"I never cease to be amazed at the trouble they go through," said Candace Vice, director for trade compliance for Customs in Houston. "This is a massive amount of work they went through to package this into something that's used so it would be very difficult for us to detect."

Racers. "I think football teaches you a lot about life," he said. "It teaches you to keep going when it gets tough. You have to play a little bit when you are hurt. We get knocked down in business all the time. It emulates life because you have to be a leader, a follower and know how to follow instructions."

Although it has been more than 25 years since he has sported a Racers jersey, Dennison said he still keeps in touch with some of his fellow players. And yes, they talk about the old days.

Of the many stories Dennison can tell, perhaps the most humorous pertains to fellow teammate Rick Fisher, who is currently the head basketball/football coach at Murray High School. "When he came in, Rick was really quiet," he said. "He would walk slowly off the field and to the huddle. But when the ball snapped, he was out of there. He was a great running back."

Although Fisher showed great confidence and skill on the field, no one but his teammates knew of his pre-game ritual. "He had a very nervous stomach and while Coach Ferguson was giving his 'win one for the Gipper' speech, we could hear Rick throwing up in the shower. He was always really sick before the game," Dennison said.

Garnet Scott of Hopkinsville, who played football from 1969 to 1972, also remembers a story about Fisher. "Rick is color blind and he used to go from room to room asking if his coat and tie matched," Scott said. "He usually went with whatever answer he got the most."

Fisher laughingly acknowledged that the stories are true. "I have fond memories of my years with the Racers," he said. "When I played football, it was a big rivalry between us and Western."

Fisher played from 1969 to 1972, which was also during WKU's winning streak.

"It was usually the last game of the year and was always very intense," Fisher said. "There was a lot of pressure on both teams. I remember the time when I was close to 1,000 yards and they were after me pretty good. I have fond memories of those games."

Fisher credits former Racers coaches Bill Ferguson and Carl Oakley for his success as a player. "They came and recruited me," he said. "Their direct influence is why I

do what I do today. Without football, I wouldn't have changed as many lives and I never would have met my wife. The lessons I learned in football carried through to my life off the field."

Although the players and coaches have changed since these three took the field, they still look forward to Racers football games—especially with Houston Nutt in charge.

"I'm a big Houston Nutt fan," Dennison said. "I'm not so hung up on wins or losses anymore. Houston does things the right way because he has shown that you can win without an outlay. It all filters down from his outlook."

"He brings the players in here and puts them on the right track," Dennison said. "If the team doesn't go 11-0 this season, that's fine. Coach Nutt is a real asset to this community."

From a coaching standpoint, Fisher also praised Nutt. "He needs to be patted on the back for the relationships he has developed with all the high school coaches," Fisher said. "Whether it is things like needing to use their weight room or their coaches, Houston has been so supportive of us. He has been a great influence on all the coaches."

"Nutt has turned the program around and Murray is highly respected," Fisher said. "The quality is a complete turnaround because these kids now have a chance to go to the pros."

The Racers will take on the Western Kentucky Hilltoppers at 7 p.m. on Sept. 7 at Roy Stewart Stadium and are determined to continue the winning streak established last year at WKU (35-14). The series is tied 15-15 on MSU's home turf, but the Racers are counting on breaking it with a victory. For ticket information, call (502) 762-4895.

"Judge Coffman had put aside some of the litigation. Some of the cases were not allowed to be acted upon. Now, we'll move ahead."

The agreement with PacifiCorp hinges in part on Big Rivers reducing the price it pays for coal from Green River Coal Co., its largest coal supplier. The utility pays far more than the market rate under a 20-year contract that Thorpe himself helped arrange.

Big Rivers — claiming that

contract was based on kickbacks paid to Thorpe — wants to cancel the contract, but Coffman said earlier that she will not decide whether to nullify the contract until after Thorpe's trial.

Clyde Brown was sentenced to 18 months in prison and his coal company fined \$150,000 for his role in the scheme. Eddie Brown was sentenced to 15 months in prison and the alleged go-between in the scheme, Henderson businessman Shirley Pritchett received 18 months in exchange for his guilty plea.

#### Writer wants to keep dolphin-safe label

Dear Editor:

One of the most successful animal protection campaigns in American history was the consumer boycott of so-called "dolphin-friendly" tuna. For some scientifically unexplained reason, tuna swim underneath dolphins in the eastern Pacific. Tuna fishers exploited this phenomenon by setting mile-long purse seine nets on dolphins to capture the tuna, and in the process injured and drowned dolphins by the thousands. School children and other Americans concerned about cruelty to the dolphins led a tuna boycott. They succeeded in pressuring companies to stop purchasing tuna caught in this manner. And in the early 1990's the Congress approved federal legislation that embargoed the sale of "dolphin-friendly" tuna in the U.S. Consumers who buy tuna can be assured that any tuna with a "dolphin-safe" label was not captured in a manner that intentionally slaughtered dolphins.

This success story, however, may be short lived. Last month, the U.S. House of Representatives passed a bill that would change the "dolphin-safe" label and eviscerate American law protecting dolphins. Mexican lobbyists are pressuring Congress and the President to give Mexican tuna fishers access to the U.S. market, which is the world's largest market for tuna.

Remarkably, some members of Congress and the Clinton Administration are bowing to their wishes and seem prepared to sacrifice dolphins on the altar of free trade. Their dolphin-friendly bill is S.1420. Fortunately, a number of other legislators are seeking to defend American law, consumers and dolphins and to defeat this dolphin-friendly legislation.

Please urge Kentucky Senators Wendell Ford and Mitch McConnell to oppose S.1420 and to protect the dolphin-safe label for American consumers.

(At the Republican convention), Bob Dole (did) what he had to do: He pulled the Republicans together for the fall campaign, settled on a big tax-cutting package as the centerpiece of his candidacy, and depicted his opponent as a big-spending liberal in sheep's clothing.

(At the Democratic convention), President Clinton did what he had to do: He cited the accomplishments of the last four years, said in effect that the past is only prologue, offered a vision of the future that centers on education, and tried to take the high ground against the GOP's only real issue against him: personal character. Clinton, speaking as president and candidate, was challenging his opponents to lay off personal attacks while challenging Americans to look ahead to a new century.

Now the campaign starts. If Clinton's call for an uplifting campaign has even a few weeks' effect on the president's friends and foes, an insult-weary American public will appreciate it.

Aug. 31 — *The Augusta (Ga.) Chronicle on Dick Morris:*  
The Dick Morris fiasco proved the perfect metaphor for the Democrats' convention — preach one thing and practice another. Hypocrisy run amok.

Morris, the behind-the-scenes Svengali who engineered (President) Clinton's rhetorical swing to the right after the party's humiliating wipeout in the 1994 congressional elections, crafted the Chicago hoopla around "family values." Then hours before Clinton's speech, Morris' libertine lifestyle was "outed" when a supermarket tabloid published pictures of the political prostitute with a conventional prostitute, complete with the bimbo's diary remarks of how Morris told her White House secrets and even let her listen in on his phone conversations with the president.

So much for family values. So much for White House denials that security is lax.

Nonsense. Any guy who can talk his way out of that kind of domestic pickle should still have a long and productive career as a professional con man.

### KENTUCKY EDITORIAL

Public apathy has always been the key to society's tolerance of the coal industry, with its manifold excesses.

It is the public's acceptance of the coal business as it is — rather than as it could be — that has enabled politicians to ignore the broken lives, ruined watersheds, captive government and lost hope that have followed in the path of mineral exploitation. ...

You can hear the same resignation in the answer given before an Interim Transportation Committee meeting last week by Rep. Paul Mason — generally a good state legislator. Asked about the damage and death caused by overloaded coal trucks, he mused, "The answer? There's simply not one."

This ignores the fact that other states hold truckers — and the operators for whom they haul — to a higher standard of behavior, without putting them out of business.

"The bottom line," Mason said, is that "coal is still contributing about \$190 million to the economy" of Kentucky. Apparently he is talking about the severance tax on coal, which will produce about \$171 million this year.

What he does not include in that calculation are all the costs that the industry inflicts on society, and on taxpayers from Ashland to Louisville to Paducah.

The most obvious among those is inordinately high workers' compensation rates, borne by employers everywhere in Kentucky. Another is the price we pay for building public roads so they can stand the pounding of illegal coal trucks, and the bill for repairs when they wear out prematurely.

Add the environmental damage, and the cost of regulating an industry that persistently breaks the rules society tries to apply, and coal is no bargain.

Governor Patton is quoted as vowing that he will reform Kentucky's system of higher education during his term of office.

If that is Patton's intention, then his first step toward achieving it should be changing Kentucky law so that his term is extended by a hundred years. That is about how long it would take to make headway against the duplication of programs and turf building that the governor is targeted.

Patton is right in thinking Kentucky's "system" of higher education cries out for reform. He also is right in believing that — despite pleas from the universities — few are willing to pump more state money into the institutions until there is evidence they can make more coordinated use of it. ...

Having said that, however, what state taxpayers continue to hear most from the universities is appeals for more money despite growing taxpayer and political awareness that state funds too often are used to perpetuate academic duplication and feed institutional rivalries. ...

What Kentucky needs is a better coordinated and less competitive university system. It needs greater academic and administrative consolidation and fewer professional programs that burn taxpayer money while eroding taxpayer support for higher education in general. Above all, the universities need to realize that universities are not an end to themselves. The goal for Kentucky universities should be the most efficient possible use of the public educational dollar. When higher education falls short of that goal, it should be judged accordingly.

Tough order? You bet.

Many a governor before Patton has tried to reform higher education, only to finally throw up their hands in frustration.

## Tea and soul food for two

Perryville is home to the popular Elmwood Inn, a striking antebellum mansion near the Chaplin River that flows west to east through the town. The Elmwood was for years a fine restaurant, but closed about 1989, only to be reopened by new owners, Shelley and Bruce Richardson, as a popular bed and board inn.

The most distinctive feature of the Elmwood is that it serves formal high tea each afternoon. In fact, the raspberry and lemon curd served on the scones there, was featured at the Southern foods booth at the Atlanta Olympics and drew my attention to Elmwood in the first place. Folks flock from miles around to the daily events.

The Richardsons have a tea menu for each month. A September's tea menu, for example, features Creme

Fraiche Tarts, Javanese Shortbread, Curry Chicken Rolls, Tomato Basil Sandwiches, Apple Cake with Hot Butter Sauce, Cinnamon Crunch Muffins, Scones with Lemon Curd, Blackberry Sorbet, and Savory Tartlets. Courses are served on silver trays, accompanied by background music of Mozart, Bach, Haydn, or Chopin.

Built as a residence in 1842 by John Allen Burton, Elmwood served as a field hospital for wounded Confederates left behind when General Bragg ordered a retreat after the pivotal Battle of Perryville on October 8, 1862.

The Burton family sold Elmwood in 1897. Sarah Griffing and her daughter bought it, and with the help of her brother, educator Thomas Poynter, operated it as Elmwood Academy. (Another brother

had founded the famous Science Hill Academy in Shelbyville.) After Elmwood Academy closed in 1924, Sarah Griffing's daughter, Blanche, rented rooms and taught piano there until she died in 1955. The mansion went through a period of disrepair until rescued by preservationists in 1974, when it became Elmwood Inn with its good restaurant.

You can learn more about the marvelous monthly tea menus and recipes by finding Shelley and Bruce Richardson's attractive book, complete with four-color photos by the talented John Gentry of Danville, entitled "A Year of Teas at the Elmwood Inn." They'll probably autograph it for you if you come by. To make lodgings or tea reservations, phone (606) 332-2400.

One can easily make a day of it in this area, visiting Centre College in Danville, Shakerstown and the Beaumont Inn at Harrodsburg, My Own Kentucky Home and the Talbott Inn in Bardstown, and then the Perryville Battlefield and Elmwood Inn in Perryville.

Elmwood's recipes are palatable, pleasing, but the atmosphere is soul-lifting. This piece of the past produces a peace of mind.

## Big plays, defense spark Laker win

### Calloway flattens Heath 33-0

HEATH — The drama was building. With time running down, Heath took its final snap of Friday's game with Calloway and heaved a pass downfield. The crowd held its breath, waiting to see what would happen.

Instead of falling into the hands of a Heath receiver, the ball wound up in the hands of Calloway defensive back Jo Derek Adams, whose interception saved the day.

Well, maybe not exactly.

The Lakers already had the game well in hand at that point, but Adams' pickoff did preserve a 33-0 shutout for Calloway, allowing them to move to 2-0 on the season.

Actually, the game was decided earlier as Justin Morton turned two spectacular plays into touchdowns, quarterback Dan Arnett had a pair of one-yard TD runs and the Laker linemen, "The Hogs" as they're called, controlled both sides of the ball.

"Our defense played outstanding football the whole game," Calloway coach Billy Mitchell said after his team held Heath to just 54 total yards while rolling

up 300 themselves. "We were zeroing in on that, and we had a pretty good defensive game."

Morton's two scores came at key spots for the Lakers. His leaping catch of a 19-yard pass from Arnett near the out of bounds line gave Calloway its first score of the game, and his 80-yard punt return in the third

quarter, which started with the ball bouncing over his head and ended with him running diagonally across the field the last 50 yards, put the game out of Heath's reach.

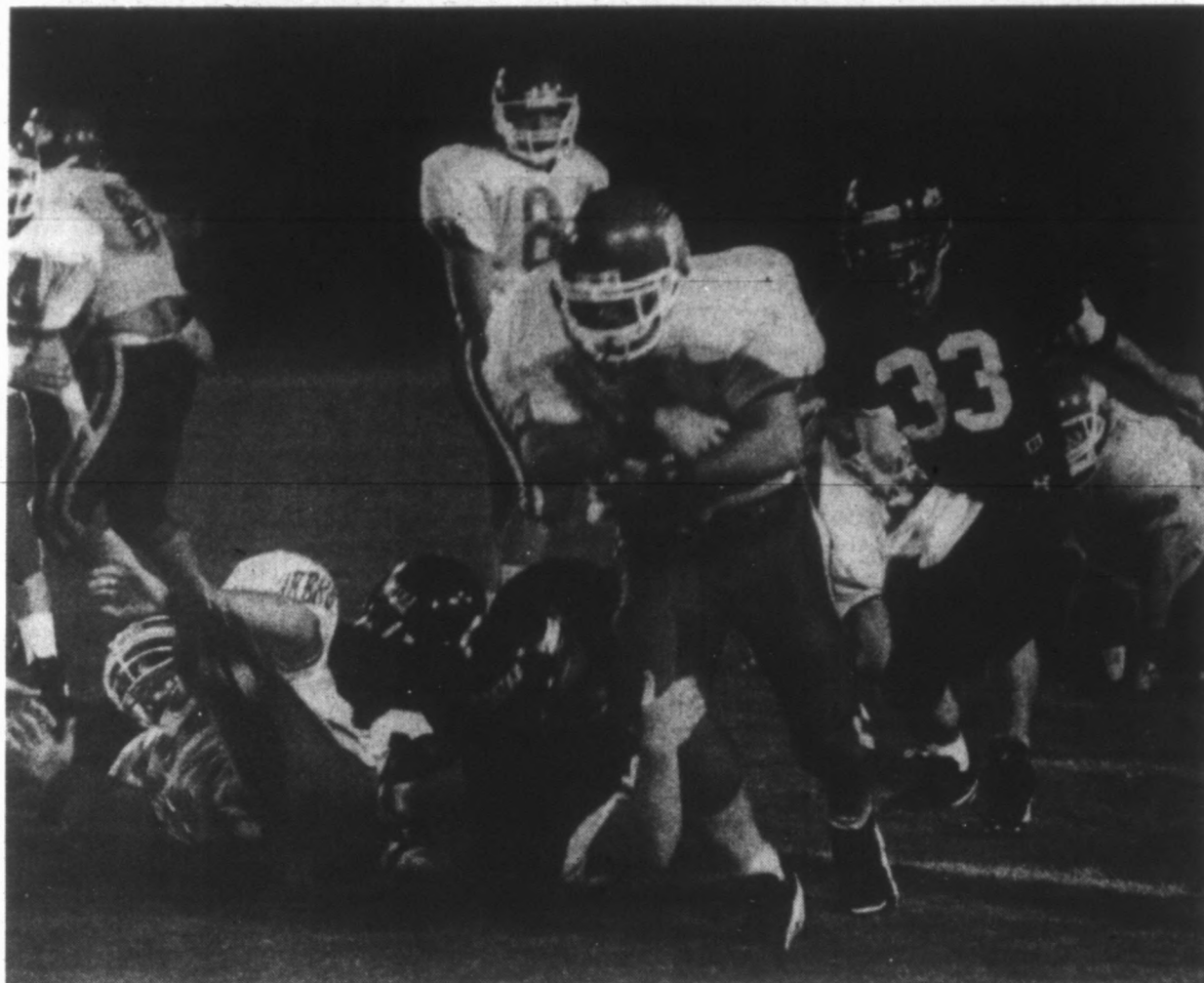
"Dan put that pass in the perfect place," said Morton, a junior. "It couldn't have been picked off, but it was right at the line. And on the return, I was dead until Josh McKee put on a good block to let me cut back to the middle."

Mitchell said Morton's scores twice opened doors for Calloway. "He made that great catch early that helped us because we were struggling, and that got us going offensively," the coach said. "Then the return really opened things up. We could have had control of the game earlier, but we had some turnovers."

Calloway's line play was just as important, holding Heath without a first down in the first half.

"Coach (Keith) Knight and coach (Chris) Bynum have worked us hard, and we've worked on our conditioning after practice," said senior Craig Butler, who plays on both sides of the line and had a quarterback sack Fri-

## Baltimore's Murray slugs homer No. 500

BALTIMORE (AP) — Eddie Murray hit his 500th career home run Friday night, joining Hall of Famers Hank Aaron and Willie Mays as the only players with at least 3,000 hits and 500 homers.

Exactly one year after Cal Ripken electrified a sellout crowd at Camden Yards by playing in his record 2,131st consecutive game, Murray became the 15th player to hit 500 home runs.

In the seventh inning of the Baltimore Orioles' rain-delayed game against the Detroit Tigers, he sent the first pitch from Felipe Lira over the right-field wall. His 21st homer of the season, a solo shot, tied the game 3-3.

As soon as the ball cleared the wall, multi-colored confetti

rained down on the field. Murray slowly circled the bases and was greeted by most of his teammates at the plate.

A huge banner unfurled down the ivy-covered wall in center field that read, "CONGRATULATIONS EDDIE 500."

The crowd shouted "EDDIE! EDDIE!" for nearly nine minutes, and Murray came out to give the crowd a few heart-felt waves. The game was further delayed as ushers cleared the field of the confetti.

Murray, 40, spent the latter part of the celebration alternating pacing the dugout and sitting down. Then he emerged for a second curtain call and shook hands with several fans in the first row to the left of the dugout.

Murray is the first switch-

## Injuries, miscues ruin Tigers' start; Union wins 28-20

MORGANFIELD — Friday night's game between Murray High and Union County was delayed approximately 45 minutes because of lightning.

Once the game started, the lightning was still striking — on the Tigers.

"We'd been better off if the lightning kept up and sent us home," said Murray coach Rick Fisher.

Murray jumped out to a 14-0 lead just seven minutes into the game, but then the storm — figuratively speaking — struck the Tigers.

After the two touchdown lead, problems in the form of injuries and mistakes stalled the Tiger offense as Union cashed in on the miscues and fought back for a 28-20 win at Baker Field.

"When we got up fourteen, we shut down," explained a dejected Fisher. "We let them back in the game and that shows a lack of experience and a lack of football instinct."

For the first time in Fisher's seven-year tenure, the Tigers dropped back-to-back games in a season. Worse yet, the 0-2 Tigers

## L.A.'s Butler back in Dodgers' lineup

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Two operations for cancer and 32 radiation treatments later, Brett Butler made good Friday on his promise to return to the Los Angeles Dodgers.

In his first game in more than four months, Butler went 1-for-3 with a walk, a run scored and two nice catches in Friday night's 2-1 victory over the Pittsburgh Pirates.

"This was just amazing — the people, the response," Butler said after the game. "It's something I'll never forget. It's just nice to be back."

Butler highlighted his comeback with a two-out single to left in the fifth inning. The crowd roared as Butler took off toward first base. It was his first hit since getting an RBI single off Colorado's Mark Thompson in his last at-bat May 1.

In the sixth, Butler caught Carlos Garcia's line drive on

the warning track, the same place he made an over-the-shoulder grab of Jason Kendall's ball for the final Pittsburgh out in the fourth.

It didn't long for Butler to get into the action. Pittsburgh's Mark Johnson, the fourth batter, hit a ball that Butler played off one bounce and threw to second base. Then he caught a fly by Mike Kingery for the final out of the half-inning.

The second standing ovation of the night interrupted Butler's first at-bat. He stepped back out of the box, and tipped his blue helmet to the crowd, who also showered him with prolonged applause during pregame introductions.

Butler didn't stay long at the plate. He hit a roller to second baseman Jeff King, who flipped to first for the out. He then flied to left in the third, singled and walked in the eighth.

"As I was walking up to the plate, that was the most special (moment)," Butler said.

## Jordan's HR propels St. Louis, 8-3

ST. LOUIS (AP) — This isn't just the St. Louis Cardinals' best baseball of the year, it's their best this decade.

Brian Jordan hit a three-run home run and Gary Gaetti had a three-run double as the Cardinals won their seventh straight game with an 8-3 victory over the San Diego Padres Friday night.

St. Louis' streak is the franchise's best since the 1988 team also won seven straight from Sept. 5-11, and the Cardinals also moved 11 games above .500 for the first time at 76-65.

But their lead in the NL Central remained at 1½ games over Houston, which beat Colorado 2-1.

"We've just got to keep setting our sights higher, because it's going to take a bunch of wins from here to the end," manager Tony La Russa said. "It's a nice time to go into a stretch, but we just need to keep reminding ourselves who we're playing."

They beat the Padres, who fell one percentage point behind Los Angeles in the NL West, for the seventh time in 10 meetings.

"This game isn't a big deal tonight," said the Padres' Tony Gwynn. "The Cardinals have just dominated us all year long and we knew that coming in."

"We just have to get our game together and worry about us." The Cardinals have scored 49 runs in their last five games.

St. Louis starter Alan Benes

was struck on his right wrist by a Steve Finley line drive with two outs in the fifth and had to leave the game. Preliminary X-rays showed no break.

"How it feels, I don't really know yet," Benes said. "We'll probably wait until tomorrow to figure out what's going to happen. It seems like it's going to be all right."

"I guess it shows it's a good idea to keep the ball down, to keep yourself from getting hurt."

Jordan's 15th home run was his first since Aug. 2, and only his second at Busch Stadium. It came off Bob Tewksbury (10-10) after Ray Lankford walked and Ron Gant singled to start the fourth. Gaetti followed with a triple and scored on John

Mabry's sacrifice fly to make it 4-0.

Jordan's power stroke has been hampered by a wrist injury, but it hasn't kept him from driving in runs. He leads the team with 95 RBIs and is batting .424 with runners in scoring position.

Jordan said he called his mother during a rain delay after the sixth to tell her about his home run. "She's been teasing me about not hitting a home run in a month," Jordan said. "I said, 'Well, I'm still driving in runs with men in scoring position.'"

Reliever Mark Petkovsek (10-2) singled to start the fifth, Ron Gant walked with two outs

day night. "We've been really dedicated in the offseason and we lifted hard to get bigger this year. I thought we wore them down as the game went along."

Arnett's first one-yard scoring plunge came with 2:54 left in the first half to put Calloway up 12-0. A bad snap on a Heath punt attempt gave the Lakers the ball at the Pirate 12 soon afterward, and on the fourth play of the possession, Arnett again dove in from a yard out. Morton then ran in a two-point conversion for a 20-0 halftime edge that might have been greater had the Lakers not turned the ball over twice inside Heath's 40.

Calloway fumbled the ball away again midway through the third, this time at Heath's 35, but the Laker defense rose up to force a punt, which Morton

returned for the touchdown to make it 26-0 heading into the fourth period.

Heath drove to Calloway's 23 before turning the ball over on downs early in the fourth. Mitchell then inserted Jason Hargrove into the backfield, and the freshman running back responded by carrying the ball nine times for 61 yards, capped off by a two-yard touchdown burst with 3:35 remaining in the game. Todd Monohan then added the PAT kick for the 33-0 final score.

With one last chance to avoid the shutout, Heath drove to its own 43 and sent out four receivers on the final snap of the game, but the interception by Adams, a junior, sealed the goose egg on the Pirates' side of the scoreboard. The pick was Calloway's second of the game as Brian Duvall, another junior, had intercepted a pass late in the first

stanza.

Hargrove led all rushers on the night. Calloway had 213 yards on the ground as Russell Lencki added 50 yards on 10 carries and Jason Eaves had 47 on six attempts. Morton caught four passes for 62 yards.

Heath had just 31 yards on the ground and only 23 through the air in falling to 0-2 on the year.

"Mitch Ryan played well defensively in the first half until we had to take him out with an injury, and I also saw Craig Butler and Josh McKeel quite a bit," Mitchell said. "And Jamie Burken is coming around on defense too."

"As the season goes along, Dan Arnett, Russell Lencki and Justin Morton will improve so we will be able to throw more, and Jason Hargrove came in and ran well, and we're thinking he will fit in real well for us," he added.

"A lot of young players got in tonight, and it will help us later getting them in this early in the year."

Calloway now comes to a crucial part of its schedule with three straight district games, starting next week at Hopkinsville, which buried Madisonville 56-6 Friday night. Home contests with Lone Oak and Union County follow.

"We've got three straight district games coming up, and we've got to get better," Mitchell said. "We can't have the fumbles and interceptions like we had tonight."

"We could have had this game in control quicker, and we did have it in control defensively," he added. "We like to get control of a game in the second quarter, but we can't have turnovers in district games like we did tonight, or we'll be out of the game."

start. "We're a beat up football team."

While the Tigers' offense failed to get a first down in the second half, the defense kept Union (2-0) within reach.

Defensive end Salim Sanchez scooped up a fumble and scored from five yards out in the first quarter to make it 14-0 and Jack Drake turned a fumble recovery into a 40-yard romp down to the Union nine-yard-line in the third quarter. Drake, a senior linebacker, later scored on a one-yard plunge to put MHS up 20-15 in the third quarter.

Murray stopped Union on its next drive, but on the following punt, Union's Skyler Smith dashed 55 yards into the Tiger end zone to make it 21-20 with 3:29 to go in the third.

"We felt like we could set up a

punt return and it worked well for us," said second-year Union coach Joe Prince. "That was the biggest play of the game."

Union was whistled for a clipping penalty on the play, but it came after Smith crossed the goal line and the yardage was assessed on the ensuing kickoff.

Murray still had life in the fourth quarter, but Union foiled a possible scoring opportunity when John Farley picked off an Allen Thompson pass at the Tigers' 37.

Two plays later, Bart Pride broke several Tiger tackles and rambled 23 yards for the final score with 11:29 to play in the game.

Murray never crossed the 50-yard line in the final 11 minutes.

Fisher blamed missed assignments on the Tigers' feeble offensive output. Thompson, who completed just one pass for seven

yards — the other 19 coming on the second half of a hook-and-lateral play — agreed with Fisher.

"It just isn't there yet," the senior quarterback said. "Maybe one guy will miss a block, another guy go the wrong way or I make the wrong read. That will come with experience."

Fisher said early on that this could be a "slow starting team," but the mounting injuries could make the start even slower.

"Both the knee injuries could be pretty serious," Fisher said, referring to Harrison and Hammonds. "Most of our skilled people are wounded — Allen Thompson may have a broken finger."

The slippery grass from an early game rain shower contributed to Harrison's injury. Fielding a punt at the end of the second quarter, Harrison slipped and his knee locked under him. However,

most of Murray's other injuries were due to Union's aggressiveness.

"They hit you up here," said Fisher. "You could close your eyes and listen to them play. I can't say that about us right now."

Murray bolted out of the gates by stopping Union on its first drive and watching Harrison sprint 65 yards for the game's first score.

"With the people we had in there to start the game, those things were working," Fisher said of the Tigers' ground game. "Then we start getting banged up and we were misconnecting in the second half."

If there's a light shining on the horizon, it could be the sight of Ty Holland Field next Friday night for the home and First District opener against Fulton County, a team Union whipped 28-6 in Week 1.

"District is the key part of the season," Tiger linebacker Bryan Dennison explained. "Coach Fisher said he scheduled these (first two) games to get us prepared and show improvement. We were a lot better tonight than we were at Calloway."

Said Thompson: "I miss Ty Holland Field. I can't wait to get back there next week."

Benes was knocked out on Finley's line drive infield hit with two outs and the bases loaded in the fifth. Benes retrieved the ball on the play and then threw it over Mabry's head at first as two runs scored.

Clayton's throw on Archi, Cianfrocco's two-out grounder in the sixth was high and pulled Mabry off the bag, allowing John

Flaherty to score from third. Benes allowed two runs — none earned — and three hits in 4 2-3 innings.

Tewksbury lasted four innings and gave up four runs and four hits. He lasted only four innings in his other appearance against his former team in St. Louis, giving up six runs and 10 hits on Aug. 5.

hitter in the 3,000-500 club. Aaron and Mays hit right-handed.

This homer came left-handed. A rain delay of 2 hours, 20 minutes severely depleted the crowd and left the stadium barely half full. But those in attendance gave Murray a prolonged standing ovation that he acknowledged with a tip of the cap after he reached the dugout.

Murray is hardly typical of the sluggers on the 500-homer list. He never hit more than 33 in a season and has reached 30 in only five of 20 seasons.

"I never considered myself a home-run hitter," he said recently.

Murray spent his first 12 major league seasons with the Orioles, hitting 333 home runs while averaging 99 RBIs a year. But he was traded away after the 1988 season following a dispute that began when owner Edward Bennett Williams questioned his leadership abilities.

Ironically, many of the Orioles have lauded Murray's presence in the clubhouse since he rejoined the team in a trade with the Cleveland Indians on July 21.

"Eddie has meant a lot to me and everybody," Orioles second baseman Roberto Alomar said. "I learn a lot from him, just by watching him and talking to him."

Murray hit six homers in his first 25 games with the Orioles as their designated hitter, giving him 498 for his career. That's when his drive for No. 500 turned into an arduous task.

Early in his second tenure with Baltimore, Murray said his biggest wish was that his 500th homer would come quickly so he and the Orioles could fully concentrate on getting into the playoffs.

## Conditions very good for anglers

Local conditions are still very good for most anglers and the many different species they are seeking.

The catfish is a major attraction, but interest in crappie and bass is increasing rapidly. While many were catching the white and blue channel catfish in the main river, they were also finding several hungry, large crappie willing to take the shiner minnows. Eventually word got to the crappie fisherman and a few began to fish for them exclusively and did quite well.

Hot weather crappie are normally hard to catch in numbers, but this year continues to be unusual in lots of ways.

The largemouth and smallmouth bass are gathering in large schools, feeding on the roaming threadfin shad. Sometimes they are ready to feed in the early mornings and sometimes its in the late evening just before dark.

Jack and Debra have done well on bass and stripers. They were fishing in a crowd and Debra was the champion angler while others looked on. They were catching stripers but she beat them all by 17 fish.

I fished one day with Ken Wingham and his grandson John who is 7 years old and loves to

fish. We fished for stripers also and I watched a young boy catch big fish by himself and sometimes with a little help from me. John seemed to mature with each fish, which calls for a high five, and his casting was super. It was such a pleasure to be in the company of these fine people and see the happiness in their eyes and smiles. I expect to fish with John Wingham again!

Brad and Mae Girkey came down from Frankfort seeking a

trophy smallmouth and some stripers. The found some schooling bass that afternoon before fishing with me, but couldn't catch them on anything!

They were fat and I know the Duncans will enjoy them for several meals.

Paula did an outstanding job by catching her fish on light tackle. She used a surface lure and at just the right speed she could draw strikes when no one else could. Another adventure to file away in the memory banks as a success.

## Feds propose liberal duck hunting regs

For the 1996-97 season, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service is proposing liberal duck hunting regulations, some of which allow more hunting than last year.

That's because wet conditions on the prairie pothole country of the United States and Canada again this year brought an increase in the duck population.

This year's fall flight index, a measure of the duck population, is nearly 83 million birds, compared with last year's final index of 77 million and a low of 57 million in the late 1980s.

Last year's liberalized regula-

tions led to hunters bagging 12.5 million ducks, up from 8.5 million a year earlier.

The service also is proposing a "Youth Waterfowl Hunting Day," a weekend or holiday within 10 days of the regular duck season in which a child could hunt in the company of a non-hunting adult.

"We're very pleased with the way the service has gone with the new program," said Matthew B. Connolly Jr., executive vice president of Ducks Unlimited Inc., the country's major waterfowl conservation group. "It will provide hunting opportunities but still be very much in keeping

with erring on the side of the resource."

For hunters under age 45, Connolly said, this could be the best season they've ever seen.

States may set their seasons within the frameworks mandated by the Fish and Wildlife Service. This year's frameworks, by flyway, are:

**Atlantic flyway**

Ducks — A season of not more than 50 days between Oct. 1 and Jan. 20. Daily bag limit is five, including no more than one mallard hen, one black duck, one pintail, one mottled duck, one fulvous whistling duck, two wood ducks, two redheads and one can-

vasback. The season on harlequin is closed. The daily bag limit of mergansers is five, including only one hooded merganser.

Geese — For light geese, a 107-day season between Oct. 1 and March 10. Daily bag limit is eight, 24 in possession. No hunting of Atlantic population Canada geese. Special or experimental seasons for resident geese will be allowed in Connecticut, Georgia, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, South Carolina, Virginia and West Virginia.

Mississippi flyway

Ducks — A season of no more

than 50 days between Sept. 28 and Jan. 19. Bag limit is five, including no more than four mallards, one hen mallard, three mottled ducks, one black duck, one pintail, two wood ducks, one canvasback and two redheads. The daily limit of mergansers is five, including only one hooded merganser.

Geese — Seventy-day season for dark geese between Sept. 28 and Jan. 31 and 107-day season for light geese between Sept. 28 and March 10. Daily bag limit is 10 light geese, three Canada geese, two white-fronted geese and two brant. There are area-specific restrictions.

## Bowling Green man enjoys hunting, giving back

BOWLING GREEN, Ky. (AP) — Encamped on an Alaskan tundra for 10 days, Bowling Green's Tom Baker took his practiced aim and killed two caribou.

Anyone upset? Baker offers no apology for his yearn to hunt in an era when hunters find themselves squarely in the aim of animal rights proponents.

Why apologize when Baker tries to offer Mother Nature substance — magnificent animals in

return for the one he takes.

Baker heads up the Kentucky chapter of the Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation. He gave \$10,000 of his own money and helped raise \$275,000 to re-introduce elk in Kentucky.

While Baker counts two elk and 10 deer heads on the den wall of his Bowling Green home, he also counts the 29 elk he helped move from Canada to Land Between the Lakes.

The herd has produced at least two calves, he said.

"I wonder how many of the

people who would condemn hunters are out there trying to give something back," Baker said.

To be sure, Baker takes from the wild.

He keeps a photo album for each trip like the one to Alaska he returned from Monday. He owns 27 albums dating back to 1985 on his den shelves.

His trophies cover the strong pine walls of his den. The skin of a 300-pound black bear lies at the foot of his gun locker, and the stuffed remains of a 600-pound bear will guard his back door

soon.

Baker's withdrawals from the wild include 10- and 11-foot alligators, two rattlesnakes, two turkeys and a mountain sheep.

He has a story for each one, like the five-foot diamondback rattlesnake skin he claimed as a bonus on a Texas turkey hunt.

"The gobblers were about 300 yards away, and we kept calling, but they spooked and started to go away from us," Baker said.

"I crawled on my stomach about 400 yards, fired and hit one. Then, about 10 feet away, the

snake started rattling.

"I'm glad that snake was having a good day up until that point."

Baker has stared down from a tree stand as a bear flailed its claws and clicked its teeth. He has scoped the wilderness while listening for the high-pitched bugle of male elk calling for a mate.

He pulls no punches; it's a rush.

"There's no feeling like being out there so close to majestic animals," he said.

## DR. GOTT

DEAR DR. GOTT: What is peripheral neuropathy? My doctor says there is nothing he can do to help me.

DEAR READER: "Neuropathy" means that certain nerves are malfunctioning. "Peripheral" denotes the nerves in your extremities. Common symptoms of this condition include pain, tingling and numbness of the hands and feet.

In most instances, the affliction is associated with poor circulation to the nerves themselves, frequently associated with diabetes, trauma, alcohol, blood disorders, drug reactions, lupus, nerve compression, and a host of other factors.

Obviously, before treatment can be recommended, the cause of the neuropathy must be uncovered, using a battery of blood tests and X-rays, often in conjunction with an examination called a nerve conduction study. A consultation with a neurologist may be necessary.

If your doctor has thrown up his hands, you could be helped by such a consultation. Because most forms of neuropathy are progressive and will result in chronic disability and/or pain, I believe that it is paramount for you to be tested thoroughly for a treatable cause.

In my view, given the wide range of available specialists, no primary care doctor has the right to give up on a difficult diagnosis. I don't doubt that you have peripheral neuropathy. I want to know why. Ask your physician for a referral to a neurologist or a specialist in internal medicine.

DEAR DR. GOTT: I've read in a health book that I can stop the aging process by using supplements such as Q10, beta-carotene, ginkgo and glutamine. I'd appreciate your comments.

DEAR READER: Nobody can stop the aging process, which is programmed into our cells. Of course, we can accelerate aging by mistreating ourselves — for example, by drinking too much and smoking cigarettes. But we cannot lengthen the process. That's built into the genes.

The products you mention have not been scientifically proved to provide health benefits. They certainly will not "stop" the aging process, any more than any other supplement will.

I know this statement infuriates health-food faddists, who believe that a variety of herbs and vitamins can extend life. But no reputable studies have shown this to be true. In fact, you may have heard of recent reports associating the beta-carotene vitamins with an assortment of health risks.

As much as we all yearn for an elixir of youth, it just ain't there. We're governed by our genes and the best we can do is to avoid messing things up by shortening our lives.

The most interesting hands to play are those where the struggle to make or break the contract is so close that the final outcome depends more on skill than on high cards or distribution. For example, the outcome of today's hand rests entirely on the expertise of the players.

Declarer played low from dummy on the heart lead and won East's nine with the ten. When South then led a spade, East allowed dummy's nine to hold, and from this point on declarer was fighting a losing battle. He continued with a spade at

trick three, East winning with the king and shifting to the queen of diamonds. South took the ace and could see that if he led a heart to the king and established the spades, he would have no way to get back to dummy to cash them.

He therefore abandoned the suit and tried to get his ninth trick from diamonds instead. But when that suit failed to divide 3-3, he had to go down one.

East's fine defensive play at trick two notwithstanding, declarer should have made the contract. He should have anticipated that the defenders might refuse to win the first spade lead and taken steps to deal with that contingency.

The correct play is to win the opening trick with the ace of hearts rather than the ten! This creates an extra entry to dummy that can later be utilized if necessary. A spade is then led to the nine. If East ducks, a second spade is played. South wins the diamond return, leads a heart towards dummy and finesses the jack after West follows low. Another spade lead then establishes the suit and declarer finishes with ten tricks.

Note that in playing the ace of hearts at trick one, South assumes that West holds the queen. This is confirmed by the Rule of Eleven, which reveals that the nine is the only heart East can have that is higher than the four led by West.

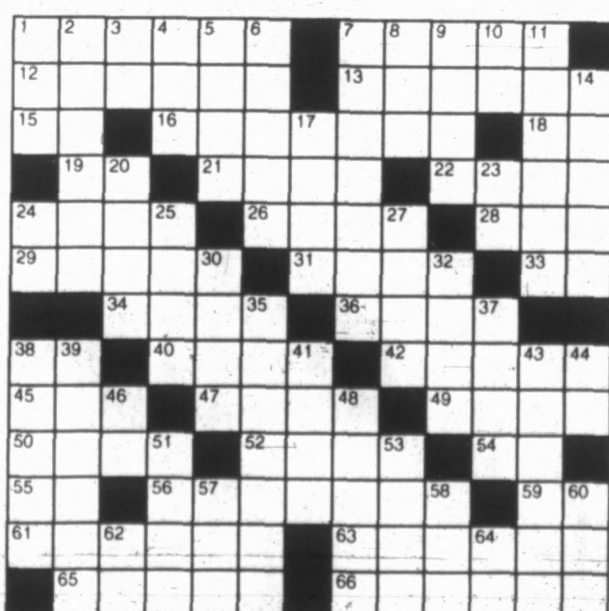

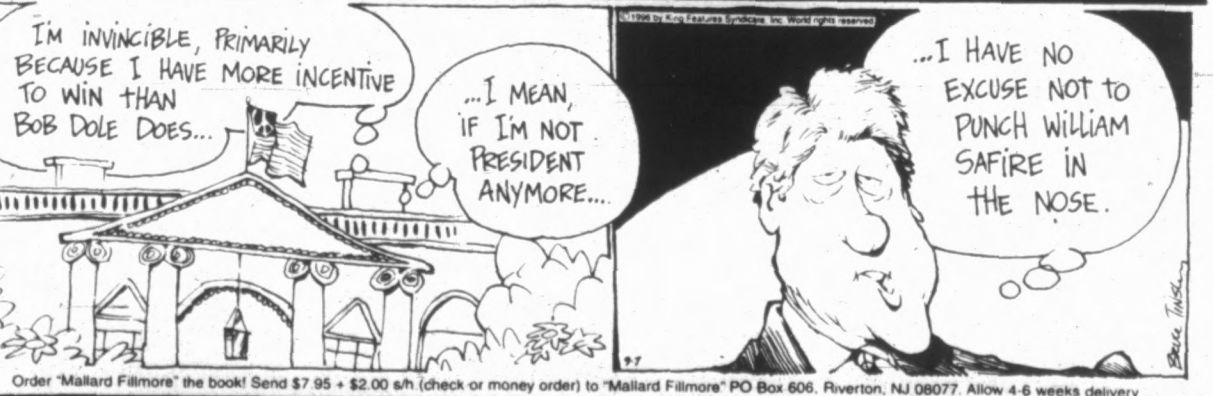

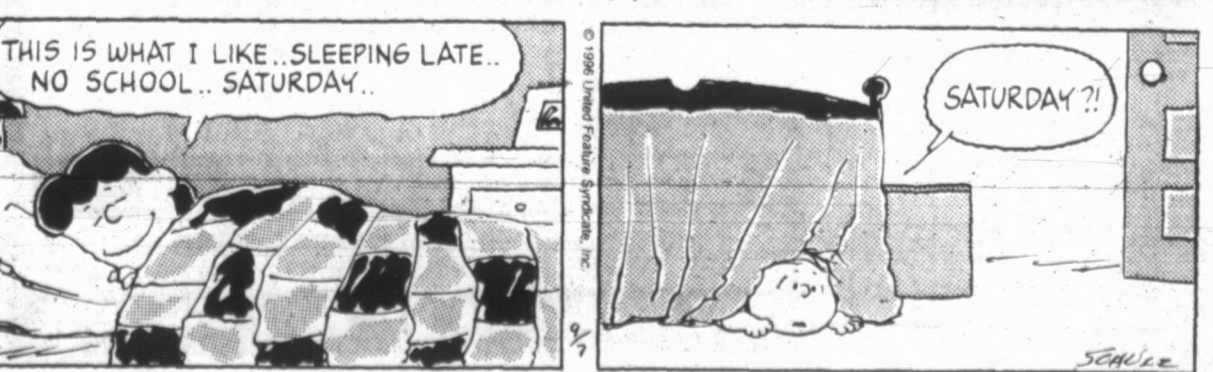

## Campbell Soup restructures

CAMDEN, N.J. (AP) — Campbell Soup Co. plans to lay off hundreds of workers, close plants around the country and sell some of its less-profitable businesses in a move to boost sales and earnings.

Campbell also said Thursday it would buy back as much as \$2.5 billion worth of its own stock — a step intended to make remaining shares more valuable. The company said it would announce details next week.

On Wall Street, investors cheered the moves. Campbell stock, which is traded on the New York Stock Exchange, jumped 6.5 percent Thursday. It rose \$4.37 1/4 a share to close at \$71.87 1/4.

"They're obviously doing the right thing for shareholders," said Lawrence Adelman, an analyst with Dean Witter Reynolds in New York.

Not all of the financial community was enthusiastic. Standard & Poor's said it is reviewing its rating of Campbell debt for a possible downgrade because of the greater emphasis on borrowing signaled by the company's stock buyback plans.

The sixth-largest U.S. food products company said it wants the restructuring to make it a top performer among global consumer companies.

In moves to accelerate growth

in Germany and Europe, Campbell said it would buy a German soup maker, Erasco Group, from Grand Metropolitan PLC for about \$210 million. Campbell said Germany is the biggest soup market outside the United States.

"We are poised for breaking away from our competitors in the food industry," said David W. Johnson, Campbell's chairman, president and chief executive. "Now, more than ever, our vision is within reach."

Johnson was brought in from outside in 1990 to turn around the beleaguered company by streamlining operations and focusing on its core businesses.

Campbell said the restructuring would reduce earnings by about \$160 million after taxes in the first quarter of fiscal 1997. The announcement came a day after Campbell reported a 26 percent increase in earnings for the fourth quarter of fiscal 1996.

Campbell ended speculation about pending layoffs, announcing it would cut 650 jobs in North America, including 175 positions at its world headquarters in Camden. The company has about 44,000 employees.

The company also said it would close a ramen noodle plant in Atlanta and a poultry research facility in Farmington, Ark., and a seasonal tomato paste processing plant in Sacramento, Calif. A

Pepperidge Farm biscuits operation in Lakeland, Fla., will be reconfigured.

Campbell also said it will sell poultry processing facilities in Douglas, Ga.; Tecumseh, Neb.; and Worthington, Minn. About 1,100 jobs would be affected, but spokesman Kevin Lowery said employees at the poultry facilities will likely be offered jobs by prospective buyers.

Campbell did not specify which businesses would be sold but said the lines represented sales of about \$500 million — about 7 percent of its annual revenue.

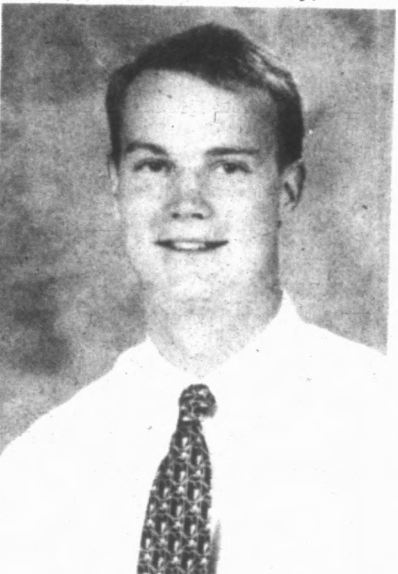

The success did not come as easy this year as in years past. The start of Jefferson County Schools had an impact on attendance numbers during the weekday morning and afternoon hours.

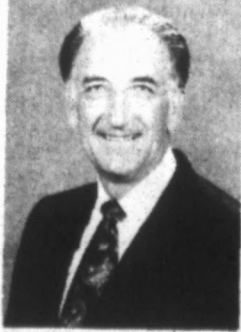
"We are very pleased with the

## Wickliffe to host 'First Nation Dancers'

Wickliffe Mounds Research Center, 94 Green St., Wickliffe, will host the "First Nation Dancers" on Saturday and Sunday, Sept. 21-22.

The Native American dance troupe, with performers from numerous tribes, weaves dancing, song, storytelling, and flute music together to present a memorable glimpse of the First Peoples culture and traditions. These two days will include teaching about tribal dances, regalia, and culture.

Organized performances will take place each day at 10:30 a.m. and 2 p.m. Throughout weekend, group members will be teaching and talking with visitors on a more informal basis.

The First Nation Dancers represent several tribes, including Shawnee, Crow, Potawatomi-Seneca, Ottawa, and Lakotah. At the heart of the dance group is the Whispering Thunder Drum

from Kansas City which derives its members from various Native American nations including Lakotah, Potawatomi-Seneca, Cherokee, Leni Lanape, and Omaha. The Drum renders their songs in the Lakotah language.

Core dance members are Kathy Baird, a Crow from Illinois. Her expertise is in Jingle Dress and Shawl dancing, which are two elegant forms of women's dance. Victoria Fortner, a Shawnee from Missouri, brings a mastery of storytelling as she serves both as emcee and dancer.

"It is exciting to welcome the First Nation Dancers back to Wickliffe Mounds again this year. Last year's (1995) event weekend surpassed all previous records at our site, with over 900 people attending over the two days," said Becky Fye, Assistant Director. "This event has become the most important for us

in terms of public programming and providing new educational opportunities to our audience."

"We've actually expanded this year's program even more," explained Fye. "School-group only performances are scheduled for Wednesday (9/18) and Friday (9/20) at Wickliffe Mounds, and at Murray State University's Wrather Auditorium on Thursday (9/19). We expect over 1700 school children from twenty-one schools in Kentucky and Illinois to attend these special performances. Believe me, seats filled up quickly! It's exciting to bring Native American culture to our area students."

In addition to the dancers, there will be a select group of vendors with crafts and jewelry items for sale. Like the dancers, they are Native Americans, and some may be demonstrating beadwork and other crafts

through the weekend.

Regular admission will be charged for the First Nation Dancers event: \$3.50 adults, \$3.25 seniors, \$2.50 ages 6-11, \$2.00 MSU affiliated, and children under 6 are free. Group discounts are available by prior arrangement. To purchase advance tickets for this special event, send a check payable to WMRC, and indicate how many tickets needed by category.

Visitors are encouraged to take advantage of the free shuttle bus service offered this year. "Because we have limited parking, we contracted with Paducah Area Transit System to run a shuttle bus from the Wickliffe City Park (6th & Court Sts) to our site starting at 10 a.m. through 4 p.m. both days," said Fye. "We're grateful to Rick Davenport, general manager, and PATS for their generosity. In

addition, the Ballard County Disaster Emergency Service volunteers have agreed to assist us throughout the weekend by directing traffic to the City Park. We wouldn't be able to provide the shuttle bus service without their help."

Wickliffe Mounds is a program of Murray State University. The weekend performances by the First Nation Dancers are funded

in part by a grant from the Kentucky Humanities Council and the national Endowment for the Humanities. Other sponsors of the event include the Paducah Area Transit System, WKY Classic Rock, and Friends of Wickliffe Mounds.

## Counselors go on the hunt for new students

At the end of September, admission counselors from Murray State University will once again be on the road searching for prospective students. Through special dessert receptions, counselors provide information to students and their parents about the university. Alumni, faculty and currently enrolled students are also on hand to answer questions.

"We are bringing MSU to them," said Paul Radke, director of school relations. "We invite all the prospective students and their parents to come and listen to the presentation." Areas of interest include cost, financial aid, housing, academic requirements, student life, programs, scholarships and admission requirements.

"We've done these receptions for several years, but we expanded the list last year," Radke said. "Attendance has been very good and we have had some where 250 students and parents have shown up. As a result of more people being interested, we have more people coming to campus."

The two-hour receptions are scheduled in places ranging from Chicago to Hopkinsville.

"It is a very informal atmosphere," Radke said. "The questions I am often asked are the nuts and bolts such as how much it costs, etc. The students and alumni get asked the more in-depth questions about what it is really like on campus and the outcome of their education."

MSU faculty and staff involved in the Road Scholars Program will be invited to attend receptions at their host school.

As a traditional recruiting technique, the receptions have worked rather well, according to Radke. He noted that the university experienced a 10 percent increase in

freshman enrollment this year and praised the counselors for their work.

"This is one of the most experienced staffs I have had," Radke said. "Every staff member is responsible for recruitment territory with specific high schools. It is important for them to get experience talking with students. They have to become MSU to the high school."

Radke has two assistant directors, Kathy Hillyard and Doris Clark; and four admissions counselors, Felicia Payne, Lori Rowlett, Mallory Modelmog and Jason Barnett.

"From early September until early February, we are pretty well gone three to four days a week," Radke said. "This is a very versatile, high-energy staff."

He emphasized that the counselors assist in making the receptions a very comfortable, personalized environment for the students.

"We have reinstated the counselor breakfast and lunches which is an opportunity for us to meet with guidance counselors and give them an update on MSU information," Radke said. "We give them lots of materials so they can provide them to students."

"What I want to do is when guidance counselors recommend schools to the students, I want MSU to be in the top four or five that are recommended," he said.

Another initiative this year is to host a bus-in for Louisville/Jefferson County guidance counselors.

"A bus will pick them up and bring them to campus where we will have a program and a tour set up," Radke said. "Then we will send them back. It will simply be a same-day bus trip. The hardest thing we have to do is convince them there is life after Elizabethtown."

## Citadel loses 16 cadets in first week, four women still remain

CHARLESTON, S.C. (AP) — "Hell Week" claimed 16 freshmen at The Citadel, but not the four women who have broken the military school's 153-year-old all-male tradition.

Known officially as Cadre Week, the freshman class' first week includes extensive physical and mental challenges thrown at them by upperclassmen.

The four women are among 565 students still enrolled,

spokesman Terry Leedom said Wednesday.

The Cadre Week attrition was lower than last year, when two dozen students dropped out, including Shannon Faulkner, who fell ill on the first day and dropped out after a court order made her The Citadel's first female cadet.

The average high temperature during the first week of training last year was 99 degrees. The average this year was 89 degrees.
